Colonel cuts ribbon

New gym opened Friday

The air station's new multi-million dollar gymnasium was opened Friday following a ribbon cutting ceremony by Colonel Charles Robinson, commanding officer, MCAS Kaneohe Bay.

"Of all the facilities on the air station, this is by far the most important," the colonel said before cutting the ribbon. "It will touch more lives and will be a tremendous asset to the Marines, sailors, dependents and visiting teams."

During his address the colonel briefly mentioned the two other facilities dedicated during the week. He said that on March 22 the new Temporary Lodging Facility was opened and the exchange added a Buskin-Robbins ice cream parlor as part of its \$600,000 renovation project.

In his closing remarks, the commanding officer said that he trusted Marines to maintain the new facility and that the old gym

(Hangar 103) would be permanently closed in 30 days.

Lieutenant Colonel David Pedersen, Special Services officer, said that he was pleased contractors finished the \$2,084,800 gym a week early and cited the energy-saving devices that have been installed.

He mentioned the 2,000-gallon hot water system that is totally solar heated, the open air circulation system which is the only one of its kind on the island and numerous skylights which allow use of the basketball court without artificial lighting during the day.

Although the basketball court, the three regulation-size racquetball courts and the locker rooms, including the saunas, are fully operational and are in use, the gym is still awaiting the installation of the wall exercising weights. They too should be installed and operable within a month.

Station XO: "It's one heck of a job"

In a voice that has often been described as friendly and down to earth, with an accent that rings of his Worcester, Mass. heritage, Lieutenant Colonel William Conley, executive officer, Marine Corps Air Station, described his more than 20 years in the Marine Corps.

Conley, a colonel selectee and former Commanding Officer of Station Operations and Maintenance Squadron, has been the Station Executive Officer since Jan. 10.

"I left SOMS reluctantly," said Conley, his piercing blue eyes reflecting mixed emotion. "It's nice to have a command and easier when you're the number one guy." As the new station executive officer however, the lieutenant colonel says it's one heck of a job. "I really like it! I get involved in a myriad of areas such as housing, facilities management and the club and exchange system," he said, "all those things that most Marine Corps officers never get involved in. It's different from normal tactical operations."

Emergency leave regs change

Military members going on emergency leave are now authorized funded commercial transportation, according to a recent message from Headquarters Marine Corps.

A revision to the Joint Travel Regulations went into effect Jan. 1, permitting commanding officers or leave approving authorities to approve funded emergency leave travel via commercial transportation when space required government transportation is not reasonably available.

"The change was authorized by the Per Diem Travel and Transportation Allowance Committee, but it is the responsibility of the commanding general to implement the change at their commands," said Major J. Mushette, Brigade Personnel Officer. "And, it all depends on whether or not MAC transportation is reasonably available."

The policy is for members and command sponsored dependents serving on a permanent duty overseas or members on ships operating outside the United States, and members on ships or in units away from their homeport, or members on temporary duty away from their

permanent duty station, inside and outside the United States.

According to the message, for members and their dependents on permanent duty overseas or members on ships outside the United States, funded commercial transportation may be authorized only in certain circumstances.

These circumstances are emergencies involving spouse, or member's or spouse's parents, and sibling or child whenever circumstances warrant and military situation permits, based upon the judgment of the officer granting leave and the desires of the service member.

The message stated that return transportation may be approved to the overseas international airport from which the members or dependents departed or overseas international airport nearest the member's overseas duty station, homeport, or port being visited by the member's ship.

For members on ships or in units away from their homeport or on temporary duty away from their permanent duty station, inside or outside the United States, funded transportation may only be approved for emergencies involving death, serious injury, or serious illness of a member's dependent.

Cost of transportation, in this

case, is limited to permanent duty station or homeport and return. Transportation may be authorized to an alternate location but may not exceed the cost to homeport or permanent duty station.

Funded emergency leave provides for transportation only. No per diem or miscellaneous expense is authorized, stated the message.

Mushette said that since most family emergencies are time sensitive, swift action on emergency leave requests is essential.

"The Traffic Management Office determines whether or not government transportation is reasonably available and can meet the needs of an individual," he said. "After working hours this determination is made by the Marine Liaison at Hickam Air Force Base. If government air is not reasonably available, only then will the individual be allowed commercial travel."

Mushette explained that if government transportation is not reasonably available, individuals who cannot wait for the proper procedures to acquire commercial travel, may pay their own way on a commercial flight. In this case, they will be reimbursed upon their return.

