Last Marines exit Sangin, Afghanistan

FORWARD OPERATING BASE NOLAY, Afghanistan - The final Marines and sailors of Forward Operating Base Nolay exited the Sangin Valley, leaving the 2nd Brigade, 215th Corps, Afghan National Army in full control of the FOB and the surrounding area for the first time without coalition forces in place since they first entered during 2006. The Marines and sailors from Security Force Assistance Advisor Team 2-215 arrived at Camp Leatherneck following a seven-month deployment and a convoy out of Sangin Valley, May 5. On the same day the last Marines of 1st Battalion, 7th Marine Regiment departed FOB Sabit Qadam, also in Sangin. ([Read the STORY](#))

CAMP LEATHERNECK, Afghanistan – Multiple mounted patrols totaling 174 tactical vehicles with approximately 700 service members entered Camp Leatherneck's North Gate during the early morning hours and throughout the day, May 5. Tactical vehicles driving through a gate on the Marine Corps' central-Helmand base is a regular occurrence; however, this was a significant occasion for Marines, coalition forces and their Afghan counterparts. The armored vehicles were returning from Sangin, Afghanistan, an infamous battleground in northern Helmand province, and a village that will be remembered in Marine Corps and British history. FORWARD OPERATING BASE SABIT QADAM, Afghanistan – During the beginning years of the Marines' occupation in the Sangin District, the area was a hornet's nest of Taliban insurgents and became one of the most dangerous areas in the country.
