

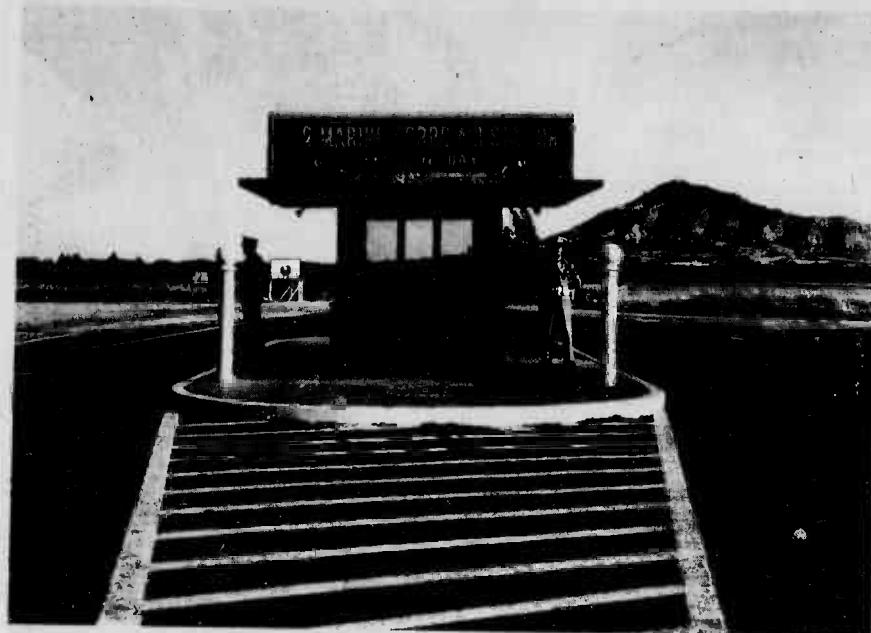

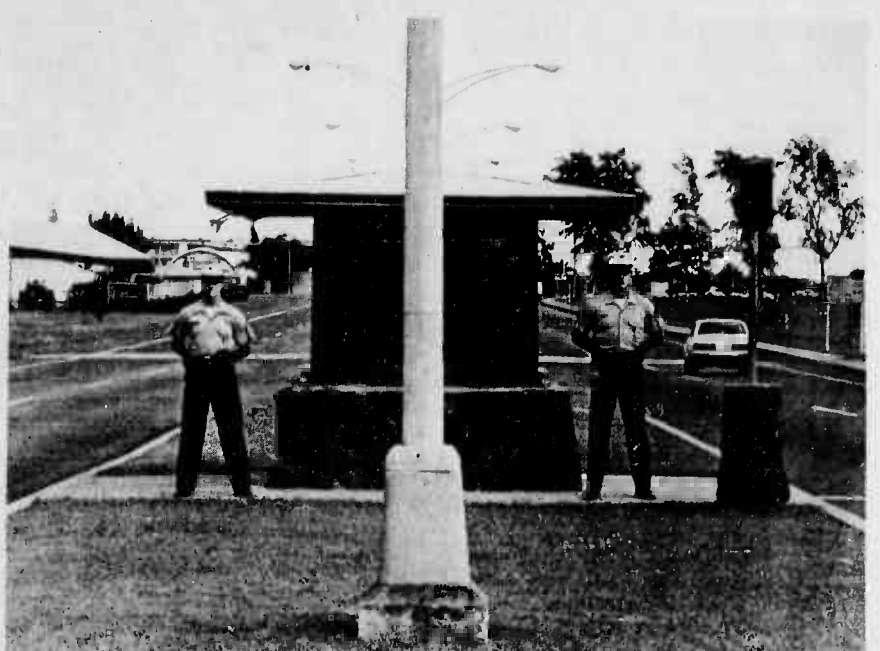

## Air Station salutes years of service

Mokapu Peninsula is one of the most beautiful and most versatile places on Oahu. It is also the home for more than 9,000 Marines who will be celebrating the 30th anniversary of the commissioning of Marine Corps Air Station, Kaneohe Bay Friday.

The Air Station covers the entire Mokapu Peninsula, a land steeped in ancient Hawaiian legend. The very word "Mokapu" means "sacred land."

IT IS HERE THAT, according to Hawaiian legend, three Hawaiian gods shaped man's image from the sands of Heleloa Beach and gave him life.

In the early days the peninsula was considered a barren, desolate wasteland. This changed during the 16th century when King Kamehameha the Great built his royal palace near the Nuupia fishponds in the vicinity of the present-day main gate.

The sands of Heleloa Beach face to the East where Ulupau Crater rises nearly 700 feet from the ocean. The first military use of Mokapu may have been at Ulupau Crater during the mid-1700s. In legends it is said that Pele, the

Hawaiian goddess of fire and volcanoes, chose Ulupau for her Oahu home while wandering around the islands. It was originally called Kuwaaohē, meaning "stand and wait," and may have applied to sentries who stood watch for invaders from the other islands.

ONE ACCOUNT HAS IT that Kahekili, the king of Maui and Molokai, sent spies to gather information about the army of Oahu. With the information gathered, the spies would use the sheer cliffs of Ulupau's northern slopes as their signal post. They lit large fires and torches to relay messages to lookouts on Molokai. Their activities went unobserved behind the crater's rim.

Kahekili undermined the power of Kahana, King of Oahu, and won the kingdom in a bloody battle. When Kahekili died in 1794 his son came into power. This set the stage for the legendary battle at the Nuuanu Pali when Kamehameha the Great forced the enemy army over the cliffs.

Another prominent land feature on the peninsula is Puu Hawaii-iloa, site of Kansas Tower today. Geologically, it is regarded as

being older than Ulupau, Diamond Head, Koko Head and the Punchbowl. It is believed to have been formed from a volcanic crater or vent.

IN THE 19TH CENTURY a great change began taking place in Hawaii. Royalty began leaving Mokapu for the rapidly changing leeward side of Oahu where Waikiki was becoming the status residential area for monarchs and foreigners. As the royalty moved out, commoners moved in and paved the way for the "Great Mahele" or land reformation.

In 1848, the common people were given the right of title to land, a right previously held by Hawaiian royalty. Farmers and tradesmen came to Mokapu and on the flatlands of this sacred peninsula, where royal pheasant hunts once took place, cattle now grazed.

During World War I, Ulupau Crater was again employed as a military base when the Kuwaaohē Military Reservation was established there in 1918. President Wilson signed an executive order that made it what is now considered one of the oldest military bases on Oahu.

WITH WORLD WAR II approaching, the Kuwaaohē Military Reservation was re-established. Early in 1942, cannoners began arriving to set up coastal defenses on Mokapu Peninsula. When commissioned in 1941, it was known as Camp Ulupau but was redesignated Fort Hase, in honor of Major General William T. Hase, in February, 1942. The post served as headquarters for the harbor defense of Kaneohe Bay.

The largest weapons at Fort Hase during World War II were 14-inch guns from the battleship Pennsylvania. These were employed in a position known as Penn Battery. In addition, French Battery stood between the Hilltop area and North Beach.