Off year elections held in three states

While 1983 is an off year for federal elections, the polls will be open in many states to select state and local officials.

Kentucky will hold its primary on May 24 to select candidates for the Nov. 8 election of governor, lieutenant governor, secretary of state and attorney general. Residents of Kentucky may register to vote absentee by completing a federal post card application form (FPCA), which serves as a request for registration, and an absentee ballot should be sent to the county clerk of residence. Registration must be completed at least 30 days before an election. Kentucky law requires submission of an FPCA for each election.

Louisiana residents will elect a governor, lieutenant governor, secretary of state and attorney general Nov. 19. Primary elections are set for Oct. 22. A completed FPCA will serve as a request for a state application for registration and registration certificate. In return, the voter receives a registration certificate number. A request for a ballot may then be made by submitting another FPCA to the clerk of the district court of the voter's parish or residence, or the civil sheriff for the parish of Orleans. Recent changes in Louisiana law require that registration be completed 30 days prior to a primary and 24 days before a general election.

Mississippi will elect a full slate of state officers including governor, supreme court and district judges, senators and representatives during general elections Nov. 8. Primary elections are scheduled for Aug. 24. Citizens of Mississippi may register and vote absentee by mailing their FPCA to the registrar of their city or county requesting an affidavit of registration. The FPCA acts as a request for registration or as an absentee ballot. Registration must be completed 30 days prior to an election.

In addition to these elections, voters may be eligible to vote in other local and special elections. Questions concerning election schedules and absentee voting should be referred to the local unit voting assistance officer. Questions which cannot be answered at the local level may be referred to the Navy Voting Action Officer, Naval Military Personnel Command, Code NMPC-64C, Washington D.C. 20370 or by calling autovon 234-3248 or commercial (202) 694-3248.

Kindergarten pre-registration ends April 8

Pre-registration of kindergarten students for the 1983-84 school year at Mokapu School will be held from March 28 to April 8.

Kindergarten attendance is not required, but any child who is 5 years old as of Dec. 31 is eligible to enroll in kindergarten for the 1983-84 school year.

Parents are required to bring a birth certificate, quarters assignment from the air station Family Housing Office, verifying that base housing will be provided within 90 days, and a Hawaii school health record at the time of registration.

The health record is required to verify that a physical examination and tuberculin test or x-ray were completed within a year before school entrance and that all immunization requirements are met.

It is important that all new entrants show proof of freedom from communicable tuberculosis. No child will be admitted to the school without this proof.

A signed statement from a doctor verifying that the child is in the process of completing the health requirements is acceptable. The law allows a child 90 days to complete all the health requirements with the exception of the tuberculin test.

It is also required that all parents complete the state registration form SIS-10 at the time of registration.

A student is officially enrolled and assigned to a class only after all registration requirements are met.





Wool scarf

The Marine Corps Uniform Board recently approved a new green wool scarf for optional purchase and wear by all Marines, according to a recent message from Headquarters Marine Corps.

The red wool scarf for women and the

tissue faille green scarf for men are no longer authorized.

The message stated that during the winter, Marines may wear the new scarf when an overcoat is worn with the service or utility uniform, at the option of the individual. It cannot be worn with the service uniform without an overcoat, but commanders may prescribe it for wear with the utility uniform, in the field, as a component of cold weather training.


"When worn, the scarf must be

overlapped to form a "vee" at the base of the throat, hiding the garment beneath.

Limited quantities of the scarf are available through retail clothing outlets and military clothing sales stores. The scarf costs \$4.91.

Commandant addresses committee on state of Corps, future

EDITOR'S NOTE — The following article is the third of a four part series of the statement on Marine Corps posture, plans and programs for FY1984 through 1988 addressed to the House Armed Services Committee by General Robert H. Barrow, Commandant of the Marine Corps.

Marine Corps requirements to lift the war-fighting equipment and supplies of the assault follow-on echelon (AFOE) have grown with the overall growth of our MAGTF's combat power which, in turn, has been necessarily increased to counter the growing threat of the modern battlefield. With the growth in the assault echelon limited by the availability of amphibious shipping, the AFOE has had to accommodate a larger share of this expansion. Increasing lift requirements for the AFOE have, unfortunately, coincided with a decrease in the numbers of those ships (break bulk, self-sustaining) which have traditionally been utilized to lift that echelon. As the U.S. merchant fleet is moving toward greater numbers of non-self-sustaining container ships, we are moving to similarly configure our logistic pipeline to capitalize on this trend. In that regard, the Navy is planning to acquire Auxiliary Crane Ships (TACS) for in-stream off-load of the newer ships. The challenge posed by the expanded AFOE lies in the coordination required to get a significant number of different types of merchant ships at the appropriate ports in time to embark and sail in short order. The satisfactory solution to this entire equation will require a strong Merchant Marine and our continued coordination with the Military Sealift Command and the Navy.

