A new commandant takes charge

Gen. Gray points to the future of the Corps during CamPen visit

CAMP PENDLETON, Calif. — Commandant of the Marine Corps, Gen. A. M. Gray toured Camp Pendleton and talked to officers

and enlisted recently during the first stop of a tour of West Coast Marine bases.

The commandant, who has indicated that he prefers being in the field with the troops rather than with bureaucrats in Washington, took two separate opportuni-

ties to speak to officers and staff noncommissioned officers. During his no-nonsense, to-the-point presentations, he made his intentions clear. His first point was to dispel any rumors that he was an "East Coast Marine."

"There is no more East or West Coast Marine Corps," he said. "There is only one Corps, one total force. There will be no more East/West discussion."

The major thrust of the commandant's talk centered on readiness and where the Corps is, and where it needs to go to be more prepared.

"I believe we are the best fighting force on earth," he said. "We may be, or we may not be. If we are not, then that's where we are going to go. I also believe that if you know anything at all about training or being a warrior, then you know in your heart we are not as good as we ought to be."

To achieve this state of readiness, the commandant has proposed that the Corps will go back to some of its old ways, and step forward in other areas.

A need for more Marines in the infantry battalions was one area discussed by the commandant. "I don't know why we spend so much time

training young Marines in infantry matters because they haven't been through Infantry Training School." He said he didn't know at what price, but one way or another, the Corps is going back to every Marine going through the Infantry Training Regiment done away with in 1972. A hearty round of ooh-rahs and applause followed.

The next point of return to a more "macho" Corps, according to Gen. Gray, will be the return of the Physical Readiness Test and the end of the era of zero-defect mentality rampant in the Corps.

"We have a Corps of Marines who are afraid to make mistakes. I don't care

how you look. I care how you are. If you look good, you are good," he said. The general said the PRT will be taken along with the PFT, but his real interest lies in whether you can carry a wounded Marine 50 or 60 meters without killing him.

To the officers and staff noncommissioned officers, the general said an environment is going to be created where our young people (speaking specifically about corporals and sergeants) can seek challenges beyond what they are left alone to do today.

He spoke adamantly about putting the training of recruits back into the hands of the drill instructors and

getting the officers back into the infantry battalions where they belong.

"It takes guts to turn somebody loose, to have them go out and make mistakes where you are accountable," he said. In the same fiery breath he said if this type of environment is provided where young Marines are free to grow morally and mentally, "then you are doing what I want and I will be accountable. They may not always do it right, and that's when we need to stand behind them until they get it right."

A step toward a more professional and ready Corps lies in what the commandant See CAMPEN A-2

CMC quoted at 29 Palms

The Commandant of the Marine Corps, General A.M. Gray, visited the Marine Corps Air/Ground Combat Center recently as part of his visit to various Marine Corps installations.

During a news conference the commandant commented on various aspects of the Corps:

Training

"We're combat ready, but in my view we can always be better. We're going to stress total focus on being warriors and supporters of warriors. We're going to take a hard look at the entire training program within the Marine Corps. We're going to do a number of things that we believe will make us even more prepared for what must be done."

The Corps' growth plan

"There has been throughout the decade, a plan for gradual growth within the Marine Corps. Our goal is to reach 203,000 in numbers. We are trying to strengthen our advocate capabilities, particularly in the combat functions."

The role of women Marines

"I support the role of women in the Marine Corps. I think they're doing a superb job in the billets they fill. At the present moment we have a sufficient number of women in the Corps. Due to the fact that women can only fill certain billets, we must maintain an appropriate balance. The kind of combat today is different from the kind in WWII and as you see in the movies. There is no rigid front line. We will, however, have to deploy our women Marines to combat theaters because they are very involved in the different aspects of the Marine Corps."

1/3 Marines assist in search for hiker

Ten days after a flash flood ripped through the Koolau Mountains, sweeping away Nang Nguyen from the Sacred Falls area, Marines from Co. B, 1st Bn., 3d Marines began to search for the 61-year-old hiker.

Several previous searches by civilian authorities had been unsuccessful. From an urgent request by Hawaii State Sen. Jimmy Wong, more than 130 Marines arrived at the Sacred Falls area July 31 to begin the last-ditch search effort.

Nang, who had been picking mountain apples with a

friend, Quyen Gia Tran, 25, was about a quarter mile down from the falls when the flash flood rushed through the small and relatively calm stream.

Moving on line and about five to seven feet apart, the Marines began combing areas in and on both sides of the river looking for any signs of life.

"Even though it's been ten days, there hasn't been a trace of odor which leads me to believe that the victim may not be dead," said Jim Gomes, heading the State's Search-and-Rescue Team.

The only trace of Nang found in the previous searches was his blue T-shirt and shorts along with the bag of mountain apples he was picking during the flood.