A number of 3-inch guns manned by Army Cannoners were between the sand dunes of Heleloa and the western base of Ulupau. Fifty caliber machine-guns were along the North Beach area from Pyramid Rock to Ulupau.

PRIOR TO AND DURING World War II, the Fort Hase detachment grew from its humble beginning as a defense battalion to a major unit of the Windward

Coastal Artillery Command. With its growing pains taxing the facilities, the Army acquired an additional 474 acres (the present Capehart housing area) of land from Harold Castle.

By the end of the war, thousands of troops were stationed at Fort Hase, or had received the training given there.

In the 1940s, the 98th Army Division departed Fort Hase bound for occupation duty in Japan. They had just completed their training in preparation for the invasion of Japan, which never occurred.

April 1, 1947, Fort Hase, which had once based elements of three divisions, became a skeleton outpost of the Army's Fort Ruger.

The Army was not alone in its interest of Mokapu Peninsula. In 1939 Navy planners began eyeing the area as a possible advance naval base. Security on the isolated peninsula could be easily maintained with only one road leading onto the land, and airfield planners and engineers were particularly pleased with the flat plain of Heeia.

A MESSAGE WAS SENT to the Department of the Navy and on Aug. 5, 1939 the contract was signed that started the work at the Kaneohe Naval Air Station and also gave birth to Naval installations on Palmyra, Johnson and Midway islands, in Alaska and at other Oahu locations. In all, the U.S. Government paid a total of \$1,097,736.04 for nearly 500 acres of Mokapu Peninsula.

During September 1939 engineers started work on a dike to create more acreage and began digging into the waters of the bay to fill in the diked area. This dredging and filling continued until 1943 when a total of 280 acres was added to the original land acquisition.

IN AUGUST 1940 THE Navy decided to expand even more by acquiring all of Mokapu Peninsula except for Fort Hase, which was still controlled by the Army. This new acquisition was the Nuupia area where the peninsula joins Oahu and was purchased by the United States for \$90,000.

With most of their land problems solved, workers began arriving at Kaneohe to build the advance naval base that was destined at the time to be only a small seaplane base. Quonset huts, designed to house the civilian workers, were the first structures to dot the peninsula's skyline. Within a matter of months supply warehouses, communications facilities and seaplane hangars began making their appearance.

PLATOON SERGEANT George Spencer reported aboard the base early in November 1940 with 30 other Marines. They were the first military unit to occupy the Naval

Air Station. As the senior military man present, Sgt Spence could be considered the first commander of the Air Station. His command was short-lived however, because a few weeks later Marine Major J. C. Donehoo Jr. arrived to become the first Commanding Officer of the Marine Barracks at Kaneohe Naval Air Station.

The Marines were primarily concerned with protecting construction materials and policing the area. This mission was accomplished, in part, using horses which were stabled in Building 713 just west of the runway.

The Naval Air Station's first Commanding Officer, Commander Harold Martin, arrived at Kaneohe Bay Dec. 7, 1940. Exactly one year later his command was the first on the island to be attacked by the Japanese.

IN A SMALL WOODEN shack at a desk made from an apple crate, CDR Martin began planning and executing the orders that would transform Kaneohe Bay into a sprawling, multi-million-dollar military installation. Work continued at a rapid pace during the next few months and included the construction of Baker Tower, known today as Kansas Tower. By late 1941 the major portion of construction was nearing completion.

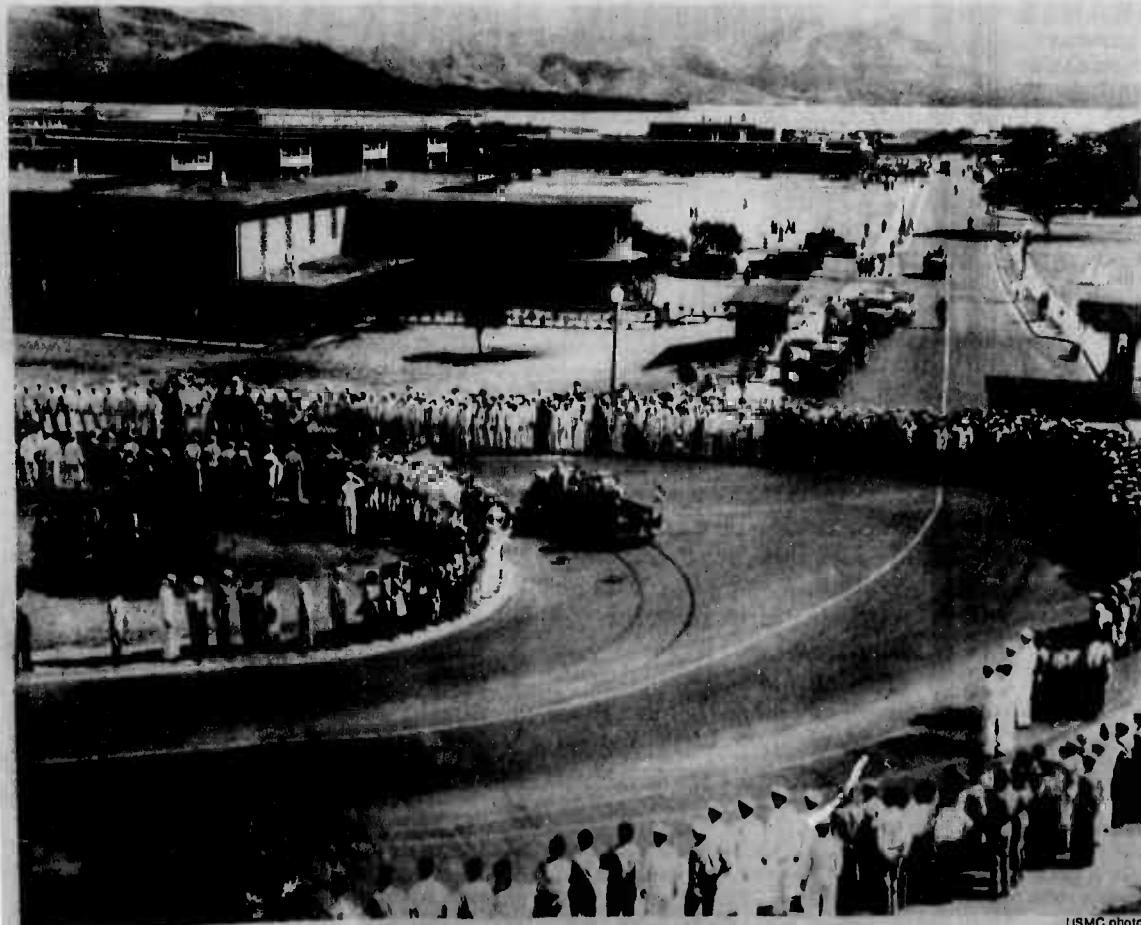
The mission of the Air Station was expanded to include the administration of the Kaneohe Bay Naval Defense Sea area and the Kaneohe Naval Air Space Reservation. With the added responsibilities came more aircraft. For the men stationed here, life was one seaplane patrol after another, including a patrol that was launched early one December morning. Just before 8 a.m., as the sailors waited for the patrol to return, the drone of approaching aircraft could be heard. It was Dec. 7, 1941.

