

# Civil Guard bomb dog and handler help police

During a training session with the German police an E-3A Component explosive detection dog team, Mr. Marcel Brassé and his dog Aaron, assisted in solving a crime. This was not part of the training, but a real-life investigation.

Each year the dog handlers have to pass a test to obtain their qualification certificates, and every three months they attend training with the German police. In October 2004, the Civil Guard's dog handlers were attending a training course in Bochum when the police of Witten called the group in to help them clear up a crime. While following a suspect's trail, Mr. Brassé and his dog Aaron found a bag with a pistol and a mask and so helped the police to identify the person and solve a crime.

This shows that the Civil Guards' professionalism and the quality of their training benefits not only the Component, but also the public.

Mr. Marcel Brassé has been employed at the Component since 1990 and has been an explosive detection dog handler since 1992. He works with 80 other members of the Civil Guard to ensure the Component's security. Daily, the identities of more



than 600 contractors and suppliers have to be checked, and the guards have to be familiar with about one hundred different ID cards. It is not only the main gate that has to be monitored – also the restricted areas and the fence of the air base have to be checked by patrols 24 hours a day.

To compare their knowledge and skills and to learn about the procedures of other nations, the Civil Guard hosts the international Canine Biathlon every year with participants from all over the world.

## First NATO airlift of civilian police into Darfur

On 7 August, NATO airlifted a team of 49 African Union civilian police as well as an additional 533 military peacekeepers into Darfur. This is the first time that NATO has assisted in airlifting civilian police into Darfur. The airlift was carried out by the United States, in the framework of the Alliance's support to the African Union.

#### Enhancing NATO's support

Since July, the Alliance has been helping the African Union strengthen its peacekeeping mission in the region by airlifting forces from African troopcontributing countries into Darfur. To date it has airlifted about 1,900 African troops into the region.

At the beginning of August, the African Union requested that NATO also assist in the transport of civilian police. The North Atlantic Council, the Alliance's principal decision-making body, agreed to the request on 5 August. It is being carried out in close coordination with the European Union, which has the lead on police matters in Darfur. Further airlifts are scheduled for September.

#### NATO exercise helps Russian rescue

The United Kingdom team that helped rescue seven Russian sailors from a stricken submarine on 7 August said a recent NATO exercise had provided valuable practice for the operation. During the rescue, the UK Royal Navy's Scorpio 45, a remotecontrolled mini-sub, spent five hours cutting fishing nets and cables that had trapped the Russian submarine at a depth of 190 meters off the Kamchatka peninsula.

Previous rescue attempts had failed and, after three days underwater, the seven-member Russian crew was beginning to run low on oxygen and suffer from exposure to low temperatures.

#### Practising for real-life emergencies

Just a few weeks earlier, the Scorpio and its team had been put to extensive use during a two-week NATO submarine rescue exercise in the Mediterranean, Exercise Sorbet Royal 2005. The exercise, held from 17 to 30 June, simulated the rescue of over 200 sailors trapped in 'sunken submarines' on the bottom of the Mediterranean. Rescue personnel and equipment from 14 countries took part in the exercise.

"The success of such operations depends a great deal on the skill of the pilot in manoeuvring the Scorpio underwater," said Neil Hopkins, a member of the UK Submarine Escape and Rescue Project, "During Sorbet Royal the Scorpio was in the water for two weeks, carrying out complicated tasks day in and day out."

#### Knowledge is key

The rescue operation also benefited from work done by the NATO-led Submarine Escape and Rescue Working Group (SMERWG), which facilitates the exchange of information on available rescue techniques and equipment.

The Group, of which Russia is a member, has established an International Submarine Escape and Rescue Liaison Office (ISMERLO) in Norfolk, Virginia, United States. This office runs a database through which information on accidents and offers of assistance from across the globe is channelled.

As a result, the UK team had full access to the specifications of the stricken Russian submarine, and therefore knew what equipment would be needed to run a successful operation.

"Knowing the specifications and having the right gear in place is essential in what is a race against time," said Commander Gavin Short, a submarine expert in NATO's International Military Staff. "At the same time, the Russian authorities knew that the UK had the right equipment for the job."

The Alliance is currently developing several other submarine rescue initiatives, including a study on submarine rescue interoperability and the development of a NATO Submarine Rescue System.

#### NATO diversifies aid to African Union

NATO's continuing support to the African Union Mission in Sudan (AMIS) has become more diverse as NATO offers capacity building training as well as logistical support to the African Union.

NATO's logistical support to AMIS in the form of the coordination of strategic airlift began in mid-July. Since then NATO has transported

approximately 1,950 troops, including 49 members of the civilian police force. These airlift missions are a blend of efforts by NATO and the European Union to create a combined endeavour to promote peace in the Darfur region.

