DoD cargo 'hostage'

Washington, D.C. — The Military Sealift Command (MSC) is working with the Department of Justice to obtain a court order requiring U.S. Lines to release DoD cargo destined for Hawaii and Guam. Both agencies have been in negotiation with U.S. Lines bankruptcy attorneys for release of the cargo. To date, these negotiations have not been successful for this cargo, some of which is already in the ports of Honolulu, Guam and on the U.S. West Coast, or other cargo which requires initial or onward transportation to its destination.

According to MSC's Vice Commander, Mr. W.T. Sansone, "MSC is very sympathetic to the hardships this cargo held hostage places on military families. We understand the frustration due to lack of a prediction as to when the problem will be resolved. Our hands are tied until the court rules this bizarre course of events caused by U.S. Lines."

U.S. Lines has refused to unload or ship the cargo without scheduled payments from U.S. Navy's Military Sealift Command. While U.S. Lines was attempting to reorganize under Chapter XI of the Bankruptcy Code, Military Sealift Command continued payments to U.S. Lines for goods shipped by Military Traffic Management Command under Government bills of lading. This includes household goods and personal vehicles as well as things such as Post Exchange merchandise. While reorganizing, U.S. Lines continued its point-to-point service and ocean liner cargo shipments for DoD and other customers.

Now that there apparently is no hope that U.S. Lines will emerge from Chapter XI, payments to U.S. Lines under Government bills of lading are being withheld to offset U.S. Lines' overall debt to the Government. U.S. Lines owes the U.S. Maritime Administration \$60-\$100 million for subsidy payments and defaults on ship mortgages guaranteed by HARAD.

In the most recent attempt to obtain expedient release of the cargo, the Navy has authorized the Department of Justice to pay \$1.3 million into an escrow account to cover freight charges allegedly owed on the hostage shipments. Under the contract for transportation of this cargo, the Government does not owe U.S. Lines the

Congress authorizes

Abused dependents get ticket home

AFIS — Scenario: A stateside based service member sexually abused his daughter and physically abused his wife. Court married and convicted, he received a prison term and lost all pay and allowances.

His wife and children immediately lost all benefits, including medical and dental care and military housing. They even had to pay for the trip home for themselves, their baggage and household goods.

Stranded! That's what has happened to many families whose sponsor receives a dishonorable or bad conduct discharge or is confined for more than 30 days.

"In some cases, the service member's punishment caused further difficulties for the family instead of improving conditions," said a congressional lawmaker to whom a military wife had complained about such a situation.

Help is now on the way, not only for victims of abuse,

but for all dependents whose sponsors are sent to jail and would otherwise leave their families stranded," said a spokesman for the DoD Per Diem, Travel and Transportation Allowance Committee, which oversees travel rules.

Beginning Sept. 1, abused dependents will be eligible for government paid transportation home and free medical and dental care up to one year after the service member has been discharged or confined. It includes shipment of baggage, household goods, one automobile and medical and dental care for abuse victims.

The abuse-related legislation also includes a provision for travel benefits for stateside-based dependents of service members who are discharged for disciplinary problems.

"This is for anyone whose sponsor is going into confinement for more than 30 days or is dismissed or discharged

under other than honorable conditions," the spokesman explained.

"The medical and dental care part of the legislation only applies to abused dependents," said the spokesman. "But they can only receive treatment for an illness, injury or other condition resulting from the abuse. They can be treated in a military hospital or under the CHAMPUS program. Dependents who were not abused are not

authorized medical or dental care."

Congress included a "Military Dependents Protection Provision" in the National Defense Authorization Act of 1987 authorizing government paid transportation for abused dependents in Hawaii and Alaska are already entitled to these benefits.

Before authorizing the benefit, a lawmaker said: "In addition to loss of income and moving benefits, these

victimized dependents currently are denied access to necessary medical treatment. Victims of family violence need psychiatric counseling. Without help, the abused parents of tomorrow."

Congress also authorized government-paid transportation to "the country of origin" for dependents who are foreign nationals. They can also ship one family-owned motor vehicle.

Families here get help too

When tragedy strikes here and military family members become the victims of physical or sexual abuse, it's reassuring to know that Congress recently included a "Military Dependents Protection Provision" in the National Defense Authorization Act of 1987.

The provision gives abuse

victims a plane ticket home and ships their household goods and include medical and dental care for one year.

"In the past, family members here were always able to get themselves and goods home by what is called an advance return of dependents," said Harvey Leighton, assistant director of the Family Service Center here.

"What is really the biggest change for members here is the year of medical and dental treatment that victims will be entitled to after the servicemember is discharged," Leighton continued. "It's bad enough that a child is abused, but he shouldn't be punished again by not being able to receive psychological treatment."

Corps to test lodging, per diem rates

Camp H.M. Smith — The Marine Corps has recently joined the Navy in an expanded test of the Lodging-Plus Per Diem System for all personnel who are assigned temporary additional duty. However, the \$75-a-day limit will be maintained.

The new procedure will be similar to the current one, except that the new system will reveal, specifically, how the money will be spent. Geographical areas have been broken down into states, cities and counties to

determine the maximum per diem rates.

"Before the test started, if government quarters and messing were not available and a Marine elected to be paid on an 'actual expense' basis, the lodging portion had no limitation for reimbursement," said GySgt. E. Vandevergne, NCOIC, Disbursing Office here, "as long as the entitlement claimed did not exceed the daily maximum per diem rates." Now you are restricted as to how much you can be reimbursed

for lodging and meals.

Depending on the per diem rate for the locality concerned, a Marine will be reimbursed either \$33 or \$25 a day for meals, minus the appropriate deductions for an enlisted Marine. The test also ensures that a lodging limitation is included. A statement verifying whether or not government quarters and messing were available must also be submitted with the claim.

Getting ready for CAX 9-87 was no easy task for 1/3

The Marines from 1st Battalion, 3d Marines recently completed their third full-battalion-level Command Post Exercise (CPX) at Fort Hase Beach here before leaving to participate in CAX 9-87 at the Marines Corps Air Ground Combat Center, 29 Palms Calif.

More than 80 Marines participated in the three-day exercise which simulated controlled movement of more than 3,000 Marines.

The 1/3 Marines, MAG-24 units and BSSG-1's movements were also simulated on a sand table duplicating more than 300 miles of the MCAGCC. Twenty-nine Palms training area. The terrain displayed all the objectives, phase lines, and tactical control measures that will be applied during CAX 9-87.

"Ever since 1/3's return from Okinawa in March, the battalion's main emphasis has been to prepare for CAX 9-87," said Maj. R.D. Neal, executive officer of 1/3.

From March to July, numerous training sessions were held to prepare the Marines for the desert operation including a recent exercise held at PTA. Marines were given classes on trench clearing, small unit leadership, desert warfare, night operations, NBC defense and a first aid refresher course.

Each morning at the sand table, Marines received briefings by the intelligence and operations personnel on enemy situations, terrain and objective points to be accomplished during that day of the exercise.

"This particular scenario

for CAX 9-87 took about three months to plan and coordinate the air, artillery and ground units. This CPX was designed to get the 'bugs worked-out' before the desert exercise," Neal said.

At the nerve center of 1/3's command, Marines work inside the Amphibian Assault Command and Control Vehicle (AAVC-7A1) during the 1st Bn. CPX. The AAVC-7A1 is a mobile command operations center where the commander can keep in touch with various elements of the air/ground task force and is able to keep an eye on the battle.



Overseas ribbon authorized for wear

A new ribbon, the Navy and Marine Corps Overseas Service Ribbon (OSR), has been authorized for wear by the Secretary for the Navy, effective immediately.

The new ribbon is designed to reward Marines and Sailors who serve 12 months, either consecutive or accumulated, in a non-deployable billet outside the United States. The award is retroactive to August 1974.

The OSR is a counterpart to the Sea Service Deployment Ribbon (SSDR), according to Fred Anthony, head of the Decorations and Medals Branch, HQMC. "The situation arose where you have two Marines working side by side, one in the base and one in the Fleet Marine Force. One would serve one year and get a Sea Service Deployment Ribbon and come home. The other Marine would

spend two to three years and get nothing," said Anthony.

The award does not apply to Marines and sailors serving in Hawaii, according to GySgt. Jeannette Powell, Awards NCOIC, Awards Branch, FMFPac.

In precedence, the OSR ranks directly below the SSDR. Subsequent awards will be designated by a bronze star the same size as those worn on campaign and service medals. Marines who receive the award for the period of 1974 to 1979 are only eligible for one award, regardless of how many ribbons they may be entitled to during that time frame.

