## 3d Med Bn tests skills in mock casualty drill

The atmosphere might not be as comfortable, or the equipment as modern in a normal hospital, but the goal is the same — treat the sick and injured.

In a field hospital behind the 3d Marines Training Facility, corpsmen and medical service corps officers of Company A, 3d Medical Bn., BSSG; and Cmdr. John Taylor, surgeon, and

LtCmdr. David Young, anesthesiologist, both from Oakland Naval Hospital, took part in a simulated casualty drill Aug. 6 in which they had a chance to use their combat medical skills.

"In garrison, our main mission is to maintain medical supplies; but in a combat situation, we'd be the first unit in the medical evacuation chain with surgical capabilities," said Navy Lt. Richard Fletcher, commanding officer of Co. A.

Although in a combat situation the unit would have two general surgeons and two orthopedics, doctors are not assigned to the unit in garrison. Taylor and Young practice their expertise in a regular hospital environment and participate in simulated casualty drills to form working relationships with medical battalions, according to Fletcher.

That working relationship and 25 to 30 tractor trailers of supplies allows the unit to treat 2,000 patients before needing to be resupplied. HMM-364 provided transportation for some of the

patients, while the remainder of them were taken to the field hospital by field ambulances.

Twenty-five "casualties" suffering from abdominal and head wounds, to crushed airways and sucking chest wounds were among the "injuries" treated during the drill.

Patients were evaluated by the seriousness of their injuries, and then treated or transferred to the proper department, such as X-ray for further evaluation or the operating room for surgery.

The field tent operating room presents problems not found in a regular hospital operating room, according to Fletcher. "In addition to the inadequate light, the temperature in these tents is usually 120 to 130 degrees while the surgeons are operating," said Fletcher. "Personnel are rotated regularly to maintain an alert crew."

An alert crew also made the drill a success. "Everything went well, and everyone worked as a team to get the mission accomplished," concluded Fletcher.

## Senate approves conference report on military retirement, compensation

**EDITOR'S NOTE:** The following article is on the "Status of Military Retirement and Compensation Items" published in a Secretary of Defense message on Aug. 2, and it's reprinted in its entirety.

"The conference report on the FY-86 DoD Authorization Bill has been completed. The Senate has approved the Conference Report. The full House, however, did not take final action on the Conference Committee Report prior to adjourning for the August recess.

"Following approval, the Appropriations Committee must allocate funding for each of the programs before they can be implemented.

"With regard to military retirement, the conferees have split the difference and compromised at a \$2.9 billion reduction in retirement accrual funding for FY-86. Included in the action is the requirement for DoD to effect changes which, if enacted, would result in savings of that amount.

"The commitment to "grandfather" all personnel currently serving and those already retired was confirmed by the conferees. We expect the Congress to hold hearings before taking final action on the legislation we are required to submit.

"With regard to action on the other elements of compensation, the conferees agreed to a 3 percent across-

the-board military pay raise effective Oct. 1, which we advocated. In addition, the conferees agreed to:

— Improvements to certain Special and Incentive pays, increasing the enlisted rate to equal the officer rate of \$110 a month for such pays as demolition duty, parachute duty, flight deck duty.

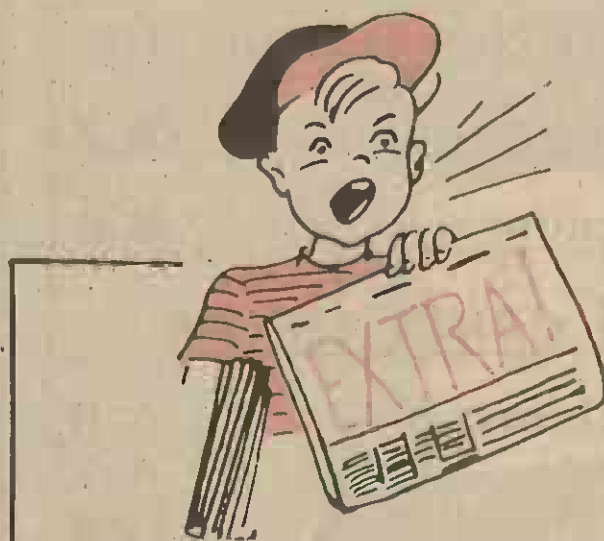
— An increase in family separation Allowance (CFSA-II) from \$30 to \$60 a month.

