## Marines celebrate anniversary

# Birthday balls set

Nov. 10 marks the 205th anniversary of the most elite fighting force in the history of the United States: the United States Marine Corps.

To commemorate the event, Marines everywhere will conduct birthday celebrations with their colleagues.

MCAS Kaneohe Bay's celebration for enlisted personnel will be held at the Windward Enlisted Club Nov. 10. The cocktail hour begins at 5:30 p.m. followed by traditional cake-cutting ceremonies.

LARRY PRICE, Channel 4 news personality, will be guest speaker during the enlisted ball festivities.

Dinner is scheduled to be served shortly thereafter with steamship round heading the menu.

Male Marines are required to wear one of two dress uniforms: summer service "A" or traditional dress blues,

while women Marines when accompanied by a male Marine may choose to wear formal civilian attire. Unaccompanied women Marines will be required to wear either summer service "A" or dress blues.

Tickets for the Enlisted Marine Corps Birthday Ball are now on sale at the Windward Enlisted Club from 8 a.m. until 5:30 p.m. Ticket prices are \$10 per couple and six dollars for singles. The fee will cover entertainment and dining costs.

THE MUSICAL group "Motion" will perform in the Enlisted Club's ballroom.

Staff noncommissioned officers will celebrate the anniversary at the MCAS Commissioned Officers' Club, Kaneohe Bay with cocktails and traditional cake-cutting ceremonies.

Three bands, "Two For The Show," "Friend," and a country western group headline the

entertainment segment of the ball.

A prime rib dinner served with wine or other beverages with dessert is featured.

Tickets for the staff birthday ball are available only at the Staff Noncommissioned Officers' Club aboard MCAS Kaneohe Bay.

A general admission charge of \$5 is required from folks attending the ball. Five dollars will be charged for dinner. The continental breakfast scheduled to be served the following day costs \$3.

AN EQUALLY enjoyable birthday ball is planned for Marine officers Nov. 10.

The Officers' Ball will be held in the Coral Ballroom of the Hilton Hawaiian Village, commencing with a colorful pageant followed by the cake cutting ceremony.

A scrumptious prime rib beef dinner with seafood salad and a special dessert are among the entrees.

The Fleet Marine Force Pacific Dance Band and a "disco" disc jockey will provide music and dance entertainment.

Tickets for this year's ball cost \$22 and cover expenses for dinner, parking, tax, gratuity, entertainment and the birthday cake.

The prescribed uniform, for those who are required to possess it, is mess dress. All other officers may wear either White "A" (large medals without sword) or summer service "A". Semi-formal is appropriate attire for guests and will be optional for retired or reserve officers.

AN ADDED benefit for Marines attending the birthday balls is the service provided by the child care center aboard the air station. The center will remain open later hours at reduced rates the evening of Nov. 10. Parents are encouraged to make reservations well in advance.

# Energy Awareness Week emphasizes conservation

Energy Awareness Week is observed by Marine Corps Air Station Kaneohe Bay Oct. 27 through Nov. 2 as a part of the Department of the Navy's program to emphasize the importance of energy conservation says Shelley Kuya, facilities engineer.

Products that can save energy and tips on energy conservation are featured at Navy Exchanges worldwide during the week.

MANY EXCHANGES set up special energy-saving centers to highlight items such as insulation, caulking, blankets, insulated draperies, auto tune-up parts and other items that assist families in saving energy.

Since energy makes day-to-day living possible, it is important to be conscientious of energy conservation so that there will be enough energy to meet our needs in the future. The supply of fossil fuels is limited yet demands keep rising. By using energy more efficiently, we can save our natural resources, the environment... and money.

Here are a few tips:

Insulating hot water heaters is an expensive way to save money. While hot water heaters are insulated an extra coat on the outside can save approximately \$10 to \$20 per year.

If you use air conditioning, you can save between \$25 and \$30 by simply keeping windows and doors closed and curtains and shades tightly drawn. Keeping a cool washing machine is another no-cost way of saving energy. Switching to the lowest temperature setting on your washing machine can have a major impact on your utility bills.

IT TAKES ABOUT 35 gallons of water to do a full wash and rinse and approximately 16 gallons for each cycle. The amount of hot water depends on which button you push.

Using a hot wash and warm rinse normally costs \$100 a year. Changing the rinse water to "cold," which experts say will not affect the wash results, can amount to savings of \$75 per year. If you go up one notch to a "warm" wash and "cold" rinse, it's more money in your pocket.

Energy can also be saved while driving. Regular tune-ups, changing the airfilter when dirty, using proper gas and oil and maintaining correct tire

pressure, coupled with obeying the 55 mph speed limit, is a proven way of saving 50 percent of normal driving costs.

**WHILE SHOPPING,** it pays to assess the real value of your purchases. Buying long-lasting products eliminates frequent replacement and saves money and resources. Recyclables such as steel, glass, aluminum and paper can be re-used to help stretch natural resources which will end up as a savings.