The new ribbon is currently out of stock at the Marine Corps Exchange Uniform Shop here, but will be in soon, according to Bonnie Bailey, assistant supervisor of the Uniform Shop.

Ignated for a certain area, a Marine would claim the actual amount spent for lodging, meals and incidentals providing the total amount did not exceed the \$75-a-day limit.

According to Vandevogte, the old system required a breakdown of meals and incidentals, for example breakfast, lunch, dinner, laundry, local transportation and other. The same principles apply for the new form

except that "a Marine does not have to document meals and incidentals, but he must document lodging," she said.

The Disbursing Office here has settled only a few claims using the new system, but "it's a lot easier," Vandevogte said. "The old way, a Marine would have to remember how much money was spent for each meal. With the new system you don't have to worry about it because you know how much you are permitted to spend."

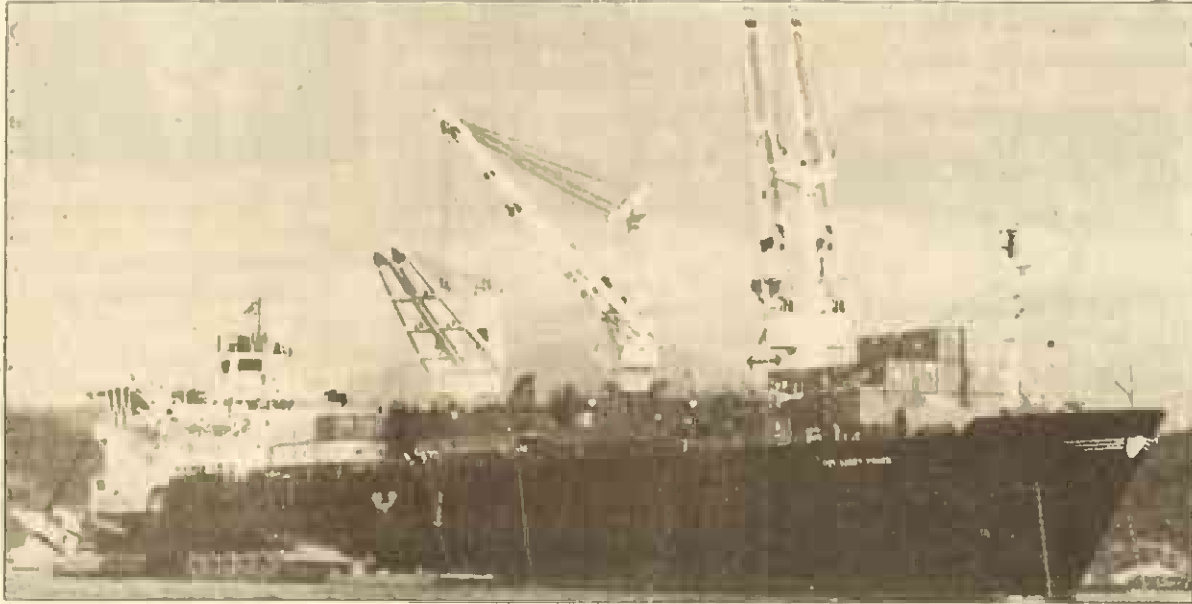
'Freedom Banner' starts up

SUBIC BAY, R.P. — Two ships of the Maritime Prepositioned Force arrived here in the pre-dawn of Aug. 4, kicking off Freedom Banner '87. The flagship of Maritime Prepositioned Squadron-2, the MV Pvt. Harry Fisher and the MV Pvt.

William B. Baugh sailed from Diego Garcia in the Indian Ocean to link up with elements of the 7th Marine Amphibious Brigade, which was airlifted from California for the annual exercise. The six-day exercise was the first where two MPF ships were off-loaded while the ships were anchored well away from piers. Both ships had 95 percent of their cargo removed simultaneously during the exercise. Operated by civilian crews, the MPS squadrons are designed to link up with 16,000-man brigades and supply all the ammunition, equipment and other supplies needed to sustain com-

bat operations for 30 days. All MPF ships are named after Marine Medal of Honor recipients. A contingent of Marines flew from California to Diego Garcia in mid-July, where they boarded the ships prior to departure. During the trip to the Philippines, the Marines prepared the equipment for debarkation. On their arrival at Subic Bay, the ships were met by Marines from Brigade Service Support Group-7 and sailors from Naval Beach Group-1, deployed from San Diego, Calif.

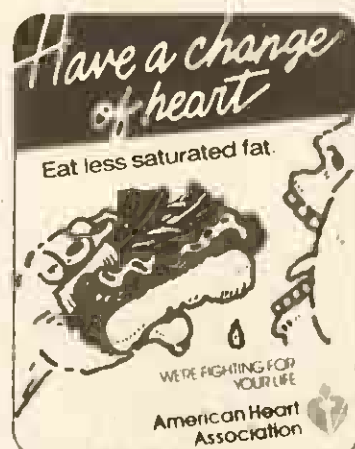

ning at 6:30 p.m. A traditional ceremony will be held at 8:30 p.m. followed by dancing at 9 p.m.

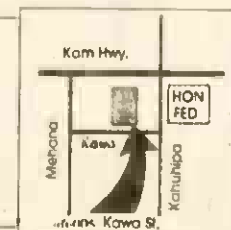
Entertainment will consist of Top 40 music played by "Score" with break music supplied by a disc jockey.

Why the U.S. is in the Persian Gulf

AFIS — As America mourns the loss of 37 sailors killed in the attack on the frigate *USS Stark*, some people have started questioning why the United States remains in the Persian Gulf.

According to Secretary of Defense Caspar W. Weinberger, the *Stark's* tragedy makes the presence of the United States and its allies in the gulf more important than ever. He urged Congress not to force America to shrink from its responsibilities and challenges in the region.

Because the gulf contains more than 70 percent of the Free World's oil reserves, it has a critical strategic importance to the United States and its allies, said Weinberger.

By helping maintain stability in the war-torn Persian Gulf, the United States and its allies contribute to the free flow of oil into the world market. Just as importantly, their presence discourages Soviet adventurism in the region, which would be catastrophic to the West.

These aren't new goals, said the secretary of defense. The U.S. naval command in the Persian Gulf, the Middle East Force, has been in place since 1949 to protect U.S. interests in the region.

The gulf remained relatively quiet for the next 30 years. But in the late 1970s, a series of events rocked the

stability of the region and its political and military character.

The Shah of Iran was overthrown, replaced by an extremist, fiercely anti-Western Islamic government, bringing on the 1979 oil crises.

standing hostilities over territorial claims and religious differences.

In the wake of these events, the U.S. Middle East Force maintains a close watch on shipping in the gulf, especially the oil traffic through the Strait of Hormuz. U.S.

in the Indian Ocean and send ships into the Persian Gulf. The British Royal Navy routinely deploys there as well. The Japanese Maritime Self-Defense Force, legally restricted from deploying to the gulf region, contributes in another way by deploying air-defense and anti-submarine forces opposite Vladivostok, homeport of Soviet Indian Ocean forces.

"Our ships operate in the Persian Gulf to represent, immediately and directly, America's commitment to stability in the region and our deep concern over the threat to that stability caused by the senseless Iran-Iraq War," Weinberger said.

"Our Navy ships are there

neither as referees nor dispassionate observers," he added. "We are there as tangible representatives of our commitment to our friends and our interests in the region — and we have many of both there."

It's a responsibility that involves risks, he acknowledged, risks that the crew of the *Stark* understood well.

"They died while guarding a chokepoint of freedom, deterring aggression and reaffirming America's willingness to protect its vital interests," the president said.

"The future belongs to the brave," the president added. "Free men should not cower before such challenges and they should not expect to stand alone."

The Iran-Iraq War broke out in 1980, renewing long-

"Swimmers, surfers/body surfers, boogie boarders, scuba/skin divers, kayakers, windsurfers and boaters should observe ocean and wind conditions before entering the water. If the surf is too big, closed out, or blown out it is best to stay on shore and wait for a better day.

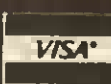

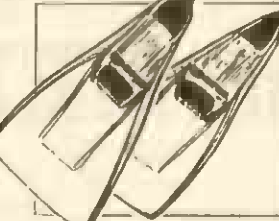

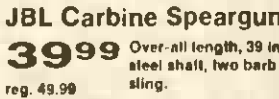

15th MAU activates

— The 15th Marine Amphibious Unit joined the Corps' "force in readiness" July 8, when Col. M.T. Hopgood Jr. was given command of the unit during a reactivation ceremony.

The unit will join the 11th and 13th MAUs which make up the Marine Corps force-in-readiness afloat in the Western Pacific.

Any of these MAU's could be called upon to secure ports and airfields for 1st MAB Maritime Prepositioned Force (MPF) operations.

