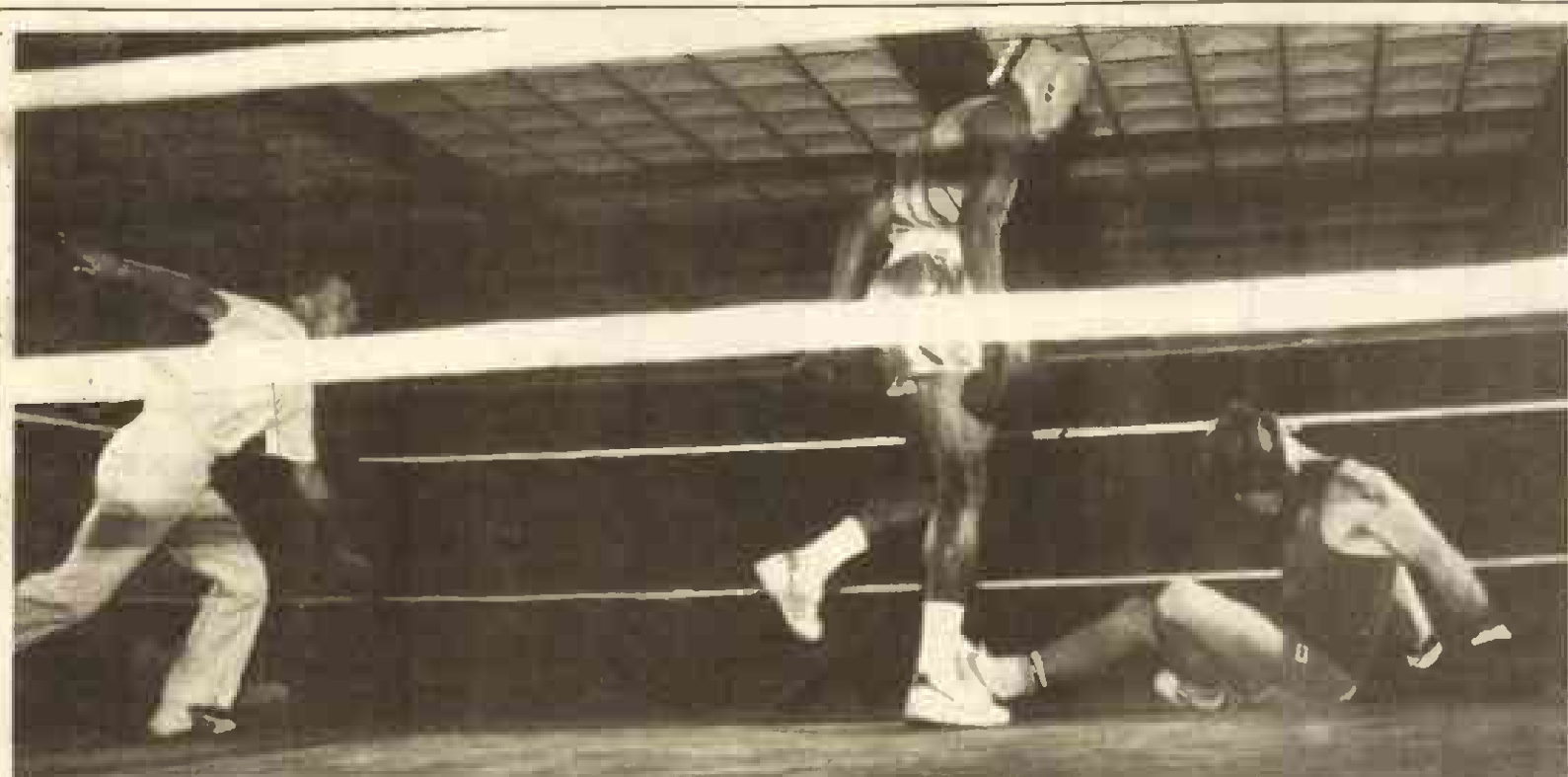

MC Marathon set for Nov. 8

Running enthusiasts throughout the nation are starting to gear up for the 12th Annual Marine Corps Marathon. The 26-mile 385-yard challenge will take place on Nov. 8, starting at the Marine Corps (Iwo Jima) War Memorial in Arlington, Va., at 9 a.m.

