## February declared Black History Month

Feb. 1 marks the beginning of Black History Month. This year's theme is "The United States Constitution and the Black American." The theme provides an opportunity to look at the Constitution and its amendments that have special meaning to black history.

Dr. Carter Woodson, scholar and founder of the Association for the Study of Afro-American Life and History, introduced the concept of Black History Week in 1926. He chose the week containing the birthdays of Frederick Douglass (Feb. 7) and Abraham Lincoln (Feb. 12).

Black History Week was extended to a month in 1976 to allow time for programs and celebrations.

## Outage hampers crossing

A power failure at the runway here Jan. 4 caused a near mishap involving privately owned vehicles and F-1s from Marine Fighter Attack Squadron 235, according to a recent 1st Marine Brigade message.

The gates controlling access across the runway are supposed to be closed prior to take-off clearance. The correct procedures were followed, the gates were lowered, and two F-1s were given clearance to roll.

Between clearance and take-off, a power failure was experienced at the gates.

"When the power fails, the gates automatically go up," said Major Sam Hall, 1st Marine Brigade Director of Safety and Standardi-

zation. "The cars thought it was okay to pass."

According to the message, one pilot saw a POV depart from the left side of the runway and another POV approaching from the right side. The lead aircraft continued its takeoff roll and passed 75 feet directly over the first POV as it continued to cross the runway. The second aircraft did not start its roll.

The message stated that if the aircraft had been operating at a higher gross weight, a collision may have been unavoidable.

Hall said that personnel are trying to rewire the system so that when a power failure occurs, the gates will fall in the down position.

## Major general selectees named

Petersen, director, Facilities and Services Division, Installations and Logistics Department, HQMC; and Richard T. Trundy, assistant wing commander, 3d Marine Aircraft Wing, Marine Corps Air Station, El Toro, Calif.

Although the promotion list has been approved by the Secretary of the Navy, the major general selectees won't begin pinning on the additional star until the list is approved by President Ronald Reagan.

## Taxes

Neat, accurate and carefully prepared returns yield faster refunds

WASHINGTON — If you're one of the millions of people who get a tax refund each year, the Internal Revenue Service says you may be able to speed things up by simply checking your return for errors and legibility.

The IRS says a neat, accurate, carefully prepared return can be processed faster, and that can mean a faster refund. On the other hand, an incorrect or hard-to-read return can take weeks to straighten out. A mathematical error will not necessarily cause a long delay, the IRS stresses, but it could prove inconvenient if you are counting on getting an exact amount back, and end up getting less.

How can you check your return? The IRS says good preparation is the best way to begin. Start as soon as possible — before you begin, check these tips supplied by IRS:

- Collect all the necessary forms and records you will need to complete your return.

- Make sure you have enough paper, or a calculator, for your math figuring.

- Don't rush your work. Take your time, and consult the instructions for each line on the tax form.

- Make sure you received a Form W-2, "Wage and Tax Statement," from each employer you worked for during the past year.

Once you finish your return, take a few moments to look it over.

Then go through the following checklist:

- Are your W-2 forms attached?

- Have you attached all the supporting schedules if you're filing Form 1040?

- Is your arithmetic correct?

- If you rounded off your numbers, did you round consistently?

- When you used the tax table, did you follow the line across to

the correct column for your filing status?

- Is the return signed and dated? Remember, if it's a joint return, your spouse must sign, too.

- Did you attach the peel-off label to your return, and is the information on the label correct?

Did you use the pre-addressed, coded envelope?

- Have you retained a copy of your return for your records?
- Did you remember to put a stamp on the pre-addressed envelope?

And last but not least, Aren't you glad you're finished?

## W-2 forms due soon

WASHINGTON... By Monday, taxpayers should receive a "Wage and Tax Statement," Form W-2, from every employer they have worked for during the past year, the Internal Revenue Service said. Even if the taxpayer had more than one employer or worked for a particular employer for only part of the year, he or she should be sent or given the form.

Taxpayers who have not received their "Wage and Tax Statement" by Monday should contact their employer and

request the form. Those still without the form by Feb. 15 should notify IRS.

If a taxpayer receives a W-2 that contains an error, like the wrong amount of wages received, he or she should ask the employer to issue a new form. The new form must have the box marked "correction" filled in. If the employee's name, social security number or address are incorrect, copies B and C of the W-2 should be corrected and the employer notified. It is not required to obtain a new form in this case.

## Laundrymen double as helicopter refuelers

BEIRUT, LEBANON (Delayed)

— The helicopter carrier USS Inchon usually keeps all helicopters of the American peacekeeping force here well supplied with fuel, but "sometimes the deck isn't open for refueling," said Marine Sergeant Tony Cobb, of Merry Hill, N.C., "So they have to come to us."

Sgt Cobb heads a five-man team from Wing Engineer Squadron-27 based at Cherry Point N.C., which operates a portable gas station called HERS—Helicopter Expedition Refueling System in the center of Beirut International Airport. When flight operations aboard in Inchon are too hectic, the HERS team stands by ashore to top-off the tanks of any helos that clatter into the Marine landing zone.

Lightweight and portable, the HERS system can be set up practically anywhere helicopters can land. For Sgt Cobb and his team the current location is ideal, near the end of the commercial runway next to the LZ.

The HERS team has positioned six 500-gallon rubber fuel bladders. In an area that was once the scene of heavy fighting between Syrians and Israelis.

"The bladders are made of six-ply rubber and reinforced with three cables through the center," said Sgt Cobb. The cables add strength to keep the bladder from rupturing during helicopter lifts.

Protecting the bladders on three sides is a 5-foot high wall of sandbags. With firefights occurring almost daily east of the Marine perimeter, there's a chance of a stray round hitting one of the bladders.