Savings is what it's all about. If energy conservation was a part of every family's life-style it would help extend our supplies and reduce import burdens. If we continue to use energy as we've become accustomed, we may find ourselves in trouble before the year 2007.

The Department of the Navy is doing its part to become energy-thrifty. Now it's our move!

A 1:30 p.m. lecture Wednesday, Oct. 29 at the Family Theatre by Alan Lloyd of the Hawaiian Electric Company highlights the week-long event. Active duty and retired service members and the families are invited to attend.



# Office hours strengthen discipline

How much do Marines in Hawaii know about Article 15 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice? If they're like the majority of servicepersons, chances are they know very little about non-judicial punishment or, what they think they know doesn't coincide with the way the system actually works. This unfamiliarity is particularly common among enlisted personnel.

Try these questions. Who may be punished under Article 15? What punishments may be imposed and how do the procedures differ from a court-martial? What rights does an individual have under Article 15?

Here are the answers to these and other frequently asked questions as derived from the manual for courts-martial.

**WHAT IS nonjudicial punishment?** Article 15 provides administrative, nonjudicial pun-

ishment of service persons, both officer and enlisted, who violate the UCMJ by an offense considered too serious to be handled by ordinary methods such as counseling, but not so severe as to require trial by court-martial.

**WHEN IS Article 15 imposed?** Nonjudicial punishment is often used in response to failure to obey regulations, short unauthorized absences, failure to go to appointed place of duty and other minor UCMJ violations.

**WHO MAY impose nonjudicial punishment?** In the Navy and Marine Corps non-judicial punishment may be imposed only by commanding officers. Before exercising authority under Article 15, the officer is required to thoroughly evaluate each case on an individual basis. The amount of punishment a commander can impose is also limited by the rank the officer holds.

**WHAT punishments may be awarded?** Commanders are encouraged to take full advantage of non-punitive disciplinary measures, but once the commander has decided to impose Article 15 and the individual has accepted Article 15, the commander must decide the amount of type of punishment to be imposed. Punishment depends on the seriousness of the offense, the grade of the offender, the grade of the commander imposing the punishment and any extenuating or mitigating circumstances (i.e. past performance, the reason the offense was committed, whether a certain type of punishment may cause undue hardship on the offender, etc.).

Punishment can include reduction in grade, forfeiture of a portion of a member's pay, detention of a portion of pay, placing the offender in correctional custody, assignment of extra duties, and certain combinations of these punish-

ments if permissible under the UCMJ.

**WHAT ARE the service person's rights?** Before Article 15 can be imposed, a member is given certain rights to ensure the procedure and any punishments received are fair and just. Article 15 cannot be imposed without first notifying the alleged offender of his offense and of the commander's intent to impose nonjudicial punishment.

The service person must then be informed of his rights with respect to the proposed punishment. One of the most important of these rights is the right to consult with an attorney. The member may also request a private hearing with the commander, and submit written statements or present witnesses which set forth defenses and mitigating circumstances surrounding the offense.

**HOW DOES Article 15 differ from a court-martial?** The accused's decision to demand trial by court-martial involves a number of considerations and should not be made without the advice of legal counsel.

The main difference between Article 15 and trial by court-martial is the permanency of the record, the amount of punishment that can be imposed and the formality of the proceedings. Unlike a court-martial, Article 15 involves no formal proceedings, no judge and no jury. Further, the maximum punishment imposed under Article 15 is less than the maximum punishment that may be imposed as the result of a trial by court-martial.

The most significant difference is that conviction by court-martial is a Federal court conviction which remains part of an individual's criminal record, even after the individual has been separated from the service. An Article 15 does not amount to a Federal court conviction. It is merely placed in the person's service record book where it remains for two years or until the individual separates, whichever is earlier.

**WHEN IS non-judicial punishment imposed?** Only after the accused has had the chance to consult with legal counsel and submit statements does a commander actually

impose punishment. Once the punishment has been imposed, the offender has 15 days in which to submit an appeal, which will not be considered by the commander who imposed the punishment, but the next higher authority.

The grounds for appeal are based on whether the accused feels the punishment awarded was too severe for the offense committed. Only the severity of the punishment may be appealed.

The individual may request the punishment be suspended, reduced, remitted or set aside in whole or in part. In the meantime, the individual may be punished as adjudged. Punishments involving restriction, correctional custody and other forms of personal restraint are held in abeyance until a decision on the appeal has been reached.

**THE POINT to remember is that non-judicial punishment is intended primarily to promote discipline and improve behavior in the command. Persons interested in obtaining further information on Article 15 procedures should contact their unit legal assistance officer.**

# Students' visit adds understanding

**EDITOR'S NOTE:** The causes and prevention of civilian-military youth conflict in Windward Oahu are the subjects of the following two-part series. The first segment reports on the success of a human relations project involving 150 Castle High School students and personnel of MCAS Kaneohe Bay. The second addresses past and present causes for the Windward youth conflicts, as identified by 228 students from four local high schools.