— Revision and expansion of Career Sea Pay rates for commissioned and warrant officers; and inclusion of rates for years beyond 12 years of accrued sea duty, ending at 20 years sea duty.

— PCS reimbursements designed to reduce out-of-pocket expenses, including a per diem allowance of \$37.50 a day for dependents over 12 years of age, and \$25 a day for dependents under 12; a dislocation allowance at the "with dependents" rate for married junior enlisted personnel, and increase in LA to equal two months LA; and making the previously authorized Temporary Lodging Expense (TLE) allowance an entitlement.

— Authority for payment of BAQ/VII beyond 90 days of sea/flight duty for E-7 and above, without dependents, for those members who have already

## Air Station gets SecDef environmental award

## AUTOVON abusers subject to discipline

Camp S.D. Butler, Japan — Four hundred thirty six dollars and 21 cents is a lot to pay for a single phone call. That's how much one Okinawa-based Marine, who abused the Automatic Voice Network (AUTOVON), reimbursed the government for an illegal call.

In addition to disciplinary action that may have been taken, 21 Marines recently reimbursed the government \$2,186.14 for calls illegally placed. The charges were

based on the commercial fair market value of the calls.

AUTOVON is a government-owned and operated telephone system, and is designed to handle official command and control telephone traffic.

Use of AUTOVON for personal calls, other than official government calls, is strictly forbidden, and the illegal AUTOVON caller is subject to administrative and disciplinary action.

## Teacher wins child development award

### Introduces children to new experiences

A child care center's staff is there to keep a watchful eye on children left in their care; but a lot more takes place when the staff consists of teachers like Michelle Dobbins.

Dobbins, who taught at the Kula O' Kamali's Child Care Center here for two years, recently received an award from the Child Development Associate Credentialing Commission in Washington, D.C.

To get the award, Dobbins completed three years of classroom preparation and college classes. After a two-day classroom observation and evaluation by an early childhood expert team, she was presented the award.

Dobbins, who is married to

GySgt. John Dobbins of MACS-2, has taught children for several years and wouldn't trade her line or work for any other. Her husband once told her that she was a "sucker for children."

"I enjoy the children's creativity and uniqueness," said Dobbins, of the four-year-olds she works with. "I don't look at them as a wild bunch, although one or two might get a little wild temporarily," said the mother of two.

Aside from the regular activities of a child care center, Dobbins' children also partake in their interests through learning centers. Whether it's art, music, science, pretend, manipulative, block or the library center, children are introduced

to new experiences daily. One of most beneficial centers is the library, according to Dobbins.

"The library center gives the children a chance to develop a yearning to read, and by the time they get to kindergarten they're all fired-up about reading," said the San Francisco native.

"I love to see the children learn. When adults discover new things, their eyebrows may raise a bit; but when children discover new things, they are truly amazed and their faces light up," said Dobbins.

Dobbins also understands a child's need to be alone sometimes. The hideout place is provided to allow a child time to be alone. "Since there's room for one person only, a child can be alone with his thoughts and feelings," she said.

After learning center and hideout time, a puppet named Wild Willie often shows up to entertain the children. On

one of Wild Willie's (Dobbins) visits he spoke to the children about their upcoming graduation and also told

them where wild things come from.

Wild Willie is just the way Dobbins finds to

enlighten the children whom she derives great pleasure from teaching and being part of their lives.

# Servicemembers can be protected from becoming terrorist victims

The hijacking of TWA Flight 847 and subsequent holding of 39 American hostages for 17 days has brought the subject of terrorism to the forefront once again. Some people are beginning to wonder if Americans, and especially American service people both here and abroad, are safe.

The answer, according to P.E. Col. Alexander C. Wylie, chief, Security Operations Division of the Department of Advanced Military Police Training at the Army Military Police School, Fort McJellan, Ala., appears to be basically yes.

"Service people should not become paranoid," he says. "The odds of being involved in a terrorist incident are very low." However, Wylie says certain precautions can be taken that may help people avoid becoming victims of terrorist incidents.

The first thing is to become aware of your surroundings. "Look for things out of the ordinary," cautions Wylie. "If there is someone watching you, your home or the area you work,

don't hesitate to report it to law enforcement personnel."

Wylie says to look for strangers who loiter (especially people with cameras) in the same general area over a period of time. Be aware of suspicious-looking vehicles that reappear several times a week. "Most of all, report out-of-the-ordinary things that make you take notice."

Wylie says there are other precautions people can take, but those precautions are determined by the level of the threat in the area you are living or traveling.

