News in Brief

Persian Gulf update

In retaliation for the recent Iranian missile attack on a U.S.-flagged tanker off Kuwait, and other Iranian attacks on vessels in the Persian Gulf, President Reagan signed a near-total trade embargo that is intended to deny Iran a market for its oil exports, White House officials said.

The embargo, which would include all trade with Iran with the exception of humanitarian trade such as medical supplies, is part of what the President deems as a "measured response" to Iranian attacks.

Prefix numbers established for emergency phone calls

With the changeover to the Oahu Telephone System, all emergency telephone numbers will be conforming to a world wide numbering plan. Under this plan the last four digits of emergency numbers for like services will be the same — only the prefix will change.

The following are the prefixes that will be used at the four military installations that are scheduled to change over to OTS on Nov. 5; MCAS Kaneohe Bay, 257; Pearl Harbor, 471; NAS Barbers Point, 684; and Ford Island, 472.

The last four digits of telephone numbers for emergency services during the first phase of the OTS change over are:

All calls for the Fire Department, less Hickam AFB, should be made to 471-7117, and all telephone trouble calls should be made to 471-7119 After Nov. 10.

Any emergency service calls placed using old telephone numbers will be automatically forwarded to the new number.

Seven Businesses off-limits on Oahu

Seven Oahu businesses have been listed as being off-limits to military personnel, according to the Armed Forces Disciplinary Control Board.

Any personnel, whether in uniform or civilian clothes, found entering or leaving, unless required to do so by competent authority, any of these establishments may be subject to disciplinary action.

All of the establishments listed have been declared off-limits for selling drug paraphernalia.

Have a safe and Happy Halloween

It's the time of year again for the Air Station men-hunes to come out on Halloween night to play a few tricks, and get some treats from housing residents.

The Provost Marshals' Office has set trick-or-treating hours from 6-9 p.m. Saturday. Military Policemen will be "out in full force" to keep a watchful eye on the trick-or-treaters, said Cpl. Lori Miranda. Motorists are asked to be especially observant, and restrict speeds throughout all housing areas during Halloween hours.

If any suspicious activities are observed, or tampered treats are found by parents or children, PMO should be contacted immediately by calling at 257-2123. Off-Station residents should contact the Honolulu Police Department.

In addition to trick-or-treating, children here can get a guided tour through a Haunted House on Friday and Saturday, 4-8 p.m. The House, sponsored by the Air Station Teen Club and Dependent Recreation, will be located at the Family Gymnasium next to the 7-day store. The cost for the tour, which includes a bag of goodies, is 50 cents for children, and \$1 for adults.

To make Halloween safe and fun for children, a few safety tips are offered:

Costumes

- Try to select a costume which is light in color.
- Wrap reflective tape around your child's ankles, wrists and headress so they can be seen.
- Apply face makeup, rather than buying a mask for your child. However, if your child will be wearing a mask, ensure the mask does not restrict vision, hearing and breathing.
- Only purchase costumes labeled "Flame Resistant."
- If costumes come with a sword, knife or other accessories, ensure these items are made of soft, flexible material.

Parental safety check

- Make sure children are chaperoned by an adult or responsible teenager.
- Tell children not to enter homes or apartments unless their chaperon is with them.
- Ensure children carry flashlights so they can see and be seen.
- Tell children to only visit houses that have an outside light on.
- All treats should be checked for tampering. Discard baked goods unless you know they came from a trusted neighbor. Factory-processed candy should also be checked for any irregularities in its seal.

Marines dare to care

The Combined Federal Campaign, will end successfully tomorrow having achieved its \$2.6 million goal. To date, Oahu military and federal civilian workers have contributed well over \$2.7 million.

Marines contributed more than their fair share, with

approximately \$278,401 donated. As of Oct. 27, 105% of the Marines goal has been achieved.

The Marines in Hawaii have historically exceeded their CFC goal. This year, despite a slow start, that tradition has been maintained as money continues to flow into CFC coffers.

New payday saves Billions\$

AFIS — What a difference a day makes! By changing the military payday from the last day of September to the first day of October, DoD saved an estimated \$2.8 billion, according to a spokesman for the comptroller's office.