The purpose of this MCAS human relations project is to better relations where community assault statistics indicate they are needed most: that is, single, male Marines and local youths between the ages of 15 and 24. The high school students were selected because of their age proximity to the conflicting group and

because of their accessibility through the school system.

**THE PILOT** project began in April with several visits to classrooms of Castle High School. Initially, the students were asked to describe, in writing, their feelings toward Marines and the reasons they thought conflicts arose between Marines and local youths. Following that, a slide show was presented depicting many of the positive community, environmental and humanitarian, as well as national defense functions Marines serve.

Days later, the students were taken on class tours of the air station/1st Marine Brigade facility. Various student tour activities included: firing blank rounds from an M-16 rifle; examining various jet fighter and helicopter aircraft; going for a

spin in an amphibious tracked vehicle; viewing scenic Windward Oahu from atop Kansas Tower; watching the air station Crash Crew Marines extinguish a demonstration fire; firing a shoulder-harnessed missile launcher (Dragon) simulator; observing the brigade's 1980 "Super Squad" Marines attack a fortified enemy position; and feasting at a C-rations cookout or the all-you-can-eat luncheon at the brigade dining facility. Every tour effort was geared toward promoting the maximum unguarded interaction of the students and Marines.

**ON THE DAY** following the tour, the students completed questionnaires. Results showed that 96 percent of the students thought the tour was a positive experience (marking either "good" or "great"). Ninety-four percent further reported the project was a

good way to improve relations between local youths and Marines. In the students' own words:

"The tour gave us a chance to discover that all Marines are not just troublemakers. They have feelings too!"  
 "Now I understand how come Marines always stare so much at us girls. I would do likewise if I had to be around girls all the time; only, of course, I would stare at boys!"  
 "The tour was good because you get to talk to Marines and see how they really are. Usually when locals see Marines, they only judge them on their looks. But if they would just take the time to sit and talk to them, then they could

see Marines are just like us. Thanks for a great day."

"ON THE tours you learn what Marines have to go through. Then you realize how much they have to put up with, without having locals make more hassles for them!"  
 "While planning for the field trip to the Marine base I thought it was going to be junk because that's the home of the grunts. I also figured it would be boring. When I went however, I saw all sorts of interesting things and the Marines were very kind and nice. Before, I thought Marines were troublemakers. Now I have a different opinion. I

hope that more schools get to go to the Marine base because it is an enjoyable, educational adventure."

Before the human relations project began, 28 percent of the students recorded positive opinions of Marines, 40 percent were neutral and 32 percent had negative opinions. After the tour, 92 percent of the students reported positive opinions of Marines. In short, the project was a success. Quite simply, it provided the necessary opportunity for Marines and students to come together in a positive setting, where they could discover each other's humanness.

**THE HUMAN** relations project was conducted during the last month of the 1979-80 school year. This is the reason there was only time to include one of the four Windward

high schools on the tours. The results were so overwhelmingly positive, however, that they clearly indicate such programs have a tremendous potential for improving military-

civilian relations with the Windward youth populations. The 1980-81 school year represents an even greater opportunity to expand and refine these human relations efforts.



## Superstition stifles freedom from fear

The sun goes down, the shadows fade, and the darkness of night arrives. It is an unusual night. It is the night when ghosts, goblins and witches come out to haunt and horrify us all. It is the night of Halloween.

Even though most of us don't really believe in the weird creatures associated with this occasion, we do find ourselves thinking about scary things—witches, bone-rattling skeletons and evil, unnatural happenings.



In story, verse and song, witches have always been portrayed as evil, wart-nosed hags who put cruel whammies on unsuspecting individuals, only to be foiled at their own game by good and wise persons who thus become the heroes of the saga. But that is not always the case. A recent song about a witch in the bayou country of Louisiana says she made a man a millionaire because he promised to marry her. But after he got his million, he decided not to marry her, so she did away with him.

The belief in witches, however, predates recent history. The ancient Egyptians and Romans believed in witches. During the 16th and 17th centuries, thousands of

women were tortured and killed after they had been charged with practicing witchcraft in England. There were many persecutions of suspected witches in the early American colonies of Massachusetts, Connecticut and Virginia. Through the influence of Cotton Mather, a New England witch hunter of that day, there were widely-publicized executions of so-called witches in Salem, Mass.

Although the belief in broomstick-riding, spell-casting witches is no longer common, witch hunts by other names still continue, often based on fears as unfounded as the superstitions of a less enlightened age. In another context but with related significance, President Franklin D. Roosevelt's message to congress in 1941 emphasized the importance of human freedoms, especially "freedom from fear."

Halloween will come and go—and the witches and goblins with it—but our confrontations with superstition still remain. The fight to free ourselves from superstition—unfounded feelings and beliefs, prejudices, etc.—continues. One English writer has said, "Fear is the main source of superstition, and one of the main sources of cruelty. To conquer fear is the beginning of wisdom."

