Small and beautiful

For many people in other parts of Europe, Luxembourg is best known for its radio and television stations of the RTL Group, the largest TV, radio and Production Company. It is also the uplink home of SES Astra, the carrier of major European satellite services for Germany and Britain. The Grand Duchy of Luxembourg, a constitutional monarchy, is an independent sovereign state ruled by a Grand Duke, located between Belgium, France and Germany. The country is 84 km long and 52 km wide and hereby it is one of the smallest countries in Europe.

The written history of Luxembourg starts in the year 963, when Siegfried, Count of the Ardennes, and founder of the Luxembourg Dynasty, had a castle built on the territory of the present-day capital of Luxembourg. This castle was the origin of the establishment of a town, which later was to develop into a formidable fortress, known by the name of 'Gibraltar of the North'.


At its height, the fortress was girdled by three ring walls studded with 24 forts, and linked underground by a 23- kilometer network of casemates. In 1994, Luxembourg City was added to the UNESCO World Heritage list. Also it was the first city to be named Müllerthal: The 'Schiessentümpel' waterfall in the 'little Switzerland area' of Luxembourg. Photo Marc Theis

European Capital of Culture twice, the first time in 1995 and the second time in 2007.

"Especially the Petrus Valley (Petrus Tal) is a feast for the eyes," said Mr. Christian Lentz, who works for (TCA) contract company Cargolux and is one of the few residents of Luxembourg working on base. "From the valley you have a splendid view on the fortress and of hiking trails and old gardens. The town itself has old pubs and restaurants and is certainly worth a visit."

When Count Siegfried built his castle he didn't know that his home was to become the cradle of one of the smallest, yet one of the richest countries in the world. The industrial sector, which was dominated until the 1960s by steel, has diversified to include chemicals, rubber, and pother products. In the past few decades, growth in the financial sector has more than compensated for the decline in steel. Services, especially banking and other financial exports, account for the majority of economic output.

Luxembourg's contribution to its defence and to NATO consists of a small army, not even 1,000 people. As a landlocked country, it has no navy, and it has no air force. Despite that, it's a full member of the E-3A Component. The country 'rescued' the Component in the early eighties. The international regulations governing military air traffic stipulate that all military aircraft must bear national makings and be registered in a country. So, it was impossible to use NATO insignia to register the Component's aircraft.



Notwithstanding the fact that Luxembourg doesn't have its own air force it offered to register the aircraft and that is why the Luxembourg Lion adorns the tails of the E-3A and Trainer Cargo Aircraft.

The country is divided into two clearly defined regions. The 'Oesling' in the north, which is part of the Ardennes, on the western rim of the Eifel, and covers one-third of the territory. It is a wooded country of great scenic beauty. The 'Good Country' in the centre and the south, covering the remainder of the territory, is mainly rolling farmland and woods. It's bordered in the east by the wine-producing valley of the Moselle, and in the extreme southwest by a narrow strip of red earth which forms the Luxembourg ironore basin.

"Luxembourg is a small peaceful island in Europe," said Lentz, who after 22 years in Germany is still proud of his country of birth.



The Tactical Leadership Programme opens in Spain

In the beginning of October, the Tactical Leadership Programme (TLP) in Spain officially stood up at Albacete Airbase. More than 100 officials from the ten NATO nations participating in TLP were on hand for the opening ceremony, which was hosted by the Spanish Air Force. The guest speaker was the Spanish Air Force Chief of Staff, General Jose Jimenez-Ruiz.

TLP's primary mission is to train mission commanders who, in a span of a few hours, organize, plan, and execute air operations involving multiple military aircraft and aircrew. The 15-sortie flying course syllabus includes offensive air operations, close air support, air interdiction, and combat search and rescue.

The Tactical Leadership Programme originally started at Furstenfeldbrueck AB Germany in 1978. A year-and-a-half later it moved to Jever AB where it remained until 1988. The program then moved to its most recent home at Florennes AB Belgium where it trained NATO personnel for the last 20 years. For more than 30 years the TLP has trained thousands of aircrew, many of whom have participated in



multiple combat actions around the world since the mid-1980s. Alumni include numerous general officers in the various NATO air forces as well as combatant commanders.

General Jiminez stated in his opening remarks, "Albacete will be the focal point in Europe for our warfighters to stimulate change and to enhance the tactical capabilities of our air forces." While focusing on the recent completion of the 21 million euro TLP complex, complete with new hangar and dormitories for 500-plus visiting students and support personnel, General Jiminez concluded, "Our aim is learning how to work together in the most effective and efficient manner, giving our pilots and aircrews the tools to win wars, the tools to keep our air forces as relevant in the future as they have been in the past."

In addition to the six 4-week flying courses conducted annually, TLP performs on average 15 academic courses ranging from Electronic Warfare and Composite Air Operations, to Air Defense Systems, Personnel Recovery, and Air-Land Integration. One course a year is held for members of the Partnership for Peace, eagerly seeking to include basic NATO functions to their emerging joint capabilities.

