Courts-martial authority expands

Recently, in the case of *Solorio vs. United States* the Supreme Court significantly expanded court-martial jurisdiction. In a decision dated June 25, 1987, the Court announced that a court-martial has jurisdiction over any offense as long as the accused is an active duty servicemember.

The *Solorio* decision overturned earlier decisions that required the offense to be "service connected" in order for the accused servicemember to be tried by the military. The key factor in determining service connection was often the location of the offense. Off-base offenses could only be prosecuted by the military in limited circumstances. With the

SecNav visits Station during Pacific tour

The newly appointed Secretary of the Navy, the Honorable James H. Webb Jr., visited the Air Station Friday as part of a tour of major Navy and Marine Corps installations in the Pacific.

The tour here began at Pless Hall Dining Facility as Webb, the 66th Secretary of the Navy, ate lunch with a group of enlisted Marines from Air Station and 1st MAB units. From there Webb moved on to the Squad Automatic Rifle Training Section range to watch as Co. B, 1/3 conducted an offensive exercise using Multiple Integrated Laser Engagement System gear.

Webb, a former Marine officer, followed that with a stop at Fort Hase Beach where he watched as Marines from Det. A, 3d AAV Bn. gave instructions in emergency egress procedures and surf swim qualification to Marines from Co. C, 1/3. Webb then watched as Capt.

D.M. Bishop, the S-2 for 1/3, used a sand table to give a class on terrain awareness and enemy capabilities, as part of a brief for the upcoming Combined Arms Exercise 9-87.

The Secretary's visit to the Air Station finished with a

Activates Friday

Second Security Force Bn. established

CAMP H.M. SMITH, — A Marine Corps Security Force (MCSF) Battalion will be activated at Mare Island, Calif., on July 31. An official ceremony commemorating the activation will be held on Aug. 12, with LtGen. D'Wayne Gray, commanding general, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific, as the senior Marine Corps representative.

The MCSF battalion will be the second of its type established in the Marine Corps. The first was activated at Marine Barracks Norfolk, Virginia, in April of this year.

The activation of these battalions is the result of the Secretary of the Navy's plan to strengthen the Navy's

ability to deter, detect and defeat terrorist attacks against personnel, vessels and installations. Traditionally, physical security at many major naval installations is the responsibility of Marine security forces assigned to Marine Barracks commands located at these installations. Furthermore, there are detachments of Marines on aircraft carriers, battleships and cruisers that provide shipboard security at sea.

Former Secretary of the Navy, John Lehman, directed that the capabilities of commands not having Marine security forces be upgraded, to include anti-terrorist defense. The new Marine Corps Security Force Battalion at Mare Island will

be the central point for all naval security training in the Pacific.

To provide the personnel required to accomplish this expanded security force training mission, it became necessary to consolidate resources from existing Marine Barracks. The reorganization will result in four West Coast Marine Barracks being redesignated as Marine Security Force Companies (Bangor, Wash., and Concord, Alameda and North Island, Calif.), Marines assigned to these companies will continue to provide security to the naval installation at which they are located, but will also assist in training Navy security personnel there in anti-terrorism security measure. The companies will be under

the administrative control of battalion headquarters at Mare Island.

Marine Barracks at Adak, Diego Garcia, Hawaii, Guam and Subic Bay will retain their name structure and operations, but will acquire a ground defense/security forces mission, their mission (except in Hawaii) will be modified to include providing anti-terrorism and physical security training assistance to local Navy auxiliary security forces. The issue of whether Marine Barracks Yokosuka will remain as is or be redesignated a security Force Company is still being evaluated at Headquarters Marine Corps.

"This new organization and structure will ensure that trained personnel are available and can react swiftly to

counter terrorists activities at key naval activities in the Pacific," said Col. Richard H. Schwartz, assistant chief of staff, readiness, evaluation and inspection Division, here.

Elements at the Battalion headquarters will include a MCSF school for Military Occupational Specialty 8151 (Guard), mobile training and oversight/inspection teams, and a group of deployable Marines who will form the fleet anti-terrorism security teams (FAST).

