## Advanced VHA/BAQ now available

If you are wondering where you are going to get the money it takes to establish a home once you arrive here, worry no more. Marines can now get advanced Variable Housing Allowance (VHA) and Basic Allowance for Quarter (BAQ) to pay security deposits, the first month's rent, and for expenses in settling.

This advanced payment is intended for easing the burden of getting settled in a high cost area such as Hawaii, but will not be approved for those who are buying real estate.

The amount of the advanced payment is determined on the basis of the individual's housing expenses and authorized housing allowances; but before you can get the money, you must show your lease, utility bills statement, and other documents which may be necessary to approve the payment.

Another consideration to grant the advance payment is the individual's ability to

repay the money, which will also be considered in the amount to be advanced. Under no circumstances will the advance exceed the individual's anticipated expenses.

Paying back the advanced VHA/BAQ will be in monthly installments of 1/12th the amount advanced, due monthly for 12 months. Collection will be made on the first day of the month, and is usually deducted from your pay check.

When necessary, and justified, initial collection of the advance payment can be postponed for up to three months, and payments can be spread over a period longer than a year; but it will not exceed the individual's tour of duty in Hawaii.

So if you are strapped for "bucks" to get settled in Hawaii, see your unit pay clerk. It's easier than you think.

## First island Marine command celebrates 83 years service

Camp H. M. Smith — The first Marine Corps establishment to set command on Hawaiian soil will commemorate 83 years on Feb. 9.

Marine Barracks, Pearl Harbor, now Marine Barracks Hawaii, was officially established in 1904 when 50 Marines from the USS Sheridan became the first Marine detachment ashore under the command of Capt. A. W. Catlin, the first Barracks commanding officer.

The Marines were initially billeted in a coal shed at the old naval station on Ala Moana Boulevard, near Aloha Tower. They remained there for four years before being moved into tents in Honolulu.

Congress appropriated \$135,000 on March 3, 1909, for the construction of a Marine Barracks. On March 19, 1912, a contract for the construction of the barracks and quarters was awarded. Two years later, in August 1914, the Marines moved from Honolulu to Pearl Harbor.

Since that time, the Barracks Marines have provided perimeter and internal security for various naval installations on the island. The Marines also participate in

honor guards, burial details, ceremonies, color guards and parades. The Barracks annually conducts four sunset parades, of which one is traditionally in honor of the Navy's Birthday and one in honor of the Marine Corps' Birthday.

In 1933, a separate Marine Barracks was established at the Naval Ammunition Depot, Oahu, now Naval Magazine, Lualualei. One was also formed at Naval Air Station Barbers Point. In July 1976, the three barracks were consolidated to become Marine Barracks Hawaii.

In response to a restructuring of the Marine Corps' security forces, Guard Companies Barbers Point and Lualualei were deactivated last May. Marines also relinquished their posts at Pearl Harbor's gates to Navy and civilian security forces. With this change, which caused a reduction of personnel, 16 officers and 427 enlisted Marines remained at the Barracks.

Guard Company, Wahiawa at the Naval Communications Area Muster Station, Eastern Pacific, and Guard Company, West Loch/Wai-

kele bring the figure to almost 600 Marines involved in extensive security tasks throughout Oahu.

Guard Company, Wahiawa was detached from Marine Barracks, Pearl Harbor, and sent to Wahiawa in 1941. Guard Company, West Loch/Waikele was initially a part of Marine Barracks, Naval Ammunition Depot, Oahu.

Although they are separated, the two companies have basically the same mission as Marine Barracks Hawaii, whose past commanders include three Medal of Honor winners, and three

who became Marine Corps' commandants.

Colonel I. B. Chesty Puller was also a commander from 1948 to 1950; and on June 26, 1974, building 221, which houses the command headquarters, dining facility and administrative section, was renamed Puller Hall.

From the time the Navy Department landed a force of Marines on the islands, the command has grown to include over 60 buildings on its 49-acre tract of land. It ranks as one of the largest barracks in the Marine Corps.

## Tax rates down; new form out

Camp H.M. Smith, — The Tax Reform Act of 1986 made many changes to the law that could affect Marines' taxes for 1987.