The Marines began searching at the point where Nang was swept away by the strong current. After covering the area extensively for eight hours, LCpl. James Kiser, 3d Platoon, found Nang's watch near the stream approximately 250 meters from where he was last seen by his friend Quyen.

Search, Rescue crew aids civilian fishermen off shore Kahana Bay

Three civilian fishermen were rescued by a SOMS Search and Rescue helicopter after their small fishing boat capsized a few hundred yards off-shore in Kahana Bay, at approximately 11 a.m. Monday.

According to Capt. John Barghusen, copilot of the rescue aircraft, an Army helicopter spotted the capsized vessel and radioed the air traffic control tower here, at 11:05 a.m. to pick up the

fishermen. By 11:10 Pedro was in the air and on its way.

Once James McDermott, a 58-year-old Navy retiree, from Laie; his 15-year-old grandson, Rodney Fuhlrodt, of Nebraska; and another youth, Patrick Vahey, also 15, of Punaluu, were located, LCpl. Ed Rowe, a SAR swimmer, was lowered into the water to assist them.

"We were fishing a couple of hundred yards from shore on Kahana Bay," McDermott explained. "Our boat was just drifting and we got

too close to the reef. I tried to start the engine but it wouldn't start. I could see the waves breaking, then we capsized."

They were brought back to the Air Station for medical attention. According to Petty Officer Second Class Paul Leytem, a corpsman here, the three were treated for mild hypothermia but were alert and in stable condition. They were then transported to the medical clinic where they were examined by a medical officer and released.

believes is one of the biggest challenges that faces the Corps — what he called "careerism."

"People are more interested in their careers and themselves than in their profession," he said. "As of last Thursday, I am the professional planner for the officer Corps and SgtMaj. Sommers for the enlisted Corps. No longer will there be career planners."

Gen. Gray said there will be no more dialogue between monitors and Marines. "If you have a problem," the general said, "call me and

make it short. We are going back to the old way of receiving and carrying out a set of orders. But, that is not to say we are going to take the human element out of it.

"What you see is what you get," he said referring to the end of hand-picked general staffs and the soon-to-come uprooting of homesteaders.

The general also talked about the perception that the Corps is not the Corps it used to be, that we need to be led out of the wilderness. "We're coming back to a time when you do what the Corps needs you to do," Gen. Gray said.

"I'm a believer in taking the snakebite and making it

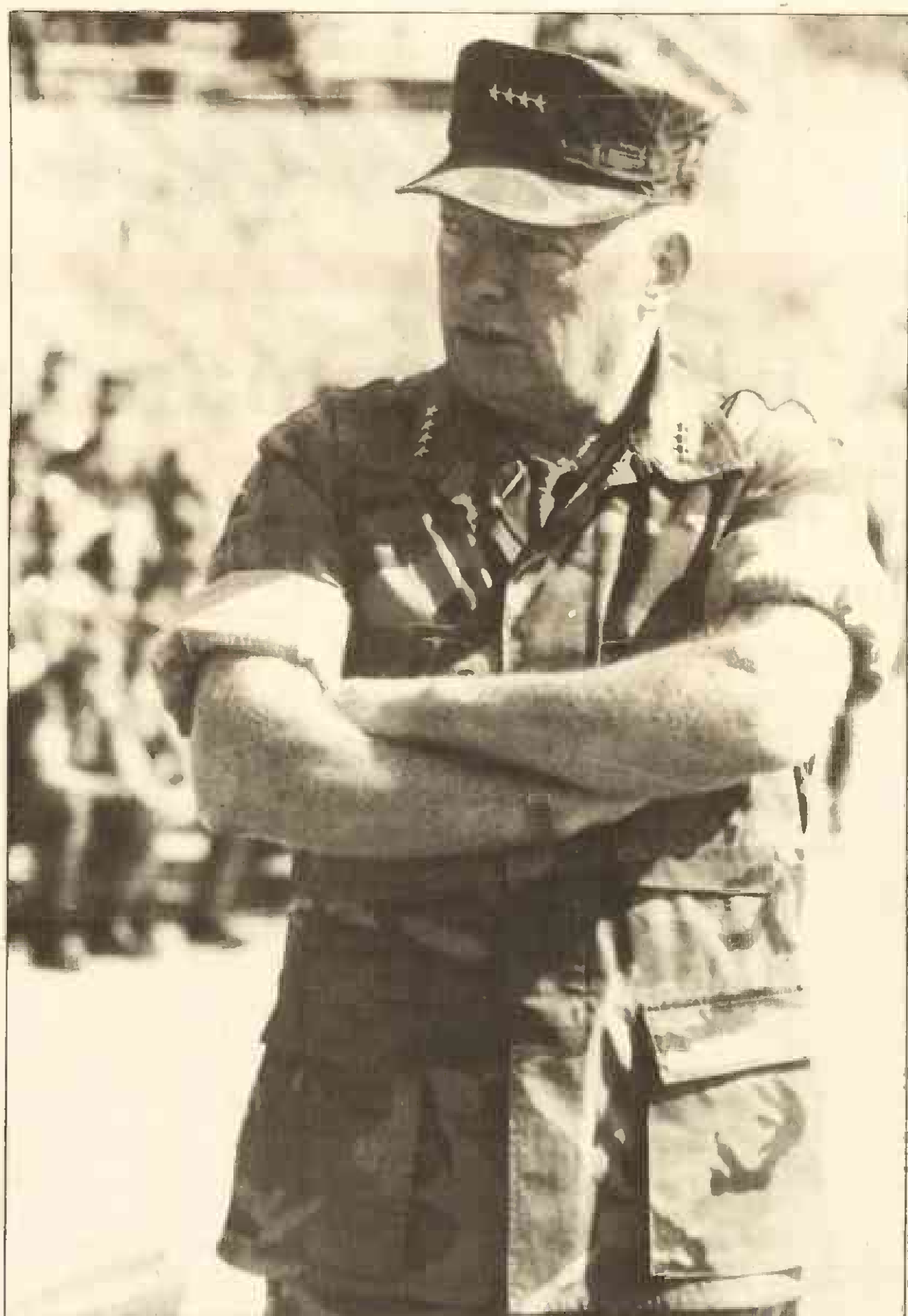
work for you." The snakebites he referred to were in respect to the bombing of the Marine barracks in Beirut, Lebanon, and the Iran-Contra and Moscow embassy incident.