The momentum of our combat service support enhancement program, initiated during September 1981 through modernization programs, acquisition of new equipment, and manpower and management initiatives, continues on a steady course. Fleet Marine Force Commanders activated ten cadred units in FY82 and will activate five more in FY83 to restore the full spectrum of functional combat service support capabilities we require. The activations include the areas of rations, landing support operations, fuel, bridge, engineer, and maintenance support — all of which are vital to sustaining the landing force ashore.

Field logistics system

Implementation of the Marine Corps' Field Logistics System (FLS) continues to be of vital necessity for our sustainability and survivability on today's battlefield. Through FLS, we have begun to replace obsolete equipment and simultaneously improving combat service support. Full implementation is anticipated by FY90.

The FLS in combination with the Navy Amphibious Logistics System forms the

Navy/Marine Corps Amphibious Logistics Support Ashore program and will result in equipment savings due to commonality of equipment and repair parts support, increased use of commercial items, decreased training requirements, and improved effectiveness. FLS is designed around international dimensional standards in order to be able to use all modes of transportation, especially the container-capable merchant fleet.

This system, combined with the aforementioned combat service support enhancement initiatives, represents significant improvements which will provide the Marine Corps with a new dimension in logistics support capabilities and will considerably enhance our Fleet Marine Force sustainability and combat readiness posture.

Medical support

I'll turn now to an area that causes me considerable concern — medical support. Amphibious operations in a high intensity environment will involve large numbers of casualties requiring immediate treatment and surgery. Under most contingency scenarios, the bed capacities and surgical capabilities found in the amphibious task force and landing force units would be overwhelmed early in the engagement. To correct this deficiency, I consider it imperative that continued emphasis be placed on the Navy's development of the Fleet Hospital program and the Hospital Ship program. The Navy's Rapidly Deployable Medical

Facility, with a 1000-bed capacity, is scheduled for implementation in June, 1983. This is positive start. The Navy Fleet Hospital program will provide 11,250 beds configured in 250, 500, and 1000-bed field hospitals to help resolve the critical shortage of in-theater medical support. The Marine Corps applauds the Fleet Hospital program; however, the global mission of our Corps requires the flexibility of sea-going medical support. Hospital ships, on-station with the amphibious task force, are required to deal with Marine and Navy casualties requiring immediate treatment before the beachhead is secure enough to implement a field hospital. During World War II, the Navy had 13 Hospital Ships. Today there are none and the need is critical.

Manpower



Up to this point, I have directed my remarks to the programs and equipment that will enhance, modernize, and maintain the deployability, combat readiness, and sustainability of the Marine Corps. The program I will now discuss, manpower, is the Marine Corps. It is my number one priority.

By the end of FY84, our manpower program calls for an end strength of 197,300 — an increase of 2,700 over the FY83 level. The requirement for additional personnel is primarily tied to the weapons and equipment modernization and enhancement programs I have previously discussed. However, not all new weapons and equipment require more Marines. As mentioned, weapons and equipment additions to the infantry structure are allowing us to reorganize into smaller infantry battalions with greater firepower. The net result of our structural and manpower changes will permit us to increase manning levels slightly throughout the active force structure. Examples of specific increases which will be generated by our FY84 manpower program include the reactivation of certain combat service support units, the activation of a Light Armored Vehicle unit, the reorganization of our artillery regiments, and the addition of Light Anti-aircraft Missile batteries.


Quality personnel, in sufficient numbers, remain the key to maintaining the readiness and combat capabilities of Marine operating forces. We continue to meet our accession requirements in both quality and quantity. Eighty-five percent of our FY82 non-prior service accessions were high school graduates. More than 90 percent of those individuals were in the top three Armed Forces Qualification Test (AFQT) categories as measured by the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB). In accordance with

Congressional direction, all AFQT Category IVs are high school graduates. These recruiting accomplishments are particularly significant because they were made under the renowned ASVAB test, which corrected the tendency in previous tests to overstate an applicant's mental ability. Quality, rather than numbers, will continue to be the driving force in establishing our recruiting goals.

