Afghanistan holds successful, peaceful elections in Helmand, Nimroz provinces

HELMAND PROVINCE, Afghanistan – Afghanistan successfully held its third democratic election, April 5. Saturday's vote marks the third time Afghans held a presidential election and the first time without current Afghan President Hamid Karzai's name on the ballot since the overthrow of the Taliban. President Karzai was chosen as the interim president during the 2002 Loya Jirga. During 2004, President Karzai became the first democratically elected president in Afghanistan and was re-elected for a five-year term during 2009.