In regard to the Corps' future, the general concluded that it is on the offense. "We're going to make sure everyone on this globe understands that we're a Corps that is going to be greater than ever and we can take names anytime, anyplace."

Commandant salutes HMMH-466

MCAS TUSTIN, Calif. — New Marine Corps commandant General A.M. Gray stopped at MCAS Tustin during his West Coast tour to meet with his Marines. After chatting with troops at the messhall, Gen. Gray went to Marine HMMH-466 to congratulate the squadron on winning the Department of Defense Award for Maintenance Excellence.

After unveiling the plaque and lugging it out in front of the formation for all the Marines to see, Gen. Gray said, "I want to tell you up front, man to man, Marine to Marine, Al Gray to one of his great squadrons, that I happen to be a very powerful and fervent believer in the CH-53 'Echo'. We could not be the magnificent force-in-readiness we are today with-



out this aircraft's capabilities."

He noted that some skeptics question the aircraft, and there have been problem areas recently, "but none of that has anything to do with you," he told the "Wolfpack." "As a matter of fact, if everybody flew, maintained and supported this aircraft like you do, we wouldn't hear much about the 53 Echo except the great things."

The "Wolfpack" was one of

only six units from throughout the Department of Defense to be recognized for outstanding maintenance. Maintenance in the DoD is a \$40 billion per year project, involving more than 900,000 skilled technicians or craftsmen.

Not only has the squadron maintained an operational readiness rate 15 to 20 percentage points above the average, but it has also submitted technical recommendations that have benefitted all CH-53E units in the Navy and Marine Corps.

"We all believe in the aircraft," said Cpl. John Christopherson, flightline mechanic with '466. "If we see problems, we deal with

them. We've flown more mishap-free hours and made more positive changes than anyone else."

"The aircraft can only be as good as the people who work on it," added Cpl. Todd Stoult, also of flightline.

The Marines who do the maintenance work were pleased with the award and honored by the commandant's interest. "It's the first time a Marine aviation unit has ever won the award," said Stoult. "The squadron's really proud of it."

"It feels good, after working so many hours, to be recognized for it," said Cpl. Larry Plewniak, flightline mechanic.

"It's a great privilege to be

able to say I serve with you," Gen. Gray said. "If I can be half as good a commandant to our great Corps as you have been a squadron in terms of the way you perform your duties, that would be a prayer answered."

As he prepared to move on to the next stop of his itinerary, Gen. Gray did something he said he does only on occasion. He did it while talking to his troops after the evacuation of Saigon, after they'd recovered the USS Mayaguez, and on three instances when his warriors returned from Lebanon and Grenada. He asked squadron commanding officer LtCol. William C.E. Wolfe to call his men to attention and then saluted the "Wolfpack."

"I'd like to salute HMMH-466 for what you have been and what you will be to the Marine Corps."

Did you know?

Specific regulations, Air Station Order 1020.4C, spell out the policies for wearing utilities, coveralls and flight clothing both on and off the Air Station. A recent joint message from the 1st MAB and MCAS, reiterates and amplifies certain aspects of this regulation.

In general, utilities and flight clothing were autho-

rized for wear to and from on- and off-station quarters. Stops off-station, for whatever reason, are not authorized. These working uniforms cannot be worn while walking or riding bicycles off-station, even to and from quarters.

