## School begins

### Let's be careful out there

Unless you slept on the way to work these past two days, you couldn't but notice the presence of numerous children on the sidewalks and in the crosswalks, indicating their return to school.

Motor vehicle operators, parents and the children themselves all have necessary precautions to take to avoid tragedy in the '87-88 school year.

For motorists, their primary concern is to be especially watchful during the times children are travelling to or from school. The posted speed limit near schools is 25 mph and flashing lights indicate when that limit is in effect, regardless of the normal posted limit. School-age children are pedestrians and have the right of way in all marked street crossings.

"To help remind drivers that school has resumed while simultaneously assist



ing children in crossing busy streets, station military policemen will be directing traffic at the crosswalks on Lawrence Ave. and at the intersection of MacLachlan St. and Harris Ave.," said SSgt. David Rodriguez, Traffic Control Chief at PMO. "Our big safety push will continue through Friday (tomorrow) with additional MPs near the crossings to help remind motorists that school is in session."

While there are numerous

crossings throughout housing areas, another main crossing is at the intersection of Cushman Ave. and MacLachlan St. near Anderson Field. Children may be present approximately 45 minutes before and after school, and Mokapu Elementary starts class at 7:55 a.m. and ends at 2:10 p.m. (except Wednesdays when school lets out at 1:10 p.m.). Schools in the civilian community have roughly the same operating hours, and motorists will be reminded of this by the yellow flashing lights at the beginning of school speed zone areas.

"While we don't anticipate any of the traffic jam problems which are the 'accepted norm' in the civilian community when school resumes," added Rodriguez, "we do urge motorists, parents and children to exercise every safety precaution possible throughout this school year."

## LtGen Petersen assumes 'Gray Eagle' designation

MCDEC, Quantico, Va — A Marine is once again The "Gray Eagle," the Navy Department's senior aviator by date of aviation designation.

Lieutenant General Frank E. Petersen, commanding general of the Marine Corps Development and Education Command, assumed the title when Navy Vice Admiral James E. Service retired Aug. 21.

The general also became the senior aviator in the Department of Defense. His October 1952 designation supersedes all other Armed Forces aviators.

The Gray Eagle Trophy award, sponsored by the Vought Corp., was started in 1960. The trophy is passed on to honor the senior Naval Aviator still on active flight status.

The miniature aircraft carrier with an eagle landing on the deck has an inscription. "In recognition of a clear eye, a stout heart, a steady hand, a daring defiance of gravity and the law of averages." A smaller replica is also presented to each incumbent to keep as a personal memento.

Lieutenant General Petersen is the sixth Marine to hold this title. The most recent was LtGen Andrew O'Donnel (October 1979-June 1981).

But the general is familiar with holding unique titles. He has been the "Silver

Hawk," the Marine Corps' senior aviator since October 1985 and the Corps' first black aviator, first black squadron commander, first black general and first black base commander.

Lieutenant General

Petersen completed the Naval Aviation Cadet Program and was commissioned a Marine second lieutenant in October 1952.

The Topeka, Kan., native has flown 350 combat missions.

## SecNav. Webb honored; comments on ships, Corps

Washington D.C. — In remarks made after receiving the Marine Corps League's Annual "Iron Mike" award, Secretary of the Navy James H. Webb, Jr. announced the names of four Navy surface combatants, including the first ship named in honor of

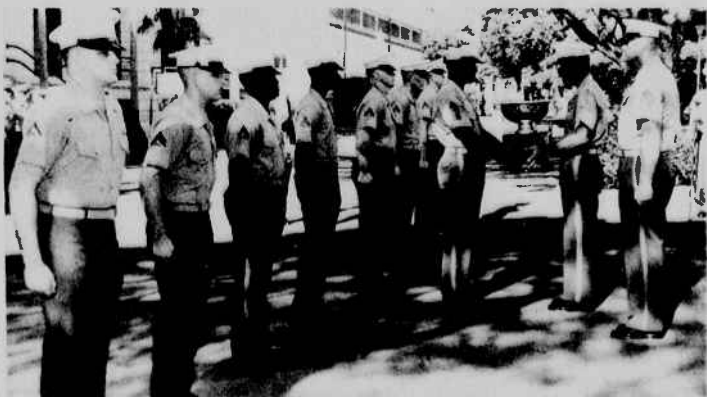
a Vietnam battle. He then warned the Marine Corps against doctrinal complacency, noting that it has been the quality of the individual fighting Marine, rather than doctrine or weapons systems, that has carried the reputation of the Corps.