In high-threat situations, Wylie suggests varying your routine. "Leave for work and return home at different times," he suggests.

It's also important to alter the route you take to work. "But be especially careful once you are in close proximity to where you

work or live," he says.

"Terrorists know that once you get close to those places, it's more difficult to vary your routine." Once again, Wylie emphasizes that these precautions should be taken only if the threat warrants it.

People traveling on temporary duty should also take extra precautions. "Travel orders contain a wealth of information valuable to potential terrorists," says Wylie. They usually include complete travel plans, lodging and modes of transportation.

In addition, in making travel arrangements, copies of the orders are given out which makes the travel plans accessible to many different people. Wylie points out that higher-ranking individuals should restrict the number of people who have access to

their daily itineraries.

When it comes to hijackings, Wylie says there is little anyone can do. However, Department of Defense officials suggest that service people involved in hostage situations remain calm and maintain a very low profile.

Officials suggest that service people neither volunteer information concerning their affiliation with the military, nor should they hide it if asked. They say that if the information is found out later, the repercussions could be more serious.

When making travel arrangements, DoD officials suggest using direct routing, not making note of your military rank, wearing casual civilian clothing and limiting travel within and to high-risk areas.

"Most importantly," says Wylie, "Be aware of what terrorism is and know what the threat is in the area you may live or travel." Wylie recommends contacting your service's intelligence people to determine the level of threat in the areas through which you travel.

## Annual Ironman Triathlon nears

There are 1,250 athletes from around the world training four to six hours a day to compete in the Oct. 26 Bud Light Ironman Triathlon World Championship in Hawaii.

Thirty-five countries and 43 states will be represented at the Ironman, the most prestigious triathlon. Athletes ranging in age from 18-year-old Mandel Motta, from Rio de Janeiro, Brazil to 70-year-old Edson Sower, of Yuma, Arizona will be competing. The largest age group for men, women

continues to be the 25-29 year old category. In the men's division, 23 hardy athletes over the age of 60 are registered to be at the 7 a.m. starting line.

Entry into the Ironman is gained by either: 1) meeting strict qualifying times in the

1984 race; 2) winning one of 40 qualifying races; 3) winning an Ironman international championship in New Zealand or Japan; 4) meeting foreign qualifications or 5) being one of the 200 selected in the lottery held in April.

# Military moves can affect tax status

**AFIS** — After 25 years in military service and 26 different moves, asking someone where their home is can be a real difficult question to answer.  
 Some people may not think too much about it, but one's place of residence is very important. Especially when it comes to taxes.  
 Military people move frequently and state tax laws vary widely. For example, Texas and Nevada have no state income tax. Other states tax federal military salaries regardless

of where the member is stationed.  
 "A member's liability for taxes is protected in some ways by the Soldiers and Sailors Relief Act," says Major Rex Fuller, deputy director of Legislation and Legal Policy for the Department of Defense.  
 "The Act says a military member cannot be taxed merely because the member is in a particular jurisdiction as a result of military orders."  
 This is intended to protect military members from liability for state taxes on

military pay outside of their permanent domicile. Otherwise, some service people might get hit for taxes in the state they are stationed as well as their legal domicile.  
 "Domicile is a legal term," explains Fuller. "It's defined differently in different states. But generally, your domicile is where you were born or, once emancipated (having left your place of birth), the place you lived with the intention of permanently living there."  
 Since intent is an important part of the law,

how is it established? The legal people use the phrase "outward manifestation." In other words, does a person behave like a given place is where they intend to live?  
 Some examples of outward manifestation of establishing legal domicile are:  
 Registering and actually voting in the state,  
 Obtaining a driver's license,  
 Owning property,  
 Registering a will,  
 Sending children to school,  
 Paying taxes in the state,

It's important to note that in expressing your intentions in regard to a legal residence you should not lie. You could be prosecuted for false swearing.  
 The term "home of record" is only significant within the military service, and shouldn't be confused with legal residence.  
 Home of record is the place from which you entered the military, or to which your goods are

shipped when you depart the service.  
 Your pay is not reported to your home of record. The state that you declare on your W-4 form gets the state withholding taxes.  
 When it comes to determining your legal residence, Fuller suggests the local Staff Judge Advocate. They are the experts in these matters and can advise you on various state tax laws and the options you may have.