ON THAT FATEFUL "Day of Infamy" the Air Station at Kaneohe Bay was the first place on Oahu to be attacked by the Japanese. In addition, the first Japanese aircraft to be shot down crashed into the hill at Kansas Tower. A Kaneohe-based sailor, John Finn, earned the Medal of Honor for his actions that morning. The ancient burial grounds of Heleloa again became a gravesite, this time for 18 sailors, one civilian and Japanese pilot Fusata Iida killed during the attack.

The attack placed Kaneohe on a forward area wartime basis. In early 1942 the Air Station became the base for Fleet Activities, serving as an important part of the supply line and as host to visiting units.

NEW PILOTS STATIONED here learned the latest flying techniques in more than 50 mobile "Link" trainers and two complete

# Black civil rights demonstration leader advocated nonviolent protest strategies

ARMED FORCES PRESS SERVICE — Perhaps no person, aside from Mahatma Gandhi of India, has been more of a symbol of nonviolence than the man whose birthday is celebrated on Jan. 15 — Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

During the demonstrations in Montgomery, Ala., in December of 1955, when the marchers were harassed by the authorities, King said, "In spite of the mistreatment that we have confronted, we must not become bitter and end up hating our white brothers. As Booker T. Washington said, 'Let no man pull you down so low as to make you hate him.'"

DR. KING'S LEADERSHIP OF THE nonviolent movement began in Montgomery. Like many movements, the protests in that Southern city resulted from a seemingly insignificant episode. Rosa Parks, a black secretary, seated herself in the front of a Montgomery bus one winter morning, a part of the bus where blacks were forbidden to ride. Martin Luther King said later of the action that Rosa Parks had been "tracked down by the Zeitgeist — the spirit of the times."

Miss Parks' reason was a bit more prosaic: "I don't know why I wouldn't move... I was just tired from shopping. My feet hurt."

Nonviolence as a strategy began in this nation long before Gandhi utilized it so effectively in India. Abolitionist William Lloyd Garrison

used it in the years before the Civil War, holding that "The history of mankind is drowned with evidences proving that physical coercion is not adapted to moral regeneration; that the sinful disposition of man can be subdued only by love; that evil can be exterminated from the earth only by goodness."

AS THE BOYCOTT IN MONTGOMERY wore on, King and his wife made the pilgrimage to India where he became even more dedicated to the cause of nonviolence. It was the struggle in Montgomery, however, that crystallized King's thinking. The experience, he said, "did more to clarify my thinking on the question of nonviolence than all the books that I have read."

In accepting the Nobel Prize for Peace in 1964, Dr. King gave a formula that might well be followed by the world today.

"The presentation of this award," he said, "also brings with it a demand for deepening one's commitment to nonviolence as a philosophy of life and reminds us that we have only begun to explore the powerful spiritual and moral resources which are possible through this way of life. We are also challenged to face the international implications of nonviolence for we know that there can be no justice in our society unless there is peace in the world."

In the past, H.A.S.P. patrolled the streets in search of servicemen getting into trouble. Although their role has changed, H.A.S.P. remains, keeping up the good working relationship with the Honolulu Police Department.

# Military terminals change flight sign-up procedures

Travelers taking advantage of Military Airlift Command flights will find that space-available procedures have changed. In the past, passengers were required to be present for each space-A roll call for any flight posted within a 24-hour period.

The new procedures allow passengers to sign up for a destination and leave the terminal until a suitable flight is available. Travelers will be required to show their intent to travel by validating

plemented Nov. 1. "It's a little early to evaluate the system completely," 1st Lt. Chavez said about passenger responses at Hickam. "It creates considerably more work for us, but it is very beneficial for the passengers. And, that is our major concern."

**THE LIEUTENANT** added that a survey has been conducted at Hickam to determine how passengers feel about the new procedure. The results have not been tallied, but he said, "I think that the percentage of people who favor the procedure will be much greater

than 75 percent. I looked at the surveys and there were very few who didn't like the new system."

There is some confusion when travelers fly into or out of non-MAC stations that do not use the new procedure. In these terminals passengers must revert to the old system of making every roll call.

Military Airlift Command recommends that passengers encourage non-MAC stations to adopt similar procedures to provide consistency throughout the Department of Defense system.

### MEDICAL IMPROVEMENT DEDUCTIBLE

Home improvements are generally not tax deductible, but they can be — if they're a medical necessity. For example, a swimming pool to provide treatment for a polio victim; a chairseat elevator for a heart patient; central air conditioning for a child afflicted with cystic fibrosis.

How much of the expense is deductible? The amount over which it increases the property value. For example, if an elevator costs \$5,000, and the property value is increased by \$1,000, the \$4,000 excess is deductible. If there's no increase in property value, it's all deductible.

But you'll need two documents to support this claim. A letter from a doctor stating that it is a medical necessity and a written opinion from a competent real estate appraiser stating the amount (if any) the improvement adds to the value of your property.

mock-up aircraft frames.

Many Navy and Marine aviators were trained and familiarized in flight operations here before being assigned to forward combat areas.

At the end of the war in 1945, thousands of military personnel passed through Kaneohe on their way back to the mainland.

Aircraft control from Kansas Tower ceased in April 1946 and was handled through the newly completed control tower above Hangar 105. In June 1946 the remains of the 19 Americans killed during the Dec. 7, 1941 attack were returned to the mainland. The remains of the Japanese pilot killed during the attack, were returned to Japan in 1948. In June 1949, the Naval Air Station Kaneohe was decommissioned.

BY JUNE 1950, the Air Station had been stripped of all valuables and personnel strength was limited to a small security detail and a Federal Communications Center. Then in 1951 the Marine Corps decided that the idle airfield would make an ideal training site for a combined air-ground team.

Working parties began clearing the jungle growth and on Jan. 15, 1952, Colonel Frank G. Dailey, the first Commanding Officer, took part in commissioning ceremonies for the new Marine Corps Air Station.

Ancient Hawaiians had divided the land between chiefs. World War II leaders had portioned the

peninsula out to the Army and the Navy. Now, for the first time in history, Mokapu Peninsula was under one command.

Early in 1952 Marine Aircraft Group-13 began moving in. The Station's brig, located next to Messhall One, was opened and had three registered guests. The first issue of the Windward Marine newspaper hit the streets on March 28, 1952.

In February 1953 the 1st Provisional Marine Brigade arrived. President Harry Truman commissioned the Brigade as the 1st Provisional Marine Air-Ground Task Force at ceremonies held April 18, 1953. For a brief time the Task Force was comprised of the 3d Marine Regiment and MAG-13.

Also during the 1953 the Air Station's Commissary opened for business, the Windward Marine became a regular weekly newspaper and in November, the first women Marines arrived.

The 4th Marine Regiment arrived in 1955 and in 1956 nearly 2,000 spectators witnessed the rebirth of the 1st Marine Brigade.

Marine Helicopter Squadron-161, Marine Composite Squadron-1 and Marine Attack Squadron-212 joined MAG-13 during April 1955. With the addition of the fast-landing FJ3 Fury jets and the extra roll-out needed for them, construction began in March 1956 to lengthen the existing runways.

