Presented for the first time in 1961, the Gray Eagle trophy is a silver eagle landing onto the arresting gear of a wood shape depicting the old Langley, the Navy's first aircraft carrier.

Vice Admiral Schoultz earned his wings in September 1945 and was promoted to the flag rank in November. Upon acceptance he commented, "I'm delighted to have my name among such notables... I appreciate it."



Reservists report for active duty training

Surgical team augments medical battalion

Take two physician assistants, an artificial kidney dialysis technician, a postal carrier, a boiler plant operator, two students, an industrial engineer, a registered nurse and an ear, nose and throat specialist. Mix well with Brigade Service Support Group's Company A, 3d Medical Battalion. Add a generous portion of support and coordination, then bake for two weeks in the tropical Hawaiian sunshine.

THE RESULTS? A highly successful two weeks of active duty training for Surgical Team-122 of Readiness Command-22, a Naval Reserve unit from Seattle, Wash.

Ten members, half the team's full complement, arrived in Hawaii June 21 for annual active duty training.

"This is a really unique opportunity for us," claims Lt. Barbara Polak, unit training officer. "This is our first trip to Hawaii and our first chance for field training. Normally we would just have classroom work and lectures back in Seattle." As a civilian Lt. Polak is a registered nurse at Swedish Hospital in Seattle.

While here, the unit will augment Company A's personnel in a field exercise. This will be accomplished by having individuals working in the various field hospital tent stations.

In addition to job-related training the unit will receive

during the field exercise, they also participated in a military-type familiarization.

"The military training has been the most interesting part of our visit for me," says Petty Officer 2nd Class Lydia Ray. "The firing of weapons, gas chamber and all that is a real switch from our regular training routine." At home the 34-year old Seattle woman is a homemaker and postal carrier.

ONE CENTRAL theme that seems to echo throughout the unit is astonishment of the support and coordination they have found here.

"There is a lot more to this level of training than meets the eye," observes Chief Petty Officer David Jensen, a 39-year old native of Everett, Wash. The artificial kidney dialysis technician goes on to say, "The training support and coordination assistance from the medical company has been very helpful. When you see the thing (field hospital) develop as we have, you come to appreciate the work involved."

Thirty-year-old Petty Officer 2nd Class Gene Partridge, a civilian physician's assistant, quickly agrees with Chief Jensen. "I've been impressed with the degree of cooperation between the Marines here and the medical company," he says exuberantly. "Working in the pre-op tent during the field exercise will be a first for me and I'm looking forward to it."

COL SOLAN'S staff assignment included assistant chief of staff, G-3, 1st Marine Amphibious Force from April to July 1971; department head, Training Branch, Headquarters Fleet Marine Force, Pacific (August 1971 to June 1976); executive officer, 34th Marine Amphibious Unit (August 1976 to June 1977); operations officer, executive officer, Marine Aircraft Group-26 (October 1978 to July 1979) and air officer, 4th Marine Division (August 1979 to December 1980).

His most recent assignment was assistant chief of staff, G-3, 4th Marine Division.

Col Solan was promoted to his present rank shortly after joining the 4th Marine Division Headquarters in August 1979.

HIS FORMAL military education has been at the Air Command and Staff College, Maxwell Air Force Base, Ala. His civilian schooling includes a Bachelor of Arts in History from Chapman College and a Master of Political Science from Auburn University.

The colonel's personal decorations include 19 Air Medals and two Navy Commendation Medals with combat "V".

Col Solan and his wife, Alberta, have a son, Michael, and a daughter Michelle.

Ordinances

Regulations prohibit use of fireworks

The introduction, possession or use of fireworks or pyrotechnic devices aboard the air station with the exception of displays approved by the commanding officer is strictly prohibited, according to Lawrence Gonzalez, chief fire inspector, federal fire departments.

PERSONS CONVICTED of violating fireworks ordinances are subject to a fine of up to \$500 or imprisonment of 30 days, or both.

Fireworks is defined as any combustible or explosive composition, or any substance or combination of substances, or device prepared for the purpose of producing a visible or an audible effect by combustion, explosion, deflagration and/or detonation. The provisions do not apply to paper caps which contain less than 0.25 grams of pyrotechnic composition per unit load.

Hawaii civilian ordinances prohibit the purchase and use of any fireworks by persons under 18 years old. If minors are arrested for fireworks violations, their parents or guardians are subject to the penalty.

It is unlawful for persons to throw, set off, fire or cause to explode any pyrotechnic article within 1000 feet of a hospital, convalescent home, home for the aged or animal hospital.

