Pass in Review

Staff Sergeant board

WASHINGTON, MCNews — A selection board to promote eligible sergeants convened May 29.

Expected to last approximately five weeks, the board is authorized to make 1,181 selections. The minimum time in grade for all occupational fields is 27 months.

MOS billets reduced

WASHINGTON, MCNews — As the result of a review of enlisted strengths in critical MOSs, the number of Marines with MOS 2144 (Self-Propelled Artillery Repairer) on Okinawa can be reduced.

The reduction in overseas billets means that there are no more overseas unaccompanied billets for gunnery sergeants and staff sergeants in MOS 2144. However, upon promotion to master sergeant (MOS 2149) these staff NCOs will again be considered for unaccompanied tours in WestPac.

"Fair benefits package"

WASHINGTON, MCNews — A "fair benefits package" for all servicemembers was announced May 26 by President Jimmy Carter and Secretary of Defense Harold Brown.

Details on the package are still being worked out, but key points in the proposal include:

- more appropriate compensation when servicemembers incur costs because of relocations as a result of reassignment;
- increased enlistment and reenlistment bonus levels, and authority to pay bonuses to enlisted persons with over 10 years' service;
- improved sea pay;
- increased flight pay;
- increased Basic Allowance for Subsistence (BAS);
- a station housing allowance that provides increased pay for members who are assigned to especially high cost areas in the United States;
- larger reimbursements for temporary duty costs; and
- an addition to CHAMPUS medical care of a dental care package for dependents of active duty members.

Carter will take three steps in the coming weeks to make this fair benefits package a reality. First, the Administration will support those aspects of the Nunn/Warner proposals that provide for these increases. The proposals would cost about \$85 million for the remainder of Fiscal Year 1980, and range from \$435 million to \$700 million in Fiscal Year 1981.

Second, in the weeks ahead, the Administration will continue to press vigorously for enactment of programs contained in the 1981 budget which include such improvements as increased TDY/TAD reimbursements and family separation allowances for junior enlisted persons. These initiatives will cost about \$200 million.

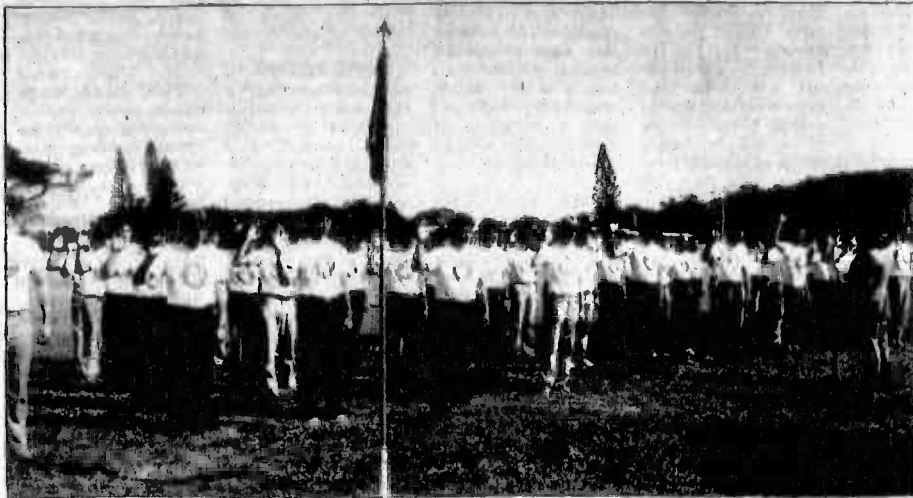
Last, the President has asked Brown to develop a legislative proposal that will provide a dental program enhancement to CHAMPUS that will cost about \$110 million in Fiscal Year 1981.

RO-RO ship joins force

The last ship of seven has been identified for the near term prepositioning force. The tanker Zapata Patriot has been leased from a private firm to carry water for the force. The 35,000-ton ship can carry nearly 9 million gallons of portable water.

The first roll-on, roll-off (RO-RO) ship to load, USNS Meteor, previously loaded some equipment at Port Hueneme, Calif., and is now loading the bulk of its cargo in Wilmington, N.C. Two other assigned RO-RO ships will also load in Wilmington while the break-bulk ships will load ammunition, food, medical supplies and spare parts at Sunny Point, N.C. Most of the work will be completed in June with the ships slated to arrive in the Indian Ocean during July.

These ships will carry equipment, supplies, fuel and water to support a Marine Amphibious Brigade of about 12,000 men and several Air Force squadrons. Equipment will be removed from the ships at periodic intervals for maintenance and operational checks.

Recruits

Men from Pacific basin enlist

Seventy-five young men from the Hawaiian islands and Guam received the oath of enlistment into the Marine Corps Friday during swearing-in ceremonies conducted aboard MCAS Kaneohe Bay. The oath was administered by Hawaii Governor George Ariyoshi.

