Seventeen months after the first shovel found its destination in a grassy area behind the school campus, the children from the James Van Dierendock Elementary School were able to enter the new multi-purpose room on 24 October.

Due to the steady rain that felt down on the small and tall shoulders from the audience, E-3A Component commander Brig. Gen. Stephen D. Schmidt kept his speech short. "Congratulations to everybody on this super new building. But keep aware, you students; the normal rules apply here too. No food fights, and have fun!" After this, Brig. Gen. Schmidt and

Grade 5, Student Council President, Hanna Stadler had the privilege to cut the ribbon.

The new room is a huge improvement. "All of us are very, very happy with the modern room", says School Principal Dr Terry Emerson. "The building includes a gym, a cafeteria, and a stage." Especially the food area is a real improvement. Dr Emerson: "Up till now the lunches had to be transported from JFC HQ Brunssum; now we can prepare them under our own management."

The stage is an advantage too. "With the stage we can show theatrical productions," explains Dr Emerson. "When the ordered chairs arrive we will have the capacity to accommodate

400 persons." The area is multi-functional. Besides theatre performances the facility can be used also as a meeting room for the international community. It's anticipated that any member of the international community can use the new multi-purpose room on a space-available basis. Information and arrangements can be obtained through the school administration office.

The total cost of the new facility, which replaced the Bubble Gym, was two million Euros. It was a co-operative project between the E-3A Component, the U.S. Department of Defense, and German contractors. Constructors from the local area performed the actual building work.

NATO assistance for Pakistan



The Alliance has decided on 21 October to enhance its assistance to Pakistan, in the wake of the devastating earthquake. As the Secretary General states, NATO has, from the beginning, been doing what they can to help Pakistan to deal with this disaster, as part of the overall international effort.

NATO set up a major strategic airlift operation of relief supplies to Pakistan – something unprecedented in its history. The airlift is taking over tons and tons of relief supplies to Pakistan, provided by UNHCR, NATO nations and other countries as well.

The airlift is well under way, using NATO 707s, an Antonov carrying a UNHCR base camp, and C-130 transport aircraft from Incirlik, which have moved tons already, with more constantly on the way. Also C-17 flights are used to bring goods from two NATO airfields in Germany and Turkey.

But Pakistan needs more help and NATO agreed to do more, as part of the overall international effort. To boost its assistance to Pakistan it deploys forces on the ground to assist in the relief effort including engineers,

multinational medical units as well as a deployable headquarters.

NATO forces arrive in Pakistan
The first elements of NATO's enhanced assistance to Pakistan arrived on 24 October, as the Alliance continues to lift supplies into the country via air bridges from Germany and Turkey.

The headquarters arrived on Monday, 24 October, to pave the way for the arrival of the other forces and co-ordinate with Pakistani authorities the areas where both the headquarters and forces will be deployed. NATO also deploys three water purification plants, and a number of helicopters are added to those already in Pakistan from NATO countries.

Meanwhile, the Alliance continues airlift operations from Germany and Turkey to transport supplies donated by NATO member and partner countries and the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees. On 28 October 25 flights have lifted approximately 300 tons of supplies to Islamabad, and about 800 tons were waiting to be lifted.

All offers from NATO and partner nations are being co-ordinated by the

NATO Response Force prepares for fresh arrivals
Two days after its arrival in Islamabad, the Deployable Joint Task Force Headquarters, led by Vice Admiral John Stufflebeem, commander of Joint Command Lisbon, was co-ordinating with Pakistani authorities the areas where the NATO Response Force troops will be deployed. Several options are being considered. Advance elements of a Dutch

medical unit arrived in Pakistan on 28 October and were ready to start work a few days later. The advanced party of Spanish engineering troops left for Pakistan by 30 October followed by a Polish engineering company. In total, the NRF is planning to send more than 1000 troops, focussing on providing engineering and medical support.

In Islamabad, following the consultations that took place between Vice Admiral John Stufflebeem, commander of the NATO Response Force, and Pakistani authorities, the Deployable Joint Task Force Headquarters is evaluating the areas of operations identified by the Government of Pakistan.

Appointment of Lieutenant General Lance L. Smith, United States Air Force, as Supreme Allied Commander, Transformation

On 19 October NATO's Defence Planning Committee announced its agreement to a request from President Bush to appoint Lieutenant General Lance L. Smith, United States Air Force, as Supreme Allied Commander, Transformation. The appointment will become effective at a future date.

Lieutenant General Smith is currently serving as the Deputy Commander/Chief of Staff, United States Central Command and has been nominated as the Commander, United States Joint Forces Command.

Response Force demonstrates amphibious capabilities

The NATO Response Force tested its capability to conduct complex sea-based operations in NATO's largest amphibious exercise, Destined Glory (Loyal Midas), in the Tyrrhenian Sea, from 29 September to 14 October.

Over 8,500 personnel, 37 ships and 57 aircraft from ten NATO countries took part in the exercise. The key aim was to test and certify the forces that will make up the maritime component of the NATO Response Force from January to June 2006.

