### Group Commander's Corner CAPT Chuck Rink



This is our last newsletter as we prepare to leave theater. The Sailors of OSCAR have achieved a tremendous reputation for the outstanding work they performed. We were in six different countries. working in 26 different locations. OSCAR had the fewest number of Sailors, but we were spread out over the greatest geographical area than any other NAVELSG FWD rotation. OSCAR Sailors worked in the rain, snow, sleet, ice, mud, freezing cold, and very dry, hot weather. Our Sailors worked day and night, seven days a week and through all the holidays. They overcame all of the challenges and met every mission requirement. They moved 3,500 pieces of air cargo, inspected 16,500 vehicles,

checked 160,000 pieces of equipment, screened 35,000 passengers with 113,000 bags, confiscated 49,000 contraband items and handled 500 hazmat items. In addition, the Seabees were demonstrating the can-do motto by repairing vehicles, building guard shacks and guard towers, grading yards with gravel, filling Hesco barriers and driving a bulldozer to improve the outer berm to improve base security. These many operational successes could not have been achieved if it wasn't for the great support from the ESS. N1 processed 689 correspondence letters, 425 redeployers and every award and eval/fitness report for the all of the members of NAVELSG FWD. N4 handled 408 requisitions for \$110,000 and \$2.5 million in returned gear. N43 drove 55,000 miles and transported 2,000 PAX. N6 resolved 6,000 IT trouble tickets and switched all Arifjan personnel to the new email system. N3 kept the 240 Sailors in the 26 locations spread out in a balanced fashion to insure the right amount of manpower was in the right place. N7 supported 50 Sailors to tap into \$50,000 of tuition assistance, implemented two critical training stand downs and ensured 100% GMT compliance for all Sailors. N9 achieved and maintained 96% medical readiness. I was fortunate to have the best Command Master Chief in the Navy, CMDCM Scott Quamme and the finest officer in the Navy

as my Deputy, CDR Jimmy Hahm. The support and guidance of these two individuals was outstanding and helped me to support the many Sailors of OSCAR. I am honored to have been the Group Commander for the Sailors of OSCAR. It will be difficult to give up this command and to say good bye, but I know my relief CAPT James McNeal will carry on the great tradition of NAVELSG FWD. I wish all of my officers, chiefs and enlisted fair winds and following seas. God bless every Sailor and the members of his/her family.
