1st MEB offloads gear, ground maneuvers begin

POHANG, Republic of Korea—The four ships of Maritime Prepositioning Squadron-3 arrived at the turbulent, cold, and rainy harbor here as scheduled, March 16, and Marines from BSSG-1 began working overtime to get the 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade's combat gear off the ships and into the hands of the brigade's Team Spirit '88 gunfighters.

"The next few days of Team Spirit belong to the 1st MEB," asserted one high-ranking brigade officer during the Maritime Prepositioning Force (MPF) off-load. "Right now, we are Team Spirit," he said.

The 1st MEB's goal of removing the equivalent of one shipload of gear from the MPS-3 ships was achieved Sunday night, ahead of schedule. By Monday night, Marines and sailors of BSSG-

1 and personnel from the Naval Support Element (NSE) managed to complete the unloading of almost all the "rolling stock" (wheeled and tracked vehicles) from Motor Vessel Sgt. William Button. Unlike Team Spirit '87 where the majority of the MPF off-load was conducted pier-side, this year the MEB accomplished a total of "instream" off-load, with the ships anchored just offshore.

The 1st MEB's ground combat element—the 3rd Marine Regiment (Reinforced)—now has more than enough heavy combat equipment to accomplish its missions ashore during Team Spirit '88.

This week, the 3rd Marines were firing many of their just off-loaded weapons systems on several ROK military ranges in anticipation of significant ground maneuvers in support of the III Marine Expeditionary Force. The Okinawa-based III MEF Marines are scheduled to storm ashore just north of here at Tok Sok Ri next week.

The 1st MEB's aviation combat element during this

exercise is the Okinawa-based Marine Aircraft Group-36. Hawaii's MAG-24 is not participating in TS '88 en masse, but detachments from MACS-2 and MWSS-173 are here. In addition, Hawaii's Purple Foxes—HMM-364—are here as part of MAG-36 while the squadron completes its regular six-month Unit Deployment Program in West Pac.

With the addition of tankers, assault amphibian, and light-armored vehicle crewmen—many of whom come from Southern California—the 1st MEB's ranks have increased by several hundred from the approximately 1,300 originally sent here from Kaneohe Bay. In addition, Hawaii's own 1st Battalion, 3rd Marines, on their regular UDP "pump" to Okinawa, is joining its parent 3rd Marine Regiment for TS '88.

For the Hawaii Marines—who are accustomed to warmer gentler climes—the challenge of freezing rains, periodic gale force winds, cold weather, and Team Spirit '88 continues.

News In Brief

Marines Search for Missing Child

Recently, 94 Marines from 3rd Marine Regiment (Rein) gathered at the Royal Elementary School to assist in a five and a half hour search for Jiezhao Li. The 12-year-old girl has been missing from Nuuanu since Feb. 11, where she was last seen selling benefit tickets.

"Corporal Barry McCool, Co. F, 2/3, heard about the search on the radio and informed the company about the search for the missing child to see if anyone else was interested in helping," said 1stLt. James J. Cavagnaro, Wpns. Plt. commander. "From there it just snowballed, to the battalion, regiment and brigade, who all provided support to locate the missing girl."

Another search is in the planning stages for this weekend.

LtCol. North to retire

HQMC, Washington D.C.—The Department of the Navy has approved LtCol. Oliver L. North's request to retire from the Marine Corps effective May 1.

North's announcement of his intention on Mar. 18, capped a week during which he and three others were indicted on criminal conspiracy charges arising from the Iran-Contra affair. North's charges include accepting a security system to protect his family from international terrorist Abu Nidal.

"I love the United States Marine Corps and the courageous 'Brothers in Arms' I have served with over the past 20 years," North told reporters, March 18. "Unfortunately, the indictment delivered two days ago places me in the situation where my continued service would be inconsistent with preparing and delivering a vigorous defense against these unfounded charges." North said his attorney planned to issue subpoenas seeking testimony and records "of the highest ranking officials of our government," an action he found to be incompatible with his service as a Marine officer.

Thanking his many supporters on behalf of his family, North said that their "prayers and support have helped us to endure this ordeal in Washington."