secured housing at their permanent duty station.  
 — Authority for advance payment of BAQ/VHA to help offset moving-in expenses following a PCS move.  
 — Extension of authority for AOCP for two years.  
 — A cost-shared dental insurance plan for active duty dependents, although implementation will be delayed until Oct. 1, 1986, to allow DoD adequate time to plan that program fully and for Congress to review those plans.  
 — Authority for paid travel to home of record for members and dependents who serve voluntary consecutive overseas tours.  
 — Authority for dependent students to continue on MAC flights from point of debarkation in the US to the

final terminal of that aircraft on a Space-A basis. However, dependent student travel for Alaska and Hawaii was not approved.  
 — Authority to pay 75 percent of SRB in lump sum, effective on Oct. 1, 1986.  
 "On other issues related, the conferees took the following action:  
 — The Senate Bill had contained a provision to establish as an entitlement in law the proposed increase in household goods weight allowance. The conference committee emphasized its support for DoD's request to provide a minimum of 5000 pounds to junior enlisteds and a maximum of 18,000 pounds to senior grades; and urged the Appropriations Committee to fund the program for FY-86. However, the committee agreed not to make the increases an entitlement until completion

of Congressionally-directed studies by GAO and DoD to reexamine the appropriate levels.  
 — VHA will replace the Rent-Plus Program in Alaska and Hawaii. There is a four-year "grandfather" period for PCS service members already housed under Rent-Plus, or entitled to payment of a Temporary Lodging Allowance or Station Housing Allowance, at the time of enactment of the Authorization Bill.  
 — The VHA "windfall" provision included in the Senate Bill has been modified. As originally written, the sum of a member's BAQ and VHA would be limited to actual housing costs. In the final bill, the "windfall" will be split between the service member and the government, with the service member permitted to keep half the

difference between housing costs and the sum of prescribed housing allowances. This program is to be implemented within 90 days of enactment of the bill.  
 "The enhancements to compensation contained in the Authorization Bill will result in a major improvement in the quality of life of our service members and their families, and reflect our commitment to improving their well-being.  
 "We are pleased that, through these improvements, Congress has recognized the hardships and sacrifices that our service members endure, and is participating with us in our efforts to continue to attract, and retain, the high quality of personnel we need.  
 "We recognize shortfalls still exists and will endeavor to provide for them in the FY-87 Defense Budget," the message concluded.

## Instructors needed for JROTC slots

The 4th Marine Corps District, in Philadelphia, has three openings for Enlisted Military Instructors for the Marine Corps Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps in Highland Springs, and Covington, Ky.  
 The Marine Corps JROTC program is offered to high school students, and is aimed at developing informed citizens; strengthening character by teaching discipline; and developing an understanding of the responsibilities of citizenship. Military instructors educate students in leadership, military history and drill.  
 Applicants for these positions must be retired or transferred to the Fleet Marine Corps Reserve as staff NCOs. They must be drawing retirement or retainer pay, have a high school diploma, and have

spent at least one tour in either a training command, on recruiting duty, as an Officer Selection Officer assistant, or on Inspector/Instructor duty. Applicants must also have an exemplary military record, and have an interest in youth groups. All Military instructors undergo certification by Headquarters Marine Corps.  
 Military Instructors are not considered to be on active duty, and are eligible to college, full retirement benefits, plus a salary at least equal to that of their last active duty pay grade, including BAQ, VHA, Commuted Rations, and CMA.

# Legal Assistance



## by Maj. Maurice Daniel Last Will and Testament

Everyone should consider the value of making a valid Last Will and Testament. Unfortunately, death without a Will often results in confusion, family disputes and lengthy legal proceedings.

Without a valid Will, a person dies intestate. Every state has laws of intestate succession, which vary widely from state as to the quantity of the estate that will be awarded to the surviving heirs.

Under intestate laws, the courts decide who will administer your estate; how your property will be divided and disposed of; and who will be the guardian of any minor children if both parents die.

With a Will, you name the executor you desire to manage your estate and dispose of your possessions. You also name the person you desire to be the guardian of your minor children.

After you have executed (signed) your Will, you should be assured that the distribution of your estate will be made in accordance with your expressed desires. Your Will does not take legal effect until death. Until that time, you can leave it as it is as long as it satisfies your desires; you can have an attorney prepare a change to it; or you can revoke it.

### Maintaining a Will

You should observe the following points to ensure that your Will can be judicially accepted as your Last Will and Testament:

Only the original of the Will should be signed by you and the witnesses to your signature. This prevents confusion that may be caused

if several Wills were offered into the probate court, with questionable changes, that may not be in accordance with your Last Will and Testament.

