# Leathernecks draw Beirut sniper fire

In the most recent hostilities in Lebanon (Sunday), another guerrillas and wounded about 10 Marine was killed and three others wounded in attacks on their position, according to a Combined News Service story in Monday's Honolulu Advertiser.

Major Robert Jordan, Marine spokesman, said the Marines fired and M-60 machine-gun fire in response to the attacks from a Moslem slum, the story reported.

The casualties reportedly came during a brief burst of fire from rocket-propelled grenades and rifle fire beginning at about 7:12 p.m. The Advertiser's CNS story reported that Jordan added that Marines were still coming under

fire (Sunday) at about midnight. Since being in Lebanon as a peacekeeping force, the story continued, eight Marines have been killed and more than 50 have been wounded.

The News Service story reported that six Marines were killed in fighting, one died in the April bombing of the U.S. Embassy in Beirut, and one was killed in an accident last year.

The Associated Press reported last week that the Vietnam-era-War Powers Act was put into effect for the first time ever, as President Reagan signed legislation authorizing U.S. Marines to stay in Lebanon another 18 months.

# PMO launches door-to-door property identification campaign

There were 381 larcenies and housebreakings reported to the Provost Marshal's Office during the first nine months of this year. totaling more than \$100,000 in stolen property.

And that doesn't even include the value of stolen automobiles.

The unfortunate aspect of these crimes is that 89 percent were unsecured, and only 2 percent of the stolen property was marked for identification, according to Sergeant James Muhlenkamp, head of the crime prevention unit at PMO.

Stereos, television sets, cameras, video recording equipment, home computers. mopeds, bicycles, home appliances and other valuable items should be marked for positive. identification. The best way to mark them is with an engraving

The Provost Marshal's Office is mounting a campaign to give everyone here a chance to have their valuables marked.

Operation Identification is a

massive undertaking that is scheduled to last several weeks. A team of military policemen will go door-to-door to mark valuables for residents in station housing and barracks quarters.

The engraving team will tackle Marine Aircraft Group-24's barracks Oct. 31 through Nov. 12, with the regimental barracks scheduled for Nov. 14-26. Station housing and the remaining barracks are scheduled for Nov. 28 through Dec. 17.

Muhlenkamp urges residents to call for an appointment if they can't be home during the scheduled times. The phone number to call is 257-3425.

"Most crimes are crimes of opportunity," Muhlenkamp said, and the most effective crime prevention methods are securing valuables and marking them for identification.

Once an item is marked, Muhlenkamp urges people to list the location and type of marking. and to keep the list in a safe. separate location.

"Mopeds and currency are the two most common high-theft items here." Muhlenkamp suid And currency is easier to safeguard in a locked wall container, or in the form of travelers' checks and money orders that are replaceable if lost or stolen.

Mopeds should be locked in the same manner as bicycles: secured with a chain and locked to an immovable object such as a telephone pole, bike rack, etc

Crime prevention is not taken lightly here, and a Crime Prevention Board meets quarterly to discuss ways to improve crime prevention measures and to further the military community's awareness of these measures.

The board consists of the Provost Marshal, Criminal Investigative Division officer, Provost Sergeant, station and brigade sergeants major and Sgt Muhlenkamp.



# Birds bomb hangars

The birds are "do-ocoing" it up in hangars 101 and 105 aboard the air station here. This is costing more than 5,000 man-hours a year to clean up, according to Dennis Pang, environmental specialist here.

'Feral pigeons, mynahs and sparrows are the primary problem birds roosting on the rafters of these hangars," said Pang. "Most of the birds are residents of this air station because food, water and shelter are readily available."

The bird problem is now at the point where damage from the corrosive effect of their droppings is becoming an aircraft safety

In addition to the aircraft corrosion problem, anything left under the bird roosting sites is quickly rendered less than sanitary and poses a potential health hazard to all personnel.

"Marines and civilian workers here have a fondness for the birds and take it upon themselves to care for them," said Pang. "One way to reduce the problem is to take away one of the essential factors, which is free handouts," he added.

"In an effort to reduce the problem, the feeding of these birds must cease," he emphasized.

