AARTS Transition

The Army/American Council on Education Registry Transcript System (AARTS) is in the process of transitioning to the Joint Services Transcript (JST).

The JST will produce a FREE uniform transcript of all military training and experiences to Service members from all branches. The new electronic transcripts will include Enlisted, Warrant Officer and Officer training, joint military training, and DANTES-funded standardized test scores.

The transition to JST is expected to be completed by Jan. 1, 2013. During the transition, the process of requesting an AARTS transcript via GoArmyEd or the AARTS website will not change. USM spring classes

USM will offer college classes on Camp Shelby for the Spring Term beginning in January. There will be early registration in mid October. ENG 102, MAT 101 and PSY 110 will begin January 14, 2013. Beginning with the Spring Term, a minimum number of students for each class will be required. ENG 102 and PSY 110 require 10 Soldiers/students; MAT 101 requires seven (7) Soldiers/students. Classes will be open to the Camp Shelby community. Soldiers will have priority for class seats. Textbooks will be FREE to Soldiers. All students must be admitted to USM to attend the classes. It is recommended that prospective students interested in the Spring Term classes visit the Camp Shelby Education Center, building 1813 for admissions information and the use of Tuition Assistance (TA) through GoArmyEd. WASHINGTON, D.C. – Congressman Steven Palazzo was formally sworn into the 113th Congress last week after being re-elected to represent South Mississippi's 4th Congressional District for a second term.

"Over the past two years, I've had the honor of serving South Mississippi in the United States House of Representatives," Palazzo said. "The trust my constituents have placed in me is something I do not take for granted."

"The people of South Mississippi first sent me to Washington two years ago to work on real solutions to the problems facing our nation. There were many tough decisions to be made in the 112th Congress, and many more lie ahead."

"My resolve is the same now as it was two years ago – Congress must cut spending responsibly, enact true tax reform and promote a pro-growth agenda that will help get our struggling economy back on its feet. In every decision, I will continue to put Mississippi values and voices first."

In his first term, Palazzo served on the House Armed Services Committee and as chairman of the Space & Aeronautics Subcommittee on the Science, Space & Technology Committee. He was also chosen to serve alongside Majority Whip Kevin McCarthy as an Assistant Majority Whip. Palazzo recently learned he will retain these key committee assignments in the 113th Congress.

Palazzo saw many legislative successes in his first term in office. Perhaps his biggest accomplishment was passage of the landmark RESTORE