THE NEW RECRUITS form the 1980 All-Pacific Marine Recruit Platoon. Several hours after being sworn in, they departed Oahu for 11 weeks of recruit training at Marine Corps Recruit Depot, San Diego. The group will remain together throughout the training cycle.

The ceremony was a warm blending of both military and civilian communities as they gathered to bid a fond aloha to their Kama'aina Marines.

Fifty-one of the neophyte Leathernecks have opted to return to Oahu through the 'Come Home to Hawaii' option. The program originated in 1977 to provide young people from the Hawaiian islands the opportunity to serve their country as Marines while being stationed in their own "backyard."

AFTER HONORS were rendered for the arriving governor, the ceremony opened with a stirring rendition of the National Anthem sung by Noelani Crabbe.

Once the anthem was completed, Ariyoshi, escorted by BrigGen W.H. Rice, commanding general of the 1st Marine Brigade, reviewed the honor guard from Company A, 1st Battalion, 3d Marines.

In his introductory remarks, Rice commended the young

Marine candidates, adding that recruits from the Pacific basin are invaluable in building the strength of the Corps and also bringing greater understanding of the Marine Corps mission to their island communities. Presently, there are approximately 400 Pacific basin Marines assigned to the brigade, including natives of Hawaii, Guam and American Samoa.

PRIOR TO SWEARING-IN the recruits, Ariyoshi offered his own words of congratulations to the men for enlisting in the Corps and reminded them that they are also representatives of Hawaii. He asked that they take the spirit of Aloha and brotherhood with them to San Diego. He also requested that they watch out for each other and do their very best in the tradition of Hawaii and Pacific platoons from years past.

Following the Oath of Enlistment, members of Kaneohe's Koolau Senior Hui presented leis to each member of the All-Pacific platoon. Sgt Mel Ugaitafa, a drill instructor from MCRD San Diego, then took charge of the platoon. His sharp commands were awkwardly executed by his charges, exemplifying the amount of work they face in order to learn close order drill. To conclude the ceremony, the honor guard passed in review accompanied by the proud notes of the "Marine Hymn," played by the Fleet Marine Force Pacific Band.

A RECEPTION for the new recruits, their parents and guests was held following the ceremony. Hawaiian entertainment was provided by the Koolau Hui Band.

Dual police force deters crime

A Marine consults a serious crime in the heart of Kaneohe town. The Honolulu Police Department is notified. An all-points bulletin is sent out. According to the description of his car, an HPD officer in his squad car sights the Marine traveling toward MCAS Kaneohe Bay.

THE HEAT is on. The Marine sees the blue light flashing and knows he is being pursued. He puts his foot to the maximum acceleration his car allows. The squad car is not on his tail. The Marine approaches the last stretch before reaching the H-3 Gate. The

policeman radios ahead to the main gate the situation and course of pursuit. Upon arrival at the H-3 entrance the scared Marine slows his car. He continues through the gate and his heart-beat slows down to a shallow thudding in his chest. He thinks to himself, "Thank God I'm safe."

HE GLANCES into his rearview mirror and sees the flashing blue light on a Grand Prix. The same car that was chasing him through Kaneohe town is speeding through the gate still in pursuit of his suspect. The Marine starts to breathe hard again. In his midnight anguish he

wonders why the policeman didn't stop at the gate. The Marine breaks out in a pulsating sweat. Not knowing what to do, he feels trapped. He begins speeding through the base, headed for the airstrip on Mokapu Boulevard. The police car, now closer than ever, is gaining ground and is being followed by a military police truck. The Marine, seeing this from his mirror, gets even more confused. Not knowing what to do or which way to turn, he stops his car and humbly turns himself over.

THIS MAY never actually occur aboard MCAS Kaneohe Bay, but the point is, the Marine in the story had

the impression that after he made it through the gate, he was safe and secure.

This isn't the case. The Honolulu Police Department has concurrent jurisdiction aboard MCAS Kaneohe Bay. They are allowed to come aboard the air station at any time to investigate crimes and pursue suspects of crimes committed outside the gates.

THE PROVOST Marshal's Office and HPD act as a dual police force in situations such as the one described. "The HPD and the Military Police Department here, cooperate with each other very effectively if HPD is looking for someone on base," explained

Capt Carl King, provost marshal at MCAS Kaneohe Bay.

He said, "It's the same as any major city having police districts. There is mutual cooperation involved with the cause of solving crime problems."

"HPD RESPECTS our police force here on base and lets us handle our own problems that occur. Yet, if they are looking for someone or something, we give our cooperation as well."

King added, "Our force and HPD have excellent relations. They can talk with us on their channels on the radios and inform us they are coming aboard. In return we can hold a suspect for them at the

gate if necessary and wait for them to arrive."

King concluded, "If a Marine is wanted by civilian authorities, all we can do is provide him with a military lawyer to be present before he is taken into custody."

