## Pass in Review

### Community college program

A test program to enlist community college students is being conducted in the New York metropolitan area.

The Community College Enlistment Program, designed to enlist students with special qualifications to fill hardskill Military Occupational Specialties, is limited initially to 100 students. The test began April 1 and will continue through June 30.

Qualified male and female applicants will complete recruit training at Marine Corps Recruit Depot, Parris Island, S.C. and be offered the following incentives for a four-year enlistment:

MOS assignment (except Occupational Fields 03, 08, 18, and 1371); four-year assignment in the MOS of their choice; appointment to private first class upon enlistment in the Delayed Enlistment Program; promotion to lance corporal at their first duty station or school; promotion to corporal after 13 months active duty and sergeant after 25 months; and a \$3,000 bonus for enlisting in MOSs eligible for bonus payment under the Technical Skills Enlistment Bonus Program.

Based upon CCEP success, it is anticipated that the program will be expanded next year to selected sites nationwide.

### Sergeant promotion criteria

WASHINGTON, MCNews — Corporals looking to add another stripe to their sleeve during July will be interested in ALMAR 063/80, which has eligibility criteria for sergeant promotions.

Commanders should compute: composite (cutting) scores for corporals with a date of rank of July 17, 1979 or earlier. Corporals must have an Armed Forces Active Duty Base Date of June 30, 1978 or earlier to be eligible.

Cutoff date for time-in-grade and time-in-service is June 30, 1980. The cutoff date for computing conduct and proficiency marks and all other elements is April 30, 1980.

Reports of composite scores must be entered on the unit diary no earlier than May 1 and not later than June 1. Corporals not having composite scores reported will be considered not recommended for promotion. Marines in transit during the period when composite scores must be submitted should have service record book entries containing composite scores and recommendations for promotions made by the detaching command prior to transfer.

Pay entry base dates should be used when computing line 10 of the composite score format.

### Unit deployment billets

WASHINGTON, MCNews — The 1st Marine Division is looking for Marines to fill billets in its infantry battalions participating in the Unit Deployment Program.

The program is open to all Marines who would normally be eligible for duty in an infantry battalion. However, Marines rotating from WestPac are also eligible but must be willing to waive their 24-month protection from participation in six-month Temporary Additional Duty deployments.

Under the program battalion deployments include six-months in a TAD status, with 18-months spent at Camp Pendleton between deployments.

Before assignment Marines must ensure that their End of Active Service is such that they can accommodate the battalion's deployment schedule. The schedule will not result in an early rotation out date from a present WestPac tour for participating Marines.

Sergeants and above can indicate their desire to participate in the program on fitness reports and AA forms. Corporals and below can submit requests via AA forms. Corporals and below, on dependents restricted overseas tours with units other than Marine security guard battalion, Marine support battalion or ship's detachments, can request assignment through the unit diary (paragraph 8098, PRIM).

### Lateral movement policies

WASHINGTON, MCNews — Guaranteed bonus money is available to Marines who reenlist under the Marine Corps revised Lateral Movement Program.

The bonus, paid prior to training for the new military occupational specialty is among the concepts announced in MCO 1220.5D that also allows Marines the opportunity to switch MOSs — particularly in aviation occupational fields. The expanded policy will aid Marines in getting out of overcrowded MOSs into undermanned and critical skill areas.

A highlight of the new Lateral Movement Program is the Agreement to Train Option Plan. It provides Marines with less than 10 years service guaranteed reenlistment money for training into an OF that has a Selected Reenlistment Bonus multiple. Under ATOP, Marines entering SRB occupational fields can collect money based on the multiple when they agree to reenlist or when they reenlist, whichever is higher. In the past, SRB payments were not made until Marines were trained in their new skill and had completed their obligated service.

The opportunity for first-term Marines to make lateral moves is also a new feature. Now Marines on their first enlistment don't have to reenlist to pick a new job. If they are in an overmanned MOS listed in MCO 1220.6D, they can request a lateral move to an undermanned MOS for which they qualify.