"As a MAU we can go anywhere, and we'll be ready to go when that time comes," said Col. M.T. Hopgood, commanding officer, 15th MAU. In the past, WestPac

Marines were deployed from the Hawaii-based 31st and 37th MAUs. Those units were disbanded in 1984 when the WestPac force was moved here.

The addition of the 15th MAU is an important step in the readiness concept of the Marine Amphibious Force.

The concept of a rotation of three complete MAUs is much the same as the Unit Deployment Program. Being the only forward force contingency in the U.S. military, the MAU is constantly in a state of readiness.

The addition of a third MAU for the Western Pacific allows these units more preparation time for their deployments. Marine Amphibious units have been called upon in crises situations, such as the evacuation of Saigon and Cambodia, and they played a major role in the return of the Mayaguez, they also took part in landings in Lebanon and Grenada.

"Every good thing in the world stands on the razor's edge of danger," Hopgood quoted.

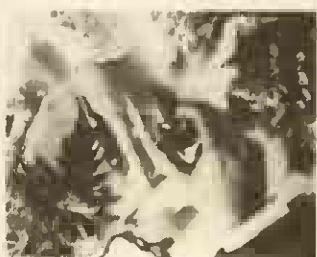

Literacy

Programs to boost literacy among Windward adults is now being offered to Air Station residents. The Officer's Wives Club has agreed to fund two Tutor Training Workshops this fall.

Using the Literacy Volunteers of America method of tutoring, both a basic workshop and English as a Second Language (ESL) workshop will be offered through the Armed Services YMCA.

LVA method relies on the student's personal experience — their interest in recreation, news, education, business and family. The student learns the words they don't know through functional materials geared to their level of comprehension. Some phonetics involved, and most of the work is practical and fun, according to trainers.

The workshop encompasses a total of twelve hours for certification. Barbara Salice, Windward Literacy Coordinator and certified trainer, has conducted two

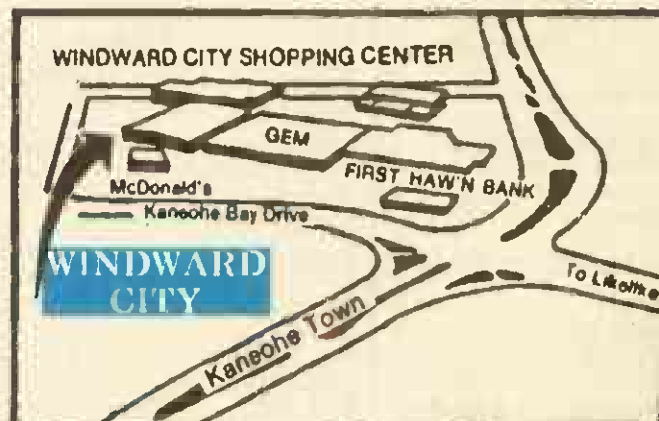

What the Constitution Means to You

It establishes a representative form of government.

It provides for regular elections and an orderly succession of leadership.

It divides the national government into three branches—each with separate authority and responsibilities.

It appoints the President as Commander-in-Chief of the armed forces.

It establishes one Supreme Court of the United States.

It makes you a citizen of the United States, if you are native born or if you comply with naturalization laws.

It makes you a citizen of the State where you reside.

It prohibits individual states from denying to citizens of another state the privileges and immunities it grants to its own citizens.

It requires each state to give full faith and credit to the laws, records and judicial proceedings of every other state.

It guarantees your freedom to practice the religion of your choice.

It protects your right to a free press and free speech.

It guarantees your right to peaceably assemble and ask the government to remedy your wrongs.

It guarantees your right to vote, if you are at least eighteen years old.

It prohibits the government from taking your property for public use without just compensation.

It prohibits the government from depriving you of life, liberty, or property without due process of law.

It prohibits the government from denying you the equal protection of the law.

It prohibits the government from searching your person, belongings or home without probable cause.

It prevents you from being arrested and detained by law enforcement officials unless you are informed of the nature and cause of the accusation against you, and when you are accused or are being tried for a crime:

- it provides you the authority to compel witnesses to appear on your behalf.
- it grants you the right to a speedy, public trial by jury in the state and district where the crime was committed.
- it allows you to decline to testify against yourself.
- it guarantees your right to a defense counsel.
- it forbids the imposition of excessive bail.
- it forbids the imposition of excessive fines or of cruel and unusual punishment.
- it prohibits the government from trying you again for the same crime once you have been acquitted.

It prohibits slavery or involuntary servitude.

It provides for its amendment upon approval by three-fourths of the state legislatures or state constitutional conventions.

Two Radio Bn. Marines give the Army's Air Assault Course a big Thumbs Up!

Two Marines from 1st Radio Bn, recently teamed with more than 100 soldiers and completed a grueling Air Assault Course conducted at a remote Army Ranger Camp near Wahiawa.

The Marines, SSgt. William Bolduc, a cryptanalyst, and Sgt. Daniel Stinson, a linguist, underwent rappelling and air assault training peculiar to most Marines.

"For the last 10 years I've been at a desk," said Bolduc. "It was driving me crazy ... [The instructors] were outstanding. Any one of those guys could have been Marine Corps drill instructors."

Putting in long days in an almost-boot-camp-like atmosphere, Bolduc and Stinson learned the latest air assault techniques from the Army instructors, or Cadre. The course culminated with a rappel exercise from a UH-1 Huey helicopter hovering at about 100 feet, or just more than twice the height of the tower on which they practiced for hours in the preceding days.

Bolduc said about the leap with full gear from the helicopter, "If you're not scared, you're crazy ... You had to hang out to reach the skid ... On the tower you had a feeling of security. In the helicopter if you didn't hold on to the rope with your brake hand (while climbing out onto the skid) you'd slide on down," he said dryly.

The training the two Marines received will partly serve to qualify them as Rappel Masters within 1st Radio Bn. They will then supervise portions of special operations training currently underway within the Battalion, say operations officials. Bolduc and Stinson will return to the Air Assault School next month for more rappel training and certification as Rappel Masters.

Marines rarely go through the Air Assault School although billets are readily

available, according to Army MSgt. Jimmy Akuna, NCOIC of the school "Unlike patrol and ambush

skills emphasized in Ranger training, the two-week Air Assault Course is non-MOS related and centers on air

mobile operations, and is designed for low intensity conflict," Akuna explained. Students painted with

cammie stick and geared with ALICE packs and weapons, conduct field exercises involving homing military

aircraft through radio transmissions using pathfinder techniques. They also marking and clearing helicopter landing zones.

The rappelling phase progresses from basic knots to the helicopters rappel with combat gear. It was motivating," said Stinson, about the helicopter rappel. "I was confident with myself," he said, fully aware, however, that a mistake from the aircraft could mean death.

"If you fall 45 feet (from the tower) into the sand pit, so what. But at 120 feet out of the aircraft, you're dead," Stinson said. He said he became thoroughly knowledgeable with concepts such as "terminal velocity," which he explained is rapid descent at 80 feet per second — the fastest speed a body reaches when falling uncontrollably from an aircraft.

"You brake three times on the way down so you don't reach terminal velocity," he said.

Among the students were women soldiers who trained for combat operations just as the male soldiers did. The students comprised the enlisted and commissioned ranks and the Cadre clerly had charge over everyone.

Each student wore a plain Kelvar helmet marked with wide masking tape and a student number. When the Cadre gave instructions, students responded with "Yes," Sergeant Assault."

"Everything was 'high speed,'" Stinson explained, noting some type of Army colloquialism. Students always "double-timed" when moving in the training field. In addition to air assault instruction, the course curriculum consisted of a physical conditioning routine, including a timed, 12-mile road march with a combat load.

Upon graduation, each student received an air assault pin, which, while not authorized for wear by the Marine Corps, is highly cherished nevertheless by two Marines with plenty of calluses on their hands.

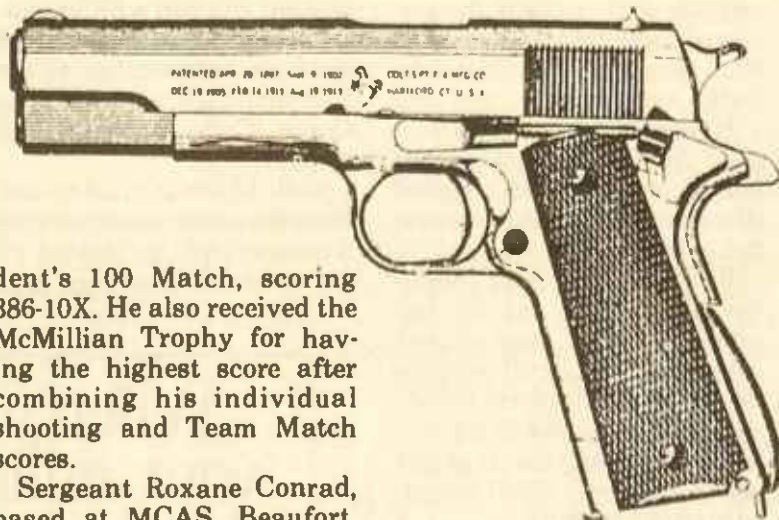
The Marine Corps Scarlet Team, collectively scored 3,457 points to place in what the shooters consider to be the most prestigious event at the national competition.

the Warm-up Match, which netted him the Jefferson Cup and the Secretary of the Navy Trophy.