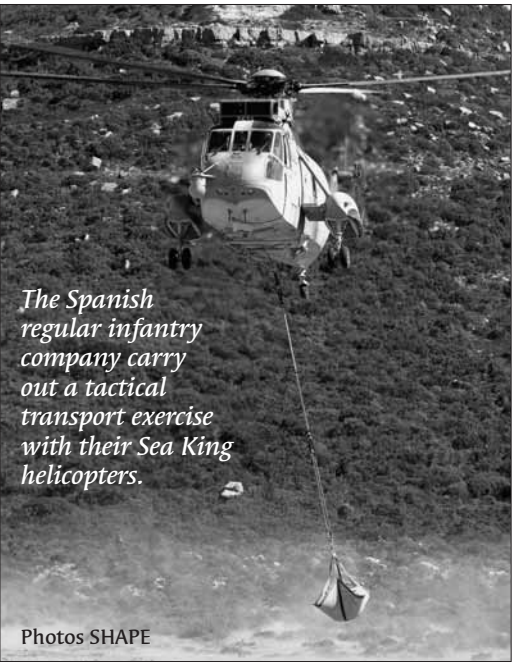
"We are focused on our task which is interoperability between our forces and gaining the ability to operate together," said Colonel Luis Martin de la Hoz, Commander of the Second Battalion of Spanish Marines.

A rapid expeditionary force
The NATO Response Force is a special, technologically advanced force made up of land, air, sea and Special Forces components that the Alliance can deploy quickly wherever needed. Building on past Destined Glory exercises, Loyal Midas presented more complex scenarios incorporating increased levels of 'free play', where the commander had to react to unexpected situations.

"In previous years, [the commander] has

had a program to go by; this year he [didn't]," stressed Rear Adm. Cooke, Deputy Commander of Naval Striking and Support Forces NATO.

The forces engaged in a number of missions and exercises, practicing the full range of crisis and emergency response scenarios. This included amphibious units fighting their way from ships towards their land objective.

Discover Belgium’s history at the BELvue Museum

So how much do you really know about Belgium? The country is still young, but already has a very stirring and fascinating history behind it. Would you like to get to know it in a splendid setting? In the surroundings where it all began? Then visit the BELvue museum, the only museum that reveals the history of Belgium right in front of you.

In July the BELvue Museum in Brussels reopened. The name ‘BELvue’ marks a new chapter for the museum called ‘Bellevue’ before. It links the words Belgium and overview. It’s the first museum dedicated to the history and the State Foundation of Belgium from 1830 till now and the dynasty.

This year it is the 175th anniversary of Belgian independence. But the very location and history of the building itself are also worth a visit. Before it became a museum, the former 18th century luxury hotel was also a royal residence. You will still find aspects from that era. With the recent renovation, the

atmosphere of the old days was restored. BELvue is located next to the Royal Palace in the immediate vicinity of many museums on the Mont des Arts and right across from the Warande Park. You won’t find a better meeting place anywhere for art, culture and nature. That is why the voyage of discovery in the BELvue museum is an ideal starting point for foreign visitors.

Visitors will be able to discover twelve rooms dedicated to the major historical periods of the country. Original documents, audio-visual accounts and computer kiosks for greater variety in approaching the subject. Connecting these exhibition areas, a connected walkabout will present the reign of each King of the Belgians through a selection of works and characteristic portraits of the personality of the monarchs and the image of the royal family as perceived by the population.

Three levels of reading matter are designed to appeal to the entire array of visitors, from general background information to the chronological listing of hundreds of significant events - social, military, political, economic,



diplomatic, religious or cultural - and also including the study of a few decisive events in order to understand the Belgium of today.

But the museum is not the only thing to see and go to. There is a museum souvenir shop, a restaurant, a library and the archaeological site. The shop is located in the entrance hall of the BELvue museum and is accessible without admission ticket. You will find a wide selection of books, picture

postcards, reproductions and Belgian articles.

For those who are interested in the history of the Brussels palace there is the archaeological site of the ‘Coudenberg’. The Brussels palace was first erected on Coudenberg hill in the late 11th and 12th centuries and was subsequently rebuilt, extended and improved in line with the growing prestige of the Dukes of Brabant, followed by the Dukes of Burgundy, Emperor Charles V and finally the Archdukes Albert and Isabel. The beauty of this palace, the seat of central power for over six centuries, the charm of its gardens and the wealth of its art collections attracted visitors from all over Europe. A huge fire unfortunately destroyed this prestigious monument in 1731 and it disappeared when the district was redeveloped after 1775. A fascinating tour underneath the Place Royale will let you discover the remains of this illustrious palace, unjustly forgotten by history.

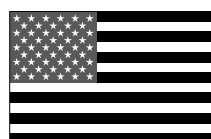

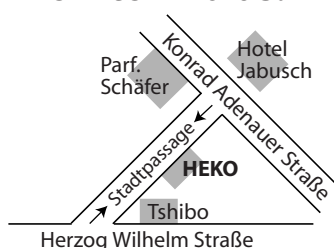