Secretary Webb announced the names of four Aegis Guided Missile Cruisers, two of which honored battles in United States history in which the Marine Corps carried the brunt of the action.

## Puller Hall wins again!

MARINE BARRACKS, PEARL HARBOR, — For the second consecutive year, the cooks and messmen here

at Puller Hall have won the Secretary of the Navy's Capt. Edward F. Ney Memorial Award for excellence in the independent mess hall category.

The award was presented to Col. William A. Tilley, Jr., Barracks commanding officer, and MSgt. Clifton L. Overs, mess hall staff noncommissioned officer-in-charge, during the recent 1987 Memorial Awards Ceremony/International Food Service Executives Association Conference in Miami Beach, Florida.

Tilley said that no one he spoke with at the awards ceremony in Miami Beach could ever remember any unit winning the award in

consecutive years. "There's no way I can adequately express what the winning of the Ney Awards means to this organization," Tilley said.

The Marine Corps has recognized its mess halls for food-service excellence for many years, but has only recently joined the IFSEA, which sponsored the Ney Memorial Awards program in the MajGen. W.P.T. Hill category. Within the program, mess halls compete for the best mess awards in different categories within the Marine Corps.

"There is no compromise when it comes to food service," Tilley said, "but within the IFSEA, requirements are extremely stringent. You're either good or you're not."

"This business is fast moving, and there's no room for

mistakes," Overs said. And as with the first award, he gives all the credit to his Marines and civilian mess attendants. "I always talk about my Marines, because I've got the best in the world."

"I'm proud of my people," he said. "They did the work and deserve all the recognition."

During the local presentation of the award at Marine Barracks Hawaii recently, Col. Tilley reminded the Barracks Marines to "Be proud of yourselves and be proud of the cooks. They have to strive for excellence at every meal."

"Master Sergeant Overs and his crew represent you (the Barracks). It's your mess hall. You're the ones who take the pride in knowing that you stand for the best, and the mess hall is just one of those areas," Tilley said.

## LABOR DAY

Be safe on Sept. 7

Labor Day weekend is almost upon us and with it comes fun with family and friends. Unless some common sense rules are followed this fun filled weekend could end in tragedy.

Travel within the speed limit, slower if conditions dictate. Drive defensively, always try to anticipate the moves of the other drivers.

The combination of drinking and driving is incompatible; do not attempt to mix the two. Utilize the designated

driver program—it works.

Seat belts in automobiles and helmets for motorcycles save lives — use them. State laws require restraint systems be utilized for adults and children. Marine Corps and Air Station orders require motorcycles to use helmets and reflective vests on and off station. Willful violation of motorcycle safety regulations may cause you to lose military benefits in the event of death or disability associated with a

motorcycle accident.

Remember water safety rules and swim within your limits. Recent water related tragedies within 1st MAB stand as a reminder that the ocean demands the highest respect. Don't swim after alcohol consumption. Don't dive alone. Use the proper equipment and don't exceed your abilities, qualifications or good judgement. Limit exposure to the sun between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. and use a high SPF sunscreen.

## Square it Away!

The following is an excerpt from Air Station Order 1020-4D, Uniform Regulations and Personal Appearance Standards.

"The cap (service, garrison and utility) as part of the uniform, shall be worn in vehicles, except when the configuration of the vehicle does not permit so due to limited head space." (Enclosure 1, para. 4b.)

sions in two wars and has logged more than 4,000 hours in various fighter and attack aircraft.

"During Korea, you had to see who you were fighting," he said. "You were literally face-to-face with the enemy. Today, the air fight takes place over the horizon. You can achieve a kill miles away."

"Younger pilots who have grown up in the computer age seem to do better in the cockpit than those seasoned with thousands of hours in a 'bird,' primarily because eye-to-hand ability is more adaptable to the modern cockpit," he added.

He hasn't been in the cockpit as much as he would like since assuming command here in June 1986, but he has recently flown the F/A-18 Hornet, the F-16 Falcon and the TAV-8B Harrier II.

Although he began his career in Korea flying the

F4U Corsair, the general has been flying the Phantom since 1968, when he was squadron commander for Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-314.

Under his command, '314 became the first squadron to receive the Marine Corps Aviation Association's Robert M. Hanson Award as the outstanding fighter squadron of the year.