The new law requires all Marines to complete a new Internal Revenue Service

form W-4 by Oct. 1, 1987, which is necessary because many common deductions have been repealed, and tax rates have been lowered.

When the new tax law takes effect on Jan. 1, 1987, the number of exemptions cur-

rently claimed by Marines may result in incorrect withholding. If too little is withheld, Marines may face an unexpected tax liability when filing their 1987 tax returns, especially those Marines who have working spouses, itemize deductions, and/or have nonwage incomes.

"At the end of the year, if a person's withholdings does not cover 90 percent of the tax liability, a penalty will be assessed," said Charles Matsuda of the local IRS office.

In addition, the IRS could impose a \$500 penalty for underwithholding. "This happens when someone files a false claim," said Matsuda. One of the areas in which the IRS could claim intentional fraud happens when an individual files to be exempted from a tax liability and doesn't qualify.

"Only certain individuals qualify, and they must meet two requirements," he said.

They should have had no liability in the prior year, and do not expect to have any tax liability in the current year. Also, if someone claims 14 or 15 exemptions, and can't prove or justify them, it is considered a false claim.

To prevent underwithholding, Marines may prefer overwithholding in order to get a refund; but by doing this a Marine deprives himself of part of his pay throughout the year. He also gives the government interest-free use of his money until a tax claim is filed.

To help prevent over or underwithholding, the new W-4 will have complete instructions for computing the appropriate number of exemptions. The form should be completed and returned to the unit's administration office.

## HMM-364 gets new 'birds'

Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron-364 recently received six new CH-46E Serviceability, Reliability and Maintainability helicopters, the first squadron in Hawaii to receive the updated aircraft.

The helicopters came from NAS North Island, Calif., where the modifications were made. The new version of the helicopter need less maintenance per flight hour.

"The modifications were made to keep the CH-46's operational into the 1990's when they will be replaced by the MV22 OSPREY," said LtCol. C. T. Dunstan, commanding officer of HMM-364.

According to LtCol. Dunstan, HMM-364 has six more CH-46's to go through rework; and, eventually, all squadrons will have the updated version.

## Cope Canine

# Air defense exercise held

Hickam AFB, — Cope Canine, a joint military air defense exercise, will be conducted in and around Hawaii

Feb. 6, and 7. Service members from the U.S. Air Force Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard and Hawaii Air

National Guard will be participating.

Cope Canine, a U.S. Commander in Chief, Pacific Command, sponsored exercise, is planned and coordinated by the 326th Air Division and will test the capabilities and readiness of the 326th AD, the HANG and other military units to respond to simulated air attacks.

The 326th AD, headquartered at Wheeler AFB, is responsible for directing and evaluating air defense activities during Cope Canine. Exercise activities will be held in designated training areas north and south of the island of Oahu. Three Navy ships will provide sea-based anti-air missile support during the exercise.

Participants in this exercise will also include the 154th Composite Group; 150th and 169th Aircraft Control and Warning Squadrons; 199th Tactical Fighter Squadron; 15th Air Base Wing; and 9th Airborne Com-

mand and Control Squadron. Also, the 92nd Bombardment Wing, Fairchild AFB, Wash.; 962nd Airborne Warning and Control Squadron, Elmendorf AFB, Alaska; 6924th Electronic Security Group, Wheeler AFB; and Air Force Reserve units 419th Tactical Fighter Wing and 940th Air Refueling Squadron from Hill AFB, Utah.

Other units include Patrol Wing-2 and Fleet Composite Squadron-1 from NAS, Barbers Point; Coast Guard Air Station, Barbers Point; and Marine Aircraft Control Squadron-2 and other units of Marine Aircraft Group-24 stationed at Marine Corps Air Station, Kaneohe Bay.

Aircraft assigned to the Hawaii Air National Guard provide the Air Force with response capability for the air defense of Hawaii. Additionally, the HANG operates two radar sites around-the-clock at Mt. Kaala AD on Oahu and Kokee AD on Kauai.

# Food Stamp forms available at FSC

Service members here who think they qualify for the Food Stamp program can pick up application forms at the Family Service Center.

After filling out applications, members may either mail them in or take them to the Applications Unit #3 Office, located at 45-260 Wai-kalua Rd., Kaneohe, HI 96744.