THE OLD adage, "Crime doesn't pay," is something every Marine should consider twice as hard before committing an act against the law.

Don't fool yourself by thinking you are home safe from civilian authorities once you are inside the gates. Concurrent jurisdiction gives HPD the right to be on base any time they have a suspect or a related reason for investigation.

Payment provides incentive

Bonus program assists retention

Occupational fields eligible for the Selective Reenlistment Bonus Program were announced June 1 in ALMAR 091/80. The SRBP was established to assist in attaining and sustaining adequate numbers of career-enlisted personnel in designated occupational fields. It provides additional pay incentives, reenlistment or extensions of enlistment of at least three years during the first 10 years of service.

TWO ZONES of eligibility were established: Zone A (21 months) to six years of active service) and Zone B (six to 10 years of active service). The occupational fields eligible for a SRBP payment and their respective award levels are normally announced annually, but are subject to change at any time to meet the needs of the Marine Corps.

A Selective Reenlistment Bonus, not to

exceed \$12,000 for each zone, is paid to a qualified Marine to change extension of enlistment or reenlistment in an occupational field specified as eligible by the Commandant of the Marine Corps.

THE BONUS amount is computed by multiplying the member's base pay at the time of reenlistment or extension of enlistment by the number of years and/or fraction of years of additional service for which the member will be obligated by the multiple designated in the current MCBul 7220.

To be eligible for a reenlistment bonus under the SRBP, Marines must meet certain requirements. They must be eligible and recommended for reenlistment, be serving in the grade of lance corporal or above, and be qualified in the skill for which the bonus is awarded.

Bonuses for reenlistments effected on or after April 1, 1979 will be paid under the lump sum method of payment only, to be paid at the time of reenlistment or on the effective date of the extension of enlistment.

PRIOR TO reenlistment an SRBP eligibility checklist will be prepared by the career planner. Once completed, it will be reviewed for accuracy, dated and signed by the commanding officer prior to reenlistment and the disbursing officer prior to bonus payment.

Before a member is reenlisted he or she must sign an SRBP Statement of Understanding, stating that he will be required to serve in a billet in the occupational field for the duration of his enlistment or extension unless a waiver is granted by the Commandant.

COMMANDING officers are authorized to award SRB payments in the multiple indicated to Marines having a primary military occupational specialty within the occupational fields listed below, provided they meet the eligibility requirements outlined

above. Occupational field eligibility for Zone A Selective Reenlistment Bonuses are: 04, 14, 21, 26, 28, 40, 44, 46, 58, 59, 61, 65, 66, 72, 73, and MOS 3073.

Those eligible for Zone B SRBs are: 02, 04, 11, 14, 18, 21, 26, 28, 33,

34, 40, 43, 44, 58, 59, 60, 61, 65, 66, 68, 70, 72, 73, and MOS 3073.

If you are considering reenlistment, or extending your current contract, see your career planner. You may be eligible for the Selective Reenlistment Bonus Program.

"If I hire you to take care of my automobile or factory, or... counter, I do not want to hear why things are half-done; I want results.

"So also if you come to me and hire me to do a job of writing by the fifteenth of the month; you do not want me to show up on that day with a moving-picture story describing how I couldn't do what I was paid for. You want the writing and you

want it first class, all wool and a yard wide.

"This is cold, cruel heartless talk. It is to all second-raters and shirkers.

"But to real men it is a joy and gladness. They rejoice to make good themselves, they expect others to make good, and they like to hear preached the gospel of making good. In the parable of talents, we are told of the three servants who had received talents: five, two and one, respectively. On the master's return they all rendered account of their stewardship. The first two had doubled their capital. Each of them said so in fourteen words, and their work was pronounced. 'Well done, good and faithful servant.' Servant number three had accomplished absolutely nothing, but he

made a full report in forty-two words, three times as long as the other reports.

"There you have it. The less you do the more you explain. 'EFFICIENCY!'

"Learn that word by heart. Get to saying it in your sleep.

"Of all the joys on this terrestrial sphere, there is none quite so soul satisfying as MAKING GOOD.

"Do your work a little better than anyone else could do it. That is the margin of success. Making good requires no footnotes.

"Failure requires forty-two words."

Ceramic tiles are 'classy'

The best design materials for the house always turn out to be old and new at once. They have strong roots in the past, but are interpreted for the present. Architects and decorators call such materials "classic." The rest of us call them "classy."

Ceramic tile wins top honors in this category. It goes back some 27,000 years, and now, as through the centuries, its basic ingredients are clay and fire. What has changed is its fashion value.

Thanks to sophisticated new firing and blending techniques, tile now comes in any color under the sun, and in an infinite number of sizes, shapes and textures. Sculptured

effects and decorative motifs add to the options.

A myriad of fashion options may seem a great advantage to the consumer, but the fact is that a broad choice often confuses the do-it-yourself remodeler and decorator.

So, here, from the Tile Council of America, are some hints to ease the selection process.

