Paper shortage hits Hawaii Marine

A strike, which has shut down the newsprint manufacturing industry in Western Canada, has forced the publishing Company of the **Hawaii Marine** to conserve its limited supply of newsprint.

Consequently, the Editorial/Opinion page, Street Scoop, Localmotion, Cinema and In This Issue have been omitted from this issue of the **Hawaii Marine**. These regular features will appear on a space-permitting basis in the upcoming issues.

In addition, the classified advertisements are running at a reduced type size.

The width of the **Hawaii Marine** has been reduced by three-quarters of an inch, permitting the publisher to reduce the amount of tonnage needed to print the paper and various supplements to it.

Raise reimbursements service members

Travel allowances and rates increase

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Congress has approved an increase in the Monetary Allowance in Lieu of Transportation and Per Diem rates for military members with permanent change of station orders. The change was announced in NAVOP 093/81 of July 2. The raise is from seven to 13 cents per mile for MALT and from \$35 to \$50 per diem.

ACCORDING TO the message, the rates are in effect for all personnel whose PCS orders have an effective date of July 1 or later. It also says that persons transferring PCS are entitled to both the MALT and per diem allowances and that receipts are not required to substantiate the \$50 per diem rate.

Because the new rates are based on the effective date of orders, many people who detached from their old commands before July 1 may still be authorized the higher rates. The effective date of orders is defined as the date a member is required to commence travel from the old permanent or last temporary duty station, whichever is applicable in order to arrive at the new duty station by the date indicated by using the mode of travel authorized.

FOR EXAMPLE, a Marine was ordered to a new duty station and detached from his old station June 1. He was authorized 15 days leave, four days proceed, 24 days

temporary duty en route, and seven days travel time from there to his new station. He was required to report to the new permanent station July 21. The effective date of his orders would be July 15, thus authorizing payment of the higher rates. This is because the effective date is determined by subtracting only travel time from the actual

reporting date. Leave, proceed and temporary duty en route serve to delay the reporting date and therefore the effective date of orders.

The approved increase in rates is a significant step toward adequate reimbursement for PCS moves. These increases, along with rates of seven cents per mile for dependents 12 years or older

and three and one half cents per mile for dependents ages 2 through 11, is believed will help defer most on-the-road expenses incurred during PCS travel.

Additional PCS travel reimbursement initiatives are under active consideration by Congress and, if enacted, will further reimburse service members for costs associated with PCS orders.

Official delegates awarding authority to 13 Marine commanding generals

WASHINGTON, D.C., — The Secretary of the Navy has granted approval for the Commandant of the Marine Corps to sub-delegate authority for awarding the Navy Achievement Medal to 13 additional Marine Corps commanding generals.

According to ALMAR 114/81, the move came about "to provide more timely recognition to junior officers and enlisted Marines."

The 13 commands receiving awarding authority for the medal are MCRDs, Parris Island and San Diego; MCBs, Camp Lejeune and Camp Pendleton; MCLBs, Albany and Barstow; MCAS, Cherry Point and El Toro; MCAGCC, 29 Palms; LFTCPAC and LFTCLANT; and 4th MarDiv and 4th MAW.

"A most effective means of enhancing morale is prompt and appropriate recognition of exceptional performance," stated a personnel services official here.

"It is also essential to preserve the character and meaning of all awards; therefore, recommendations must be carefully and thoroughly prepared and documented."

Awards recognizing specific accomplishments or acts should be made as soon as possible after the event occurs. A maximum of 30 days from submission should be the target goal of delivery.

An official in the Personnel Services Division explained that sustained superior performance is more appropriately recognized at

the completion of an assigned duty.

However, he added, "In no instance is it to be considered routine to recognize Marines at the end of a tour."

Recommendations for the Navy Achievement Medal are to be prepared on the current award recommendation form and forwarded to the commanding general who has jurisdiction over the individual being recommended. Award recommendations for members of personal staffs are to be forwarded to CMC for appropriate action.

Deployed Marines return

PEARL HARBOR, Hawaii — Returning leathernecks from Marine Amphibious Unit-37 were greeted with squeals of joy and tears of love as they streamed down the gangplanks to meet their wives, children and sweethearts.

THE TRAVEL-WEARY, but grinning, Marines debarked from the decks of the USS Belleau Wood the USS Tuscaloosa and the USS Thomaston at Pearl Harbor Saturday morning, ending their deployment to the Western Pacific and Indian Ocean.