He was awarded the Purple Heart for injuries sustained in Vietnam. While serving as the squadron commander for VMFA-314, he was on a mission assisting a recon outfit that had been pinned down above the Demilitarized Zone when one of his Phantom's engines was hit by enemy ground fire and burst into flames.

"I pulled the throttle back and shut down the engine, added power on the other one and tried to get as close to the DMZ as I could," he recalled.

But on the way back the

number two engine caught fire.

"This may sound kind of foolish, but here are two guys sitting in an airplane with both engines on fire and the hydraulic system leaking," he said. "If we had punched out over enemy territory, we

could have spent the remainder of the war in the 'Hanoi Hilton.'"

Just after reaching the DMZ, the fires burned through the control system and he gave the order to eject. He was looking back at his

radar intercept officer to ensure his seat worked.

"When I ejected, I went out in an awkward position," he said. "The initial impact of the ejection seat gives a shock of about 20 Gs. It was like a corkscrew effect."

He suffered a herniated

disk in his back and a hair-line fracture of the hip socket but flew 240 more missions before being treated. Today he walks with a slight limp but it doesn't keep the 55-year-old from working out at the gym whenever his schedule permits.

Young Marines enjoy having the opportunity to work out next to their commanding general. Although he admits that he is probably setting the example, the general says that is not the reason he is there.

"It's my own personal desire to be here," he said. "Staying physically fit is the best thing you can do." The general can still pass the Marine Corps physical fitness test but is no longer required to because of his age.

Even though being the Gray Eagle is the culmination of a 35-year career in aviation, Lt. Gen. Petersen still says, "As I sit here with three stars, I would give up a month's pay to be able to rove around with the young aviators and fly their stuff and live in their world."

## At A Glance

### Paydays Change

Dates of regular military paydays will change as a result of the 1987 DoD Appropriations Act.

The Act, which was effective earlier this fiscal year, shifted the regular payday scheduled for Sept. 30 to Oct. 1. All future paydays will also be affected by this change. Monies earned during the first half of a month will be paid on the 15th while those earned during the last half of a month will be paid on the first of the following month.

No major problems are expected as a result of this change. However, many people have automatic payments made from their Direct Deposit accounts. This change could cause that

deposit to be made from one to two days later than usual. Account balances will have to be monitored closely to ensure that adequate funds are available for those automatic payments.

The paydays for the months of October through January 1988 are: Oct. 1, 15 and 30; Nov. 13; Dec. 1, 15 and 31; and Jan. 15, 1988. November 1 and 15 are Sundays, and Jan. 1, 1988 is a holiday.

## MSG Briefing

Some of the criteria for sergeants and below applying for MSG duty are: proficiency and conduct marks of 4.2/4.2 respectively, United States citizenship, and be within the weight standards. Also, the service record books should contain evidence of a satisfactory ENTAC or NAC, and a AFCE/GT score of 90 or above.

Marines must have at least 32 months of obligated active service when reporting to MSG school. Sergeants and below volunteering for MSG school must be single and remain unmarried according to MC 1306.2M.

To apply, interested Marines must first see their unit administrative section.