IN 1957 A NEW MIRROR landing system to aid the fast-landing jets and a 10-lane bowling

alley were completed, and plans were made for construction of 1,000 Capehart homes. The Golf Course doubled its size in 1958 with the completion of the back nine holes and Hollywood came to Kaneohe in September 1958 when filming began on the motion picture "South Pacific." Several Marines of the Brigade's First Amphibious Tractor Company were given roles in the musical.

That same month the Navy's Pacific Missile Range Facility, Hawaiian Area, became a tenant of the Air Station's. Another tenant unit, the First Composite Radio Company, arrived at Kaneohe in 1959 from Camp Smith and was redesignated as the First Radio Battalion in 1964.

BY THE END OF 1964, major units from the 1st Marine Brigade included the 4th Marine Regiment; the 3d Battalion 12th Marine Regiment; MAG-14 and a service battalion composed of a number of separate supporting companies.

The increased U.S. involvement in Vietnam in 1965 meant the deployment of the Brigade's ground units. Once in Vietnam the units were detached from the Brigade. In July of that year the 1st Battalion, 5th Marine Regiment arrived here to replace the 4th Marines and in December, Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-212 became the first Brigade unit to return to Kaneohe from Vietnam.

The 5th Marines were ordered to Vietnam in 1966 and left the Brigade with no ground units until June of that year when the 1st Battalion, 27th Marine Regiment was reactivated. In December 1969 their colors were retired and the Kaneohe-based units were redesignated as the 1st Battalion, 3d Marines.

IN APRIL, 1968, after being stationed at Cherry Point for 20 years, MAG-24 moved to MCAS Kaneohe to fill the billet on the air side of the Brigade. Two air units, VMFA-235 and Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron-262 joined the Brigade on September 1968 and May 1971 respectively.

June 4, 1971 the 1st Battalion, 12th Marines became part of the Brigade followed by the remainder of the 3d Marines June 9.

At the end of 1968 the Naval Ocean Systems Center became an Air Station tenant. During September 1970 NOSC moved from their residence near Hangar 103 to their present location at the end of the Westfield adjacent to Hale Koa Beach.

In 1974 VMFA-122 left Hawaii to retire its colors, leaving the Brigade with only two fixed-wing squadrons, VMFA-235 and -212. The Brigades' Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron-463, who had become part of the Brigade in May 1971, was called in to remove Americans from Cambodia in March 1975. No sooner had the dust settled from that mission than they were directed to fly into Saigon to evacuate Vietnamese and Americans there.

HMH-463 WAS NAMED the 1975 "Outstanding Helicopter Squadron of the Year" by the Marine Corps Aviation Association for their role in those two operations, "Frequent Wind" and "Eagle Pull."

Personnel strength increased by over 1,500 Marines during 1975 and 1976 and resulted in the reconstruction of the 3d Battalion, 3d Marines and the formation of Battery "C", 1st Battalion, 12th Marines. Reorganization continued with plans for the restructuring of the Brigade Provisional Service Battalion into the Brigade Service Support Group.

VMFA-235 deployed to Iwakuni, Japan as the first F-4 squadron selected to implement the new Unit Deployment program.

In 1977 the Unit Deployment

Program was initiated and the Brigade was tasked with providing a battalion landing team, a composite helicopter squadron and a logistic support unit to the 31st Marine Amphibious Unit on a six-month rotating tour basis. This program allows Marines to work "in the field" with allied countries as well as enjoy liberty in such countries as Japan, Korea and the Republic of the Philippines.

IN SEPTEMBER 1977 HMM-265 arrived, Battalion Landing Team 2d Battalion, 3d Marines returned to Hawaii in July 1978 from the first deployment to the Western Pacific under the new program. June 30, 1978 HMM-165 became the newest air unit to join the Brigade team.

While the Brigade was participating in the Unit Deployment Program, the Air Station was being commended by the Hawaii State Senate for its environmental efforts. The Air Station was also the recipient of the 1978 Commandant of the Marine Corps Environmental Quality Award and the Secretary of the Navy Environmental Protection Award.

In addition to environmental protection, the Air Station is also concerned with good relations with the surrounding civilian communities. Exhibitions are presented during frequent tours of the Air Station by outside civic groups.

The Station and the Brigade were recipients in 1979 of an ancient poi pounder, presented by a direct descendant of the military instructor to King Kamehameha the Great. And in July 1980 a Hawaiian cultural religious group, headed by the "Kahuna" Sam Lono, held a conference at Kansas Tower. Lono and his religious group returned to the Air Station in October of that year to hold a Hawaiian religious festival at Pyramid Rock.

NINETEEN-EIGHTY WAS also the year of the Iranian Crises and in February of that year the 31st MAU deployed to the Persian Gulf to help protect American interests in that area.

During 1981 the Air Station supported athletics and community relations with a number of special events. In March the Na Opio High School outrigger canoe racing championships were held aboard the Air Station with approximately 2,500 people attending.

A major construction project ended July 29, 1981 as BSSG opened a new \$6 million maintenance facility. This facility consolidated the many sections of Maintenance and Motor Transport Companies into a 14-acre complex.

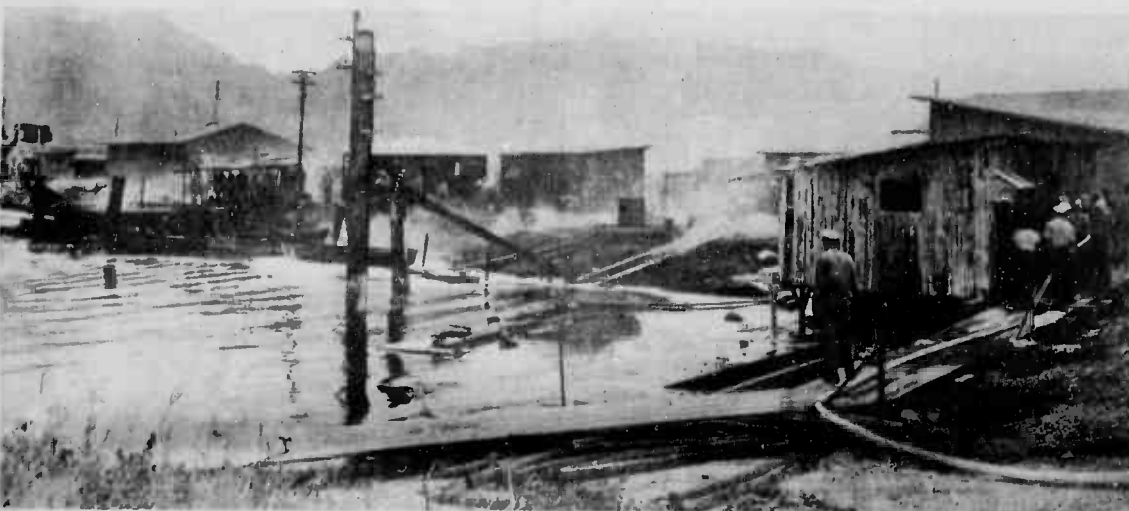
The Air Station was also the host for several ceremonies surrounding the 40th anniversary of the Dec. 7, 1941 attack by the Japanese. During December approximately 30 surviving members of Navy Patrol Squadron-11 (VP-11) who were stationed at Kaneohe at the time of the attack placed a plaque on Hangar 101 as a memorial to squadron members who died during the attack.