# Sailing skills open new frontier

Mastering the skills of handling a sailboat is an exhilarating experience. Once acquired, these skills open a new frontier on the ripples of Kaneohe Bay. All that is needed to experience this frontier of freedom is a sailboat and a license.

THE MCAS Kaneohe Bay Special Services, Station Marina presently has eight sailboats available for patrons at the air station to take out for their enjoyment. They include six main-sail Laser sailboats, one 13-foot jib-sail/main-sail Puffer, and one 19-foot Lightning boat.

The 19-foot Lightning sailboat was turned over to the MCAS Special Services Office from the docks of Pearl Harbor Naval Base a month ago.

CAPT JAMES Davis, adjutant and special services officer, Marine Barracks, Hawaii at Pearl Harbor, requested Headquarters Marine Corps approval to have the boat relocated at the MCAS marina.

Marine Barracks had no further use for the sailboat, which had been docked there for a long period of time. Special Services at Kaneohe Bay has made several plans to put the Lightning boat and all their new floating additions to good use.

THE BOATS will be used as rental boats for persons carrying licenses which state they can safely operate them. For sailors who have the experience to operate the boats but no license, the personnel at Special Services

have taken care of that as well.

Patrons who wish to qualify for operation of the Laser and Puffer sailboats, the smallest of the fleet, can do so by taking a written and practical boat test at the marina for a minimal fee. A small fee added to that of the initial testing can qualify a person for a license to sail the Lightning and Apollo sailboats, the largest in the marina's fleet.

ROY BENDEL, sailboat licensing instructor at the station marina, explained, "All testing and practical application training is done here. Classes are held every Wednesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday. People have the option of choosing between two morning classes from 9 a.m. till noon or two afternoon classes from 1 to 5 p.m.

"The requirements call for persons to have six hours in the classroom and two hours of practical application sailing instructions. An additional four hours is required in the practical application portion before one of our students receives a boating license."

AFTER completing

the additional four hours, "qualified sailboat operators can take a boat out in the bay anytime, after making the necessary arrangements for having one available," said Bendel.

He noted, "I think the classes are going pretty well at the present time. The students we're getting are responsible and translate their learned skills to the

actual sailing techniques. "In fact, my first student from whom I first began teaching here at the marina Sept. 20, learned well enough to win the marina's Laser race from the marina, around Coconut Island and back, Sept. 28."

FOR ANYONE who has been waiting for

the opportunity to sail the blue Kaneohe Bay, but has put off getting a license, now is a good time to take advantage of the marina's offered instruction.



# Consumer's Choice

**EDITOR'S NOTE:** Consumer's Choice is a column designed to bring various items of interest to consumers' attention. Subjects range from grocery shopping to home buying. This article is concerned with nutritional fact versus myth. It is based on a series of surveys completed in 1975 by the U.S. Food

and Drug Administration.

The Ps and Qs of nutrition are quite simple for people who are aware that eating the proper foods is an important part of maintaining a healthy body. However, there are a great many consumers who base their nutritional values

on myths and personal preference rather than facts.

As you read the following statements, commonly voiced by food shoppers, answer them true or false. Find out if your beliefs about nutrition are those of myth or fact.

1. If you eat any variety of foods, you'll get proper nourish-

ment. True\_\_\_ False\_\_\_  
2. People don't have to eat meat, poultry or fish to stay healthy. True\_\_\_ False\_\_\_

If you agree with the first statement, chances are your daily food consumption may not be nutritionally balanced.

According to FDA surveys from the mid-'70s, choosing appropriate foods for a nutritionally well-balanced diet doesn't mean just the variety of foods eaten.

The choice of foods which provide the proper nutrients for a healthy body should be selected from the four main food groups: milk, meat, bread and vegetables (fruits included). A diet of these foods supplies enough needed calories, protein, vitamins and minerals, if served properly. Generally, a well balanced diet can be maintained by including two or more servings from each of the four main food groups each day.

It isn't absolutely necessary to eat meat, fish or poultry to stay healthy. Vegetarians do not damage their health by omitting this food group. If you disagree with statement number two, you have been slightly misinformed, according to the FDA survey. As long as there are

enough dairy foods consumed to replace the meat group, they can readily provide the high quality protein that meats supply. Alternatives, such as peanut butter or eggs, can add protein needed for the body's health.

Strict vegetarians who do not eat eggs or dairy products, may have a difficult time providing themselves with an adequate protein diet. They may require vitamin B supplements.

It's often supposed that snacks ruin a properly maintained diet. The fact of the matter is that nutritional value is mainly dependent on the types of foods eaten. If you agree with statement three, you are correct.