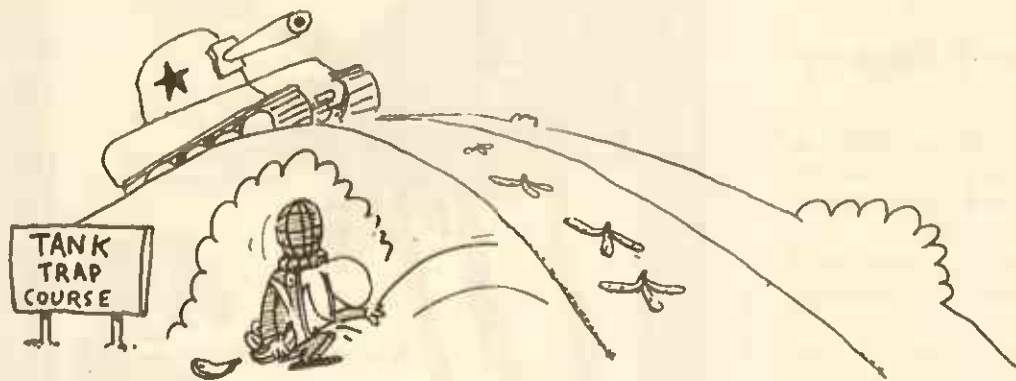
Twelve Marines placed in the President's 100. This is a record number of places won by the Marines Corps in the match. The shooters were awarded a letter and medal from the president.

Rainbows to sport new offense in '87

This is a year of transition for the University of Hawaii football program.

A new head coach, two new key assistant coaches, and a whole new offensive system will be introduced to fans when the Rainbows take the field Sept. 5 in the home season opener against Fullerton State at Aloha Stadium.

The UH defense, solid as a rock and among the best in the nation in recent years, may be the only facet of the game that will not be substantially changed this season.

The new head coach is Bob "Wags" Wagner, an assistant for 10 years to former head coach Dick Tomey and, for the past four years, the man who ran the Bows' defense.

The two key assistant coaches are Rich Ellerson, who will handle the defense, and Paul Johnson, the offensive coordinator.

Wagner didn't hesitate very long before reaching into Canada to replace

himself as the defensive coordinator. He called in Ellerson, a former Rainbow player and assistant coach with whom he had worked in past years.

Ellerson played as a linebacker and center in 1973-77 and was the outside linebacker coach and defensive line coach from 1981-83. Since then he has coached in the Canadian Football League, last year as a defensive coordinator, the post he now fills at his alma mater.



Johnson, the offensive coordinator for Georgia Southern last year, led his team to national Division I-AA offense records. His high-powered offense led the division's schools in rushing yards, total yards and points scored per game.

Wagner takes over as UH head coach

Bob Wagner, 40, became the 19th head football coach in University of Hawaii history when he was appointed to the position in January. He served 10 years as an assistant to Dick Tomey, who has taken over as head coach at the University of Arizona.

Wagner came to the UH in 1977 and worked

as an assistant coach to then head coach Larry Price. "Wags," as he is known by friends, remained on the staff when Tomey took over the helm in 1978. In 1983, Wagner was promoted to defensive coordinator.

During his years under Tomey, Wagner coached the linchangers and the secondary and special teams. The Rainbows ranked sixth in the nation in 1977 in net punting and punting returns.

Prior to joining the UH, Wagner had assistant coaching stints at Muskingum College, the College of Wooster and the University of Washington.

Wagner has a B.S. degree in Business Administration from Wittenburg University in Ohio and a master's degree in physical education from Ohio University.

Wagner married the former Gloria Christine Jorgensen in November 1980.

9-game home schedule to Rainbows' advantage

The Bows this year play another demanding 12-game schedule, with nine of the games — one more than last year — to be played at home. The Bows play eight conference games, six of them at Aloha Stadium.

The home field advantage the UH will enjoy in six of the eight conference games should be a boon to the Rainbows. Last year, when they played four conference games on the road, the Bows had a 4-4 conference record.

The following is a game-by-game summary of the Rainbows' 1987 football schedule.

SEPTEMBER 5
FULLERTON STATE
AT ALOHA STADIUM
With coach Gene Murphy committed to the school, the Titans are expected to improve on last year's 3-9 win-loss record.

A Pacific Coast Athletic Conference member, Fullerton State has several key players returning,

including quarterback Ronnie Barber, who came off the redshirt list last year when starting signal caller Tony Dill was lost for the season.

Ed Gillies, who has been called the best player on the team, returns and has been moved to a guard slot from offensive tackle. The Titans also boast fine receivers.

If Fullerton State has a problem, it is with the defense. Coach Murphy has said that if Fullerton is to be competitive this year, its defense must get stronger.

Look for the Bows to win the opener against Fullerton State.

SEPTEMBER 12
WISCONSIN
AT MADISON, WISC.

Big Ten teams have given the Rainbows trouble, particularly when playing in the Big Ten team's home tent, but Wisconsin this year faces many of the same difficulties that the University of Hawaii must overcome.

Wisconsin has a new coach, who welcomes only eight returning starters, seven on the offense and only one, safety Pete Nowka, on defense. Also the squad will have to learn the veer offense, which Don Morton, the new head coach, brings to Wisconsin.

The Bows may very well win the first road game of the year in Wisconsin.

SEPTEMBER 26
TEXAS-EL PASO
AT EL PASO, TEXAS

The Rainbows rest for a week after the Wisconsin game and then head right back to the Mainland to play their first Western Athletic Conference game against an improving University of Texas-El Paso.

UTEP has four starters returning to its defensive line, but its offensive line had holes to fill when spring training began. Whether adequate replacements have been found will be decided early

is expected to produce excitement, thrills and perhaps a few chills as it is woven into the system. Whether it will produce winning football, nobody knows for sure.

Johnson, who is responsible for getting the run-and-shoot spread attack into high gear, explains the run-and-shoot as an offense with options.

When opponents are shutting down the running game, the offense can shift quickly into the passing offense. When the enemy is defending well against the passing attack, the running phase of the run-and-shoot is called to the rescue.

In one game last year, Johnson's team passed for 400 yards and in another game ran for 400 yards, a lot of yardage per game no matter how you get it.

Wagner made the decision to go to the run-and-shoot before hiring either of his key assistants. He believes that the spread offense was made for the kind of players that Hawaii generally recruits. His reference is to the fact that the Bows recruit very few, if any, behemoths, but does attract many smaller, quick players

who often are multi-talented.

Defense
With a defense anchored by All-American Al Noga, and the new run-and-shoot offense that can cover up some expected offensive weaknesses, optimists are predicting that Hawaii will improve on its 1986 7-5 win-loss record.

However, it can be pointed out also that the Rainbows lost 15 starters from last year's team and only five offensive and two defensive starters returned for this season. This left many holes for coaches to fill with relatively inexperienced personnel.

Noga, whose brother Niko last month inked an \$800,000, three-year contract with the professional St. Louis Cardinals, will get some help on defense this year from a transfer — that is if the notices about Ken Masterson are not inflated.

Masterson is a former starting linebacker for the Southern Methodist University Mustangs, whose football program has been shut down for two years by the NCAA.

Still, the fact remains that Noga and defensive

back Pat McCray are the only returning starters on defense.

Quarterbacks
The Rainbows have a plethora of quarterbacks to choose from this year. Warren Jones is expected to get the nod to start the season. Should he not cut the mustard or suffer injury, coaches Wagner and Johnson can reach into the quarterback bag and pull out Walter Briggs, Ken Niumatalolo or Garrett Gabriel.

Slotback Marco Johnson, an All-Western Athletic Conference return specialist in 1986 — and an All-American candidate this year — is one of the returnees counted upon to pile up big yardage figures. He and Junior Lopati are expected to handle the bulk of the running offense this year.

Other ball-packers who will see plenty of action are Koldene Walsh, Heikoti Fakava, Billy Stephens and redshirt Dane McArthur.