Our success in recruiting quality Marines in the past few years has been achieved, in part, by assigning our very best Marines to recruiting duty — one of the most demanding and difficult peacetime assignments. We are committed to this effort and intend to continue this policy. We will be similarly selective in the assignment of instructors to the recruit depots and other training establishments. I am convinced that this near-term investment in recruiting and training will result in long-term benefits to the Marine Corps. The number of Marines assigned recruiter and instructor duties meets the minimum requirements to accomplish these important tasks, and I urge your continued support for the recruiting and training overhead levels requested.

Reenlistment of proven, quality Marines is another key part of our manpower program. During FY82, 15,051 Marines reenlisted. Our continuing emphasis on quality, the general state of the economy, and the improving national attitude toward military service has contributed to an excellent reenlistment year.

After many years as an active infantry officer, Esau is now chief of staff for the 1st Marine Brigade. He has held that position since June last year, and considers the assignment an opportunity to expand his horizons, and pass on some of his expertise to unit commanders and staff officers within the brigade.

A cigar smoker, with one always available, Esau's stern, rugged, no-nonsense features contradict his charismatic demeanor. He has the reputation of remaining calm and flexible in crises and, as he quips in an east coast accent, "I grew up in New York City. Anyone who can survive that is not easily rattled."

That brand of humor is one of his useful methods of putting people at ease. But he seriously attributes his steadiness to 25 years of seeing all there is to see.

Seated at his desk — with his ever-present cigar in hand — "the chief" talks openly about his transition from commander to staff officer, his past, and a subject he is well-versed in, leadership.

"When you're a commander you're responsible for everything that happens or doesn't happen within your command," he said,

"and when you're the chief of staff, your responsibilities are to see that the commanding general's policies are carried out, and to assist commanders in their efforts to accomplish the brigade's mission."

"I'm the right hand man of the brigade commander. I'm responsible for molding the (headquarters) staff into a cohesive unit. If the staff does its job and takes care of the administrative matters, the commander is free to get out and do all those things a commander would like to do," he explained.

This assignment marks the first time the colonel has worked closely with a permanent air-ground unit. He said it has been a learning experience as he is becoming involved in the "nitty gritty" of Marine Corps aviation. He now understands more about the logistics behind putting planes and helicopters in the air, and realizes that they "don't just appear magically when they're needed."

Reflecting back 25 years ago, Esau said he was playing baseball for Manhattan College in New York where, as a pitcher with an arm like a cannon, but who never new where the ball was going once it left his hand, he was offered a contract by the Cincinnati Reds. He opted to

finish school, but he was certain to be drafted into the Armed Forces.

The Army promised he could play baseball — as a private. The corps, however, proposed a better deal: if qualified, he could play baseball, and have a commission in the reserves. He signed.

After a while, Esau decided that being a platoon commander was more challenging, and he abandoned thoughts of pro baseball to devote more time to his charges. "I enjoyed being with my platoon more than I enjoyed chasing a little white ball," he said.

He applied for augmentation into the regular Marine Corps and was accepted. From there, then First Lieutenant Esau embarked upon a career voyage that took him across many seas, touching many shores.

His career took him to various commands, stateside and abroad: the Mediterranean, as operation officer for Battalion Landing Team 3d Battalion, 2d Marines; the United Kingdom, where he was an assistant naval attaché in London; aboard the USS Shangri La, as a detachment executive officer; New York City, N.Y., where he selected officers, and Quantico, Va., where he trained them.

Of all the places he has been, he said that the Republic of Vietnam was his most memorable tour of duty. "Vietnam gave me the opportunity to use all those years of training."

"My job was to plan the operations my men (2d Battalion, 5th Marines) executed, and we did it without needlessly endangering their lives. It was the best and worst of times," he recalled. Esau went to Vietnam a second time, only as a non-combatant. He was assigned to the Joint Casualty Resolution Center to search for missing American servicemen.

He became a hero while in Vietnam, but he prefers not to look at it that way, or discuss the circumstances. According to him, it was just a matter of being with a unit that saw lots of action.

Returning his thoughts to the present, the chief commented on the younger Marines today, compared to the youthful leathernecks of 25 years ago. He feels the average Marine of this era is better educated and has a grasp for world affairs, but succumbs more to peer pressure involving drugs and alcohol. In spite of that, his faith in the younger Marine remains strong.

"I've led young Marines into combat, and I can say that they were unbeatable. That was years ago, but there is no big difference between the Marines then and the youngsters we lead today. Properly led, they'll do wondrous things," he declared.

