# Pass in Review

# Community college program

A test program to enlist community college students is being conducted in the New York metropolitan area.

The Community College Enlistment Program, designed to enlist students with special qualifications to fill hardskill Military Occupational Specialties, is limited initially to 100 students. The test began April 1 and will continue through June 30.

Qualified male and female applicants will complete recruit training at Marine Corps Recruit Depot, Parris Island, S.C. and be offered the following incentives for a four-year enlistment:

MOS assignment (except Occupational Fields 03, 08, 18, and 1371); four-year assignment in the MOS of their choice; appointment to private first class upon enlistment in the Delayed Enlistment Program; promotion to lance corporal at their first duty station or school; promotion to corporal after 13 months active duty and sergeant after 25 months; and a \$3,000 bonus for enlisting in MOSs eligible for bonus payment under the Technical Skills Enlistment Bonus Program.

# Sergeant promotion criteria

WASHINGTON, MCNews — Corporals looking to add another stripe to their sleeve during July will be interested in ALMAR 063/80, which has eligiblity criteria for sergeant promotions.

Commanders should compute; composite (cutting) scores for corporals with a date of rank of July 17, 1979 or earlier. Corporals must have an Armed Forces Active Duty Base Dute of June 30, 1978 or earlier to be

Cotoff date for time-in-grade and time-in-service is June 30, 1980. The cutoff date for computing conduct and proficiency marks and all other elements is April 30, 1980.

elements is April 30, 1980.

Reports of composite scores must be entered on the unit diary no earlier than May 1 and not later than Jone 1. Corporals not having composite scores reported will be considered not recommended for promotion. Marines in transit doring the period when composite scores must be submitted should have service record book entries containing composite scores and recommenduations for promotions made by the detaching composed prior to transfer.

# Unit deployment billets

WASHINGTON, McNews - The 1st Bearine Division is looking for Murines to fill billets in its infantry bettalions participating in the Unit Deployment Program.

The program is open to all Marines who would normally be eligible for duty in an infantry battalion. However, Marines rotating from WestPac are also eligible but must be willing to waive their 24-month protection from participation in six-month Temporary Additional Duty deployments.

Under the program battalion deployments include six-months in u TAI) status, with 18-months spent at Camp Pendleton between deployments.

deployments.

Before assignment Marines must ensure that their End of Active Service is such that they can accompodate the battalion's deployment schedule. The schedule will not result in an early rotation sour date from a present WestPac tour for participating Marines.

Sergeunts and above can indicate their desire to participate in the program on fitness reports und AA forms. Corporals and below can sobmit requests via AA forms. Corporals and below, on dependents restricted overseas tours with units other than Marine security guard battalion, Marine support battalion or ship's detachments, can request assignment through the unit diary (paragraph 8098, PRIM).

# Lateral movement policies

WASHINGTON, MCNews — Guaranteed bonus money is available to Marines who reenlist under the Marine Corps revised Lateral Movement

Program.

The bonus, paid prior to training for the new military occupational specialty is among the concepts announced in MCO 1220.5D that also allows Marines the opportunity to switch MOSs — particularly in aviation occupational fields. The expanded policy will aid Marines in getting out of overcrowded MOSs into undermanned and critical skill

A highlight of the new Lateral Movement Program is the Agreement to Train Option Plan. It provides Marines with less than 10 years service Train Option Plan. It provides Marines with less than 10 years service guaranteed reenlistment money for training into an OF that has a Selected Reenlistment Bonus multiple. Under ATOP, Marines entering SRB occupational fields can collect money based on the multiple when they agree to reenlist or when they reenlist, whichever is higher. In the past, SRB payments were not made until Marines were trained in their new skill and had completed their obligated service.

The opportunity for first-term Marines to make lateral moves is also a new feature. Now Marines on their first enlistment don't have to reenlist to pick a new job. If they are in an overmanned MOS listed in MCO 1220.5D, they can request a lateral move to an understanned MOS for which they qualify.

Less obligated service is also included in the program. New requirements call for two years of service for retraining that takes less than 16 weeks; three years service to participate in ATOP.