The original Will should be placed in a safe place (fireproof container) as soon as possible after execution. For convenience, the safe deposit box of your attorney — or drafter of your Will — or the safe deposit box of the named executor is recommended.

It is recommended that you not store the Will in your safe deposit box, because in most states a court order to open the box must be obtained after your death before the Will can be obtained.

If you plan to travel or are going on deployment, it is suggested that you mail or deliver your Will to the

executor named in your Will. Otherwise the Will could be lost or destroyed if you are involved in an accident.

If you maintain the Will in your possession, it should be kept in a safe, fireproof container preferably with other important documents, such as your insurance policies and financial statements. Your executor and alternate executor should be given clear instructions so that they can easily obtain the Will.

### Corrections, changes

Don't make erasures or pen or pencil corrections, especially of names or figures, to the original Will. If you discover any errors in your Will, immediately return it to your attorney for corrections.

If you desire to make changes to provisions in your Will, you may do so by having an attorney prepare a Codicil, or amendment to a Will. A Codicil must be prepared and executed with the same formality as the original Will, and is attached to the original Will. The alternative to have a Codicil done, you may have an attorney prepare a completely new Will and revoke or destroy the old one.

### Revocation

You may revoke your Last Will and Testament by burning or tearing the original with the intent to nullify it. Its legal effect then becomes void. You may also revoke your Last Will and Testament by executing a new Will which expressly states that the prior Will is hereby revoked. Also, in many states, a final divorce automatically revokes provisions made for your

former spouse in your Will.

### Annual review

You should review your Will at least once a year to determine what if any changes need to be made due to marriage, divorce, death, or changes of executor(s), guardian(s) and beneficiaries; or change in the disposition of your estate. If you have any questions about your Will or estate planning, consult an attorney.

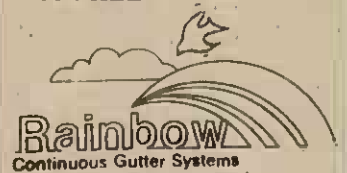

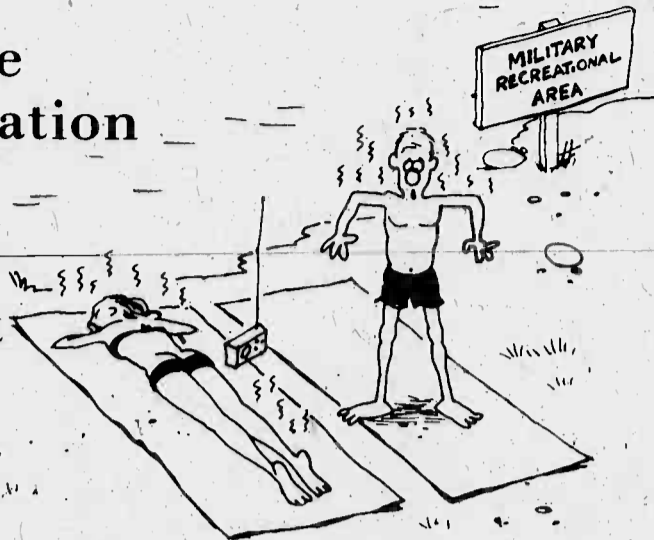

# Summer's not over

Here's some helpful information to get you through the hottest season of the year



## Learn to cool your body down

Summer and early autumn heat waves make most people miserable, but they can also cause dangerous heat strokes and heat prostration. How can you keep your body from blowing its cool? Follow a few hot weather safety precautions:

**Slow down.** Your body can't do its best in high temperatures and humidities, so ease the stress and don't overdo when the heat's on.

**Heed your body's early warning symptoms,** such as flushed face, headache, or dizziness. These feelings and signs indicate that "heat syndrome" is on the way.

**Dress for summer weather.** Lightweight, light-colored clothing reflects heat and sunlight and helps maintain normal body temperatures.

**Put less fuel on your inner fires.** Foods like steak and roast beef are proteins that increase body water loss; fresh fruits and vegetables are lighter fare that help keep the body cool.



**Don't dry out.** Heat wave weather stimulates perspiration which drains the body of fluids, so drink plenty of water while the hot spell lasts.

In a normal year about 175 Americans die from summer heat and too much sun exposure. During a recent 15-year period, more than 8,000 persons were killed in the United States by the effects of heat and solar radiation.

