Deputy SecNav evaluates family services

The Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Navy for Personnel and Family Matters, Alice M. Stratton, visited Navy and Marine Corps facilities in Hawaii Jan. 29-31.

Stratton, a Navy wife and an active family therapist, was recently appointed to this new position by Secretary of the Navy John F. Lehman, which will create and follow-up initiatives in quality of life issues, child abuse, spouse employment and drug and alcohol abuse.

Stratton arrived at Kaneohe Bay Jan. 31, and met with representatives from Family Advocacy and

senior enlisted Marines from the 1st MAB and the Air Station.

During the meeting, conducted at the Family Service Center, the representatives and Stratton noted and discussed four main topics: a need for expanding the child care facilities and reevaluation of tests and guidelines for day care run by spouses in government housing; classes on money management for Marines and spouses who have difficulty budgeting their funds; child and spouse abuse; emergency medical treatment and pediatric clinic problems.

DoD opposes legislation to cut future retirement funding

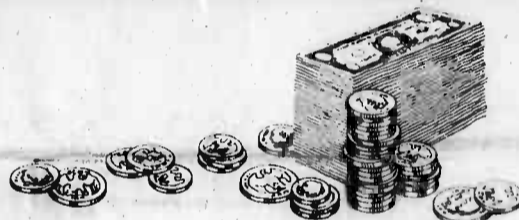
The Defense Department is flatly opposed to reductions in military retirement funding, a point Secretary of Defense Caspar W. Weinberger emphasized at length in a recent report to Congress.

"Although the Department of Defense has prepared the draft legislation as required by the Congress," he stated, "I want to make it absolutely clear that such action is not to be construed as support for either of the options for change."

The proposed changes would result in an average reduction in retirement benefits of about 16 percent (compared to the current system), but would affect only those entering the services after its enactment. All current and former service members would continue to accrue retirement benefits under the current retirement system.

Even though the two options apply only to future entrants, Weinberger expressed concern that such changes would have an immediate, adverse effect on the morale of the current force.

"No matter how the reduction is packaged," he said, "it communicates the same message, i.e., the perception that there is an erosion in support from the



American people for the service men and women whom we call upon to ensure our safety.

It says in absolute terms that the unique, dangerous and vital sacrifices they routinely make are not worth the taxpayers' dollars they receive, which is not overly generous. "I do not believe the majority of the American people support this view," Weinberger concluded, "and ask that you consider this in your deliberations on this very crucial issue to our national security."

The report, mandated by the Congress, contained two options for reducing military retirement funding by \$2.9 billion in fiscal 1986 and included an analysis of the impact the options might have on force readiness.

The first option would reduce the current 2.5 percent per year multiplier to 2.15

percent for each year up through 20 years and increase it to 3.2 percent for each year between 21 and 30 years. And it would change the retired pay calculation from the high-three-year average to a high-five-year average.

The cost-of-living adjustment in this option would be preserved at the full amount of the consumer price index increase.

The second option keeps the high-three system, but reduces the multiplier to 2.2 percent for each year up through 20 years and increases it to 3.1 percent for each year between 21 and 30 years.

The cost of living allowance would be limited to the consumer price index change minus one percentage point for life, with a one-time restoral at the 40th anniversary of initial entry into service.

Retired pay would be recalculated at the point of restoral to the amount to which the individual would have been entitled at that point had his original retired pay been fully indexed.

In his cover letter to the report, Weinberger also indicated serious concern over the significant reduction in future combat readiness that would result from losses of mid-level personnel if the proposed changes were enacted.

Housing allowance changes become effective March 1

Washington, D.C. — The amount of Variable Housing Allowance Marines receive will be tied to actual housing

costs, plus a standard utility/maintenance expense, starting March 1.

The change stems from the FY-86 DoD Authorization Act announced in ALMAR 001/86. Marines will be required to present proof of their actual rental or mortgage costs to their CO for certification before VHA can be authorized. In cases where BAQ plus the prescribed VHA exceed actual costs, the VHA will be reduced by one half of the difference.

Housing costs for renters will be limited to rent payment, liability and personal property insurance, plus the utility/maintenance expense. Marines who live in a rented mobile home or

house boat will be able to include lot or berthing fees.