- A brick-shaped quarry tile in some good earth color is great for flooring in formal and country rooms. This is also a good style for the hearth. A glazed quarry tile becomes a bit more formal.

- For semi-formal and traditional rooms a glazed floor tile is the best choice. The deep reds, greens and golds are the most traditional and formal hues.

- Ceramic mosaics, which usually come in 1" and 2" sizes, are wonderfully versatile. They can be used on floors, walls and counters as well as outside, and they lend themselves to both a straightforward high-tech look as well as to fanciful patterns, borders and even murals.

- Highly dimensional, sculptured tile should only be used on walls, and are best for contemporary rooms.

- A square tile of whatever size is the most versatile of all the shapes. It will suit any room, from colonial to contemporary.

- Hex-shaped tiles suit informal rooms.

- Octagon-shaped tiles with small insets in a contrasting color can be wildly elegant. White with black, for example, is a very

Help Squad aids do-it-yourselfers

Fixing up your own home doesn't have to be expensive, according to one home improvement expert.

"Do-it-yourselfers, don't always adequately plan their purchases," notes Yuki Hisamoto, a perfectionist who manages the lumber yard at Pioneer Home Supply in Wahiawa.

Area rugs add zest

formal combination and suitable even for period rooms.

- Limit highly decorated tile to small areas. Remember, tile is such a permanent material, and a lot of pattern on a large floor or wall is sure to tire the eye quickly.

Decorative tile,

however, is handsome on backsplashes; standing in for chair rails in a dining room; and for borders around windows, doors and fireplaces.

- The grout color is an important fashion issue. Use a dark grout with a light-colored tile, for example, and the effect will be very high-tech, very contemporary. The lesser the contrast, the quieter the pattern effect.

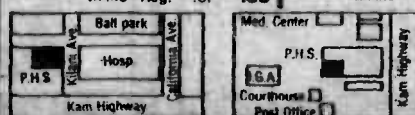

Don't take your home wiring for granted

Most homeowners take their house wiring for granted. As long as the lights go on and the refrigerator works, the entire system is left alone. When the paint on a house starts peeling and cracking, the homeowner schedules a paint or siding job. When the plumbing leaks, he fixes it or calls a plumber. When the driveway washes away or starts cracking up, he calls a contractor. When the roof leaks, he gets immediate repairs. If he doesn't have

enough hot water, he goes and buys a larger heater.

But what does he do when his lights blink, the TV picture shrinks, the hot water doesn't get real hot, the refrigerator compressor quits, breakers routinely trip and he doesn't have enough receptacles? Well, he usually just buys more extension cords and lives with the situation. He can't fix it himself and is afraid it would cost too much to "fix it right."

When he does an addition to a house or finally does make repairs, he hunts for the cheapest, unlicensed, "no permit necessary" person around. He won't think of going to a cheap, unlicensed doctor, lawyer, or CPA. But when he needs an electrician, he is willing to settle for a "he seems to know what he's doing" type person.

And strongest of all, the homeowner dreads getting a permit. He wants to avoid the hassle. He thinks of the

inspector as a bureaucratic pile of red tape, the enemy, someone to be avoided.

Well folks, Glenn, of Glenn's Electrical Service in Kaneohe says "the inspector is the best friend a homeowner ever had. He works cheap, polices the work done by contractors and makes sure that the installation or work meet the minimum Code standards."

The electrical contractor "has to" guarantee his work,

and "has to" maintain appropriate minimum liability insurance, for the benefit of the customers.

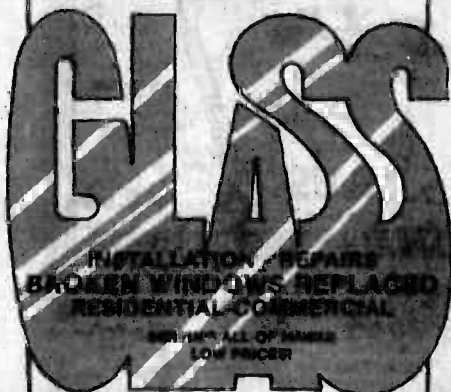
Of all the construction trades, the Electricians are about the highest paid, most technically educated, "work alone" people. The Electrical contractor works with tremendous liability and marginal profit due to high labor and overhead costs. He is either competitive or out of business.

Very rarely does a person hire an electrician except when compelled to by complete system failure or new construction. The trend seems to be that homeowners would rather spend their limited funds on swimming pools and other additions than correct the existing wiring or bring it up to code standards.

Fire is the number one danger in the home, and electrical problems are the number one

Quick actions earn medal

Standing duty is often regarded by Marines as strictly routine. Occasionally, however, something happens that graphically illustrates the large responsibility standing a duty watch entails. Cpl Michael Ledsworth never expected anything unusual to happen when he was on duty at Company F, 2d Battalion, 3d Marines during the morning hours of March 31. Ledsworth explained what happened.