If the applications are mailed, the member will receive an appointment by mail. But if the applications are personally delivered, an appointment can be set up then. The advantage of taking the applications instead of mailing them is that a member's eligibility for Food Stamps starts the day the office receives the applications.

Once at the appointment, the social worker will collect all information, to include any verification of pay or social security numbers. Depending on the completeness of the applications and any verifications, claims may take up to 30 days, so take all the information you may need.

The Applications Unit #3 office is open Monday through Friday, from 7:45 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. For more information, call 247-2178.

Food Stamp Officer (DSS1). It is very important that recipients respond to the letter within 10 days after receiving it. No response will cause ineligibility for Food Stamp benefits.

## Children's Dental Health Month set

bed to have 10 or more decayed primary (baby) teeth by the time he/she is two years old. This problem is called "nursing bottle tooth."

Another way "nursing bottle mouth" can occur is when a toddler is allowed to carry a bottle around with him all day. Not only does this all-day bottle habit diminish your toddler's appetite at mealtimes, it also increases his chances for cavities by increasing his sugar consumption.

The best way to avoid "nursing bottle mouth" is not to put a bottle in bed with your infant and not to allow a toddler to carry a bottle around during the day.

If the bottle serves as a pacifier, then fill it with water, which will not harm teeth and its natural amount of fluoride will strengthen your baby's teeth against decay.

Pediatric dentists have witnessed an epidemic of tooth decay in children who are given bottles as pacifiers.

Usually the child is put in a bed at night or naptime with a bottle with milk or other sweetened beverage. When the child falls asleep, he/she does not swallow the last mouthful of liquid; it stays in constant contact with his/her teeth.

The sugar in the liquid is turned to acid in the child's mouth and it works all night to dissolve the enamel on your baby's teeth.

It is not uncommon for a child who takes a bottle to

# 'Da kine' Marine calls it quits, stays home

Sergeant Major E. T. Alvarado bid farewell to the Marines here on Jan. 29, after 32 years of service to Corps and country.

Alvarado's first encounter with the Marine Corps was in high school. "Most of my friends were already in the reserve program, and so were my two older brothers. So I joined during my junior year in high school. After boot camp at San Diego, I was a 60mm mortarman with the 15th Rifle Company nicknamed "Da kine Marines," explained Alvarado.

After graduating from St. Louis High School in Honolulu, Alvarado stayed with the reserves for about two years. "After school, I just did odd jobs, and in 1957 I decided to pursue a career in the Corps," he said.

The sergeant major did just

that by completing 30 years of active duty. The last 10 of those years were as a sergeant major. With the wealth of Marine Corps knowledge the sgtmaj. has accumulated, he had this to say to "his" troops:

"I believe that every Marine is a potential sergeant major. It's just a matter of doing your work 100 percent and more, taking the initiative and attending as many schools as you can to develop your knowledge. Also, you should set good examples for the younger Marines who are following. The upward mobility is there. Nobody ever gets stagnated by the Marine Corps; individuals do that to themselves.

"In the Corps, a good guideline to follow and practice is 'advise and supervise' because, somewhere in your

career, you either are going to be advising or supervising; those are areas that you must be effective in," the sergeant major said.

In all his years of advising and supervising, the sergeant major said his biggest supporter has been his wife, Helen.

"The Marine Corps has been rewarding, and Helen has given me the support I needed throughout my career. Also, I think that the Marine Corps has made my children more stable in life compared to other children. All the traveling from the

east coast, midwest and west coast, was a wealth of education and experience for them," he said.

"It seems that many of the places I've been stationed at are non-existent now, so that tells me it is time to retire," he said, chuckling.

SgtMaj. Alvarado ended his Marine Corps career where it all began 32 years ago as "Da kine" Marine; at home, in Kaneohe.

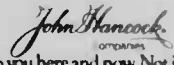

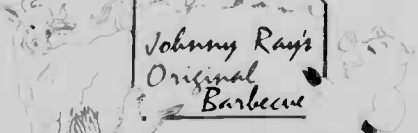

## From 'black gear' to bagpipes; Camp Smith's PMO enjoys the sounds

Camp H.M. Smith — The skirt he wore complemented his knee-high socks, and his "purse" added the finishing touch; this is not an outfit you would expect to see a Marine Corps provost marshal wearing.

