

White Knights make history during CREE participation

The White Knights of Marine Medium Helicopter Sqdn.-165 made 1st Marine Brigade history recently as it deployed all its helicopters and equipment to the field during the Combat Readiness Evaluation Exercise held here last week.

The Marines of HMM-165 had no easy task creating a tactical airfield. The composite helicopter squadron flies 16 aircraft and carries with it more than 100,000 pounds of tools and equipment necessary for routine and non-routine maintenance of their helicopters. This is the first time that a squadron has supported an operation from a strategically located airfield instead of a hangar area.

Helicopter squadrons have been reluctant to deploy ashore because of the massive support needed to move that large a unit, support that is needed elsewhere during an operation.

The squadron moved from its simulated shipboard environment (west field) and redeployed to Camp Helemano, near Schofield Barracks. The Marines moved all of their outsized equipment on trucks (simulating the landing gear that would normally be used) and the remainder was flown to the new airfield. While the crews and mechanics were loading the gear, the squadron was supporting the ongoing 37th MAU operation in the Schofield area. It flew medical evacuation missions and inserted patrols in the hills near Helemano, flying more than 200 hours in two days, putting both man and machine to the test.

"We did this because most squadrons never break out this

gear until it's needed, and that could be too late," said LtCol. Marv Blair, commanding officer of HMM-165. "We are deploying the youngest and most inexperienced squadron ever. I wanted to teach these Marines how to erect tents and field maintenance areas. They needed to learn the basics of being a field Marine." Blair continued.

"Some of my troops didn't realize that the security of our airfield lies solely in the hands of our personnel, with little or no help from ground units who will be busy on the front. They had no idea of what to expect out here. This was new to everyone. I think they enjoyed getting some field time," he added.

According to the operation scenario, the squadron was transferred to shore because the USS New Orleans was tasked with patrolling the waters off Holm (Kauni). It had to make the patrol without the helicopters due to the distance between the islands and because the squadron was already committed to the operation ashore.

The site that was selected for the tactical airfield was a rolling plateau with tall green grass that had been rain-soaked for several days. The fear of helicopters getting stuck in the soft earth almost canceled the operation before it started.

The decision of redeploying was delayed until the necessary intelligence information could be gathered about the location of the new airfield. The wet ground and the possibility of enemy counterattacks were forsaken as the Marines of HMM-165 headed toward Camp Helemano, about 10 kilometers from the front.

While the aircrews were flying

support missions for 3d Bn., 3d Marines, the remaining personnel were busy building a tent city, comprised mostly of work spaces. The headquarters and operations tents went up and were filled almost immediately with Marines talking on radios and conducting business necessary for the operation of the squadron.

The squadron brought everything it needed with them, including wiremen, ground support equipment, a tactical airfield refueling station and all the spare parts necessary for an extended stay. The Marines moved more than 300 people, 16 helicopters and 100,000 pounds of equipment in four hours.

"The operation has gone well, a lot smoother than expected," said 1st Lt. Terry Steele, embarkation officer. "We have never done this before but our Marines have worked well together and have accomplished the mission. Without the support of Marine Air Base Sqdn.-24, MAU Service Support Group-31 and the Army, who provided trailers to move our oversized gear, we could never have undertaken such a large-scale operation. We learned a few things out here," Steele added.

When all the rotors finally came to a stop the first evening, the squadron was on a war footing, with men on the perimeter and listening posts stationed several kilometers out. The helicopters were positioned to provide interlocking fields of fire to protect themselves against air and ground attacks. In addition to the perimeter guard, the crew chief of each aircraft slept in or near his helicopter, protecting it from sabotage.

and Brigade Service Support Group. Each company will total 80 Marines and consist of three 26-man platoons with a company commander and guidon bearer.


The parade will be reviewed by MajGen. J.J. Went, Deputy

Courts-Martial Report

EDITOR'S NOTE: The information contained in Courts-Martial Report is submitted by the Joint Legal Service Center and is published as a source of information for all Marines.

Private William R. Henry II, Marine Aircraft Group-24, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of unauthorized absence from Dec. 20, 1983 to April 15, 1984.