Homeowners will be required to provide proof of mortgage payment, homeowner insurance and real estate taxes if not included in the mortgage, and the standard utility/maintenance expense. Marines who own and occupy mobile homes or house boats may also include their lot or berthing fees.

Detailed information on implementation and reporting procedures, along with a standard utility/maintenance expense table, are still being worked out. It will be published as soon as details are finalized prior to the new VHA provisions taking effect.

In memoriam . . .

Kenneth Delaney Dougherty Sr., 63, the Air Station's Safety and Occupational Health manager, died Jan. 26 from a heart ailment.

Dougherty worked at the Air Station's Safety Office since July 1983. He had 42 years of federal service, including employment with the Army and the Federal Aviation Administration. He retired from the U.S. Army as a major in August 1962.

He is survived by his wife, Sara, and three sons and one daughter.

History notes

One of the first black American heroes was Crispus Attucks, a Revolutionary War merchant seaman and fugitive slave. Leading an angry mob of townpeople against the unwelcome redcoats, he was the first to fall at the 1770 "Boston Massacre."

Freed blacks fought in the War of 1812, the Mexican War and the Civil War. By 1864, more than 180,000 blacks served in the Union Army in what was known as the United States Colored Troops, with 24 earning the Medal of Honor. Black troops of the 9th Cavalry saw action at San Juan Hill, Cuba, under the leadership of Teddy Roosevelt during the Spanish-American War.

In World War I, the all-black 369th Infantry Regiment of the 93rd Division became one of the most decorated units of the war.

Navy moves

Washington D.C. — Funding cutbacks for Permanent Change of Station moves will reduce the number of assignment changes made in FY-86 by about six percent.

The reductions are due to Congressional action that has put a "ceiling" on PCS spending. Certain policy changes have been made by the Chief of Naval Personnel to save money while considering the impact they will have on all Navy people and their families.

First, the term "careerists" has taken on a new meaning. Before, a person who was considered a careerist if 10 years of service had been completed. Now, careerists are members with more than four years active service who are on their second or subsequent enlistment.

All people in this category with a Projected Rotation Date of April 1986, or after will have their PRDs adjusted to reflect the Prescribed Sea Tour or normal shore tour for and rating instead of having

PRDs set at the Expiration of Active Obligated Service. PCS orders already received will remain in effect.

Another change affects males on their first enlistment with a four-year obligation who are assigned initially to continental U.S. shore duty. Before, a person was reassigned to sea duty after 18 months on shore duty. Now, only people in a "sea intensive" rating will be reassigned to sea duty after 18 months. If a rating is not considered "sea intensive" and a person's PRI is in

April or later, the PRD will be adjusted to the EAOS.

A third change affects the minimum tour-length requirements for training. First term enlistees must complete a tour of duty of at least 18 months before they can receive training in conjunction with PCS order. Careerists must do a tour of at least 24 months to qualify. All requests after March 1 must meet these requirements.

Finally, neutral duty tours are now 37 months. People currently under orders to sea duty are not affected. However, some orders to shore duty may be cancelled

in cases where hardship would not be a factor to the person involved.

These policy changes will reduce the number of PCS moves and help the Navy to live within Congressional PCS move limitations.



POW medal approved

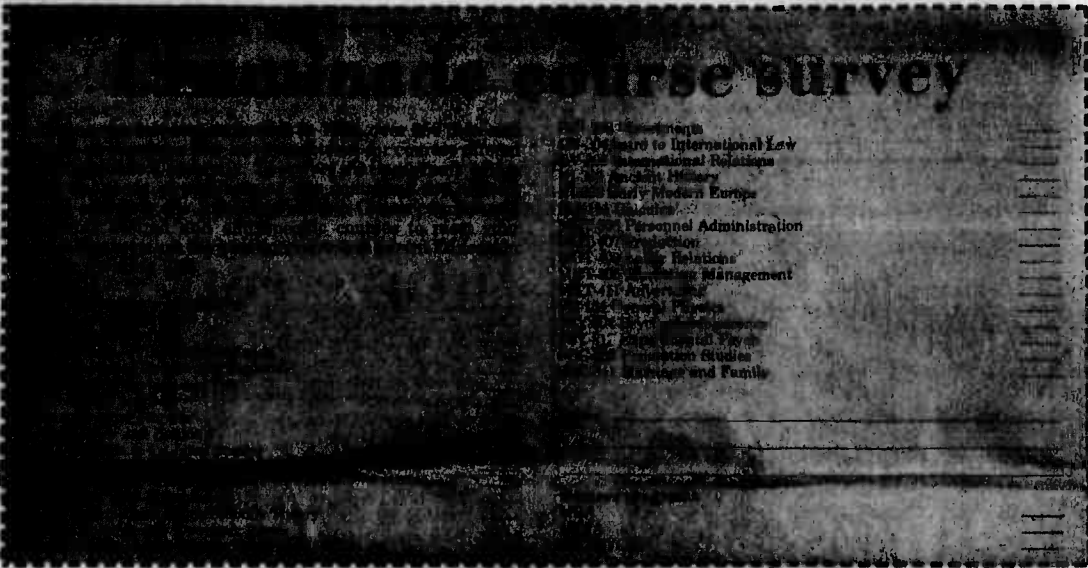
Washington D.C. — A Prisoner-Of-War medal was approved under the 1986 Department of Defense Authorization Act.