Less obligated service is also included in the program. New requirements call for two years of service for retraining that takes less than 18 weeks; three years service for formal schools longer than 18 weeks and; four years service to participate in ATOP.

Lateral moves interested in aviation skills have some added MOS choices. There are eight available MOSs in OF 60; seven in OF 59; four in OF 72; three in OF 70 and 73; two in OF 66 and one in OFs 61, 65 and 68. Marines must be in overcrowded OFs and MOSs to be able to move into an underpopulated OF or MOS. They can't move if still completing obligated service is part of a previous bonus program.

Lateral move procedures and available OFs and MOSs are listed in MCO 1220.5D, or by contacting local career planners.

## Tuition costs covered

The Marine Corps Tuition Assistance Program now has a policy for authorizing high school completion in addition to college degree completion.

The program enhances Marines' educational opportunities by providing financial assistance to cover high school and college tuition fees.

**THE NEW POLICY** authorizes 100 percent payment of tuition charges for military personnel enrolled in off-duty high school completion programs. The payment may only be authorized for courses offered by regionally accredited educational institutions. Public high schools are exempt from this requirement if they are approved by the appropriate state agency.

Locally, the maximum amount of course work cannot exceed one class in any one school term. Courses carry academic credit computed in Carnegie units.

For approved college and university courses, tuition assistance may not exceed 75 percent of the cost of each course. Course work can only be authorized at an academic level beyond the diploma or degree currently held by an individual.

This means that Marines who wish to pursue an undergraduate program of study cannot already possess a baccalaureate degree or any professional degree such as

law, dentistry or medicine. Graduate courses should not duplicate previous work and cannot be authorized at a level below the graduate degree previously earned.

**TUITION** assistance can only be granted for off-duty classroom courses offered by regionally accredited colleges and universities. The maximum amount of course work cannot exceed two courses in any one academic term. If the student desires to enroll in three or more courses, he must fund the additional courses on his own. The TAP-funded courses must carry academic credit expressed in either semester or quarter hours.

Under the college-level tuition policy only courses leading to an associate, baccalaureate or graduate degree are authorized. Credit courses in vocational or technical certificate programs offered by regionally accredited colleges will also be approved if applicants have not completed more than 30 semester or 45 quarter hours of college work.

Independent study and correspondence courses are not authorized under the tuition assistance program.

Under the college-level tuition policy only courses leading to an associate, baccalaureate or graduate degree are authorized. Credit courses in vocational or

technical certificate programs offered by regionally accredited colleges will also be approved if applicants have not completed more than 30 semester hours or 45 quarter hours of college work.

Independent study and correspondence courses are not authorized under the tuition assistance program.

Capt Michael Howard, education officer, Joint Education Center, elaborated on the reimbursement policy. "The student must realize that failure on his part to complete the course will result in his having to repay the government. Payment will have to be made in full by a certified check. Students who fail to comply may find their commanding officers or the disbursing officer involved in the case."

**REIMBURSEMENT** of tuition assistance is not required when students are unable to complete courses due to hospitalization, emergency leave, significant change in military duties, or unit deployment, or; if students attended classes, met all course requirements, and completed the courses but received failing grades due to academic deficiencies.

Students will be required to reimburse payments if they: voluntarily withdraw from courses; fail to complete courses

for reasons other than the ones already stated; receive failing grades for voluntary non-attendance; receive incomplete grades due to voluntary failure to meet course requirements (unless the incomplete is removed by a passing grade within 60 days), or receive failing grades as a result of failure to remove incomplete grades.

**STUDENTS WHO** drop out of courses and receive incomplete grades cannot enroll in additional courses until incomplete grades are removed or reimbursement is made. Those who voluntarily receive failing or incomplete grades in two courses will be ineligible for further tuition assistance until they present evidence of successful completion of two courses for which they themselves have provided full funding.

Students eligible for Veterans Administration educational assistance under the G.I. Bill will be counseled on benefits and assisted in making applications.

If you want to improve your educational level, look into the opportunities offered by the TAP. It would be difficult to find a better price for additional schooling.