Lateral movers interested in aviation skills have some added MOS choices. There are eight available MOSs in OF 90; seven in OF 99; feur in

# **Fuition** costs covere

The Marine Corps Tuition
Assistance Program now has a
policy for authorizing high
school completion in addition to
college degree completion.

The program enhances Marines' educational opportunities by providing financial assistance to cover high school and college tuition fees.

THE NEW POLICY authorthe NEW POLICY authorizes 100 percent payment of tuition charges for militury personnel enrolled in off-duty high school completion programs. The payment may only be authorized for courses offered by regionally accredited education, all institutions Public high al institutions. Public high schools are exempt from this requirement if they are approved by the appropriate state agency. Locally, the maximum amount

of course work cannot exceed one class in any one school term. Courses carry academic credit computed in Carnegie units.

For approved college and university courses, tuition assistance may not exceed 75 per cent of the cost of each course. Course work can only be authorized at an academic level beyond the diploma or degree currently held by an individual.

This means that Marines who wish to pursue an undergraduate program of study cannot already possess a baccalaureate degree or any professional degree such as law, dentistry or medicine. Graduate courses should not duplicate previous work and cannot be authorized at a level below the graduate degree previously earned.

TUITION assistance can only be granted for off-duty classroom courses offered by regionally accredited colleges and universities. The maximum amount of course work cannot acceed the course work cannot acceed the course work cannot acceed the course with the course wit amount of course work cannot exceed two courses in any one academic term. If the student desires to enroll in three or more courses, he must fund the additional courses on his own.
The TAP funded courses must carry academic credit expressed in either semester or quarter

Under the college-level tuition policy only courses leading to an associate, baccalaureate or graduate degree are authorized. Credit courses in vocational or technical certificate programs offered by regionally accredited colleges will also be approved if applicants have not completed more than 30 semester or 45 quarter hours of college work.

Capt Michael Howard, education officer, Joint Education Center, elaborated on the reimbursement policy. "The student must realize that failure on his part to complete the course will result in his having to repay the government. Payment will have to be made in full by a certified check. Students who fail to comply may find their commanding officers or the disbursing officer involved in the case."

REIMBURSEMENT of tuition assistance is not required when students are unable to complete courses due to hsopitalization, emergency leave, significant change in military duties or unit deployment, or; if students attended classes, met all course requirements, and completed the courses but received failing grades due to academic deficiencies.

Students will be required to reimburse payments if they: voluntarily withdraw from courses; fail to complete courses for reasons other than the ones ulready stated; receive failing grades for voluntary nonattendance; receive incomplete grades doe to voluntary failure to meet course requirements (unless the incomplete is removed by a passing grade within 60 days), or receive failing grades as a result of failure to remove incomplete

STUDENTS WHO drop out of courses and receive incomplete grades cannot enroll in additional courses until incomplete grades are removed or reimbursement is made. Those who voluntarily receive failing or incomplete grades in two courses will be ineligible for further tuition assistance until they present evidence of successful completion of two courses for which they themselves have provided full funding. Students eligible for Veterans Administration educational

ussistance under the G.I. Bill will be counseled on benefits and

assisted in making applications.

# Legislation pends, Navy looks ahead

Washington, CHINFO — Many pieces of legislation of keen interest to Navy members are pending in congress currently, Master Chief Petty Officer Robert White, Jr. told listeners at a Secretary of the Navy briefing for the Navy/Marine Corps Council. However, the Navy isn't standing still in those areas in which it can move forward without congressional assistance.

without congressional assistance.

White, the First Fleet Master Chief of Naval Shore Activities told the meeting, "Some things are being done to improve retention that don't require congressional approval."

He gave thumbnail sketches of several Navy initiatives to improve service life.

"The most popular is the Guaranteed Assignment Retention Detailing Program—Guard III," he said. Under Guard III apotential results working

III," he said. Under Guard III a potential reenlistee, working through his career counselor, can discuss specific duty choices with detailers. The detailer may offer what the person is interested in or may propose other inviting alternatives. A deal can be made over the phone which then must be backed up by a command message. The master chief noted that while this type of program has been open to first-term reenlistees in the past, it now is available to persons with as many as 25 years in the Navy.