"AT ABOUT 1 a.m. two Marines came to the duty desk and reported that a stabbing had occurred on the third deck. I grabbed my duty book and ran outside to

check the side exit. I spotted someone in the bushes and called for him to come out. The man continued moving through the bushes to the front of building 1029 and threw sand at me in an attempt to escape. I chased him and spotted the knife he was carrying. He threw the knife away, I guess to get rid of the evidence. "I caught up with him near the station roller rink but he managed to break free. I caught up to him again at the battalion command post parking lot. I apprehended the Marine and escorted him back to the company area. I knew the man, and talked with him to calm him down.

"I PUT HIM under guard of the staff duty NCO and went back for the knife. I used my garrison cap to pick it up, to avoid putting my prints on it. The police and ambulance were alerted by Cpl Jesse Caudle. When the MPs arrived they searched the man and confiscated the knife.

For his noteworthy achievement, the 21-year-old native of Port Huron, Michigan was awarded the Navy Achievement Medal. The citation lauded his

"composed, professional manner."

IT ALSO ADDED that Ledsworth had "maintained complete control of the situation throughout the entire course of events. His dedication to duty and diligent efforts reflect great credit upon himself, the Marine Corps and the United States Naval Service."

"I was really surprised when I received the medal," the soft-spoken Marine said. "I figured I was just doing

my job, but I was told what I did was beyond the call of duty."

The victim of the stabbing, LCpl Kenneth Woodland, has since recovered from the incident. His attacker recently pleaded guilty at a General Court-Martial to assault with intent to commit murder.

HE WAS sentenced to confinement at hard labor for ten years, forfeiture of all pay and allowances, reduction to private and a dishonorable discharge.

Bright-eyed children gathered as bewitched mice to the strains of the piper. Small sticky hands clutched strings of brilliantly colored balloons towering over the heads of grown-ups. Delighted giggles and fragrant smells wafted skyward.

a turnout." Kailua Tavern (now the location of the Shell station) was a landmark and popular watering hole. Beer was 30 cents.

The American Legion also sponsored the horse races that followed the parade. The 1949 celebration included a luau at the Army mess hall (now the location of the Aikahi Shopping Center), the meeting place of the American Legion. Andy Gumming provided the music.

"THE FIREWORKS in the evening were the main event. We had to stop them early that year because we had a casualty. One of the workers burned his hand." The fireworks have proven a major draw through the years. "They come from all over just to watch the fireworks; 80,000 people watched the fireworks from the beach last year."

Farias elaborates on the history of the parades. "We kept up with the annual parades and a few years later we had between 8,000 and 10,000 (persons in attendance), including a lot of people from the mainland." Kailua and Honolulu were the only Oahu cities that sponsored parades.

FUND-RAISING became an actual function of the Kailua Chamber of Commerce in 1960. "Kailua was getting on the map, becoming known. Eisenhower came through here and Roosevelt did, too. Johnny Yuma 'The Rebel' rode a horse in our parade."

Farias has seen the parade grow from 20 floats to 116, not counting the marching units. It's clear that his enthusiasm and pride have not diminished through the years. Farias enjoys his role in the annual preparations. "We're going to have a big celebration this year. Over 25,000 people attended the parade last year."

FARIAS AND his wife Amy are members of the 1980 "Ohana Americana" committee. Amy is president of the Kailua Seniors, an organization that has donated its time and talents as this year's food and refreshment booth committee.

Response from community, civic and military organizations in the preparation for the Fourth of July parade and festivities has been outstanding. This year's celebration will include a parade and subsequent judging of entrants, an arts and crafts fair featuring strolling minstrels and mimes, and an evening fireworks display.

"WE'RE TRYING to get the American Legion to get little flags to give to the kids this year," says Farias. The presentation of a well-orchestrated Fourth of July depends upon involvement, organization—and donors. Last year the Kailua Chamber of Commerce spent almost \$3,000 on the aerial display.

The Kailua Fourth of July effort is well on its way toward that goal. Almost \$3,000 has been contributed by local merchants and individuals with a tender spot in their hearts for the annual festivities. Grand marshal Danny Kaleikini will preside over the parade which will feature crazy clowns, flowery floats, brass bands, martial marching units and custom corvettes. Windward members of the University of Hawaii Rainbows will be guests of honor.

The 1st Marine Brigade is providing a marching unit and Marines for the combined service color guard.

The FMFPac band will perform, as will six others.