North, who President Reagan described as a hero, has been serving in the Service Plans and Policy Branch, Plans Division, Headquarters, Marine Corps, since December 1986.

2/3's UDP: Bear Hunts & ROK Blitzes

After a six-month deployment in the Far East under the Unit Deployment Program (UDP), the Marines and sailors of 2nd Bn., 3rd Marines, returned home earlier this month.

While assigned to 9th Marines, 3rd Marine Division, 2/3 spent September getting acclimated and indoctrinated. They also received small unit training to prepare them as reinforced rifle companies for upcoming exercises.

"Even though the Battalion didn't leave Okinawa as a unit, the off-island training the reinforced rifle companies received in Korea and the

Philippines added greatly to the Marines and sailors taste for the Western Pacific," said LtCol. James L. Reid, 2/3's commanding officer.

Company E, reinforced with elements of Weapons Co., was the first to leave Okinawa to take part in Exercise Bear Hunt '88, with 3rd Bn., 4th Marines. During the latter part of the two-month exercise, "Echo" Company (rein) was attached to 1st Tank Bn., 72nd Brigade, U.S. Army, for the Force-on-Force portion of Bear Hunt '88. Officers from H&S Co., augmented the Tactical Exercise Control Group (TECG) for Bear Hunt '88.

Company G, 2/3 and two

Forward Air Control (FAC) teams departed for Exercise Valiant Blitz in Pohang, Republic of Korea, aboard the USS Tripoli and USS Peoria. While participating in the month-long exercise, Golf Co. acted as the aggressor force against 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines, from Camp Pendleton, Calif., and the 13th Marine Expeditionary Unit (MEU).

By the end of November, E and G Companies returned to Okinawa to begin preparing for their part in the Air Contingency Battalion (ACB), as Co. F was on its way to train and participate in Exercise Balikatan. "Fox" Company spent three weeks training with 35th MEU and 3rd Battalion, 2nd Marines, from

Camp LeJeune, N.C., in the Philippines.

Although the holiday season brought a lull to the battalion's training, January brought in a flurry of activities for the Marines of 2/3.

As the Air Contingency Battalion (ACB), the Marines were on short alert status for any hostility that could have erupted; ACB continued until mid-February. Golf Co., went to the Philippines for training.

There was also battalion Field Exercise (FEX) 1-88 on Okinawa, in which the Marines participated in various types of training to include helicopters and amphibious assaults, mechanized attacks, raids and a mass casualty drill.

In preparation for their return to Kaneohe, 2/3 underwent a Logistical Readiness Evaluation (LRE). The inspection went well for the Marines as they received six "Noteworthy" and six "Ready" grades. The battalion was also inspected by the Marine Corps Disbursing On-Site Evaluation Team (MCDOSSET) and was rated as the fourth best on the

island before their turnover with 1/3.

"The companies' training with the other units, as well as the UDP, enhanced the interoperability of the Marines," said Reid. "We were required to work with other battalions from two other divisions, which allowed us to gain an appreciation for the training we are able to accomplish here."

Order places limits on smokers

Military personnel and government employees working at Marine Corps Air Station, Kaneohe Bay and Camp H.M. Smith are reminded they are subject to orders that cut back on the places where smokers can light up.

Air Station Order 6200.2A and Battalion/Camp Order 5103.1 are the result of U.S. Surgeon General findings which report that second-hand smoke poses a significant health hazard to non-smokers.

As outlined in the orders, smoking is prohibited in all common work places unless adequate ventilation exists to provide each worker with fresh air.

The order's also prohibit smoking in theaters, auditoriums, child care and youth activity centers, conference and counseling rooms, class-

rooms, libraries, and eating facilities. Corridors, stairwells, restrooms and lobbies are also no-smoking areas.

The prohibition extends to government-owned and leased vehicles. This includes aircraft, unless smoking is

permitted by the operational directives for a particular type of aircraft, and then only at the discretion of the mission commander.