A hard boiled egg, an orange and a tuna sandwich as a snack can contribute to a well balanced diet because they carry high protein values. However, heavy consumption of junk food snacks such as candy, potato chips and soft drinks, all of which are relatively high in calories and low in nutritional value, can be harmful to health. When they take the place of nutritious foods during regular meals, they're even more harmful.

If you agree with three quarters of the people surveyed by the FDA you believe that eating fresh home-cooked vegetables is preferable and more

nutritious. The FDA considered their beliefs wrong.

The reason they claim these people are incorrect about fresh, frozen or canned vegetables is that the content of nutrients available in vegetables depends on the way they are cooked and stored. According to the administration, vegetables lose nutrients during the cooking process and in storage, even factory storage.

Overcooking destroys many nutrients. Cooking vegetables in excessive water loses many valuable water-soluble vitamins, such as C and some of the B vitamins.

Storing fresh vegetables at improper temperatures for periods of time, or keeping them in open containers also contributes to a reduction in nutrient values. Vegetables begin to grow older faster.

Retained nutritional value really depends on the way vegetables are handled and prepared, rather than whether they are bought canned, frozen or fresh.

Being a smart consumer means buying the right things at the right prices. Food purchase is an important process for the majority of American consumers. Buying the proper foods for yourself and your family can be a big health bonus.

## Marine Corps offers training

The Marine Corps is looking for persons who would like to be parachutists and scuba divers.

To be qualified, Marines must have successfully completed a Marine Corps approved course in parachute and scuba phases of operations and training, according to training officials at Headquarters Marine Corps.

Marines may not attend the courses for the skills on permissive temporary additional duty, but the courses can be used as a reenlistment option when quotas are available for Marines in the three military occupational fields infantry, artillery and operational communications.

Persons who meet all qualifications can receive one of the following MOSs:

9952 — Scuba Marine; 9953 — Parachutist/Scuba Marine; 9962 — Parachutist; 8652 — Reconnaissance Man, Parachute Jump Qualified; 8653 — Reconnaissance Man, Scuba Qualified; and 8654 — Reconnaissance Man, Parachute and Scuba Qualified.

Requirements for Marines to become scuba divers or parachutists are:

Scuba volunteers must be 30 years old or younger and at least first class swimmers. Parachute volunteers may not be older than 36 years.

Marines must have at least 18 months of active duty remaining.

Both parachutists and scuba divers who serve in a job requiring their special skills are entitled to special payments.

For more information interested persons may check Marine Corps Order 1500.16C.





## Bonus

### New Zone C Marines rate reenlistment payment

Active duty Marines with 10 to 14 years of service now rate a zone C reenlistment bonus in various fields. To be eligible for a zone C selective reenlistment bonus, the enlisted member must have completed at least 10 but no more than 14 years of active service on the date of reenlistment or by the end of an extension of enlistment. **THEY MUST** also reenlist or voluntarily extend their enlistment for a period of at least three years, provided that the reenlistment or extension, when coupled with existing active service will provide a total of 14 years active service, and members must not have received a zone C SRB.

Effective Oct. 1, 1980, the reenlistment bonus maximum of \$12,000 has been raised to \$16,000. Occupational fields that are eligible for the zone C selective reenlistment bonus are:

Commanding officers are authorized to approve the zone C bonus besides approving zones A and B bonuses.

In the past, Marines who wanted to reenlist with the option of a lateral move into a field with a bonus were unable to receive the bonus until their next reenlistment. **THE AGREEMENT** to Train Option Program (ATOP) now allows people reenlisting with the lateral

move option to extend for the school. At the end of the school the Marine would reenlist and be eligible for the bonus. Marines using ATOP must agree to work in their new field for the duration of their active duty reenlistment time. For further information contact your unit career planner.



# Equator

## Marines enter royal domain of Neptunus Rex

ABOARD THE USS NEW ORLEANS Sept. 2 — Hundreds of Marines and sailors from the 31st Marine Amphibious Unit and their shipmates were initiated into the solemn mysteries of the ancient order of the deep this morning when their ship crossed the equator en route from the Indian Ocean to Mombasa, Kenya for a liberty visit.

His Majesty, King Neptunus Rex, along with his bride, child and royal staff, came aboard the evening of Sept. 1 to begin ceremonies traditional

to equator crossings by United States Navy vessels.

Individuals who had previously crossed the earth's imaginary center-marking line, termed "shellbacks," were charged by the king to "inspect and determine the worthiness" of all "pollywogs": those who hadn't made the trip before.

According to the summons issued to pollywogs, the uninitiated were ordered to appear before the royal court to answer complaints filed against them with the govern-

ment of the domain of Imperlum Neptuni Regis, State of the Raging Domain, Equatoria.

The summons alleged that the pollywogs had "conspired to enter the royal domain without visa or passport of proper authorization." They further charged that they had "failed to maintain the personal hygienic perfection required to enter the domain. To wit, they had alluded to cover their bodies and enter their minds a certain amount of slime that is usually found on pollywogs and other lower specimens of the realm."