Heat claims its victims in a less dramatic manner than many other kinds of accidents. There might be a small huddle around a supine figure at the beach, the clatter of a helmet and rifle in a holiday parade, an eddy

among the elderly in a subtropical park, a troubled congregation between the fairway and the green.

To keep from dying in the summer heat, remember:

**Avoid "thermal shock"** by gradually getting used to warmer weather during the first critical two or three days of a hot spell.

**Vary your thermal**

**environment,** or in plain words, get out of the heat frequently and go where it's cool.

**Don't get too much sun.** Sunburn makes body temperature higher and upsets the body's temperature control system.

Summertime weather means fun in the sun, but for your body's sake — play it cool.

### Treatment for Sunburn

Sunburn results from overexposure to the sun, which rays can penetrate clouds so a cool, cloudy day offers no protection.

The best prevention is gradual exposure to the sun, avoiding the hot afternoon hours, and using a good sunscreen or lotion.

Treatment for sunburn includes drinking plenty of liquids and applying cold packs or cold compresses to the burn. Bland creams may also help the burn, but do not apply soaks. Aspirin will also help ease pain and reduce inflammation. See a doctor if vomiting or dizziness occurs.

## Plastic jogging suits can be dangerous

Some joggers believe that wearing rubberized or plastic jogging suits will help them lose weight faster.

According to Brigade Surgeon, Navy Captain John Yauch, the suits will cause a person to lose weight, but the results could be more than what they bargained for.

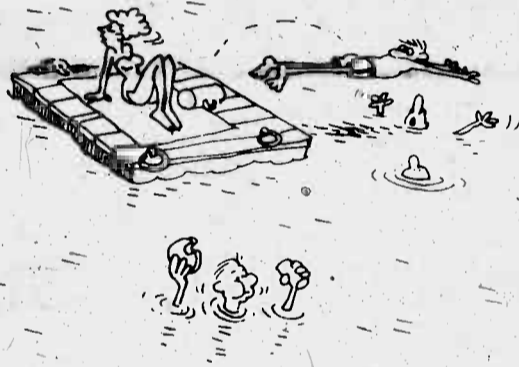
"The suits cause people to lose water weight, not fat so the weight loss is only temporary," Capt. Yauch explained. "Because the suits trap heat next to the body, runners can easily become overheated, causing any number of heat-related injuries."

Some heat-related problems, such as cramps and exhaustion, cause a person to feel weak and have cramps. Heat stroke sometimes provide no warning, and the mortality rate for heat stroke victims is high, according to Capt. Yauch.



The best prescription is prevention, and the Brigade Surgeon suggests staying out of the noon-day sun. "Plan your runs in the morning and late afternoons," he said. "Wear loose-fitting clothes that allow ventilation."

Runners who experience problems should stop and find a shady place to rest, and should drink water. Courses should be planned so that shade and water are available.



## Wearing sunglasses while in uniform

**AFIS**—It's the season for sunglasses. There are grey, green, blue, pink and amber tints... colors for all occasions.

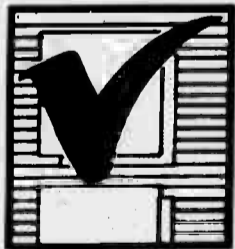
But what if you're in the military and in uniform? Then, it's a different ballgame. Each of the military services, including the Coast Guard, has strict rules which cover the wearing of sunglasses in uniform and when in ranks.

Within certain guidelines and restrictions, the services do permit them, but in each case a conservative style is preferred.

That's certainly the case with the Navy, according to a spokesman. Says the Army Regulation Board, "They should not be outlandish."

The Air Force allows sunglasses to be worn when not prohibited by safety regulations.

The Coast Guard permits prescription sunglasses. "We prefer them worn on leave and liberty," says the



Marine Corps Uniform Board.

None of the services will authorize sunglasses to be worn in formation without medical justification.

Medical reasons for sunglasses vary from inflammation of the iris of the eye, trauma to the eye, cataract, and conjunctivitis, to congenital problems, in which a person may be born without the iris or part of it is missing, said Capt. Ron Noble, optometrist and Don Milsap, chief optician at Walter Reed Army Medical Center. Such patients are often photophobic, a condition in which the eyes are particularly sensitive to light.

## Know the symptoms of heat illnesses

**AFIS** — The words "heat prostration" may get an image of fragile ladies in crinolines swooning on the porch of a big mansion.