Approximately 12,000 marathoners are expected to leave the starting line at the memorial, and trek through Arlington, Georgetown, and the District of Columbia.

The race has been nicknamed "The Marathon of the Monuments" because of its scenic route. National landmarks along the course include the Capitol, the White House, Jefferson and

Lincoln Memorials, the Pentagon, national museums and the Kennedy Center.

The District of Columbia Special Olympics and Marine Corps Marathon are again sponsoring the Special Olympics Mini-Marathon connected with race day activities. This event is open to Special Olympians throughout the nation and begins 20 minutes after the start of the marathon.

Pre-marathon running clinics will be held Sept. 4, 25, Oct. 9 and 23, at George Washington University's Medical Center. The clinics start at 7 p.m., in Ross Hall. Speaker Dr. David M. Brody will cover topics on treatment and prevention of injuries.

MAG-24 takes HEED

New air bottle aids aircrew survivability

With the majority of the flights from Marine Corps Air Station Kaneohe Bay taking place over water, being trapped underwater during a mishap is a definite possibility for aviators here.

To give themselves a little added protection, helicopter crews here are currently training with the Helicopter Emergency Egress Device. The HEED is a small metal cylinder, similar to a scuba tank, that contains approximately 1,800 pounds per square inch of compressed air.

"How long a person can breathe with this bottle varies, depending on depth and the way he breathes," said Petty Officer 1st Class John Dacko, a hospital corpsman from the Aviation Physiology Training Department, Branch Medical Clinic at Naval Air Station, Barbers Point. "Generally the air will last about two minutes at 20 feet," he added.

The purpose of the bottle is to give pilots and crewmen extra time if they should happen to get trapped under-

water during an mishap.

The bottles are equipped with on-demand regulators that release air only when the user inhales, then closes so the user can exhale through the mouthpiece.

"Aircrewmen have to get training with the bottle before they can be issued one," said Dacko. "The hardest part generally is getting someone to breathe underwater, because it isn't natural. Once he get over that it's easy."

During the course of the training, aircrewmen attend a HEED classroom session, then hit the Station Pool for hands-on experience.

Initially, the students practice breathing with the bottle while sitting in the shallow end of the pool. Once they are comfortable with that they begin training with the Shallow Water Egress Trainer.

The SWET is a rectangular box constructed from metal tubing. Mounted on top of the box is a seat on a swiveling bar. The box is lowered into the pool and an aircrewman is strapped into the seat, which is then flipped over, dunking the occupant and

simulating an overturned helicopter.

Hanging upside down underwater, the student has to unstrap himself, get his HEED bottle out and begin to use it, then find his way out of the trainer.

The students have to go

through the SWET trainer four times. The first time the student simply exits the trainer without the bottle. On the next try, the student has to get the bottle out and begin using it before unstrapping himself, then move to exit the trainer.

On the last two tries, divers are positioned around the trainer to prevent students from exiting in certain areas, simulating clocked escape hatches. The goal is to teach them not to panic if they can't immediately find a way out.

"It's hard to get used to using the bottle and breathing underwater, but it's always good to have those few extra breaths," 1stLt. Mark Turgeon, a CH-53D pilot from HMH-463, who went through the HEED training.

"It doesn't take that much longer to get the bottle out and start using it, and it helps relax you, knowing that you have it. This is definitely a good idea and I'm glad it's finally been implemented," Turgeon added.

HEED training was conducted over a six-day period, with 151 Marines from MAG-24 squadrons qualifying to carry the bottle, including 48 in one day. This was a new Navy record, according to LtCmdr. C.L. Schuyler, the MAG-24 Aeromedical Safety Officer.

For now the bottles will be carried in the pouch used to hold the service pistol in the SV2 Survival Vest that aircrewmen wear. The vest will be modified in the future to incorporate a permanent place for the bottle, according to Dacko.

DACOWITS Committee visits WMs from Station, 1st MAB

VMFA-232 SNCO named as academy honor grad; earns 99.1 overall score

Many Marines aspire to be the best. However, being the very best in a highly competitive environment is something few of us ever achieve. Recently, SSgt. J.E. Glick, a powerplants mechanic from VMFA-232, was named honor graduate of the Staff NCO Academy with a composite score of 99.1 percent.