"The bladder can absorb one M-16 round," Sgt Cobb. But a second round could set them ablaze.

The HERS team in Beirut has pumped more than 40,000 gallons of commercial jet fuel in just over 40 days. The fuel is delivered by a civilian firm located at the opposite end of the airport.

"The old man who delivers the fuel is great," said the sergeant. "We have learned a lot about the fighting in this area this summer."

Although the fuel is stored in collapsible bags, the system has to be checked each morning for water contamination. "We usually recirculate about a thousand gallons to get the water out of the hoses," said Lance Corporal James Rivers of Ocean Springs, Miss. The fuel is pumped through the filter-separator to remove water and other contaminations before it is pumped into thirsty helicopters.

While Sgt Cobb remains ashore with HERS, the four Marines working for him rotate from the Inchon every two weeks.

On the ship, Navy crews refuel helicopters, so HERS Marines almost have taken on an unpopular job.

"These Marines have taken on the job of doing the laundry," said Lieutenant Colonel William Beebe, executive officer of Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron-263, "and they have done a great job." Beebe said he's never seen another group of Marines tackle that job with enthusiasm. Although

# El Toro receives first Hornets

MCAS EL TORO, SANTA ANA, Calif., The F/A-18 Hornet was inaugurated into U.S. Marine Corps service during ceremonies at Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-314 here Jan. 7.

Guest speakers for the ceremony included Lieutenant General William Fitch, Assistant Chief of Staff, Aviation, HQMC who represented the Commandant of the Marine Corps, Lieutenant General J.K. Davis, commanding general of Fleet Marine Force, Pacific; Major General Clayton Comfort, commanding general of the 3d Marine Aircraft Wing; Harold Altis, executive vice president of McDonnell Douglas Aircraft Corporation; Colonel Donald Bergman, commanding officer of Marine Aircraft Group-11; and Lieutenant Colonel Peter Field, commanding officer of Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-314.

During his address to the 1,500 spectators attending the ceremony, LtGen Davis had some specific remarks for the Marines of the Black Knight Squadron. He said, "You are the first in a program that has received more than its share of press, some of it not so good. Because of the high visibility, there will be more than considerable interest in how well you fare. Very soon you will have 12 expensive Hornets entrusted into your care. I expect you to train realistically — but in a manner

that ensures conservation of these costly aircraft. You and all the Black Knights are responsible and accountable to do this . . . to the American Taxpayer."

Speaking of the Hornets development, MajGen. Comfort said, "From its inception, one thing has made the Hornet program special . . . common purpose and an extraordinary sense of teamwork on the part of the sailors, Marines and civilians involved in bringing the strike fighter program through development and into high-rate production."

Other distinguished visitors at the ceremony included Vice Admiral C.A. Esterling, Commander, Naval Air Forces, U.S. Pacific Fleet; Brigadier General Richard Cooke, Commander, Marine Corps Air Bases, Western Area; and Commodore J. Weaver, F/A-18 Project Manager, Naval Air Systems Command.

Five of the 12 Hornets VMFA-314 will use in their operations have already arrived, and according to "314 Commanding Officer Lieutenant Colonel Peter Field, "Our training has been superb, the morale is high, and we're ready to go to work."

The F/A-18 Hornet is a single-seat, twin-engine, multi-mission strike fighter. It was designed to replace the F-4 Phantom Fighter jet in the Marine aviation arsenal.

The U.S. Marine Corps is the first service to use the Hornet in tactical operations and the first

operational squadron is located at MCAS El Toro. The Hornet will be used by Marine fighter attack squadrons both ashore and aboard aircraft carriers. As a multi-mission aircraft, it will serve in fighter escort and aid in air defense missions in its fighter role, and in attack missions, its job will be to wipe out enemy ground and/or sea forces.

"Superlatives tend to exaggerate the truth sometimes, but when someone says the F/A-18 Hornet is the best fighter-attack aircraft on earth, it's pretty darn close to the truth," said Field.

The supersonic F/A-18 has a top speed of 1.8 times the speed of sound and can fly at altitudes of over 50,000 feet. It can carry two types of air-to-air missiles, up to 14,000 pounds of ordnance, and is outfitted with a 20 millimeter cannon.

The Hornet is powered by two turbofan engines which have 18,000 pounds of thrust each. Compared to the F-4 Phantom engines, they have about the same amount of thrust, weigh half as much, and have 7,700 fewer parts.

If the engines are the heart of the Hornet, then the two mission computers aboard would certainly be the brains. One of the computers controls the navigation systems, and the other the weapons systems. They oversee the functions of the aircraft's

radar, flight control, navigation, communications, avionics, and weaponry.

The most notable feature of the Hornet is its reliability. "The reliability of the F/A-18 would probably not be as great as it is right now if it weren't so easy to maintain," said Field, who has worked in the Hornet program from the project phase, through test and development, and squadron training, to the current operational phase.

The Hornet was engineered by McDonnell Douglas Corporation

to enable maintenance people to work on the aircraft without getting in each other's way. Electrical components are located at chest level behind quick-release access doors. Built-in test panels on the aircraft tell maintenance personnel if problems exist and where.

The aircraft has also been designed so that new equipment can be added and existing components upgraded.

The F/A-18 Hornet is adding a more potent punch to an already powerful Marine air/ground team.

## Cigarette price increase

As of Jan. 1 cigarette prices increased in all military exchange stores.

Said Diana Easley, director of delivery, here at the Main Exchange, "This increase is due to higher federal excise taxes and applies to all tax paid cigarettes in the United States."

Tax paid king and regular size cigarettes jumped from \$5.90 to \$6.70 a carton and the price of 100 and 120mm cartons rose from \$6.10 to \$6.90. Individual packs in all lengths increased to 80 cents.