The POW medal will be considered a Defense Service Medal and will rank in precedence as the highest service medal that can be

given to a person. A POW is "someone who, while serving in any capacity with the Armed Forces of the U.S., was taken prisoner and held captive after April 1, 1917." Steps are being taken to design the medal and identify potential recipients.

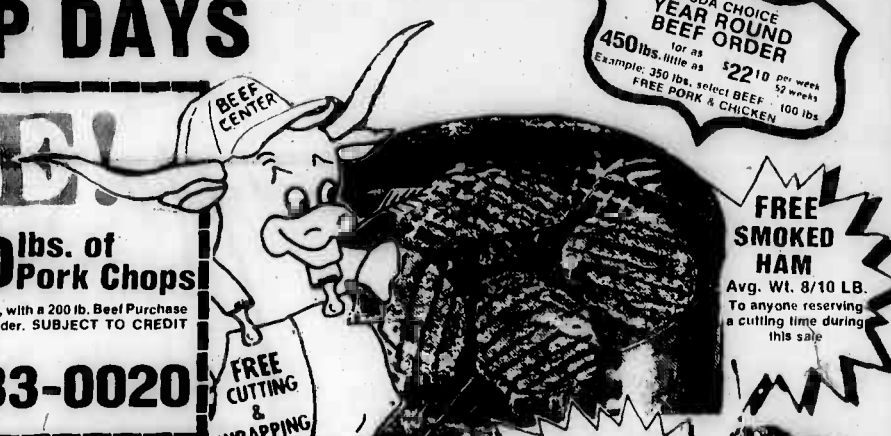

ON BEHIND THE FIGHTING U.S. MARINES

What will you call them?

'They're Marines, call them Marines'

Forty-three years ago today, women Marines became an official part of the Marine Corps, with the creation of the Women's Reserve.

Prior to 1943, Women Marines were not considered to be an "official part" of the Corps. In WWI, women served as "Reservists (Female)" from Aug. 12, 1918 to July 30, 1919. These Reservists mainly performed clerical duties because of a government estimate that "40 percent of the work at Headquarters Marine Corps could be performed by women as well as men."

Most of these 'Marinettes' were assigned to Headquarters Marine Corps, in the offices of the Paymaster, Quartermaster, and in the office of the Commandant. A handful were stationed in recruiting offices across the United States.

On July 30, 1919, Gen. George Barnett, the Commandant, issued orders for the separation of all the reservists. The Marine Corps again became a strictly male-dominated service.

Women didn't wear the Marine Corps uniform again until 1943 when America, faced with manpower shortages on the

fighting front, began using women in various duties to 'Free a Marine to Fight.'

On Feb. 13, 1943, Gen. Thomas Holcomb, the Commandant, publicly announced the formation of a new Women's Reserve. Gen. Holcomb was asked after this, "The Army has its WACs; the Navy, its WAVES; the Coast Guard, its SPARs. What will you call your women?" "They're Marines," replied Gen. Holcomb, "call them Marines."

Holcomb's statement symbolized the two morale factors that made the World War II Women's Reserve a success:

First, Marines shared their name and the pride they felt with the women; and the Marine Corps became the first service not to refer to women by a quasi-official nickname or an alphabetical designation.

Secondly, the men's distinctive uniform was followed closely with

necessary modifications for a woman's physique.