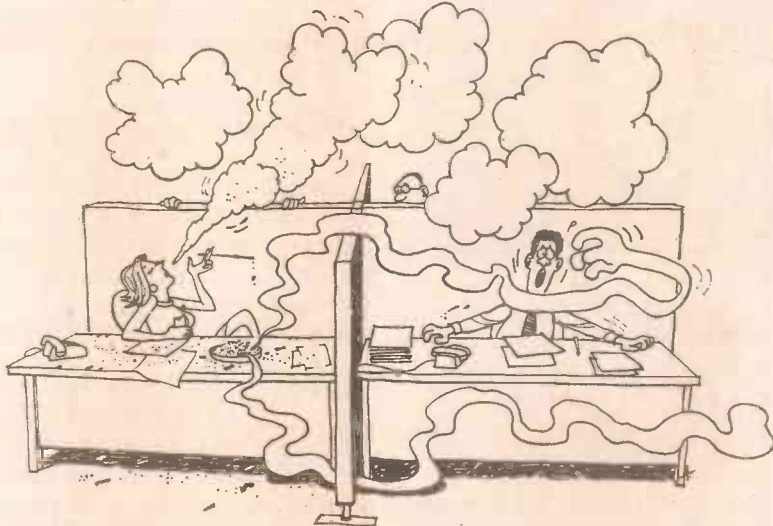
The orders also state that billeting arrangements should be made to preclude

putting smokers and non-smokers in the same room if at all possible.

The only areas where smoking will be permitted is in private offices, designated smoking areas, and outdoors unless the area is off-limits due to fire or explosive hazard.

The orders apply to all Air Station, 1st MEB and Camp Smith personnel. They also apply to all civilian employees at both installations, including non-appropriated fund employees, military family members, contractor employees, and visitors in Air Station/1st MEB or Camp Smith occupied buildings, facilities, vehicles and aircraft.

Major uniform changes discussed

MCCDC, QUANTICO, VA.— Senior enlisted Marines, attending an annual senior course here, were briefed recently on revisions to Marine uniforms.

"We are trying to make all-season service and blue uniforms available Marine Corps wide by late next year," Capt. John A. Scarborough, secretary-recorder for the 24-member uniform board, told the sergeants major and master gunnery sergeants. The all-season item is slated to replace summer and winter service uniforms and blues currently used.

Within the next four years, the board hopes to make the all-season uniforms boot camp-issue items.

Another item discussed was the tanker jacket, approved last June, which will be available to Marines by late summer. The jacket will be authorized for wear with the service "Charlie" and "Bravo" uniforms and the service sweater.

The jacket, a simple design, pewter-colored garment, generated some controversy at the brief because of its appearance. A zipper runs from the bottom to the knit collar and it has two front pockets. The rank insignia will be worn on the epaulets of the waist-length coat.

The jacket's introduction in the Marine Corps was a surprise to some at the brief; they knew it was being considered, few knew it had been fully approved.

"A Marine Corps order was signed Jan. 4 which states some massive uniform revisions," Scarborough said. The order will be published and distributed in late spring, according to Scarborough.

The order revises and modifies some of the established regulations on wearing uniforms and accessories.

The board is composed of the president, 21 voting members, one non-voting member and a secretary-recorder; 20 are active duty Marines.

Suggestions usually come from sources external to the board, such as the Commandant of the Marine Corps or Marines in the field.

For example, Scarborough cited a sergeant who recently sent a letter suggesting the

dress blue "delta" uniform be authorized for wear while on leave or liberty. The suggestion is now being considered, he said.

Working groups do background research and prepare a formal recommendation for the board. The board then compiles a recommendation

for the Commandant based on what the working groups have prepared.

Besides being familiarized with new uniform changes, the audience here had a chance to voice their opinions concerning the board and decisions made on the uniforms.

The brief was one portion of the eight-day annual Sergeants Major and Master Gunnery Sergeants Senior Course where the senior enlisted were briefed on the latest Marine Corps information on technology and trends.

Prince Kuhio honored

On March 26, the local community here will be celebrating the birthday of Prince Jonah Kuhio Kalaniana'ole. Prince Kuhio served as the second Hawaii delegate to Congress from 1902, until his death Jan. 7, 1922.