He next discussed frocking—the practice enabling persons selected for advancement to wear

the uniform and hold the position of the grade for which they have been selected without awaiting a final promotion date—noting the Navy is the only service with

Navy is the only service with such a program.

White also discussed a program to recognize top performers, under which commanding officers may award Navy Achievement Medals to members of their command.

Other Navy programs help cople get educations, with one

people get educations, with one helping persons get the necessary college degree and then enter a path to a commission, he said.

The master chief noted that while some Navy ratings are seriously short of personnel, the "SCOPE" program is designed to enable people to transfer into these critical ratings, gaining new jobs and the schooling that goes with them. with them

White reemphasized that while pay and compensation are primary problems affecting retention, the Navy ien't sitting retention, the Navy int status, idly by waiting for outside help. He added that it is the responsibility of active-duty personnel to encourage members of the Navy to take part in voting

of the Navy to take part in voting for their elected representatives and to write to them, telling them how they wish to be represented. "The Navy today is more personnel oriented than at any time in history," White concluded, "and it to getting better all the time."

# Ranking institutions lend themselves to service and support of customers' money management

Remember when you were a child and put your money in the bank for safekeeping? You probably imagined that the ably imagined that the bank kept your money in a closed box with your name on it. As you grew up you learned what actually happened to your money. However, did you ever explore the other services a bank offers?

Although hanks yary

Although banks vary in the services offered, checking and savings accounts, loans, bank-sponsored credit cards, traveler's checks, safety deposit boxes and Christmas generally found in all-banks.

CHECKING accounts are popular due to the safety and convenience they offer. Instead of they offer. Instead of carrying around a large sum of money, a simple piece of paper can purchase items for you. Checks come in a wide variety of colors and designs and have your name, address; phone number and social security number printed security number printed on them. Generally two forms of identification are required when writing checks, one with

a picture.
Cancelled checks
provide accurate, documented records of transactions. This is especially true if one remembers to write a short description of the check's purpose.

A SERVICE charge is levied against checking accounts not meeting a preset minimum balance. This charge is made any time the account balance drops below the preset limit.

Once a month you receive a bank state-

ment itemizing the account transactions for a specified period of time. The statements are

consecutive so that no day is missing during the time you have your account open.

When you receive the When you receive the statement, you should reconcile or balance your checkbook. This in-volves checking to make sure all deposits made appear on the statement and in your checkbook, recording bank charges for service charge or new for service charge or new checks in your check record, comparing checks listed on the new statement with those written and finally balancing your check-book record with the bank statement. Failure to reconcile your account each month can result in

**CHECKS WRITTEN** on an account with insufficient funds 'bounce.' This' means bounce. This means that a check is returned to the individual or business trying to collect those funds. Whether a check bounces due to a mathematical error, a deposit being recorded after a check has cleared or a check was written or a check was written with the knowledge that there was no money in the account, it's considered to be a bad check

A bad check creates a great deal of difficulty for all involved. The recipient must try to collect the funds from the person writing the check. The check writer may find himself placed on a bad check list and unable to write checks in the establishments where his previous check bounced. Servicemen or dependents who write a 'bad" check to one of the base activities can find themselves with check cashing privileges suspended on base for a

year. Service persons receive an entry in his or her service record book. FORGERY is a crime

of falsely and fradulently making or altering a document such as a check. This crime is usually a result of someone using another person's name and check to obtain funds from an account. By this definition a forged check could also result from writing a check on a closed also result from writing account under your own name. The basic difference between a bad check and a forged one is the intent of the action

reformed.

