

Not just moral... ethical

Each person has their own unique set of internal beliefs that act as norms for individual behavior. Some people are guided by religion, some by the "golden rule," still others by family traditions; but each set of norms acts as a guidepost on how to interact with others.

These internal guides are morals. They serve well in everyday life but they can vary greatly from person to person. For this reason, the military does not simply trust service members to act morally; instead, it mandates and prohibits particular behaviors. External rules on behavior, such as these, are called ethics, and for service members they are contained in the Joint Ethics Regulation (JER).

The JER sets limits on gifts, fundraising, conflicts of interest, relationships,

use of government property and many other subjects. It is important for all service members to be familiar with the JER, as actions that create even an appearance of impropriety are prohibited. But there are a couple of questions that can help everyone arrive at ethical answers.

Could my action create the appearance of impropriety?

How would my action look in if it appeared in a newspaper article?

Does the ethics counselor think my action is OK?

Even very moral people can violate the ethics rules, but if these questions are asked each time there is a potential ethical dilemma, the actions that follow will not violate the JER and there will be the cover of having an opinion from the ethics counselor. The actions that survive this questioning will be not just moral...but ethical.