He was sentenced to forfeiture of \$350 pay per month for three months and to be confined at hard labor for three months.

LCpl. Willie J. Hall, Brigade Service Support Group, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of disobedience of the lawful order of a superior noncommissioned officer; theft of \$500 in U.S. currency, the property of the Bank of Hawaii; and altering a U.S. Treasury check, with the intent to deceive, to reflect a value of \$895 vice the actual value of \$395.

He was sentenced to forfeit \$250 pay per month for six months, reduction to private, and confinement at hard labor for four months.





6th Engineers practice trade

From volcanic land to land of volcanoes

From one volcano to another, Marines from Construction Platoon, Headquarters and Service Co., 6th Engineer Bn., traveled from the land of Mount St. Helens to work in the only other state with an active volcano. They're part of the headquarters element of the construction battalion of the 4th Force Service Support Group, building here as part of their two-week annual training duty (ATD).

The combat engineers are based at Portland, Ore. They were here as part of a 34-man detachment, providing useful construction services for the Station, April 28-May 11, and satisfying their reserve training requirements at the same time.

"They're only one of approximately 10 units from 6th Engineer Bn., which are coming to this station during the course of 1984 to provide inexpensive labor for minor construction projects," said Capt. Keven McCabe, assistant maintenance officer, Facilities department. "These minor projects would be very difficult to fund however, if the Station had to pay both the labor and material costs. Usually two-thirds of a project's cost is derived from labor expenses. As a result, labor from the Marine Corps Reserve and Navy Seabees allows the Station to afford three times the amount of projects it could normally accomplish if projects were contracted to civilian personnel.

"A unit from B Co., 6th Engineer Bn., located at South Bend, Ind., arrived here May 12 and worked until May 25," he said. "They were the second unit to arrive this year and so far, the program has worked very well. Most of the units are composed of individuals with some construction experience. The detachment commanders are usually construction contractors or associated with construction in some way, so they assure quality workmanship."

The Marines from Construction Platoon, H&S Company, deal primarily with concrete, building frames, and the mechanics of structure. Their two weeks training offered them an ideal opportunity to train within those trades.

"Our first project was to pour the floor for a storage building at the Windward Enlisted Club," said CWO-2 C.E. Mason, Construction Platoon commander, H&S Co. "We also laid the concrete floor for a 40x80 foot building at the golf course behind the Staff Noncommissioned Officers' Club. We did some steel structure work at that site as well, which when completed, will be used to store golf carts.

"Our third project was to lay the concrete base for a protective screen between the 15th green and the 16th tee," he continued. "The screen is designed to catch golf balls that inadvertently fly to the 15th green from the 16th tee. The screen won't be completed by H&S Company, because the steel for this project won't be here until approximately August.

"Originally we were slated to have only three concrete projects," said Mason, "but we picked up a fourth and did some steel work because we were running ahead of schedule. Our fourth project was to tear down and rebuild a 15-foot-square storage building belonging to Marine Air Control Squadron-2, which had been damaged by a civilian-contracted steamroller.

The program of combat engineers in the Reserve contains two benefits, first, reservists add to the overall strength, and professional of the Marine Corps combat engineer MOS. Additionally, the types of projects engaged help train individual Marines for outside civilian jobs.

"The projects have been generally difficult and challenging," he said, "which make for excellent learning opportunities. Some units have constructed projects relatively simple in nature and those really don't generate much learning or professional feeling."

The Marines from H&S Co. practice their trade on weekends

as well as two weeks every summer. They donate their time and talent on weekends to non-profit organizations through community-service type projects. They cannot, however, compete against civilian contractors for profit.

"We are presently building a summer camp area for the Girl Scouts in Vancouver, Wash.," said Mason. "The project consists of building bunkhouses, cook shelters, restroom facilities, and a main lodge. There are approximately 26 buildings involved within the project, and we've been working on it for four months now. This project is pretty typical of weekend training exercises."

The reservists have a wealth of experience and training to draw upon as some individuals work in the construction field during their civilian work day. Mason is a contractor, one Marine from his platoon is a journeyman carpenter, another is a construction laborer, and yet another is a draftsman.