The price of the Class A generic cigarettes, introduced by the Army and Air

Force Exchange Service in December, rose to \$5.20 a carton for king size, and 100mm cartons are now \$5.40. Individual packs of generic cigarettes now sell for 65 cents.

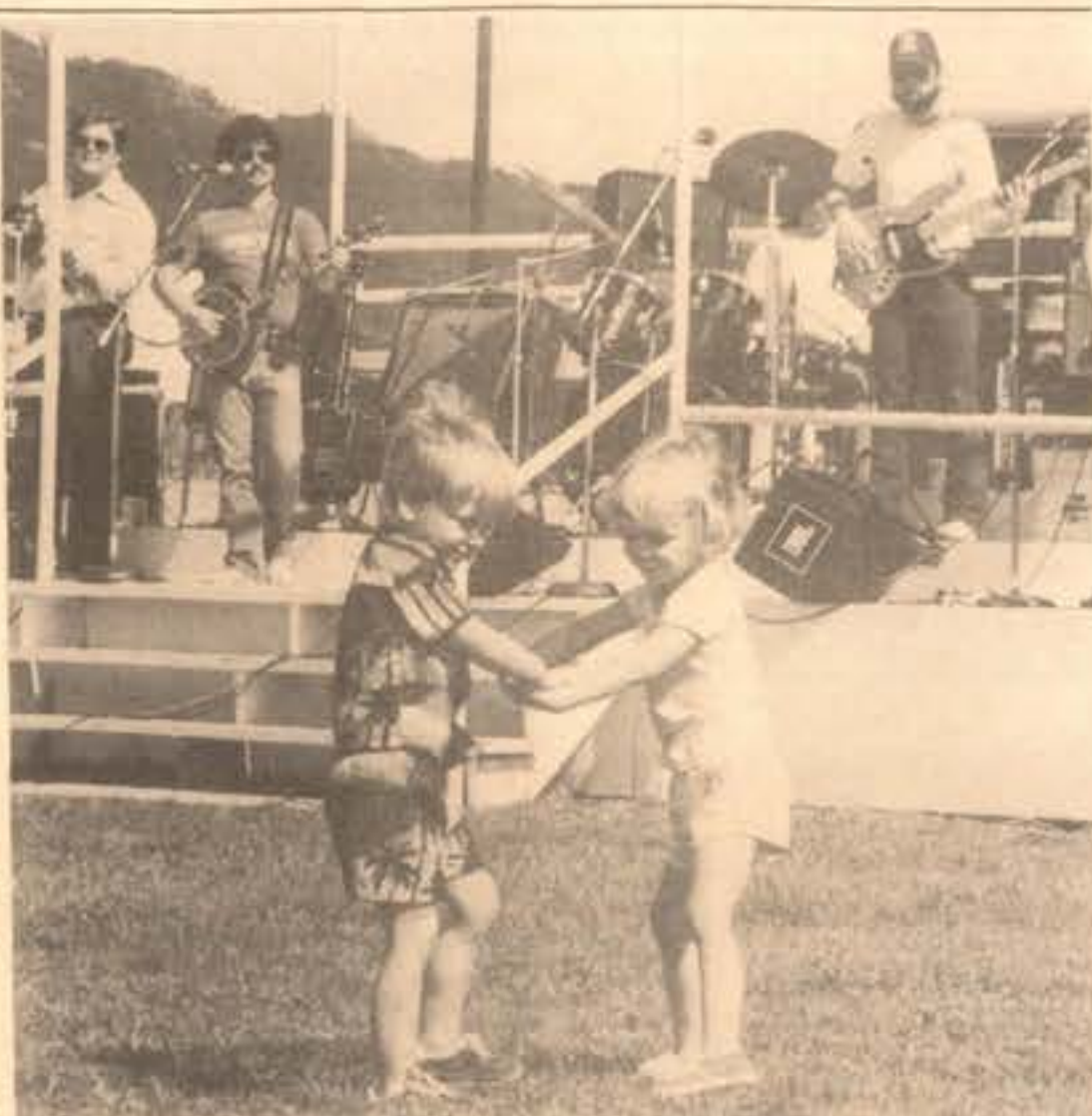

# Armorer insists on clean weapons

He's a Marine on the other side of the cage, the one who finds carbon inside the chamber of an M-16 and hands it back for another scrub down. He's an armorer and his domain is the Station Armory.

Three Marines keep the armory here running smoothly. Staff Sergeant James Jackson and Sergeant Randall Allen are old hands, with about 15 years experience between them, and Private First Class Don Atkins is the new man in town.

Atkins joined the armory in October after finishing the U.S. Army Ordnance School at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md. The 19-year-old leatherneck enjoys his first duty station.

"Coming here has been a good experience and I've learned a lot from Staff Sergeant Jackson and Sergeant Allen. They know their job and are good teachers."

Atkins learned the inner workings of nine weapons at school. The .45 and .38-caliber pistols, M-16 rifle, M-60, M-85 and .50-caliber machine guns and three types of grenade launchers haunted the Marine until he knew them inside out. "There are more than 200 parts in the M-85 machine gun," he said, "and we had to learn them all before leaving school."

The M-85 is the hardest weapon to learn, Atkins said, and the M-16 is the easiest. While the M-16 may be the easiest for Atkins to work with, it's at the bottom of his list. He's had no experience with the newer version of the M-16, but from what he's read, the new model will be a lot better.

Topping the list of weapons he likes is the .45-caliber pistol. "I enjoy the way it works," he said. "If something's wrong, it's easy to tell what it is."

The Louisville, Ga. native enjoys the way many things work, and if something doesn't work, he's liable to take it apart and fix it. "I like to know how everything works in life," he explained. "If I've got something old and there's nothing to lose by taking it apart, I'll tear into it."