Marines residing in off-station TLA facilities are not authorized to wear either

utilities or flight clothing to and from their quarters. Also, these uniforms cannot be worn when traveling via public transportation, such as a bus or taxi.

Coveralls are considered a working uniform and can be worn in immediate work areas, and, provided they are clean and not stained with grease or oil, in the dining

facility for breakfast and lunch.

Military Police will be issuing Minor Incident Reports to those in violation of uniform regulations. Also, anyone attempting to depart the Air Station in violation of the "regs" will be detained and released to an appropriate unit representative.

CMC at MCDEC:

'Common sense will tell you what is right'

MCDEC, Quantico, Va. — General A. M. Gray, commandant of the Marine Corps, visited the Marine Corps Development and Education Command, July 9, the first base he has visited since assuming the Corps' highest position June 28.

The commandant addressed the students and staff of the Marine Security Guard School, and attended change of command ceremonies at The Basic School and at Marine Helicopter Squadron One.

While at TBS, he told newly-graduated lieutenants: "The troops are the warriors and the reason you exist. And as long as you promise to do everything you can for those troops, we'll get along fine. If not, you're out of here."

At Marine Security Guard Battalion, the commandant expressed his views on their role, where the Marine Corps is today, and where he believes it should be.

The general congratulated the audience, comprised of students and staff members, for being part of a special organization with a unique mission; but he reminded them that all Marines are equal in importance.

"There are about 198,500 Marines in the Marine Corps and all of them are special," he said. "The reason they are special is that they make up the best-led, best-trained and most self-disciplined organization on earth. More importantly, they are expected to be winners."

The commandant added that Marines aren't special because their superiors demand it, but because the nation demands it.

"It isn't easy to be a Marine ... there's a lot of sacrifice and a lot of loneliness," he said. "But the reason Marines have served the state department and foreign policy since the Marine Corps' birth is because we do it better!"

"Our history supports the proud way we have served our country. You are the latest generation of Marines who do what has to be done."

He told the class to draw on that tradition, that legacy and history when they get lonely and their thoughts stray from their mission. He emphasized self-discipline.

"Being self-disciplined is doing what has to be done," he said. "Wherever we have a breakdown in discipline, we're not doing what has to

be done, are we?

"To be a good leader, you have to keep leading," he added, and pointed out that all Marines were leaders, because in his Corps whenever there are two Marines, one of them is in charge. "That means, in or out of combat, you never let your fellow Marine down. Your

mission, task and responsibility is to look after each other. It's part of the price and privilege of wearing this uniform."

General Gray said good leaders sacrifice more. "You have to take care of your people and be squared away yourself. There's an old say-

ing in the Corps, take care of your troops and they'll take care of you.

"We're going to take all this talk about how we're not what we used to be and tell them, 'you get out of the way, we're going where we want.'"

The general also said the key to maintaining the Marine Corps as a force in readiness is "training, training and more training."

"The threat is out there, and it's everywhere," he said. "You have to be streetwise. What you are being trained to do is important or we wouldn't be doing it. If you think you are good enough now, you aren't getting the message. You have to better."

"The responsibility to be the best Marine in the world is on your shoulders. We have some extraordinarily high standards of excellence, and I'm going to raise them even higher."

In closing remarks, he stated that common sense was the bottom line. "Common sense will tell you what is right."

Corps discontinues enlistment incentive

HQMC, Washington, DC, — Since 1982, a high school graduate with an Armed Forces Qualification Test (AFQT) score of 65 (70 for MOS request) has been offered several incentives to enlist for six years under the Quality Enlistment Program (QEP).

However, since June 1, new Marine Corps recruits enlisting under QEP will no longer have the incentive of "accelerated promotion" from lance corporal to corporal, according to a manpower official.

Since September 1982, when QEP began under the title "Six Year Enlistment Program," qualified recruits have had several advantages, one of which was accelerated promotion from lance corporal to corporal without having to achieve a specific cutting score.

Other incentives were, and still are: choice of occupational field, choice of duty assignment, automatic appointment as private first class upon entry to active duty, and accelerated promotion to lance corporal. Promotions, however, are still based on the same standards as

regular Marines.

The official said the initial goal of the program was to improve the quality of Marines enlisted while increasing the Term of Enlistment. This would also reduce the cost of training and recruiting. The AFQT score requirement was reduced to 50 (65 for MOS request) in August 1985 to increase the number of six-year enlistments.

As the Marine Corps' quality increased, so did its retention rate. This caused a slow down on the pathway to promotion, so the average time in grade requirements for the average corporal increased. Because of this overall increase, the requirements for the QEP Marine were raised from seven to 12 months time in grade and from 13 to 18 months time in service.

The requirement for promotion to corporal was again increased in June 1986 (time in grade increased to 24 months, time in service increased to 30 months).