"The purpose was to reduce expenditures in the fiscal 1987 budget," said the spokesman. "By delaying the payment for one day, the outlay occurred in fiscal 1988 instead of in 1987. That meant that there were only 11 monthly paydays in fiscal

1987. But beginning in fiscal 1988, we'll go back to 12 monthly payments."

This is a one-time savings that occurred because Sept. 30 marked the end of fiscal 1987 and Oct. 1 was the start of fiscal 1988. Congress ordered the shift in paydays to begin on Oct. 1 to shave nearly \$3 billion from fiscal 1987 salary expenses.

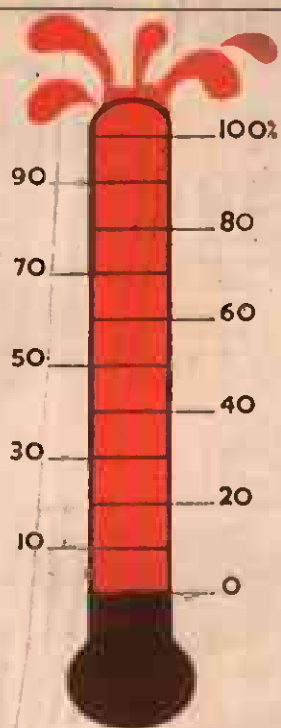
Hundreds of thousands of reservists and National Guardsmen are not affected by the move.

"There has been a lot of confusion about tax savings," said the spokesman. "But there are not any. One

would assume that you're getting less money in 1987, but that's not true. There is already a provision in the law that if a payday falls on a weekend or holiday, payday will be the day before. The first of January is always a holiday, so payday will be on Dec. 31, 1987, instead of Jan. 1, 1988."

Taxable income is based on the calendar year instead of the fiscal year.

First-of-the-month paydays have been made permanent, but there will not be any more savings for DoD. "It was a one-time thing," the spokesman emphasized.

Navy Relief Volunteer receives 'satisfaction'

The first thing you notice about this Navy Relief volunteer is that his smile is genuine, his manner unaffected, and his handshake is firm. Then he introduces himself and you can't help but laugh. "Hi, I'm Bill Smith," he says automatically, "No kidding, my name is really Bill Smith!"

Smith, known as "Uncle Bill" to the other volunteers and staffers at the Navy Relief office here, is a 64-year-old retired naval officer who has been doing volunteer work here twice-a-week since May.

"I was volunteering for several different local organizations, but I wasn't really happy with them," explained Smith. "I was going home feeling like I hadn't really

done any work. Then I thought I'd try the Air Station here. I found the Navy Relief office, and I've been really happy working with it. I like the people I work with, the Navy Relief training program, and the people who come for assistance."

Smith, who retired from both the Navy and the California State Service, got involved in volunteer work to remain productive after retiring. "I wasn't interested in working hard anymore; and my wife and I both wanted to have more time to ourselves," said Smith. "I wanted to have some kind of commitment — an obligation." Smith's wife also volunteered for Navy Relief, working one-day-a-week at the Pearl Harbor office.

Smith, who spent 23 years in the Navy as an enlisted

man and later as an officer, feels that his military background is a valuable asset.

"One of the reasons I enjoy working with the military is because I understand what they're going through. I've been through the same thing," he said.

"When you move around a lot and your housing allowance gets screwed up, or the military decides they overpaid you 10 years ago, they take it out and you're left high and dry. I understand how that feels," he added.

"Uncle Bill," feels that his age also makes him better able to help those who come for assistance.

"Because of my looks and my voice, a lot of people feel they can open up to me because I seem to remind them of their grandfather," he said. "One young lady

even told me I reminded her of her great-grandfather," he recalled with a laugh.

The reward for all this, says Smith, is the personal satisfaction he gets by helping others.

"When someone opens up his life to me, and he's honest and up front about his problems, then I try to work something out for him. When he comes back months later to tell me 'Hey, it worked,'

that gives me a lot of satisfaction. I want to help people, and that's what I feel I'm doing," "Uncle Bill" concluded with a friendly smile.

Legally speaking . . .

Operational Law — What it is and what it does

Prosecution and defense usually get most of the attention in military law. A less well known area of military law is "operational law." This term refers to the various legal problems a Marine unit faces when it deploys to train or to fight.

The purpose of this article is to explain the role that "operational law" plays during combat and peacetime military activities.

Law of War

Perhaps the most important part of operational law is the "law of war" as laid out in the Geneva and Hague Conventions. The law of war tells who you can legally kill, and how you must treat prisoners of war and civilians.