By its very nature, the run-and-shoot offense has made tight ends expendable and available for use in other positions. The run-and-shoot is a spread formation without tight ends and it uses slot backs

on both sides of the field. A running back plays behind the quarterback.

Offensive line
The offensive line has been a concern to the coaching staff, largely because several standouts were lost to graduation in 1987.

The success of the offensive line this year will depend to a large extent upon how healthy some of the returning linemen remain as the season progresses, and how well they

recover from recent injuries.

For example, Charlie Moetului is recovering from a broken leg, Amosa Amosa has had shoulder surgery, and Mark Nua, from whom great things are expected, spent the summer nursing a foot problem and a hamstring pull.

Wide receivers threatened to be a problem this season in that three of the top four receivers last year were graduated and the one returnee has been

moved to slot back. It is thought, however, that speedsters such as Jamie Collins, Marcel Williams, Martial Wallace, Chris Gaskill and Chris Roscoe will fill the bill adequately.

In past years, the Rainbows have been known for their kicking game, both in punting and placekicking. But last year was an exception.

"We need to return to the Hawaii kicking game of the past," is the way coach

AT ALOHA STADIUM

Utah last year finished with two wins and nine losses after many had picked the Utes to challenge for the WAC championship.

Injuries to key personnel were the problem last year and, lacking depth, the Utes are in a rebuilding phase. The team last year finished dead last in the nation in total defense.

Only three starting players return to the offen-

sive unit, one of them Eddie Johnson, the WAC's second leading rusher and an All-WAC selection in 1986. This year, Johnson will be running behind an inexperienced offensive line with only one returning starter.

Again, the Rainbows look like a winner.

OCTOBER 24 BRIGHAM YOUNG UNIVERSITY

AT ALOHA STADIUM

Hawaii will have to pull out all the stops to defeat BYU. The Cougars are not

expected to romp as they have done so often in past years, but they are tough and will win more games than they will lose.

The Rainbows always have a hard time with BYU, as the series record of four victories and nine defeats for the Bows attests. BYU is coming off an eight win, five loss year in 1986, nevertheless is considered to be one of the two strong teams into the WAC. The other is San Diego State.

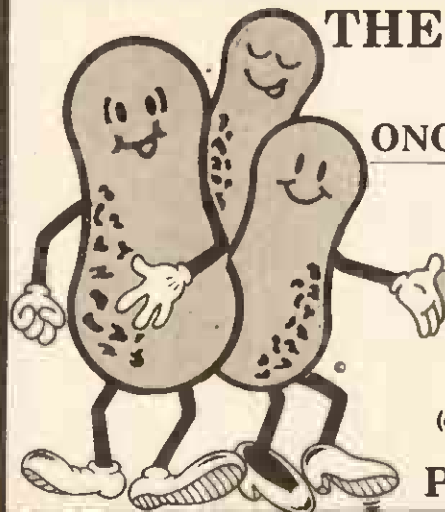

It's tempting to call Hawaii the winner in this home game, but reality says the victor will be BYU.

OCTOBER 31
SAN DIEGO STATE
AT ALOHA STADIUM
The reigning WAC champion, San Diego

State, is expected by most experts to win the title again this year. The Aztecs have had an excellent recruiting year and back for another shot at All-America honors is a quarterback Todd Santos.

Santos is San Diego's all-time leading passer, with 7,493 yards, and could become the leading passer in NCAA history if he averages 261 passing yards per game this season. He averaged 255 yards last season.

Inexperience at some positions may hurt the Aztecs, but recruits are expected to settle into some of the holes and perform like veterans. This is true of both running backs and receivers.

One key to the success of San Diego State in 1986 was the play of reserve offensive linemen, who return this year as experienced veterans. The Aztec kicking game should be one of the best in the nation.

Given the experience and known talent of San Diego and the rebuilding program of the Rainbows, the winner will be San Diego State.

NOVEMBER 7
COLORADO STATE
AT ALOHA STADIUM

Colorado State, which nearly won the WAC title last year, is picked to finish last in the WAC this year. Why? Mainly because only four of the team's starters return, forcing a massive rebuilding job for Coach Leon Fuller.

The Rams' losses to graduation included Steve Bartalo, the WAC's all-time leading rusher, and Kelly Stouffer, who quarterbacked the team for three years. The new quarterback will be untested and the running backs all are newcomers.

The one bright spot for the Rams is its receivers, some of whom are returnees.

The Rainbows should

win this one.

NOVEMBER 21
AIR FORCE
ACADEMY
AT ALOHA STADIUM

The Rainbows take a week off to savor the win over Colorado State and then take on another Colorado team — the Air Force Academy.

The Falcons struggled last year and will struggle again this year unless replacements are found for graduated running backs and the quarterback. The Air Force Academy has only two

returning defensive players and five returning from the offense.

The Falcon offense is expected to be respectable, but the defense is questionable, despite the makings of a solid defensive line.

Hawaii could reverse last year's 24-16 loss to the Air Force.

NOVEMBER 28
UNIVERSITY OF WYOMING
AT ALOHA STADIUM
Wyoming could be the surprise team in the WAC. Fifteen starters, eight on

defense and seven on offense, have returned and all key spots are filled by veterans.

Quarterback Craig Burnett will have three experienced targets to throw to this year. They are senior split end James Loving, who last year had 54 catches for 673 yards and six touchdowns; senior tight end Bill Hoffman, with 51 catches for 469 yards and one touchdown; and senior split end Anthony Sargent, who hauled down 47 passes for

Last year, the Oahu Interscholastic Association coaches were unanimous in predicting the district winners: Waianae (West), Leilehua (Central), Kahuku (East) and Farrington (Honolulu). They were on the nose.

This year, there isn't one unanimous pick. While the coaches feel the defending district champions will be contenders, all said that there were other teams that could dethrone them.

Here's what OIA coaches said about this year's season.

HONOLULU DISTRICT

Roosevelt: Coaches around the league feel that this could be the Rough Riders' year. Uncharacteristic of past Roosevelt teams, this year's edition has size.

"We're a little bigger this year, but we have to work on speed and quickness," said head coach Rodney Iwasaki.

Top returnees for the

Rough Riders include quarterback Brandon Victor, running back Rory Ramos, offensive lineman Gannon Gragas, and receivers Matt Tellex and Clifford Smith.

On defense, linebacker Brian Laughlin and defensive back Layton Kaleikau are key returnees. Others returning on defense are lineman David

Tuifoa, defensive back Kerry Higa, and linebackers Dominick Kaaihue and Charlie Holani.

Farrington: Kalihi seems to have an endless supply of football players. Farrington proves that every year.

The Govs' strength is in the offensive backfield with Robert Gampong at quarterback. The ground

game will be handled by returnees Clement Mao, Prince Anguay and Resti Paguriagan.

Other key players on offense are lineman Hiram Palimoo and Jose Pena, and wide receiver Dan Ornellas.

Defensively, returning are linebackers Edmund Ulutoa, Malo Torres,

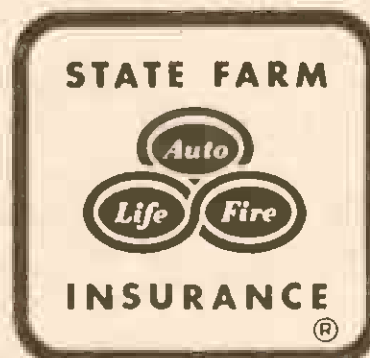

Ronald Jhun and Anatera Tupuola, and linemen Lesa Taufusi and Santiago Carrenza.

"We'll be competitive," said head coach Skipper Diaz. "But if our offensive lineman can come through, we'll be very competitive."

Kaimuki: Coaches have a good feeling about this team, which finished at a surprising 4-4 last year. The Bulldogs, of the remaining teams in the Honolulu District, could surprise people.

Top returnees include linemen Stone Tupou and Jon Hamasaki, and linebacker Ariel Fangon. Also back are running backs Trent Nakamura and Terrence Kapoi. Vying for the quarterback spot will be Travis McKay and Blaine Gushikuma.

McKinley: This is another team the coaches feel could be a serious threat. Unlike last year, head coach Daryl Sakai has more players to work with.

Back for the Tigers are linebacker Iulio Salavea, running back Chad Shiraishi and wide receiver Milton Gainey. Returning linemen include Walter Moniz, Boy Aana, Chad Sugiki, Ricky Shimokawa

and Douglas Hubin.

"We're real young," said Sakai. "We had a senior team last year. We have a lot of people back who didn't have much playing time."

Kaiser: It's hard to leave Kaiser out of the race, but head coach Scott Chan described this year's squad as "green."