Atkins' mechanical inclination has led him to take cars, radios, televisions and numerous other objects apart, but not always with success. "I took a watch apart once... a watch like no other I've owned before. I finally got it back together, but it still didn't work."

Whenever he tells the story, the smile on his face shows how serious he took the failure. The leatherneck's easygoing manner doesn't extend to the weapons in his care, though. He uses limited technical inspections to ensure the weapons are safe to fire. "If you issue someone a bad weapon, it could blow up in his face," he explained.

There are more than 500 weapons stored in the armory, and all of them must be ready for issue, Atkins said. More than 350 of the armory's weapons are packed in cases, already to be put in action at a moment's notice. The rest of the weapons are used for range practice, rifle and pistol matches and daily security purposes.

The security for all this firepower isn't limited to physical security. The weapons are locked in racks, which are bolted to the wall in a room surrounded by concrete and steel. The room, accessible only through another security area, is further guarded by an alert alarm system. The system detects movement, not sound, so no matter how silent an

intruder is, the alarm will go off.

The system is also battery assisted, Atkins said, so power failures don't affect it. The military police are automatically alerted when the alarm is activated.

One of the best ways to protect the condition of the firearms,

Atkins said, is to make sure the weapons are cleaned and ready for reissue. Cleaning for three consecutive days following a range detail is the best method, and he won't accept a dirty weapon.

If Atkins finds carbon deposits after the third cleaning, he hands it back for another scrub down.

## Civic leaders witness Marine amphibious training

Nearly 40 members of the Armed Forces Committee of the Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii attended a VIP exercise at Bellows Air Force Station, Thursday. The VIPEX was hosted by the air station and gave the 1st Marine Brigade the opportunity to demonstrate their use of Bellows as a vital training site.

"Your Marine Corps is only as good as its training areas," said Brigadier General J.W. Moore, commanding general, 1st Marine Brigade. His remarks followed a luncheon for the VIPs, also attended by Colonel C.D. Robinson, commanding officer, Marine Corps Air Station; Col H.J.M. Radcliffe, commanding officer, 3d Marines; Col John Solan, commanding officer, Marine Aircraft Group 24; and Col Harry Solter Jr., commanding officer, Brigade Service Support Group.

Following the luncheon, the VIPs were escorted to the beach where they witnessed an amphibious landing by two waves of assault amphibious vehicles. Once ashore, Marines from Company L, 3d Battalion, 3d Marines stormed the beach firing blanks.

The show of force was highlighted by Marines from Company A, 3d Reconnaissance Battalion as they heloasted into the water from a CH-46 Sea Knight helicopter.

"Bellows is very important to amphibious training," said BrigGen Moore. According to Colonel Duane Wills, the Brigade's operations and training officer, Bellows is the only beach on Oahu where Marines can conduct amphibious landings and continue the assault ashore.

At the completion of the amphibious demonstration, the guests were taken to the air strip at Bellows where 3d Marines rappelled from a hovering CH-46

helicopter and consolidated on the runway. The demonstration continued with the external lifting of an empty water tank from the runway by a CH-53 Sea Stallion helicopter, the largest helicopter in the Marine Corps' aviation arsenal.

The remaining Marines were removed from the runway by a CH-46 with the use of Special Insertion and Extraction (SPIE) tactics.

"We're very enthusiastic about having this opportunity to see what Marines do," said Claire Engle, director of committee programs for the Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii. "Thanks to the 1st Marine Brigade we have a much clearer picture of what their training requirements are and how they use Bellows for training."

The exercise lasted more than an hour and reinforced the air station's policy of maintaining understanding and good relations with the surrounding community.

## Dentist claims Marines are respectful patients

Ever since Navy Lieutenant Randy Shaffer began practicing dentistry three years ago, Marines have been his best patients. In fact, Marines have virtually been his only patients, because he has never been stationed on a naval base.

"I like working on Marines because they are very respectful and responsive. It makes my job easier," he commented.

Shaffer is a dentist with the 21st Dental Company here. A pleasant and unassuming person, he considers himself as being appreciated by his patients, but that is as far as he cares to elaborate, giving in to his modesty. But without him saying so, it is a sure bet that his shining personality and comforting attitude are testimony as to why his patients feel the way they do.

The 31-year-old exodontist went from repairing cars in Albuquerque, N.M., to medical research, and no dentistry, in which he appears to have found his niche.

For 13 years Shaffer labored as an automotive mechanic to help pay his way through the University of New Mexico. He graduated from there in 1973 with a bachelor in science degree in biology. The following three years he did biological research for six months at a local toxicology laboratory, and for 2½ years at Albuquerque's Veterans Administration Hospital.

He said, working "with tons and tons of lab animals," lost its flavor. He hungered for something tastier to sink his teeth into. "That was a dead end for me. I was feeling stagnant," he said.

While pondering his future, he wandered into the VA's dental department and started asking

questions. He was impressed with the answers he received, and decided that dentistry was what he wanted.

With a new surge of energy, Shaffer applied for, and was accepted, at four schools. He chose Creighton University in Omaha, Neb. A week prior to reporting for classes, he got married and, he and his bride, Dorothy, spent their honeymoon driving across the country in a hauling truck.

"That was quite an experience," he recalled with a laugh. "My wife looked very young for her age, so we had trouble getting into some motels. When we did get a room, I had to sign for it and then sneak her in through the back door." He said they grew to like Omaha, but the cold weather was a shock.

His introduction to the Navy came while at Creighton. He was preparing for the National Board Examination,

and the pressure was on. It was his final year, and this test was the big one: pass it, or hang it up. One night after hours of cramming, he received a telephone call that changed his life.