The leathernecks, members of 3d Battalion, 3d Marines, Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron

Composite Marine Amphibious Unit Support Group-37, Battery Battalion, 12th Marines and 3d Platoon, Company A, 3d Reconnaissance Battalion, left here in February for their annual six-month deployment.

THE KANEHOE-BASED Marines spent liberty time in ports of call such as Perth, Western Australia; Pattaya Beach, Thailand; Singapore; Subic Bay, Republic of the Philippines; and Colombo, Sri Lanka.

During their visit to Sri Lanka, Marines from the USS Belleau Wood and USS Thomaston

volunteered their services to help renovate the Colombo General Hospital.

The deployment also witnessed two major and two minor amphibious exercises.

The last stop for the deployed devildogs before their return home was Subic Bay, Republic of the Philippines. The Marines departed there two weeks ago on their final trek back to Oahu.

CPL BRET MILLER, Btry. C, 1/12 said, "This was my second deployment and I think it was much better than the first. This time we stopped at more ports and met more people.

"We even got a chance to help the people of Sri Lanka, by fixing up their hospital. My only regret was that this float was so short."

"This was my first deployment," noted LCpl Anthony Brown, Btry. C, 1/12, "and I definitely want to do it one more time. I really liked all the liberty ports we stopped at, especially the Philippines."

The incoming deployment was replaced in the Western Pacific by 2d Battalion, 3d Marines, Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron composite-262, and Marine Amphibious Unit Service Support Group-31, which left Pearl Harbor earlier this month.



Marines must maintain initial issue

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Officials at Headquarters Marine Corps report that large numbers of former active duty Marines are reporting to duty with Marine Corps Reserve units with less than the required uniform items.

Marine Corps Order P10120.28D, paragraph 01040, requires that personnel leaving active duty prior to completion of a six-year obligation, must retain their initial issue of uniform items.

It points out that individuals who return to active duty within three months of separation must bring with them all uniform clothing items that they had when they got out. Only clothing that was either recovered by the Marine Corps or not issued during the previous enlistment may be issued to the Marine at no expense.

Reporting to duty with a reserve unit has similar requirements.

Persons must check in with all the uniform items they were required to have at the time of release from active duty. That is why minimum clothing requirements must be retained by persons still under service obligation as part of the inactive reserve. If called back to active duty or the reserves, the clothing items must be on hand.

The order directs commanding officers to ensure that Marines leaving active duty before

completing their initial six-year obligation possess all the required uniform items. All the items must be serviceable at the time of separation.

ALMAR 103/81 reminds commanders at all levels to make sure their personnel are aware of the contents of clothing retention portions of the order. Persons with questions concerning what items must be kept and by whom, should see MCO P10120.28D.





Blood bank seeks voluntary donors

Blood donors are needed everyday of the year. The military blood donor system in Hawaii is based entirely on voluntary contributions. Resources are collected and coordinated by Tripler Army Medical Center. The blood is then used by active duty, dependents and retirees of all services as patients at TAMC.

drive is significantly below safety supply levels. Available statistics show that the usage rate by Navy and Marine beneficiaries usually exceeds the donor rate.

BLOOD BANKING is an essential medical service. Blood bank reserves are used in most major surgeries, some of which would be impossible without blood transfusions. Transfusion therapy that uses whole blood or blood products to treat specific blood disorders and illnesses has been most effective in dealing with patients with blood disorders such as hemophilia and leukemia.

Giving blood is safe and actually quite simple. The human body has about 10 to 12 pints of blood and can easily spare a pint. When blood is given, the body responds promptly to restore plasma volume, and vital red blood cells are constantly being replaced by the bone marrow.


BLOOD IS COLLECTED under medical supervision by a medical technologist or technician. It takes just a little of the donor's time and can mean a lifetime of health for someone who is sick or injured. While certain medical considerations exist for giving blood, generally persons in good health and feeling fine will probably meet the health standards for donating blood.

Eight blood drive days are scheduled throughout the remainder of this year at MCAS Kaneohe Bay and two at Camp Smith.


At the air station the days are Sept. 14 and 16, Nov. 6, 13 and 23, and Dec. 24, 28 and 30. Camp Smith donor days are Sept. 2 and Nov. 2.

THROUGH THE years, Navy and Marine personnel and their dependents have demonstrated their desire to take care of their own by supplying adequate numbers of donors to meet the usage rate. In the past few months, however, donations have fallen below adequate supply levels.