The passing-oriented Cougars have Brant McCreadie at quarterback. McCreadie started the final game last season. His favorite target will be the swift Mike Williams at wide receiver.

Other key returnees include Glenn Kalima on the defensive line, running back Fred DeWitt, cornerback K.J. Ishikawa and linebacker Vic Sherman.

Kalani: Despite a 1-7 finish last season, the Falcons gained respect from other teams. Coaches around the league speak highly of second-year head coach Gordon Miyashiro.

Top returnees are quarterback Sean Ribeiro, wide receivers Tony Carpenter and Eric Senter, running back Jason Nakasato and defensive back Brian Sambrueno.

WINDWARD DISTRICT

Kailua: Although head coach Alex Kane claims just four returning starters, rival coaches are aware that the Surfriders' size can match up with anyone, including Kahuku.

Back for Kailua is the quarterback tandem of Chris Hampe and Peter Albinio. As juniors last year, both shared the duties at the helm while playing full-time as defensive backs. Both will resume their duties on offense and defense this season as well.

Also back for the Surfriders are running back Solomon Thomas and center Ben Kama.

Kailua's biggest drawback right now is scheduling. Among its opponents are Leilehua, Farrington and Waianae — all are contenders in their respective districts. And this is before the Surfriders meet Kahuku and Castle.

Kahuku: The Red Raiders could easily repeat with the talent that will be returning. Among them are quarterback Walter Santiago, tailback Byron Jeremiah and receivers

Defensively, Kahuku returns all-star safety Raymond Galeai, whom head coach Lester Souza feels is one of the state's top players. Also back are Kingsley Ah You (DB), Feso Malafau (DT), Al Wily (LB) and Talbert Alo (DB).

Souza is aware of Kailua's tough schedule and added that games against

the non-district opponents may be the key to winning the district. The Red Raiders will draw Radford, McKinley, Kalani, Pearl City and Kaimuki. Radford and Pearl City are contenders.

Castle: No one's counting the Knights out of the district race. Mark Kane-coached Castle teams have always been tough competitors.

Arkansas. Anchoring that line is nose guard Tony Cherico, a three-year starter and a cinch for All-America honors.

The Arkansas Razorbacks promise to be one of the better college football teams in the nation this year. Therefore, barring a major upset, the Rainbows can be expected to lose the final game of the 1987 season.

All in all, however, the rebuilding Bows should have no worse than a break even season of six wins and six losses. With a little luck, they may wind up at 7-5.

and David Kauai. The secondary will be anchored by Danny Poti and Allan Pagba.

Head Coach Francis Claveria said his team's strength is the defense, but added that "our offense has been coming around." One of the reasons for the resurgence has been the addition of offensive coordinator Sam

Delos Reyes, a former head coach at Nanakuli.

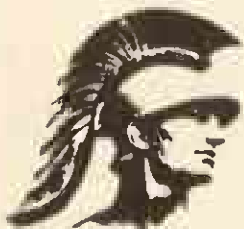

cially was named OIA executive secretary. Gary Clark, who coached at Aiea last year, returns to his alma mater as the new head man.

Clark, who inherited the team in mid-summer, said he wasn't that familiar with most of the players. But his top returnees include all-star running back Adrian Murrell, linebacker Mike Daniels, wide receiver Hugh Okuma and linemen Donn Manzano and Bart Hanakahi. Hanakahi, a soccer player, also serves as the place kicker.

Aiea: Coaches around the league are calling the Na Alii a "sleeper" this year. Aiea has a lot of quality players coming back and unlike last year, it has depth.

Aiea finished last season with a 4-4 record (tied for second with Moanalua and Radford) despite having to play with just 23 players. New head coach Glen Tamayoshi will have at least 40 players this season.

The Na Alii's strength lies with its defense, said Tamayoshi. Those who will play key roles include all-star linebacker Ricky

Feliciano, the brothers Krome and Krine Agbayani, Ben Gurr, Moronai Ufufi and Tautava Fua-papa.

The offense will be guided by either senior Tausili Taliulu or junior Jay Chaviera. Tamayoshi added that Taliulu is a fine wide receiver as well.

Waialua: While Waialua may lack the numbers — it had about 30 players in mid-August — it has a lot of talented players from last year.

The entire backfield, sans quarterback, returns with running backs Rodney Dicion, Elmer Bartolome and Antonio Bangloy. Other returnees include wide receivers Luly Fernando and Ciraco Dicion, linemen Joey Kawauchi, Louie Mamuad, Fred Mamuad. Ryan Souza and Dominic Amantiad.

"We'll be scrappy," said head coach George Watanabe. "But a lot of kids

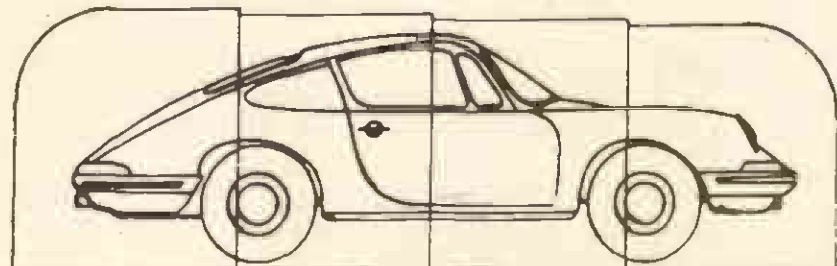

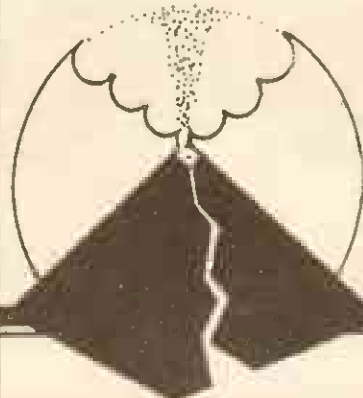

No clear favorites in ILH grid race

The Interscholastic League of Honolulu football race figures to be a close battle this year. Though most of the coaches feel that St. Louis will once again be the team to beat, no one's discounting PAC-5 and Iolani. And if this season

is to have a surprise, it will probably be Damien.

The league is so balanced that all coaches agreed that consistency will be the key to winning the title. A "mild" two-game slump in the ILH could be costly.

Here's how the coaches analyze their teams.

St. Louis: Kamehameha head coach Bernard

Silva was impressed with the Crusaders during the summer pass football league. What he probably saw were returning wide receivers Shanon Cabunoc, Randy Iaea and Mark Martinez all over the field. Other key returnees on offense are linemen Richard Felimer, Blane Lavaras and John Naipo.

Defensively, coming back are linemen Andrew Tocaina, an ILH all-star, and Reid Nakai, linebackers Dan Chandler, Garri Akiona, John Correa and Miki Ho, and defensive backs Wayne Lewis, Akoni Kaanoi and Jay Paikai.

PAC-5: PAC-5 will probably take its offensive show to the air once again with Kimo Padello at quarterback. He'll be aiming for receivers Randy Clark and David Mills. Giving the Wolfpack a balanced attack will be running back Jason Hollenbeck, who will probably be following the blocks of linemen Shannon Cyrus, Charles Arakaki and Tim Mattos.

Also returning is all-

star defensive back Rhys Kiaaina and linebackers Latigo Biggins, David Kea and Rick Azcueta.

Iolani: Iolani appears strong at the skill positions with returning wide receivers Drue Apao and Brandon Sumida, and running backs Eddie Kealoha and Erik Leong. John Stephens will be the quarterback.

The offensive line includes three returnees: Damon Dias, Mark Sumikawa and Rick Takeshita.

The Red Raiders' defense returns linemen Derek Crosier and Mike Towns, and linebackers Mike Nakagawa and David Yoshida.

Head coach Eddie Hamada said the key will be "how fast the youngsters

can come around."

Damien: With 20 returning starters back from last year, ILH coaches feel the Monarchs will be serious contenders for the league title.

Back on offense are running backs Eric Javier, Eric Mau, Kevin Pupuhi, Dennis Akana and Sheldon Spencer; receivers

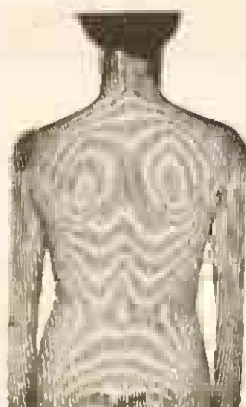

Clement Inoka and Barry Brunett; and linemen Soane Uiagalelei, Aaron Lenchanko and Mike

Andrell. As of summer practice, head coach Wally Aina said there are three candidates for the

quarterback spot — Moku Paiva, John Santiago and Brian Borges. Returning on defense

are linebackers Billy Manuwai, Peter Jones, Nathan Wong and Shane Saito; linemen Alii Hauanio and Charles Freitas; and defensive backs John Keoni, Jason Hussey, and Eddie Smith. Another key performer is utility man Matt Wong.