## Legislation pends, Navy looks ahead

Many pieces of legislation of keen interest to Navy members are pending in congress currently. Master Chief Petty Officer Robert White, Jr. told listeners at a Secretary of the Navy briefing for the Navy/Marine Corps Council. However, the Navy isn't standing still in those areas in which it can move forward without congressional assistance.

White, the First Fleet Master Chief of Naval Shore Activities told the meeting, "Some things are being done to improve retention that don't require congressional approval."

He gave thumbnail sketches of several Navy initiatives to improve service life.

"The most popular is the Guaranteed Assignment Retention Detailing Program—Guard III," he said. Under Guard III a potential reenlistee, working through his career counselor, can discuss specific duty choices with detailers. The detailer may offer what the person is interested in or may propose other inviting alternatives. A deal can be made over the phone which then must be backed up by a command message. The master chief noted that while this type of program has been open to first-term reenlistees in the past, it now is available to persons with as many as 25 years in the Navy.

He next discussed frocking—the practice enabling persons selected for advancement to wear

the uniform and hold the position of the grade for which they have been selected without awaiting a final promotion date—noting the Navy is the only service with such a program.

White also discussed a program to recognize top performers, under which commanding officers may award Navy Achievement Medals to members of their command.

Other Navy programs help people get educations, with one helping persons get the necessary college degree and then enter a path to a commission, he said.

The master chief noted that while some Navy ratings are seriously short of personnel, the "SCOPE" program is designed to enable people to transfer into these critical ratings, gaining new jobs and the schooling that goes with them.

White reemphasized that while pay and compensation are primary problems affecting retention, the Navy isn't sitting idly by waiting for outside help. He added that it is the responsibility of active-duty personnel to encourage members of the Navy to take part in voting for their elected representatives and to write to them, telling them how they wish to be represented.

"The Navy today is more personnel oriented than at any time in history," White concluded, "and it is getting better all the time."

# Finances:

Remember when you were a child and put your money in the bank for safekeeping? You probably imagined that the bank kept your money in a closed box with your name on it. As you grew up you learned what actually happened to your money. However, did you ever explore the other services a bank offers?

Although banks vary in the services offered, checking and savings accounts, loans, bank-sponsored credit cards, traveler's checks, safety deposit boxes and Christmas generally found in all banks.

**CHECKING** accounts are popular due to the safety and convenience they offer. Instead of carrying around a large sum of money, a simple piece of paper can purchase items for you. Checks come in a wide variety of colors and designs and have your name, address, phone number and social security number printed on them. Generally two forms of identification are required when writing checks, one with a picture.

Cancelled checks provide accurate, documented records of transactions. This is especially true if one remembers to write a short description of the check's purpose.

A **SERVICE** charge is levied against checking accounts not meeting a preset minimum balance. This charge is made any time the account balance drops below the preset limit.

Once a month you receive a bank statement itemizing the account transactions for a specified period of time. The statements are

consecutive so that no day is missing during the time you have your account open.

When you receive the statement, you should reconcile or balance your checkbook. This involves checking to make sure all deposits made appear on the statement and in your checkbook, recording bank charges for service charge or new checks in your check record, comparing checks listed on the new statement with those written and finally balancing your checkbook record with the bank statement. Failure to reconcile your account each month can result in disaster.

**CHECKS WRITTEN** on an account with insufficient funds 'bounce.' This means that a check is returned to the individual or business trying to collect those funds. Whether a check bounces due to a mathematical error, a deposit being recorded after a check has cleared or a check was written with the knowledge that there was no money in the account, it's considered to be a bad check.

A bad check creates a great deal of difficulty for all involved. The recipient must try to collect the funds from the person writing the check. The check writer may find himself placed on a bad check list and unable to write checks in the establishments where his previous check bounced. Servicemen or dependents who write a "bad" check to one of the base activities can find themselves with check cashing privileges suspended on base for a year. Servicepersons receive an entry in his or her service record book.

