

First Battle Staff class graduates at Camp Shelby

The First Army Training Academy held commencement for 15 students attending the U.S. Army Sergeants Major Academy, Battle Staff Noncommissioned Officer Course (BSNCOC) Video Teleconference Training March 26.

Command Sgt. Maj. Milton C. Elliot, command sergeant major of the 2nd Battalion, 346th Regiment, was the guest speaker for the graduation.

"This was a pilot class for Camp Shelby utilizing VTT," said Sgt. 1st Class Troy D. Batiste, Operations NCO for the 2nd Battalion, 410th Field Artillery Regiment and Assistant Instructor for the BSNCOC. "The instructors here were liaisons for instructors at Fort Bliss, Texas."

"I felt the Military Decision Making Process (MD-MP) unit of the course was

the most challenging," said Sgt. 1st Class Katrina F. Crawford, native of Abilene, Texas and Senior Human Resources NCO for the 3rd Battalion, 346th Regiment. "There was a lot of information to take in [from] a three-day block of instruction."

According to the U.S. Army Sergeants Major Academy, BSNCOC is the only course offered by the U.S. Army to educate NCO staff members on how to operate as part of a battalion or higher staff. The course instruction concentrates on the battle staff duties and responsibilities of the coordinating and special staff sections, regardless of the NCOs functional area of assignment.

"I thought the course was challenging," said Sgt. 1st Class Peter J. Novak, 177th Armored Brigade Staff Intelligence NCOIC and native of Henniker, N.H. "I think the assistance of the instructors is the key to our success because of their willingness