The Staff NCO Academy, located in El Toro, Calif., consists of six weeks of training designed to hone the professional skills of both staff NCOs and staff sergeant selectees. Most importantly, the academy strives to prepare its students for greater responsibility by way of instruction in selected subject areas. These include: leadership, techniques of military instruction, drill, inspection, Marine uniform regulations, physical training management, training management, administration, operations, military justice and counseling.

The overall grade that students receive at the end of the course is derived from personal appearance, leadership abilities, drill, students presentations, and physical fitness. Ten academic exams were given in the six week period. From approximately 350 questions, Glick missed only three.

So keen was the competition, that it was not until the final day before graduation that Glick was made aware of having earned the title of "honor grad." In addition, he was told that, based on peer evaluations and the opinions of the staff members he was to receive the Peer Leadership Award. Besides receiving a trophy Glick was tasked with delivering an address on graduation day describing the classes' experiences while at the academy.

After his speech Glick participated in the procession of graduates assuming his rightful place at the head of the line and accepted an NCO sword, traditionally given to each classes' honor graduate.

training, nutrition and equipment needed to endure the distance.

Similar clinics will be conducted at the Sheraton National Hotel, in Arlington, Va. The first symposium will begin at 7 p.m., Nov. 6, followed by symposiums that begin at 9 a.m., Nov. 7 and continue throughout the day.

Also at the Sheraton National Hotel Nov. 6 and 7, in conjunction with the Marine Corps Association, the Marine Corps Marathon will host the Runner's Exposition. Commercial vendors will be on hand from 3 to 8 p.m., Nov. 6, and 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Nov. 7, with state-of-the-art displays of shoes, clothing, equipment and literature, as well as nutritional products, medical aids and other related running items.

A traditional pre-marathon pasta dinner will be served at the Sheraton on Nov. 7 from 4 to 10 p.m.

Highlighting the pre-marathon activities will be the keynote address given by veteran marathoner Bill Rogers and Dr. George Sheehan, prominent members of the running community.

All participants of the Marine Corps Marathon will receive a marathon T-shirt and patch. All finishers receive a completion certificate and more than 300 awards will be given to the winners of the various categories of the race.

The open winner will be presented the Middendorff Trophy. In addition, awards will be presented to the top men and women finishers in the following age groups: 19 and younger, 20-24, 25-29, 30-34, 35-39, 40-44, 45-49, 50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74, 75-79, and 80 and older. There are no age limits in the Marine Corps Marathon, but the American Joggers Association does not recommend running marathons for persons under 14 years old.

Registration for the marathon costs \$15, and is payable by check or money order to MASD NAFI-89. Write to the Marine Corps Marathon, P.O. Box 188, Quantico, Va., 22134 for applications, or call (703) 640-2225 or 2720.

Team applications must be postmarked by Oct. 27, and individual entries must be mailed by Oct. 13. No applications will be accepted after the deadline or after field limit of 12,000 entrants is registered.

Former 3d Marines CO reflects on AWS

MCDEC, Quantico, Va. Colonel Ron Christmas returned to the hallowed halls and classrooms of the Amphibious Warfare School here last July after almost 20 years...this time assuming directorship of the prestigious school for captains.

From the rugged jungles and steamy climate of Vietnam, where he earned a Navy Cross, to the classroom atmosphere of AWS, where he was a distinguished honor graduate in 1968, he brings with him the operational expertise and practical experience to run a first-class institution.

"I was very pleased to come back to the school," said the Philadelphia native. "This is the next best duty you can

have other than being a regimental commander."

Prior to reporting to AWS last year, Col. Christmas commanded the 3d Marines, the ground combat element of the 1st MAB.

The 47-year-old Marine feels that recent command of an infantry regiment enables him to better inform captains going back to the fleet about the 'real world'. He also had another very important reason for wanting to come back

to Quantico, the place he has come to call home: his family.

"My wife went to Quantico High School and this is the one place that we've passed through that we can call home," he said.

Christmas' picture joins past school directors' pictures on the wall in the corridor outside his office. Examining the backgrounds of the men in those pictures, it is not rare to find a former student returning to become director of the school.

"Lieutenant General John Phillips, the deputy chief of staff for Plans, Policies and Operations at HQMC and MGen. James McMonagle, CG 1st MarDiv and IMAF in Camp Pendleton, Calif., were former directors here, so I'm in good company," said Christmas, an Army War College graduate.