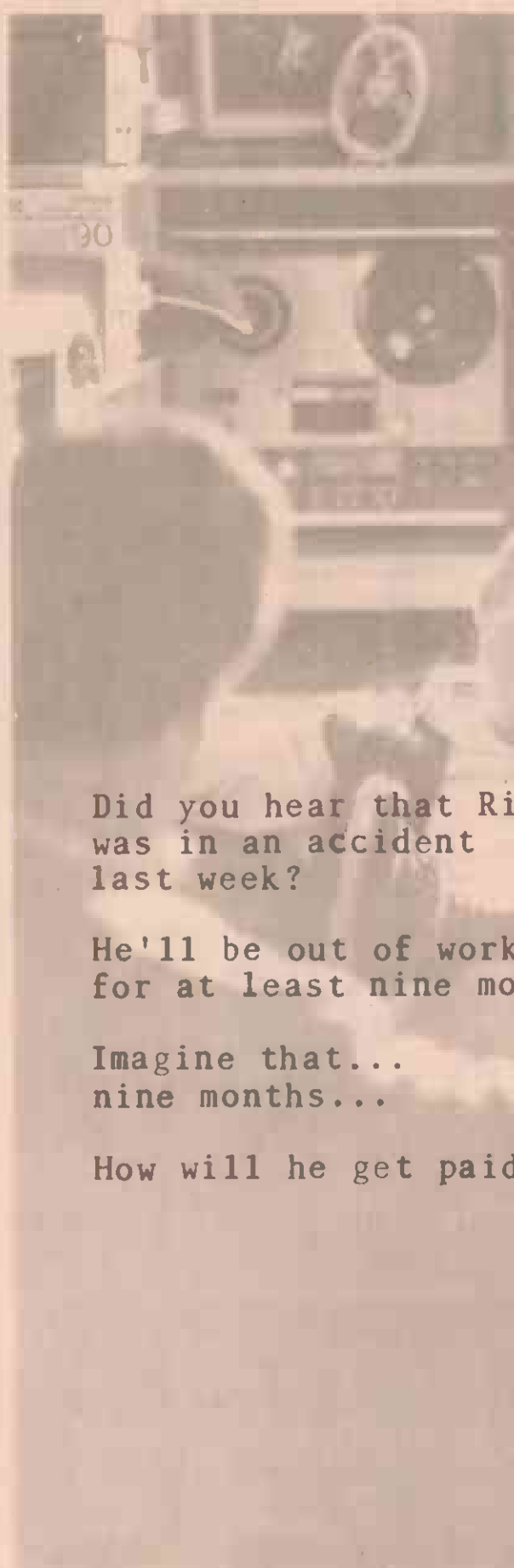

# Help keep those cookouts safe

The word "cookout" seems to be synonymous with summer. Most people enjoy cookouts, with their good food and happy memories. However, outdoor cooking can lead to tragedy when carelessness causes burns. The Federal Fire Department recently issued an advisory to remind everyone of some common sense rules when cooking out:

- When starting a fire use only charcoal starter fluid on unlit coals. Don't freshen a fire by adding more fluid the heat of the coals can ignite the liquid burn back into the can, causing it to explode in your hands. Never use gasoline or other flammable liquids to start a fire, they are explosive and much too dangerous to use on grills. Electric starters can be used in place of lighter fluids.
- Have a container of water or a garden hose ready to extinguish a fire. Always soak coals after cooking; unsoaked coals can relight a day later.
- Place grills where they will not tip over or ignite objects above them. Never bring a grill into homes, tents, or recreational vehicles. Aside from the possibility of fire, carbon monoxide produced by burning charcoal can be dangerous in an enclosed space.

- Keep children away from fires and grills. They may try to climb on the grill to see what is cooking. If anyone is burned by outdoor cooking, cool the burn with water immediately. Cover the burn with a clean cloth and seek emergency help.
- If a bag of charcoal gets wet, leave it outside, away from the house.

# Ships

Chosin (CG 65) commemorates the 1st Marine Division's heroic breakout from communist Chinese encirclement at the Chosin Reservoir during the Korean War, a three week march to the sea that Secretary Webb indicated, "... was one of the great moments in Marine Corps History. Under heavy attack, the Marines fought their way out under bitterly

cold conditions, never losing unit integrity, never abandoning their equipment, or their wounded, or even their dead."

Hue City (CG 66) will be the first combatant ever to carry the name of a battle from the Vietnam War. Following the North Vietnamese takeovers of the old imperial capitol during the Tet Offensive of 1968, a force consisting principally of U.S. Marines and South Vietnamese soldiers and Marines fought for more than a month, often in bitter

house-to-house engagements, to retake the city. Secretary Webb indicated that, "Hue City will cause all of us to remember the rewards of courage, and the sad legacy of commitments abandoned through the confusion of domestic politics."

Other cruiser names include Shiloh (CH 67), named for the two day civil war battle fought in 1862 and Anzio (CG 68), which commemorates the allied landings at Anzio, Italy in 1944.