The CMC decided to eliminate the accelerated promotion to corporal after talking to many Marines in the field.

The official said the CMC felt promotion to the NCO ranks should be based on the individual's performance and ability and not on his or her actions during the time of enlistment.

The most recent changes in the overall Marine Corps promotion structure include:

1. The promotion by MOS instead of OccFLD of Staff NCOs.

2. Reduced meritorious promotions.
3. Stabilization of the MOS structure to allow for equal and deserving promotion opportunity.

Manpower's overall goal is to purify the promotion system and make it a fair and more equitable one. The spokesperson said, "The Commandant believed in the value of the QEP as 1) an excellent program to continue to keep the Corps manned with quality Marines for longer terms of enlistment and 2) a valuable recruiting tool."

Although the results of these changes won't be seen until 1990 or 1991, Manpower officials believe the changes will not have a major impact on recruiting.

Local spa closes; refunds 'unlikely'

Servicemembers and dependents were among the thousands of customers of Mademoiselle Spa Lady surprised by the recent closing of the Kaneohe health club located in the Windward City Shopping Center. Customers have since received written notice that the corporation which operated the club has filed a petition with the U.S. Bankruptcy Court in Honolulu.

Papers filed with the Court by the corporation state that its debts, not including any amounts owed to customers, greatly exceed its assets, which are limited to office equipment, supplies, machinery and other equipment. The corporation has requested approval of the Court to retain an auctioneer to sell off these assets at an auction scheduled for July 28, 1987, and, in that connection, the Court has been told that efforts to sell the business have not been successful and that the business will not be reopened. The Court has been asked to approve a voluntary surrender of the premises where the club was operated to the landlord of the premises.

At a meeting of creditors at

the Court on July 16, attended by about a hundred former members and other creditors, representatives of the club stated that it is doubtful that former members will receive any refund because administrative expenses and creditors with higher priority will likely exhaust all available assets. However, they stated that they are studying the possibility that persons who joined the club within 90 days before the petition in bankruptcy was filed, that is, persons who joined on or after March 10, 1987, may have a higher priority to be paid before other members.

All former members and other creditors were urged to file a Proof of Claim with the Court, a one-page form identifying the creditor and the basis for the claim. The forms are available from the Clerk of the Court.

Former members were told at the meeting that another health club in Kaneohe, Spa Health and Fitness Center, has agreed to honor the memberships of Mademoiselle Spa Lady and that the terms under which this will be done may vary according to the type of contract which the member had with Mademoiselle Spa Lady. Former

members were also told that since Mademoiselle Spa Lady was a member of The Association of Physical Fitness Centers, other health clubs across the United States which are members of that association should honor the Mademoiselle memberships despite the fact that Mademoiselle has closed its doors.

Since the likelihood of refunds from Mademoiselle is slim, making use of other health clubs' facilities may be the only remaining value to be obtained by former Mademoiselle members for what they paid for their memberships.

The president and sole stockholder of the corpora-

tion which operated Mademoiselle, H. Keith Lewin, stated that the club closed its doors because of competition from other clubs, increasing operating costs and high accounts receivable, and he had no other choice but to close the club and seek the protection of the Court.