"What we're seeing more and more is that our faculty consists of many AWS graduates and I think that's extremely important for the school," he said. "They help a great deal by knowing the

school and what can be done to make it better."

When he went through the course, Christmas remembers sitting in his chair eight hours a day, for 22 weeks, listening to instructors.

"I remember thinking to myself that we should be doing classes, such as terrain appreciation, in the field," he said. "I don't want to say we didn't learn a lot, because we did. We just could have learned more."

"What's exciting about AWS today is that the course is expanded to 39 weeks, which allows the captains to go to the field. We spend over 500 hours in the field. Our students are getting hands on training with every weapon. They're firing them. They're spending a week in cold weather training. We're doing things that, back in 1969, I can remember saying we should be doing."

When he first came here, he didn't have to institute a lot of changes, because he felt that, after taking a look at the situation, his predecessor

and faculty had built a tremendous foundation.

"I found that through this first year I tweaked courses, based on my operational experiences as a commander," he continued.

Christmas and his staff have incorporated a school-within-a-school concept, where they give certain mini-courses to students not attending the course. So far, this has just been a test and the colonel hopes that HQMC will approve it.

"We have 14 spaces that can be filled by captains from the Fleet Marine Force who may not have the opportunity to go through AWS," he explained. "By bringing them in for specific mini-courses, they're able to experience a formal school and take away with them a wealth of information that can be used in the FMP."

Statistics show that only 22 percent of Marine Corps captains can go through AWS. But 85 percent of those who do have orders back to

New system helps predict enlistee's potential

HQMC, Washington, DC. — In the past, when a recruit enlisted, he or she was classified as either a High School Diploma Graduate (HSDG) or a Non-High School Graduate (NHSG).

Now, instead of this two tier system, a three tier system is being used. The classifications are now High School Diploma Graduates (Tier I); Alternative Credential Holders (Tier II); and Non-High School Graduates (Tier III).

The classification system is used to help predict the success of the recruits completing their first term of enlistment, according to Manpower Policy Analyst Maj. Mike Swords. It also helps recruiters seek out better quality enlistees.

The increasing variety of alternative educational credentials, such as adult education diplomas, correspondence school diplomas and educational certificates, is one reason why the system has to be adapted. Inconsistencies in the way the different services classified recruits occurred. For example, the Marine Corps accessed those with General Education Degrees (GED) under the non-graduate criteria, but another service used the high school graduate criteria, Swords said.

Another reason for the change came from the public sector. They thought the two tier system reflected on the quality of the educational program. According to Swords, parents and educators said they felt the Marine Corps was saying the alternative programs "were not good programs and don't produce quality men and women."

"That's not what we're saying at all, we're just saying that knowing nothing else about these kids, that in the aggregate, the traditional day high school graduate is better bet," he said. "We didn't say kids without a traditional diploma couldn't enlist."

DoD has found that more daytime high school graduates complete their first term of enlistment successfully than non-graduates, explained Swords.

The change first began in 1983 when a Joint-Service Educational Credentials Working Group began to meet periodically to

review the services' definitions for high school and non-high school graduates.

Manpower came up with the following definitions for the new system:

Tier I. High School Diploma Graduate — An individual who has attended and completed a 12-year/grade day program of classroom instruction and possesses a diploma issued by the school attended, or an individual who has attended and successfully completed at least one semester of college regardless of high school diploma status.

Tier II. Alternative Credential Holder — An individual who has any high school credential not falling into the above category (includes GED, adult high school diploma, continuation high school diploma, certificates of attendance, certificates of completion, etc.).

Tier III. Non-High School Graduate — An individual who has not completed 12 years of school and who does not possess any high school educational credentials.

Because of these changes, recruiters' tasks were also reclassified. So, instead of enlisting the usual 95 percent HSDG, the Marine Corps' goal is to enlist at least 90 percent Tier I HSDG, no more than 3 percent from Tier III, and the difference would fall in the Tier II group of Alternative Credential Holders.

"We haven't lowered the standards," Swords said. "We're getting the same group of people in the three tier system as we did under the two tier, it's just that we're probably better reflecting their educational achievement."

In other words, the recruits classified under Tier II used to be classified as either NHSG or as HSDG (See table).