Checks made payable to an individual can be placed in a hold status when presented at your bank. This means that the money will not be credited to your account until your bank has had the opportunity to clear the check through the institution issuing it. This action prevents checks being cashed when a 'stop-payment' has been issued or the account has insufficient funds. Some banks will cash checks up to a certain amount for regular customers only while other banks hold checks no matter the

amount.
SAVINGS accounts provide a secure place to keep your money for future use while allowing it to earn interest. Interest is money paid to you for allowing the bank to utilize your money. Depending on the type of savings program elected, the amount of interest paid will fall into the allowances set by the federal government.

type of savings account. The Christmas Club The Christmas Club allows you to put away a set amount of money each month to be used for Christmas spending. Travel, car, furniture; home and business lonns are only a few of the

are only a few of the loans made by banks. A loan application determines your eligibility for a loan. Good credit references are an asset toward obtaining a loan.

CREDIT references are gained from credit card accounts, from bank-sponsored cards, loans in existence, savings accounts or any previous account paid in full. Often loan officers apply their first im-pressions when deciding

who to loan money to. Loans cannot be given for a period longer than your tour length. Full payment will be due three months prior to your rotation date.

Your rotation date.
Credit cards such as VISA and Master Charge are connected with banks. Applications are filled out and sent to the central credit division, of the main bank. To be eligible expenses cannot exceed 40 percent of your gross income. An expense in this case is considered to be any deduction from your pay. For military personnel this would personnel this would mean any items listed in the allotments and deductions blocks of your leave and earnings statement plus other bills you may have. Banks also consider time in service and time on station for military

personnel.

AUTOMATIC paycheck deposits can be a valuable asset. Known in the military as 'check-to-bank' or 'direct deposits', the system automatically adds your paycheck to your account. Direct depositends waiting in long count. Direct deposit ends waiting in long lines at the bank on paydays. It also elimi-nates service charges on checking accounts at some banks. Direct deposit can be author-ized for checking and saving accounts.

Automatic deductions from checking accounts

can be authorized for payment of loans, insurance premiums, deposits in a savings account of purchase of savings bonds.

Stephanie Pahia, manager of the MCAS Branch of the Bank of Hawaii, elaborated on the bank's policies. "Few people know that they can pay all their utility bills here in addition to buying bus passes and traveler's checks. They can also pick up food can also pick up food stamps by bringing in the pink authorization card stating the amount they can receive and the identification card

issued to them as the recipient of food stamps.

"DUE TO the bank's policy on cashing out-ofstate personal checks we encourage Marines to request that money sent by cashier's check or bank draft vice personal check or money order. This allows us to cash these items for people who do not have accounts with us.

"We wire money in order to transfer ac-counts to new duty stations for Marines. This protects the Marine's money and Marine's money and allows him or her to

travel with a minimum

amount of cash.

"ALSO, FEW realize
that while pay, retirement, annuity, insurance or disability
checks do not need to be personally endorsed for deposit, an allotment check must be. Even tax returns may be deposited without personal en-

We are here to help the individuals. We encourage Marines to open accounts with us or somewhere elee. We offer assistance in checking account reconciliation one," concluded Pahia.

are still using profanity.

The military Services of all nations, and of all times, are particularly guilty of this offense.

Capt Corcoran of the Royal Navy sings in the operetta, HMS Pinafore,
"Bad language or abuse
I never, never use,
Whatever the emergency;
Though 'bother it' I may
Occasionally say,
I never use a big, big D."
But Capt Corresponded not typical of

But Capt Corcoran was not typical of the British military man. The English soldier was just as profane as his American counterpart, although he often used a different line of "English" cuss

words.

John Updycke, a noted authority on language, says: "Profanity has time out of mind been regarded as a necessary accompaniment of fighting... Perhaps it spurs and encourages and begets esprit de corps on the battlefield, just as college cheering does on the sports field."

For those disinclined to use roughlanguage outright, there are ways of

language outright, there are ways of disguising profanity:
H.L. Mencken said, "Many

en H.L. Mencken said, Many euphemisms for goddamn have flourished in America. Gosh itself was borrowed from England, but goshdarn, goldarn, goshday and goshdang are Americanisms, and so are goshamighty, goshwalader and goshawful."

goshwalader and goshawful.

Whether the use of profanity is outright or disguised, an editorial writer for the Washington Post pointed out recently that "Besides being boring, the use of obscenities is a lazy way of communicating."