For Captain Barry Cronin, this outfit is becoming more and more commonplace as he and other members of the Clan Na Gael Shamrock Pipe Band participate in parades and other community activities.

According to Cronin, the outfit is probably of Scandinavian design and includes the skirt, a kilt, knee-high socks, a purse, a sporrans to carry small items, and the hat — a bul moral.

Cronin became interested in the bagpipe more than five years ago when a bagpiper "piped" him and his wife out of a church following their wedding ceremony. "I liked the way it sounded, and I wanted to know how difficult it was to play," he said.

He was told it was a very difficult instrument to master, but that it was within his capabilities. "I started playing, and I essentially taught myself in my spare time," he said.

Before he began playing the bagpipe, the Manchester, N.H., native had never played a musical instrument before. "It took me a long time. You don't just pick up bagpipes and begin to play. You start with a practice chanter, which is similar to a small flute," said Cronin. "The chanter helps in mastering the fingering, which

can be pretty difficult. This is also how you learn to play the melody, which includes the notes — all of the little grace notes and doublings.

That's where the real difficulty lies, according to Cronin. "You can play a tune, but it's very boring to go from one note to another. So, in between, you add little quick notes — doublings, triplings — that give a little 'blip'."

Bagpipes are available through a variety of manufacturers in Scotland; and according to the nine year veteran, most pipe bands today use Scottish bagpipes. He also added that an estimated cost for a good set of pipes would be around \$500. "If you take care of them, they'll last for several generations," he said.

The Scottish pipes are usually made out of African black wood. The bag, which

occasionally has to be replaced because it's made out of animal skin, is airtight and has a blowpipe into which you blow in the air. It has to be full of air at all times.

Breathing and squeezing the bag needs to be synchronized in order to maintain the same pressure on the reeds inside each drone to keep the sound continuous. The drones are the tall stalks that are carried on the shoulder. There are two tenor and a bass drones.

"Playing the bagpipe can be very tiring because of the wind involved. You're constantly breathing, so your facial muscles need to be built up. Your fingers also get tired because you're con-

stantly fingering," he said.

Variations of the bagpipe have been around for hundreds of years. According to Cronin, who is a St. Anselms College alumnus, the exact origin is in question. The first documented pipes played in Scotland and Ireland was a two-drone pipe called a pieb mor, gaelic for war pipe.

"The Scottish took the pieb mor, added a third drone, a better chanter and actually improved it," he said. However, Cronin added that much of this can cause fierce debate because it depends on what nationality you are. He is of Irish descent.

Regardless of the many variations of the bagpipe that could be told, the pipe

music is unique said Cronin. He added that, unless you're a student of pipe music, you won't recognize the melodies even though you may enjoy listening to them.

When Cronin began his training on the bagpipe, he would practice two to three times a week, at least an hour each day. Even now, he still plays on the chanter and takes part in group practice to maintain proficiency. He does not practice at home because he does not feel that playing in the house does a bagpipe justice. "You need open space," he said.

So, if at anytime you hear a strange sound coming from Smith Field here, you know that Provost Marshal is blowing his pipe.

## Runner's Forum

To continue the discussion on pain and the various remedies, I should devote some time to muscle cramps that sudden pain that can knot a muscle when you're asleep, or that crippling pain that comes when you're running hard on a hot day.

Cramps seem to come from nowhere, but there are methods of preventing or lessening their severity.

Cramps can be caused by bad positioning, insufficient blood supply, muscle fatigue or mineral depletion. A night

time cramp is caused when a foot is placed in a downward position (plantar flexion) by the weight of the covers.

When you move or stretch, the calf muscles, which are already somewhat flexed, are contracted and go into an uncontrollable shortened state — a cramp. The best way to relieve the pain is to stretch the calf by bringing the toes to an upward position.

When a cramp occurs during your workout, it is usually an indication of a min-

eral imbalance such as calcium, sodium or potassium. Doctor Knochel, a researcher with the Veterans Administration in Dallas, says, "mineral deficiencies can affect blood flow to muscles. When you contract a muscle, it releases potassium into the surrounding tissue where it acts as a dilator of arteries in the muscle bed. This doesn't occur in someone who is potassium deficient. It's equivalent to putting a tourniquet around your arm which produces a cramp."