Also part of operational law are "rules of engagement." These are rules issued by a commander setting out when you are allowed to shoot. While the operational lawyer must be alert to see that rules of engagement do not violate the law of war, he must also ensure the rules are not too narrow or confusing — thus putting Marines in unnecessary danger.

SOFA Agreement

Deploying Marines must also be aware of foreign jurisdiction questions. If a Marine commits a crime in a foreign country there is a question as to which nation's courts will try him. The United States has negotiated Status of Forces Agreements with a number of countries. These agreements determine which

country has jurisdiction over a serviceman in particular types of cases. It is important that the Marine lawyer handling operational law be knowledgeable about Status of Forces Agreements and foreign criminal law.

Civil Affairs

A new area of operational law is civil affairs. Until recently, only the Reserves had a civil affairs capability. Civil affairs deals with our obligation under the Geneva

Conventions to care for civilian population in the places we fight. In order to ensure we fulfill that obligation, Marine Corps judge advocates are increasingly involved in organizing care for refugees and local civilians in war zones. Put simply, civil affairs' mission is to get civilians out of the way of ground troops who are busy locating and destroying the enemy.

In peacetime, the Civil

Affairs Officer (who might also be the operational law specialist) is more likely to be settling claims from farmers whose fields have been plowed up by AAVs or settling with a bar owner whose club has been dismantled by Marines overindulging in liberty.

Brigade Training

First MAB has an active Operational Law Program at the Legal Services Center. In

the last ten months, law of war classes have been given to nearly 1700 Marines from infantry, artillery, air, and support units. The officer conducting the law of war training considers this the most important part of operational law. He remarked, "Based on what I've seen and what I am told, nobody has ever explained the law of war in clear, simple language to junior Marines. They deserve

On the Blotter

Editor's Note: The following are actual incidents which occurred on the Air Station this week. The Military Police Department here is bringing significant cases to your attention to prevent these types of incidents happening to you or your family. To report a crime, or if you notice suspicious activity on the Air Station, please call the Military Police Department's 24-hour Crime Stopper number — 267-2123.

A few Marines from the Air Station have recently been arrested for contempt of court in Honolulu.

Contempt of court is defined as an act, or omission, tending to obstruct or interfere with the orderly administration of justice. In short, it is showing disrespect for the authority of the court.

• A Cpl. was found to be in contempt of court after he was arrested by the Honolulu Police Department for fighting downtown. The Cpl. failed to appear at his specific court date. As a result, a bench warrant was issued for his arrest in the amount of \$100.

• A Sgt. was found to be in violation of a restraining order that prohibits him from making any contact with his wife, after he confronted her about their ongoing marital problems.

• A Cpl. was convicted of three counts of contempt of court: two were for failing to appear for a scheduled appearance, and one fine was assessed during the court proceedings. The Cpl. was released after being fined \$200, and forfeiting \$220 bail. The Cpl. also received a 30 day suspended jail sentence.

• A disturbance was reported at the Enlisted Club by the duty manager. A PFC was dancing on a table and taking his shirt off. The PFC and his friend, another PFC, were escorted to the manager's office, where they refused to show their I.D. cards. The PFC that was dancing on the table became involved in an argument with the manager, and both PFC's left the office without being told to do so.

The MP's arrived and the odor of alcohol was noticed on both of the PFC's. While being apprehended, one of the PFC's punched the manager, and tried to punch an MP.

Both Marines were apprehended for assault, breach of peace, disobedience of a lawful order, resisting apprehension, and drunk and disorderly conduct.

• A LCpl. was apprehended for DWI, a traffic accident, damage to government property, and under-aged drinking.

The LCpl. himself reported the traffic accident which happened after he left a party at the Hale Koa beach. The LCpl. stated that he had struck a fire hydrant and three guards posts on Sumner Road. MP's detected the odor of alcohol on the LCpl., who elected to have his blood tested. The results of this test are pending. It was also discovered that the LCpl. was under the legal age for drinking.

• A Sgt. and a LCpl. were apprehended for an assault and breach of peace. The LCpl. reported that an

unknown male, who was later identified as the Sgt. kept looking into her room at the barracks. When she questioned him, the Sgt. grabbed her by the throat and yanked her dog tags so that he could read them.