Cadre personnel and Marines being assigned to Marine Detachments aboard ship will receive enhanced security training at the four-week school upon graduation, the cadre Marines will be assigned designated

naval installations, including naval station, Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, to supervise and train Navy security personnel in anti-terrorism and physical security.

Mobile training teams from the battalion will oversee and inspect training conducted by cadres and by the Marine Barracks.

The FAST will be home-based at the battalion headquarters, and will be able to respond to a variety of missions and physical security tasks. They will be a reactionary force, with trained personnel able to move on short notice," said Col. Schwartz.

The MCSF Bn., with its concept for training and deployment of forces will be a unique and very effective security force.

Uniform Board okays 'tanker jacket' for wear

HQMC, Washington, DC, — In the hot sweltering days of summer or in the ice cold days of winter, Marines have always worn appropriate distinctive uniforms. Soon, they will be able to maintain that look on in-between days.

The Marine Corps Intermediate Weight Jacket for men, better known as the "tanker" jacket, was approved on June 15 after a month-long wear test.

The Permanent Marine

Corps Uniform Board had Marines in 11 locations test 70 jackets, beginning in May, for approximately four to six weeks. Although the 19 percent female testers suggested several adjustments, an overall 92 percent found the jacket comfortable and gave it a "high average" rating.

The overall rating was above average, and 97 percent found the jacket suitable for wear in intermediate weather.

According to uniform specialist Judy Legg, the preferred slacked pocket style was adopted over the jacket without pockets. Incorporated because of recommendations, the back of the jacket body will be heightened to ensure shirt collars are covered, and an inch will be trimmed off the cuffs.

"The cuffs were too long and Marines said they were uncomfortable," said Legg.

The pewter gray polyester-wool gabardine jackets were worn an average of 14 times

during the test; however, it is unclear whether this number represents actual times worn or days worn, Legg said. The results might be skewed since the females probably stopped wearing the tested jacket as soon as they found it unsuitable for wear, added Legg.

"The female test participants said the jacket didn't fit at the waist. The knit material ended up resting above the hips and the khaki blouse protruded from the bottom," Legg said. "In general, it wasn't designed for a woman's figure."

"We anticipated some problems, but wanted to go ahead with the test to find out the specific changes needed," she added.

The coat is designed to be worn with the Service "B" and "C" uniforms or with the service sweater. Fifty-three percent of the testers said the Marines should have the option of zipping the jacket, but 43 percent said they felt

Generally, circumstances must exist that make military prosecution essential in the interest of justice, discipline, and proper administration within the service. a partially-zipped style was preferred.

Drivers license information

Marines and sailors at one time or another may need to renew or get a Hawaii drivers' license. The following information should clarify some questions.

Active duty servicemembers, 18 years of age or older, who hold a valid driver's license from any state, can drive in Hawaii as long as their out of state license is valid. Licensed minors must obtain Hawaii licenses.

When applying for a Hawaii license, you must present a social security card and current out of state license. You must also complete a license application form, and take a written, road, and an eye test. When a Hawaii license is issued, your out-of-state license will not be returned.

'Death Angels' on target during missile shoot at Barking Sands

Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-235 honed their flying prowess recently against jet-propelled drones during a missile shoot at the Pacific Missile Range Facility, Barking Sands, Kauai.

The BQM-74C target drones, shot down by the "Death Angels," were flown by remote control by personnel from the Pacific Missile Range Facility.

Two types of air intercept missiles were used against the drones: an AIM-7F

"Sparrow" — a radar-controlled missile and an AIM-9H "Sidewinder" — a heat-seeking missile.

Carrying two different types of missiles aboard the aircraft, the pilots and radar intercept officers have to work together in order to hit their targets. According to the Death Angels, this type of flying is called "crew coordination."

"Even though the pilot flies the plane and fires the missiles, it's the RIO's job to locate, direct, and activate the proper systems to make

it all work," said 1stLt. F. "LC" Greenwood, RIO, VMFA-235.

The two-day exercise began on a Monday which meant that the squadron's maintenance shops worked throughout the weekend, checking, and double-checking the radar and weapons system of each aircraft to ensure a successful exercise.