Families study stress, violence, abuse

A Family Advocacy Awareness Workshop was held recently at the Hilton Hawaiian Village. It was sponsored by the Family Service Center here to obtain visibility for the Family Advocacy Project. Its focus was family violence.

Opening remarks at the workshop were made by Brigadier General Orlo K. Steele, Commanding General, 1st Marine Brigade. "Approximately 22,000 of today's Marines are married and most are in the lower pay grades," said the general. "In Hawaii, 16 percent of the population is military connected but 50 percent of abuse cases are military related."

A slide show by Jane Phillips, director of the Family Advocacy Project followed the general's remarks. These slides demonstrated child abuse such as broken limbs and burns.

The audience was then asked their opinion of the slides by Shelly Asso, coordinator, Region IX, Resource Center. Responses ranged from "terrifying" to "grotesque,"

The audience was then usked to close their eyes and visualize what an abuser looks like. Asao commented that one high school student pictured a green-eyed monster with a notebook as an abuser. The monster would wait for everyone to go to sleep and then write what he was going to do and to whom.

"But an abuser does not have to be a green-eyed moster. Everyone

has the potential to be an abuser,"

The audience then filled a drawn circle with things that are needed for a normal life. The circle was filled with ideas for a wellbalanced life including love, independence, acceptance. touching and understanding.

When these things are taken away, one is left with emptiness and negative feelings, according to Asao. Independence is replaced with dependence, acceptance with rejection, touching with withdrawal, and understanding with hostility and confusion. An abuser's life seems to be full of negative vibrations.

"We all have our up-and-down days, but abusive people always have down days," said Asau.

There are several things that lead to being an abusive person. According to the Family Advocacy Project, abusers come from all classes, ages, races, socioeconomic groups, occupations, religions and profiles.

"The command will not tolerate spouse or child abuse," said Colonel Richard H. Esau Jr., then the chief of staff, 1st Marine Brigade. "The person who goes around with enough anger and rage to beat his wife or children

Show ID card for DEERS

Last week's article on the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System stated that DEERS would eliminate the "use of military identification cards as the primary proof of eligibility at military health care facilities, Oct. 1. The headline "DEERS halts ID card checks" may have created some confusion. Military ID cards have been eliminated as the PRIMARY proof for DEERS elilgibility. Rather than relying SOLEY on military ID cards, which may contain out-of-date or incorrect information, military health care facilities are determining eligibility of military dependents from computerized sponsor (member) enrollment records from the DEERS data base. However, ID cards are still needed.

Tuition Assistance Program limited

The article "SecDef limits scope of tuition assistance", which was published in last week's issue of the Hawaii Marine, caused Major Jack Templeton, Joint Education Officer here, to drop by with updated information. Although the article was directed at Navy personnel, it could cause some confusion for Marines, the major said. The article states that "Since Oct. 1, tuition assistance is granted only to active duty service members who are not eligible for Vietnam-era, or "old" GI Bill education benefits. That's not true for Marines, Templeton said. Marines are authorized use of tuition assistance even though they're still eligible for the GI bill education benefits. Joint Education's policy is that it's up to the individual as to which is used.

"If an individual is eligible for the old GI Bill education benefits and is getting out in a year," explained Sergeant Glen Hall, Joint Education, 'we recommend that he or she use tuition assistance for that year and use the GI Bill upon leaving the service, However, if a person is eligible and is staying in for a long time, we recommend that the GI Bill be used, because funds are limited for the tuition assistance program. But, the bottom line is that it's up to the individual Marine."

WASHINGTON, D.C. (NES) — Electricity, since the day Ben Franklin's famous kite and key made history, has made our lives easier and more convenient. But, like the automobile, it has also claimed lives through carelessness and

According to the Consummer Product Safety Commission, there are more than 5,200 fires, 250 injuries and 60 fatalities annually associated with portable household electrical appliances. The severity of these accidents ranged from cuts from blades of a blender to destroyed homes. Some injuries resulted from product misuse while others occurred because of malfunction or design defect.

-A young girl was taking a bath when a hair dryer, turned off but still plugged into the outlet, fell into the water. She was electrocuted, even though the bair dryer was in the off position.