The Sgt. said that he was looking for another Marine, and that the LCpl. was disrespectful toward him. Both were processed and released to their unit representative.

to know exactly what they can and cannot do in combat. Usually, the tough questions are ignored. We try to do things differently in our classes." Besides inserting law of war and civil affairs play in CPX exercises, the operational law specialist has been involved in simulating law of war problems in field training at Kahukus and Schofield Barracks.

Earlier this year, the Brigade's rules of engagement were revised. Examination by the operational law spe-

cialist revealed the rules were far too restrictive, and in several cases based on a misunderstanding of international law. Bringing them in line with the law of war gives commanders and individual Marines more freedom to defend themselves and to fight. Events in the Persian Gulf show the need for clear, unrestrictive rules of engagement.

Operational law requires research in international law. Recent international law issues include: MPS shipping under international law; the need to arm MPS ships; special "law of war" considera-

tions for guerrilla warfare; the legality of the Soviet made AK-74 hollow-round ammunition; and legal requirements for transferring North Korean prisoners from American to South Korean control.

Although the value of operational law becomes most apparent when Marines have deployed in an operational setting, it is important in garrison as well. Operational law expertise is needed to advise staff sections on a variety of matters; including questions on targeting, rules of engagement, treatment of

civilians, and treaty obligations.

Marine Corps Order 3300.3, Marine Corps Law of War Program, requires legal review of all plans and operational policies to ensure consistency with the law of war. At the unit level, operational law provides simple, precise law of war training, in the field or out, and information on foreign law for deploying units.

H&S Co.: 'Brains' of the three B's

Think of Brigade Service Support Group-1 as a human body, and then consider, that, like every body, it needs to have a controlling ele-

ment. Without that controlling element, the body wouldn't be able to function.

The controlling element, or the brain, of BSSG-1 is Headquarters & Service Company. The mission of H&S Co.,

says its commanding officer, Maj. E.R. Elder, is to control all the administrative and logistical functions of BSSG-1. Whether in garrison in the field. In short, BSSG-1 controls the Brigades' "beans, bullets and band-aids," and H&S Co. controls BSSG-1.

Headquarters & Service Co., recently took part in a field exercise at Bellows Air Force Station to practice their ability to control the functions of BSSG-1.

During the exercise, BSSG-1 Marines learned individual field skills, defensive tactics, and company tactics, while continuing to support all of the 1st MAB's requirements in the field.

"We're like any other service company in that we support headquarters, in our case BSSG-1," said Elder. "Our scope here is a little larger than most service companies though, because of our new Maritime Prepositioning Force (MPF) mission."

Elder considers the operations section, the most important part of his company. "In garrison the operations section coordinates all of the outside requirements for support," said Elder. "They are

also responsible for setting up our MPF off-loads, while our computer systems work to make sure BSSG-1 is ready to support 1st MAB's MPF mission." The operations section is also responsible for all of the embarkation and transportation requirements of BSSG-1.

During the Bellows exercise, the operations section operated the Tactical Logistics Operations Center (TLOC). The TLOC staff included representatives from every unit in BSSG-1, and coordinated all support activities which are provided to 1st MAB.

Also included in the TLOC was the communications section. They were tasked with maintaining internal communications for the exercise, as well as providing communications with higher headquarters.

Throughout the field exercise, TLOC continually performed as "the hub of the wheel" that coordinated all of the training and support requirements for BSSG-1, indicated Elder.

Another element within the company which honed

their field skills in the exercise was the Brigade Information Systems Management Office (BISMO). BISMO provides software, programmer, technical and maintenance assistance for all the computer systems in the Brigade.

Other sections that fall under the umbrella of H&S Co. are the administration, intelligence, operations and logistics shops, supply, legal, postal, consolidated administration, and the chaplain.

Additional sections were attached to H&S Co. during the field exercise to provide services which wouldn't normally be provided in garrison. Some of these sections were: a platoon of military policemen who provided rear area and convoy security; a disbursing office; a field mess that provided 1,200 hot meals-a-day; and a human affairs section. H&S Co. also maintained a small weight room and operated a liberty bus in order to keep up morale.

Marine Bomber Sqdn. holds reunion

MCDEC, Quantico, Va. — Risk was a way of life for the gallant young Marines of Marine Bomber Squadron (VMB)-612 during World War II, a way of life they relived during a recent reunion here.

Their mission was a valiant one: attack enemy ships at night with modified B-25 Mitchell aircraft redesignated as PBJs by the Marine Corps. Their home bases were on Saipan, Iwo Jima and Okinawa. According to Peter B. Mersky's book, "U.S. Marine Corps Aviation," VMB-612 probably flew the last combat mission for the Corps in World War II.