During World War II the new Marines, unlike their predecessors who perform only clerical duties, began serving in jobs such as photography, communications, supply, disbursing, intelligence, parachute rigging and gunnery instruction.

Although limited to state-side duty only in the early days of their activation, their theatre of operations

widened to Europe and the far East, as well as Hawaii and Alaska. The ranks of the women's reserve swelled to 19,000 approximately the size of a Marine Corps division.

Gen. Alexander Vandergrift, Commandant of the Marine Corps, remarked that the Women's Reserve "could feel responsible for putting the 6th Marine Division in the field; for without the women filling

job throughout the Marine Corps, there would not be sufficient men available to form that division."

Terminal date for demobilization of all World War II women's reserve units was Sept. 1, 1946. Prior to that date, though, approval was given to retain a small group of women's reserves.

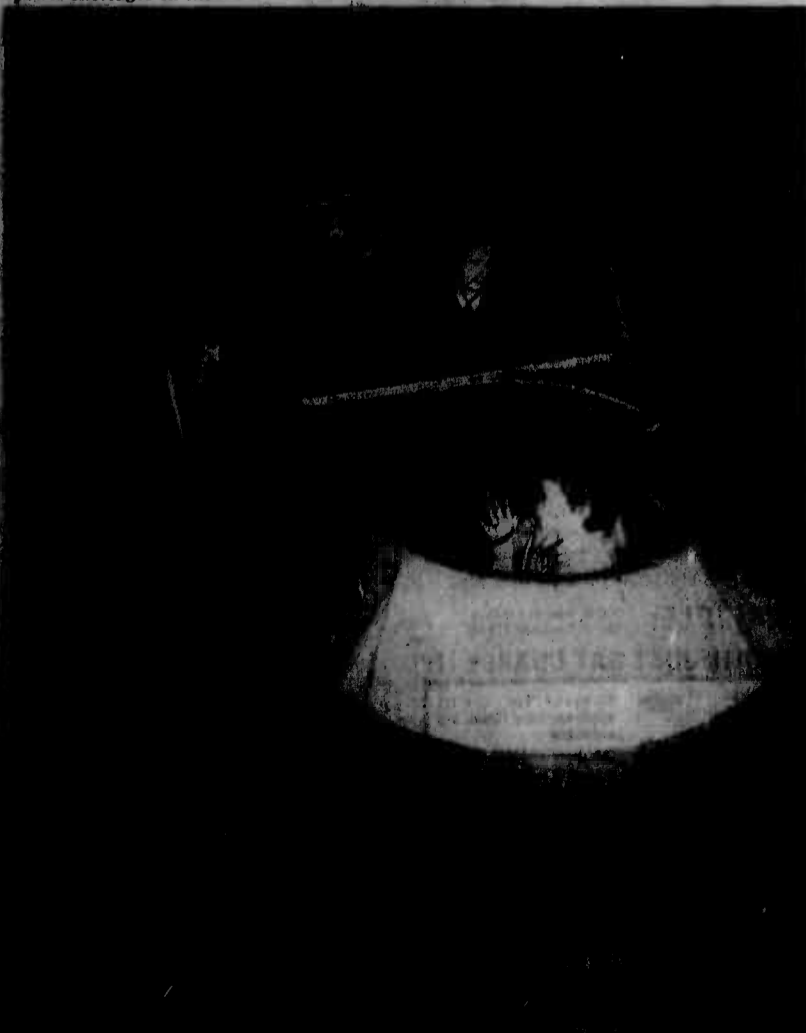
At Headquarters Marine Corps, this small group worked out plans for a post war reserve. Their plans called for the enrollment of increased numbers of women into the Corps in case of future national emergencies.

From the end of 1946 to early 1948, only 100 women reservists remained on active duty. On June 12, 1948, Congress passed the Women's Armed Services Integration Act. With this act, women were accepted into the regular Marine Corps; in January 1949, recruiting began.

In 1986 women now no longer serve the Marine Corps simply to "Free a Marine to Fight" as they did in 1943; they now serve to fulfill the Marine Corps mission alongside their male counterparts.

Station sailor reflects on black history

EDITOR'S NOTE: The following article is the first of a series, featuring black Marines and sailors at Kaneohe Bay, to commemorate Black History Month.

I've been around animals all my life and always had a special love for them. As long as I can

remember I've wanted to be a veterinarian or game warden, and I also wanted medical experience. I thought I'd start with people and then switch to animals."

