## New CG FMFPac slated

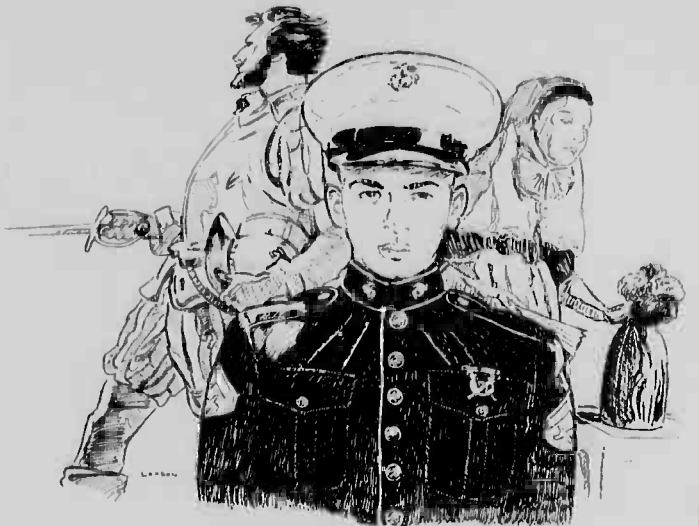

## Air Station behind 'power curve' Urgent energy conservation measures needed

Here's the problem: A Corps-wide energy use study has placed MCAS Kaneohe Bay near the bottom of the list in energy-conserving installations. For the month of July the Station was nine percent above the DoD Energy Program Policy and more than two million gallons over in water usage allotted.

The solution is simple. Everyone here must work together to cut down on the use of water and electricity.

Military units here have already received their five-paragraph order for conservation measures.

While military sections/units have their officers, SNCOs, and NCOs to monitor energy-saving measures, housing residents must rely largely on self-discipline to exercise conservation.

Housing residents account for 51 percent of the electricity and water bills here. The residents not only have to participate by switching lights off and turning water faucets off — residents also need to become educated on energy conservation and work together as a team by passing the word to

"conserve."

The do's and don'ts of electricity use.

- Operate electric equipment in the early morning hours prior to 9:30 a.m. to reduce peak electric demands.

- Turn off all lights, televisions, and any appliances when there is no one in the room and/or not in use. (Only maximum 60 watt incandescent bulbs for the interior and 40 watt bulbs for exterior use are permitted.)

Trying to keep too cool is costing us big bucks. Learn to turn down your air conditioners.



- Turn off air conditioning units for three

hours a day and keep thermostats no lower than 78 degrees Fahrenheit. Written permission from the Housing Office is required before installation of a window air conditioner in quarters.

- Use fans to ventilate and increase air circulation during "cool days."

- Water heater thermostats should be set at 120 degrees Fahrenheit except where dishwashers are used and then the temperature can be adjusted no higher than 140 degrees.

The do's and don'ts of water/irrigation use.

Watering hours are necessary for the Air Station in order to control the rate of water consumption and maintain reservoir supplies for fire protection. As water supplies vary, so do the hours allotted for lawn irrigation. Changes to hours are made by written announcements published at various times throughout the year.

To further control the rate of water:

- Don't water to the point where runoff occurs. Water only lawns and plants — not roads and sidewalks.

To report wasteful practices, call the Station Inspector at 257-3454, during working hours, or Station OOD at 257-3234, after working hours.

- A steady rainfall of 30 minutes or more during designated watering days or within 24 hours would preclude watering until the next watering period.

- Use a broom instead of the water hose for cleaning debris from sidewalks, and lanais.

- Leaking/dripping faucets and valves should be reported for repair. Contact Facilities Department Trouble Desk at 257-2380 or the Station OOD after working hours.

- Do not wash vehicles or other items with a free-running hose. Use a pail or hose nozzle with an automatic turn-off valve.

Voluntary conservation of electricity and water is much easier to live with than having strict enforcement measures placed on units and housing areas.

## Air Station to join nation in Constitution commemoration

On September 17, 1787, 40 men signed their names to a document which established the world's first government of the people, by the people, for the people.

Today, the Constitution of the United States is the world's oldest written instrument of national government. It is the cornerstone of the American Republic, a symbol of our national ideals



of freedom, justice and equal opportunity.

To commemorate the his-

toric moment when the Constitution was signed, the Commission on the Bicentennial of the United States Constitution is inviting every American to join in "Bells Across America, a ringing tribute to the Constitution."

The ringing tribute will start at 4 p.m. E.D.T. (10 a.m. local time), the time of the signing of the Constitution.

At that time, individuals and groups across the nation will simultaneously ring bells for 200 seconds.

The tribute can be made with bells, chimes and carillons to echo the sentiments of a grateful nation. During the 200 seconds, Americans will have the opportunity to reflect on the blessings of liberty and the ideals of justice and equal opportunity made possible by the Constitution.

