CFC kicks off Friday; 'Your share helps' slogan

The 1985 Honolulu Area Combined Federal Campaign begins tomorrow and the goal for Hawaii Marines has been set at \$251,400, an increase of 22.8 percent based on last year's contributions.

"Over the past 24 years, federal employees and members of the Armed Forces have shown their concern by contributing more than \$1.1 billion to charitable organizations through the CFC," said President Ronald Reagan in his announcement endorsing the fund drive.

Command coordinators are optimistic about the fund drive. "We're expecting a very successful campaign this year," said Maj. D.W. Kessler. MCAS coordinator,

"and this will depend upon the success of the many enthusiastic keypersons who will be personally contacting the federal employees here."

Donating to the CFC is easy. An allotment for as little as \$2 a month can be obligated to organizations listed in the CFC pamphlet, or to one specific cause such as a hometown Boy Scout program or other charitable organization the individual selects. One-time, cash contributions are also welcomed.

"Everyone, no matter how young they are, must know someone who has benefited in some from one of the many organizations listed in the CFC brochure," said Maj. S.G. Hornberger, command coordinator for the 1st MAB.

There are 177 local and international charities or campaign groups listed in this year's CFC brochure. Many of them provide either direct aid to underprivileged or diseased people; or research treatment or cures for those afflicted with a

disease or disorder. "While the decision to give is personal and voluntary, I encourage each of you to join me in wholeheartedly

supporting this year's CFC," concluded President Reagan.

Guidelines listed for holiday mailing

The U.S. Postal Service has published guidelines for mailing holiday greetings and packages.

To ensure they arrive on time, November is when most parcels should be shipped. Packages can be shipped by Parcel Airlift Mail, or Space Available Mail.

Packages up to 30 pounds, and 60 inches in combined length and girth, may be sent by PAL. Patrons pay the regular parcel post rate to the Unites States exit port or from the port of entry, plus a fee for air service. The air service fee is 30 cents for parcels weighing 20 pounds or less; 60 cents for 2 to 3 pounds; 90 cents for 3 to 4 pounds; and \$1.20 for 4 to 30 pounds.

Military parcels should be shipped in November by Space Available Mail. Items shipped by SAM are transported by surface means and flown on a space available basis from the United States to overseas destinations or from overseas destinations to the United States.

Packages up to 30 pounds, and 60 inches in combined length and girth, may be sent by SAM for regular parcel post rates to the United States exit port or from the United States port of entry.

When mailed from a military post office outside the continental United States, the weight cannot exceed 70 pounds and size is limited to 100 inches in combined length and girth.

The post office here normally handles 1,000 to 3,000 pounds of mail daily, but during the Christmas season they handle almost 6,000 pounds daily. This is why mailing early is stressed.

Wrapping is also important. If the box is dirty, use brown paper and seal the box. Nylon strap tape is best, and masking or scotch tape are not recommended.

The post office at the Marine Corps Exchange has a lot of business during the Christmas season. GySgt. David Retan, the Main Post Office operations chief, suggests, patrons use the Main Post Office to alleviate long lines at the Exchange Post Office. The Main Post Office is located in building 835 on Second and D street.

To ensure mail will be received by Christmas, domestic area letters, cards, and priority parcels going to the continental United States, Alaska, or Puerto Rico should be mailed by Dec. 14. Parcels being sent to those locations via surface transportation should be sent by Nov. 11. Letters, cards, and priority parcels destined for Guam should be sent by Dec. 11, and surface parcels by Nov. 11.

For letters, cards, and priority parcels bound for APO or FPO addresses in Europe and the Far East, Dec. 6 is the deadline. Parcel Airlift mail packages to those locations should be sent by Nov. 25 and SAM packages by Nov.15.

Africa and Azores bound APO and FPO letters, cards, and priority parcels should be mailed by Dec. 2. Their PAL mailing date is Nov. 11 and the SAM mailing date is Nov.