FIREWORKS CAN not be exploded on any highway, street or other public way, such as sidewalks, parks, public beaches or school yards. Also it is illegal to detonate fireworks from or into any vehicle.

Reconstruction of any commercially manufactured fireworks is strictly prohibited.

Kailua plans Fourth of July activities

This year Kailua will celebrate the nation's 205th anniversary July 4 with a parade through the center of town, an awards ceremony and arts fair at Library Square and a fireworks display later in the evening at Kailua Beach.

THIS YEAR'S theme, "A Kailua Rainbow," is intended to present Kailua as a dream world where everyone has a holiday in a most fantastic flight of fantasy.

The 33d Annual Fourth of July parade, which will span 1.3 miles down Kainalu Drive and through the center of town, is scheduled to begin at 10 a.m. This year's Grand Marshal is the Honorable Eileen Anderson, Mayor of Honolulu. The

parade will have approximately 115 units, including 11 marching bands.

The site for the Kailua Fourth of July Arts Fair will be the Library Square, the area between the Kailua Library and Kailua Elementary School. More than 100 craftspeople and artists from Kailua and other parts of Oahu will be displaying their talents during this year's fair.

Continuous entertainment will be featured from 10 a.m. until 5 p.m. as well as a variety of fine foods from several Windward civic and social groups.

The Library Square is also the site for the awards ceremony which is planned for noon. Entries will be evaluated in the following categories: best senior and junior marching units, best band, best float, most

original entry, best special unit, best motor vehicle unit and best mounted unit.

THE MARINE Corps will be represented by a marching unit and color guard provided by Dragon Platoon, Wea-

pons Company, 1st Battalion, 3d Marines. A representative from the MCAS Kaneohe Bay color guard will participate as a member of the joint service color guard.

The fireworks display, starting at 8 p.m.,

will come from Flat Island and will be visible from Fort Hase Beach and Kailua Beach.

The activities planned to celebrate this Fourth of July should make it a memorable one.







But it's no wonder many leathernecks have a "I don't care attitude." With people continually complaining about having to stand formations, run physical fitness tests, stand duty, or do all the other requirements that are a part of being a Marine, along with their job.

It's not only the lower ranking leathernecks, the ones who have only been in the Corps for a couple of years. I hear it frequently from staff noncommissioned officers.

These are the people who should be setting examples. Marines who have decided to stay with the Corps but yet are the ones often passing on poor attitudes.

I remember the day I told my father I was joining the Corps, there was a shine in his eyes as he told me of the pride a Marine has. The willingness to do his duty and how motivated Marines were.

IN BOOTCAMP, and my military school, I was surrounded by people who really enjoyed the Corps. People who talked highly of the traditions that have been passed down through the years. At that

But as time went on it seemed as if I had to look in corners, and crevices to find Marines who were proud to be Marines, one of the finest, the elite, the few.

I can tolerate hearing disappointment about the Corps from Marines who joined with misconceptions; and are now wondering about whether this is the career they want.

But I can't tolerate Marines who are on their second or third enlistment, and are now trying to figure out why they have

stayed around this long and are putting down the Corps as a whole.

It is because of some staff noncommissioned officers I look up to, that lately I have started feeling as if I don't give a damn, that the Corps is messing with my mind. There are better things for me to do as a civilian.

EACH PERSON may have some regrets about their decision to stay with the Corps, or to join the Corps in the first place. But why pass on these feelings by sitting back and complaining? Why not take a positive attitude and look on the bright

side, try to do something to make your tour one that you can look back on and remember as a good one.

Get something out of the service, an education, travel, or just learning how to get along with people from all areas of the United States with different ideas and attitudes about life.

Don't let four or more years of life pass you by just because you aren't completely satisfied with how things are going. And don't try and ruin others lives by instilling in them a sense of wrongdoing by giving them your bad attitude.


To remove the safeguards which Christ established to protect family stability would be to foster the disintegration of our society. It is out of His love for us that

Martial music

Origin unknown, but the beat goes on

The Marines' Hymn is one of the world's best known pieces of martial music. It's been played everywhere, in parades, at the White House, even in the Hollywood film "Rocky."

NO MATTER WHERE it's played, it reflects the pride and tradition of the most famous organization of its kind.

Composed during the war with Mexico, the first verse of the hymn was written shortly after the occupation of Mexico City. History, a chronic offender of disappointing oversights, failed to record the author's name. Before that War, Marine colors bore the inscription "To the shores of Tripoli." With the capture of Mexico's National Palace, also known as The Halls of Montezuma, the inscription was changed to: "From the shores of Tripoli to the Halls of Montezuma."