According to the Naval Regional Medical Clinic, Hawaii at Pearl Harbor, ideally 40 to 45 units of blood should be drawn with each scheduled donor day. The recent 12 to 15 donor response per

Midshipmen meet Marines' mettle

The First Marine Brigade and squadrons within the air wing became hosts to 49 midshipmen first class, July 3 through 24. During their visit here from the U.S. Naval Academy, Annapolis, Md. they were able to take a good look at and participate in many phases of Marine Corps life.

THE VISITING midshipmen had previously expressed interest in the Corps, come Navy and opted to come here rather than train aboard ship.

They were divided into groups and spent half their time with the ground element and the other half with the aviation units. The men will decide in February whether they want to become officers in the Marine Corps or Navy. Before departing the air station, they left the impression that the Corps will soon receive some new officers.

Most of them showed interest in becoming pilots and radar intercept officers, but still felt it important to know and understand the ground units.

"THE AIRWING'S mission is to support ground Marines so, if we were to become pilots, we have already learned about what we would be supporting," said Will Rogers. "I think it gave all of us more respect for what ground units do."

During their time with the brigade the visitors experienced helo casting, high speed recoveries, rappelling and special patrol insertion and extraction rigging. "All the instructors in the brigade were excellent," stressed Don Wehrenberg. "While there, I found no reason to be apprehensive about anything I did. Those guys really know their stuff."

EVEN THOUGH I want to join the Marines and be with the wing, I feel it's good to be exposed to

both aspects of the Corps," said Wehrenberg.

Nodding in agreement Ed Wojtan said, "I have complete confidence in the Marines and a lot of respect for them." Looking at the floor Wojtan quietly commented, "I'd really like to be a pilot but, because of my eyes, I don't know if I can. This is the first time I have ever wished for 20/20 vision."

Dominic Dixon expressed his feelings of the brigade in one simple statement, "The ground Marines are really hot!"

While spending time learning about the fixed and rotary wing squadrons, the midshipmen had the opportunity to get in some air time.

DURING THEIR stay with Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-232, the visitors experienced what six times the force of gravity in an F-4S felt like while riding in the RIO's seat. Landing from his ride in the aircraft Vincent Lamolinara seemed to be upsurge of his footing at first, but his smile told the whole story.

"It was great. It was kind of like I thought, I knew I would probably get sick, but flying is what counts," said Lamolinara.

Getting sick while flying was not something unique to Lamolinara. "About 85 percent of the visitors become sick while flying in the aircraft," commented 1stLt Patrick Moriarty, Schedules Officer for VMFA-232.

EVEN WITH the odds against it Red Jentz proclaimed, "I'm not going to get sick!" Jentz also expressed his interest in the brigade. "I really want to be with the ground Marines. The officers there have a lot of contact with the enlisted people, and they have the direct opportunity to take care of their people."

"I don't see that interaction in the

wing. I want to be in a position where I can work with and help my people."

Ivan De Bate has his eye on a long-range flying goal. "I have always wanted to fly and someday hope to be a space shuttle pilot," De Bate said.

THE OFFICERS

who sponsored the midshipmen showed a personal interest in the visitors. "These guys are really a great group of people," commented 1stLt Mike Bridges, Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron-265's S2 Officer. "I've really enjoyed them being here and I think it's been exciting for them."

First Lieutenant Andrew Hertzog, HMM-265 Legal Of-

ficer commented, "They all want to learn as much as they can and, have been really interested in things we have shown them. It's been great having the midshipmen here."

WHILE FLYING

with HMM-265 some of midshipmen learned a different side of a pilot's life. "It is customary for a person to get thrown in the bay after he flies for the first time," said 1stLt Bridges with a mischievous twinkle in his eye. "The midshipmen were no exception. After they flew the helicopter we tossed them in the bay. But they enjoyed it as much as we did."

Laughing, the pilot continued, "After they climbed out of the

water, they made their way to the ready room and left their wet flight suits lying in the middle of the floor."

The midshipmen left Hawaii Saturday to return to the halls of the U.S. Naval Academy. They have about 300 days left before they are commissioned in either the Navy or Marine Corps.

"WE'VE HADA lot of different experiences during our three weeks here," said Dixon. "I don't think any of us can make a commitment to either service right now, let alone choose between infantry or aviation. There are a lot of options open to us. Right now it's time to sit back and reflect on what we've done and learned here."

Marines share reconnaissance know-how

"I've never done this type of thing before but it looks pretty wild!" exclaimed Midshipman First Class Matt Aylward, before he hooked up his snap ring to the line dangling 35 feet straight down off the end of the rappelling tower.

"I guess I'll see you at the bottom."