Mail to South and Central American and Near East APOs and FPOs should he mailed as follows: letters, cards, and priority parcels,



Nov. 25, PAL, Nov. 11; and SAM, Nov. 4. All other APO and FPO destined letters, cards, and priority parcels should be mailed by Nov. 25, with PAL packages mailed by Nov. 4, and SAM packages sent by Oct. 28.

International mail should be mailed to Canada and Mexico, letters, cards, and parcels by air, Dec. 14; by surface, Nov. 11:

To South and Central America, letters, cards, and parcels by air, Dec. 4; by surface, Nov. 4;

To the Far East and Europe, letters, cards, and parcels by air, Dec. 6;

And all other countries, letters, cards, and parcels by air Nov. 25.

Surface mailing dates for the Far East, Europe, and all other countries has already passed and mail will not be guaranteed to arrive by Christmas.

Compared to 1975 fuel consumption rates, ships in 1984 were 7.8 percent more efficient per underway steaming hour, and aircraft were 4.2 percent more efficient per flying hour. On a square foot basis, facilities have reduced energy use 10.7 percent. "The ships, aircraft squadrons and shore facilities that

Oct. 27: Daylight-saving time; Mainland sets clocks back



Daylight-savings time doesn't affect Hawaiian residents, but when it comes to calling the mainland, it's a good idea to remember that at 2 a.m., on Oct. 27 is when mainland clocks are set back an hour - except for Arizona.

Next year, people may be waiting until after Halloween for that extra hour if the bill in Congress passes.

Charcoal briquette manufacturers like the idea, claiming they will sell \$56 million more of their product. Farmers think extending daylight-savings time would be a hardship, shortchanging them of morning daylight to do chores.

Parents of young children like the idea of more evening light at Halloween, but don't like the idea of their children waiting for early morning buses in the dark.

Daylight-saving time has long heen a subject of controversy in the United States, and the bill being considered this year - which would also begin daylightsavings time at the end of March - is not the first such proposal.

Similar bills extending daylight-savings time were introduced in 1976, 1981 and 1983, but didn't become law.

In past years, daylightsavings time has been extended only for energysaving purposes - during both world wars, during the entire year of 1974 and for eight months in 1975.



MPS-3 ship

PFC Williams visits Hawaii

Motor Vessel PFC De-Wayne T. Williams, one of the four ships to be used by the 1st Marine Amphibious Brigade in its new role with the Maritime Prepositioning Ships program, visited Pearl Harbor Oct. 16-21.

Brigade Marines took advantage of the visit to familiarize themselves with the ship which will hold approximately one-fourth of the 1st MAB's prepositioned combat equipment.

Members of the 1st MAB's newly-organized MPS-3 Planning Cell conducted briefings and tours of the ship, and arranged familiarization training for vehicle and equipment operators from BSSG and the 3d Marines.

The ship is one of 13 being chartered and manned by civilian crews of the Military Sealift Command as part of the MPS program. All MPS ships are named after Marines who won the Medal of Honor. Two other Marine Amphibious Brigades - the 6th MAB at Camp Lejeune, N.C.; and the 7th MAB at Twentynine Palms, Calif. operate in conjunction with

In the future, Marines will be able to be airlifted from their bases directly to, or near, an objective area where they will "marry up" with most of their equipment prepositioned aboard the merchant-class ships.

The four ships assigned to operate with the 1st MAB have been designated the MPS-3 squadron. The equipment the ships will carry will come from Marine Corps logistics bases on the mainland and will be loaded at an east or gulf coast port in mid-1986.

The four MPS-3 ships are: the Sgt. William R. Button, smoking.



New dog tags will ease paperwork burden

ans of the television series "MASH" no doubt remember the efficient company Cpl. Radar O'Reilly

"Radar" was the GI's dream: He knew where to find everything. In today's world of specialization, clerks

usually don't have access to all the information "Radar" did. Finance people have the finance records; personnel folks have the



personnel records; and medical people have the medical records.