"All our shops, including the ordnance personnel from H&MS-24, who were on the flight line at 3 a.m. every day, did a great job by keeping our birds flying and missiles firing," said Capt. A. "Rocky" Morrison, pilot and coordinator of the missile shoot for VMFA-235.

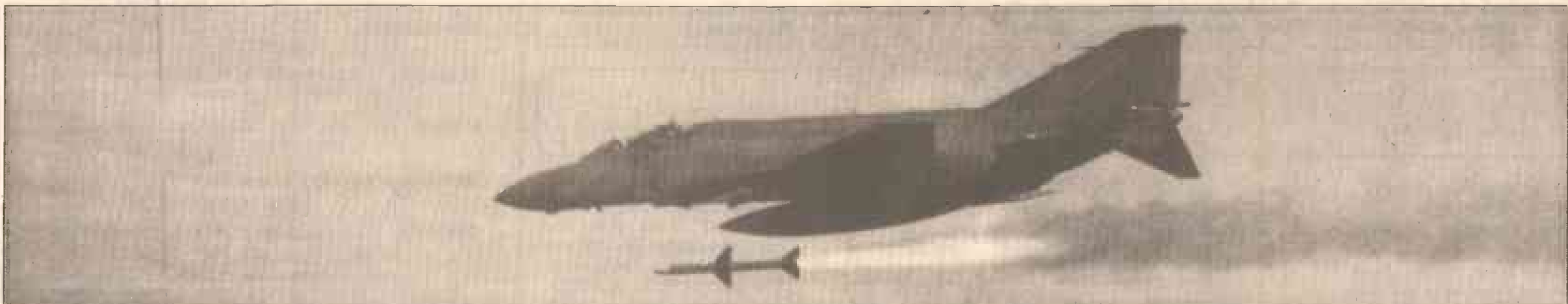
"The ground crews just don't get the recognition or the glory they deserve during these operations," added Morrison.

Although the recognition and glory doesn't always reach the Marines "behind the scenes," VMFA-235's ground and ordnance crews were clearly gratified as they saw their Death Angels land without ordnance and heard that all the targets had been shot down.

Auxiliary MPs help to 'keep the peace'

Sacrifice is something that Marines take in stride as part of what the Corps life is all about; but the selfless spirit that makes a Marine endure these sacrifices can only be expected to go so far. Just try to get someone to sacrifice some of their off-duty time.

Usually, it's hard to find volunteers for off-duty work, but a handful of Air Station and 1st MAB Marines are proving that it's not always true.

These Marines are members of the Auxiliary Military Police Program. They are, essentially, Marines from various occupational fields who serve as reserve MPs, according to Sgt. Michael Weaver, Crime Prevention NCO from the Provost Marshal's Office here.

"The auxiliary program serves two basic functions" said Weaver. "One, it supplements the military police; and two, it offers Marines in other occupational fields the chance to get some on-the-job training for a possible lateral move into the mil-

itary police field. It also gives other Marines a chance to see what our job is, and how we do it."

The 11 Marines who are currently serving as auxiliaries here perform all of the duties regular MPs do, including gate sentry, flight line security, patrolling, dispatching, as well as

answering emergency calls.

The program was started in 1978 when LtCol. John D. Wintersteen, then a captain and now the Provost Marshal, tried to augment his then-meager police force. "We had a very small department then, less than 100 people" said Wintersteen. "The base was the

same size, and we had the same number of Marines stationed here, but we were understaffed. That was also a pretty unsettled era; we were making 10 to 15 drug arrests a week. There was a lot more going on, but we didn't have the people to get them."

Another problem, accord-

ing to Wintersteen, was the fact that almost two-thirds of the MPs were on temporary duty with PMO from other units. "After their six months were up, or if they deployed, we'd lose them; and their units wouldn't let them come back after they got back" said Wintersteen.

"The auxiliary program was a good way of getting some of these people back here to use the training we'd already given them" added Wintersteen.

Another advantage of the program, according to Wintersteen, is that it gives Marines outside the military police field a chance to see how that field works.