"We're very confident we'll reach our goals because those are basically the same goals we've been able to achieve in the past," he said. "What we really want to do is see, over a period of time, how the various groups in the alternative credential group perform. We're expecting them to perform well, but if they don't, we'll take a closer look."

Under the DoD regulations, each of the services has the authority to apply different

service-specific enlistment and classification standards for the various subgroups in Tier II.

"We've chosen not to do that because we don't have the data to justify it," Swords said. "It would take several years for us to gather the data."

Besides using the classifications to predict success, the standards also determine whether a recruit can reenlist or qualify for a bonus.

Those classified in Tier II and III cannot qualify for a bonus for two reasons: first, these two groups amount to 10 percent of the recruits and the number who apply always exceed the number needed; second, it is

incentive for the high school student who signs up in the Delayed Entry Program to complete his education.

However, those in Tier II are automatically considered high school graduates when it comes to reenlistment. Only those in Tier III who want to reenlist must work toward and receive a high school degree while in the service.

As of April, those who entered the DEP to be shipped after Oct. 1, 1987, were classified under the three tier system. Recruits shipped before October are the last to be classified under the two tier system.

VMFA-115 makes history

MCAS Iwakuni, Japan — The Silver Eagles of Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-115 made Marine aviation history July 12, when their F/A-18 Hornets arrived here under the Marine Corps Unit Deployment Program. VMFA-115's

arrival marked the introduction of the F/A-18s into the six-month rotational cycle.

Home based from MCAS Beaufort, S.C., the Silver Eagles replaced the Checkers of Marine Fighter Attack Squadron 312, who are also from Beaufort.

Although this is the first six-month deployment overseas with the single-piloted, supersonic fighter/attack aircraft for the Silver Eagles,

the aircraft is not new to them. The squadron began the transitioning process from the F-4 Phantom and received their first F/A-18s more than two years ago.

The flight to Iwakuni from their home station was described as smooth and enjoyable, according to VMFA-115 Commanding Officer, LtCol. H. Lee Logan, and the squadron also made time to visit MCAS Kaneohe

Bay. This is the squadron's first UDP deployment to Iwakuni since 1977.

"We (VMFA-115) look forward to introducing the F-18 to WestPac and showing how effective the aircraft can be," said Logan.

CFR Reunion

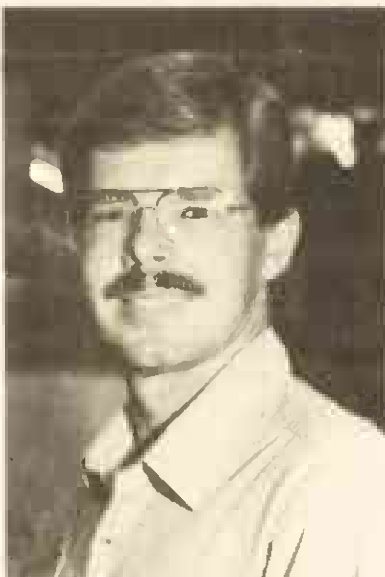

As AIDS and HIV spread throughout the world, even Marines and sailors aren't immune from catching it, but prevention may help them from becoming another statistic

A killer in our ranks

MCAS, Cherry Point, N.C. — "I was one of those guys who thought everyone who got the AIDS virus was a homosexual. When I came up positive I was in total shock. I'm trying to overcome that shock — some people never do. The ones who are married and have kids have the toughest time."

These are the words of an HIV-infected Cherry Point Marine who agreed to speak only if his name was not revealed. Human Immunodeficiency Virus infection usually develops into Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome over a period of time. "I'm living a nightmare... I just keep going one day at a time — what else can I do?"

HIV and its deadly legacy, AIDS, are assaulting all aspects of our society, and the U.S. Navy and Marine Corps are not immune. Statistics provided by Dr. Margan Chang, the special projects officer for the HIV program at Portsmouth Naval Hospital in Virginia, show that 1.5 per every 1,000 servicemembers are affected with HIV.

Once considered a disease restricted to homosexuals and IV drug abusers, the most current statistics from this year's third annual AIDS convention show the number of infected heterosexuals is doubling every quarter.

For another Cherry Point Marine, a positive test result was a rude awakening. "I couldn't believe what they were telling me. I'm not gay — but the disease has that stigma. I was infected by a prostitute in my home town."