Born on the island of Kauai, Kuhio became a prince by the royal decree of his cousin, King Kalakaua. Kuhio was educated in San Mateo, Calif., and the Royal Agricultural College, Cirencester, England. The son of high chief David Kahalepouli and Prin-

cess Kinoiki Kākaulike did not let his education stop there. He trained to be the successor of the throne, until the monarchy was overthrown.

Kuhio was arrested and jailed as a political prisoner for treason because of his part in the counter-revolution of 1895. After a year in prison, he was released and married Elizabeth Kahuna Kaauwai.

Kuhio made many political gains in his nearly two-decade term as a delegate. One of his major contribu-

tions was creating the present day Hawaiian Homes Commission. Kuhio also presented a bill to Congress asking to admit Hawaii into the Union in 1919.

He also did much to advance the cultural heritage of the Hawaiians by organizing the Order of Kamehameha in 1903 and presiding over the first observance of Kamehameha Day in 1904. He continued his cultural awareness by organizing the Chiefs of Hawaii and the Hawaiian Civic Club.

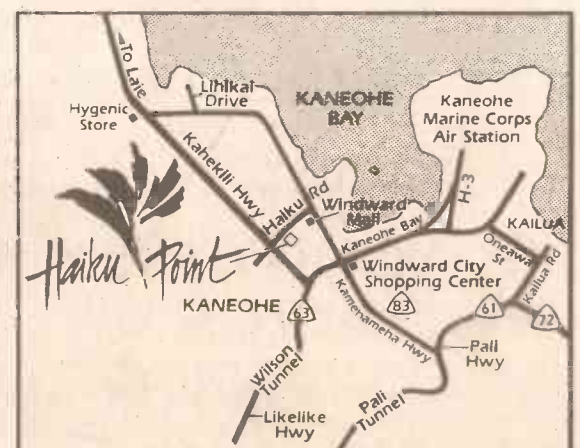

Water consumption below allocations set by State Board

Air Station water consumption for the months of FY88 and is below the allocated amount of water consumption set by the State Board of Water Supply, according to Ben Dorado, Facilities Department.

Dorado stresses the importance of continuing this downward trend in consumption. During the winter, water tables are high enough to support the allocated amount of water, but the problems begin in the summer.

"Our main concern now is keeping water consumption at its present level to avoid a later water shortage and the imposing of strict water consumption guidelines," said Dorado.

In an effort to continue this downward trend, Air Station personnel and housing residents should keep in mind the

following conservation guidelines:

- Do not wash vehicles or other items with a free-running hose. Use a pail or hose nozzle with an automatic turn-off valve.

- Follow the lawn watering schedule as prescribed in ASO 11300.8B. Do not water lawns after steady rainfall of 30 minutes, or to the point where run-off occurs.

- Use a broom, not a water hose, to clean debris from sidewalks and lanais.

- Do not let water run while washing dishes, shaving, brushing teeth, etc.