"We were on a mission out to the Sea of Japan and didn't know the hostilities had ceased," said Roger Sanders, who currently lives in Brookings, Ore. "We didn't see anything out there except for a fishing boat, so we turned back. I was later told that was the last combat mission flown by Marine aviators in World War II. It's

all written down somewhere."

About 140 former members of what Sergeant James J. McElroy, a combat correspondent in World War II, referred to as the "Hottest Squadron" held their first reunion Sept. 17-19 at the Sheraton Hotel in Arlington, Va.

The former Marines who attended the reunion made the best of it. They had traditional luncheons and other opportunities for fellowship and slated a full-day visit for Quantico. They attended a memorial service at the base chapel, toured the Marine Air Ground Museum and visited The Basic School.

But, for the most part, the reunion was an opportunity for former squadron members to reflect on their past as one of eight Marine Corps PBJ squadrons.

The PBJs of VMB-612, were painted blue-black, equipped with radar for navigation and bombing at night and only had twin .50-calibre machine guns in the tails for defensive armament.

According to some squadron members, the plane was made to fly only five hours per mission. However, the demands on the squadron required the planes to fly 700-900 miles out on each mission; up to 12 to 14 hours per flight. The aircraft got this added capability from extra gas tanks that were mounted on the wings and in the bomb bay.

"We flew most of our mission at 200 feet so we'd be undetected by enemy radar and maintained complete radio silence at night," said Edgar Pelletier, a radar gunner at the time. "When we saw an enemy ship, we dove to 50 feet and hit 'em with our rockets."

The five-inch, and later eight-inch, rockets and 500-lb "tiny tim" bombs with rocket motors, were the main weapons on VMB-612's aircraft. With the .50-calibre machine guns as their only defense against enemy aircraft, their survival depended principally upon their pilots' skills.

"Once we were on a night bombing run and attacked a 400-foot transport and a patrol boat in the Sea of Japan. We left and got about ten minutes out and two enemy fighters got on our trail and left their headlights on," said Jack Binswanger, Sarasota, Fla., who was a tail gunner at the time. "Sanders, the pilot, dove until we got about three feet off the water and stayed there. The fighters followed us for about ten minutes and turned back. They weren't going to come down that low to get us."

VMB-612's night mission made it difficult to determine how many ships they hit during the war. However, some records assert that between April 10 and July 28, 1945, they flew 251 sorties, damaged more than 50 enemy ships and sank five of them. They also flew 31 sorties around the Sea of Japan between August 1-15. The war officially ended on September 2, 1945.

The reunion here was the first the entire squadron has held since the war. According to Ivan Roberts, a radar gunner at the time, from Tampa, Fla., parts of the squadron have reunited in past years.

"The pilots have had reunions, so have the radar gunners, but this was the first time the entire squadron has gotten together," said Roberts.

Organizing the reunion was time-consuming, Roberts said. It took nearly three years to organize it, with the final form taking shape last year. That's when networking efforts with former squadron members began to pay off. The effort branched out across the nation until 250 former members of the squadron expressed an interest in a reunion.

"I had run into the old paymaster of the squadron. He had the names and addresses of 600 enlisted men, but the addresses were all 42 years old. Also, one of the pilots had a list of 75 officers... it was 42 years old, too," said Roberts.

The networking effort produced a list of 806 former members of the squadron. Roberts said at least 106 were deceased.

Roberts said that in cases of deceased former members, spouses and family were still invited. Among those who attended were Norma Moyer and Barbara Enders, wife and daughter of then-Staff Sergeant William Moyer, a radar technician for VMB-612. William Moyer died in 1981.

"We eloped just before he

went off to the war," said Norma. "We were very young, and we wanted to get married. Our parents thought we were too young to get married, with what was going on, so we went ahead and got married anyway on New Year's Eve in 1944."

"The reunion gave me a chance to touch base with people who knew my dad as a young man and as word got around that he passed away and we were here instead, everyone was great," said Enders. "People came to us and shared with us the times they had with him."

William Stephens, of Cleveland, Oh., is the son of then-Corporal John R. Stephens, who was an aircrewman for the squadron. John Stephens died in 1979. Stephens, like his father, is also a former Marine. He served in the Corps from 1969-1971.