IN THE INTEREST OF giving the tune rhythm, the hymn's author reversed the phrases.

There's a disagreement as to the origins of the hymn's music. According to Walter F. Smith, second man to lead the Marine Corps Band, the aria of the Marines' Hymn is found in the opera "Genevieve de Brabant," by the German composer Offenbach. John Phillips Sousa, the most famous of all Marine Band leaders also believed the melody was taken from that opera.

THE CONTRADICTION comes from the Spanish wife of one of Smith's band members. She wrote in a letter to her husband that it was written to the tune of a Spanish folk song.

The music's origin remains a mystery, which may not add to the song's popularity, but makes interesting history.



Soaring like birds entices mankind

Near Waimanalo on most sunny days, one can sit at the beach and watch as hang gliders sail overhead.

APPEARING AS giant birds from the stone age, daredevils effortlessly guide their wings in circles over the multicolored ocean, viewing the sights below as only birds do. At one time, man made wings of feathers to try and propel himself into the air but soon discovered his own arm power was not enough to maintain flight.

From arm power, man emerged into the day and age of gliders,

pioneered by Otto Lillenthal of Germany in 1891. Lillenthal ran with the craft on his shoulders and once lifted from the ground, hung from the glider.

ALTHOUGH Lillenthal is noted for his gliders, the earliest flying machines were sketched and described by Leonardo da Vinci in the late 1400's. These flying machines may look much the same as the aircraft that later evolved but, according to the experts there is no evidence that any of his designs were ever built or flown.

Man was soon found hidden in barns and out

of the way places, tirelessly trying to perfect dimensions that would help to carry him into the vast unknown sky. Man did not hide while building his flying machines to protect his designs, but rather to protect his families reputation. At one time flying was more of a disgrace and embarrassment than a source of pride.

FRANCIS M. ROGALLO, an aeronautical research scientist employed by the Langley Research Center, drew diagram after diagram trying to find an aircraft wing that could easily be stored in a bag. He searched for a design

that would combine the shape of the supersonic airplane with the collapsible canopy of the parachute.

Along with his wife Rogallo invented a completely new aircraft design, the flexible wing, followed by many patents being filed. The first was granted in 1951 and the second in 1956.

Mr. Rogallo tried to convince the National Aeronautics and Space Administration that his flexible paraglider would be perfectly suited as a reentry glider, but his words fell on deaf ears.

THE DESIGN of most hang gliders

today is the same as that presented to NASA, only on a smaller scale and mounted on a simple rigid frame. It can be flown from any hill with a gentle breeze blowing up its slopes.

The first people who dared to fly the hang gliders simply hung on and let the wind make its own flight path. But with the advancement of time and technology man soon learned that by simply shifting his body weight he could maneuver the glider in any direction he wished.

Pilots first supported themselves by draping arms over a parallel bar attached to the sails,

but a few years later the triangular trapeze bar, which was developed for water-ski-kite-fliers in Australia, replaced the bulky parallel bars and the swing seat emerged.

SOON DESIGNERS, engineers and private companies began to file "improved" and "modified" versions of the NASA Rogallo.

Today there is a variety of harnesses to choose from when deciding on a hang glider. One may opt to buy a model with a swing seat, held to the sail by a length of stout rope, the seated harness, or a prone harness.

With different types of gliders on the market and options available to persons purchasing them, there is one catch. There are no movable controls on hang gliders other than the flyer himself.

BUT EVEN with no controls the pilot can perform maneuvers such as landing with accuracy, moving forward, backwards or side to side.

As the number of hang gliders continue to increase, and the stunts they perform become more daring, only time will tell the possibilities of hang gliding as a future mode of travel.




Water skiers form team

New team jumps into sports scene

There's a new team on the MCAS Kaneohe Bay sports scene. But unlike most other teams, this one doesn't need bats or balls or racquets or mits. All they need is two pieces of wood, a few buoys, some water and a boat.

"WE HAVE A lot of good water skiers on the station," says Marina Manager Mike Hilbert, "and I wanted a program that would help them reach a competitive level."

The program Hilbert developed was the Hawaii Marine Ski Team. Right now it has 11 members but Hilbert claims there is no specific limit.

"We don't have a

preset number of skiers for the team," he explains. "Actually, the more the merrier. We don't just want people who are good skiers now. This is a great opportunity for novice skiers to get some instruction."

NOVICES, as well as accomplished skiers, can advance their skills by a series of practice sessions. National competitors from around Hawaii have volunteered their time and advice to help the team. At team practices competitors will give lectures and demonstrations and team skiers will run through courses of varying difficulty at different speeds.

