News in Brief

Philippine update

As a result of recent terrorist actions in the Republic of the Philippines, travel into that country by U.S. military and military-related personnel has been restricted.

According to All NAVACTS Hawaii message 153/87, all incoming space available travel, including ordinary leave and environmental/morale leave for active duty U.S. military personnel, civil service personnel, dependents and retirees, has been suspended until further notice. Persons exempt from this suspension include those who are currently stationed or residing in the Philippines, and are returning to their home or duty station there.

Personnel travelling to the Philippines on Permanent Change of Station and mission essential (PAC) orders should use MAC flights, if feasible, which will fly directly into the U.S. bases there.

In the most recent development in the Philippines five men brandishing M-16 rifles disarmed two security guards, who were protecting a housing area where numerous U.S. servicemen live, according to a report in Monday's Star-Bulletin.

The incident occurred less than a half-mile from Clark Air Base where last week suspected communist rebels shot and killed three Americans in separate attacks near that base.

According to U.S. officials, the dead included two active-duty Air Force sergeants, and an Air Force retiree. In another incident, assailants fired at an Air Force captain.

Cake Cutting Ceremonies

Hopefully the Corps will be getting better and better. For the air wing, I hope it means getting down to only two types of airplanes, which will make things easier for logistics and maintainability.

Things like inspections are going to get a lot harder, because there'll be a lot more things to inspect — a lot more space-age technology. Marines will be more intelligent.

I hope we don't get too technical. Remember, the basic element is the human being. The individual Marine is the one who accomplishes everything that the Marine Corps does. If you get too technical, then the human being won't be able to handle it. It's got to be brought down to where the human being can handle it.

Buying and registering a car

Dealing with dealers

As the year end approaches, many car dealerships are burdened with unsold 1987 cars. Since the 1988 models are already being produced in Detroit and elsewhere, there is added incentive for dealers to clear their lots.

The credit sales contract is probably the greatest legal pitfall for young Marines. The attraction of low payments too often traps a Marine into a quick sale. The reality of high interest rates and small print in sales

agreements is not realized until much later.

A typical scenario develops when a Marine decides that the monthly payment is within his means. At the outset, the need for financing limits the Marine's ability to bargain. The salesman's only objective is to manipulate the payments into the Marine's budget. A used car often ends up costing over twice its blue-book value. What few Marines realize is that if the car is wrecked or stolen, the insurance will generally only cover its market value which will be thousands of dollars less than the financed amount. Further, no matter what happens to the car, the

Marine will be responsible for payments until the loan is paid off.

Another common misconception is that if the car is allowed to be repossessed, the debt disappears. However, repossession is not a cure for financial problems. The bank will sell the car at or below market value and then deduct any cost of selling, storage, and other repossession charges from the repossession sale proceeds. Whatever remains, the bank will apply to the loan balance. The Marine will then be liable for the difference. Typically, the deficiency is up to one-half of the loan balance. Now the Marine continues to make payments for a car he no longer owns.

The easiest way to avoid being pressured into a sale is to avoid signing the contract until the following day.

Registering your car

If you purchase from a dealer, the dealership will lead you through the paperwork required to register your car. Otherwise, you must register the car on your own. The following are documents required to register a car:

The Sales transaction
The Bill of Sale, form DF-L-40, must be executed and signed by the seller before a notary. This recites a description of the vehicle and the sale price.

Power of Attorney
The Power of Attorney, form DL 38, allows the buyer

Veteran's Day remembered

AFIS — The observance of Veterans Day goes back to 1921, when an American soldier — his name "known but to God" — was buried at Arlington National Cemetery. The burial site of this unknown soldier became a memorial of dignity and reverence for America's veterans.

Similar ceremonies were held earlier in England and France, where unknown soldiers were buried at Westminster Abbey and the Arc de Triomphe, those nations' highest place of honor.

All three memorial gestures took place on Nov. 11, giving universal recognition

to the celebrated ending of World War I hostilities at 11 a.m., Nov. 11, 1918 — the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month.

That day became known as Armistice Day and was declared a national holiday 12 years later. Shortly after the holiday was proclaimed, World War II broke out in Europe, shattering the dream that World War I had been "the war to end all wars."

More than 16 million Americans served during World War II, of whom more than 400,000 were killed. The families and friends of these dead longed for a way to honor their memory — to

honor veterans of all wars.

The answer came in the form of legislation that changed Armistice Day to Veterans Day, an observance honoring veterans of all America's wars. In 1954, President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed the bill proclaiming Nov. 11 as Veterans Day and called for Americans everywhere to rededicate themselves to the cause of peace.