A monument to all Americans who died at Naval Air Station Kaneohe during the attack, was unveiled during ceremonies Dec. 2. The monument stands near the flagpole in front of the Air Station's headquarters building. Also, the "eternal sweetheart" of Japanese pilot Fusata Iida who lost his life during the attack at Kaneohe, visited the site of the crash Dec. 6.

The Air Station now stands on the threshold of a new year. As Marines here gather to celebrate the 30th anniversary of the Air Station they can pause to reflect on the lessons they have learned through the years. The Marine Corps Air Station, Kaneohe Bay, under the command of Colonel C. D. Robinson, is 30 years young, and still growing strong.

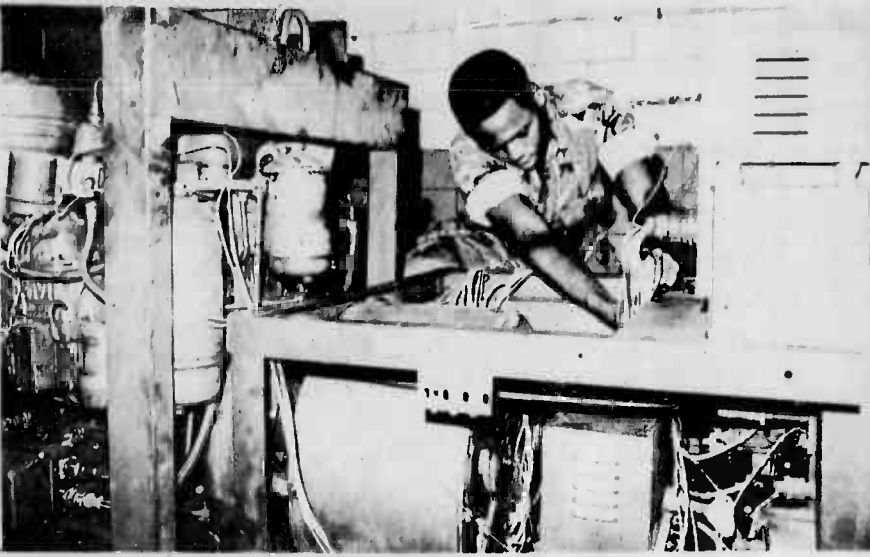

## Overhaul

*Marines save Uncle Sam's money*

Marines from the Auxiliary Section of Marine Air Traffic Control Squadron-18, Detachment "B" recently enabled Uncle Sam to pocket approximately \$10,000.

Their money-saving effort involved the extensive overhauling of a power utility generator which is the units' lifeline, providing the Brigade with a mobile air traffic control facility.

THE POWER utility generator is Navy property and before one screw could be removed, permission had to be granted by the owners at the Navy Electronics Systems Command in California. "It was a unique request, but there weren't any problems," said First Lieutenant William Clyde, Section Officer.

Under normal circumstances the generator would have been sent to California for repairs. If a replacement was available, the turn around time would have been about one month. If one was not available, then a long wait could be expected.

With the official green light the section went to work, under the guidance of Gunnery Sergeant Dayne Flanagan, Operations Chief. A few lunch breaks, late hours and 30 days later, the project was completed, and 1st Lt. Clyde says he is pleased with the results.

HE SAID THE task was not only cost effective, it also allowed for valuable training. His Marines are school-trained at

second echelon work, and the section is designed to normally perform fourth echelon repairs. Overhauling the generator required fifth echelon talents.

"Working at this echelon was above the men's school level, but they did some excellent and outstanding repair work," concluded 1st Lt. Clyde.

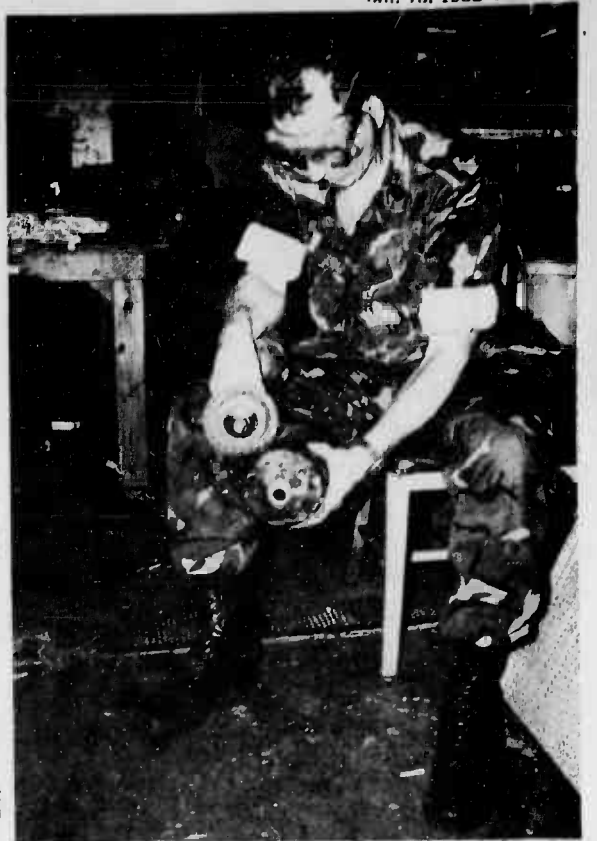

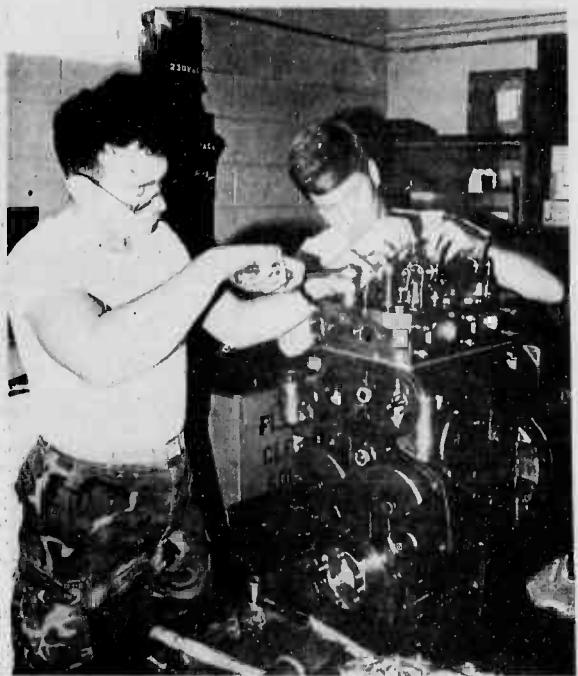

# Put nature back into your kitchen

Marine Corps Air Station, Cherry Point, N.C. — How well I remember my first visit to a health food store. I stood and stared from floor to ceiling at shelves of jars containing earth-tone granules: dried herbs, "natural" spices, banana chips, buckwheat groats, bulgur, sesame seeds, wheat berries...