Additional charges of "brown baggery, wopery, chit requesting, apple polishing, sympathy seeking, gundecking, procrastinating, goldbricking, reveille neglecting and liberty hounding" were also brought.

The day of reckoning found pollywogs humbling themselves and pleading their cases before the royal court. The benevolent presiding judges prescribed a suitable penance, the exact nature of which is one of the most highly guarded secrets of the deep.

Following completion of the ceremonies,

newly-appointed "shellbacks" were presented with parchment documents prepared by his majesty's scribe Davey Jones, attesting to their status. The certificates avow that on this day, at zero degrees latitude and 45 degrees easterly longitude, the USS New Orleans appeared at the equator and those uninitiated who wished not to displease the rulers of the sea were "found qualified to be numbered as one of our honored shellbacks and has been duly initiated into the solemn mysteries of Neptunus Rex and the endorsement of the ship's captain."

# Deployed crew enjoys taste of African culture

MOMBASA, KENYA, Sept. 7 — Warm weather and personable people greeted Marines and sailors of the 31st Marine Amphibious Unit during their recent port visit to this East African coastal city.

Thirty-first Marine Amphibious Unit personnel and their shipmates from the USS New Orleans and USS Vancouver stopped in Mombasa for four days of liberty following a month-long Indian Ocean deployment aboard the ships of the Navy's Amphibious Squadron One.

IN MILD temperatures in the 80's, American servicemen

wandered the streets of the city, shopped at numerous curio stands, relaxed at sidewalk cafes and lounged at beach resorts.

At the souvenir huts, Marines and sailors bargained with merchants over the amount of Kenyan shillings to be paid for wooden carvings of animals, brasswork, Kenyan jade and other articles.

"BARGAINING over prices was really an unusual experience," commented Sgt Eric Young, 21, of Farmington, Conn., a logistics clerk with the 31st Amphibious Unit Headquarters element. "After you got used to it, though, it was really

a lot of fun. I got some good deals and had a good time doing it," said the sergeant as he packed away his menagerie of wooden jungle creatures.

Patrick Kithuku, 32, a dealer in teak and ebony carvings, described the Americans with whom he dealt to be "quite sociable, very friendly. Of course, their visiting does bring a definite increase in business, too. For both reasons, we'd like to see them visit more frequently."

A FAVORITE August-to-April vacation spot for European tourists because of its climate, beaches and laissez-faire lifestyle, Mombasa offers quite a cosmopolitan setting.

From a sidewalk cafe table, one can pick out smatterings of conversations in English, Swahili, German, Indian and other dialects.

Attire is similarly varied; walking down most any street one can meet Indian women in traditional sarongs, West German tourists in European designer fashions, Moslems in Islamic garb on their way to one of several Mosques and Kenyans or Englishmen in western-style clothing.

MOST KENYANS speak "London-tinged" English dating from British Crown colony days prior to the nation's gaining independence in 1963. Another example of

British influence is evident while riding in a cab or driving a rental car; traffic flows on the left-hand side of the street.

Influence of the English aside, though, it is obvious that Kenya is its own nation.

Shoppers in most places of business are met by the gazes, from large black and white portraits, of the two men who have served as president of Kenya since the republic was formed: the current head of state Daniel T. Arap Moi, and the first president, national hero Mzee Jome Kenyatta.

A GOOD selection of international restaurants and a fairly

active nightlife added to the enjoyment of visiting Mombasa.

"I went into Mombasa carrying very little money and still had a great time," said Cpl Lance Searlott, 23, of Burbank, Calif., a platoon guide with Company F, Battalion Landing Team 2/3, the ground combat element of the unit. "Off the main streets I discovered some outstanding places to eat where prices were low, atmosphere was good and the quality of food was excellent."

"WE'VE FOUND the five groups of American sailors and Marines that have

visited so far this year to be very easy to get along with," affirmed Phillip Musau Mutinda, 28, assistant manager of a popular Mombasa nightclub, "The Cave." The establishment was constructed using underground beams from a tunnel leading to historic Fort Jesus, designed to protect the port by the then-occupying Portuguese in the 16th century.

"Whenever we get together with the Americans," continues Mutinda, "it's as if we've known each other for a long time. In fact, we even keep special hours for visiting Americans. We

don't do that for all navies."

This camaraderie has sparked such activities as an ad hoc disco band made up of servicemen that recently played at the club during a port visit.

"The people were really congenial," they remarked, adding "We

met not only Kenyans, but also tourists from all over Europe. The beaches were hard to beat for quiet sunbathing, there were some good deals to be had, and we had a good time checking out the limbo dancing and other floor shows in the clubs."

THAT LIBERTY in Mombasa, Kenya was enjoyable seemed to be the consensus among 31st Marine Amphibious Unit troops. It is also generally agreed that the exposure to Africa was a worthwhile cultural addition to the introduction one receives to Asian life in western Pacific ports.