But real men and strong women can get heat sick too — soldiers standing in formation on a hot day, sailors in an engine room, or Marines climbing a cliff in anti-chemical warfare suits.

Caring for the victims of heat problems — there are actually four kinds of heat sickness — is part of Dr. George Benjamin's job. Benjamin is a physician at Walter Reed Army Medical Center.

Studying causes and ways to prevent heat sickness is the job of Dr. Dave Miller, a research physiologist at the Naval Medical Research Institute in Bethesda, Md.

Here is some information on the subject from the two doctors and from a tri-service manual on heat sickness.

For joggers in the United States, "the real risk is for those who may want to undo a winter's lack of exercise on one warm day. Regular athletes are adapted to the heat — they sweat more effectively — but anyone can get 'heat sick,'" says Dr. Benjamin.

The mildest form of heat sickness — heat rash — interferes with the body's ability to sweat, making other heat problems more likely.



Other risk factors for heat sickness are medications such as "fluid pills" and some heart medicines; being overweight, and being very young (infants) or very old.

Persons who have suffered heat sickness before are likely to suffer a more serious case the next time they are under heat stress.

Heat cramps — that pain in the gut you may feel while running on a hot day — are an indication that you should rest and drink fluids. Juice and soft drinks are recommended over plain water because heat cramps are usually brought on by a lack of electrolytes or body salts.

Victims of heat exhaustion can feel dizzy and nauseated and have muscle cramps, but the basic symptom is just feeling too tired to move.

Some heat exhaustion sufferers pass out. The person

usually appears pale, and has cold clammy skin because of "peripheral vascular collapse" due to loss of salt and water. Treatment is to get to a cooler place, rest, and replace fluid and electrolytes.

The most serious form of heat sickness, heat stroke, can be "like being shot in several places," says Dr. Miller. That is because the body loses more oxygen under extreme heat stress than it can replace — resulting in damage to internal organs.

The lack of oxygen in the brain can result in a confused or unconscious patient. With prompt treatment — first to cool the body and then to deal

with oxygen-loss damage — "heat stroke victims can usually be brought back 100 percent," says Dr. Miller.

Without prompt treatment, the mortality rate is high. Heat stroke victims are usually flushed, in contrast to pale heat exhaustion victims, and their skin is hot and dry — they've stopped sweating.

To avoid heat sickness if you must work or exercise in a hot place drink fluids, don't skip meals (you need the salt and sugar) but don't overeat, and if possible, wear clothing that allows airflow.

Salt pills are not recommended, except in a few cases when your medical officer may prescribe them, and may actually make you sicker.

## Marine-life hazards

A variety of sea life can cause pain. Jellyfish, sea urchins, and coral reefs can cause stings and cuts.

Once the wound is clean, apply a weak solution of household ammonia as soon as possible then apply a paste made with meat tenderizer and water.

Rubbing alcohol may be used to help itching, and aspirin can help the discomfort.

See a doctor if pain and swelling persist for more than 24 hours or if there are signs of infection.

# Vacationing? Visit the countries 'Down Under'

The 2d Marine Division called New Zealand "home" during the early stages of World War II when thousands of Marines trained at McKay's Crossing before beginning their island-hopping campaign.

Today, the Marines are still remembered and honored for their contributions in defending the countries "Down Under." Old Glory and the Marine Corps colors hang side-by-side in Old St. Paul's, a historic parish church near McKay's Crossing.

Other cities in New Zealand are still frequented by United States military forces. Christchurch, "the most English city outside England," as it's known, is host each year to members of the Antarctic exploration "Operation Deep-Freeze."

There's a story behind all of New Zealand's cities and towns, from Nightcaps to Papatotue, and the history of the rugged land itself would fill volumes.

The best way to learn about the country is to visit it, according to Gunnery Sergeant John Feeney,

NCOIC of Brigade Schools, here.

Feeney described his 11-day excursion to New Zealand as a good, wholesome trip, and he recommends a vacation there to anyone who can go.

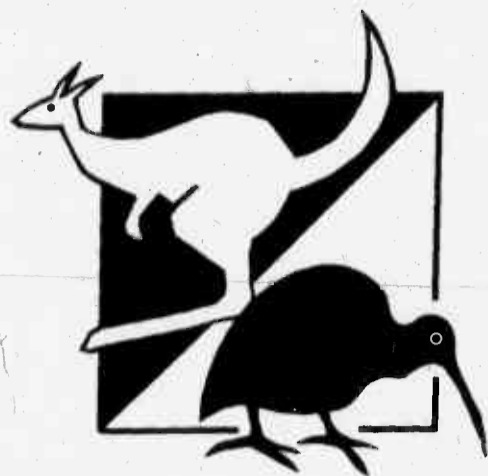
"The exchange rate is excellent," Feeney said. "At \$2.07 New Zealand for each American dollar, it's like getting everything for half price."