The first Marine was also infected by the opposite sex. "A friend and I took a week's leave in the Philippines. We spent that week having sexual relations with many native women. When we came off leave, we found out that area of the city had been marked "off limits" for disease control. We were terrified we'd caught VD or Herpes or something. We relaxed when we found out

we hadn't caught anything like that. The only thing we knew about AIDS was that homosexuals caught it. We found out we were wrong when we both tested positive for HIV back in the states."

The Department of Defense has adopted a method for monitoring active duty military who become infected with HIV. "For administrative purposes, the Walter Reed classification system is used to monitor a victim's deterioration from simple infection through the development of AIDS," Chang explained.

The Walter-Reed system is made up of six classifications. Those who test positive for HIV, but show no other symptoms are placed in the first classification. As new symptoms show that the person's immune system is failing, the patient is placed in

higher categories.

At stage six, the person is considered to have developed AIDS. Military persons who are at stages one and two are educated and returned to work as normal, with follow-up checkups once yearly. At stages three through five, infected persons are temporarily medically retired from active duty. "If a person were to improve and reach stage one or two once again, they would return to active duty," said Dr. Thaddeus Zajdowicz, the head of the infectious diseases department of Portsmouth Naval Hospital in Virginia. "To date, none has ever improved enough to return from temporary retirement." At stage six, the AIDS victim is given 100 percent medical disability and medically discharged from the service.

When a Marine or sailor tests positive twice with the

ELISA HIV test, and also tests positive on a different test called the Western Blot, a sealed letter is sent to his/her commanding officer. The letter contains only the last four digits of the victim's social security number and a statement that the individual has tested positive for HIV. The victim is then sent to one of four regional Navy HIV referral centers.

Once there, the person is evaluated. The evaluation consists of an examination of the patient's sexual history, a physical examination, blood tests, chest X-rays and skin tests. The HIV victim is also thoroughly educated about his infection, and counseling is available. Finally, the patient is given a Walter-Reed classification and appropriate action is taken.

Steps are taken to maintain confidentiality for

the patient, but apparently these steps are inadequate, or there is simply no feasible way to guarantee total privacy for the HIV victim. "There is no real confidentiality," said Conte, who has treated and followed 16 HIV infected patients during his tour here. "No matter what, somehow people who shouldn't know are going to find out."

One of the infected Marines interviewed expressed satisfaction at the way his confidentiality was maintained, even though the privacy was not absolute.

Another, however, did not fare as well. "I know that an admin clerk typed up a letter concerning my condition, and word spread from there. When I came back from Portsmouth Naval Hospital, I found the locks had been cut off my lockers, and all my

stuff was packed up and moved to another area. Then I was given a single room even though I'm a PFC." Privates first class normally stay in four-man rooms. Single rooms are usually only for sergeants and above. "While at the hospital, I met some sailors whose mattresses and clothes had been dragged outside and burned. People just don't understand the disease."

AIDS is primarily a sexually transmitted disease. In an infected person, the virus can be found in virtually every bodily fluid, including blood, semen, saliva, vaginal secretions, urine, and spinal fluid.

HIV is not spread by casual contact. The only non-sexual way to become infected is by having infected blood come in contact with an open sore, or by use of an infected hypodermic needle. You cannot be exposed by touching, hugging or working with an infected person.

"My advice to anyone who has sex is that there is no truly safe sex," an infected Marine said. "If you're going to have sex, for God's sake follow the safe sex guidelines, and use a condom."

To keep yourself out of high-risk groups, follow these guidelines for minimizing chances of infection: do not have sex with multiple partners, do not have sex with people who have sex with multiple partners, and always use a condom. If you use any kind of injected drugs, don't share needles. Also try to reduce the number of blood transfusions you receive. Each transfusion carries approximately a 1-in-100,000 chance of carrying an undetectable amount of HIV.

AIDS is a deadly disease, but it can be easily prevented if caution is used. As Time magazine reported in a Feb. 16, 1987 article titled "The Big Chill: Fear of AIDS," "... Barring the development of a vaccine, swingers of all persuasions may sooner or later be faced with the reality of a new era of sexual caution and restraint."

Council Bluffs, Iowa, was named to the Allstars but will not be able to go to all-Marine camp because of work commitments.