**FORGERY** is a crime

of falsely and fraudulently making or altering a document such as a check. This crime is usually a result of someone using another person's name and check to obtain funds from an account. By this definition a forged check could also result from writing a check on a closed account under your own name. The basic difference between a bad check and a forged one is the intent of the action performed.

Checks made payable to an individual can be placed in a hold status when presented at your bank. This means that the money will not be credited to your account until your bank has had the opportunity to clear the check through the institution issuing it. This action prevents checks being cashed when a 'stop-payment' has been issued or the account has insufficient funds. Some banks will cash checks up to a certain amount for regular customers only while other banks hold checks no matter the amount.

**SAVINGS** accounts provide a secure place to keep your money for future use while allowing it to earn interest. Interest is money paid to you for allowing the bank to utilize your money. Depending on the type of savings program elected, the amount of interest paid will fall into the allowances set by the federal government. Christmas Clubs are a

type of savings account. The Christmas Club allows you to put away a set amount of money each month to be used for Christmas spending.

Travel, car, furniture, home and business loans are only a few of the loans made by banks. A loan application determines your eligibility for a loan. Good credit references are an asset toward obtaining a loan.

**CREDIT** references are gained from credit card accounts, from bank-sponsored cards, loans in existence, savings accounts or any previous account paid in full. Often loan officers apply their first impressions when deciding who to loan money to.

Loans cannot be given for a period longer than your term length. Full payment will be due three months prior to your rotation date.

Credit cards such as VISA and Master Charge are connected with banks. Applications are filled out and sent to the central credit division of the main bank. To be eligible expenses cannot exceed 40 percent of your gross income. An expense in this case is considered to be any deduction from your pay. For military personnel this would mean any items listed in the allotments and deductions blocks of your leave and earnings statement plus other bills you may have. Banks also consider time in service and time on station for military

personnel.

**AUTOMATIC** pay-check deposits can be a valuable asset. Known in the military as 'check-to-bank' or 'direct deposits', the system automatically adds your paycheck to your account. Direct deposit ends waiting in long lines at the bank on payday. It also eliminates service charges on checking accounts at some banks. Direct deposit can be authorized for checking and saving accounts.

Automatic deductions from checking accounts

can be authorized for payment of loans, insurance premiums, deposits in a savings account or purchase of savings bonds.

Stephanie Pahia, manager of the MCAS Branch of the Bank of Hawaii, elaborated on the bank's policies. "Few people know that they can pay all their utility bills here in addition to buying bus passes and traveler's checks. They can also pick up food stamps by bringing in the pink authorization card stating the amount they can receive and the identification card

issued to them as the recipient of food stamps.

"**DUE TO** the bank's policy on cashing out-of-state personal checks we encourage Marines to request that money be sent by cashier's check or bank draft vice personal check or money order. This allows us to cash these items for people who do not have accounts with us.

"We wire money in order to transfer accounts to new duty stations for Marines. This protects the Marine's money and allows him or her to

travel with a minimum amount of cash.

"**ALSO, FEW** realize that while pay, retirement, annuity, insurance or disability checks do not need to be personally endorsed for deposit, an allotment check must be. Even tax returns may be deposited without personal endorsement.

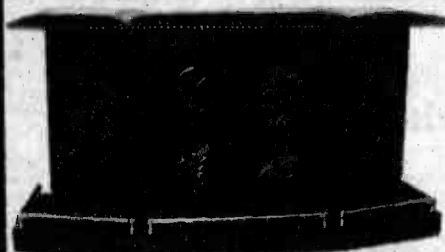

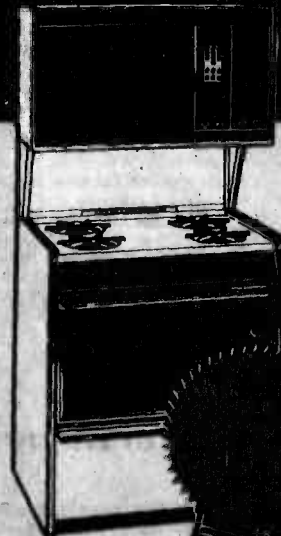

## Marines assist accident victim

The routine drive to work was altered slightly for two MCAS Kaneohe Bay Marines Friday. 2dLt Michael Ogden, watch officer at Station Operation and Maintenance Squadron's Communication Center and Sgt Archie Achuara, SOMS Crash Crew, stopped to assist an elderly gentleman who had fallen off his bicycle.