"We feel good about our chances," said Aina. "We have a lot of three-year players, who we invested in when I took over three years ago. Now we'll see if we can pay off."

Kamehameha: This is

how tough the ILH is this year. Coaches find it hard to imagine the Warriors not in the top three.

The Warriors' strength may be defensive, which is led by linebacker Ryan Fujitani and lineman Noa Lidstone. The defensive backs, among the finest in the league, include Barrett Awai, Sean Spencer and Todd Wong.

The offense returns running back Jason Leong and linemen John Bandman and Kevin Souza.

Punahou: Punahou's

defense is probably as good as any in the ILH with a strong corps of linebackers led by Scott Craven, Santini Liufau, Darol Kobatake and Reyn Yates. The linemen are no slouches either with nose guard Chris Dyas, tackle Todd Hirai and Ryan McBride.

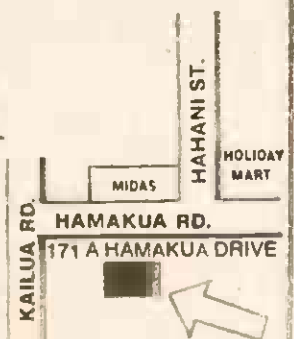

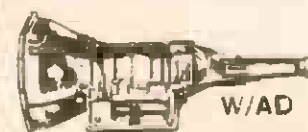

Another Giants year expected in NFL

It's been seven years since a National Football League team repeated as Super Bowl champion. And during those years, prognosticators have almost always predicted the defending champion to repeat. This year isn't any different.

The New York Giants are expected to enjoy another banner season in

the National Football Conference that will lead them to Super Bowl XXII, according to NFL analysts. But the Chicago Bears, 1986 World Champions, could thwart the Giants' return trip.

In the American Football Conference, the Denver Broncos will have to upgrade their running

game to complement their dangerous aerial attack. Other serious Super Bowl contenders in the AFC are the Cleveland Browns and New England Patriots. But like the Broncos, the two teams have their share of weaknesses.

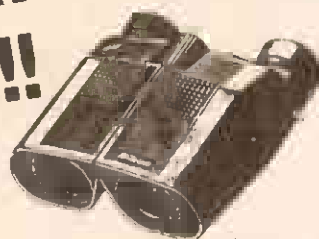

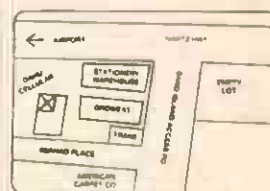

NFL EAST

New York Giants (14-2): Led by quarterback Phil Simms (259 of 468 for 3,487 yards and 21 TDs), the New York Giants' offense should be as potent as ever. And by making wide receiver Mark Ingram of Michigan State their No. 1 draft pick, the Giants now have a legitimate deep threat. Last year, Simms' primary target was a tight end — Mark Bavaro — who led the team with 66 receptions for 1,001 yards.

The Giants' ground game is adequate enough to keep defenses honest. Leading the way is little Joe Morris (5-7, 195), who gained 1,516 yards on 341 carries (4.4 average).

The defense, which allowed the second fewest points last year, should be strong again with Lawrence Taylor, Harry Carson and Carl Banks setting the tone at linebacker positions.

Washington Redskins (12-4): The Redskins are still livid from last year's meetings with the Giants. Washington was not only shut out by New York in the NFC Championship Game (17-0), but is also dropped its

two regular season meetings.

Quarterback Jay Schroeder proved himself when he completed 276 of 541 passes for 4,109 yards (a club record) and 22 touchdowns.

Washington's defense may be a tad weaker than the Giants, but it's still better than most in the NFC. Leading the way will be linemen Dave Butz, Dexter Manley, Darryl Grant and Charles Mann.

Philadelphia Eagles (5-10-1): Head Coach Buddy Ryan, now in his second season at the helm, will have to produce an offense to complement his defense. Last year, the hapless offensive line set a dubious record by allowing its quarterback to be sacked 104 times. If the line isn't improved, it will be a long season for third-year quarterback Randall Cunningham.

The Eagles defense, at best, is average. There are many question marks, including the return of safety Wes Hopkins, who is recovering from a knee injury from last season. Cornerback Roynell Young and defensive end Reggie White will be depended upon heavily throughout the season.

Dallas Cowboys (7-9): Once known as America's Team, the Cowboys have become America's Disaster. Tom Landry's team experienced its first losing season since 1964.

Housecleaning will have to begin on defense, which allowed 337 points. First-round draft pick Danny Noonan, a defensive tackle from Nebraska, may replace the aging John Dutton at tackle. Also, Ed Jones and Randy White are past

their prime. The linebacker positions are also questionable. Only cornerback Everson Walls and safety Michael Downs are above average performers on defense.

On offense, quarterback Danny White's health is still questionable because of an injury he suffered last season. But his replacement, Steve Puler, did an adequate job.

St. Louis Cardinals (4-11-1): To put it bluntly, the Cardinals stunk last

year. And the front office did nothing to improve the team during the draft.

Perhaps the only interest the Cardinals will have for Hawaii fans is that former University of Hawaii standout Niko Noga will be the starting middle linebacker. A month ago, the Farrington High School graduate inked a three-year contract worth about \$800,000.

Neil Lomax, who showed signs of brilliance at quarterback in 1984, may lose his job to No. 1 draft pick Kelly Stouffer out of Colorado State.

NFC CENTRAL
Chicago Bears (14-2): Indecision by management could easily ruin the 1987 season for the Bears. The front office apparently can't decide who it wants as its quarterback.

With four already on the roster — Jim McMahon, Doug Flutie, Steve Fuller and Mike Tomczak — the Bears went on and made Michigan signal caller Jim Harbaugh their first-round draft pick.

The rest of the Bears' offense appears intact with Walter Payton providing the ground attack behind the blocks of Pro Bowlers Jay Hilgenberg

(center) and Jim Covert (tackle).

The Bears defense allowed the fewest points last year with 187, an NFL record for a 16-game season.

Minnesota Vikings (9-7): The Vikings' hope to dethrone the Bears as Central Division champions went out the door when quarterback Tommy Kramer entered the alcohol rehab this summer. Wade Wilson, who hit 80 of 143 passes for 1,165 yards, should be an adequate fill-in. But he's no Kramer, who enjoyed a banner season completing 208 of 372 passes for 3,000 yards and 24 TDs.

Minnesota shored up its running game by making Penn State running back D.J. Dozier its No. 1 draft pick.

Defensively, the Vikings allowed just 273 points, fifth best in the NFC.

Detroit Lions (5-11): After a disastrous season on offense (277 points), Lions' head coach Darryl Rogers has decided to go with Chuck Long at quarterback. Long, a second-year player, has just three games of playing experi-

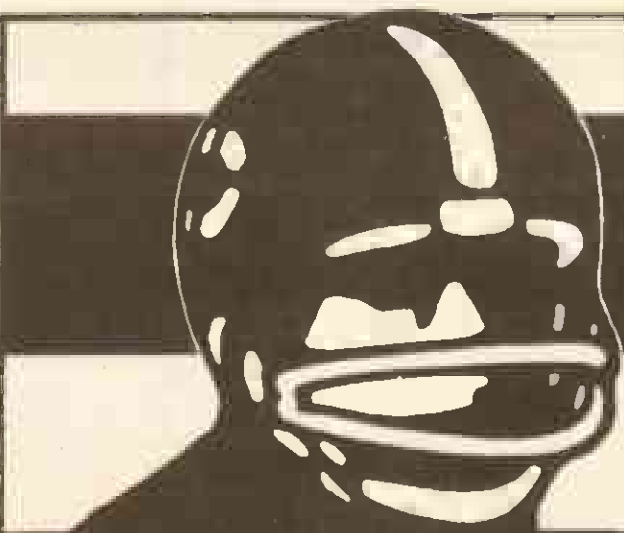

ence under his belt.

The defense is full of question marks. Critics say that some players performed "over their heads" last season, thus are flukes.

Green Bay Packers (4-12): The Packers are coming off their worst season since 1958 (1-10-1). Head Coach Forrest Gregg is in the hot seat now that he is in his fourth year of a five-year contract. But getting back on the plus side may be difficult.

Quarterback Randy Wright put up decent passing stats — 263 of 492 passes complete for 3,247 yards and 17 TDs. However, the Packers' offense could only score 253 points. The ground game will be in the hands of first-round draft pick Brent Fullwood out of Auburn.