Although Feeney traveled commercially to and from New Zealand, military members and their families can fly space available on

Military Airlift Command flights, which take off from Hickam Air Force Base to Down Under twice a week. One flight goes into New Zealand, landing at Christchurch, and both flights terminate in Australia.

Military Airlift Command flights require passengers traveling to Australia to have a passport, shot record and a visa, while passengers departing at Christchurch don't require a visa. The flights cost \$10 per person each way.

# Avoid needless expense when buying automobiles

**AFIS** — Since May 9, used car dealers have been required by the Federal Trade Commission to put a sticker on the window identifying who gets stuck with repair bills should that car on the lot turn out to be a mechanical nightmare.

The sticker, or "Buyer's Guide," tells whether you're buying the car "as is" — you pay all the bills — or with a warranty — the dealer pays all or part of the cost to repair covered systems.

Kansas, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Mississippi, New York, Vermont, West Virginia, and the District of Columbia do not permit "as is" sales. In these states, dealers must sell the vehicle with implied warranties.

Implied warranty coverage varies from state to state, but the most common is called a "warranty of merchantability," meaning a product will do what it is supposed to do — a toaster will toast, a car will run.

Your state consumer protection office can provide some information about implied warranties in your state. If your state requires an implied warranty, this must be indicated on the Buyer's Guide.

Get the dealer to put any oral promises in writing on the Buyer's Guide, which becomes part of your sales contract and overrides any provisions to the contrary that may be in the contract. If you can't get the promise in writing, don't count on it.

The Buyer's Guide suggests getting an independent inspection of the car before you buy it.

Having a mechanic or diagnostic center inspect the car can be well worth the money — you may learn

about expensive problems that you can't live with, or use what you've learned about minor problems to negotiate a better deal.

Private sellers — whose cars you see advertised on the bulletin board to give you a Buyer's Guide, so careful

inspection before you buy is especially important.



# New radar system developed for Corps

Marine Corps News — A new tactical radar system, developed especially for the Marine Corps, and which is capable of providing a three-dimensional display of targets at distances of up to 300 nautical miles, will soon become the guardian of the MAGTF's tactical air space. The radar will scan the skies up to 100,000 feet in a 360 degree sweep.

After more than a decade in the research and development stages, the AN/TSP-59, has replaced the outdated "vacuum tube" technology of earlier radar systems. The Corps' first all solid-state, long-range radar will use Electronic Counter Counter Measure features to operate in radar jamming environments, and will have a secondary support role in air traffic control.

"The AN/TSP-59 will prove to be more reliable and easier to maintain than its

predecessors. The Mean Time Between Failures for the system as a whole is expected to approach 1,000 hours, with power modules in the transmitter achieving greater than 100,000 hours MTBF," said Maj. James E. Thigpan, Acquisition Sponsor Project Officer of the AN/TSP-59.

Lieutenant General Keith A. Smith, Deputy Chief of Staff for Aviation, HQMC, accepted the first of 11 units from General Electric Company. At a cost of approximately \$10 million each, the AN/TSP-59 was procured for less than proposed budget price and delivered several months ahead of schedule.

This latest development in state-of-the-art radar technology will be used to control friendly aircraft in addition to the long-range detection of hostile intruders.

"Its primary mission will be to provide air defense to the MAGTF. Its long-range

capability will allow us to respond quickly to the threat of hostile aircraft," Thigpen continued.

The new radar systems will be fielded by air control squadrons. As the Corps' primary deployable, long-range radar system, the AN/TSP-59 arrived at MCAS-6, Cherry Point, in July. The remaining units are

scheduled for delivery by the summer of 1986.

The first Marine radar technicians for the AN/TSP-59 will attend factory training courses at General Electric Co., Syracuse, N.Y., until a formal school is established at the Marine Corps Communications Electronics School, Twenty-nine Palms, in 1986.

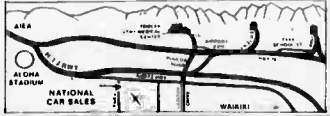
