

NAEW&CF and E-3A Component Dual Change of Command



Command of the NATO Airborne Early Warning and Control Force and of the NATO E-3A Component both changed hands here September 7 in a combined ceremony presided over by the **Supreme Allied Commander** Europe, Gen. James L. Jones.

The commander of the NAEW&C Force, Maj. Gen. Gary A. Winterberger, U.S. Air Force, announced his retirement from active duty and handed over the position of Force Commander to Maj. Gen. Axel R. Tüttelmann, German Air Force. Gen. Tüttelmann served nearly two years as the commander of the E-3A Component and now moves to the **AWACS Force Command headquarters** post, which is co-located with the Supreme Headquarters Allied Powers in Europe at Mons, Belgium.

The E-3A Component also received a new commander as Brig. Gen. Stephen D. Schmidt, U.S. Air Force, assumed command. Gen. Schmidt served formerly as Director of Logistics for the U.S. Air Force's Air Education and Training Command. He is also a command pilot with more than 3,780 hours logged in the B-52H.

E-3A Component Supports Hurricane Relief Efforts

The Component demonstrated its rapid response capability by generating a very short-notice TCA flight to deliver a load of 14 large tents, 24,000 blankets and 600 beds to Little Rock Air Force Base, Arkansas, on 12 September.

Since that first flight, the effort continues and the Component expects to deliver nearly 100 tons of critical supplies via flights scheduled through the end of September. Each mission requires more than 20 hours of flying time and TCAs are now picking up cargo donated by NATO allies at Ramstein Air Base, Germany.

Less than 36 hours after receiving notification from SHAPE that the NATO Response Force had been activated to aid in relief efforts following Hurricane Katrina, a TCA from here picked up a U.S.-bound load of relief supplies in Prague, Czech Republic, 11 September.

Ambassador to the North Atlantic Council led to a vote on Friday, 9 September, to provide relief support and SHAPE took action immediately.

Initiating the first-ever humanitarian relief effort by the NATO Response Force, SHAPE directed that NATO

A request for support from the U.S. forces begin planning and by Sunday morning, the first TCA arrived in Prague to pick up a load of supplies.

> The U.S. Ambassador to the Czech Republic, Bill Cabaniss, and the Czech Foreign Minister, Cyril Svoboda, met the aircraft and spoke with international media about the mission.

Ambassador Cabaniss thanked both NATO and the Czech Republic for the support.

The TCA arrived at Little Rock Air Force Base, Arkansas, on Monday, 12 September, and unloaded the supplies. The U.S. Federal Emergency Management Agency provided trucks and moved the beds, tents and blankets to refugee camps in northern Louisiana.

One TCA can carry up to 85 passengers and crew and 8 to 10 tons of cargo, depending on load configuration.







It is with deep regret that we bid farewell to our dear friend and colleague, Trond Skaugvolldal, who passed away on 31 August 2005 after a short but courageous fight against a serious illness.

Trond was employed by the NAEW&CF E-3A Component as a member of the NATO Civilian Staff on 12 October 1981. He was a Technical Librarian in the then Software Support Centre (SSC), now the Information Technology Wing.

Trond was born in Narvik, Norway on 26 February 1953. He began his career as a member of the Royal Norwegian Air Force and served in SHAPE and NPC Glons prior to joining the Component.

A unique and special character, Trond was also a creature of habit, as his work friends will confirm – departing at 1100 sharp each day for his lunch at the IDH; after work, stopping off for an Altbier at the Frisbee Club, only leaving for home once the 50/50 draw had taken place.

He always looked forward to, and spent weeks planning for, his annual retreat to his cabin (of which he was very proud) in Norway. Trond was an avid player of 'Bosseln' with his German friends on Fathers' Day. Other interests that he enjoyed included model railways, sailing, and his beloved Lexus.

Trond was highly respected and will be fondly remembered by all who knew him.

The Component extends its sincere condolences to his family.