That's how Seaman Elicia Cole, a hospitalman assigned to the Kaneohe Branch Medical Clinic here, explained how she got into the Navy's medical field.

Cole, a 21-year-old native of Erie, Pa., got involved in the health field while in high school. "I went to a vocational school where you had classes in the morning and worked on a program in the afternoon," explained Cole. "I knew I wanted to get into medicine, so I joined the nursing assistant program.

She joined the Navy to take a break from school, and studied biology at

Edinboro State University, in Erie, for one year. "I went there right out of high school, so I needed a break and wanted to travel," Cole said.

Along with her interest in animals, Cole also pursues needlepoint and model building. "I am very close to my brother, and he was into building models, so I got involved," Cole said.

Between helping people at the Outpatient Clinic, Cole

took time to reflect on Black History month, being celebrated now. "Everyone should remember where they came from and why they are here," said Cole. "By commemorating Black History Month and celebrating your ancestry, you can feel good about who you are."

"For me, Black History month is a chance to reflect on my heritage, to keep up with my background and

know where I'm from," she said.

Cole feels that Black History Month has done a lot to improve the relations between people of different ethnic backgrounds. "Anytime you have people of different races who don't understand what the other race is about, you're going to have some hostility. Knowing a little about that

Free income tax assistance available

The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program, sponsored by the Internal Revenue Service, is in its 17th year of providing free personal service to taxpayers, and has been conducted here for several years.

Trained volunteers help taxpayers complete Federal Forms 1040, 1040A and 1040EZ, including exemptions, deductions and special credits for those who may be eligible.

different race will help get rid of the fear and hostility," Cole said.

According to HN Cole, people still need to stop stereotyping themselves and others. "A lot of black people who grew up poor resign themselves to being poor all their lives. They need to break that stereotype. A better understanding of the accomplishments of blacks

can help them do that," Cole said.

Cole grew up in a middle-class white neighborhood in a town where most of the blacks are poor. "My father was a teacher, so he did pretty well for himself," she said. "I think a lot of my friends looked at that and were inspired to work a little harder to get out of the rut of being poor. Black History Month lets other blacks see those accomplishments," Cole said.

HMM-165 returns from deployment

The "White Knights" of HMM-165 returned here Feb. 4, marking the end of their six-month deployment to the Far East.

The squadron arrived at MCAS Futenma on Aug. 4, to begin what would end up as being a successful deployment, according to LtCol. T.A. Braaten. HMM-165's commanding officer, "Nobody likes being away from home," said Braaten, "but we proved a lot during this deployment. During Operation Bear Hunt in Korea, we proved we could live in tents in the field — which is unusual for a squadron — and still keep all the aircraft up," said LtCol. Braaten.

While on deployment, the squadron was busy participated in several operations and joint ventures, including, a search and rescue exercise in Iwakuni, Japan; Operation Bear Hunt, in the Republic of Korea; carrier qualifications aboard the

USS St. Louis; night insertions and extractions for 2/3's Raidex; and exercises Night Owl and Large Force, and Operation Beach Crest.

One measure of the squadron's success was their completion of all assigned missions, and assuming missions for HMM-361 after some aircraft was grounded for mechanical troubles.

The White Knights encountered some difficulties during the deployment which makes their success even more remarkable.

Limitations were placed on the pilots, including a 500-foot minimum altitude for training flights; no night vision goggle training; and no evasive maneuver tactical training.

Typhoons also caused problems. "They are always a problem at that time of the year in that area. Every time one passed near the island, we had to pack everything up, which put us out of action for two days," said Braaten. "Luckily nothing was damaged, but it was certainly inconvenient."

The squadron did get some training that isn't available here, according to the squadron executive officer, Major E.W. Marks. "It was nice to get to do some longer flights than just from Kaneohe Bay to the Pohakuloa Training Area," said the major. Also, the weather on

Okinawa is a lot worse than it is here, so we got to do a lot of actual instrument flying, which was good for the pilots," said Maj. Marks.

By the end of January, HMM-165 had turned over all its aircraft to HMM-364, which replaced them in the Unit Deployment Program,

before returning to Kaneohe Bay.

"Anytime you go to a foreign country, you become familiar with the contingencies which might occur should we actually be called up. For that reason, the deployment was very successful," concluded Braaten.

