Eighth International Canine Biathlon

On 28 May the 8th International Canine Biathlon took place at the Component. It was hosted by the Civil Guard and supported by a lot of voluntary helpers.

About 135 participants were announced for this event from 11 nations – Germany, The Netherlands, Belgium, Czech Republic, Austria, Slovenia, Latvia, Lithuania, Great Britain, France and Finland. The Finnish team had the longest journey, about 2000 kilometres. There were teams from the military, police, the civil area and, of course, the Component's Civil Guard. Most of the teams camped over the whole weekend at the Component.

Conditions for this event were perfect. The weather was sunny at around 30 degrees Celsius. The well-prepared course was about 8.3 km long and had 25 very different obstacles, like simulated attacks on the dog handler, fleeing robbers. One obstacle was 15 metres long, and about there was a dirty pond of 1.7 metres .

At some obstacles the dog and the handler had to crouch, and at some they had to climb, for example to the top of a building. It was really teamwork between the handler and the dog. If the dog couldn't jump on top of a box, etc., the handler was allowed to help him. Because of the length of the course and the heat there were canisters with water and sometimes little pools for the teams to cool down to prevent heat stroke. In addition the judges were authorized to disqualify a team to prevent any injuries to the dog, if they saw that the dog had no strength any more to finish this competition.

For the visitors a barbecue was provided with lots of good-tasting sausages, steaks and other food and a drink stand with cool drinks for their health. The visitors were impressed by the well-trained dogs from many



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Technical Support Visit at FOB Aktion

On Monday, 13 June a team of 32 people from MOB Geilenkirchen flew to Forward Operating Base (FOB) Aktion to help to prepare the FOB for the Consolidated Inspection (CI) two weeks later. Beside the CI preparation for five days they performed also maintenance work and ICCS.

The TCA not only carried passengers to FOB Aktion, but also to FOB Trapani and FOB Konya. After the TCA landed in Trapani and unloaded the cargo, the aircraft started thirty minutes later to Greece. The Operations Officer, Lt. Col. Ilias Lagonikas, awaited the team from Geilenkirchen under the leadership of Capt. Andreas Hauck. After the unloading of equipment there was a short in-briefing with housing and security information.


Housing for this Technical Support Visit (TSV) was provided on base. Everyone had his own room, bathroom with shower, television with German, U.S. and Hellenic programs, balcony and acceptable furniture. Fortunately also an air conditioner. Very welcome with about 30 degrees Celsius over the whole week. After the work was done – and there was a lot of work –

everyone could enjoy a few hours on the beach with swimming.

On Tuesday morning the FOB Commander Col. Charilaos Lamprou welcomed the TSV team. Capt. Hauck explained the work for the different sections. In all areas the CI Preparation had to be done. Labelling and IT security had to be checked, directives had to be updated, and the following of procedures and guidance had to be monitored. Also maintenance work had to be done on the UHF Radio and Satellite Communication.

For Supply Mr. Jerome Rogers did the preparation and he was really satisfied. "Everything was well-organized, clean and in the right place," he stated. In Logistics there was more work than in other sections because the FOB has no specialists at the moment and so the MOB personnel had to do all the work. That meant repair and maintenance of all the machines, vehicles and tools. "I expected it to be worse than it actual was", says SSgt. William Ross.

It's the first time for him on the FOB. He is working with Mr. Wilfried Küppers who has been to the various FOBs and the Forward Operating Location between thirty and forty times and gained much experience over



the past years. When he looks back, he notices a lot of improvements. It's not the same situation as in Geilenkirchen and there are not the same equipment, materials and tools, but it's getting better and better every year.

One more part of the Technical Support Visit was the ICCS Training for the FOB personnel. The two shooting instructors, SSgt. Christopher McCrady and Mr. Maximilian Kellner from the Security Squadron, gave training in shooting and weapons handling. They trained about forty colleagues of the FOB with the P7 pistol over two days in a lot of different and demanding exercises with various targets, positions and ranges. The FOB personnel were more than lucky to have this chance to improve their skills.

Pubs and Forms Section is more than satisfied, because the Operations Centre is well-organized. All the old publications were changed and procedures and guidance were checked.

The Mission Support made some great improvements too. New software was installed and Flight Maps are available at the FOB now. Now maps can be easily changed at the FOB.

The TSV team did a lot of work this week. That was recognized by the FOB Commander who invited the team for a crew dinner on the beach with many good-tasting Greek specialties.

In return the TSV personnel invited some of the FOB personnel to their crew dinner on Thursday evening in Preveza downtown. The atmosphere was excellent and everyone had the chance to get to know each other and how they are doing their job for the E-3A Component.

In all the Technical Support Visit showed improvement in all areas. Even if not everything could be fixed right now, a lot has been done.

Alliance to deploy extra troops for Afghan elections

NATO Ministers of Defence have reiterated their commitment to Afghanistan, saying the Alliance will continue to expand its presence in the country and assist in providing security for the upcoming elections.

Speaking after a meeting of the Ministers in Brussels on 9 June, Secretary General Jaap de Hoop Scheffer said the current expansion of the NATO-led International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) to the West of Afghanistan is on track. Once this phase is completed this July, NATO will be providing security assistance in about 50% of Afghanistan's territory.

'Clear commitment'

In addition, the Ministers have

demonstrated a clear commitment to further expand ISAF to the South of the country, with a number of countries already pledging resources for the expansion.

The Secretary General also said that NATO would assist in providing security for the upcoming parliamentary and provincial elections this September. The Alliance will deploy an additional three battalions, a quick reaction force, and an 'over-the-horizon' force to boost its presence on the ground.

This will be similar to the support that NATO successfully provided to the historic presidential poll in October 2004. The Ministers also discussed long-term support to Afghanistan after the elections, including in the fight against narcotics.

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
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