The use of slang obscenities by the U.S. military has even affected the verbal image of Americans abroad.

Mencken says of the "S.O.B." expression, "It was such a byword among

the American Expeditionary Force of World War I that for a generation afterward Americans were collectively known is France as less commonliches..."

The brass, equally guilty of using profanity themselves, don't like to hear it used among the rank and file. Although Gen George Washington had quite a colorful vocabulary to go along with his hot temper he issued a proclamation on the subject which said in part:

"The General is sorry to be informed that the foolish and wicked practice of proclama cursing and, awaging a vice

that the foonen that wicked practice of profane cursing and swearing, a vice hitherto little known in an American army, is growing into fashion. He hopes the officers will, by example as well as influence, endeavor to check it."

Other writers who urge cleaning up bad language point out that good words are worth much and cost little. And Washington further noted that the use of professities to the common and low. profanity is "a vice so mean and low . . . that every man of sense and character detests and despises it."

Memory is an important tool for discovering personal identity. When one goes back to one's hometown a mixture of emotions are discovered. Things are just the same, yet they have changed. So we tend to idealize the past and see it as a golden era when men were noble, unselfish and filled with high ideals. But in so doing we see only half of our history and discover only half of our identity. The founding fathers were men of vision and imagination, but they were also slave owners, personally ambitious, "men of like passions with us." We moved westward with the courage and determination necessary to open up the frontier, but we also crowded the Indians off their land and called them "savages" off their land and called them "savages" for resisting us. We freed the slaves, but only at the cost of a bloody uncivil war.

We continued adding stars to the flag, but these new territories were often annexed because of our bloated sense of "manifest destiny." We reached out and touched the moon and planted our flag upon it, but at home we could not solve the problems of the ghetto and struggled to find the meaning of our presence in Vietnam.

In taking a more balanced view of our past we discover our roots, but we see also that we have cherished many one-sided images of ourselves. We have a great and rich heritage as Americans. There is no need to falsify the record in order to appreciate our legacy. Let us look back honestly upon our past and celebrate our present in both thanksgiving and epentance. Let us address the future with present in both hope and a certain amount of

Editor's Note: This is the third in a series of articles to acquaint Hawaii Marine readers with the various in-fantry training areas in the Hawaiian islands used by the Marine Corps.

Pohakuloa Training Area on the big island of Hawaii is centrally located approximately 40 miles west of Hilo and 40 miles east of Ka-waihae. A public high-way known as Saddle Road traverses the northern sector of the area and serves as the major land route for surface transportation to both Hilo and Kawaihae.

PTA IS a 116,000 acre U.S. Army training facility and is operated as a permanent detach-ment of Schofield Barracks. The training Barracks. The training areas are available upon request to active Army units, Army reserve units, the Hawaii National. Guard and the U.S. Marine Corps. Both the Army and PTA's command have been extremely cooperative extremely cooperative with the Marine Corps in providing the use of

training areas.

THE BASE camp includes all facilities for soldiers stationed at PTA. It contains the administration and logistic buildings, troop billets, Bradshaw Air-field and an ammunition storage area.

Marines usually become best acquainted with the maneuver and impact areas while at PTA. 



# Man's dream of cross-island travel becomes reality

laborers, the work started in May 1897 and was completed in eight

months. It was officially opened on January 20, 1898.

WINDWARD resi-

windward residents were treated to spectacular blasting operations that shook the stately Ko'olau's during the road's construction. Laborers using shovels and other hand tools cleared the debris and fashloned a 20-foot wide, gradual grade, relatively smooth road against the cliffs that served island residents for the next 60 years. Wilson, native son of Hawaii, was a hero!

AS MORE powerful

The great-grandson of The great-grandson of the sea captain who brought the first missionaries to the islands in 1820, John Wilson attudied engineering at Stanford University in the late 1890's.