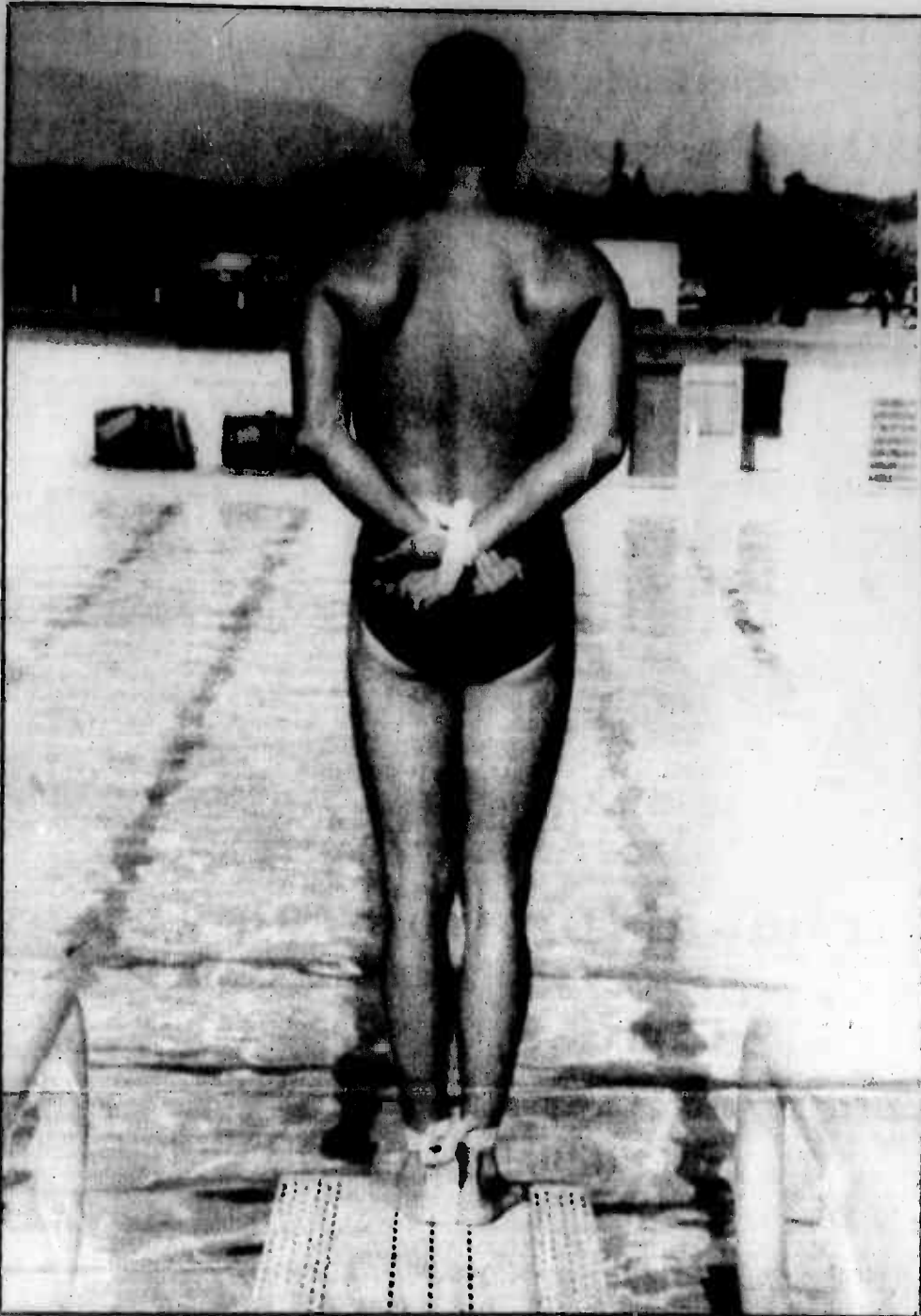

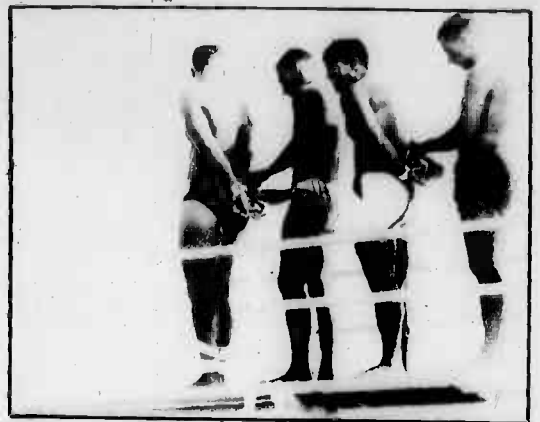

Only the best become WSSIs

Standing at the edge of the board, his hands and feet tied, a Marine prepares to jump into the water 10 feet below. He appears scared and seems far from "relaxed," a term his instructors stressed to him over and over . . .

As students of the Water Safety Survival Course, here, they take up one of the most physically challenging four-week courses in the Marine Corps. Offered twice a year, the goal is for students to learn how to instruct others in water safety and swimming skills. In addition, students will be certified in cardiopulmonary resuscitation, advanced life saving, and aquatic water survival.

According to Gunnery Sergeant Don Wilburn, WSSI Trainer, LFTC Pac, Coronado, the course requirements are that students be first class swimmers; able to swim 500 meters in 14 minutes or less; have one year left in the Marine Corps; be a corporal or above, and be in good physical condition.

The course involves advanced life saving,

techniques of military instruction, so they can teach classes; cardiopulmonary resuscitation for rescues; and confidence skills for endurance, according to Wilburn. There are written examinations, pool exercises and aerobics for cardiac strength and

muscle tone; and pool and beach rescues included in the course.

"No student can be weak in one area; they have to master all the skills," said Sgt. Bret Schmidt, a student from Co. E, 2/3, "If you're weak somewhere, you'll be dropped."

After a while, the Marine who was in the high dive gained control and jumped. Once in the water, he went through a series of drills. He did two underwater somersaults without breaking the surface, and retrieved a boot from the bottom with his

teeth. Back on the surface, he threw the boot over his shoulder.

His reward for all of this was to swim the final 30 meters to the opposite edge of the pool, and the distinction of being a Marine Corps Water Safety Survival Instructor.

DoD sets new charter flight guidelines

Most military transport aircraft are not configured to carry passengers — comfortably. Since civilian airliners are built to do just that, the Defense Department moves 95 percent of its passengers, including military families, on chartered civilian airlines. Most of the contracting is done through the Air Force's Military Airlift Command.