At approximately 7:15 a.m. Ogden came upon the accident scene which occurred near the Taco Bell restaurant in Kaliua. The victim, a local resident approximately 50 years of age, fell while attempting to enter the restaurant driveway.

"THE POLICE and an ambulance had been called but nothing else was being done. I immediately checked the victim's breathing and level of consciousness," Ogden explained.

"Fearing complications from several facial cuts, I insisted that the victim remain where he was and engaged him in conversation. One of the local residents brought some ice to stop the bleeding and reduce and limit the swelling that had begun," Ogden continued.

ACHUARA arrived on the scene at approximately 7:20. Utilizing his crash crew training, Achuara began a thorough examination of the victim, checking for broken bones and internal injuries etc. "All I could find in addition to the facial lacerations was a hand injury and possible knee injury," he said.

The ambulance ar-

rived soon after and the crew took over administering first aid. The gentleman was transported by ambulance to the hospital.

## Wilson Tunnel

Man's dream of cross-island travel becomes reality

**CAMP H.M. SMITH**—Cruising the Likie Highway from end to end, one transits the tunnel bored through the middle of the Ko'olau Mountain Range at the uppermost limit of Kalihi Valley. Before entering the tunnel's yawning mouth from either direction, the name "John H. Wilson" is seen emblazoned on the wall separating the tubes. Wilson has to be considered the "Father of Cross-Island Travel" on Oahu.

The great grandson of the sea captain who brought the first missionaries to the islands in 1820, John Wilson studied engineering at Stanford University in the late 1890's.

The only route between the Leeward and Windward sides of Oahu at the time was a winding trail through the lush Nuuanu Valley. The trail crossed the Ko'olau Range and began its descent to the foothills of Kaneohe-Kailua-Waimanalo. To say that the route was treacherous would be an understatement.

**WHILE WILSON** was home in the islands after completing his junior year studies, bids were being accepted to build "the road that couldn't be built." Wilson summoned his longtime friend and fellow student at Stanford, Lou Whitehouse, and together they submitted a bid. It turned out to be the lowest (\$37,500) and they were awarded the contract.

The people of Honolulu knew and liked John Wilson. But they now felt he had taken on a project far beyond his (or anyone else's) capabilities.

Amidst the well wishes and doubts of Oahu residents Wilson and Whitehouse set into motion their grand scheme. With a small work force of Chinese, Japanese and Hawaiian laborers, the work started in May 1897 and was completed in eight months. It was officially opened on January 20, 1898.

**WINDWARD** residents were treated to spectacular blasting operations that shook the stately Ko'olau during the road's construction. Laborers using shovels and other hand tools cleared the debris and fashioned a 20-foot wide, gradual grade, relatively smooth road against the cliffs that served inland residents for the next 60 years. Wilson, native son of Hawaii, was a hero!

**AS MORE** powerful automobiles were developed and the population of Oahu increased, John Wilson's Pali Road became woefully inadequate to handle the volume of traffic.

A tunnel concept was broached and shelved as early as 1937. It was resurrected in the 1940's when citizens, particularly on the Windward side, demanded a safer, faster cross-island route. The Territorial Government wanted a tunnel bored through the Upper Nuuanu Valley which would mean the demise of Wilson's Windward road. Wilson, on the other hand, pushed for a tunnel through Kalihi Valley.

**WILSON** argued that a Kalihi highway and tunnel system would syphon off about 40% of the vehicles then using the Pali Road, therefore negating the requirement for a Nuuanu Tunnel. The Territorial

Government didn't buy that and the battle was on!

Wilson was obsessed with the importance of the Kalihi project. Well into his seventies, his zeal remained undaunted even though he was butting heads with powerful and influential Territorial officials. More importantly, matching federal funds were only available for the Nuuanu Project.