-An elderly man, using a hair dryer while standing on a wet ceramic tile floor, was found dead from electric shock. The victim of exit burn marks on the soles of his feet. His pacemaker was stopped by the current,

-A teenager, rushing to get to school, threw a hair dryer on her bed. The switch was off, but it was still plugged in. A malfunction occurred, and a fire resulted.

Think Safety: If it's powered by electricity, be aware of its dangers. Take the proper precautions; unplug it and live.



# Excessive drinking assaults Marine Corps preparedness

Alcohol use presents some unique problems. Drinking alcoholic beverages has been practiced for thiosaire of years and is socially receptable. It is the basis for many social activities. The danger of drinking is that alcohol has some very specific physical and mental effects on the lady. It is, when these effects become pronounced and out of the control of the individual, that drinking becomes a problem.

becomes a problem.

In fact, it takes surprisingly little drinking to become drank. For the average Marine weighing 140, to be considered impaired (drank) in both the legal and medical sense, you only need to have two drinks (two 12 m. here, you neemed mad drinks or two heers, two normal mixed drinks, or two too does glasses of wine) within a one hour period. If the individual weighs as much as 200 this limit is only raised to three drinks. This presents quite a problem for someone who wishes to drink but not become drunk.

Excessive drinking conducts a

Excessive drinking produces a supheric effect, making you feel good and affecting your judgement. Any other impairment of abilities then becomes unnoticeable. It becomes, up to a point, a vicious circle the more you drink, the better you feel, the more impaired you become, and the more you drink. The abilities that are impaired are, in addition to judgement, reaction time, vision, speech, balance and coordination, and finally conaciousness. As a matter of

Drinking does not make you a fun person nor does it make you a natural socializer. As a matter of fact, it dolls the senses. The more you drink the less potential there is for any meaningful conversation.

Our consumer society has facini the problem with commercials that promise many things if you'll just have a drink. We listen to (and believe) commercials which tell us that drinking is the relaxing thing to do after a hard day's work, drinking is fun, its dedicated to you, or that it is a sigh iff success in order to sell their products advertisers recipier up products advertisers conjure up pleaseant images: evenings ending by a fireplace after a day of skiing, a day in the sun up a traplical beach, stopping to releas with good food after a long fishing trip, or a large and expensive house you're finally able to afford. It's billed as the romantic, friendly, releasing thing to do. Drinking, if not controlled, can also be embarrassing, destructive, and all consuming. However, we don't consuming. However, we don't respond to the logic of the situation, we

There are many things drinkers do to counter the problem of drunkenness that are not effective but widely accepted and commonly used. Some people eat raw eggs or drink salad oil before a party to prevent getting drunk ill doesn't work. Some rooms. getting drunk til domn't work). Some people think that drinking loss our strong black coffee will suber them up. It won't. It will, however, make you n meer alert drunk. The same thing applies to cold showers, fresh air, and slapping yourself in the face. The unly thing that subers you up is time. Time for the body to get the alcohol out of your blood and break it down.

Obviously, prohibiting alcoholic beverages isn't the answer. It didn't work in 1920 and I doubt it will work in 1920 and I doubt it will work now. I'm not advocating closing the clube or not allowing drinking at official activities. What I am advocating is teaching responsible drinking habits. Maybe if Marines know what responsible drinking is, he or she can practice it. The real answer lies within each individual: knowing lies within each individual; knowing the limit and when to stop or slow down. In some cases it may lie with friends lieling courageous emough and friend enough to stop another Marine from hurting himself or herself. It is not only necessary, but is in heading

not only necessary, but is in keeping with the tradition of "taking care of our own."

Remember, it is not mucho to drink irresponsibly. It is stupid, expensive, and sometimes very westeful, even fatal. If every Marine learns those learns those learns to the contract of lessons, we will not only be better, but more combat ready as well.



# Marines 'pig out' on giant hoagy

It was pig-out time at the Windward Enlisted Club when several hundred people devoured what was touted as the world's largest hoagy Sept. 17.

The 200-foot sandwich received rave reviews as it disappeared piece by piece.

Sept. 17.