In light of the recent aircraft accident at Gander, Newfoundland, the Department of Defense has instituted a high-priority review of policies and procedures relating to the air transportation of DoD personnel and their families.

Previously, resurveys of

contract airlines were conducted only when a problem was brought to the attention of the Military Airlift Command. Under new rules, each contract airline will be resurveyed on an annual basis. "The resurvey," said a Military Airlift Command official, "will be as complete and thorough as a pre-award survey (see accompanying story) to ensure that the airline still meets Federal Aviation Administration and Military Airlift Command contract standards."

"Maintenance facilities, both at the airlines headquarters and in other parts of the country will now be surveyed on a regular basis."

The number of spot

surveys at aerial ports will be increased from 10 percent of the transit aircraft to 50 percent.

Currently, MAC contract administrators from all

parts of the country fly aboard MAC charter flight on occasion to verify that the airline is meeting the requirements of the contract. These "range riders," as they are known,

are not there to rate a pilot's performance, but rather to see that the passenger safety and comfort requirements are being met.

As an additional safety

precaution, DoD has now requested cockpit privileges through the Federal Aviation Administration to allow rated military pilots to observe contract airline pilots on occasion.

Coors sponsors new scholarship

Applications for the 1986 Coors Veteran's Memorial Scholarship Fund, which provides more than \$500,000 to the sons and daughters of American veterans, will be available starting March 3.

For the second year, Coors and Coors distributors will award a minimum of 100 scholarships with a maximum value of \$5,000 each, to eligible students who successfully have completed their freshman year of college.

"The program was designed to salute American veterans and express our company's appreciation for their sacrifices," said Peter Coors, Brewing Division president. "The response to our 1985 program was overwhelming. We received applications from college students all across the United States."

Last year, 114 scholarships, totalling \$501,000 were awarded to applicants in 49 states and Puerto Rico. In addition, Coors distributors raised an additional \$254,000 through canister collections and special promotions to award local scholarships and support veterans organiza-

tions in their communities.

