Motorcycle safety is of utmost importance....

Motorcycle crashes claim the lives of more than 2,000 riders each year, and military riders are no exception. Motorcyclists are 16 times more likely than passenger car occupants to die in a traffic accident and about four times as likely to be injured. While only 20 percent of car crashes result in injury or death, an astounding 80 percent of motorcycle crashes involve injury or death according to the statistics from the National Highway Traffic Administration (NHTSA).

All drivers of cars or large vehicles have a responsibility to watch out for the motorcycle riders who use the highways alongside them. Many drivers fail to notice motorcyclists on the roadways because of distractions such as cell phones, other

large vehicles on the road or simple negligence. Remember that motorcycles can be easy to miss! Motorcycles are already more difficult to spot than cars because of their smaller profiles, and drivers are conditioned to look for other cars, not motorcyclists.

Traffic, weather and road conditions require motorcyclists to react differently than drivers, so it is often difficult to judge and predict when riders may take evasive action. This means car drivers must always be aware of their surroundings. Remember to turn and look instead of relying on rear view mirrors which have huge blind spots that can obscure motorcyclist and even other cars..

Car drivers are more likely to be involved in an accident with a motorcycle when performing common driving tasks, such as making a left turn in front of a rider or failing to

notice a motorcyclist riding in a blind spot. The chances for accidents go up exponentially when hazardous road conditions are present. Potholes, wet leaves, railroad tracks and other obstructions may force a motorcyclist to take unexpected evasive action or sudden emergency maneuvers, and unless a driver is paying attention and maintaining good situational awareness, the motorcyclist may appear to "come out of nowhere." This is especially true when operating sport utility vehicles, delivery vans, and large trucks that may block motorcyclists from view.

If you ride a motorcycle, using the following preventative measures will help if you are involved in a motorcycle crash. The most important factor for reducing injury if involved in an accident is the proper wear and use of personal protective gear. Gloves, leather clothing, proper footwear, eye protection and helmets are designed to minimize injury, but they are only effective when worn. The helmet is by far the motorcycle rider's most important piece of safety equipment because it protects against head and brain injuries.

The Department of Defense (DoD) requires the use of a helmet by all personnel who operate motorcycles, even in areas where helmets are not required by state law. The helmet must be Department of Transportation (DOT) certified and must fasten under the chin properly. Novelty style helmets that do not meet DOT standards are prohibited due to safety concerns, and may not be worn.

Another requirement all military and civilian riders need is operator's education. The DoD requires completion of a Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF) approved course prior to operating a motorcycle on Federal Military installations.

Motorcycle Safety relies on the rider being aware of other motorists at all times, and making sure that other motorists are aware of him. Motorcyclists also have the responsibility of avoiding activities that cause accidents such as speeding, drinking and driving, being under the influence of drugs, disobeying traffic laws, etc. Remember to ride within your own abilities and stay within your bike's safe capabilities.

The Camp Shelby Joint Forces Training Center Safety Office conducts Motorcycle Safety Foundation approved motorcycle safety courses on a periodic basis for all personnel who intend to operate motorcycles on the installation.