"It was around midnight, and as I listened, I kept wondering, 'who is this guy?'" That guy was a Navy recruiting officer, and he offered Shaffer a deal he could not — and did not — refuse. "He said if I joined the Navy, there was a 98 percent chance I could get into General Practice Residency. I wanted to go into oral surgery, but I'm the type who's cautious about making radical decisions."

So he played it safe and accepted the recruiter's offer. After graduation in May 1980, he was commissioned and sent to Camp Pendleton, Calif. for one year, and then transferred to Hawaii. He recently deployed with 3d Battalion, 3d Marines, and he said

that is when he saw Marines in a different light.

"I couldn't appreciate what Marines were all about until I went on deployment. All the gung-ho stuff I heard about, and saw in the movies was true. It was amazing."

In Shaffer's opinion, working at a small clinic, such as the one here, has plenty of advantages because he can practice all facets of dentistry. He said he is becoming increasingly interested in the technical aspects of his trade. He is licensed to practice in Minnesota, and is eligible to work in 11 other states if he pays the appropriate fees.

When his tour ends here, he would like to go to Bethesda, Md., to study comprehensive dentistry. "That's where they make you a superdentist," he joked. Until then, the former car repairman is happily putting the bite back into the brigade and air station Marines.

The Soviets claim to have the best CBR protective masks in the world. Although they provide excellent protection against CBR agents, these masks are uncomfortable and restrict vision. The standard mask issued to lower-ranking personnel of the ground forces is the ShM model (figure 1). The rubberized mask fits completely over the head. Although ShM affords excellent CBR protection, it is heavy, cumbersome, and extremely uncomfortable in hot weather. The lack of a voice-mitter hinders communication and the small eyepieces restrict side vision. A modified version of the ShM mask is issued to personnel who must communicate by voice. This model (figure 2) is worn by commanders, NCOs, and radio operators. It contains a voice-mitter and does not cover the ears. The communication mask provides good protection against all known CBR agents for the eyes, respiratory system and face but, as with the ShM, it restricts side vision.

The 1st Marine Brigade was back in the saddle again Jan. 5 and 6 — and it had nothing to do with cowboys and westerns.

"The Back in the Saddle Program is a traditional program in naval aviation that involves reviewing safety for the new year," said Major Sam Hall, 1st Marine Brigade Director of Safety and Standardization.

"This particular time of the year was chosen for the program because it seems that more safety mishaps occur in February and March than any other time."

"Usually just the aviation units do this, but the brigade is unique in that the ground units participate also. It's been done in previous years, but greater attention has been focused this year."

## Brigade reviews safety operation

To prepare for the program, unit safety officers received handouts of mandatory topics to cover in addition to their own topics. Each unit then submitted a schedule of events to the brigade safety office.

Hall explained that the aviation units participated for two days, while the ground units joined in for one day.

All squadron personnel were included. Topics covered by aviation units included classes for

pilots and air crewmen. The ground units covered subjects on weapons and ordnance safety.

Two representatives from the Naval Safety Center, Norfolk, Va., assisted this year by giving multiple Safety Maintenance Malpractice Presentations.

Lieutenant Commander William Evans, Chief Aviation Physiology Training Service, Naval Regional Medical Center, Hawaii at Naval Air Station, Barbers Point, lectured on flight

physiology to several squadrons. "He was not obligated to help us," said Hall. "He did this on his own time."

The major also mentioned the assistance received from Officer Ben Torres, Traffic Division at Honolulu Police Department, who lectured on traffic safety and defensive driving. Torres presents safety lectures aboard the air station throughout the year.

"Some of the people who've worked the hardest are the Training and Audiovisual Support Center," said Hall. "They prepared equipment for the safety lectures, and they pleased everyone."

"The brigade mishap rate for calendar year 1982 was 4.17, considerably lower than the 12.43 mishap rate for 1981," said Hall. "Our goal for 1983 is 0 mishap."

## Getting out?

Retests mandatory; broken time diminishes reenlistment opportunities

Marines who get out of the Corps and then decide to reenlist may find that it's a lot tougher now than it used to be.

Since November, all former Marines requesting re-entry into the Marine Corps are retested with the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB). New scores are submitted to Headquarters, Marine Corps with

the reenlistment package.

This new ruling applies to Marines who have been out of the Marine Corps more than 24 hours.

In addition, former Marines requesting re-entry into balanced or over primary military occupational specialties must submit three choices of short MOSs and be willing and qualified for a lateral move if necessary. According to Career Planning Newgram 18-82, if a

Marine will not make a lateral move or is unqualified for another MOS, the chances of re-entering the Marine Corps are slim.

"I suggest that Marines wanting to get out of the Marine Corps take leave, 30 to 60 days before they get out, go back to their hometown and check out the job market and the economy," said Staff Sergeant Ricky Drost, career planner, Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron. "Ma-

rines should make darn sure that getting out is what they really want to do," Drost added.

According to the Career Planning Newgram, all Marines should fully understand that the chances of re-entering the Marine Corps have been greatly diminished.

## Overseas mail inspection

WASHINGTON, D.C. — In an effort to crack down on drug trafficking, black marketing and other illegal activities, the Department of Defense recently issued new regulations regarding inspections and searches of Military Postal System (MPS) mail overseas.

The new rules include the Fleet Post Office (FPO) system which most Marines use at sea or while stationed outside the U.S.

The new regulations provide for:

- random inspection of mail bags and parcels in overseas Military Postal Facilities;
- the search and seizure of individual items of MPS mail, based on probable cause;
- the use of mail covers in limited circumstances when authorized by specially designated military officials; and
- customs inspections of MPS mail by foreign customs officials.

"Overseas," according to the regulations, means any place outside the 50 United States where the U.S. Postal Service (USPS) does not operate a civilian post office, or aboard ships operating beyond the three-mile U.S. territorial limit.

