AmeriCorps group trains at Shelby

Team Leaders of the AmeriCorps National Civilian Community Corps campus at Vicksburg put their physical and leadership skills to the test in the Leadership Reaction Course at Camp Shelby Joint Forces Training Center Jan. 26.

"We put our team leaders through a series of challenges to test their reaction times and leadership abilities in the NCCC program," said Rich Smith, deputy regional director for programming at the Vicksburg campus. "Each of them will be leading a team of AmeriCorps and NCCC members for a 10-month period, so this is part of their month-long preparation process to make sure they're ready lead a group of individuals, many of whom are their age or close to it, in multiple service projects throughout the southeast United States."

The AmeriCorps and NCCC team leaders negotiated a series of challenging obstacles at the LRC, each with its own unique set of difficulties that required teamwork and communication to overcome.

"I really enjoyed this because of all the peer feedback we got," said Ana Rea, of Greenville, Texas. "I've never done anything like this before, and it's definitely physically challenging, but I think every single obstacle that we did incorporated not only the physical but also the mental side of problem solving, which really helped to push us to go above and beyond our own strengths."

This event marked the first use of Camp Shelby facilities by AmeriCorps and NCCC personnel.

Camp Shelby is an excellent training ground, and nowhere else can we find facilities like this at very little cost to our organization," said Smith. "The Camp Shelby staff and Youth Challenge group here have been very hospitable to us and we hope that this will be a lasting partnership."

The Vicksburg campus of the AmeriCorps and NCCC specializes in projects ranging from disaster response and long-term recovery to working for state parks, Habitat for Humanity, schools and a variety of other organizations and short-term service projects throughout the southeastern United States.