AT THAT moment he jumped off the side of the tower and after free falling half way down he applied his break. His feet came to rest on the side of the tower and he yelled, "Hey, this is a lot of fun."

Half of the senior class of the midshipmen who were learning how to rappel July

16 discovered that it was also fun.

But, before they could jump off the side of the tower they received a short class on how to do it.

Their instructor, Sgt Tige Wade, Company A, 3d Reconnaissance Battalion, showed the class how to make a "Swiss seat." The midshipmen learned the technique of wrapping

a piece of rope between their legs and around their waists to form a harness. A snap ring connects the seat to the line in which they use to rappel.

THE BRAVER adventures, tried the Australian style which involves actually running down the tower face first and breaking when nearing the end.

By the end of the day the midshipmen had rappelled several times off the tower and from the back of a helicopter. They concluded with a tour of West Field, hanging from the helicopter practicing the special patrol insertion and extraction techniques.

Spicing, as it is commonly called, hasn't been any trouble with their either enter or leave a

Children

Mouths bear brunt of contact sports

Football, baseball, running, jump rope and other children's activities provide hours of fun; but at times these activities, along with household accidents, result in damage to the teeth

that if replaced in its socket within a half hour, the tooth has an excellent chance of surviving the replant.

SOMETIMES parents overlook the seriousness of such mishaps and neglect getting the child to a dentist, the person who can judge the damage done and start action to minimize, especially, the long-range effects of the injury.

Frequently, teeth will be knocked out completely, causing some pain for the child and a great deal of mental upset for the parents. However, if a permanent tooth is knocked out, there is definite hope of saving the tooth, but time is of the essence.

DENTISTS SAY chances of saving the

tooth are good if it is put back in its original socket as soon as possible. The amount of time the tooth is out of the mouth is the most important factor in determining whether it can be saved.

UNDER NO circumstances should the tooth be cleaned; any handling of the tooth other than the minimum absolutely necessary for one of the two recommended actions

should be left to the dentist. If a "baby," or nonpermanent, tooth is lost, replant is not advisable. The child should nonetheless be taken to a dentist to confirm that no other damage to oral tissues has occurred.

Injuries to the teeth, gums and jaws can be prevented to a large extent in contact sports by a protective mouthguard.

CUSTOM-MADE mouthguards, made by a dentist, can provide the best protection for the young sports enthusiast. If your child — or if you, for that matter — play contact sports, make sure a mouthguard is worn.

The small cost of this protection may save your child — or you — from a large dental bill when that almost inevitable accident occurs. (USAF, Hq. MAC, Scott AFB, Ill.)

Courts Martial Report

and transfer of LSD, the wrongful possession of marijuana and LSD on another occasion, unauthorized absence for one month and larceny of \$100 in U.S. currency.

He was sentenced to four months confinement at hard labor, forfeiture of \$330 pay per month for four months, reduction to private and a bad conduct discharge.

LCpl James I. Miller, 1/12, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of the possession of marijuana on two occasions, the transfer of marijuana on three occasions and the sale of marijuana on three occasions.

He was sentenced to three months confinement at hard labor, forfeiture of \$250 pay per month for four months, reduction to private and a bad conduct discharge.

private and a bad conduct discharge.

Cpl Harry W. Gustine, Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-235, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of the wrongful possession of 83.83 grams of marijuana.

He was sentenced to 75 days confinement at hard labor, forfeiture of \$250 pay per month for four months and reduction to private.

LCpl Edward L. Spurgeon, 1/12, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of the sale of marijuana on four separate occasions.

He was sentenced to 75 days confinement at hard labor, forfeiture of \$300 pay per month for three months, reduction to private and a bad conduct discharge.

LCpl Stephen J. Smith, 1/3, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of unauthorized absence from Feb. 28 to March 10, 1981; from April 2 to May 6, 1981; and from 1 to 5:45 p.m. June 8, 1981; and for missing movement through neglect.

He was sentenced to 80 days confinement at hard labor, forfeiture of \$200 pay per month for three months and reduction to private.





Energy

More than 16 percent of electricity used in homes goes into lighting, according to the U.S. Department of Energy. Some people enjoy a brightly lit home, but lowering lighting levels is an easy energy conservation measure.

PERHAPS THE easiest conservation method is to turn off lights when they are not in use.

Lighting may be concentrated in reading and working areas, and where good light

ing is needed for safety. This would include stairwells or kitchen areas. Light can be reduced in other areas but there should not be a sharp contrast of lighting between rooms.