After years of research, officials at the Soldier Support Division of the U.S. Army's Combat Develop-ment Directorate, Fort Benjamin Harrison, Ind., believe the new soldier data andwiched in plastic between two metal dog tags
— will enable service people
to carry detailed personal

information with them.

Chris Occhialini, systems manager for the soldier data tag, said the computer chip was the overwhelming choice for information

choice for information storage because it is more durable and its data can be crased and updated.

Laser cards and magnetic strips were considered, but magnetic strips could be crased by magnets and laser cards were susceptable to scratching. The chip being considered is

about one-quarter inch square and has a 64K. memory (about 15 pages of single-spaced typewritten information). Each chip is

expected to cost about \$30.
Before departing for overseas, checks must be made on each service member to see if they have a will, all necessary shots, medical profile, or how many more years of service does he or she have.

Today, everyone awaiting deployment lines up and has their paperwork processed manually by finance, personnel, medical

finance, personnel, medical and other representatives.
With the soldier data tag the computer chip would be handed over and placed into a reader. In 30 seconds or so, all needed information would be available.
A February 1983 test showed how efficient the soldier data tag could be to manifest troops boarding sircraft for deployment.

Presently, this information is compiled on paper, and changes must be sent back to administrative personnel for retyping.

During the test, soldiers boarding the aircraft handed over their computer chips, which were read into portable computers. Within accurate listing was provided to the aircraft commander.

The technology behind the soldier data tag and its associated equipment is impressive. Regionly impressive. Basically, the Army is studying ways to provide portable computers at lower command levels that are linked with larger

computers at higher levels. For example, during conflicts, soldier casualty information could be passe on to higher headquarters directly from the field. Not only would a casualty be identified, but higher See DOG/A-8



Safe vaccine for Hib available

If you have a child between the ages of 2 and 5, and particularly if the child attends a day-care center, you're aware of "Hib"— hemophilus influenza type b— a dangerous and potential, to the heaterial infection ly fatal bacterial infection that affects children of that

What you may not have heard is that there is a new vaccine that protects children from "Hib" disease.

The U.S. Center for Disease Control recommends the vaccine for all 2-year-old children and for children in high risk categories from 18

months of age until their fifth birthday. Dr. Ernest Takafuji, the Army's disease control

consultant, goes a step further. "I strongly recom-mend that all 2- to 5-year-old military children get the shot. The disease is most common among children in clustered conditions, and most military children, whether they're in base housing, day-care centers or family day care, fit that description," said Takafuji.

Besides day care children, those at high risk for Hib include children with no spleen, with Hodgkin's disease, with sickle-cell disease, and the poor.

The vaccine has been found to be 90 percent effective in children 18 to 71 months of age. Although the vaccine is not effective for children under 18 months, younger siblings and playmates will have a reduced chance of getting Hib if the 2-year-olds are vaccinated.

Unlike vaccines such as that for pertussis (whooping cough), the new Hib vaccine is made from only a part of

bacteria, rather than inactivated whole bacteria.
Such a purified vaccine appears to cause fewer adverse reactions.

In clinical trials, the only side effects — which were infrequent — involved swelling and soreness at the injection sight, as well as

some fever.
All service medical clinics are giving the vaccine, although temporary shortages may exist at some clinics because the vaccine's manufacturer has been having difficulty making enough to meet demand.

What is "Hib"?

Hib is the short term for "Hemophilus influenza type b," a bacterial infection that causes an estimated 12,000 cases of meningitis in the United States every year.

About 60 percent of the children who contact Hib get meningitis. Meningitis is a leading cause of acquired mental retarda-tion, and can also cause deafness.

In addition, every year Hib is responsible for 7,500

cases of pneumonia, infectious arthritis — a potentially crippling form of arthritis that affects children.— blood infection and epiglottitis, a swelling in the throat that can lead

to suffocation.