Tunnels were completed at the upper ends of both Nuuanu and Kalihi Valleys only after a decade of political bickering.

# NROTC offers scholarships

Applications are now being accepted for active and reserve Marine Corps personnel who have been waiting for the 1980 Navy-Marine Corps Naval Reserve Officers Training Corps Scholarship Program.

This program provides for a four-year education at some of the finest colleges and universities across the country. The NROTC Scholarship Program is one of several education and commissioning programs available to both male and female enlisted Marines. Upon graduation a midshipman receives a regular commission in the U.S. Marine Corps or the U.S. Navy.

MARINES should be aware that the scholarship program pays tuition, books, educational expenses and a stipend of \$100 per month. However, while enrolled in the program, Marines do not receive active duty pay and allowances. In most cases it will be necessary for those selected for an NROTC scholarship to provide additional funds themselves to defray supplemental costs while participating in this program. Marines selected will be released from active duty in order to accept the scholarship.

NROTC candidates assume all responsibility for applying for admission to the NROTC college or colleges of their choice. Applicants for the scholarship program should note the requirements of each college regarding deadline dates for submitting applications. Candidates are encouraged to seek admission as early as possible to their first three NROTC college choices.

All admission applications should be forwarded to the respective institutions prior to January 1, 1981. Applicants who delay in applying for admission until they have been selected for NROTC may find it too late to gain admission to their selected college or university. Admission to the institution must be gained before the scholarship can be awarded.

CANDIDATES designated as NROTC finalists will be required to indicate their choice of colleges in order of preference during processing.

Marines who apply for the program will be assisted by the Marine recruiting activity designated as the NROTC processing station for that area.

Eligibility requirements include being a high school graduate or having an equivalent certificate. The applicant must not have reached his or her 21st birthday by June 30, 1981.

ALTHOUGH there is no GCT requirement, all applicants must take either the American College Test or the Scholastic Aptitude Test prior to December 1, 1980. Applicants who take the SAT or the ACT must authorize release of test scores to the NROTC Scholarship Program by indicating the four-digit program code, 0056, on the registration form. Marines who attain a high qualifying score are eligible for further consideration for the scholarship.

Selectees must be physically qualified in accordance with the standards prescribed for midshipmen. The DoD Medical Examination Review Board schedules and reviews all physical exams.

SELECTEES must agree to complete all requirements for a baccalaureate degree and to accept a commission in the Marine Corps or the Navy.

The timetable below is provided to assist Marines who are inter-

ested in applying for this scholarship program. Interested Marines should contact their unit career planner or the Joint Education Office, 257-2081, for further information.

October 1980—The October 1980 American College Test is the latest ACT which may be taken for purposes of NROTC.

November 1980—The November 1980 Scholastic Aptitude Test is the latest SAT which may be taken for purposes of NROTC application.

December 1, 1980—Deadline for the postmark of applications.

December 1, 1980—The final date for releasing college board test scores to the NROTC program.

December 31, 1980—The SAT/ACT score receipt deadline date.

January 1, 1981—The recommended deadline for submission of applications to colleges and universities.

January 15, 1981—The final date for resolving

application difficulties. All applicants should have received notification of their status as finalists by this date.

January 31, 1981—The final date for completing NROTC processing.

February 1981—Meeting of the Navy and Marine Corps selection boards.

March 15, 1981—Notification of selection results to all processed finalists.

April 1, 1981—The final date for resolving any remaining difficulties and/or lack of selection board notification.

May 1, 1981 to September 1, 1981—Official letters are mailed to selected students who have been accepted by a college or university and who will receive scholarships, authorizing travel to the school.

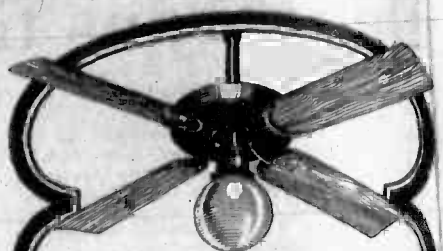

## Consumer's Choice

Editor's note: Consumer's choice is a bi-monthly column designed to bring various aspects of a subject to the consumer's attention. One subject will be covered each month. Every two weeks a different approach to the monthly subject will be presented. This month's subject is based on an original television script written by Cherrill Alfou Anson. It deals with consumers and supermarket strategy.