An easy method to reduce lighting in non-working areas is to remove one bulb out of three in multiple light fixtures. The extra socket should be filled with a burned out bulb for safety. In single bulb fixtures, replace the bulbs with one of lower wattage.

IF BRIGHT lighting is needed in an area use one large light bulb instead of several small ones.

When purchasing lamps, consider the advantages of those with three-way switches. These lamps make it possible to keep lighting low when bright light is not needed, which saves electricity. Use the high switch only for reading or other activities that require brighter light. When watching television,

turn three-way bulbs to the lowest lighting level. This will reduce the glare on the television and use less energy.

FOR OUTSIDE poles or spot lamps use 50-watt reflector floodlights in place of the standard 100-watt bulbs. The 50-watt floodlights provide about the same amount of light but at half the wattage.

By keeping lamps and lighting fixtures clean people may further save energy.

Using light colored rugs, draperies, walls and upholstery, which reflect light, the amount of artificial lighting may be reduced. Opening draperies during the day will also cut down on artificial lighting.

IT'S EASY FOR many people to use more light than is needed.

But, by applying energy conservation methods into daily routines, not only energy can be saved but, money also.





Sailors and Marines work together

Drill tones rescue techniques

The 12-ton boat plunged through the waters surrounding Kaneohe Bay. At the helm, the coxswain moved the tiller almost imperceptibly to the right and simultaneously pushed the throttle downward. The huge, Gray diesel engines rumbled in response and the 40-foot rescue craft lunged ahead.

Droplets of water cascaded over the bow, partially wetting the helmsman as the boat, answering the call for speed, lowered itself into the sea.

Eyes shaded by dirty fingers peered out into the vast expanse of the Pacific. A strong wind agitated the surface of the water just as the sun broke from behind the clouds. The harsh, glaring sun bounced off the still rough water in a thousand dancing reflections.

They were heading to the bay with a crew of three, the coxswain, an engineer and a deck-hand. Anxiety showed on each of their faces. Professional sailors all, their job was to rescue the crew of a simulated crashed aircraft, interplay with the search and rescue unit and mark the site of a simulated crash for possible future salvage operations.

This was the most recent of rescue drills conducted by Station Operations and Maintenance Squadron. And, although only a drill, the casual observer might notice the absence of routine procedures. An aura of dread and anticipation hung in the air like the drops of water. Each person feared the training because it could — someday — be a real-life situation.

Four Marines attached to SOMS had volunteered earlier and were placed in the water simulating downed aircrew men. It was a real-life test of all concerned with water and helicopter rescue procedures.

Minutes before, the drill had begun with an alarm ringing simultaneously at search and rescue and the waterfront operations areas. It signaled the advent of an emergency. The boat and two others had scurried from their berths, like buzzing bees leaving their hive.

The downed aircrew men had earlier used a die-marker to stain the indigo blue of the waters surrounding them a florescent yellow. It was a sign to all concerned that here were Marines who needed help.

Sighting the survivors, the coxswain moved the throttle of the boat to the idle position, and the vessel knifed through the water much more slowly. Within seconds the boat was alongside the four swimmers and the sailor forward to cast a line to one of the survivors. Immediately, like an angel of mercy, an HH-46 hospital helicopter appeared from over the horizon. The sound level changed from a buzzing to a deafening roar as the chopper hovered closer and closer to the swimmers.

Soon overhead, its powerful rotors churned the sea and tossed the boats to-and-fro. In seconds, a search and rescue swimmer appeared at the hatch of the aircraft and like a small bird leaving its nest for the first time,

plunged into the water. He swam to one of the survivors and gave the pilot of the huge Sea-Knight a thumbs-up, signifying that he was unhurt.

The crew chief of the SAR bird then lowered its hoist with horse-collar device to the waterborne rescuer. He attached it to one of the survivors and signaled again to the aircraft. The wet, uncomfortable survivor was then hoisted into the warm safe cocoon.

In moments, two pick-ups had been conducted by the

hospital helicopter. Another two survivors were rescued by the waterfront operations personnel. The choppers took their passengers directly to the Naval Regional Medical Center, Kaneohe Branch while the boats returned to the docks with their precious cargo.

Waiting at the docks was a team of medical personnel. They gave immediate medical treatment to the survivors and subsequently transported them via ambulance to the branch dispensary.

According to the scenario for this drill, one of the downed aircrew men was bitten by a shark while another was suffering from water exposure. The other two were unscathed.

The drill was a success thanks to a group of sailors and Marines.

"All's well that ends well," is a trite, overworked expression. But in reality that's the only phrase that can be used to describe the drill. They worked as a team to