THEN I LEFT BECAUSE I didn't have the slightest idea what to do with any of that stuff. I knew it was supposed to be nutritious, but it all looked so strange!

I bought a couple of paperback books on vegetarian cookery, made a trip to the local library, and in no time I was back in the health-food store ready to do battle with the soy grits and lentils.

The results were well worth the effort. Whole grain cooking is very much a part of my family's life

now. Once you get the knack, there's nothing to it, and it certainly takes the "boring" out of cooking as well as eating. If you haven't baked with whole grains, you really don't know what "full-bodied" flavor can be like.

**THE NUTRITIOUS ADVANTAGES** of whole foods cannot be disputed. It's nutrition as nature intended it to be — balanced and truly natural. Though the refined equivalents are enriched and fortified, they are still lacking in comparison to "nature's way." With all the fuss about fibers in our diets, what better place to look to put the controversy to rest?

It's unfortunate, but even the basics of whole grain cooking are foreign to most Americans these days. Wholewheat flour, for instance, is about as basic as you can get.

I wouldn't advise a complete changeover from the refined white

stuff, for you may be quite disappointed: cookies turn out cakey, and quick breads are quite heavy. Instead, substitute half the flour needed with wholewheat. You'll find your baked goods have a pronounced flavor, and the texture is very appealing.

**THICKEN YOUR GRAVIES** and sauces with wholewheat flour instead of white. Again, lots and lots of flavor. A white sauce made with wholewheat flour, and seasoned lightly with a little basil, will make the plain white kind taste like a weak powdered substitute.

## HPD cracks down on booze drinkers

Consumption of alcoholic beverages on the scenic overlooks bordering H-3 is, and has been, illegal. The Honolulu Police Department is cracking down by arresting violators who persist in drinking on these overlooks.

"Drinking on scenic overlooks is just the same as drinking on a public beach," said Honolulu Police Sergeant Clement Enoka. "They both carry the same punishment," he added.

In recent months the overlooks have become increasingly popular locations for parties and drinking. Marines apprehended for drinking in these areas will be subject to the same punishment imposed on civilians who commit the same offense. Fines range from \$25 on up, depending on the seriousness of the violation.

## Helpful hints ensure travelers safety

WASHINGTON... During this coming year, many of you will be traveling both at home and abroad. The following helpful safety tips will enable you to have pleasant and uneventful journeys:

### BEFORE LEAVING...

- Give a trusted person a copy of your itinerary so you can be reached in case of an emergency.
- Obtain traveler's checks, and be sure to record the check numbers and amounts as you cash them.
- Don't overpack your bags.

### IF TRAVELING IN YOUR OWN CAR...

- Be aware that your out-of-town license plates may attract thieves.
- Remove all luggage when you leave the vehicle.
- If you must leave your ignition key in the car, don't leave your home key with it.

### AT THE AIRPORT...

- Keep your tickets in a safe place and your valuables with you.
- Use only authorized skycaps.
- Watch your belongings as they enter and leave the metal detectors.

### WHILE IN TRANSIT...

- Use only recognized taxi services, and try to determine your fare beforehand.
- On buses or subways, sit or stand close to other passengers, the driver or the conductor.
- In general, stay in well-lit, populated places when awaiting transportation.

### AT YOUR DESTINATION...

- Use all locking devices in the room, and know your escape routes in case of fire or other emergencies.
- Be sure of a visitor's identity

before opening the door. Open the door with the chain lock secured to verify the caller's identity, or use the door viewer.

- Use streets that are well-traveled, and select the most direct routes.
- Place your wallet in a front pocket rather than in a back pocket or coat; carry a handbag with an arm through the strap.

### WHEN TRAVELING A-BROAD...

- Don't publicize your travel plans, but do let someone know your schedule.
- Don't use baggage tags that show your employer's name or logo.
- Don't exhibit large amounts of currency.
- Above all, be discreet; keep a

"low profile."

- Patronize only reputable hotels and restaurants, and avoid hotel paging.
  - Don't establish a pattern of routes in daily activities.
  - Know how to contact police, and report suspicious incidents.
  - Avoid civil disturbances and areas known as "tourist traps."
  - Use vehicles most common in the country. Travel in numbers when possible and not in remote areas.
  - If you don't know the language, learn phrases such as "I need a doctor." Know how to use the pay telephones, and carry change.
  - Refuse to meet with strangers in unknown or remote locations.

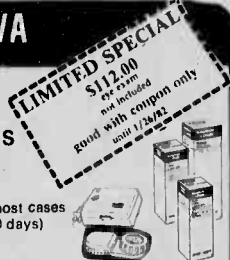

## Americans observe Franklin's birthday

Benjamin Franklin, whose birthday is observed on Jan. 17, was a genius of his day and an inspiration for all generations thereafter. At the age of 15 he was writing satirical articles for his brother's newspaper in Boston. During the next three decades, he excelled as a printer, author, philanthropist, inventor, statesman, diplomat, scientist and "bon vivant." In short, he enjoyed a productive life.

IT WAS SAID THAT HE was not entrusted with the writing of the Declaration of Independence for fear that he might conceal a joke in the middle of it. But if he was denied that experience, he did use his sense of humor to cool hot tempers during those humid days of July 1776 when the nation was born.

The breadth of his interests is evidenced by the 13,000 Franklin documents, in nine

languages, located in four depositories. Yet he wrote only one book, his autobiography, as a chronicle of advice to his son.

One career in which Franklin was perhaps adequate but did not excel, however, was that of a military man. He served for a short time on the Pennsylvania frontier during the French and Indian Wars.

HIS MOST OUTSTANDING service was to the unit's chaplain. After the chaplain had complained that attendance at worship services had fallen off, Franklin suggested that the weekly liquor ration be issued at the conclusion of the Sunday morning service. Church attendance picked up dramatically, leaving little doubt that the men received as much inspiration from the spirits as they did from the spirit.

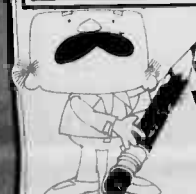

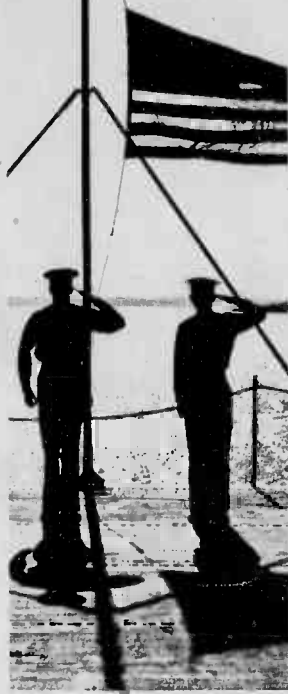
His awards include the Navy Commendation Medal with combat V and the Army Commendation Medal.

## Tournament

### Ground emerges triumphant during basketball competition

History reversed itself Sunday evening as the Station's Air and Ground basketball teams squared off to decide which team was the best in the west, as the Hawaii Marine Athletic Basketball Tournament came to a close.

Last year these two teams made the finals and Air pounded Ground 83-70 to win the HMATC. This year the tables turned as Ground edged Air 51-49 in a heartstopping, down-to-the-wire thriller.