"Before 1972, the Marine Corps didn't have a regular MP field. All of our people were assigned temporarily from other fields," said Wintersteen. "Because of the nature of our job, and our requirements — the clean records and intelligence — we were getting basically the 'cream of the crop,' the people who were likely to go on to become the future leaders in the Corps."

When the military police field was formed after 1972, PMO lost the opportunity for the average Marine to learn the job, according to Wintersteen. "My thinking

with the auxiliary program is that we can give people a chance to see the other side of the Corps again, and maybe make them better leaders," said Wintersteen.

"We're not in the business of giving on-the-job training to help Marines get a job as a civilian policeman when they get out, although they do get that," added Wintersteen. "What we do, hopefully, is train Marines to be better Marines and motivate them to stay in."

In order to become an auxiliary, applicants must submit an Administrative Action form, as well as have a recommendation from their commanding officer. That is followed by interviews with the training chief, the Provost Sergeant and the Provost Marshal.

To be accepted, applicants have to be at least 19 years old, have a minimum GT of 100; and have a clean record book, according to SSgt. R.S. Stachowski, training chief at PMO.

Once accepted, prospective auxiliaries go through a one-day orientation course that covers a wide range of topics, including use of deadly force; procedures for patrolling and responding to domestic and prowler

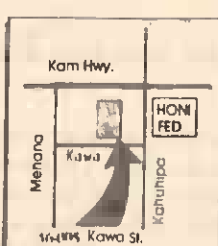

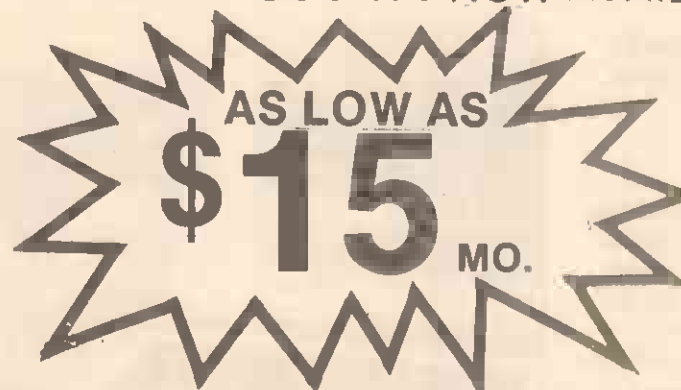

"This orientation is designed to give the applicants a brief overview of what they'll be doing, and give them a working knowledge of how to do it," said Stachowski. "During the orientation, they see the paperwork and hear the techniques; but the fine-tuning comes on the road."

As part of their training, the auxiliaries also familiarize themselves with, and fire, the .45-caliber pistol.

Lance Corporal Raymond Spackman, an auxiliary from H&MS-24 who is hoping for a lateral move into the MP field, feels that volunteering keeps him motivated and teaches him discipline and how to deal with other people.

"I'm doing this for the future" said Cpl. Lester Lacombe, a unit diary clerk from H&HS who has been serving as an auxiliary here since August 1985. "I'm on the waiting list for the New York State Police Academy right now, so this is a way of getting some valuable training. It's also helped me as a Marine, improving my bearing, appearance and ability to communicate."

The program also gives the Marines a feeling that

they're doing something useful according to both Marines, who felt that they were helping others.

The auxiliaries are also appreciated by the regular MPs. "I remember when I was still 'on the road,'" said Stachowski. "It was always good to see an auxiliary come in because it meant an extra man on duty, a backup when we might not ordinarily have one."

Being that extra man can also mean being in the right place at the right time.

Last year, Cpl. Lacombe was cited for his exemplary actions after he entered a burning house on the Air Station's Housing area, while on duty as an auxiliary, searched for any trapped people, and extinguished the blaze.

Auxiliaries are required to work 16 hours a month; but according to Stachowski, most do a lot more than that. After six months, the auxiliaries, who wear an armband instead of an MP's badge, are finally eligible for a badge, and a possible lateral move. The auxiliaries aren't getting paid any more for their extra duty. In fact, they aren't getting much at all for their sacrifices, except the satisfaction of doing a necessary job, and doing it well. For them, it seems to be enough.