THE MARINA manager explains that a competing skier would run through the slalom course three times. "Each competitor first runs through the slalom at 28 mph," he outlines. "The second run is made at 30 mph and the last one at 32. There are six buoys the skiers have to go around. When they circle the buoys they reach speeds of up to 60 mph."

"We have a slalom course with six buoys here at our marina," points out Hilbert. "There's also a slalom with a jump ramp at Keehi Lagoon. That's about all the courses on the island, but these are good runs that are measured and official."

THE MARINA manager explains that a competing skier would run through the slalom course three times.

"Each competitor first runs through the slalom at 28 mph," he outlines. "The second run is made at 30 mph and the last one at 32. There are six buoys the skiers have to go around. When they circle the buoys they reach speeds of up to 60 mph."

The craft that whips the skiers through the course is a major consideration, because of the speeds and types of turns involved.

"We are trying to buy a Mastercraft boat with a 361 cubic inch engine for the team," claims Hilbert. "It has about 220 horsepower. But it will only be used for competitions and the ski team. A boat like that is too powerful to be used in our regular rental program."

HILBERT GOES on to say that ski team members will be able to get some sort of discount for rental boats to be used in practicing.

The team is working on setting up an inter-

team competition for the weekend of July 18.

"If we can set something up for that weekend," Hilbert claims, "we are going to try and get Kelly and Ken Lopes to do a demonstration. They are national champions and did some demonstrations at the Marina openhouse we had a couple of weeks ago."

Hilbert stresses that right now there is no top skier or real coach. The team is set up to help all the members improve and enjoy.

"IF SOMEONE wants to join us," Hilbert concludes, "they can call me to set up an appointment to get together and talk about the program and what it offers."

Flight crews increase air combat readiness

Four Marine Aviation Weapons and Tactics Instructors from Squadron One at MCAS Yuma, Ariz. arrived at the air station June 14. Since arriving they have certified five pilots and six radar intercept officers as Air Combat Tactics Instructors in Marine Fighter Attack Squadrons 235 and 232.

MAWTS-1 was originally formed in June

1978 as a result of the Cox Report of 1974. The Cox Report was a study directed by Gen. Louis H. Wilson, then commander of the Marine Corps, on ways to improve combat readiness in the Corps.

The squadrons Weapons Tactics Instructor, trained by MAWTS-1, the commanding officer and the operations office, select pilots and radar intercept

officers for ACTI training and certification. And long before the MAWTS instructors arrive at the squadron, the pilots and RIOs have already been preparing.

"DEPENDENT on the officer's flying experience and performance he will fly different missions to train him for certification," commented Maj Richard Stearna, a

MAWTS instructor. "When the MAWTS instructors arrive we give the officers an intensive written test. The test concerns the weapons system employment and specifically questions on air to air missions," he said.

After the written test, the officers are required to satisfactorily fly three missions. "The first flight is a one vs. one flight with similar

aircraft," said Maj Stearna. "The flight ensures the capability of the officer to instruct new pilots and RIO's on basic aircraft maneuvering in advanced concepts of air combat."

THE SECOND two flights are of a different nature. "The next flight is a two vs. one flight with different types aircraft, with the last flight being a two vs.

two with dissimilar aircraft," explained Maj Stearna. "These last two flights stress more advanced concepts

Once the MAWTS instructors have certified the qualifying officers, the instructors remain with the squadron to further evaluate.

The four MAWTS instructors are primarily concerned with the F-4 community in the Corps.





False claim reaps penalty

Marines and Navy personnel authorized temporary lodging allowances should use extreme care when filing their claims. A growing and disturbing amount of fraudulent claims have been detected by the disbursing office on the air station.

"MANY PEOPLE ARE under the impression that if authorized funds are spent on improper items while receiving TLA, such as alcohol, inflated receipts and buying meals for friends, disbursing will just deny that part of the claim. This is simply not the case," commented LtCol Gerald Miller, staff judge advocate, 1st Marine Brigade and MCAS,

Kaneohe Bay.

"When the individual files the TLA claim listing items that are improper, it becomes a violation of the Uniform Code of Military Justice at the instant the claim is filed or presented to disbursing," LtCol Miller continued. "Those violations are charged as filing a false claim and submitting a false official document."

LtCol Miller pointed out that because the fraudulent claims are violations of the UCMJ, the person submitting the claims are subject to its penalties.

"SUBMITTING A FALSE statement is a violation of Article 107 under the UCMJ. The maximum punishment is one year confinement at hard labor,

reduction in rank to E-1 for enlisted personnel, total forfeitures, and a dishonorable discharge," LtCol Miller said.