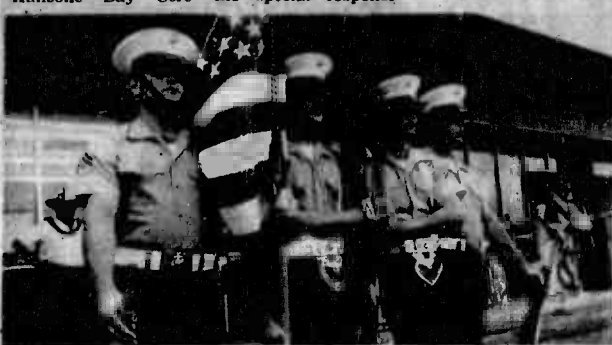

Consumer's Choice

EDITOR'S NOTE: Consumer's Choice is a bi-monthly column designed to bring various aspects of a subject to the consumer's attention. One subject will be covered each month. Every two weeks a different approach to the monthly subject will be presented. This month's feature is geared toward health-minded shoppers. It points out tips on buying foods of nutritional value.

The egg is an excellent source of protein, and a nutritional work of art. However, if you worry about cholesterol, it's a good idea to cut down on eggs as well as on the saturated fats in red meats, butter and other whole milk products.

WITH ALL that is written and said about additives, cancer and other health problems many consumers think that foods raised in the natural state are the best thing for you. If you feel this way, now you know you're not alone. Natural food stores are

sprouting up everywhere to cater to growing numbers of consumers who are willing to pay a little extra for food without chemical additives and commercial processing. This can be just fine for the conscientious shopper, but there are some things that every health minded consumer should know.

FIRST OF all, there are no legal standards to define "health food." Any merchant can call his food product a health food. The only general restriction is making outlandish claims that a given food is therapeutic. Although a food producer may label a jar of honey as "health" food, he isn't allowed to claim

that it cures arthritis or lumbago.

Over the past years, health food products such as wheat germ, granola, brewer's yeast, yogurt and others have been exploited. Even though there's a lot to be said for most of these foods, some of them have real drawbacks: The calories in honey for example

are as empty as sugar calories, and honey normally costs more.

IN SPITE OF its nutritional value, granola, used in cereals and baked goods is often sugary, fatty and expensive. There are organically raised fruits and vegetables available, grown without pesticides or chemical fertilizer. However, there are no

scientific facts showing any nutritional difference between an organically grown vegetable and one that wasn't grown organically. Some health food favorites have unqualified benefits: brewer's yeast for instance, is rich in vitamin B. Wheat germ is protein-rich as well as a good source of vitamins B and E. You can use either food to

supplement lots of your favorite dishes.

IF YOU PLAN to get the most nutrition possible out of every dollar you spend, read labels to determine whether a product is as nutritious as you think

Make sure you eat a well balanced meal at least once a day to get all the vitamins, minerals, and other nutrients your body needs.

fluorescents became popular in the 1940s.

Life expectancies of early bulbs were drastically reduced by frequent restarting, and electricity was cheaper than bulb replacement. Newer bulbs tolerate restarting better—and, as the consumer knows, electricity is much more expensive now.

WHAT ABOUT other bulbs? Incandescent lamps should always be turned off when not needed. When using high intensity discharge bulbs, mercury, vapor, high or low pressure sodium lamps, refer to manufacturer's instructions.

Generally they should not be extinguished unless the shut-off time will exceed 20 minutes. Remember, saving energy is everyone's job.

Lady Reservist Flies the Blues

An attractive, 30-year-old Army Reservist has done her part in getting the women's movement off the ground.

In March, Irene (Dottie) Holmes became the first woman Army Reservist to earn her wings after completing flight training at the United States Army Aviation Center in Ft. Rucker, Alabama. She passed the strenuous 10-month program with flying colors, finishing second in her class.

Not too long ago, Warrant Officer Holmes had no idea she'd become as intimate with the workings of Hueys and Chinooks as male pilots have been for the last 20 years.

After three years of active Army duty in Houston and New Orleans, she moved to Washington. In 1978, studied engineering and joined the Army Reserve. Second career

Retired Marine pursues new line of work

Servicemen nearing the end of their military careers often find themselves at a loss beginning a civilian career. Retired Marine LtCol Bert Peterka is an exception to this unfortunate maxim.

WHEN THE 52-year old native of Fort Worth, Texas, retired from the Corps two years ago following 35 years of active service, he immediately embarked on a busy new career as proprietor of the "Custom Golf Shop" in Honolulu. Peterka specializes in repairing both wood and iron clubs and also makes custom clubs on order.

Peterka explained how he first became interested in making and repairing golf clubs.

"I've played golf all

my life and I also enjoyed woodworking as a hobby. About 7 years ago I began combining the two, doing repairs on my own clubs. Eventually I started doing work for my friends. Ultimately this led to my decision to open my own shop when I retired."

THE COLONEL'S military career spans World War II, Korea and Vietnam and closely parallels the history of the Marine Corps over the past three and a half decades. He enlisted at the age of 15 with the aid of a slightly doctored birth certificate. Peterka was all of 16 when he participated in the landing on Guam. By February 1945, Peterka was already a battle-hardened 17-year-old

Leatherneck when he participated in the legendary Iwo Jima landing.