#### Game I

Air and Camp Smith christened the tournament in this lead-off game, and for the first six minutes both teams matched baskets.

The match-a-basket routine continued for most of the first half but at the close of the period Camp Smith led by two, 30-28. In the second half the game rotated. Instead of matching hoops, Camp Smith managed to hold on to a slim lead.

With less than six minutes to play and the score 48-46, Camp Smith, Corporal Walter Edmonds went to the charity line and sunk two free throws, tying it at 48. But seconds later, without a bucket being made, Air was suddenly down by six.

Correction of a mixup at the scorer's table gave Camp Smith three baskets, and Air's motivation dwindled. Camp Smith capitalized on the mix-up and went on to win the opener 68-62.

Staff Sergeant Clarence Wesley and Sergeant Tony Bennett paced Camp Smith with 20 and 14 points respectively, while Cpl Edmonds lead Air with 22.

#### Game II

Lance Corporal Joseph Pemberton, who was voted the tournament's most valuable player, led Ground against Marine Barracks in this contest, and Ground controlled the tempo.

Marine Barracks, staunch contenders last year, couldn't cope with Ground's attack and the Brigade Marines romped to an easy 51-37 win. LCpl Pemberton poured in 16 points for Ground and Major Tom Hall contributed 11 for Marine Barracks.

#### Game III

Ground's tempo continued in their game against Camp Smith. Both teams entered undefeated and intended to stay that way, but Ground sneaked by the Leeward Marines 54-52.

Behind the hot shooting of LCpl Pemberton, Ground held a six-point lead for most of the first half. Camp Smith went scoreless for more than six minutes as Ground's defense kept them in check. Cpl Ronald Johnson thawed the cold spell for Camp

Smith and with a little more than a minute left, his team staged a small rally, pulling within two, 24-22. Before the close of the half Ground added a bucket to lead 26-22.

Run and gun marked the style of play in the second half and Ground tried every trick to keep Camp Smith at bay.

The clock ticked down to 22 seconds as Camp Smith closed the gap to 54-52. A turnover gave Camp Smith the ball with 10 seconds left. Sgt Bennett got the pass as time ticked away. He stopped at the key, checked the clock then hurled a prayer toward the hoop.

He didn't draw iron but got his own rebound for a second attempt. It was no good and as the buzzer sounded, Ground retained their undefeated status. Final score: 54-52.

#### Game IV

The Air Station's Air team proved that height doesn't always make the difference in basketball as they edged the Ground team 50-47 Saturday at Hangar 103.

The game got off to an unusual start as the referee called two technical fouls on the Ground team's bench for slam dunking the ball in pregame warm-ups. As Air took the ball out of bounds in the beginning, they held a 1-0 lead.

Within seconds Private First Class Rick Hester hit two baskets and as Ground was still complaining about the fouls they were behind five zip. LCpl Pemberton, the game's high scorer with 20, broke the tie for the Ground team, but Air, behind LCpl Jimmie Harvey bucket jumped out to an early 7-2 lead.

Ground's Cpl Mark Thompson scored two more points before Coach SSgt J. Brown called time out to break up Air's momentum. Cpl Edmonds managed to sneak in another basket before the Ground team temporarily took control of the game.

Corporal Thompson hit another bucket followed by a Lance Corporal Larry Volley bucket to close the gap 9-8 before they were called for their third technical of the evening for delaying the game.

Cpl Edmonds sank the shot and followed it in the next play with a field goal for his team to take a four-point lead.

Then the game turned into a two man show. Ground's LCpl Pemberton came to life, with an outside shot. LCpl Harvey followed it with a basket for Air, to increase the lead to four points again. LCpl Pemberton made two free throws and gunned in a 20-footer. LCpl Harvey scored a lay-up which gave the lead back to Air.

On a picture-perfect tip by Sgt James Puckett as a Cpl Edmonds' shot fell short, Air completed their scoring drive. Ground returned with two baskets and it was tied at 20 points.

LCpl Pemberton sank two more free throws to match a Cpl Edmonds' field goal and the two teams hit the locker room at half-time tied at 22.

The Air team kept up their running offense in the second half as Sgt Puckett scored on a lay-up from the opening tap. A LCpl Pemberton shot tied the game.

Keeping the tempo fast, looking for the open man and playing as a team were just a few of the factors that kept Air in front of Ground.

With seven minutes left in the game Ground's PFC Ricky Hicks was fouled and completed a three-point play to put his team back in the lead since shortly after the second-half tip off.

Air's Gregory Jackson was fouled and stepped to the line to sink two free throws to put his team on top again 42-41.

LCpl Pemberton, after a rest on the bench found his mark again but before he could start to rally his team, the Air started to open up the game. After two quick Air baskets Coach Brown had to call another time out to slow down Air. But, before play could resume Coach Gysgt Holloway called a time out and the Air had the advantage again.

One minute 55 seconds remained and a Cpl Edmonds' basket countered PFC Hick's and Air remained ahead by three.

Cpl Thompson came through with another two points with 50 seconds left to bring his team within one.

With 10 seconds to go LCpl Harvey missed a shot and PFC Hicks came down with the ball for a rebound. The persistent LCpl Harvey stole the ball, put up the lay-up and Air once again had their three-point lead. Everyone watched the final seconds tick off and Air handed Ground their first defeat of the series 50-47.

Coach Holloway attributed his win to "strategy, out hustling Ground and being more motivated." He continued, "We had to out run them if we were going to win and we did just that... plus we halted their one-man team."

#### Game V

Captain Johnny Charles attributes Camp Smith skating past Marine Barracks 68-41 Saturday to "my sixth man, Corporal Roland Johnson and my seventh man Lance Corporal Nathan Beckwith."

Cpl Johnson was the second leading scorer with 13 points and LCpl Beckwith was the third leading scorer with 12 and the

leading rebounder for Camp Smith.

With a bench like that Camp Smith had no trouble building a 9-2 lead after two minutes of play.

Marine Barracks did come back to narrow the score 14-10 but Coach Charles used his reserves and with six minutes to play until the half Camp Smith totally dominated 26-14.

Camp Smith was all over the boards coming down with the major rebounds and ran their opponents into the ground with fast breaks.

Reverting to a man-to-man defense Marine Barracks tried to slow the pace down but it was too late to combat the 18-point lead Smith had tallied.

Camp Smith returned to the court after half time with a 37-21 lead and two quick buckets by Sgt Bennett ended Marine Barracks' hopes for a win.

Camp Smith kept the 20 point lead until Marine Barracks returned to their man-to-man defense. Then Smith increased their lead to 25 points.

LCpl Beckwith scored six of the final eight points for Camp Smith and they went on to win 68-41.

Camp Smith's win qualified them to enter into the finals tied for first place with three wins and one loss.

#### Game VI

Staying alive was the theme of this game as Air and Marine Barracks needed a win to stay in contention. It was obvious that Air was in for an easy game as their lead spread to 20 points midway in the first half. The period ended with Air ahead 38-25.

After 10 minutes into the second half, Marine Barracks was still unable to break 30 points. Their opponents' margin zoomed to 25. At the close of the game, Air had captured 80-40 victory.