More significance was added to Veterans Day in 1958, when two more unidentified American war dead — one from World War II and one from the Korean conflict — were brought to Arlington

Cemetery from overseas and buried beside the World War I soldier. On Memorial Day 1984, an unidentified American war dead from the Vietnam War was also buried at the Tomb of the Unknowns.

From 1971 to 1975, Veterans Day was observed on the fourth Monday in October in compliance with a 1968 law that changed most national holidays to Mondays.

However, recognizing the significance of Nov. 11, Congress passed a law in 1975 returning the Veterans Day observance to that date. The law took effect in 1978, the 60th anniversary of the World War I armistice.

to transfer registration. Otherwise, the seller would have to personally escort the buyer to register the automobile.

Notice of Transfer
Within ten days of transfer, the seller must sign and submit the Notice of Transfer, form DF-L-53. All forms are to be sent to Division of Licenses, Finance

Department, City and County of Honolulu, Hawaii 96814.

Non-Resident Certificate

The Non-Resident Certificate, from DF-L-50, enables the active duty Marine to forego local fees charged to Hawaii residents that range from \$30 to \$90 per year.

Title

The Title should be prop-

erly signed by the seller and any lienholder.

Registration and Safety Sticker

The Registration and evidence of the most recent safety check are also required to register the automobile.

Having acquired each of these documents, the next stop is the Department of

Motor Vehicles. Notoriously long lines may be avoided by using a registration service. Licensing Help located in the atrium of the Marine Corps Exchange will assist the new car owner in registration for a fee ranging from \$13.50 to \$18.50, depending on the exact task to be performed. Licensing Help's booth is open from 10 a.m.-5 p.m. Monday through Saturday.



On the Blotter

Editor's Note: The following are actual incidents which occurred on the Air Station this week. The Military Police Department here is bringing significant cases to your attention to prevent these types of incidents happening to you or your family. To report a crime, or if you notice suspicious activity on the Air Station, please call the Military Police Department's 24-hour Crime Stopper number - 257-2123.

There were six incidents of fraudulent use of construction passes this week on the Air Station.

Numerous contractors are issued vehicle passes daily to work on the Air Station. The Provost Marshal's office dictates that these passes are to be used only for the vehicle specified on the pass.

For instance, if a pass is issued to a contractor for a blue '87 Ford pickup truck, that pass cannot be used for any other vehicle. If the contractor needs to use another truck that day, he must go to vehicle registration for another pass. The same is true for temporary passes. If you get a temporary pass, it can only be used for the car described on the pass.

If you have any questions concerning the registration of vehicles aboard the Air Station, call the Vehicle Registration Office at 257-3547.

Here's what else happened throughout the week:

A dependent son and his civilian friend were apprehended for illegal bench sponsorship and wrongful possession and use of marijuana. The MP's detected the odor of marijuana coming

from a '83 Chevy at Pyramid Rock Beach. The two men gave the MP's consent to search the vehicle.

During this search, the MP's seized a plastic bag that contained a hand-rolled cigarette and suspected marijuana.

The dependent son had also sponsored the civilian on to the beach; this is against Air Station regulations. Both were processed. The dependent son was released to his father, and the civilian was escorted off the Air Station.

Lance Corporal Sean P. Fitzgerald, VMFA-235, MAG-24, was convicted during a special court martial for assault and damaging personal property. He was sentenced to be confined for three months.

Private First Class Howard L. Hadel Jr., HMH-463, MAG-24, was convicted during a special court martial of unauthorized absence, possessing drug paraphernalia, and of using and possessing marijuana. He was sentenced to be confined for three months, to forfeit \$400 pay for three

months, to be reduced to private and to receive a bad conduct discharge.

Private First Class James E. Canoy, HMH-463, MAG-24, was convicted during a special court martial of using cocaine. He was sentenced to be confined for two months, to forfeit \$450 pay for two months, to be reduced to private and to receive a bad conduct discharge.

Private First Class Calvin A. Hoogerhyde, Jr., 1/3, was convicted during a general court martial of 79 specifications of writing bad checks totaling approximately \$15,000. He was sentenced to be confined for four years, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be reduced to E-1, and to receive a dishonorable discharge.







Esprit de corps and Marines

A former Marine describes the unique trait

Editor's note: William R. Manchester was an enlisted man in the Marine Corps between July 2, 1942 and Oct. 24, 1945. He served in the Solomon and Ryukyu Islands as a sergeant in a rifle battalion.