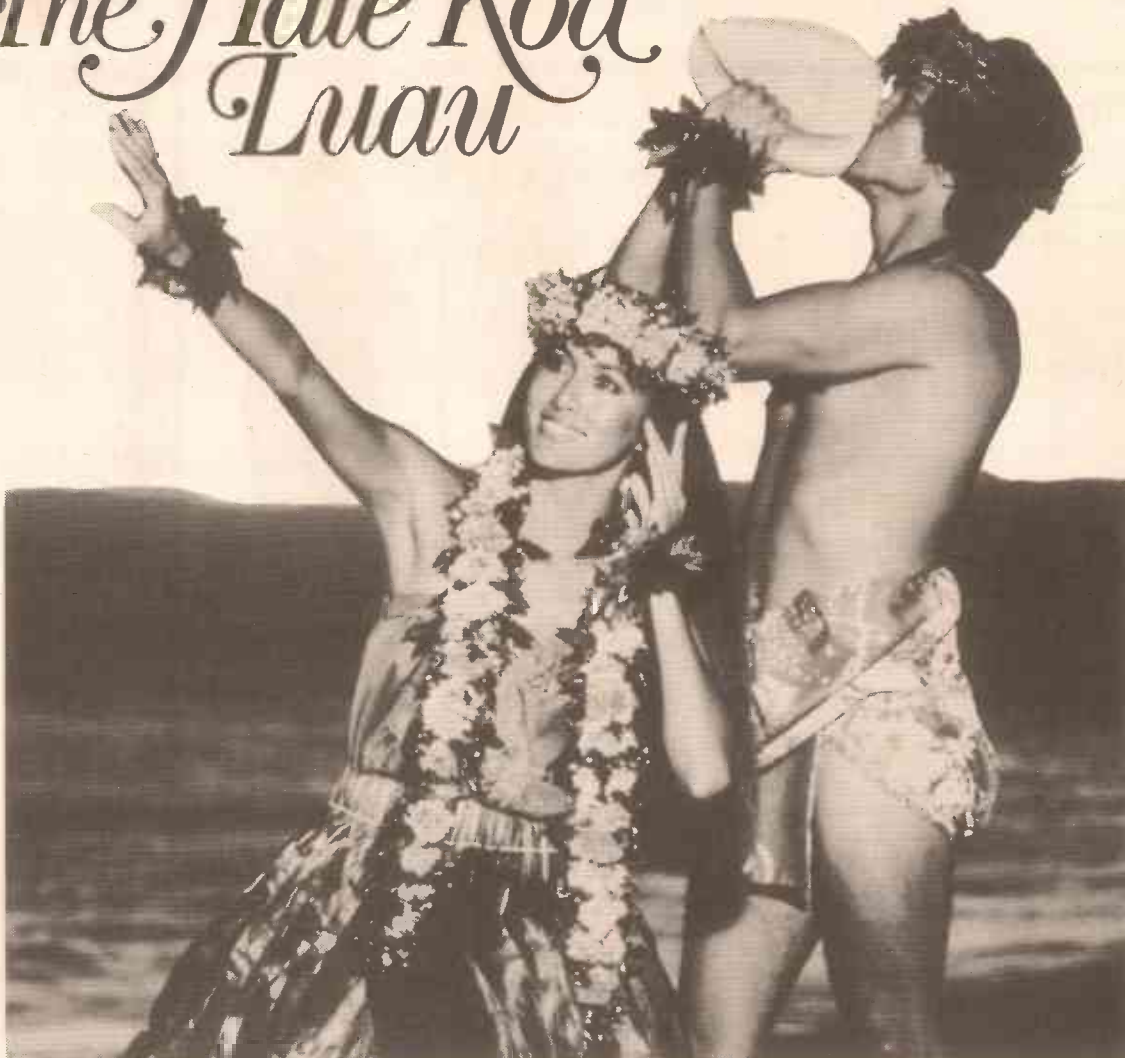

VA Information

Q — If my husband dies while hospitalized in a VA medical center, will the VA help with expenses of bringing him home for burial?

A — Yes. If a veteran dies while a patient in a VA medical center, transportation expenses to the place of burial will be paid by the VA.

Q — I have a five-year level premium term insurance plan with the VA. I would like to convert to one of the permanent plans. Will I have to take a physical to meet certain health requirements?

A — The five-year level premium term insurance plan can be converted without meeting health requirements at any time the policy is in force. However, if the veteran is totally disabled, it cannot be converted to an endowment type policy.

Q — What is the amount of the VA clothing allowance for disabled veterans? When is it payable?

A — The clothing allowance is payable annually, in August. The rate in 1988 will be \$380.

Q — Is it true that veterans are eligible for a pension from the VA when they turn 65?

A — To qualify for VA pension benefits, wartime veterans must meet income requirements, have been discharged under other than dishonorable conditions after at least 90 days of active duty and be permanently and totally disabled for reasons not traceable to military service. Veterans 65 and older and not working are considered permanently and totally disabled.

Q — What type of income should I report on my annual eligibility verification report to continue my VA pension benefits?

A — Income from all sources must be reported. The VA will determine what sources and amounts will be counted and the amount of income to be excluded.