The chief also addressed the role of the staff noncommissioned officer, a subject to which he warms. "There seems to be a problem in the Corps where the staff NCO is sometimes underutilized," he said. He elaborated that the "problem" stems from the '60s when many staff NCOs were commissioned and as officers, began doing things that were within the scope of their replacements.

He said many young staff NCOs were not given a chance to prove themselves, and lacked

the support necessary to do their jobs. "Unfortunately," he continued, "others proved incapable of meeting the challenge."

He advocates restoring to them the authority they had, as he remembers it, when he came into the Corps. He said staff NCOs are the ones through whom officers must work because they have everyday contact with junior enlisted Marines who confide to them things they would never tell an officer.

"The staff NCO, to me, is very important indeed. If he is capable and not used properly by the hierarchy, then the unit suffers accordingly," he strongly emphasized, "and without professional staff NCO leadership, the Corps can't function." The colonel added that staff NCOs and junior officers must learn to trust and respect each other's knowledge and experience, and work as a team and that the staff NCO should never lose sight that the officer is the responsible person. "With that kind of relationship, wonderful things happen," he commented.

Col Esau predicts fruitful happenings for the brigade, which he feels is the cutting edge of the Fleet Marine Force. He said the brigade is qualified to carry out any mission it is assigned.

He plans to become even further enmeshed in

the finer points of his staff position, assisting the commanding general and unit commanders.

Although he considers himself to be 423 steps behind what he was 25 years ago, he still remains active in sports. "I'm a sports nut. I love all sports, but fishing is my favorite. It's the most relaxing sport there is," he said.

He has not forsaken the sport that lured him into the Corps, only now he favors slowpitch softball. "It gives an old campaigner like me a chance to compete with the younger Marines. I play with youngsters who weren't even born when I came to Hawaii in 1959 to play in the All-Marine Baseball Tournament. But I think they enjoy having the old man out there, with all his aches and pains. It seems today I run in one place a lot."

In retrospect, the chief said he is happy with the route he has followed. "I've had a very fulfilling life. I'm one of the few people I know who is doing exactly what the Good Lord meant for him to do."

"My only regret is that those 25 years are behind me, and there are only about four years ahead of me before I may be asked to retire — and go fishing. I'm not so sure I'm ready for that yet."

Security conducts random inspections

The Security Department will be conducting random inspections of commercial and privately owned vehicles at various checkpoints on the air station.

"The purpose of the inspections are to insure that all drivers have a valid drivers license, current registration, and proof of insurance in their possession," said Captain T.P. Carter, Operations Officer, Security Department. "In addition all military and civilian personnel must have a valid Department of

Defense decal."

Motorcycles and mopeds are also subject to inspection. Motorcycle operators must have a green safety card in their possession.

"Persons who have a car with an obvious safety violation will be given five days to correct the problem," said Staff Sergeant Donnie Young, Chief of Accident Investigation.

The inspections will be conducted periodically throughout 1983.







year later, he switched to the Marine Corps Reserves and was promoted to corporal before receiving his commission through the Platoon Leaders Course in 1961.

"I think I've always wanted to be an officer in the Marine Corps," said Conley in an authoritative voice that helped to get him where he is today. "My goal was to graduate from college so I could be an officer." A graduate of the Worcester State Teachers College in Massachusetts, Conley majored in social studies and minored in math and science.

His first assignment took him aboard the USS Long Beach where he served as the executive officer for the Marine Detachment. He attended flight training at Pensacola, Fla., from 1966 to 1967 before reporting to Vietnam to fly with Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron 463 and Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron 163 until 1968. After attending the Amphibious Warfare School in 1970 he went through the transition from rotary wing to fixed wing aircraft at Marine Corps Air Station, Yuma, Ariz.

While at Yuma, Conley served as the maintenance officer for both Marine Attack Squadrons 223 and 214 before transferring to Iwakuni in 1972 to serve as the executive officer for Headquarters and Maintenance

Squadron 12. During his tour with H&MS-12, he served as the officer-in-charge of H&MS-12, Forward in Vietnam.

After his second tour in Vietnam, Conley reported to Training Wing 2 in Kingsville, Texas. There he served as the operations officer for the Wing and Navy Training Squadron 21. During his three years there he also served as an instructor on the A-4 Skyhawk.

From 1976 to 1977, Conley attended the Army Command General Staff School at Fort Leavenworth, Kan. where he made the Dean's List. Upon graduation, he moved close to home to serve as the executive officer for Detachment A, Marine Aircraft Group 49, a reserve unit out of Naval Air Station South Weymouth, Mass.