"This is great," commented

Sergeant Charles Perry, Headquarters Company, 3d Marines. "The biggest one I'd ever seen before was 6 feet long.

His eyes could easily see more than his tummy could hold, as the world-class hoagy was more than 33 times larger than the "giant" one he remembered.

The idea for a 2,400-inch sandwich came from the club's manager, Staff Sergeant Keith Ward. He read about the Air Force's record-setting 113-footer and knew he and his crew could easily double that.

But 113 doubled is more than 200, right? This hoagy was just for practice," Ward said. He and his three-man crew will attempt to wipe out the Air Force's record in late November with a 240-plus foot sandwich.

"Ive contacted the Guinness (Book of World Records) people and spoke with representatives of Real People about our next sandwich, but I haven't received any confirmations yet," Ward said. He also explained that they plan to build the monster feast in five minutes.

The first sandwich took six people 15 minutes to construct at a cost of \$468.35. It took 135 loaves of bread and more than 350 pounds of ingredients to complete.

When the leathernecks cut down the Air Force's record with a 250foot hoagy, the Air Force may look for revenge. But to double the Marines' upcoming effort they'll have to rent a football field. The sandwich would have to be long enough to go from goal line to goal line, then double back to the 33yard line - from each end.

# Corps shoots Marine to Olympic gold

Camp Pendleton, Calif. - "It's not the fact of winning so much. It's the fact that personally, you've tried your best." - First Lieutenant Billy Mills, United States Marine Corps, October

Almost 19 years have passed since former Marine and Olympic Gold Medalist Billy Mills made that statement. He still believes it

Mills, an Oglala Sioux Indian. first gained prominence at the 1964 Tokyo Olympics. He is the only American to win an Olympic gold medal in the 10,000 meter run. While training for the Olympics, he was a motor transport officer assigned to 1st FSR (now 1st FSSG) at Camp Pendleton. Mills was in the area recently as featured speaker for a March of Dimes breakfast benefit held in Mission Valley. He also paid a visit to Camp Pendleton and reminisced about his days as a Marine and Olympian.

"I once ran a 4:03 mile on this track," Mills said to his wife Patricia and Duke Karnoscak, another former Marine and representative of the March of

11 Area track where Mills had spent endless hours preparing for the Olympics. While at the track, he met with members of the All-Marine track team currently training here for the Interservice championships. The All-Marine tracksters listened intently as Mills described some of his running exploits. They cheered and applauded after hearing a tape of the actual boardcast of the 10,000 meter Olympic final in Tokyo.

A blow-by-blow description was also recorded in the Oct. 16, 1964 edition of the Camp Pendleton Scout. "As they rounded the final turn, they were neck-and-neck. The immense crowd was on its feet roaring.

"Coming out of the turn. Gammoudi's name was on everyone's lips. He had surged out three full yards ahead of the world-record holder Clarke. Mills was in third place a yard behind

"On the NBC film coverage of the event, Bud Palmer is describing Gammoudi's winning push to the finish line when out of the background, someone screams

Dimes as they strolled along the Agh-h-h! Look at Mills! Look at

"Mills seemed to shift into a, completely different gear ratio and streaked past the other two runners just in time to break the tape first for an historic American

Mills' winning time was 28:24.4, then an Olympic record. He had outrun two of the finest 10,000 meter runners ever, Mohammed Gammoudi of Tunisia (silver medalist) and Ron Clarke of Australia (bronze medalist).

"The height of competition is not competition against each other," Mills explained. "When I won the gold medal the real win was to be able to compete with myself and my feelings of inferiority. I competed with and beat myself."

"I've seen films of that race many times," claimed a starstruck Farley Simon, 10,000 meter specialist with the All-Marine team. "It was an outstanding race. I was thrilled when I found out we were going to meet Billy Mills. He still holds the Marine Corps record for 10,000 meters so he's a hero of

During Mills' visit he also renewed old acquaintances with Les Lavelle who was athletic Billy is played by Robby Benson," director of Marine Corps Base, she explained. "It deals with his director of Marine Corps Base, Camp Pendleton in 1964 and Jack Gabrels, the assistant athletic

"I remember Billy was a very pleasant, modest young man," said Gabrels, "We had a marathoner here in 1964 by the name of Captain Alex Breckinridge who was trying to make the Olympic marathon team. The top two finishers of the Western Hemisphere Marathon held in Culver City, Calif., were going to the Olympics. Mills decided he would run. He ended up finishing a close second to Peter McArdle and won an Olympic berth. It was his first marathon. Two weeks later, he qualified for the Olympics again at 10,000 meters."