The new regulations came about as the result of an agreement, effective Nov. 20, 1982, between DoD and USPS whereby responsibility for the privacy and security of MPS mail overseas was transferred to DoD. The authority to conduct random inspections, probable cause searches, mail covers, and customs inspections has always existed. In the past, however, authority to order such measures rested either with USPS inspectors or with federal judges and magistrates. Now, certain commanding officers may authorize the measures.

New regulations authorize First Class mail to be opened only in certain situations:

- with the consent of the sender or addressee;
- pursuant to a search warrant or authorization based on probable cause;
- pursuant to a foreign customs inspection; and
- when mail is suspected of being dangerous, such as a suspected mail bomb.

DoD officials emphasized that "the service member's privacy rights will continue to be protected to the maximum extent possible consistent with the need of the military to ensure that the MPS is not used as a conduit for drug

trafficking, black marketing, and other illegal activity."

To that end, individual items of First Class mail will not be opened as part of the inspection program unless random inspection of mail bag contents (through the use of fluoroscopes, metal detectors, drug detection dogs or similar means) gives rise to a probable cause belief that the individual item contains drugs, contraband, or other evidence of a crime.

## New pay policy

WASHINGTON, D.C. — The three-month test phase of the Corps' new pay policy has been successful, officials announced here recently.

Therefore, as of Jan. 1, the master military pay account maintained at the Marine Corps Finance Center, Kansas City, Mo., will be the official pay record for paying Marines through the Joint Uniform Military Pay System/Manpower Management System (JUMPS/MMS).

This means individual Marines must pay especially close attention to their Leave and Earnings Statements (LES) since they will normally be paid solely according to the amount forecast on the automated record. While the Corps will be relying more substantially on computers, there are provisions that allow commanding officers and disbursing officers to override the computer generated amounts to prevent severe hardships and adjust for other circumstances.

The new policy does not impact on such payments as: advance pay, bonuses, payments upon joining and transfer, emergency leave or travel payments.

When introduced in 1973, JUMPS/MMS was heralded as a nearly error-free pay system. Even so, the Marine Corps continued to pay based primarily on the local personal financial record. This procedure has proved extremely costly and time consuming.

Because of the success of the test phase, the Corps has decided to go ahead and rely primarily on JUMPS/MMS. Data from several sites around the Corps indicated that "the new policy was successfully implemented with no major problems," according to ALMAR 279/82.

A report of the "lessons learned" during the test phase has been forwarded to all Marine commanders to help ensure a smooth transition. According to Fiscal officials here, "The test phase has demonstrated that the policy works and that the most critical factors are command attention and the cooperation of all concerned."

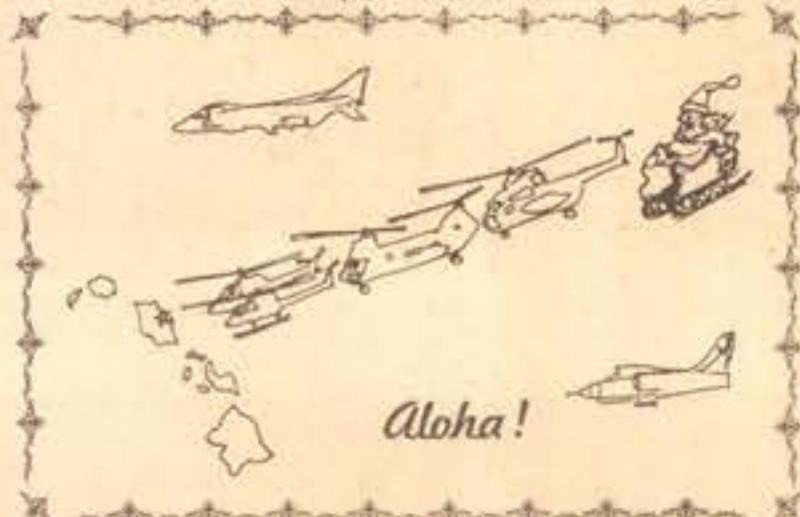


## Unit Info

## Child seats mandatory

Child restraint seats are now mandatory in California. The new law became effective Jan. 1.

Children under 4 or who weigh less than 40 pounds must be restrained in car seats, that meet the National Crash Test standards. Military Police will enforce this law aboard all military bases in California.

According to a recent Fleet Marine Force, Pacific message, automobile accidents are the No. 1 preventable killer of children after the first year of life. The force of impact on an unrestrained child's body in a 30-mph crash is equal to a headlong plunge from a three-story building. A 10-pound infant will be thrown forward with a force of 300 pounds in a 30-mph crash.

More than 2,000 children are killed and 200,000 injured each year in the United States in automobile accidents, according to the message. The only way to protect the infant is to use an approved child restraint seat. Proper and consistent use of safety devices will reduce the probability of death by 90 percent and injury by 80 percent, according to the message.

Child restraint seats can ensure that children have the best chance of surviving an auto accident.

Child restraint seats aren't mandatory in Hawaii, however the idea is the same. Family Services here lends seats for up to three months, free of charge.

## Identifying the "telltale" signs Brochure aids in marijuana detection

"Is Your Child Smoking Pot? What You Can Do To Help," is a free brochure recently developed by the American Lung Association of Hawaii.

This informative, easy-to-read brochure is specifically aimed at parents concerned about marijuana and its effects on a child's physical and mental health.

"Many parents have called, wanting to know how they can tell if their child is smoking marijuana," explained lung association health educator Kathy Koga. "Although only a

professional counselor can truly diagnose a drug problem, there are several 'telltale' signs which may indicate marijuana use."

She noted that this brochure not only can help parents identify signs pointing to pot smoking, but, more importantly, offers a number of "do's and don'ts" to parents attempting to help their child.