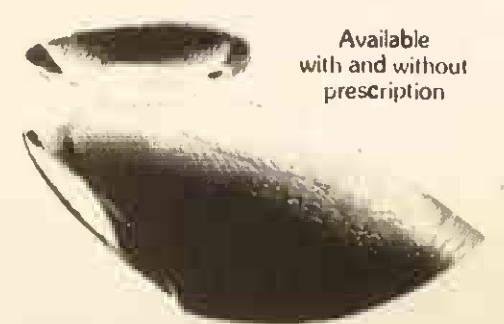

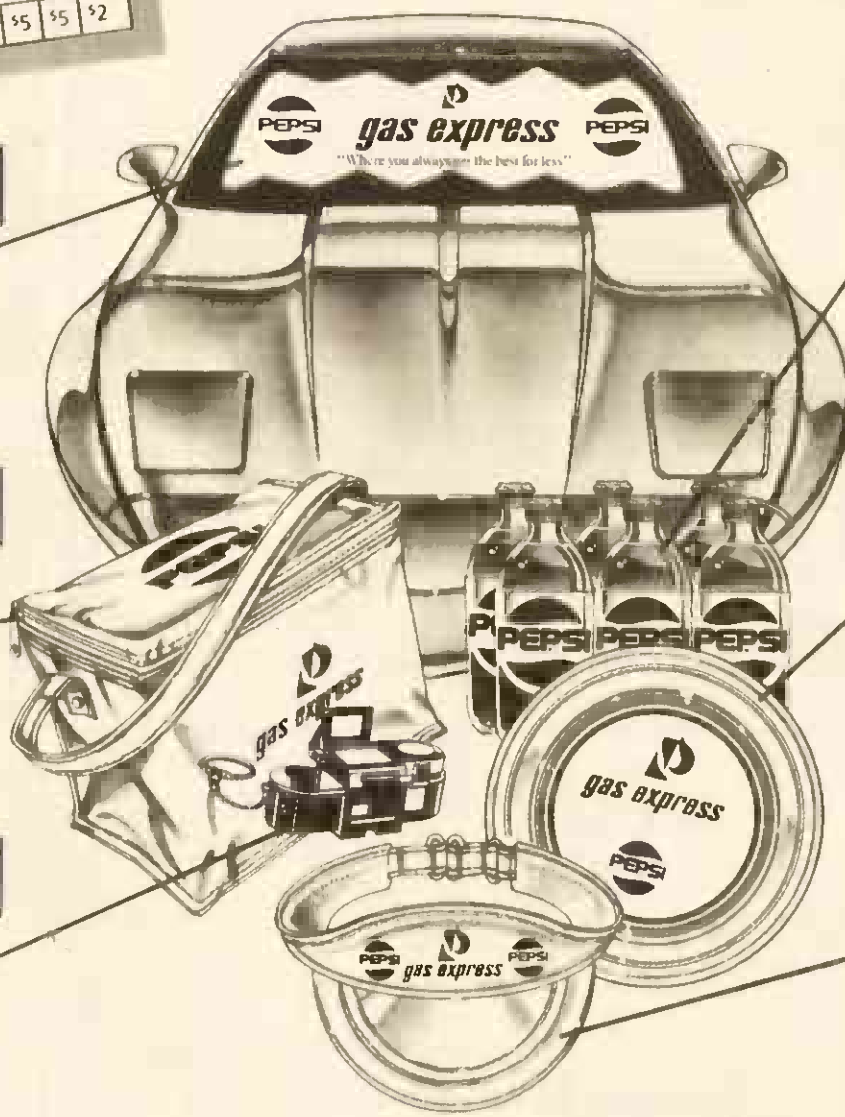

Courts-martial authority expands

Recently, in the case of *Solorio vs. United States* the Supreme Court significantly expanded court-martial jurisdiction. In a decision dated June 25, 1987, the Court announced that a court-martial has jurisdiction over any offense as long as the accused is an active duty servicemember.

The Solorio decision overturned earlier decisions that

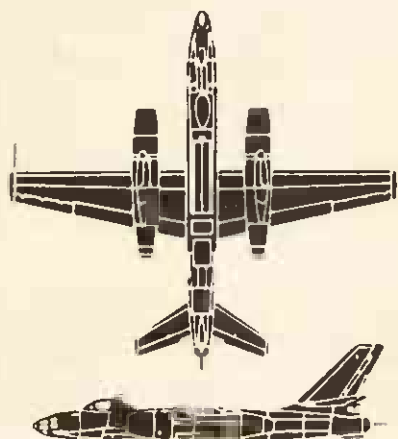
required the offense to be "service connected" in order for the accused servicemember to be tried by the military. The key factor in determining service connection was often the location of the offense. Off-base offenses could only be prosecuted by the military in limited circumstances. With the Supreme Court's expansion of jurisdiction in Solorio, courts-martial may now hear cases regardless of the location of the offense.

Although off-base offenses now fall within the jurisdic-

tion of courts-martial, restrictions do apply if the offense has already been tried in a domestic or foreign criminal court. In order for the military to prosecute an offense that has already been prosecuted in a civilian court, special circumstances must exist.

Generally, circumstances must exist that make military prosecution essential in the interest of justice, discipline, and proper administration within the service. The determination is to be made on a case by case basis.

Marines debut new hovercraft in Philippines

GREEN BEACH, SUBIC BAY NAVAL FACILITY, Republic of the Philippines — Captain Kirk Deissler had been in the amphibious warfare business for nine years but he still tensed up when the amphibious assault vehicle he was riding on rolled into the water.

The AAV was buttoned up tight but Deissler knew it didn't really matter. He was going to get wet anyway. If Deissler didn't get soaked in his own sweat on the way into the beach, the Philippine jungle heat and monsoon rains would take care of him later.

Deissler, though had more important things on his mind on July 14. His Marines, the men of Co. A, 1/9, were about to make history, one way or the other.

For the first time the Marine Corps was going to assault a beach in another country with the help of the Navy's new attack hovercraft. The Landing Craft Air Cushion travels on a bed of pressurized air at speeds exceeding 50 knots. Three LCACs are embarked with Amphibious Ready Group Alpha to transport assault equipment of the 13th MAU.