Q — May a widow receiving nonservice-connected VA pension benefits under the current pension law re-elect benefits under previous legislation?

A — No. Election of current pension benefits by recipients of former VA pension programs is irrevocable.

Q — My GI Bill education assistance does not cover all of my education expenses. Does the VA offer any other financial assistance?

A — Yes. The VA Work-Study Program offers additional income for veterans enrolled in school fulltime. Contact your school's veterans affairs office or the nearest VA regional office for complete information.

Q — I am interested in purchasing a motor home. Can I use my VA home loan guaranty?

A — No. Motor homes are not included in the VA Loan Guaranty Program.

Q — I have a 50 percent service-connected disability rating. I am going to be married soon. Will my

compensation increase?

A — Yes. Veterans whose service-connected disabilities are rated at 30 percent or more are entitled to additional allowances for dependents upon submission of documentation.

At A Glance

Mokapu Kindergarten Registration

Kindergarten registration will be conducted at Mokapu School from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. from March 29-April 8. Because Mokapu can only accommodate 8 kindergarten classes, students will be taken on a first-come, first-served basis. Other students will be wait-listed and overflowed to nearby schools outside the Air Station. Those students on such a waiting list will be notified of their school in late August, when school enrollments are more definite.

Parents need to present proof of their child's age at the time of registration, such as a birth certificate, baptismal certificate, passport, or other verification of birth. The child's medical report (DOE Form 14) must be complete showing a physician's examination within 12 months of school entry, including negative results for active tuberculosis and current immunizations against diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis, measles, mumps, poliomyelitis, and rubella. This medical report must be presented by the first day of school in September.

Although kindergarten is not mandatory in Hawaii, the DOE offers full-day kindergarten to children who reach age five by December 31 of the school year.

Protecting Endangered Species

Marines and Girl Scouts improve Hawaiian stilts' home

Endangered species are the concern of many organizations in this country.

The Girl Scouts of Troops 156, 174, 29, and the Marines from AAV Det., A Co., 3rd Marines recently lent a hand to the endangered Hawaiian stilt bird (Ae'o). They work together annually to improve the nesting grounds and protect the birds from predators such as cats and mongooses.

"The restoration project is one aspect of the Air Station's continuing work to implement its natural and cultural resources management plan," said Dr. Diane Drigot, Station Environmental Protection Specialist.

The Nu'upia Ponds Wildlife Management Area is the home of the stilt bird. The Marines and Girl Scouts were briefed and carefully supervised by Station environmental personnel during all

aspects of the improvements to ensure that there were no adverse effects on the ponds historical value.

Marines spent a day-and-a-half driving six assault amphibian vehicles, breaking up pickleweed and exposing mud flats at Nu'upia Ponds. By mowing down the pickleweed at the ponds, it is more difficult for the mongoose and other predators to access the nesting area of the Ae'o according to Drigot. The birds' feeding grounds are also expanded when the vegetation is tilled under.

The controlling of the vegetation not only improves the birds' habitat but also preserves the traditional Hawaiian landscape around the historic fish ponds, according to Drigot.

In 1978, artificial nesting islands, made from old tires, were installed in the ponds. Before the Ae'o's nesting sea-

son begins each year, they are repaired. This year was no different. Once the AAVs completed their dredging, the Girl Scouts went to work repairing the artificial nesting islands. Approximately 50 Scouts and adult chaperones, including Military Police Game Wardens, used shovels, buckets, and hands to repair the islands after the winds and tides washed away the mud used to fill the tires.

According to Drigot, everyone benefits from the work done at the ponds.

"The time spent at the ponds, gives everyone a better appreciation of the natural and cultural environment," Drigot said. "The Marines receive training, the Girl Scouts receive a patch and credits towards their wildlife badge, and the stilts have their nesting and feeding grounds improved before their mating season begins."

SNCO Wives Club: A service organization for enlisted Marine families

The military community has a long tradition of taking care of its own, and one organization deeply involved in that effort here at the Air Station is the Staff Noncommissioned Officer's Wives Club.

"The SNCO Wives Club is a social service organization dedicated to helping junior enlisted Marines and their families," said Angela Reed, president of the Club.