A few of these suggestions include: If you suspect that your child is smoking marijuana, do not jump to conclusions and alienate him. Do not accuse, but do ask. Make an effort to assist your

child in becoming accurately informed about the physical, social, and psychological effects of marijuana smoking. Don't become hysterical or over-exaggerate the dangers of pot. Express concern and state your position regarding marijuana use.

Also included in this brochure are names, addresses and phone numbers of groups throughout the state offering information and counseling services.

Koga also said that "Is Your Child Smoking Pot?" is currently being used in the lung

association's statewide Marijuana Smoking Health Education Program.

This year-old program centers on the impact marijuana smoking has on the lungs and respiratory system, offering information which can aid individuals in making informed decisions regarding personal marijuana use.

# Reserve dentists 'rough it' in paradise

Four cammie-clad Marines sit with mouths agape, as the morning sun peeks around poles supporting a heavy canvas tent. The smell of wet grass and canvas hangs in the air. Chirping birds and passing cars muffle the sounds of whirring instruments.

An exercise in mobility brought Reserve dentists and dental technicians from Arizona to the air station where they "roughed it" on the lawn next to the 21st Dental Company.

The two-week exercise for reservists

from Detachment 2, 4th Dental Company, 4th Force Service Support Group, Phoenix, Ariz., began Jan. 9 and ended Friday.

According to Commander Ronald Pagani, reserve division officer, it's not necessary for the dental unit to train in a remote area as long as their operations remain detached from the permanently based dental clinic as much as possible. X-rays are the only major service provided by the 21st Dental Co.

In canvas tents with wood and dirt floors, it was business as usual for the four reserve dental officers and seven dental technicians. Although figures

are not in for this exercise, the reserve dental unit that trained here in August treated 316 patients with more than 2,700 dental procedures, including almost 1,000 fillings.

"They are scheduled to come out here 30 to 60 days before each (Western Pacific) deployment," said Captain R.C. Terhune, company commander, 21st Dental Co. "It's a last push to get all the dental work done on those going to deployment."

According to Pagani, a mobile dental clinic like this is designed to keep troops from being debilitated because of a simple toothache. "To lose a man in your squad because he has a toothache is absurd," said Pagani.

"Our goal is to keep this from happening."

The reserve training exercise benefits not only the troops, but also the reservists and the sailors attached to the 21st Dental Co. "It's a benefit for them (reservists), for training purposes, to work in the field just as they would if they were called to active duty," said Terhune. "And, it certainly helps us with the workload."

In addition to supporting the dental needs of Marines here, the reservists train at other locations, including the Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center at 29 Palms, Calif., in support of Combined Arms Exercises.

"We move around to different places to see how other areas operate," said Pagani. "We're supposed to be a complete mobile unit," he added. "Training like this gives us the chance to see how effective we are and to learn the needs of a mobile unit."

"It's different here," said Dental Technician Second Class Craig Adkins, leading petty officer. "It's a little tougher to do the job like this, but we get the job done." Adkins, owner of a dental laboratory in Flagstaff, Ariz., spent more than six years as a dental tech on active duty before joining his reserve unit 3 1/2 years ago.

"So many of these people have (civilian) jobs other than what we are doing here," said Captain Edward Gomez, reserve commanding officer. "This gives them a chance to work in the field with the equipment."

Back in Arizona, the reservists work at several different civilian jobs. On drill weekends however, Saturdays are spent in the dental clinic of St. Joseph's Hospital in Phoenix while administrative work is done at the Reserve Center on Sundays.

As a civilian, Dental Technician Second Class Peggy Millsap is a radio dispatcher for the Phoenix Police Department. "I really enjoy dental work and I enjoy working with the Marines," said Millsap. "This field exercise is something I would never have the opportunity to do anywhere else," she added. "I think it's excellent. There's also the satisfaction that I get when I feel like I'm doing something important."

Dental Technician Third Class Jeff Stewart of Tempe, Ariz., spent three years on active duty as a dental tech aboard the carrier USS America before joining the reserves five years ago. "The last three years of my reserve active duty have been spent working with Marines," said Stewart. "I really enjoy working with Marines."

The Marines seem to enjoy the reservists about as much as dentists can be enjoyed.

















"It was outstanding," said Staff Sergeant James Brown, maintenance supply, Marine Amphibious Unit Service Support Group-31. "That was the fastest filling I've ever had," he said. "I was more relaxed out here than I am inside."

"They (Marines) like this stuff," said Pagani. "Marines are trained to be field-oriented and this fits right in with them."

## Marine provides inspection results

The days of waiting for the results of the Inspecting General's inspections are over for the 1st Marine Brigade.

Lieutenant Colonel James Mangan, brigade inspector, devised a method to obtain the results the next day. He uses a computer.

"I took something commercially available and came up with a way to

calculate and print out, on a daily basis, the result of FMFPac (Fleet Marine Force, Pacific) functional area inspections," said Mangan.

The procedure he uses is simple. Once the FMFPac Inspector approved the inspectors' evaluations, Mangan's clerks obtain the gradings. The lieutenant colonel uses his own IBM Desk Top Computer to compile a report.

"I do it at home by myself," said Mangan. "I purchased an electronic spread sheet program for my computer. It takes me about 20 minutes to an hour to update the file and a couple of minutes to run it off. The next morning, the report is simply photocopied for distribution."

Mangan said the report shows the numeric grade achieved for each functional area. The grading is based on a scale from zero to five.

"This can't be applied to all inspections," he said. "The utility is for big inspections. I'm not saying this hasn't been done at other commands, but it's not uncommon for units to wait days for results."

Communication was the basic problem the lieutenant colonel attempted to solve.