Deissler's AAV roared through the surf, its tracks churning the water as they grasped for shore. The landing was a daylight rehearsal in preparation for a pre-dawn

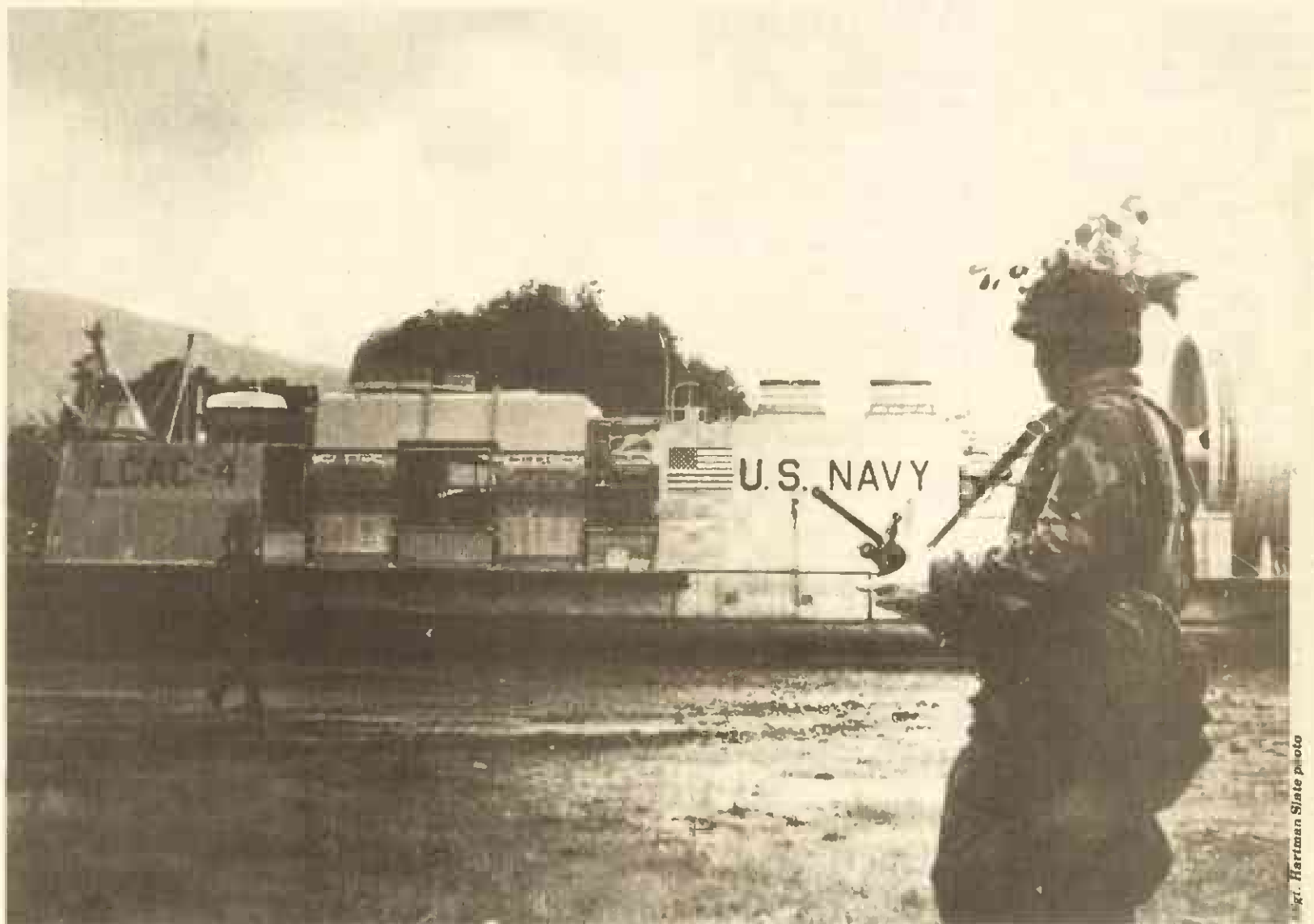
raid exercise the next day. Deissler watched his charges closely, looking for things he would need to smooth out in the debriefing later.

Facing the Marines was a tactical situation that would leave most commanders uneasy. The beach was less than 200 yards wide and inland marshes channeled any breakout down a lone dirt road. Resistance along the road could cause problems but the 1/9 Marines charged head-on. A MAU specializes in rolling with the punches.

While deployed in the Pacific, the 13th MAU acts as the spearhead for the III MAF, headquartered in Okinawa, Japan. Task organized to provide rapid response to almost any situation, the MAU is the smallest of the Corps' Marine Air/Ground Task Forces.

The 13th MAU is built around a ground combat element manned by Battalion Landing Team 1/9. The battalion is supported by a composite air squadron of helicopters and a combat service support element.

As the AAVs moved into the hinterland, carrying A Company to its objective, the LCACs thundered from their home aboard the amphibious washup, USS Germantown. Throwing huge plumes of spray into the air, the LCACs carried much-needed tanks and other assault vehicles to the beach at more than four times the speed of conventional landing craft. Deissler

liked that a lot.