#### Game VII

Camp Smith went against Ground for the second time. This game was to decide a finalist against Air who drew a bye. Ground LCpl Pemberton tallied 28 points to pave the way for a 64-56 coup and a berth in the championship bracket.

#### Championship Game

Talk about fired-up teams. Air and Ground went through their warmup drills with lots of chanting and apparent confidence. This was it. No room for mistakes because there wouldn't be another chance.

After the tipoff, Air went into a tight two-one-two zone defense, forcing Ground to take outside shots. But with seven minutes gone, Ground, holding on to a 10-6 lead, began penetrating Air's zone, causing it to crumble.

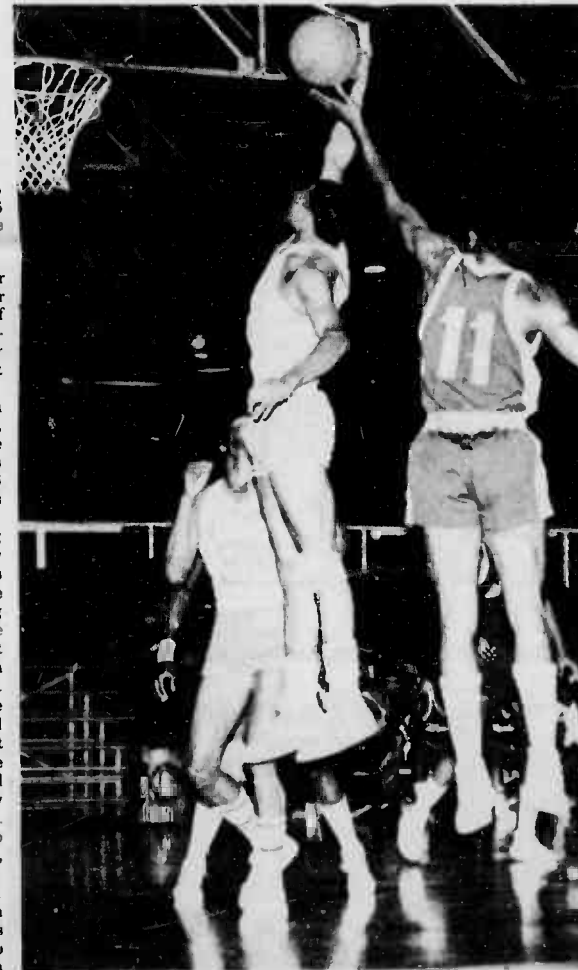
On offense, Air resorted to firing long-distance bombs that rarely found their target. Ground's defense held Air to one shot, while scraping the boards and scoring on fast breaks. Air tied the game at 12 and for the rest of the first half the action saw-sawed with a slight advantage toward Ground.

Ground wasted little time building their lead in the second half, but Air quickly whittled it down. The last minutes were thrills-a-minute. Ground grasped a 51-49 lead and unsuccessfully tried for a larger spread. Meanwhile, Air attempted to catch up and assume command, but neither team got its wish.

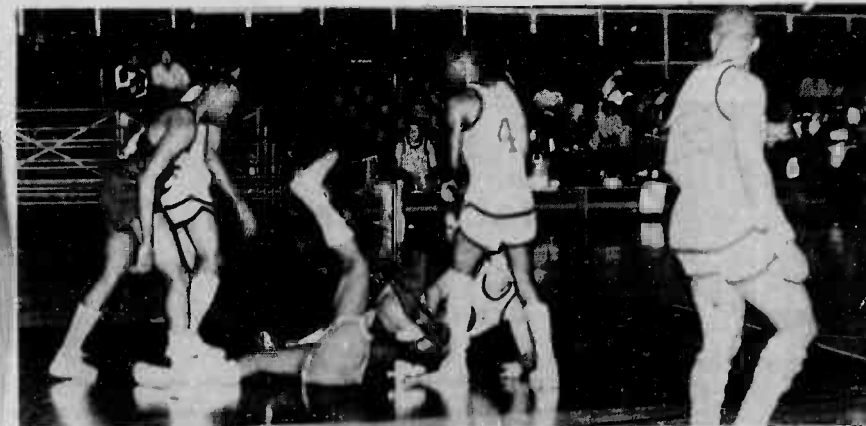

THE INTENT OF THE public information hearing is to provide a detailed explanation of

Department of the Navy AICUZ program and the update to the 1976 MCAS Kaneohe Bay AICUZ study being conducted by VTN, Pacific, a Honolulu-based engineering, architectural planning firm, under a Department of the Navy contract.

The AICUZ program was developed by the Department of Defense to provide a sound planning base for compatible land use in areas surrounding a

military airport. The program was initiated to protect the public's safety, health, and welfare while forestalling degradation of the operational capability of military air installations.

THE MAIN INTENT OF the AICUZ program is to ensure that development of surrounding lands will be compatible with accident potential and noise levels associated with airfield operations. Key elements in this process

are the development of an appropriate mix of land use controls such as zoning, easements, and noise abatement measures.

The initial Air Installation Compatible Use Zone Study for Marine Corps Air Station Kaneohe Bay was completed in 1976 by CH2M Hill, an engineering and planning firm based in Corvallis, Ore.

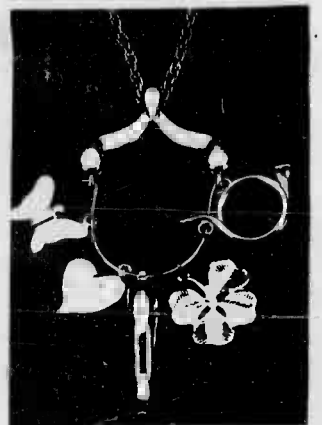

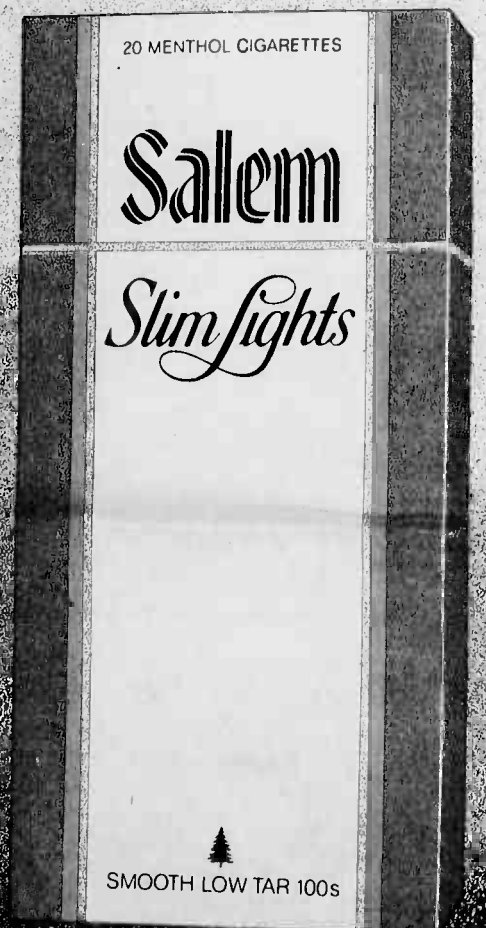