"I had an aviation guarantee," said Stephens, who wanted to follow in his father's footsteps. "But, I was too young, 17 years old. You were supposed to be 19, so they made me a 'grunt'."

Most members of '612 were teenagers or in their early 20s during the war. "There was one guy who was 24 years old and we called him 'pappy,'" said Pelletier. "Most of us were just kids at 18-19 years old."

"I was a pilot at 19 years old," said retired Col. James Bode. "You had to be young

to do some of the things we did."

If there had been an honored guest for the reunion, it probably would have been retired Brigadier General Jack Cram. Cram was the commanding officer of the squadron when he was a lieutenant colonel. He earned the Navy Cross for gallantry on Guadalcanal as an aide to Brigadier General Roy S. Geiger, the Corps' fifth aviator. Geiger was then in overall command of Marine aircraft elements on Guadalcanal. Cram earned his Navy Cross by using the general's personal plane to destroy an enemy supply ship.

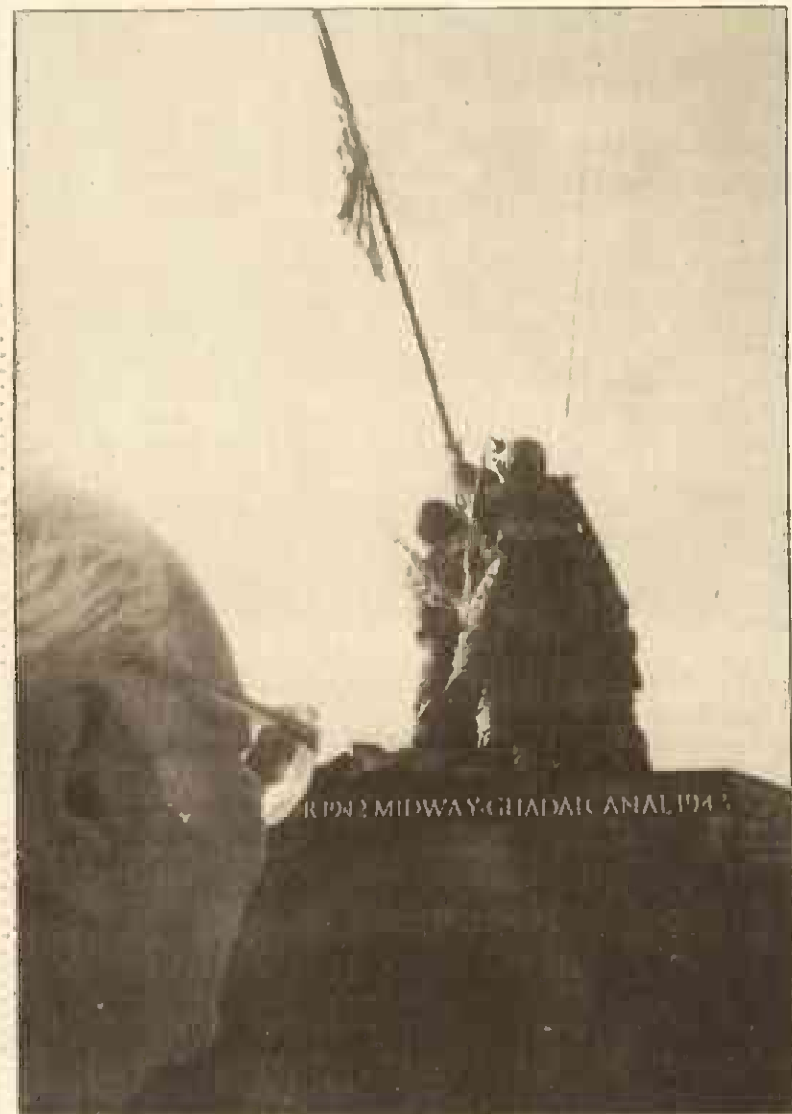
The former commanding officer of the squadron, now 81 years old, wasn't able to attend the reunion because of personal obligations.

For those who attended the reunion, it was a moving experience.

"Seeing old friends you haven't seen in 42 years puts something in your heart and in your eyeballs," said Binswanger.

"I've shed more tears during this reunion than I have in my lifetime."

According to the Master of Ceremonies, retired Marine Captain George Leinhart of Beaufort, S.C., the squadron won't wait another 42 years for a reunion. Another reunion has been already tentatively scheduled in two years.