In addition to the airlift missions, NATO is also providing Staff Capacity Building workshops for the African Union's officers within the Deployed Integrated Task Force (DITF) Headquarters in Ethiopia. The training is based on strategic level planning and focuses on technologies and techniques to create an overall analysis and understanding of Darfur and to identify the areas in which the application of AU assets can influence and shape the

operating environment to deter crises. The training, covering command and control procedures, reporting systems, battle rhythm, intelligence collection and analysis, force generation, situational awareness and task force and headquarters standard operating procedures refinement, began on 1 August. At their request, the AU officers are also receiving informational briefs on NATO's experiences with the NATO Response Force concept, and deployed operations in Afghanistan.

In a separate activity, NATO is also providing 14 officers in support of a United Nations (UN) organized MAP Exercise for the AMIS Force Headquarters in Sudan. In this exercise, NATO has provided exercise writers and tactical-level controllers. The MAP Exercise will run until 26 August.

In May NATO's North Atlantic Council (NAC) agreed that the Alliance could support the AU mission by providing strategic airlift and training, especially in the areas of command and control and operational planning.

## Canadian students serve as tour guides

Every year, Veterans Affairs Canada hires groups of Canadian university students to spend four months in Europe to serve as tour guides and hosts at the two World War One Canadian Memorial Parks in Beaumont-Hamel and Vimy, France.


In the beginning of this month, four of these guides had the opportunity to take a tour themselves, courtesy of the Canadian Contingent here at Geilenkirchen. Karyn Belanger from Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, Paul Battin from St Mary's, Ontario, Sonya Diesberger from Moncton, New Brunswick and Dan Levesque from Quebec City, Quebec sat back and let me, the Canadian Contingent Unit Historian, do the tour guide duties and show them a little of what we do here at the base.

The group started with a tour of a jet on the flight line. Together with Capt. Mark Lachapelle we explained the operation of an AWACS in flight from the flight deck and mission crew perspectives. The group then proceeded to the simulator building where they were treated to thirty minutes of life on the flight deck in the flight deck simulator. The instructor pilot, Turkish Air Force pilot Capt. Ali Hazar, demonstrated a few touch-and-goes here at the main operating base. After the flight deck experience, Maj. Jerry Carell, escorted them into a mission crew simulator where all the 'radar blips' were explained to the guides.

No tour of the Canadian Contingent's operations would be complete without a stop at the Canadian Military Family Resource Centre at the Canadian National Support Unit. The Director, Ms. Elizabeth MacDonald, showed the guides the support network set up by the Canadian Forces for the families of members of the Canadian Forces. After the stop the group took home some back issues of Canadian newspapers and magazines, something they sorely miss at their shared house in Arras, France.

The final stop on base was the NATO shop in the Sentry Club where the special visitors picked up some souvenirs of their trip to Geilenkirchen

This particular group of guides returned to Canada in the middle of August. Karen Belanger commented after the tour that the trip to Germany and the base was the perfect end to



their trip to Europe. They will be replaced by a new group of eager Canadian history buffs a week before they go back to Canada.

The Vimy and Beaumont-Hamel sites are open to visitors year round, but with limited hours during the winter months. Beaumont-Hamel Newfoundland Memorial Park is nine kilometres north of Albert, France and the Vimy Memorial Park is ten kilometres north of Arras, France. The base of the Vimy Memorial will be undergoing extensive renovations until 2007 and is completely obscured by tenting. However, the Vimy Grange Tunnel tour, preserved crater line and reconstructed trenches are still open to visitors.

Teuta, the friendly waitress, will give you service with a smile. Dragon is master of the kitchen and is also seen serving food and insuring his guests are satisfied. But his dishes are about 'letting the food speak for itself', and it is good. Tasting his work underscores his philosophy.

Laanna, his beautiful wife, will also assist you in making you feel satisfied and full. With few exceptions, meat and fish are both accorded respect. I had the lamb medallions with herbs and garlic butter sauce. Give me a five star yummies on that one. The house wine is served in pottery pitchers and taste great. I haven't ventured into the wine list because the house wine works just fine.

Desserts come from the 'bigger is better' school, and they're a little daunting after these generous appetizers and entrees. But you can always have a little of their home made Flan with caramel sauce. Ask for your check and a little after-dinner drink of something tasting of anise will put the cap on a great experience.

Some restaurants are the dining equivalent of watching bowling on TV; Bo-ring. Not at El Gitano. As an extra treat, go Wednesday and experience the hot and cold buffet for  $\in 10$ , go on a Saturday and there is live Spanish guitar music, go Sunday and get a five course meal for  $\in 13.50$ , you can't help but to enjoy the difference. It's nice to know about a place where you can get a respectable meal with a side of style at a price that doesn't make you feel like you just paid your mortgage.