Before arriving in Hawaii, Conley worked as the G-4 plans officer and later as the assistant G-4 for the 3d Marine Division on Okinawa.

"They've all been good tours, but I especially liked my two combat tours," he said, "only because I did a lot of flying and I got to do what I was trained to do. But I really believe my best tour has been right here in Hawaii.

"I don't know what my next assignment will be," said Conley, "but I'll do whatever the Marine Corps tells me to do and go wherever the

Marine Corps sends me. I'd like to command a MAG somewhere," he added.

As the station executive officer, Conley feels that the Marine Corps' emphasis on drugs and alcohol is long overdue. "The regulations have always been there," he said sternly, "now we have more vehicles available to us to get rid of the abusers."

Weight and personal appearance standards are also aspects that are high on the executive officer's list. A softball player himself, Conley feels that one of the ways to keep people away from drugs is to keep them physically fit. "They go hand in hand. If you have an interest in health and physical fitness, you'll stay away from the substances."

The executive officer's decorations include 28 awards of the Air Medal, two Navy Commendation Medals with Combat "V", the Combat Action Ribbon and the Humanitarian Service Medal.

Conley and his wife, Kathleen, have five children, Annemarie, 20; William, Jr., 18; Sean, 17; Michael, 13; and Katy, 11. When asked if he would encourage his children to join the Marine Corps, Conley was only slightly hesitant. "I would encourage them to join any service they desire," he said, "but I would be proud if they joined the Marine Corps."

Intelligence Brief

The prototype of this military helicopter was first shown in public in the Soviet Aviation Day flypast over Tushino Airport, Moscow, in July 1981. The Ka-25 is powered by two small turboshaft engines mounted side by side above the cabin, and this has left the cabin space clear for personnel, operational equipment, fuel and payload.

In its anti-submarine version, the Ka-25 operates from ships of the Soviet Navy, including cruisers of the Kresta and Kara classes, and the helicopter carrier/cruisers Moskva and Leningrad, each of which accommodates the 20 aircraft. It has a search radar installation in a pod under the nose. Other equipment includes a towed magnetic anomaly detector, dipping sonar housed in a compartment at the rear of the cabin, and an electro-optical sensor.

Recognition features: Two three-bladed, coaxial main rotors which are counter-rotating; no tail rotor; double engine nacelles above cabin; four-point, nonretractable landing gear; three vertical fins on horizontal stabilizer mounted on tail boom; mounts MAD gear, capable of employing a variety of weapons and systems such as torpedoes, depth bombs, and sonobuoys.



Veterinarian to change hats

Dog doctor says 'Aloha' Hawaii

Framed behind the receptionist's desk is a picture of a white, shaggy, mixed-breed dog sitting at a tastefully set table. A large vase of daisies, a bottle of wine, a long-stem wine glass, and a thick, juicy steak is set before him. The caption below the picture states, "If you think your dog is stupid, remember who is supporting him."

This picture will probably hang in the air station's veterinarian's office for years to come and bring countless smiles to pet owners. However, Air Force Major William S. Johnson is ready to pull the nails from his veterinarian shingle and put up a new one that reads Environmental Health Officer.

Johnson, the last practicing Air Force veterinarian in Hawaii, is scheduled for a tour of duty at Homestead, Fla., where he will not be working with animals. His tour as a veterinarian here ends in April.

Air Force veterinarians will be phased out by Oct. 1 and replaced with Army veterinarians to provide a more economical operation, according to Johnson.

While stationed here, Johnson has worked with marine mammals at the Naval Ocean Systems Center. Most of his afternoons have been spent at the Zoonosis Clinic, next to the housing office. "My primary purpose at the clinic is to ensure the health and safety of the human population by treating animals with contagious disease," explained the Indiana native.

Although contagious diseases are treated at the clinic, other illnesses or injuries are referred to clinics in the civilian community. Routine shots are also given at the clinic.

"I've experienced special satisfaction in treating animals and seeing the results of my work," Johnson said while adjusting his wire-rimmed glasses.

"I've thoroughly enjoyed being stationed with the Marines. If I had not gone into the veterinary service, I

would have become a Marine Corps officer," he said.

Although the humorous picture in his office will remain, Johnson will carry some laughs with him to Florida. The humor was provided by the owners of his patients.

"Once, a lady brought in her dog to have it spayed and it turned out to be a male," the doctor said with a smile. "Another time, a man brought in his cat named Kate. Kate was a male, but the owner didn't realize it until I told him."