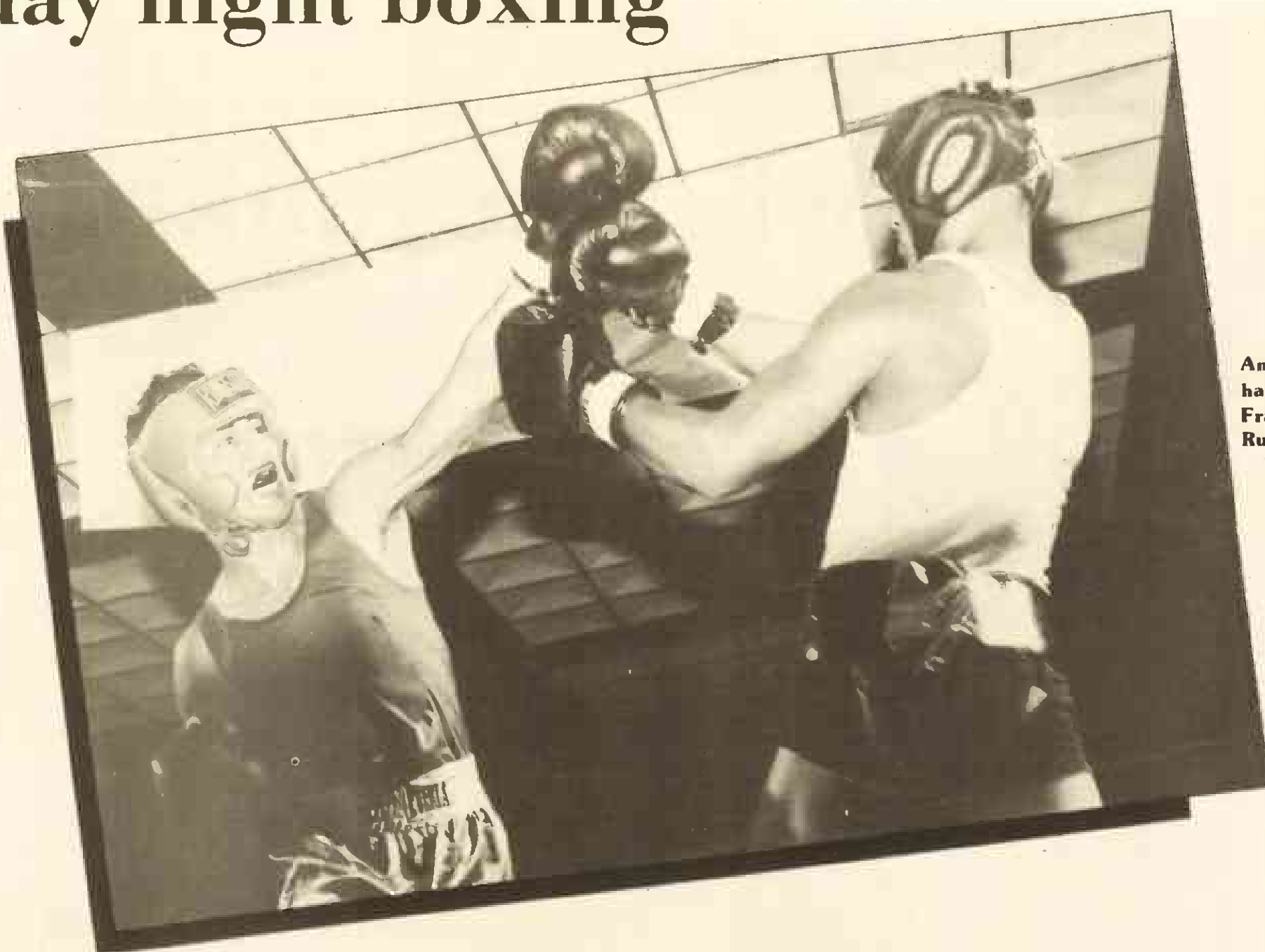

Tsunami!

A moving wall of destructive water

On May 7, 1986 the Oahu Civil Defense Agency issued a tsunami, or tidal wave, warning following an earthquake in the Pacific. The wave hit the Windward Coast of Oahu about five hours after the earthquake, but never rose above two feet. All the people who had either evacuated or run to some "safe" vantage point to see the wave laughed and went home.

Officials are now worried that Oahu residents may ignore the next tsunami warning as a false alarm.