The Club, which currently has 18 members, operates or supports a number of charity functions here on Oahu that benefit the military.

The most visible sign of their work is the Thrift Store, located on the ground floor of the Credit Union building. The Store sells donated items, including clothes, kitchen utensils, toys, games, etc., at reduced cost.

The club also administers the SNCO Scholarship Fund,

which awards cash scholarships to deserving dependents of SNCOs and below who are stationed here.

Other charitable functions of the Club include donations to several charities including Navy Relief, the Family Services Center, and the YMCA Outreach. The Club also provides emergency relief for victims of fire, and most recently, floods.

Another tangible sign of their work is the Food Basket program, run every year at Thanksgiving and Christmas. Club members collect donations of canned and dry goods and divide them into baskets to be distributed to needy families aboard the Air Station.

"To be honest, I think we do a great service," said Reed, wife of SSgt. Arthur Reed, 1/3.

The Club is also a member of the Inner Coordination Council, an island-wide group of enlisted wives clubs that coordinates and distributes funds to three military-related charities. "We just received a new charter, so we don't know which charities we'll support yet," said Reed. "One will be the United Services Organization (USO), but the others haven't been determined yet," she added.

"We try to help not only staff NCOs, but the junior enlisted, of all services," said Reed. The Club is currently trying to help the wives of some junior enlisted personnel establish their own club here.

The SNCO Wives Club meets the first Monday of every month, and is currently looking for new members. Any wife of a Staff NCO, of any service, is eligible to join. A membership social, to acquaint prospective new members with the Club, will be held March 27.

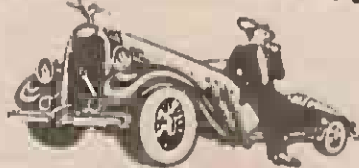

Tax Treatment of Individual Retirement Account

An Individual Retirement Account (IRA) is a personal savings plan that is given preferential tax treatment. The contributions made to the plan may be fully or partially deductible, and the earnings from the account are not taxed until you receive distributions from the plan. Distributions made before you reach age 59½ will be penalized.

Contributions

The general rule is that if you have compensation for a tax year, you can make an IRA contribution. Your contribution is limited to either the compensation earned for that year or \$2,000, whichever is less. Also, if one spouse works and the other does not, limited contributions can be made to an IRA for the non-working spouse. If the working spouse made no IRA contributions, the contribution to the non-working spouse's IRA is limited to either the working spouse's compensation or \$2,000, whichever is less. If

contributions are made to both spouses' IRAs, the total contribution to both IRAs is limited to either the working spouse's compensation or \$2,250, whichever is less.

Contributions for the 1987 tax year must be made no later than April 15, 1988. If you report a false contribution, you can be penalized up to \$100.

Tax Deductions

The Tax Reform Act of 1986 changed the rules concerning deductibility of IRA contributions. If neither you nor your spouse is covered by a pension or retirement plan, then your contributions are fully deductible. However, if either you or your spouse is covered by a pension plan, then your deduction may be fully or partially eliminated, depending on the amount of your adjusted gross income (AGI). Publication 590-IRAs contain worksheets that you can use in figuring the deductibility of contributions.

For couples filing jointly, with at least one spouse cov-

ered by a plan, both spouses' IRA contributions are fully deductible if their AGI is \$40,000 and below, partially deductible for AGI between \$40,000-\$50,000, and not deductible for AGI over \$50,000. For single persons covered by a plan, their deduction for contributions is full for AGI between \$25,000 and \$35,000, and zero for AGI over \$35,000.

Employer's Plan

Members of the armed services are considered covered by a plan. It does not matter that we are not vested in other words, that we have no present legal right to retirement benefits. If you are not a servicemember and have doubts about whether you are covered, check your Form W-2. If there is a check in the "Pension Plan" box, you are covered. Servicemembers should take caution because you are covered by a plan even though your W-2 does not so indicate.