Names like Inchon and Chosin Reservoir also play large parts in Peterka's military past. By the time the Korean conflict drew to a close, he had attained the rank of staff sergeant and was on the verge of being commissioned a second lieutenant.

"Lying about my age when I first entered the Corps caused my commission to be held up for over a year while my records were being straightened out," he recalled.

THE REST of Peterka's career illustrates the versatility expected of a good Marine. He served as a platoon, company and battalion commander, had a tour of sea-duty aboard the USS Bremerton, served as an operations officer

at Camp Fuji, Japan, and became an instructor-instructor with 1st Battalion, 24th Marines.

He then served his third combat tour in Vietnam with the 3d Marine Amphibious Force and the 7th Marines, ran a base brig at Camp Lejeune, served as Marine Representative, Alternate National Military Command Center for the Joint Chiefs of Staff and attended the Army Command and General Staff College, Fort Leavenworth, Mo.

Peterka served as public affairs officer, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific, before retiring in June 1978. He also managed to find time to acquire both a bachelor's degree (business administration) and a master's degree (management sciences).

With such a background in the military,

one might expect Peterka to find it difficult to start all over again. Luckily, this wasn't the case.

"AFTER 35 years in the Marine Corps I anticipated that I would miss it when I retired," he asserted. "Fortunately I've been so busy I haven't had much time to miss it. It hasn't been difficult making the adjustment. I still maintain contact with Marines at Kaneohe."

Peterka employs one full-time worker and a part-time helper. His full-time assistant, Peter Heaton, is also a military retiree. Heaton was a radioman first class when he retired following 21 years in the Navy. Most of the shop's customers are local professionals, sporting goods stores, country clubs and military courses.

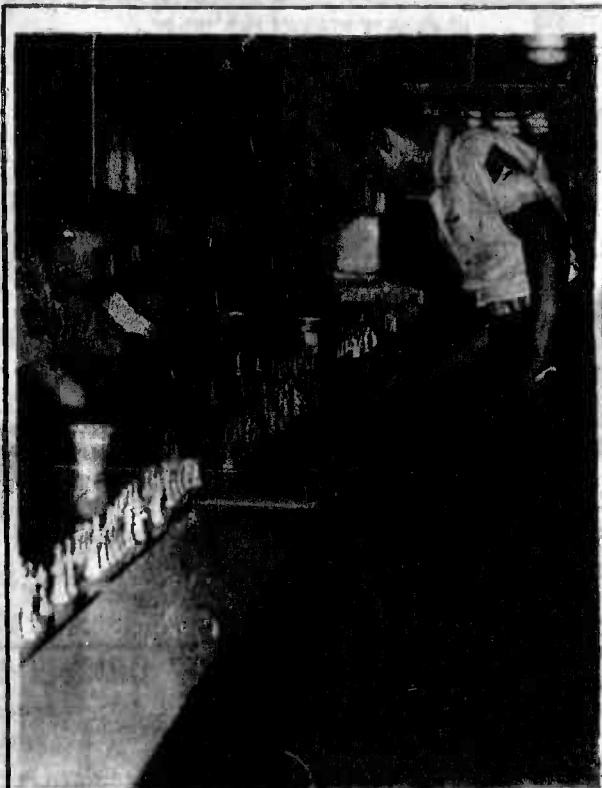

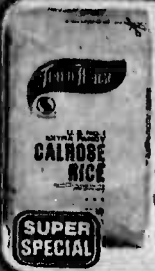

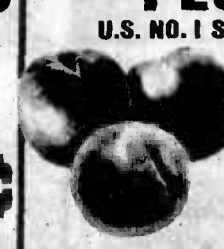

Alternative that reduces gasoline use

Rapidly soaring prices these days are forcing consumers to develop alternate ways of reducing their use of gasoline. Besides walking, carpooling, public transportation and bicycling, a gas-saving favorite of many people is the moped.

PEOPLE CAN be seen almost everywhere on or off station.

Putting about on small vehicles that resemble a combination motor scooter and bicycle. It seems to run for weeks on a single tank of fuel.

Mopeds are not only compact, economical and inexpensive, they're also fun to operate. Because they are equipped with motors, they are considered motor vehicles, and as such

the rider is granted all rights and is subject to the same responsibilities as automobile operators.

According to the Hawaii Vehicle Code, a moped is defined as: "A device upon which a person may ride that has two or three wheels in contact with the ground, a motor having a maximum power output of one-and-one-

half horsepower (1,119 watts) or less. If a combustible engine, a maximum piston or rotor displacement of 3.05 cubic engine and propels the device unassisted on a level surface no faster than 35 mph."

MOPEDS ARE not allowed on Hawaii's highways and when operated aboard the station or city streets,

they must travel as far to the right side of the road as practical, at speeds not to exceed 35 mph. Whenever bicycle lanes are available, the driver must use them. Extreme care should be used in passing parked or moving cars. Mopeds, as well as other motor vehicles are prohibited from driving on sidewalks or areas intended for pedestrian use.