The size and velocity of a tsunami can never be predicted because those factors are determined by such variables as water temperature, ocean depth, and location

and magnitude of the disturbance that caused the wave.

The agency responsible for issuing warnings, the Tsunami Warning Center, can only identify and locate the seismic disturbances, and then predict when the wave will hit a specific place.

"Being in the middle of the Pacific, we are subject to being hit by waves caused by earthquakes all around the Pacific Basin," said Paul Takimiya, the education and training officer for the Oahu Civil Defense Agency.

"Everyone expects to see a huge wall of water on the horizon, but that only happens when the wave approaches the shallows," said Takimiya. "A person sitting in a boat at sea might not even notice a tsunami as it passes."

All of the energy of the wave will be involved in forward motion while in deep water, so waves can reach speeds in excess of 600 miles-per-hour. Once it moves into shallower water the wave will slow down and that energy will be transferred into vertical motion allowing the wave to grow.

"Another misconception people have about tsunamis is that there is only one wave, when actually it's a series of waves," said Takimiya. Deep ocean tsunami waves can be as much as 100 miles apart, but that distance will narrow as the front waves slow down in shallow water.

"A lot of people died during the 1946 tsunami that hit Hilo because they went down to the beach after the first wave receded, and then were hit by the second wave," said

Takimiya. Takimiya stresses that beaches and inundation zones, areas likely to be hit hardest by tsunamis, should be avoided until the all clear has been sounded, which can take as long as 24 hours.

The best place to get information on inundation zones, according to Takimiya, is in the front of the phone book. "Everyone should be familiar with the inundation zones in areas where they normally work or live, and when a tsunami warning comes, evacuate those areas and stay out of them," stressed Takimiya.

Other recommended safety procedures include maintaining a survival kit containing a battery powered radio, a flashlight, drinking water, food for three days, medication, first aid kit, plus other necessary items.

Kaneohe holds night court

The first night court session for the Kaneohe District Court was called to order on Aug. 4. From now on, night court will be conducted at Kaneohe District Court, on the first and third Tuesday of each month, also starting at 6 p.m.

The night court will only process traffic arraignments and pleas. No trials are scheduled.

The jurisdiction of the Kaneohe District Court is the Windward side of the island from Waimanalo to the Kahuku side of Waimea Bay. When issuing a traffic citation in these areas, the Honolulu Police Department has been asked to inform the person cited that night court is available at Kaneohe District Court.

To arrange for a night court appearance, the person

cited must contact the Kaneohe District Court by phone or in person. The Kaneohe Court will process the request and notify the person of his/her night court date. Person interested in arranging a night court appearance at Kaneohe District Court may call 235-0044.

The contact by phone is being tried on an experimental basis for Kaneohe District Court's night court only. Normally, arrangements for court appearances by phone are not permitted. This is because in the past, such arrangements have led to confusion and nonappearances by the persons cited.

Night court is also held in the Honolulu District Court for Honolulu traffic arraignments and pleas on the second and fourth Monday

night of the month. Persons cited on traffic matters in Honolulu can also request a Saturday morning appearance.

These special hearings are being held by the District Court of the First Circuit to try to accommodate the public and to schedule appearances for traffic arraignments and plea other than during the normal workday hours.

District Exceptions for State of Hawaii Schools

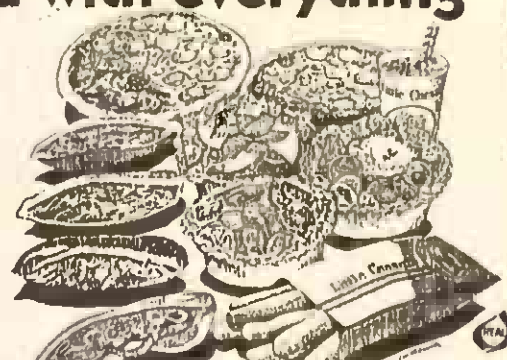
New arrivals residing in a temporary residence should register their children in a school where they anticipate residing permanently. To do this, parents must request a District Exception and should cite their concern for continuity of the child's education.

Since they will have a temporary address while on TLA, the school may not wish to grant the exception. If the school denies the exception, the parent has the right to appeal the decision and the presiding school district, will make the final decision.

If parents do not seek a District Exception and do not attempt to register their children where they expect to reside, they will be required to register their children in a school closest to their temporary residence.