The bells located at the MCAS/1stMAB Headquarters and the 3d Marine Regiment Headquarters are scheduled to be sounded for this observance.

## At A Glance

### Paydays Change

Dates of regular military paydays will change as a result of the 1987 DoD Appropriations Act.

The Act, which was effective earlier this fiscal year, shifted the regular payday scheduled for Sept. 30 to Oct. 1. All future paydays will also be affected by this change. Monies earned during the first half of a month will be paid on the 15th while those earned during the last half of a month will be paid on the first of the following month.

No major problems are expected as a result of this change. However, many people have automatic payments made from their Direct Deposit accounts. This change could cause that deposit to be made from one to two days later than usual. Account balances will have to be monitored closely to ensure that adequate funds are available for those automatic payments.

The paydays for the months of October through January 1988 are: Oct. 1, 15 and 30; Nov. 13; Dec. 1, 15 and 31; and Jan. 15, 1988, November 1 and 15 are Sundays, and Jan. 1, 1988 is a holiday.

Water shortages are a chronic problem in Hawaii; accordingly the hours for watering grass areas have been restricted throughout the Air Station, effective immediately.

Barracks and office space lawn areas will be watered only on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, from 7 through 9 p.m.

The housing area has a different schedule. Residents of odd numbered buildings can water their lawns on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays from 3 through 7 p.m. Residents of even numbered buildings can water on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Sundays, also from 3 through 7 p.m.

It is important that lawns are watered sufficiently to promote live growth but, just as important, the water must be secured at the designated times to prevent water running wastefully throughout the evening hours.

Air Station and 1st MAB inspectors, conservation duty officers and military police will patrol to ensure the strict enforcement of these regulations.

# SAR executes high seas rescue

A Air Station Search and Rescue crew scrambled last week to medically evacuate a woman from the deck of the civilian cruise ship SS Independence off the northeast coast of Oahu.

The HH-46 helicopter, piloted by Capt. J.C. Barghusen, lifted off at approximately 1 p.m., Sept. 2, after receiving a distress call from the Coast Guard's Joint Rescue Coordination Center in Honolulu.

Their mission was to medivac a female crewmember aboard the SS Independence, who was suffering from an overdose of prescription drugs.

According to the copilot, Capt. D.E. Davies, the SAR approached the ship from the stern and immediately lowered rescue swimmer Sgt. R. Benoit to the deck of the ship.

The victim was then hoisted aboard the chopper and flown to the Air Station. Hampered by bad weather, the SAR crew was forced to

transfer the woman to an ambulance for transport to Castle Medical Center. Other crewmembers aboard the chopper who

helped with the rescue were LCpl. L.E. Rowe, a rescue swimmer, and HM3 M. Guerrero, Naval Regional Medical Center.

# Hot cars: human inferno

On a hot day last summer, a group of soldiers enjoyed a speed-boat race on the banks of the Ohio River. The following morning, they read all about it in the newspaper *The Indianapolis Star* — not because the race was an important sporting event, but for another, more tragic reason.

A 1-year-old child had been left alone in a car while his parents watched the race. The boy had died of heat exhaustion, his body's cooling system unable to keep pace with the rising temperature inside the car.

Heat exhaustion doesn't take long. In another case, after 20 minutes in a closed car, a 6-year-old girl was very pale, disoriented and dehy-

drated. Her father had tied her to the seat while he went to get help after the car had broken down. After state police broke the window to get her out, they measured the car's temperature: 140 degrees Fahrenheit.

After unsuccessfully trying to save the life of a baby girl who had been left in a car for an hour on a July day, Dr. Kenneth B. Roberts, associate chief of pediatrics at Sinai Hospital in Baltimore, studied the effects of car heat on children. He chose "a gorgeous 83°F September day." He found that in just 15 minutes, temperatures rose to 110°F in cars parked in the sun with the front windows open two inches. The temperatures continued to rise after 15 minutes, but

not dramatically.

Direct sunlight and lack of ventilation are the two most important factors in car heat, but high humidity adds to the danger because it interferes with sweating. Children dehydrate more easily than adults, so they are more susceptible to heat stress.

Roberts polled 50 mothers of children under 2 and asked if they had ever left their children in a car. More than a fourth of the mothers had done so, and they had not left the windows open for fear the baby might be kidnapped.

Leaving a child in an unattended car in any weather or an animal in a car with the windows closed is against the law in many states and against traffic regulations on military installations.

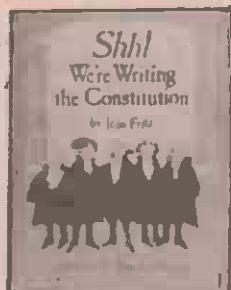

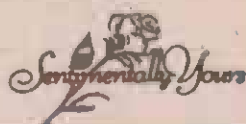

Whether you are living in or own a multi-family dwelling, such as an apartment, condominium, or townhouse, it would be in your best interest to look for fire safety features.