The only route between the Leeward and Windward sides of Oahu at the time was a winding trail through the lush Nuuanu Valley. the trail crossed the Ko'olau Range and began its descent to the foothills of Kaneohe-Kailus-Waimanalo. To say that the route was treacherous would be an

WHILE WILSON was home in the islands after completing his junior year studies, bids were being accepted to build "the road that couldn't be built." Wilson summoned his wilson summoned hislongtime friend and
longtime friend and
fellow student at Stanford, Lou Whitehouse,
and together they
submitted a bid. It
turned out to be the
lowest (\$37,500) and they
were awarded the
contract.

The people of Honolulu
knew and liked John
Wilson, Butthey now felt
he had taken on a project
far beyond his (or
anyone else's) capabilities.

Government didn't buy that and the battle was Amidst the well wishes and doubts of Oahu residents Wilson and Whitehouse set into motion their grand scheme. With a small work force of Chinese, Japanese and Hawaiian laborets, the work

Wilson was obsessed with the importance of the Kalihi project. Well into his seventies, his zeal remained un-daunted even though he was butting heads with powerful and influential Territorial officials. More importantly matching federal funds were only available for the Nuuanu Project.

Tunnels were com-Tunnels were com-pleted at the upper ends of both Nuuanu and Kalihi Valleys only after a decade of political

resurrected in the 1940 a when citizens, particularly on the Windward aide, demanded a safer, faster cross-lainnd route. The Territorial Government wanted a tunnel bored through the Upper Nuuanu Valley which would mean the demise of Wilson's Windward road. Wilson, on the other hand, pushed for a tunnel through Kalihi Valley.

WILSON argued that a Kalibi highway and tunnel system would exphon off about 40% of the vehicles then using the Pail Road, therefore

IN 1961 the Kalihi Tunnel was officially opened. John Wilson had died years before. As a tribute to the man who engineered the construc-tion of the old windward Pali Road and who provided the thrust behind the construction of the Kalihi Valley Tunnel, the latter was

named in his honor.

Applications are now being accepted for active and reserve Marine Corps personnel who have been waiting for the 1980 Navy-Marine Corps Naval Reserve Officers Training Corps Scholarship Program.

This program provides for a four-year education at some of the finest colleges and universities ncross the country. The NROTC Scholarship Program is one of several education and commissioning programs avail-able to both male and female enlisted Marines. Upon graduation a midshipman receives a regular commission in the U.S. Marine Corps or the U.S. Navy.

MARINES should be aware that the scholarship program pays tuition, books, educa-tional expenses and a stipend of \$100 per month. Often consumers go to the supermarket to buy groceries and return tome with more nonfood items than actual food Here's something to think about: as much as think about: as much as 27 cents of every dollar consumers spend in the supermarket goes for things that aren't food. For example, every American uses approximately 640 pounds of paper products per year. You can cut your paper bill by reviving the tradition of the clean rag to replace some of those paper towals.

DO YOU throw away plastic bags, then run to the store to buy more? Why not wash them out when you're done with them, hang them over a bottle to dry and reuse

Supermarkets are making more and more space for things that aren't food, so it's important to come to gripe with the amount you spend on nonfood products if you want to

cut your supermarket bill.

The marketers have spent a lot of time and money to find out how you tick as a consumer and what it takes to get you to bay that impulse item to increase profits. You can counter these lures by taking a few simple measures to increase your consciousness of buying and controlling your subconscious impulses.

before you left home. chances are you don't need it. Skip it and cut

your bills.
Shop the specials skeptically. More people than ever are shopping in newspapers, and that's a good sign. However, a study in a southeastern metropolitan community found that 13 to 25 percent of the food specials advertised in newspapers were not reduced in price. Don't take for granted that what you are buying is really marked down

KNOW your prices. Try to train your memory to remember the prices on items you purchase every shopping trip, if you don't practice it already. If you have trouble remembering figures a small notebook

simply use your regular shopping list and record the prices beside each


Last, yet far from being the least impor-tant, try house brands. Store brands cost an average of 14 percent less than nationally advertised name brands In many cases there is very little difference in quality. Sometimes the only difference between the store brand and the name brand is the advertising and it's not palatable.

By observing personal spending habits in a supermarket consumers on the average become more awars of ways to save for other needed household items. Making a conscious effort to shop wisely should show a considerable difference in your regular food bill.