# Revisions improve line charge mines

QUANTICO, Va. — To modernize and update countermine warfare, the Marine Corps is revising the M58A1 Line Charge Mine.

The line charge mine detonates previously enemy-set mines and mine fields, as well as destroying physical troop movement countermasures such as barbed wire and cut underbrush.

At present, the line charge mine consists of a cord of C4 explosives trailing behind a rocket which is launched from a stationary launch pad and rail. The mine's total weight is in

excess of 300 pounds, and requires the operators to be exposed to hostile fire during the initial "setup" time (approximately one hour) and during launch.

"In an effort to alleviate the problem of hostile fire and lack of mobility, we have designed a new delivery system," said Maj Marshall Foore, mine warfare developmental project officer, Development Center.

Recently designed at MCDEC and tested at the Marine Corps Combat Training Center, Twentynine Palms, Calif., is a

trailer that incorporates the presently existing line charge line, launch pad, rail and a redesigned generator trailer.

The newly designed trailer and mine can be towed behind such vehicles as Landing Vehicle Tracked Personnel 7 or the M60 battle tank. It can withstand rugged terrain as well as accomplish launch and detonation from within the confines of the vehicle.

Also under development is an increased propulsion rocket to enable the effective delivery of the line

charge. The present rocket system doesn't always extend the line charge to its optimum length due to the drag induced by the charge.

When fully delivered, the line charge measures 350 feet or nearly 117 meters, and incorporates more than 1,750 pounds of C4 in its charges.

Presently being considered is the Pomins line charge system, designed by the Israeli Army. The system lends man-portability to land mine warfare.

Pomins is a man-portable system incorporating a 30-meter line charge operated from a

backpack/launching rail. Once projected onto the mine field and detonated, the anti-personnel mine neutralizes all mines within a 1x300 meter area, allowing personnel movement through the previously active mine field.

However, the Marine Corps is not the only organization updating and modernizing land mine warfare.

"The Russians have incorporated mine warfare into every defensive and offensive unit in their command, from land-based armor to the highly mobile air force," said Foore.

Each Russian division is staffed with four armored mine layers and 12 towed mine layers, which are totally mechanized.

The use of air-delivered scatterable mines has also become an integral part of the Soviet "mine defense."

The Soviets have developed their capabilities to the extent of effectively laying 30,000 to 40,000 mines in less than 36 hours.

"With the employment of effective countermasures, we can take the sting away from the punch delivered by the Soviets in mine warfare," concluded Foore.



# Survival: Selected Leathernecks master defense skills against nuclear, biological and chemical agents

Since World War II the United States has devoted many resources to the development and deployment of strategic weaponry and conventional military forces. Not only has this been done to be prepared in case of war, but also as a measure to deter foreign hostile confrontations and to deal with potentially dangerous contingencies.

directed by WO-1 Edward Avacilla, officer-in-charge of the NBC School, and SSgt Donald Haight, class instructor.

The purpose of instruction offered by the school is to teach Marines how to detect areas contaminated by radiation or chemical agents and to be able to survive in that environment.

**THERE IS** one specific contingency that selected Marines from various deployable units of the 1st Marine Brigade, are studying more closely now than ever before—the possibility of battle against nuclear, biological or chemical weapons.

**MANY** news sources claim that the U.S. military is unprepared for defense against NBC attacks and is lacking sufficient training in this area. However, in recent months Marines deploying to the Western Pacific regions of the globe from the 1st Marine Brigade on Oahu not only train for NBC warfare in garrison, but also while deployed on ships. Though attaining a

full scale level of readiness in NBC warfare is new to the Marines, it is a course of study they readily accept. As one Marine in the class stated, "Put me in an environment where I have to keep that mask on my face or whatever else to stay alive, and I guarantee you it will be done."

**AS PAST** world situations have shown, when U.S. decision-makers wish to quickly involve ground forces in a situation, or at least pose a threat, their first choice is the Marine Corps.

Today's Marines are expected to be no exception. As a result of the present unstable world situation, men attending the brigade NBC classes are being equipped, trained and organized for quick reaction.

SSgt William Burmley, instructor-inspector of the NBC school pointed out, "During

the Marines' training here, some are required to make presentations to the class on what they have learned. Also, upon completing the class these men are able to go back to their units and conduct classes for their own unit members."

**WHILE IN THE** class, Haight emphasizes to the men in his introductory lecture the nuclear, biological and chemical strengths of the Russian army and how "the red army is considered our biggest threat when it comes to NBC tactics."

Avacilla mentioned, "We give these men the lecture on Russian capabilities to give them an idea of what to expect in a conflict."

The students are shown a "Soviet threat" presentation, which is prepared by the Warsaw Pact and presented by Haight. They also learn the war history of chemical agents used since World War I.

"Russia has proven they will use all means possible to win a war," said Haight in a stern voice.