"You can go home now. There will be no invasion! The weather has fought for us!"

The words of Queen Elizabeth I started England celebrating. The seemingly invincible Spanish Armada had finally met its match. Sudden, violent storms in the English Channel wiped out most of the Spanish navy before it was able to launch its planned attack on Britain.

Those unseasonable late July storms helped change the history of the Western world.

Throughout history, weather has decided the outcome of battles and the fate of nations. Blazing heat and numbing cold have weakened military units and destroyed their equipment. Hurricanes and other storms have wiped out armies, fleets and entire military installations.

Wise military planners learned that though they might never be able to control the weather, they could learn enough about it to use changing weather conditions to their advantage.

Matthew Fontaine Maury, U.S. naval officer, was the first to use weather information to plan naval operations. During the mid-1800s, he studied ships' logs to determine wind and weather trends. Using these findings, he made up charts and sailing directions that cut the sail time from New York to San Francisco by almost 50 days.

The Japanese applied their understanding of weather to the surprise attack on Pearl Harbor. A storm moving across the Pacific provided cloud cover that helped prevent detection of the Japanese fleet.

During World War II, the Allies relied on weather forecasts to plan European operations.

The Normandy invasion was based on a specific set of weather requirements. D-Day had to fall during the period one day before or two days after a new or full moon, followed by at least three days of light and clear skies. The success of that planning is now history.

The North Vietnamese also knew how to use the weather to their advantage. During the dry season, they infiltrated men and materials from the north along the Ho Chi Minh Trail to Vietnam's borders with Laos and Cambodia. In the wet season, when large portions of the trail were impassable, they stockpiled material, improved routes and prepared for the next dry season.

Recognizing the need for weather support, the Air Force ordered 23 members of its Air Weather Service to Southeast Asia in 1961. At the war's peak, almost 700 weathermen were on duty. They made weather observations, radioed weather conditions to and received reports from pilots and prepared official forecasts.

The face of warfare has changed dramatically since the days of the Spanish Armada. Yet even in the supersonic, nuclear and computer age, weather continues to be a major factor in military operations.

Today, the Air Weather Service and Naval Oceanog-

raphy Command work around the clock and throughout the world to provide accurate, up-to-date weather information.

The Air Weather Service compiles more than 140,000 weather reports from around the world every day for the Air Force and Army. The Naval Oceanography Command provides similar information to Navy and Marine Corps commanders.

Together, they help commanders incorporate weather information into peacetime operations and show how the weather can be used to advantage in combat.

Here are some examples of the way weather affects military operations of nearly every kind:

Aircraft operations are affected by visibility, winds and atmospheric moisture. Poor weather may require flights to be delayed or diverted and affects flight length and fuel consumption.

Airborne-assault operations are most affected by winds and, to a lesser degree, by cloud cover. Helicopters and gliders can't fly safely during strong winds, and clouds help conceal paratroopers when they are most vulnerable to attack.

Air reconnaissance, whether conducted by aircraft or satellite, is often affected by cloud cover.

Ground-troop operations are affected by storms and

temperature extremes, which dictate the speed in which they can move. Weather conditions in the immediate area and at surrounding air bases affect air support for these troops.

Chemical-warfare operations are affected by winds, temperature and the moisture content of the air. For incendiaries to be most effective, the climate must be dry.

Surface ships rely on accurate wind, current and sea-temperature information because it affects their maneuverability and fuel consumption. Radical temperature and humidity changes influence radar and radio communications.

Submarine operations are affected by surface winds, sea conditions and temperature and the presence of sea ice, which affects the ability of a submarine to avoid detection or launch its missiles. Submarines are most difficult to locate under conditions of poor visibility, strong winds, heavy seas and low cloud cover. Sea temperatures affect submarines' sonar patterns.

Amphibious-assault operations are influenced by factors that influence air support. Surf, tides, temperature, visibility and winds must be considered when landing on beaches and maintaining logistic support after the landing.