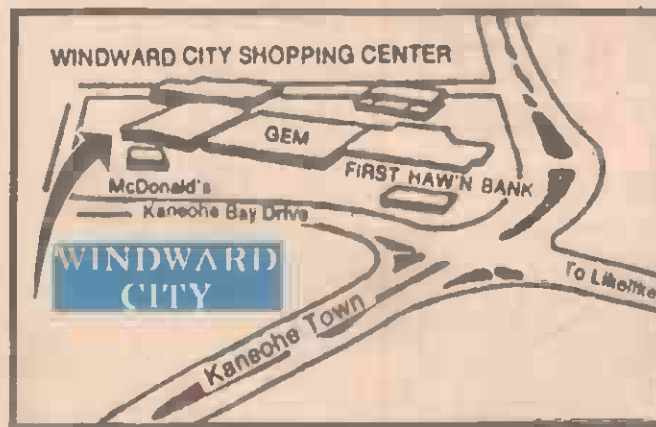

# Preventing jet lag

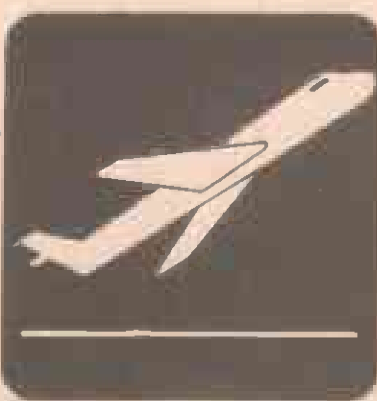
## Adjusting the body clock

**A**FIS — In one way, our Stone Age ancestors had it easier than we do.

They never had to fly across time zones and face a power breakfast meeting, much less a battle, when their bodies told them it was midnight. And unlike most people in uniform, our fur-wearing forebears never had to work late at night and then defend the Free World early the next morning.

Along with the joys of modern civilization comes the need to be alert to the command of the clock. Our bodies tell us to be alert, eat and sleep according to a cycle known as a circadian rhythm, which is believed to follow the sun's cycle.

We can get our bodies to adjust to clock time, but the balance is easy to upset. We don't even have to travel to get that rhythm out of whack. All it takes is a weekend or a couple of days off duty, when we go to bed and get up later than normal, and



we've set our bodies up for a letdown, the "Monday syndrome."

No matter the cause, a fouled-up body clock can lower productivity and cause accidents. Dr. William Storm, chief of aerospace research branch at Brooks Air Force Base, Texas, said that military researchers have been looking at special sleeping pills with a short half-life as one way of minimizing jet-lag problems. Ordinary sleeping aids stay in the body a long time and cause a hangover — which can dangerously hamper per-

formance in critical situations.

The British had some success with the new type pills when they gave them to troops en route to the Falklands to make them sleep in the daytime so they'd be ready to fight on arrival. Storm says the research is still being done on the sleeping aids and advises strongly against self-medication.

Storm says there is no way to completely avoid the fatigue of time changes or longer working hours. But he recommends ways to manage the body's rebellion at a manageable level.

• To avoid Monday syndrome, don't stay up late on weekends.

• Storm says it's best to simply get several good night's sleep at your regular bedtime before flying. he disagrees with experts who say to adjust your bedtime several days before you fly across time zones by one hour per time zone.

• While flying across time zones, eat good meals and don't smoke. In general, it's a good idea to drink plenty of non-alcoholic and caffeine-free fluids while flying. If possible, take walks up and down the aisle or do isometric exercises in your seat.

• If you have control over your schedule, don't plan a critical event for a time you'd normally be asleep.

• Even when you're not traveling, be aware of your most alert times and try to do your difficult work then.

# How the first sergeants got their rank

First, let me say that the first time you find yourself standing in line in front of the first sergeant's desk you'll become the first one to realize why he's called first among sergeants.

That crusty old composite of stern features, stripes, ribbons and diamonds will probably tell you he's got more salt in his socks than you've got in your whole seabag and you'd better shape up or he'll ship you out. First sergeants have been doing that for a long time. Since shortly after the War of 1812, in fact.

During that early combat period the Corps had exactly

115 men serving as sergeants, some working with line units and other wrestling with garrison life. When the war ended and the Navy took over the primary job of national defense and showing the flag all over the navigable world, most ships with Marines aboard had no officer and the Leathernecks were commanded by a sergeant.

Under that system you had sergeants facing pirates and privateers at sea drawing the same salary as sergeants dealing with laundry hangups at the Washington Marine Barracks. Since there was no special "combat pay" to reward the three striper getting shot at, Congress in 1833 finally realized the situation was unfair and cre-

ated the intermediate rank of "orderly sergeants of the post" and "first sergeant of the guards at sea."

They were not common ranks (in fact there were only 33 men originally appointed to the two titles) but they did have some monetary benefits. The 33 Marines who first received the ranks in 1833 drew \$16 per month.

Just a year later, a billet arrangement at Headquarters Marine Corps set the stage for usage of first sergeants as specialist in administration. Three orderly sergeants were employed in 1834 by Colonel Commandant, the Adjutant and Inspector, and the Quartermaster.

While the act establishing

orderly and first sergeants officially referred to them by those names, by far the most common term used for senior NCO's was orderly sergeant. Over the years however, Marines who found it difficult to deal with three syllable words in fast-paced barracks-room bitching sessions began to refer to the senior NCO at their station as simply the "first sergeant."