Persons operating mopeds must possess valid driver's licenses, however, no one under the age of 15 may drive the vehicle. Mopeds must be equipped with standard safety features (lights, horns, brakes, etc.), and cannot be modified except as authorized by the manufacturer. Such modifications may not increase the vehicles' horsepower.

HAWAII LAW does not indicate mandatory wearing of helmet by a moped driver, but it does list other requirements. According to the code, no one driving a moped shall attach themselves, or the moped, to any other vehicle, nor permit the rider of a bicycle, coaster, sled, toy vehicle or roller skates to be attached to the driver.

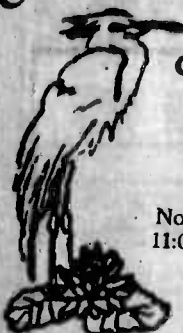

Lifesaving: what to do and how

You're at the beach settling down to soak in the sun. It's a beautiful day and you don't have a worry in the world. It's quiet, and only a few people are in sight swimming, snorkeling and laying around on the beach. Wait! What was that? Someone beyond the waves crying for help? Un- sure, you wait. Again. The same desperate

voice.
What do you do?

DO YOU JUMP in the water with visions of heroism in your mind? Do you call someone else to come to the rescue? Or do you ignore the cries of a possibly drowning person?

Many people really don't know how to react to a panicky situation

at the ocean or in a pool. The only way to save a drowning victim is to know what to do and how to do it. Think ... before you jump in the water.

The American Red Cross will hold an Advanced Lifesaving Class from July 7 through 18 at Camp Smith. The course will consist of classroom instruction and practical application in the

pool and ocean.

TO TAKE THE advanced course you must be able to swim 500 yards, know the five basic swim strokes, be able to tread water for ten minutes and float on your back.

The course is open to active duty Marines, dependents and civilian personnel. To attend, you must be at

least 16 years of age.

Rita Albina will teach the course. "The course is designed to teach people how to save others and themselves in dangerous situations," she stated. "It isn't just a life-saving course. It builds confidence in swimming ability and teaches you to respect the water. The main thing to remember about trying to save

someone's life is make sure you know what to do without putting yourself in danger," Albina added.

SOME OF THE most important topics covered in the course are first aid, utilization of lifesaving equipment, escapes and releases of drowning swimmers and lifesaving strokes.

Advanced Lifesaving

courses are given by the Red Cross five or six times a year. Classes run from 8 to 11:30 a.m. with an average class size of 25 students taught by two instructors. Upon completion of the course students will be qualified lifeguards.

Intelligence Brief

ROPUCHA LST. Built for the Soviets by Poland's Gdansk Northern Shipyard, the Ropucha class LST marked a new class of Soviet LST's, and is a major addition to the Soviet Amphibious ship inventory. There are presently ten units in service.

Unlike previous Soviet amphibious ships, a major design feature of the Ropucha appears to be facilities for embarked troops (estimated capacity: 225 - 275). Also included in its 1,000+ metric ton lift capability are 22 - 27 BTR-60 PA/B amphibious armored personnel carriers.

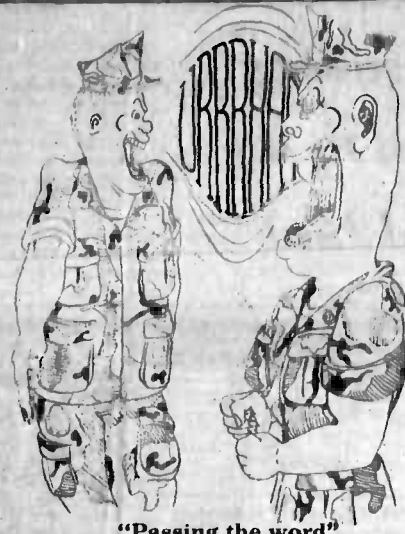
Another major design feature is the inclusion of both bow and stern ramps. It is believed a vehicle deck runs the length of the ship, which would provide a roll on/roll off capability.

In contrast to the Alligator LST (briefed last article), the Ropucha is

slightly smaller but can carry a larger number of troops for a longer period. However, the Alligator's total lift capability is approximately 700 metric tons greater.

Weapon systems on the Ropucha consist of two twin 57mm guns and possibly shore bombardment rockets. With these weapons, the ship can provide limited covering fire for an amphibious assault.

Dominant recognition features of the Ropucha are the aft area, which includes a four level superstructure that covers 50 percent of the total length of the ship; the twin 57mm positioned fore and aft on the superstructure; and the large main stack with side by side exhaust.

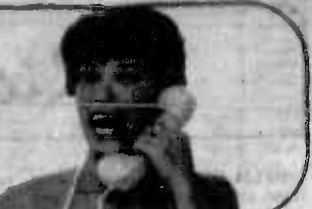