Hib infection leads to an estimated 1,000 deaths per year. Overall, children in

The Branch Medical Clinic, here, will be offering the Hib vaccination Nov. 7, to children ages 18 months old

children ages 18 months old and to those who have not reached their fifth birthday and are attending preschool or day care facilities.

Hib vaccine has been recently developed to protect susceptible children from becoming infected with the bacteria Hemophilus influenza, type B (Hib), which can cause the serious illnesses of epiglottitis and one type of meningitis. meningitis.

Because children in preschool and day care facilities come into close contact with other children, contact with other children, they are at particularly high risk of developing serious disease from Hib. This vaccine will now be a routine immunization given to children when they turn 2 years old.

Occhialini said different types of information would normally be accessed through a password known only to the wearer. That means finance people couldn't access routine medical information and the medics wouldn't have access to personnel information. There would be open access to emergency medical



Survivor benefit plan

Many career-minded servicemembers and those approaching retirement want know what the Survivor

to know what the Survivor Benefit Plan is about and how it affects retired pay. The SBP law was enacted in 1972. Basically, it is designed to provide income protection for survivors of a retired uniformed services. retired uniformed services-member following the retiree's death. Survivors may include a widow or widower, dependent children or persons with an insurable interest in a retiring member.

Cost of the plan

Income protection is provided through a survivor annuity. The cost of the annuity is withheld from the retiree's retired pay. The Federal Government also contributes to part of the SBP cost. Under current provisions of the law, the maximum SBP survivor payment is 55 percent of the

He or she may choose to reduce the amount of retired pay on which survivor payments are based or decline to participate in the SBP. The decision should be made in writing to the appropriate service at least 30 days before the first day for which the retiree can receive retired pay.

Automatic enrollment

A servicemember who

retires while on extended active duty who has not made an election is automatically enrolled in the SBP with maximum coverage when he or she retires if he or she has a spouse or dependent children at the time of retirement. A servicemember usually cannot withdraw from the plan once it is in effect unless he or she later becomes totally disabled.

If there is no spouse or dependent children at the time of retirement, then the servicemember can enroll in the program and name a beneficiary who has an insurable interest in him or her; otherwise, the retiree can start participation in the SBP when he or she acquires a spouse or child after



Energy use steadily rises

energy per person than any other people in the world. We have only 6 percent of the world's population, but we use about one-third of all the energy consumed on this globe. Our total national energy cost is steadily rising.

Where does all this energy go?

Our industry takes about 36 percent. Our commerce uses about 11 percent for enterprises including stores, offices, schools, and hospitals. Our residences take about 26 percent. And transportation accounts for another 29 percent or so.

Most of the energy we use in the United States comes from petroleum (crude oil). Because domestic production falls short of our needs, we have to import almost half of it.

Expert estimates of our known and potential domestic reserves vary, but most likely we have somewhere between a 25 to 30 year supply of oil, if we keep our energy-use growth rate at about 2 percent per

However, if we continue using energy as we have become accustomed to, we could run out of domestic oil supplies in the year 2007,

and we may run out of natural gas even sooner.

The overall energy situation in the United States is not rosy: Energy demand keeps rising; energy prices keep going up; the availability and future costs of supplies remain uncertain.

What can we do about it? Conserve energy. This will help us extend our supplies and reduce our import burdens until we develop new energy technologies and resources.

Without personal hardship, we could easily cut our energy use by an estimated 30 percent or more - saving energy for our country and money for ourselves.

The energy we use for our homes and automobiles gas, oil, electricity - draws on all of our energy resources. Cutting back on these uses is the simplest, most effective way to make our resources last longer. And each individual conservation effort, multiplied by millions, can serve as an "energy bank" — a supply that can be used to help balance our energy accounts.

We can conserve if we make energy thrift a part of our way of life - adopting commonsense energy habits.



Appliance energy savers

Making a product from recycled aluminum requires less than 10 percent of the energy that would be needed for the same product made from the ore.

· When you buy fabrics or garments, try to choose those that can be washed in cold water

and/or require little or no ironing.