To be eligible, applicants must have completed at least one year of college; have a cumulative grade-point-average of at least 2.75 on a 4.0 scale; and be under 22 years of age as of July 1, 1986.

Applicants must be family members of honorably discharged U.S. Armed Forces personnel or family members of American service personnel killed in action, missing in action or who died in the line of duty. There is no restriction on when the serviceperson was in the armed forces.

The student may reside anywhere worldwide, but must be enrolled full-time in an accredited four-year institution of higher education in the United States.

Applications can be obtained from local Coors distributors or participating veterans organizations, by writing Coors Veterans' Memorial Scholarship Fund, P.O. Box 7529, Wheeling, Ill., 60090, or by calling, toll-free, 1-800-492-6677. Deadline for applications and materials is July 1, 1986.

How MAC charters granted

Airlines wishing to transport U.S. military personnel and their families under contract to the Military Airlift Command must first pass a strict and exhaustive inspection by a Military Airlift Command capability survey team.

"When an airline volunteers to come on board as a member of the Civil Reserve Air Fleet, a pre-awarded survey is conducted," said a Military Airlift Command official. "The team will first visit the Federal Aviation Administration office responsible for the airline's

certification to verify that the airline is currently operating within the FAA's specifications."

The survey teams are not responsible for the routine safety inspections of chartered aircraft. "MAC relies heavily on the FAA inspectors for operations and maintenance inspections," said the official. The team, which usually consists of a rated pilot and a maintenance expert, are Federal Aviation Administration-trained beyond their normal Air Force training.

The next step in a pre-award survey is a visit to the airline itself.

"The team interviews airline officials and reviews safety programs, management procedures, maintenance schedules, flight operations, crew qualifications, training programs and the financial management of the airline," said the spokesman.

The team will then survey the actual airframes, inside and out, to be sure the potential contractor complies with specific military requirements.

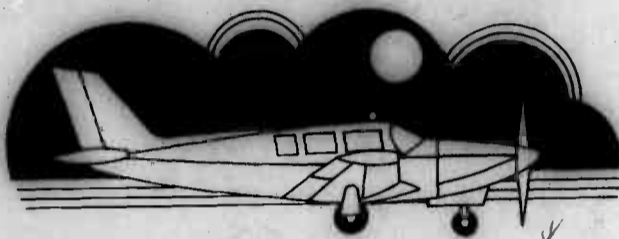
"MAC contract flights, whether for cargo or for passengers, must meet some unique military requirements," said the official. "Besides being very

concerned with safety, we are also concerned with passenger comfort."

For example, the seat spacing in Military Airlift Command contract flights is, in all cases, more than the Federal Aviation Administration requires.

All Military Airlift Command contract airlines must be a part of the Civil Reserve Air Fleet, which is comprised of aircraft that operate in the civilian world in peacetime and are committed to agument the Military Airlift Command in wartime.

Airlines that do not meet Federal Aviation Administration and Military Airlift Command standards are not allowed to be in the Civil Reserve Air Fleet and thus are not eligible for contract flights. That means if a discrepancy in standards is discovered, U.S. military personnel or their families will not fly on that airline until it corrects the deficiencies and is resurveyed.



Exchange privileges explained

As of Sept. 1, 1985, patrons at the Exchange here are no longer required to have their ID cards checked at the door, but only authorized patrons can make purchases.

"This change in policy of not having to present an ID card when entering the Exchange is not something new," said CWO-2 Leo Bueno, assistant Marine Corps

exchange officer. "Most mainland Marine Corps Exchanges go by this policy," he said.

Military personnel and their families can sponsor friends and relatives into the Exchange; however, this does not allow authorized patrons to purchase goods for their friends and relatives unless they are bonafide gifts.

According to the Marine Corps Exchange Manual,

commanders can take appropriate disciplinary action against military personnel who purchase merchandise to resell it or to make money from it; or who have bought merchandise or services for the benefit of others who are not entitled to the privilege. "This shall not be construed as preventing anyone who is entitled to exchange privileges from purchasing lunches or

refreshments for occasional bona fide guests or from making purchases for use as bona fide gifts," the manual states.

"All Marine Corps Exchanges sales made to military personnel and their families are made in good faith. Those who choose to abuse the system risk losing their exchange privileges and face possible disciplinary action," said Bueno.