The defense was horrendous, allowing 418 points last year. Obviously, there are no outstanding players on defense.

Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2-14): Finding a strength on this team is like getting a straight answer during the Iran-Contra hearings.

New Head Coach Ray Perkins has the unenvia-

ble task of reviving this corpse known as the Buccaneers. After masquerading as an NFL team the past two 2-14 seasons, Tampa Bay, needless to say, is rebuilding.

Vinny Testaverde will be challenging incumbent Steve DeBerg for the quarterback job. Regardless of who wins the job, he won't have an easy time with a supporting cast of lineman and backs who are mediocre at best.

Defensively, the Bucs allowed 473 points last year — the most in the NFL. A lousy draft didn't help the team in any way.

San Francisco Forty-Niners (10-5-1): This rapidly aging team will still contend, mainly because of its strong defense, which allowed just 237 points, third best in the NFC. Key players include nose tackle Michael Carter, linebackers Riki Ellison, Keena Turner and Milt McColl.

Offensively, there is still uncertainty in quarterback Joe Montana's health. If he's healthy, he'll be firing the bombs to wide receiver Jerry Rice (86 catches for 1,570 yards and 15 TDs) and Dwight

Clark, who is recovering from injuries. Another target for Montana is Hawaii's Russ Francis.

Los Angeles Rams (10-6): Indecision with the quarterback situation in past years proved costly to the Rams. So this year, Head Coach John Robinson is giving the ball to Jim Everett. Though he didn't post impressive passing stats, the Rams have high hopes for the former Purdue star.

The Rams may have the best back in the league, outside of Walter Payton, in Eric Dickerson.

The defense, which allowed just 273 points (fourth best in the NFC), will center around linebackers Mark Jerue and Carl Eckern.

Atlanta Falcons (7-8-1): Ineptitude in the front office, unfortunately, will lead to another losing season for the Falcons. Owner Rankin Smith Sr. named Marion Campbell, last year's defensive coordinator, head coach for his beleaguered birds only because nobody wanted the job. (Actually, nobody wants to work for Smith.) Smith, after all, fired Campbell as head coach of the Falcons 11 years ago. Smith must be desperate.

Atlanta allowed the fifth fewest points (280) in the NFC last season. Accounting for much of the work were linemen Tony Casillas, Mike Gann and Rick Bryan.

There's not much to say about the offense, either. **Quarterback David Archer** had a respectable season (150 of 294 for 2,007 yards and 10 TDs), but critics feel his passing skills need to match his running ability (298 yards on 52 carries).

New Orleans Saints (7-9): Basket case of the

NFL. The Saints haven't smelled a winning season in 20 years. This year will be 21.

For starters, the quarterback spot is up for grabs between Dave Wilson (189 of 342 for 2,353 yards, 10 TDs) and Bobby Hebert (41 of 79 for 498 yards, 2 TDs). But there is stability in the running game with Rueben Mayes (1,353 yards on 286 carries for a 4.7 average).

New England Patriots (11-5): The Patriots will have to improve their

running game if they expect to win the division, much less make it to the Super Bowl. They helped their cause by obtaining offensive lineman Sean Farrell (trade from Tampa Bay) and Bruce Armstrong (No. 1 draft pick from Louisville).

Quarterback Tony Eason (276 of 448 for 3,328 yards, 19 TDs) gives New England a strong passing game. Among his favorite receivers is Stanley Morgan (84 receptions for 1,491 yards, 10 TDs).

The defense ranked 24th in rushing defense last year, but still allowed the second fewest points in the AFC, thanks to a strong linebacker and secondary corps.

Miami Dolphins (8-8) The Dolphins' defense, virtually non-existent last year, allowed the most points (405) in the AFC. A key performance last year came from rookie linebacker John Offerdahl, Miami's leading tackler, who made the Pro Bowl.

Miami's offense has been synonymous with the pass since the quarterback duties were turned over to Dan Marino (378 completions for 4,746 yards, 44 TDs).

New York Jets (10-6) Injuries have riddled the once potent New York Sack Exchange — Joe Klecko (knee), Marty Lyons (shoulders) and Mark Gastineau (knee). Magnifying the defense's problems is the inept play of the linebacker and secondary corps.

The news gets better on offense. With Ken O'Brien (300 of 482 passes for 3,690 yards, 25 TDs) at quarterback and Al Toon (85 catches for 1,176 yards) at wide receiver, the Jets

aerial attack is above average.

Buffalo Bills (4-12): Second-year signal caller Jim Kelly has been receiving rave reviews from his coaches and opponents. In his rookie season, Kelly completed 285 of 480 passes for 3,593 yards and 22 touchdowns. Critics believe he'll improve those already impressive numbers.

The Bills tried to solidify their weak defense, which allowed 348 points last year, by making a pair of linebackers and a pair of defensive backs their top four draft picks. Shane Conlan, the Bills' No. 1 draft pick, will join Darryl Talley at outside linebacker.

Indianapolis Colts (3-13): Head coach Ron Meyer is hoping that momentum from a season-ending, three-game winning streak will carry over to this season. One of the key performers during that streak was quarterback Gary Hogeboom. The former Cowboy missed 11 weeks before returning for the final three games.

Indianapolis' defense, which allowed the second most points (400) in the AFC, got a tremendous

boost from the draft — the top four picks are defenders. The big catch is line-backer Cornellius Bennett, who is expected to be given a starting job.

AFC CENTRAL
Cleveland Browns (12-4): The Browns are expecting to have a banner season offensively with Bernie Kosar at quarterback. The University of Miami product, who completed 310 of 531 passes for 3,854 yards, will have a healthy Ozzie Newsome at tight end and wide outs in Brian Brennan, Reggie Langhorne and Webster Slaughter as targets.

The Browns improved an already strong defense when they made Duke linebacker Mike Junkin their No. 1 draft pick. He will be joining veterans Clay Matthews, Eddie Johnson and Anthony Griggs on the defense.

Cincinnati Bengals (10-6): In the big battle for grid supremacy in Ohio, the Bengals are expected to keep pace with the Browns. Cincinnati should be a potent force on offense with Boomer Esiason at quarterback (273 of 469 passes for 3,959 yards, 24 TDs).

Meanwhile, the ground game will be provided by

a capable James Brooks (1,087 yards for a 5.3 average) and Larry Kinnbrew.

The defense, though above average, could use improvement. Outland Trophy winner Jason Buck out of Brigham Young University will be given one of the starting defensive end positions.

Pittsburgh Steelers (6-10): The Steelers won't have an easy time reminding fans of the glory years of the 1970s with Mark Malone at quarterback.

Malone has less than impressive stats — 216 of 425 passes for 2,444 yards, 15 TDs.

The defensive front line won't remind fans of the Steel Curtain era, either.

Houston Oilers (5-11): The Oilers are looking to quarterback Warren Moon to orchestrate the run-and-shoot offense, brought to Houston by quarterback coach June Jones. Wide receivers Drew Hill and Ernest Givins will be key aerial targets, while Mike Rozier

and rookie Alonzo Highsmith balance the attack on the ground.

Houston's defense's strength rests in its secondary with Patrick Allen, Steve Brown, Keith Bostic and Bo Eason.

AFC WEST
Denver Broncos (11-5): While efforts should've been made to improve their running game, the Broncos made a wide receiver, Ricky Nattiel, their first-round draft pick. Denver already has

Playoff may decide NCAA title

If a one-game format is decided to be the best way to crown a national college football champion, pity the person, or persons, who have the job of selecting the two teams.

The playoff teams probably would be selected on the basis of who won the bowl games preceding the playoff game and the national polls. It has been recommended that the

game be played the Sunday before the Super Bowl game and that the first game be played following the 1988 season.

Without a doubt, a committee would be formed to name the two playoff teams. A committee can work anonymously, whereas one person cannot.

In a case where there are three or more teams closer-

ly crowded at the top, even after bowl games and the polls all are in, selecting only two of them to play for the NCAA championship could be a life-threatening chore. The alumni and fans of the team left out will be — to put it nicely — upset.

Imagine, for example, having to make a choice between Oklahoma and Nebraska.

A plan for a playoff to decide a national champion was on the agenda of the NCAA convention in 1976. The plan did not come to a vote, because coaches and school officials opposed any and all plans for a playoff.

However, sentiment seems now to be tipping in favor of a playoff game.

The reason for this is the financial success of last season's Fiesta Bowl game between Miami and Penn State, the two top-ranked teams in the nation. The game was won by Penn State, which was then proclaimed to be the national champion.

It has been estimated that one football playoff game would rake in as much as \$40 million in revenue. This would swell the coffers of the two participating schools. And such figures do much toward changing the minds of coaches and administrators.