Often consumers go to the supermarket to buy groceries and return home with more nonfood items than actual food. Here's something to think about: as much as 27 cents of every dollar consumers spend in the supermarket goes for things that aren't food. For example, every American uses approximately 640 pounds of paper products per year. You can cut your paper bill by reviving the tradition of the clean rag to replace some of those paper towels.

DO YOU throw away plastic bags, then run to the store to buy more? Why not wash them out when you're done with them, hang them over a bottle to dry and reuse them.

Supermarkets are making more and more space for things that aren't food, so it's important to come to grips with the amount you spend on nonfood products if you want to cut your supermarket bill.

The marketers have spent a lot of time and money to find out how you tick as a consumer and what it takes to get you to buy that impulse item to increase profits. You can counter these lures by taking a few simple measures to increase your consciousness of buying and controlling your subconscious impulses.

SHOP from a list. Keep pencil and paper in the kitchen and write down items you need as you think of them. Think of needed items before going to the store. Check your shelves for good measures. Look at it this way: if you didn't know you needed something

before you left home, chances are you don't need it. Skip it and cut your bills.

Shop the specials skeptically. More people than ever are shopping the advertised specials in newspapers, and that's a good sign. However, a study in a southeastern metropolitan community found that 13 to 25 percent of the food specials advertised in newspapers were not reduced in price. Don't take for granted that what you are buying is really marked down.

KNOW your prices. Try to train your memory to remember the prices on items you purchase every shopping trip, if you don't practice it already. If you have trouble remembering figures a small notebook can come in handy or

simply use your regular shopping list and record the prices beside each item.

Last, yet far from being the least important, try house brands. Store brands cost an average of 14 percent less than nationally advertised name brands. In many cases there is very little difference in quality. Sometimes the only difference between the store brand and the name brand is the advertising and it's not palatable.

By observing personal spending habits in a supermarket consumers on the average become more aware of ways to save for other needed household items. Making a conscious effort to shop wisely should show a considerable difference in your regular food bill.

## Rick's Review

**Crimebusters** starring Terence Hill and Bud Spencer isn't exactly one of the classic films of our times, but then again it doesn't try to be. Producer/director E.B. Clucher has taken a fast-paced, oftentimes silly story and made it into a fairly entertaining action/comedy.

The tale is about a couple of out of work, hapless stevedores named Matt (Hill) and Wilbur (Spencer). Hill is excellent as the handsome blue-eyed sharpie and Spencer complements Hill's performance nicely in his portrayal of Wilbur, who can be best described as

part teddy-bear, part M-60 tank.

After trying to find honest work with negative results the two decide to do the next best thing and enter a life of crime.

Their first job is robbing a nearby supermarket. They enter the store through the rear of the building and physically crash through the door of what they believe is the cashier's office. To their dismay, they find they've broken into a recruiting station for the Miami police department.

After this bungled robbery, our heroes decide to forsake their

flirtation with crime and sign on as police recruits. During initial training the two just slide along. Their most notable talent seems to be the ability to demolish police cruisers in the blink of an eye.

Matt and Wilbur become full-fledged police officers just in time to avenge the death of a friend who is mysteriously murdered by small time narcotics smugglers.

This is where the fun begins. The two crime-fighters begin pulverizing every bad guy in sight trying to run down the murderers. Along the way both demonstrate

every known means of flattening crooks and when they run short of conventional methods they invent a few.

**Crimebusters** is an ordinary story that works because of the fast-paced action. The movie is a throwback to the old days when violence didn't have to be gory to excite the audience. Instead of being brutal, the film has much the same humorous quality evoked by those old John Wayne movies where the Duke would single-handedly clear a barroom. You know it doesn't happen like that in real life, but it's fun to watch anyway.