In the invasion of Okinawa, he saw 66 consecutive days of combat. When on June 4, 1945, the stalemated Machinato line was broken by landing two regiments behind enemy lines, on Oroku peninsula, he was in the assault wave. The following day he was wounded in action and evacuated from the island. Manchester, author of the best-seller *Goodbye, Darkness*, has given the Hawaii Marine permission to reprint this article, which originally appeared in a 1950 edition of the Baltimore Sun.

The United States Marine is a gas-operated, rain-cooled, spam-fed, more or less semi-automatic flat trajectory infantry weapon. He has never been known to have a stoppage.

This is usually attributed to an intangible "esprit de corps". Esprit de corps, to the Marine, is a big joke. Mention it with contempt and he will leer cheerily and agree loudly unless you happen not to be a Marine, in which event you will likely wind up with a mouthful of broken teeth.

For whether the Marine admits it or not, and he rarely will, he does have esprit de corps. Where does he get it?

Superficially, he looks like an army infantryman. Coat him with several inches of mud, as his habit commonly does, and you can not tell the difference.

It begins when he volunteers. In the stupor of combat the Marine may forget why he joined, who signed him up, even where he enlisted. But never, so long as he remains in uniform, is he permitted to forget that he volunteered — that he asked for it.

Even in the latter stages of World War II, when the Corps had to accept draftees, it made certain they were draftees who preferred the Corps to any other branch of service.


This gives the Marine a psychological edge. The man in the ranks always has a vague feeling that he is among people who want to be where they are, even when this is obviously untrue. And when he complains his noncoms can always joke back, "Well, Mac, you volunteered."

He hears this jeer roughly 17,239 times during his stay in boot camp, where the core of esprit de corps is formed. Boot camp is the Marine's basic training. It is given in two camps, Parris Island, S.C., and San Diego. San Diego is rarely mentioned.

Parris Island is discussed continually because it is by far the more unpleasant of the two, and the Marine likes to feel himself a much put-upon man. Parris Island is one of the most unpleasant places in the world.

It is a bleak, desolate, arid body of hot, flat sand and treacherous quicksand lying off Beaufort, S.C. It is inhabited by enormous sandflies, snarling drill instructors and sweltering fledgling Marines.

There the recruit, or "boot," is put through an infantry training program which differs from the Army's only in intensity and spirit. The aim of the program is to exhaust, humiliate and defeat every atom of civilian

individuality extant.

If, during a boot camp inspection his rifle is found too dirty, the boot can expect to see the drill instructor strip it, bury the parts in the sand, and order him to uncover them with his nose while everyone watches.

And if, while standing at attention, he succumbs to the horrible temptation to swat one of the great sandflies crawling over his face, he can almost count on being told to climb a near-by tree and throw down a dozen apples.

The difficulty here is that no apples grow on Parris Island's trees. When none are forthcoming, the drill instructor will cheerfully direct the rest of the boots to help their unfortunate comrade by pelting the tree, and of course him, with small stones.

For three months the volunteer is trained like an annoying animal, and from the first day of the treatment his drill instructors chant in his ear, with monotonous regularity, the creed of Marine Corps superiority.

The recruit is told that if he survives this inhumane treatment, he will be a member of the best fighting force in the world.

He is told — and the telling does not stop with the end of boot camp — that if for any reason he should fail in a mission, he will be letting down 175 years of the gaudiest tradition known to man.

This is where the Marine gets the heady gas which keeps him in operation under the most discouraging circumstances. If he fails, he tells himself — he remembers the relentless repetition of the Corps' creed, and he does not fail.

Such back-slapping would seem to produce a mass of extroverts, and this is indeed the case. The Marine Corps encourages the trend. Mirrors are placed prominently in Stateside barracks for men going on liberty who wish to admire and dandify themselves. The uniform is designed with an eye to splendor, and every legend of invincibility is carefully cultivated.

The delusions of the Marine Corps frequently astonish and infuriate men in other branches of the services. A private soldier in the United States Marines accepts as indisputable the proposition that he is the equal of a lieutenant in the Navy, a major in the Army, or a brigadier in the Air Force.

Rank has its privileges, and so the Marine is often obnoxious in public. It also has its responsibility

ties, and so he is dependable under fire.

It is romantic to believe that this rivalry with other branches of the services is always friendly. It is not. The Marine's attitude toward other outfits is often bitter, insulting and fantastically unrealistic — as the attitude of a fighter it has to be.

Legend has it that when the Panama Canal was opened, naval vessels lying offshore waiting to enter the new channel were charged to see two Marines in a dug-out whip in ahead of them — the first to pass the gates. Two wars have served only to strengthen this spirit.

