

Lt. Col Brett Venable takes over Medical Task Force

Medical Task Force Shelby conducted a change of command ceremony June 25 at Building 1402, Camp Shelby Joint Forces Training Center.

Outgoing MTFS Commander Col. James D. Grady relinquished command of the unit to Lt. Col. Brett H. Venable, the event being symbolized by the ceremonial passing of the unit colors, and hosted by the Commander of the Dwight D. Eisenhower Army Medical Center, Col. Christopher M. Castle.

"Jim Grady is a serious and committed Soldier and physician who has been dragging his young Family around the planet through a series of demanding and competitive assignments," said Castle. "He also deployed in Operation Enduring Freedom as an Operations Task Force Surgeon. No other could have commanded this Task Force these past few years. Venable attended graduate school at Syracuse University where he earned a Master of Business Administration from the Whitman School of Management

and a Master of Public Administration from the Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs. He is accompanied to this new command by his wife, Anja.