Although this training is relatively new to brigade Marines, their attentiveness in the classroom shows a keen interest in the training. When asked why such a large interest in NBC exists, Burmley replied, "The float units want to be sure they have their teams ready for NBC and are capable of handling a situation."

The men are given a basic knowledge of what will happen and what to expect when a nuclear weapon is detonated by learning the basic structure of components, chemical make-up and fusion weaponry.

Students participate in a simulated classroom exercise called a "radioactive chemical survey," in which the men take readings in the "contaminated" areas.

The practical appli-

cation in the men's training involves NBC reports using radios and other detection apparatus. They employ equipment such as IM-147 Radiac equipment to detect radioactive materials, M2-56 Chemical Detection Kits, and decontamination kits along with wearing the proper permeable protection clothing with helmets, cartridge belts, ponchos and gas masks with hoods.

**ALSO INCLUDED** in the practical application portion of training is the forming of detection teams. Instructors divide the group into ten detection teams, and send them out to eight pre-selected training areas on the air station designated to be "contaminated with radioactive particles and suspected chemical agents."

Avacilla indicated, "The base area is very low on radioactivity areas used for monitoring radiology. But there

are at least eight checkpoints that each team must monitor and report their readings to us. The maximum time allowed for this exercise is three hours."

**AFTER THE** Marines complete the series of classroom and outdoor practical application exercises and exams, they receive a diploma and are sent back to their units for assignment to unit NBC teams.

Haight revealed, "The Russians train their people in NBC or nuclear biological radiology beginning at age eight. By the time they reach ninth grade they had, at least 140 hours of NBC training before entering the military."

**AVACILLA** concluded, "We take 10 days to teach these Marines that their purpose is to master the skill of detection and

decontamination, and to be able to stay alive if placed in the area of an NBC attack."

The question of nuclear proliferation and the long term effects that it may have are questions that may remain present and unanswered for a long time. However, this 10 day NBC course of instruction ensures that if such an attack should occur, Marines will be prepared.

## Peddlers jockey for positions

Buddy Ikeda's sure-footed riding brought him victory in all events he entered and all the top trophies at the first Hawaiian Bicycle Motocross held at MCAS Kaneohe Bay, Sunday.

Ikeda outpeddled all 16-year-old and above competitors to win the trophy in that class, slid past other racers to win the "Trophy Dash" and managed to stay ahead to receive the day's overall trophy.

The Motocross race was dedicated to 10-year-old racer Durand Keulannehe, who died in a traffic accident.

**BICYCLE JOCKEYS** from all over the island came to test their skill in the rapidly growing sport. Multicolored riding suits representing different bicycle shops made the races easier to

follow as more than 150 peddlers, ranging in age from five to 34 competed against each other for top honors.

According to Toku Fukuhara, director of the Hawaiian Bicycle Motocross, "The sport is really booming across the nation because it's an individual effort by the kids. They've banded together, formed a club and now compete against each other for points. At the end of the year, each racer's points are tallied and the person with the highest number gets to wear the prestigious "1" on the front of his BMX racer. Number two goes to the next highest point scorer and so on down to number 99. Right now we have approximately 1,000 racers in the organization, both boys and girls."

The seven-month-old track built by bikers from the air station's Teen Center, was described as "slow" by their director, Richard Cole, but

record after record was shattered. When the dirt finally settled, Moki Fernandez emerged with a new track record of 35.5 seconds, shaving two and one half seconds off the previous record.

**IT SEEMS** the parents of the BMXers enjoyed the heats almost as much as the racers. Nearly 300 spectators cheered for the children as they flew over jumps, around turns and through "S" turns.

Racing in the cruiser class for big bikes was the oldest kid of them all. Thirty-four-year-old Marine GySgt. Donn Dunlap of Camp H.M. Smith had his troubles, finishing 3rd, 4th and 4th in heats against four other racers.

"I believe I'm the oldest active BMX racer in the United States," claims the 10-week veteran of the sport. "I've been sponsoring children for about a year now and plan to take five riders to the Mongoose Grand Nationals in Concord, Calif. I'll be the chaperone and team manager for the club 'Great Outdoors.' These riders have unbelievable strength," explained Dunlap. "Pound for pound they are stronger than I am."

The first day of the matches, Culbreath tied for the lead. He increased his lead by three strokes the second day and went


into the third and final day of the competition with a good grip on the championship. Defending his well deserved reputation, Culbreath was overall winner with a low gross score of 229.





# Dodge opens in Kaneohe

National Facilities Corp., the company that owns the facilities and leases on Windward Oahu and Honolulu Ford is the newest Dodge franchise dealer for Kaneohe.

## Stereo technology advances

Car stereo, once little more than a radio and small speakers, has changed drastically in the last five years. Electronic tuning, digital time delay, metal tape capability, Dolby, five-way speakers, 100-watt amplifiers and space age circuitry that keeps your radio tuned no matter where you drive — these are just a small part of what's now available from auto sound retailers at an affordable price.