"Everyone wants to know how we're doing, and it's difficult to find out right away. It's usually not until the inspectors have left that everyone knows the total results," he said. "Now all levels of command can know at the same time, and quickly, the results of an inspection. My basic objective is for them to know soon enough to ask questions while the inspecting team is still around. An inspection is more effective when the units understand why they received specific marks."

A proposal was submitted to Headquarters, Marine Corps to use Mangan's system throughout the Corps.

"I assume that if Headquarters, Marine Corps likes it, future inspection teams may arrive equipped with computers, or with the program disk to fit just about any computer available at the command," said Mangan.

## Navy Relief Society provides assistance

Seventy-nine years ago the Navy Relief Society was founded to provide financial assistance to the widows and children of deceased sailors and Marines.

Survivors of both active duty service members and regular Navy or Marine Corps retirees are still given high priority in the Society of 1983.

Today, the Navy Department promptly provides survivors of active duty personnel with cash death gratuity and government life insurance proceeds. A Casualty Assistance Calls Officer (CACO) helps these survivors apply for all benefits for which they are eligible.

The survivors of retirees are not furnished a CACO or death gratuity and two or more months may elapse before eligible dependents of either active or retired personnel actually receive Veterans Administration, Social Security, or Survivor

Benefit payments.

During this waiting period, Navy Relief can and does provide financial assistance to prevent hardship. In addition, a counseling service is available to the Kaneohe Branch to assist survivors and ensure that they are aware of all entitlements.

For survivors below age 65, Navy Relief aims its longer term assistance at helping with specific emergencies, such as unusual medical and dental expenses.

Aid is also available to encourage survivors to become self-reliant. Financial assistance may be made available to pursue a course of vocational training that will help the survivor earn a living.

The basic needs of persons 65 or older are generally provided by government programs such as Social Security. There are, however, some elderly widows of sailors or Marines who have limited

incomes. With the objective of alleviating the hardship faced by some elderly survivors, Navy Relief maintains special funds which can be used to provide modest income supplementation and meet other support requirements.

Eligibility for assistance to survivors continues for their lifetime unless remarriage occurs. Surviving Children are eligible for Navy Relief programs as long as they are entitled to a dependent identification card.

Dependent children of a deceased active duty or retired service member may apply for participation in the Navy Relief Guaranteed Student Loan Program to assist in their college education.

Through contributions, Navy Relief continues its 79 year tradition of "Taking Care of Its Own." For further information visit the Kaneohe Branch Office located next to the 7-Day Store or call 254-1327.

## Marine wins Army's 10K race

SCHOFIELD BARRACKS, Hawaii — "This is one of 11 races I have chosen to run this year," said Sergeant Farley Simon after he won the Association of the United States Army 10K Run in record time. His long-range goals include to be "the first Marine to win the Marine Corps Marathon."

Simon, running his first official race of the year, shaved more than one and a half minutes off the old record as he crossed the finish line in 30:48.8.

"It was a beautiful run and a beautiful course," stated the Camp Smith Marine. "I wanted to see how everything was going and to open up the year."

Almost a minute and a half later Corporal Bruce Hall crossed the line second overall. Hall, admitting he had a few problems, explained, "I started with Farley but I felt bad after the first mile and was just trying to keep my legs moving."

The race Sunday was his first for this year.

The Brigade Service Support Group leatherneck continued, "It was a nice run and I was watching Farley to know where the turns were. He was running pretty good pretty smooth."

The first woman to cross the line was 27-year-old Tina Heifbron of the Windward side in 37:14. She commented, "I like to come out here because this is a fast course and a very well organized race. I'm using it as a

tune-up for the Hawaii Women's 10K." More than 1100 runners finished the run but no one came close to the sub five minute miles run by Simon.

"I'm not joking this year," stated Simon, "when I see the line I'm here to race. I'm going to spend the first half of the year getting into the best shape possible and then I'm going to be the first Marine to win the Marine Corps Marathon."

## Book describes involvement during Vietnam

The History and Museums Division, Headquarters Marine Corps has just published "U.S. Marines in Vietnam: An Expanding War, 1966," by Jack Shulimson, the third in a projected 10-volume operational history of the Marine Corps during the Vietnam War. Written from the perspective of the III Marine Amphibious Force, this book describes the Marine Corps experience in Vietnam during 1966 in "an expanding war."

Despite its focus on the ground war in I Corps, the tactical area of responsibility assigned to Marines, the volume also treats the activities of Marine advisors, the Seventh Fleet Special Landing Force, and the Marines on the staff of the U.S. Military

Assistance Command, Vietnam. There are separate chapters on Marine air, artillery, and logistics. An effort has also been made to place the Marine Corps role into the context of the overall war.

The author, Jack Shulimson, the senior Vietnam historian in the History and Museums Division, has been with the division since 1964. He is the author of earlier classified studies and the co-author of the predecessor volume in this series: "U.S. Marines in Vietnam: The Landing and the Buildup, 1965." Shulimson is a graduate of the University of Buffalo and earned a master of arts in history from the University of Michigan. He is, at present, a candidate for a doctoral degree in American Studies at the

University of Maryland.

Based on official records, supplemented by oral histories, private papers, and comments of more than 130 participants, the book is copiously illustrated with 194 contemporary photographs and 34 maps. The appendixes include a command and staff list, footnotes, chronology, glossary, and an index. This volume should be an important addition to the literature on the Vietnam War. Case-bound copies for major libraries can be obtained from Headquarters, United States Marine Corps, Code HD, Washington, D.C. 20380. Individual soft-bound copies can be purchased from the Government Printing Office.

### HEBREW CHRISTIAN TO SPEAK

Rev. Arnold G. Fruchterbaum will be the speaker at Kaneohe  
Congregational Church on Jan. 30 to Feb. 2. Mr.