"The program of combat engineers in the reserve contains two benefits," said Mason. "First, reservists add to the overall strength and professionalism of the Marine Corps combat engineer MOS. Additionally, the types of projects engaged help train individual Marines for outside civilian jobs. We've had several individuals receive jobs as a result of skills developed within our unit. The training helps them with carpentry odd jobs around the home as well.

"The troops have been really motivated and fired up since they've been here," he continued. "They really enjoy the weather and the types of projects we've been working on. It was like a reward for a lot of hard work and everybody had been looking forward to it for a long time. I think this was the best ATD yet."

"The projects have been really challenging," said Cpl. Matt Ohlson, H&S Co. "The cement work is nothing new for me though, because I work in a civilian construction job. Many of our younger troops aren't involved with construction in the ATD, but we've learned a lot during these two weeks, and I think it has been one of the best summer training periods."

Several enemy saboteurs were captured the first night without their getting into the perimeter area. The aircraft were well protected from attack by using camouflage nets over the helicopters to hide them from enemy aircraft. The Marines who normally fix and fly helicopters, were in the 'bush' stalking the enemy and establishing defensive perimeters.

"This operation pulled a lot of people together," said Sgt. Floyd Fassett, HMM-165. "Morale is high. It took a lot of work but it


went well. I think they should have gassed us though, it wasn't realistic enough at times." During their 48-hour stay at Helemano, the squadron was attacked by enemy aircraft and ground troops. With the help of Marines from 3/3, the squadron repulsed numerous assaults on the perimeter. For a short while the squadron was put into a modified Nuclear, Biological and Chemical alert and the Marines donned masks and protective suits. The attack never materialized however and the "all clear" was sounded a while later.

The redeployment operation and the CREK were designed to test units who are about to deploy to the Western Pacific. Readiness and effectiveness of the squadron was enhanced by the tactical deployment of the unit's assets to the field.

"The exercise was a great experience," said Capt. Dave

Darrah, a pilot with HMM-165. "The concept of the CREK is great, it really does test the abilities of the squadron. We need to do this more often," Darrah added.

The White Knights experienced more than a few days in the field. They saw first-hand what the Marine Corps is all about — a force in readiness.



You can count on the Corps.

Summer fire prevention tips

1. Recreational hazards:

- a. Camp in prepared camp grounds free of fire hazards.
- b. Ensure fire-fighting equipment and communication facilities available for emergency use.
- c. Use fire retardant materials in tents and structures. Never use candles or matches in or near a tent.
- d. The area used for barbecues in forest land should be cleared in at least a 5-foot circle. A supply of water and a shovel should be kept nearby for control of any small fire that may start in nearby vegetational growth.
- e. Home barbecue grills should be set up at a safe distance from the house. Use only approved barbecue fire starters.
- f. The use of fireworks or pyrotechnic devices are prohibited.

2. Parental supervision of children guards against false alarms and fire setting.

- a. A false alarm is a malicious act, and anyone transmitting a false alarm or tampering with fire alarm equipment is subject to disciplinary action.
- b. Children are imitators. Show them what could happen if they play with matches, climb on the stove, pull on pot handles and electric cords, touch or fall against an open heater and then let them show you.

3. Adequate circuitry is necessary for portable air conditioners and fans.

- a. 220V A/C units should have a separate circuit protected with a proper sized circuit breaker or fuse.
- b. 110V A/C units should be connected to a properly grounded outlet protected with a 20 Amp circuit breaker.
- c. Air filters used for air conditioning and ventilation equipment must be cleaned or replaced at regular intervals to minimize a fire/smoke hazard because of the accumulation of combustible lint and dust.
- d. Maintain maintenance requirements in accordance with manufacturers' recommendation.

4. Fueling lawn mowers and other fuel-fired equipment requires care.

- a. Fueling of equipment should not be accomplished within 20 feet of any structure of building.
 - b. Adequate safety housekeeping procedures should be used for spillage and saturated areas containing flammable liquids.
- Flammable liquids should be stored in a one-gallon container of substantial metal construction, with tight closing screw or spring lid, and be fitted with a spout and a UL-approved label.



adults, through the arts," said Politt. "The work, time and love behind this kind of activity makes it all worthwhile for everyone."