Remember, the amount you can contribute to an IRA and

the amount of the contribution that is deductible are two separate considerations. You may still want to make the full contribution even though it may not be fully deductible. The earnings in your IRA still go untaxed until you receive them, and over a long period the savings can be substantial. If you do decide to make non-deductible contributions, you must report them using Form 8606.

Remember, tax advice varies with the individual. If you have questions about your particular tax situation, contact your VITA Representative or the Legal Assistance Office at 257-2168/2169/2160 for advice.

On the Blotter

A majority of the thefts that have been reported to the Military Police in the recent months have been of property that was unsecured. The Military Police Department wants to remind you to secure your property whenever you leave it unattended, even if just for a few minutes. It's unfortunate for the honest person that there are too many people that can't resist even the smallest opportunity to steal property for personal gain. Property that is unsecured and unattended offers the potential thief the opportunity to take something with the feeling that they have very little chance of being caught. The best way to stop this type of theft is to take the time to secure your property even if you are going to be gone for just a few minutes.

Alcohol/Drug Incidents

He was held in lieu of \$150 bond and scheduled to appear in district court.

A lance corporal was arrested for terroristic threatening and harassment after he pushed a Honolulu Police Officer and threatened to kill him. He was held in lieu of \$150 bond and scheduled to appear in district court. The lance corporal had been drinking.

There were nine other alcohol related incidents this week including eight DWI's, one on-station and seven off-station, and one apprehension for drunk and disorderly.

Larceny of Property

A lance corporal reported that his wallet containing \$200 was stolen from off his bed in his unsecured and

unattended barracks room. The investigation continues.

A private first class reported that his privately owned car was stolen while it was unsecured and unattended in the barracks parking lot. The theft is still being investigated.

A dependent wife was detained by MCX security for shoplifting after being observed leaving the main exchange with a bathing suit that she did not pay for.

Change: Tax Rates

The number of tax brackets is reduced from 15 to 5.

Change: Exemptions

Personal exemptions are increased to \$1900.

Dependents cannot claim personal exemptions for themselves, if they can be claimed on another's tax return.

Change: Age & Blindness

Extra exemptions for age and blindness are eliminated. They are replaced by additional standard deductions for age and blindness.

Change: Standard Deduction

The standard deduction is increased for most individuals.

Change: Two-Earner Deduction

The deduction for the two-earner married couple is eliminated.

Change: Interest Deductions

The deduction for consumer loan interest (auto, personal, credit card interest for example) is lowered to 65% of the total interest paid.

Change: IRA Deductions

Deductions for Individual Retirement Accounts may be reduced or eliminated depending on income and marital status.

Change: Miscellaneous Deductions

Certain miscellaneous deductions (Unreimbursed business expenses, union dues, tax preparation fees for example) are only deductible to the extent they exceed 2% of adjusted gross income.

Change: Sales Tax

General sales tax deduction is eliminated.

Change: Contributions

Charitable contribution deduction for those who do not itemize is eliminated.

Change: Capital Gains

Long term capital gain preference is eliminated.

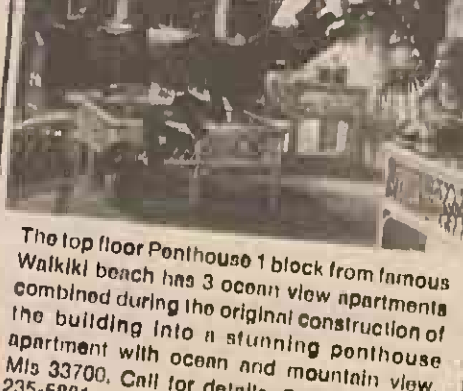

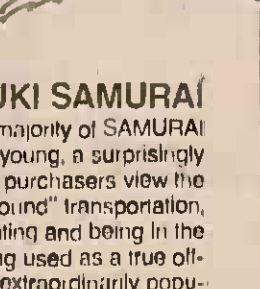
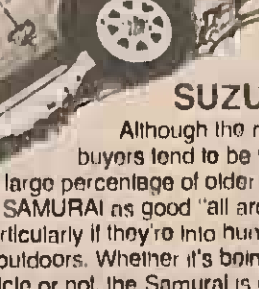