"Making a false or fraudulent claim is a violation of Article 132 under the code. Its maximum punishment can be confinement at hard labor for five years, reduction in rank to E-1 for enlisted personnel, total forfeitures, and a dishonorable discharge," he added.

The Naval Investigative Service is conducting formal investigations on all reports of fraudulent TLA as well as TAD claims reported to commanding officers by the disbursing office.

AFTER THAT, APPROPRI-

ATE disciplinary action for offenders will be taken. According to LtCol Miller, that action can be in the form of a court-martial or nonjudicial punishment.

Subsequently, it should come as no surprise to the individual suspected of abusing TLA funds when he receives a copy of the charges levied against him.

Each TLA applicant signs a document stating he understands the penalties and forfeitures involved for filing false, fictitious and fraudulent claims.

"Many people believe that filing TLA claims are like filing income taxes," LtCol Miller said. "They think they can cheat a little and get away with it. Or that if they're

caught, they'll just be made to repay the difference in the actual amount of the claim from the false one.

"WHAT THOSE PEOPLE fail to realize is that once they're suspected and charged with the violation, the whole claim itself will not be honored," asserted the SJA. "As an end result, many careers are ruined."

So, those persons collecting TLA and slightly contemplating altering or changing receipts, beware. Disbursing does have the capability of detecting false claims and are required by prescribed regulations to report any and all violations to commanding officers and NIS for disciplinary action.

America's freedom began with a bang

"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among those are Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness."

THESE WORDS dramatically open perhaps the most important document in the history of the United States... the Declaration of Independence.

Saturday marks the 205 anniversary of the signing of the document that has long been considered to be our sacred honour."

Written by Thomas

Jefferson and later adopted by the Second Continental Congress July 4, 1776, the declaration affirmed individual and political equality and the right of self-government for the American colonists, thus severing all ties with Britain, the "mother country."

But independence didn't come easy, nor without bloodshed. Ill feelings between the British government and the colonies, that were once undoubtedly loyal to British rule, gradually developed, paving the way for a revolution.

HISTORIANS disagree on the reasons for

the sudden change in attitudes but, as John Adams later wrote: "The revolution was effected before the war commenced. The revolution was in the hearts and minds of the people."

After seizing control of the French Empire in 1763, Britain began throwing its weight around with Americans and taxed them heavily. The colonists, enjoying their self-government flatly refused to pay the tax and showed their disgust by dumping tea into the harbor.

This was more than the British government could handle. Despite pleas by the First Continental Congress on behalf of the

colonists, Britain considered the act a sign of rebellion and dispatched troops to take swift action.

THAT REACTION by Britain ruffled the colonists and on April 19, 1775, the Revolutionary War began with "the shot that was heard 'round the world."

News of war shocked Britains and colonists alike. Legislators from both sides attempted to halt the fighting but, the die was cast.

June 7, 1776 Richard Henry Lee of Virginia offered a resolution announcing that "These colonies are, and of right ought to be, free and independent states." Many delegates held back. Finally on July 2,

delegates from 12 colonies passed Lee's resolution thereby establishing the colonists as independents, free from British rule.

AFTER THE historic occasion John Adams said: "I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance,

solemnized with pomp and parades, with shows, games, sports, guns, bells, bonfires and illuminations from one end of this continent to the other, from this time forward forevermore."

July 8 in Philadelphia, Pa. the declaration was read. Bells were rung, bands played and people rejoiced. It signaled the beginning of a new era.

Fireworks have been associated with the fourth of July for years. Towns put on elaborate displays for all to view, and some families have private displays in their yards.

MOST PUBLIC displays are presented in a manner so that children are kept far enough away to prevent any possible harm. But when in the yard, children are often quicker than the eye and may get in the way of a dangerous firework.

Fireworks are prohibited aboard the air station and parents are responsible for their dependents bringing fireworks on the air station.

Some fireworks seem harmless but can be dangerous if misused or if children use them while not under the supervision of a responsible adult.

But children are not the only ones who can be hurt by fireworks. Many times when fireworks are lit they don't immediately explode and may appear as if they are duds. But they should not be approached. Potentially harmful fireworks may go off in a person's face causing burns and possibly loss of sight.

YOUNG CHILDREN are often given sparklers to hold since they do not explode and this way the children may participate in the festivities. But authorities point out that sparklers are a potential fire hazard and must be used with caution.

Care should also be used while setting off fireworks to ensure that dry grass or other flammables do not catch on fire by stray sparks.

The Fourth of July holiday can be a happy and beautiful one if safety is kept in mind by all.