The first flying course for TLP Spain is scheduled from 9 November to 4 December 2009, and will include participants from the NATO E-3A Component at Geilenkirchen who will perform support for both blue and red forces, as well as act as a white force to enhance training goals and objectives.



Top Gun over the Israeli fighters atta

Decimomannu, known as 'Deci', on the sunny Mediterranean island of Sardinia is well known for its European fighter community and outstanding air combat training facilities. STAREX (Sardinia Tactical Air Ranges Exercise) 2009 was the place to be for a spectacular air defence exercise with command and control provided by a NATO E-3A, manned with crews from the Training Wing.

The exercise was hosted by the Italian Air Force and included 5 F-151 Eagles and 5 F-16I Sufas from the Israeli Air Force (IAF). The Italian Air Force contributed with 10 F-16s, 10 Tornados, 6 AMXs and 4 AV-8s from the aircraft carrier Garibaldi and Eurofighter aircraft flying daily sorties out of Grosseto, which is situated in Tuscany on the mainland of Italy. In total more than 40 fighters turned and burned for two weeks, using all methods of advanced air warfare tactics.

Training Wing Exercise Director Major Sergio Manfre deployed 82 crewmembers, split into 2 crews, Advon and maintenance personnel

to Sardinia. As Deployment Commander for this exercise many times, I believe this year's exercise once again offered spectacular training only two flying hours from our home base. A huge 'over-water' Air Combat Manoeuvring Installation (ACMI) around the island offers unique training possibilities with far fewer restrictions than Central Europe. In Sardinia it is possible to drop chaff and flares, fly supersonic and use Electronic Counter Measures Jamming pods. Flying days were divided into 3 periods. Morning and noon events were normally Combined Air Operations (COMAO) - a large scale exercise - with an average of 30 participating aircraft each. Afternoons were reserved for Air Combat training.

Aircraft Commanders Maj. Andrea Franceschinis and Capt. Willem Hadders piloted the first week's A-Crew. They launched every day shortly before lunch to cover the 2nd COMAO event. Final mission details were received via radio from Lt. Col. Fabio Militello while the E-3A was airborne. Weapons Controllers built dynamic mission scenarios and tactics 'on the fly'. Fighter Allocator Capt. Juan Vazquez Moreira designated the flights to his two Controllers: Capt. Yadira Greeson took the Red Air Migs, simulated by Italian F-16s, in the northern part of the training area, and SMSgt. Kris Wouters, controlling the blue force, took the attacking F-15s and F-16s into the southern tip of the STAREX airspace. All Israeli fighters are equipped with a helmetmounted aiming vision system, the Elbit Dash System, which is worldwide the best. It allows the pilot to visually follow the target and

release the Python missile that is so agile that it will kill any airplane in any situation. The true motto of the Israeli pilots is "...you kill what you see."

Only 10 minutes after takeoff from Deci the fighters, with call signs like Sniper, Hammer, Stingray or Arrow, were ready for their 60-minute area time and started the engagement scenarios. With good planned tactics and excellent defensive directions given by Tactical Director Maj. Ignacio 'Nacho' Lanzat the blue F-16 force were able to defend us against the attacking fighters from Israel, which tried to attack our aircraft, call sign 'Magic'. Initially they claimed hits on us. However, after each mission an intensive debrief with video analysis and voice recorder replay assessed the capabilities of the flying and controlling crew and in the abovementioned event it turned out that the claimed hits on us were invalid shots. So the AWACS crew and the defending Italian F-16 pilots left the ACMI building to go for a 'victory' Espresso.

An unusual sight for European jet jockeys was the long hair of the Israeli reserve pilots. In civil life they have occupations such as computer engineers or students and fly normally <mark>o</mark>nly once per week. Sometimes up to 70% of a squadron's personnel are reservists but their performance was still outstanding. The IAF officially claims that it has never lost a fighter in direct air-to-air combat. "This underlines the great achievements of Israeli training, said Maj. Joshua K., an experienced instructor F-151 pilot. Every day they launched all their scheduled sorties without a single abort resulting from technical causes. There is no doubt that the IAF today is arguably the world's best-trained and most capable air arm.

Controlling, pre- and debriefing, and arguing face to face with these experts from Israel and Italy was an absolute highlight for every participating aircrew member. The entire exercise was a fantastic experience for the two NATO E-3A crews.

The events described above continued over the two weeks and a significant improvement in combat tactics was noted. Training Wing is already hoping that NATO AWACS will be back in Sardinia next year and is looking forward to the next STAREX.

Children from the Geilenkirchen Elementary School visited several locations around the base on 23 October in order to celebrate Halloween. Halloween actually takes place in the night from 31 October to 1 November (All Saint's Day). Emigrants from Ireland brought this custom to America at the end of the 19th Century. Its earlier name was 'All Hallows Evening'.

Trick-or-treating is a customary celebration for children on Halloween. They go in costume from house to house, asking for treats such as candy or sometimes money, with the question, "Trick or treat?" The word 'trick' refers to a - mostly idle - threat to perform mischief on the homeowners or their property if no treat is given.