I would like to thank everybody, work colleagues or friends, who recently supported my brother Trond Skaugvolldal through his serious illness. Although I was in Norway with the rest of Trond's family for most of those two months, I know that Trond was not alone.



This is a guest column by a NAEW&CF E-3A Component member.

Do you remember IVAN? It was last year September and Ivan was the last in a sequence of other Hurricanes devastating Florida's landscape. Let me tell you how it is to make it through such an event, because I was there.

When Hurricane Ivan came closer to Florida's peninsula the evacuation of the citizens of Pensacola and the surrounding area started. The military installation I went to for my NDI (Non Destructive Inspection) course was Naval Air Station Pensacola.

They too prepared for the evacuation. Everything went smoothly and professionally. I received a briefing from the Foreign Student Office. Many buses were picking up the soldiers, mostly young recruits between 18 and 21 years.

Everybody with a bus license was ordered to drive a bus. It was hot and humid, and the buses were packed with more than fifty people. Some students also had their wives and babies on the vehicle. I was the only foreign soldier who joined the evacuation.

I prepared myself for a longer trip, since the official evacuation plan was talking of Escambia County in the north. I took my cooler with ice-cold drinks, a knife, toothbrush and my sports clothes. Surprisingly we stopped after a short drive at the 'Blue Angels Elementary School'. This building was marked as a designated shelter because of its construction with stonewalls and the building was quite low.

All together we were approx. 650 soldiers and their relatives. The classrooms with carpets were locked. We were sleeping on the bare floors lined up with barely space between each other. The lucky ones had at least a blanket. We were told to prepare ourselves for maximum two days.

We had to wait nearly two days before IVAN made landfall. The strength was decreasing from the strongest category 5 Hurricane into a category 3. Before we could even hear the hurricane the electricity was gone. In USA it is common practice to have the power lines above the streets hanging between poles. They always collapse first. At the same time we had



no tab-water anymore either.

Approximately ten Dixie toilets filled up rapidly. Hygiene became a problem. But the instructors were prepared and provided 'Baby wipes'. American troops in Iraq are using this 'system' as well.

I was sleeping in the big dining room underneath the movie screen. At 0200 I woke up because it became noisy. Like a huge steam locomotive passing very closely.

A hurricane is one of the most incredible phenomena I ever experienced. This was not a normal storm like I experienced on Germany's coast. This one was the most furious and frightening at the same time. It was howling, and in gusts it tore apart even stronger constructions. If a building is not finished off by the hurricane, then torrential rainfall does the rest. As I looked through the window of a door, Hurricane Ivan blasted away the patio shed. I was glad to be in a safe building!

Since there was nothing else to do, I went back to sleep. Next morning the hurricane passed along into the neighbouring states. We could go out, staying close to our shelter. What we saw was pure destruction. The cars parked on one side of the building complex had lost all their windows and were filled up with water and got a lot of dents. Small rocks from the flat roof had flown like bullets into the cars. A human being obviously could not have survived. People on the street couldn't withhold their tears.

The instructors invited me to check their houses. So we started this 'adventure tour', passing flooded areas alongside houses which were totally destroyed. Entering the house of Sgt. Spradley, we walked through 20 cm of water. Upstairs the bedroom was covered with insulation material from the ceiling. This house was literally trash. I was speechless when he opened his garage and smiled... his boat with trailer was OK; to see something positive within all this destruction seemed to be quite common. This instructor lost nearly everything. His car was parked on base. It was a brand new Offroader; Ivan also wrecked his car.

While going from house to house to give each instructor a damage report of his property, we had to walk slalom around the uprooted trees and created waves in the water like a speedboat. Wherever we talked to the people in the neighbourhood, I saw the same picture over and over. First the citizens raised the American Flag, then they started to clean the destruction from themselves and their neighbours and when asked how it goes they smiled and provided black humour comments.