"I recieved a letter from Will Cloney, who was director of the Boston Marathon at the time. He suggested I give up my spot on the marathon team to another runner considered better qualified and just run the 10,000 meters. I ran the marathon anyway and finished 14th," Mills recalled.

Patricia Mills mentioned an upcoming film based on her husband's life. "The movie is called 'Running Brave' and


early life on an Indian Reservation in South Dakota, his collegiate days at the University of Kansas and his time in the Marine Corps leading right up to the Olympics. Filming is complete and we expect the movie to be ready for release by November."

Mills left the Marine Corps in December 1965. He retired from athletic competition in 1971 after being plagued by back and foot problems. He still jogs and occasionally participates in fun-runs. Since leaving the Corps, he has devoted his time and energies toward a myriad of activities.

Of particular interest to Mills is the Billy Mills Indian Youth Leadership Program. The program is designed to develop effective, aggressive young Indian leaders for the future.

Asked what influence the Marine Corps has had on his personal development, the former leatherneck's reply was blunt The Marine Corps taught me to believe in myself, to have pride in myself. I would have never won a gold medal if I hadn't been in the Marine Corps."

"Last year, my feat was taken as a joke. This time it's serious business. I'm ready and I'm going to make it!"

These are the words spoken by a determined Lance Corporal Glen Taylor, Weapons Company, 1st Battalion, 3d Marines, who will attempt to successfully complete a 24-hour run to commemorate the Marine Corps' 208th

Taylor, 26, a veteran of this event, has attempted this feat three times. "I won my first race totalling 146 miles during the Belgrave Harrier 24-hour run held at the Crystal Palace in London, in September 1981," said Taylor. "My second attempt in January 1982, I dropped out of the run at mile 70 due to leg problems."

On his third attempt last November, Taylor ran 86 miles in 16 hours and was forced to stop because of leg problems and improper training. "There're a couple of reasons I failed last

year," said Taylor. "For one, I tried to do it with only two weeks of preparation, and secondly, I started out too fast. "Some friends of mine came out to run with me and encouraged me on. But I ended up

running with them, averaging 616 to seven minutes a mile for the first 40 miles. That's when my leg problems began "I ran into real difficulty between miles 75 to 80, when I had severe cramps in my quadriceps. I got a lot of help from the corpsmen

trying to get them to respond. After 86 miles and 16 hours, the pain was too much to bear, so I



# Marine captures pistol record

He didn't fire expert the first time he qualified with the .45caliber pistol, but he has ever since. And now Master Sergeant Charles Wilmot holds the pistol range record here.

Wilmot, Air Traffic Control noncommissioned officer in charge, scored 379 points out of a possible 400 Sept. 16 to better the old record by one point. Staff Sergeant Arnold Pasillas, 1st Battalion, 3d Marines, had scored a 378 July 14.

A sign above the 19-year Marine veteran's desk at Station Operations and Maintenance Squadron says, "Age and trechery will win out over youth and skill every time." But he says that doesn't apply to pistol marksmanship. Concentration and a willingness to keep concentrating shot after shot is what it takes to

do well with a pistol.

Wilmot has handled firearms most of his life, having grown up in the west Texas area near Lubbuck. "My dad gave me my first gun when I was 13," he said. Since then he's become very proficient with them.

The Texan's proficiency doesn't stop with handguns. In fact, Wilmot says he's always been better with rifles than pistols. "I've only fired the M-16 once, and that was for expert," he said. He qualified expert with the M-14 for most of his career, and describes the older service rifle as a very accurate weapon.

a very accurate weapon.

Wilmot has participated in competition before, but not on a regular basis. Although he'd never set a record before coming here, the 37-year-old leatherneck did learn the basics of marksmanship. And the basics have been enough to help him set the mark for others to shoot for.