By July 1872 the term orderly sergeant was almost unheard throughout the Corps and Headquarters decided to link reality with the official record by dropping the title in favor of first sergeant.

The first sergeants remained in the second pay grade until 1893, when they received a three dollar monthly raise in salary. This threw some smelly substance into the rank-rate game, since the sergeant major and quartermaster sergeant remained senior enlisted men but drew only \$23 per month, or \$2 less than the first sergeant and drum major.

What followed was a hazy period of NCO command relationships and pay inequities that kept everybody grumbling over their breakers or ale. Finally in 1899, following the war with Spain, a law was enacted which partly untangled the mess. Legislators set forth enlisted grades and the number of men who could occupy them. At this point, first sergeants were placed in the second pay grade along with the first gunnery sergeants created just a year earlier.

By the beginning of World War I first sergeants were firmly entrenched and operating as the senior NCO in many commands. After the war, however, first sergeants again found themselves on



the short end of the promotion stick.

Sergeants major and quartermaster sergeants were the Corps' senior ranks, but both implied special technical ability and many first sergeants watched with tears of frustration as junior sergeants were jumped over them for promotion to the most senior NCO ranks.

In 1926 the problem was solved when the Commandant indicated all sergeants major would be selected only from the list of eligible first sergeants and gunnery sergeants. In the same year headquarters spelled out for the first time in official black and white the duties of the first sergeant. He was to be utilized as "first or leading

noncommissioned officer in the organization to which attached."

By the beginning of World War II first sergeants shared the second pay grade with gunnery sergeants, drum majors and supply sergeants.

In 1943 the Corps advanced the first sergeants to the first pay grade along with sergeant major, even though the latter took precedence over all other NCO's in the top pay grade. The first sergeant new found prestige was shortlived, however, and in 1946 all first sergeants' found themselves master sergeants under the Corp's most-recent shakeup.

Congress enacted the Career Compensation Act in 1949 which turned the pay grade numbering system upside down, placing the private in the lowest level at E-1 and the master sergeants at the top level at E-7. In 1954 two additional rank titles were established in the Corps and the sergeant major and first sergeant were resurrected.

Then, in 1958, the Career Compensation Act was amended and two new pay grades were added to the top of enlisted structure.

Finally, let me say while the first sergeant is officially not first, it would not be wise for you to consider him second in your command. Not even for a second.

## The test of teamwork

*While deployed, Co. E, 2/3 battles for title of 'best squad'*

Camp Schwab, Japan — 1st MAB Marines competed in the 3rd Marine Division Combat Rifle Squad Competition here as they joust for the title of the 3rd Marine Division's best rifle squad.

The battle ended July 18, with a rifle squad from Company L, 3/8 narrowly capturing the title over rifle squads from Co. A 1/5 and Co. E., 2/3. The Co. E 2/3 Marines are deployed to Okinawa under the UDP, from the MCAS Kaneohe Bay-based 1st MAB.

"The competition tests the squad leader's leadership and decision-making abilities based upon his knowledge of basic infantry tactics. It also tests the squad's ability to follow orders and func-

tion as one," said 2ndLt. Forrest Fitts, the competition's defensive problem evaluator.

In order to test both the squad leader and the squad, the competition consisted of five categories. The first three categories were one-day field exercises which required the squad leader to deploy his men in a defensive position the first day, take the offensive the second day and conduct ambush patrols on the third day. Each event was worth a maximum of 100 points.

During the second day of field exercises, Typhoon Thelma blew in and the competition was delayed. The competition was put back on its seven-day schedule by combining the last two events, field firing and physical fitness.

After the first three field events, the squads were close in total score. The last two events, each worth a maximum of 50 points, were designed to test the squad's teamwork and became the competition tiebreaker.

At 6 a.m. on the final day, all three squads seemed impatient as the physical fitness event began at Camp Gonsalves. The event required each squad to designate a member as wounded, then carry him on a stretcher across a course measuring more than three miles. The faster they ran, the higher they scored.

The squad from 1/5 started the event. The squads from 3/8 and 2/3 followed at five minute intervals. Third Bn., 8th Marines took a narrow lead by passing 1/5 and coming in five minutes faster

than the other squads.

Following an hour rest, the competitors moved to the transition range at Camp Hansen for the final event — field firing. After the squads peppered the silhouette targets and the holes were counted, the scores were neck-and-neck again.