For nearly five days we stayed in the 'Blue Angels Elementary School'. As the air conditioning also didn't work it became pretty humid. My sleeping place under the movie screen was soaked. But whenever I talked to my young comrades they smiled and showed a positive attitude. Since I became a little bit itchy because I did not have the chance to wash myself, I helped myself by using a solar shower filled with the water of a nearby pawn. We were just preparing a plan for how to make the next days more comfortable when the good news arrived... we were going to Biloxi, Mississippi!

Unfortunately our base in Pensacola was badly hit by Ivan and all barracks were flooded and partially destroyed. I have heard it took them nearly seven months to get back to normal

operation. Nearly all my equipment, clothing and food were still in my room on the Naval Air Station.

We went by bus to Mississippi, passing Alabama. Everybody was happy but also tired. We arrived at Keesler AFB. The base commander welcomed each person with a handshake. What a great feeling of getting normal food again. The food was excellent and it was the finest kitchen I have ever seen in my 28-year career.

The rest of my story is short. Because of the overwhelming support of the people of Keesler AFB, all the NDI classes were completed. People were moved out of their barracks to make room for us. During my time in Biloxi I met a lot of people from the south supporting me whenever I asked for help.

I still see myself sitting on a rocking chair on the patio of Jefferson Davis's house. He was the first and very last President of the Southern States during the Civil War. Now, after Katrina, all this is gone and lost forever. After I saw the first pictures of the destruction of the Gulf Coast of Biloxi I could at least imagine what they went through.

A hurricane with the strength of Ivan or now Katrina is so devastating that even we, in our well-protected houses, wouldn't be safe. It can happen anywhere.

KATRINA

Let us help the people of Biloxi, New Orleans and all other families who lost their homes. Let us take part and support the Gulf Coast area.

The 12th Czech International Air Festival 2005 took place at Brno International Airport on 10 and 11 September. NATO countries, as well as non-NATO states were displaying their different types of aircraft. Even tanks and anti-aircraft missile systems of the Czech Army were on display, and search and rescue actions and parachuting were shown to the curious visitors.

On Friday 9 September, Squadron 1 with a crew of 28 of eight different nationalities under the leadership of deployment commander Maj. Emmanuel de Craene and aircraft commander Lt. Col. Hans Grunwald flew to Brno International Airport to prepare the aircraft for the open display on Saturday and Sunday.

The opening and flying hours of the air show were from 0800 to 1700, with a full program for each day. Already early in the morning the entire area was covered with visitors, and people had to wait for more than one-and-a-half hours to see the E-3A from inside. On both days the E-3A was the open display highlight and probably more than 30,000 interested people visited the aircraft and put lots of different questions to the crew members who explained the different sections inside the aircraft.

Next to the aircraft the crew had a booth with Component patches, posters and T-shirts. For the children, crewmembers handed out stickers, posters and paper cutout AWACS models the whole day to prevent boredom during the waiting time. The youngsters were happy to receive info material and nearly every second person at the air show got some of the handouts.

On Saturday there was a big tombola covered by the Squadron's crew and organized by 1st Lt. Ralf Repp. Prizes were E-3A drawings by MSgt. Dirk Schmidt from Squadron 1. All the takings, about €500, were donated to an orphanage.

On Sunday, the Chief of the General Staff of the Armed Forces of the Czech

Republic, Lt. Gen. Pavel Stefka, visited the NATO E-3A. He was greeted by Maj. Emmanuel de Craene and Lt. Col. Hans Grunwald and received a guided tour. He listened to the explanations and was impressed by the technology of the aircraft and had several questions regarding data-link connectivity to fighter aircraft, in relation to the new Swedish-made Czech fighter-aircraft JAS-39 Gripen.

For the crews the air show ended on Sunday evening with the official Hangar party. At this party the best displays were honoured and the official donation of the Tombola took place. It was also a good opportunity to get in touch with the newer NATO or non-NATO states which participated at the Festival.

Looking back, the air show was a big success. This was a good opportunity for the Component to show the aircraft to the public in one of the newer NATO countries. One indicator of the public interest is the fact that some visitors travelled 400 km and even visitors from Germany came to see the displays.