During World War II a noncom returning to his company after hospitalization was grimly informed that the division was surrounded. "How come?" he asked. "Army artillery behind," he was told. "Doggie outfits on both flanks."

"What's up front?" he inquired.

"Oh," came the unconcerned answer. "Just Japs."

Again, after Tarawa had been secured, a company of Marines was left behind to patrol the island. The Army Air Corps was using the air field and every Saturday, the Marines found, an Air Corps general held a formal ceremony to decorate those who had distinguished themselves during the week.

The Marines had no decorations. They didn't even have khaki uniforms. But they did have esprit de corps.

One Saturday, as Air Corps personnel lined up on one side of the air strip, Marines fell out in parade formation on the other. They were wearing camouflaged underwear shorts, heavy shoes, pitch helmets — and nothing else.

As the Air Corps general went down his ranks, pinning Air Medals and Distinguished Flying Crosses, the Marine company commander went down his ranks, awarding each and every man a cellophane-wrapped cigar. The thing was done with a flourish. The First Sergeant held the cigar box. No one cracked a smile.

After the two ceremonies, the general stormed into the office of the naval officer commanding the island. He demanded that disciplinary action be taken. None was.

This outlook is the most obvious element in esprit de corps. Equally important is the glorification of the infantry and of combat.

In the Army, infantry men in the last war frequently found among them men who had been washed out of the Air Force or specialty schools. Standards there

were higher than were necessary for the G.I.

This was never the case in the Marine Corps. There, the infantry was the elite, and it was to be that the toughest and most alert men were riflemen. The feeling was that if a man was a cook or a truck driver, or a member of an Air Force ground crew, he had somehow failed to make the grade.

The feeling was not always justified, but it persisted and was an enormous psychological boost to the rifle battalions. It was augmented by the fact that noncombat personnel in combat units — doctors, medical corpsmen, chaplains — were supplied from naval ranks. Thus, every Marine in sight was a fighting man.

Moreover, to be a fighting man in the Marine Corps is in some respects desirable, since the veteran who survives is a privileged man. On Marine bases during the last war combat men were cocks of the walk, and youngsters, ogling them, were moved to admiration and envy.

The two factors in a Marine's attitude which are hardest to define are probably those most important to his esprit de corps. They are his basic conservatism and his eternal feeling that he is the victim of discrimination.

The Marine is not simply a conservative: he is a reactionary. In some walks of life so absolute a conservatism would be crippling, but in a fighting man it is invaluable, since he who is impervious to new ideas is unable to accept the proposition that he may be beaten.

Happily, this does not

cover new weapons. It does, however, cover everything else that is new. Changes in uniform, in parade formation, in standards, are received with hostility by the rank and file of the Corps.

When during World War II, women Marines were introduced, the innovation brought forth a roar of protest from the combat divisions, and in one company nearly precipitated a mutiny. It was almost as bad as if the company had been told its last battle was a snap.

For the Marine likes to feel, above all else, that his is a hard lot. He likes to believe that the Corps, and his outfit specifically, receives the nastiest assignments and is given the least adequate supplies with which to accomplish them.

This has a certain basis in fact. Traditionally, the Marine Corps is the first to fight, and so is handed some tough nuts to crack. At the same time, it is in the curious position of being a naval unit using army equipment.

Understandably, the Army equips its own outfits first, the Marine Corps last. That is probably why the pictures taken on Korea show men in the 5th Marines wearing the canvas leggings which the Army replaced with combat boots in the last years of World War II.

On this sort of thing the Marine thrives. As usual, he bitterly complains the doggies have everything, the Marine Corps nothing. With inadequate supplies, with understrength units, the Corps is asked to storm a beachhead bristling with guns. Oh, well. Situation

normal, he grumbles.

Throughout the Pacific campaigns Marines tortured themselves with the elaborate bees that infantrymen in Europe were enjoying the cream of European beauty while they were left to deal with hideous natives.

Pictures of the GI's being welcomed to Rome and Paris were carefully clipped from magazines and posted on company bulletin boards, where unprintable comments were written across them.

That this attitude has survived the post-war period is indicated (as follows):

When the Army announced, late in the war, that its infantrymen would be entitled to a \$10 a month hike in pay and the right to wear ribbons, Marine outfits, who received no raise and no badge, worked themselves into one of the great rages of the war.

And, unless three years of observation are wrong, Marines on Korea will be indignant to learn that newspapers have reported them to be armed with the latest and best equipment. "Call this new!" they will complain, pointing scornfully to a speck of rust.