· When shopping for an unusual item, telephone ahead to see if the store has it. If it doesn't, you save the energy and time of traveling there and being disappointed.

· Give gifts with yearround benefits. If you

have appliances on your gift list, select long-lasting models that use the least amount of energy.

 Don't buy motorized equipment or gadgets when hand-operated versions will do.

• Buy the household equipment that's right for you. Purchasing the right equipment for your home and needs, using it wisely, and taking good care of it can reduce energy costs considerably.

 Bigger isn't necessarily better. Don't buy a larger or more powerful piece of equipment than you need. Whether it's a furnace, airconditioner, or water heater, make sure its size and power are right for your home. Ask your dealer, a trade association, or a consumer-interest group for assistance in judging this factor.

Cooking energy savers

 Use cold water rather than hot to operate your food disposer. This saves the energy needed to heat the water, is recommended for the appliance, and aids in getting rid of grease. Grease solidifies in cold water and can be ground up and washed away.

• Install an aerator in your kitchen sink faucet. By reducing the amount of water in the flow, you use less hot water and save the energy that would have been required to heat it. The lower flow pressure is hardly noticeable.

 If you need to purchase a gas oven or range, look for one with an automatic (electronic) ignition system instead of pilot lights. you'll save an average of up to 47 percent of your gas use 41 percent in the oven and 53 percent on the top

 If you have a gas stove, make sure the pilot light is burning efficiently - with a blue flame. A yellowish flame indicates an adjustment is

needed. Never boil water in an open pan. Water will come to a boil faster and use less energy in a kettle or covered pan.

• Keep range-top burners and reflectors clean. They will reflect the heat better, and you will save energy.

 Match the size of pan to the heating element. More heat will get to the pan; less will be lost to surrounding air.

 If you cook with electricity, get in the habit of turning off the burners several minutes pefore the allotted cooking time. The heating element will stay hot long enough to finish the cooking



for you without using more

electricity.

 When using the oven, make the most of the heat from that single source. Cook as many foods as you can at one time. Prepare dishes that can be stored or frozen for later use or make all ovencooked meals.

 Watch the clock or use a timer; don't continually open the oven door to check food. Every time you open the door heat escapes and your cooking takes more energy.

• Use small electric pans or ovens for small meals rather than the kitchen range or oven. They use less energy.

 Use pressure cookers and microwave ovens if you have them. They can save energy by reducing cooking time.

bout 8 percent of all the energy used in the United States goes into running electrical home appliances, so appliance use and sele can make a considerable difference in home utility

Buying energy-efficient appliances may cost a bit more initially but that expense is more than made up by reduced operating costs over the lifetime of the appliance.

Energy efficiency may vary considerably though models seem similar. A wise selection requires a degree of time and effort.

Here are a few general ideas to consider when buying appliances:

 Buy products made of recycled materials or those that can be recycled - steel, aluminum, paper, and glass among others. More energy is used in the production of products from virgin materials than from recycled or reclaimed materials. For example, producing steel from scrap requires only one-quarter of the energy it would take when using virgin ores.

Dishwashing energy savers

The average dishwasher uses 14 gallons of hot water per load. Use it energy efficiently.

• Be sure your dishwasher is full, but not overloaded, when you turn

• When buying a dishwasher, look for a model with air-power and/or overnight dry settings. These features automatically turn off the dishwasher after the rinse cycle. This can save you up to one-third of your total

dishwashing energy costs.

• Let your dishes air dry. If you don't have an automatic air-dry switch, turn off the control knob after the final rinse. Prop the door open a little and the dishes will dry faster.

 Don't use the "rinse hold" on your machine. It uses 3 to 7 gallons of hot water each time you use it.

 Scrape dishes before loading them into the dishwasher so you won't have to rinse them. If they need rinsing, use cold water.

New eye surgery could affect military career

to correct myopia (nearsightedness) could affect a person's prospective or

current military career.