Some features to look for are: accessible and clearly marked exits; enclosed exit stairways; smoke detectors, fire alarm systems, and automatic sprinkler systems. You should also ensure the fire detection and alarm systems work. If the systems do not work, contact the building manager or fire department.

Your neighbors lifestyle can also affect your safety, especially when living in attached residences. The Federal Fire Department recommends everyone practice the following common sense rules of fire safety:

- Be prepared in advance to handle a fire emergency.
- Know and practice your escape routes even in the dark.
- If there is a fire in your home crawl to the nearest exit on your hands and knees.
- Know where your fire extinguishers and alarms are and know how to use them. Find out if your fire alarm sounds off at the fire department or just in your building.
- If there is a fire, call the fire department yourself, don't assume someone else has.
- When using enclosed exit stairways, never leave the door propped open, smoke can enter making the stairway unsafe.
- Smoking is one of the leading causes of apartment fires, with most starting in the living room, den or lounge from cigarettes dropped in the furniture.
- Keep all flammable and combustible materials, such as aerosol cans, flammable liquids, paper and clothing away from heaters, stoves, and any other heating unit.
- Don't use barbecue grills on balconies. Using them in a confined area near other apartments can be dangerous.

Fire safety is everyone's responsibility, especially in multi-family housing. Practice fire safety as individuals and as a community. Remember you are not alone.

## McGruff visits Camp Smith

# Kids learn to take a bite out of crime

Camp H.M. Smith — A Marine Military Policeman and his dog took center stage here recently to demonstrate crime prevention techniques for a group of visiting children when another Marine approached and began to disrupt the demonstration. The MP objected and the Marine attacked him. In an instant, the Marine was on the ground being subdued by 90 pounds of growling, barking fury.

Was it a movie film crew on location or a real life situation? Neither.

The attacking Marine was also an MP and part of the demonstration. The children, from the Nuuanu YMCA Summer Fun Program, were guests of the Camp Smith Provost Marshal's Office and the "fury" was Castor, a Military Police working dog.

The demonstration was part of the Camp Smith PMO's Crime Prevention Program.

The program, which has been in effect since December 1984, allows interested military, civilian and civic groups a chance to see, firsthand, how the PMO operates and how it can work for them.

The 27 4- to 6-year-olds were given a lecture and a dog-handling demonstration by Sgt. Mike Taylor, a safety briefing about dealing with strangers by "Officer Friendly," and a visit by "McGruff" the Crime Dog, who reemphasized the importance of avoiding strangers and saying "No" to drugs.

"We use the K-9 demonstrations especially with school-age children," said Taylor, one of two dog handlers here. "It gives the kids a chance to learn information they would not normally get in

school."

"Officer Friendly" and "McGruff" are training aids that are used to keep the public aware of how to prevent crime and work with the police.

"One of the main objectives of the program is to show the public that we (the police) are here for them," said Sgt. Frank Otano, who portrays "Officer Friendly." "The public needs to know

that they can turn to us for help and information."

# ASYMCA programs set

The Armed Services YMCA has four unique education programs coming soon which may be of interest to many members of the Marine Corps community here. The ASYMCA is offering, through the Windward School for Adults: English for Foreign Born, Adult Basic Education, and General Education Development (GED) Preparation courses.

These classes begin Sept. 15 and continue every Tuesday and Thursday from 9:30 a.m. to noon, for 10 weeks. The fourth program is a Sex Abuse Prevention Workshop, offered in conjunction with the Family Services Center, on Sept. 16 from 9 a.m. to noon as part of the ASYMCA Women's Awareness Program.

Nancy Murray, who has a bachelors degree from Indiana, teaches English for Foreign Born. She has admiration for the student she teaches. "Can you imagine going to a foreign country," she says, "learning the language, the culture, and the military way of life as well? I admire their courage."

The Adult Basic Education course is taught by Barbara Salice, who holds a masters in education from the University of Hawaii. The course is designed to help students attain an acceptable reading

level so they can begin classroom work towards a GED diploma. There have been many success stories. "Out of one class alone," Salice said, "we had one person who went on to get a GED, another who is in college, and still another who is now a dental hygienist."

The GED program will be taught by Zona Boyum, who has a master's in Guidance Counseling and Psychology from University of Northern Colorado. The course is designed to help students pass the GED equivalency test. "It's not an easy test," she says. "In fact most people with high school diplomas would have a hard time passing it if they didn't study first." However, about 80 percent of her students do pass the test.

The Sex Abuse Prevention Workshop will be conducted by Joanne Little and Michele Hill. It is open to all interested persons, including parents and professionals. The emphasis is on strategies of prevention and making the public aware of the extent of the problem. Ms. Little, who has a masters in social work from the University of Hawaii, says, "We don't want to alarm anyone, we want to educate them."

The ASYMCA provides transportation and child care services for all these programs at a very minimal fee. To sign up or get more information, call 254-4719 or 254-4965.