Satisfied with the way his platoon commanders were pushing forward, Deissler made a few mental notes that would speed things up on D-Day. He watched as Marines

form the MAU service support group moved ashore to plan the supply build-up that follows a beach assault.

Deissler was soaked by the time the rehearsal landing ended, less than two hours

after it began. Then rain was driving down on the MAU Marines and showed little sign of letting up. As far as the Marines were concerned, there wasn't much left to do but return to their ship, clean

their equipment and get ready to do it all over again.

It hadn't been a bad day for them. They had, after all, put themselves in the Corps' history book.

2/3 squad back from Oki contest; Hawaii Marines come in third

The Marines of 2nd Squad, 2nd Plt., Co. E, 2/3 are back in Hawaii after taking third place in the Far East Division Squad Competitions held recently in Okinawa.

The winner of the competition was a squad from 3d Bn., 8th Marines, followed by Marines from 1st Bn., 5th Marines, who took second place.

The Hawaii Marines, led by squad leader Sgt. Michael Larkin, earned the right to represent the 3d Marines (Rein) at the division level after winning several preliminary bouts here, including

company battalion, and regiment level competitions.

"We did real well in the offensive and defensive packages, as well as the patrolling," said Larkin, "which is where we've always made our points. What hurt us was the four-mile stretcher run. We just weren't used to the heat and humidity over there."

During the offensive portion of the competition the Marines were required to make a four-mile movement-to-contact, then mount an organized raid on a small, heavily-wired objective on a hilltop.

For the defensive package, the Hawaii Marines were dug

into positions on the reverse slope of a hill overlooking a bridge that they were required to defend. "This was a unique situation, because we were sent a two-man recon team to swim across the river at night and set charges and lay mines," said Larkin. "When the aggressors assaulted across the bridge we fired our Final Protective fire and stopped the attack," he added.

"We trained for about three weeks after the regiment-level competition, and we were really confident. I didn't think we could have been any better prepared, but things just didn't go our way," said Larkin.

AV-8B Harrier to be equipped with night attack capabilities

ST. LOUIS, — The first U.S. Marine Corps AV-8B Harrier II aircraft with night attack capability made its maiden flight from St. Louis recently.

This new capability will allow the Marine Corps to provide around-the-clock close air support for ground troops. All production AV-8Bs will be equipped with the night attack features beginning in late 1989.

(While no Harriers are assigned to MAG-24 at MCAS Kaneohe Bay, a number of AV-8Bs could be assigned to the Group if the 1st MAB deployed in its Maritime Prepositioning Force role.)

A vertical/short takeoff and landing attack jet, the

AV-8B is built by McDonnell Douglas in St. Louis. Four tactical squadrons and one training squadron now fly the aircraft.

Several new systems including a forward-looking infrared sensor, a color digital moving map and night vision goggles have been integrated with current AV-8B systems for the night missions.

"What we've done is expand the hours of the day that we'll be able to employ the weapons system," said Ed Harper, vice president and general manager of the AV-8B program at McDonnell Aircraft Co.

Harper said that the AV-8B night attack program is being conducted in coopera-

tion with the McDonnell Douglas F/A-18 Hornet fighter program for the Marine Corps and the U.S. Navy.

The key to the new night-time capability is a forward-looking infrared sensor that "sees" in the dark. Located in the nose of the airplane, this sensor provides the pilot with a video picture of the scene ahead of the aircraft on a wide field of view, head-up display.

The video image from the sensor resembles a green and white television picture and helps the pilot locate, identify and attack ground targets.

The video image also can be shown on a digital display indicator in the cockpit instrument panel.

A multipurpose color display in the cockpit, made by Smith's Industries Controls, Ltd., provides pilots with a color digital moving map that gives a video picture of the charts and maps used for mission planning and execution. The map, designed and built by Sperry Corp., displays navigational data and important threat and intelligence information. The navigational data is stored on a laser disk.

The controls for the forward-looking infrared sensor and digital moving map are located on the flight stick as part of the AV-8B's hands-on-throttle-and-stick operation.

Another important element of the night attack system is the night vision goggles. Pilots will use the goggles to identify and track targets outside the infrared sensor's field of view. The night vision goggles are similar to those used by infantry troops, but they have been designed specifically for nighttime flying.

The standard white lighting for the instrument panel has been changed to a blue-green lighting system because the brightness of white light limits the effectiveness of the pilot's night vision goggles.

McDonnell Douglas has delivered 86 AV-8Bs to the Marine Corps, which plans to buy a total of 328 aircraft. The British Royal Air Force now flies the Harrier II and is scheduled to order a total of 96 aircraft. The first of 12 EAV-8B Harrier IIs is scheduled for delivery to the Spanish navy this summer.