Sometimes this outlook produces amazing statements. Ernie Pyle was staggered, in 1945, to find Marine riflemen apologizing to him because their casualties on the beach were low. Usually, they protested, they were very high.

Because a Marine expects his casualties to be high, because he cannot accept the idea of defeat, and because he considers himself an extraordinary fellow, he has the extremely high morale called esprit de corps.

He is, therefore, never astonished when he and those beside him accomplish the unbelievable.

One afternoon several years ago a Marine company was marching down an Asian road in a driving rain. It had been raining for three weeks, and everyone heartily wished it would stop.

Suddenly the bearded gunnery sergeant leading the formation stopped, glared up at the leaking sky, and shook his well-muscled fist angrily.

"You up there!" he belted. "Knock it off!"

No one was especially surprised when it stopped raining ten minutes later.

A special MC birthday

Editor's note: The following is one of many Marine "sea stories" in the book "Green Side Out" by Major H.G. Duncan, and Captain W.T. Moore Jr., both retired Marines. In 1969, in Vietnam, Capt. Moore wrote a letter to Maj. Duncan, describing a small but unique celebration of the Corps' 149th birthday in a secluded outpost near Danang.

"Our battalion had the responsibility for the four outposts in the southern rocket belt around Danang. These outposts were manned by a few Marines and each was normally commanded by a sergeant. On the tenth of November, I made it a point to go to each post. My planned visit was unannounced, so I know that the Marines were not expecting me. I went to the first outpost and found the young ser-

geant has planned a small ceremony marking the 194th birthday of our Corps. I saw his formation a good ways before I got to the hill, so I stopped my jeep and walked the rest of the way, not wanting to interrupt and being curious about what was happening. I got close enough that I heard the sergeant making a little speech to his assembled and dirty Marines.

"His speech was something like this: 'This ain't the fanciest Marine Corps Birthday I've ever had, but it'll do. Just being with you guys is fancy enough. I don't have the manual to read, and I don't have the commandant's message, so let me just say that today is another birthday in our Corps. If some of you haven't yet learned to love the Corps, you will. When you see guys like Connor and Seitz die doing what they did, you can't help

but feel a little something kinda, like love, all over for this green son of a (gun). That's what it's all about: remembering your dead and wounded and deciding to do a better job. You guys are the greatest. I'm proud to be one of you.' The sergeant then took a C-ration fruit cake and cut it with a K-bar, giving the first piece to the oldest Marine (age 38) and the second piece to the youngest (age 18).

"I slipped away from there without going on up. There was nothing, not a word, I could have added to the ceremony."

Landing Support Co: Brings the 'pure' comforts of home

Participation in a field exercise usually means leaving all of the comforts of home behind. But, during a recent Brigade Service Support Group-1 exercise at Bellows Air Force Station, Landing Support Company brought to the Marines there some of those comforts.

Marines of Landing Support Co. set up hot and cold showers and provided electricity for the BSSG-1 Marines working at Bellows to make life a little more comfortable for them.

"Along with providing direct support for the exercise, our Marines received individual combat training," said Maj. Daniel M. Dykstra, commanding officer, Landing Support Co. "We also organized a beach operations group and set up a simulated fuel farm."

What made this exercise unique for the Landing Support Marines however, was that they were responsible for providing their own perimeter security.

"This exercise allowed us to operate as if we were in a true MPF situation," said Dykstra. "In addition to doing our job, we also had to protect ourselves. That's a great experience for a Marine who might be used to just driving a tractor."

Another unique aspect of the exercise, Dykstra says, was Landing Support Com-

pany's ability to convert brackish stream water into crystal clear drinking water by means of a water purification unit.

The clean water process is accomplished by a 600 gallon per-hour reverse osmosis water purification unit. A pump pulls the dirty stream water through a hose that leads to the unit. The water then passes through three types of filters and is treated by four separate chemicals. As quickly as source water is pumped in, fresh water pours out.

The water purification unit draws its power from a mobile power generator and dumps the clean water into a 3000-gallon vat. Still, no Marine can drink the purified water until a Corpsman tests it to determine that it's fit for consumption.

In addition to brackish water, the purification unit can also purify salt water, and water that has been contaminated by nuclear, chemical or biological agents.

"The system is very easy to operate," said SSgt. Angel Perez, NCOIC of the water purification section. "Once the system gets going, our job is to ensure that chemical levels stay at a certain point."

Once operational, Landing Support Co's water section could support all of BSSG-1's potable water needs. This could represent a significant logistical advantage to a unit

operating in the field. As long as there is a source, whether it's an ocean, a stream or pond, the units' water wouldn't have to be brought in from another location.