The procedure, called radial keratotomy, involves making small incisions in the

This diminishes the cornea's refractive power, permitting light to be focused closer to the retina. Improved focus results. If successful, the surgery diminishes the need for glasses or contact lenses. However, first-year results from a five-year study by the National Eye Institute to determine the efficacy, safety, predictability and stability of radial keratotomy show that while a majority of the eye operations resulted in a decrease of nearsighted-ness, some problems oc-

curred.

Of the 435 patients involved in the Prospective Evaluation of Radial Keratotomy study who underwent the surgery, 30 percent had underwented. percent had undercorrected

vision and continued to have some nearsightedness. Ten percent had their eyes overcorrected, resulting in farsightedness.

Two percent of the patients suffered a corneal perforation during surgery. Persistent glare, especially with night driving or flying, has been reported.

Since this is a relatively new procedure (having been performed in the United States since 1978), the long-

term effects will not be known for another 15 or 20 years. Navy Captain Ralph A. Sawyer, chairman of the Ophthalmology Department at Bethesda National Naval Hospital and ophthalmology consultant to the Navy surgeon general, reported that anyone who has had

radial keratotomy is not a candidate to enter the Navy "Anyone on active duty

who has the surgery is in violation of a Navy regulation." Sawyer said. One reason for the regulation is that no one knows the effect the surgery would have on persons operating in different atmospheric conditions both above and below the ocean, according to

Sawyer.

Air Force Lieutenant
Colonel John W. Shore,
chairman of the Department of Ophthalmology at the Air Force's Wilford Hall Medical Center and special assistant to the Air Force surgeon general for ophthalmology, said people who have had radial keratotomy cannot enlist or be commissioned in the Air Force.

The status of anyone currently on active duty who has the surgery will be determined on a case-by-case basis. People who have had radial keratotomies will not be considered for flying duties, according to Shore.

Army recruiters are prohibited from enlisting recruits who have had radial keratotomies. And according to an Army spokesman, active duty soldiers who have had the operation are subject to medical reevaluation of their fitness to remain on

active duty.

Soldiers in a non-flying status will not be considered for flying duties if they have

had the surgery.
Service ophthalmologists agree - radial keratotomy is an investigative procedures, and the long-term results are not known. One points out that, even after 18 months, the incisions on the cornea are only 75 percent healed.

Dangers of volatile liquids outlined

Explosions and fires can result while welding, cutting or performing other hot work on containers not entirely free of flammable vapors. Some substances that can produce flammable vapors when mixed with air or oxygen are;

Gasoline, naphtha, alcohol, thinner and volatile liquids that release vapors at atmospheric pressure and at normal and below normal temperatures;

Nonvolatile oils and solids that do not release flammable vapors at ordinary temperatures, but do so when exposed to neat: and

Acids that react with metals to produce hydrogen. These are safety tips when

hot work is to be accomplished on flammable liquids containers: All sources of ignition

should be removed. The container should be

emptied and drained of as much of its contents as possible. Fuel tanks of cars and

trucks should be removed. All the residue should be

disposed of safely by destroying it on an appropriate burning ground or disposing it at designated areas.

cleaned, it should be determined if it contains, or has contained, a flammable or combustible substance.

Drums and other small containers should be cleaned in the open to minimize the accumulation of flammable vapors in the cleaning area. If the cleaning must be done indoors, the cleaning area should be ventilated so that flammable vapors will be completely removed.

The inside of the container should be inspected to determine if it is clean. An inspection light for inspecting barrel and tank openings can be used. Such a light Before a container is should be explosion proof and

approved by a recognized authority as being safe for use in flammable vapors. If the inside of the container shows signs of scale, sludge, or rust, it should be cleaned again.

A combustible gas indicator should be used to test for vapors in the containers. If there is any evidence of vapor, the cleaning operation should be repeated.

Contact the Fire Department before doing any hot work on containers for proper, safe procedures and requirements for a hot work permit before the cleaning starts.