Research has also found that mineral deficiency impairs the ability of the muscle to use glycogen, the fuel for energy. In addition, muscle fatigue threshold and the excitability of nerves is also affected.

A simple way to ensure that you are maintaining an adequate mineral balance is to incorporate supplements or mineral rich foods like bananas, baked potatoes and yogurt, into your diet.

Heat cramps are normally caused when we exercise without replacing fluid loss.

In a way, this is the most dangerous of cramps because it is a precursor of more serious problems — heat exhaustion and heat stroke. The best remedy is to take sufficient fluids before, during and after running or exercising in hot or humid weather.

Finally, be aware of conditions that will set you up for a cramp. After racing or long runs, your muscles are fatigued and any strange or contracted position may cause a cramp. For the ladies, wearing high-heel shoes puts

the calf muscles into a contracted position and can cause cramps.

The most likely muscles to cramp are in the legs and arches of the feet. The best method to avoid cramps is to have a good stretching program and remember to stretch before and after each workout.

So, don't put a cramp in your running program and stay fit.

# Great Aloha Run set for Presidents Day

USPACOM, Camp H. M. Smith. — The sound of feet rhythmically hitting the pavement, and the echo of chanting voices is growing louder as military teams prepare for the "Sounds of Freedom" division of the 3rd

Great Aloha Run.

Teams from the Army, Air Force, Marine Corps and Coast Guard have been forming for the event since last December, and most began training at the beginning of the year to compete against

each other in the 8.2-mile run.

The run will be held Feb. 16, and will start at the Aloha Tower, travel down Nimitz Highway to Salt Lake Boulevard and finish in Aloha Stadium.

Each team will be judged

on appearance, esprit, estimated competition time against actual time, and ratio of starters to finishers. The top three units in each division will receive trophies. Competing military unit sizes range from a squad

with 12-30 runners; a platoon, 31-100 runners; a company, 101-200 runners; and a battalion, more than 201 runners.

"Our philosophy for the run is to finish as a team and have fun doing it," said Air Force Sgt. Pam Trump, team coordinator. "We'll work on our cadence and pace the first two weeks and then go for distance."

Enthusiasm, pace and teamwork will be stressed by the 75 Marines from Camp Smith participating in the run. "This will be the first time Camp Smith has had any teams in the Great Aloha Run," said Marine SSgt. Christopher Pagdila, team trainer. "When the battalion commanding officer suggested we put a team together, the response was overwhelming."

According to Pagdila, so many people wanted to participate that two teams were formed. "The Marines on the first team are 'elite' runners; they are long distance runners and are high place finishers in state competitions," he said. "This team will concentrate on speed and timing."

The second team consists of runners who want to participate, but don't want to set any records. "Who knows," said Pagdila, "since each team must predict their finishing time, the second team with a slower pace may finish better than the 'speedsters' on the first team," he added.

In addition to the team from Camp Smith, Marines from Kaneohe Bay will also be sending teams to participate in the race. Marines from MWSS-173; BSSG-1; "B" and "C" Batteries, 1/12; HMM-364; TOW Plt., 3d Marine Regiment; 3d Bn., 3d Marine; 1st Radio Battalion; VMFA-212; 3d Engineer Bn.; and H & S, 1st MAB have also been getting ready for the event.

Consistency, preparation and teamwork will be emphasized by the Army teams from Fort Shafter and Schofield Barracks. Approximately 3,300 team runners will participate, according to Bill Roome, coordinator for the Army "Sounds of Freedom" units. The largest of these units is the 610 runners from Division Artillery, 25th Infantry Division.

"There are four battalions with anywhere from 105-175 people each," said Army 1st Lt. Karen O'Brien, Division Artillery team coordinator. "Each battalion is training separately with the emphasis on a 9-10 minute mile at a consistent pace."

The Coast Guard will be represented by two teams of 38 and 39 runners each, with an additional 25 individual runners entered.

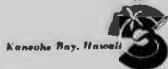

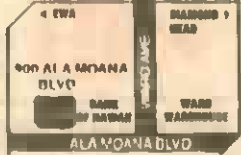
