Secretary of Defense submits resignation

Navy News Service — Secretary of Defense Caspar Weinberger received the "Medal of Freedom" from President Ronald Reagan during a farewell ceremony in Washington, D.C. on Tuesday.

Weinberger submitted his resignation to the president Nov. 5. Weinberger's resignation will become effective when his nominated successor National Security Advisor Frank C. Carlucci is confirmed by the Senate.

President Reagan praised the departing Secretary of Defense in a White House Rose Garden ceremony the same day noting Weinberger's "courage, constancy, loyalty, together with uncommon brilliance, deci-

siveness, and determination." The President said Weinberger's qualities had contributed not only to the Defense Department but to other agencies during his entire tenure in government service.

Weinberger, 70, has served as Secretary of Defense for seven years. He is leaving his post to spend more time with his wife, who has been seriously ill. "I think it's time I do a bit more to fulfill those obligations," he told reporters at a press conference Nov. 5.

When asked to describe the "Weinberger Legacy," the secretary cited the renewal of military strength under President Reagan. "The other thing that I, frankly, am very

proud of is the beneficial effect that I think all of this has had on the men and women who do these very difficult, dangerous, disagreeable tasks for us, that keep us strong and free," he said.

"The happiest part of this job by far is going around and talking with them. The trip I made to the Gulf, just a couple of weeks ago, was a great inspiration because you just see people in the most difficult and unpleasant circumstances — 126 degrees down in the engine room — who are doing the job, but very proud to be there and very anxious to have the American people know what they're doing and know how proud they are."

Spouse's careers do not effect servicemembers' jobs

Navy News Services — A military spouse's decision to get a job, attend school or serve as a volunteer does not affect his/her active duty husband's or wife's promotion, or assignment opportunities, former Secretary of Defense Caspar Weinberger stressed in a memorandum to service secretaries, Oct. 22.

DoD commanders and supervisors are prohibited from interfering with a spouse's choice to work, attend school or volunteer on or off base. The spouse's decision cannot adversely affect the military member's

evaluation or be a consideration in assignments or promotion.

A recent Air Force investigation reveal that several Air Force supervisors at a mid-west base were pressuring spouses to give up their jobs to devote more time to volunteer activities. Weinberger praised the volunteer work military spouses perform, and said their services were welcomed and encouraged.

At the same time, increasing numbers of military spouses are seeking full or part-time employment," he said. "They contribute to the

financial well-being of their families, often gain a sense of accomplishment and forge links at their workplaces, whether they work in the government or the private sector. As such, they contribute directly to the morale and health of our military members."

It is DoD policy "that decisions to seek employment, to be homemakers, and to volunteer, belong to spouses. I am grateful for their energy, their talents, and their membership in the defense family," Weinberger said.

Take a breather: Great American Smokeout

AFIS — On Nov. 19, 1987, Americans on military installations across the United States and overseas will take part in the 11th annual Great American Smokeout.

Since the first effort in 1976, which was billed by the American Cancer Society as "an upbeat, good-natured effort to encourage smokers to give up cigarettes for 24 hours," the smokeout has attracted greater attention and more participants every year. Department of Defense health promotion officials have worked closely with the American Cancer Society to plan this year's smokeout, which promises to be no exception to the "bigger and better" rule.

Smokeout 1986 set an all-time record for participation. The 23.8 million smokers who tried to quit during the day-long event represented more than 43 percent of the nation's 54.5 million smokers.

This year's theme is "Take a Breather," and that's just what DoD hopes its smoking

members will do. The goal of the 1987 Great American Smokeout is to get at least one in every five smokers to give up cigarettes from midnight Wednesday to midnight Thursday, Nov. 19. The idea is for smokers to prove to themselves they can abstain for 24 hours.

In March of 1986, Secretary of Defense Caspar Weinberger issued a health promotion directive on smoking and other health risk behaviors. It focused in large part on smoking prevention and cessation programs.

As a result of this directive, all branches of the military have been actively planning new smoking control initiatives for military personnel, retirees, their families and civilian employees.

The American Cancer Society has offered training to military and DoD civilian personnel as "Fresh Start" facilitators to conduct ongoing smoking cessation clinics at military installations in the United States and overseas.

According to the 1985

worldwide DoD survey on cigarette use in the armed forces, smoking in all services at all paygrades averaged 46 percent. Although the 1986 figures for all services are incomplete, the trend is encouraging. Smokers in the Air Force in 1986 were down to 31 percent (from 39 percent in 1985). The Army dropped to 41 percent, compared to 52 percent the year before.

In 1985, 54 percent of Navy personnel and 43 percent of Marine Corps personnel smoked. When released, the 1986 figures are expected to be lower.

Although DoD is doing what it can to discourage non-smokers from starting and to support smokers' efforts to quit, cigarettes are still sold in military commissaries at prices 26 to 42 percent lower than civilian store prices because they are not subject to state and local excise taxes. However, as of October 1987, overseas commissaries will no longer sell tobacco products to anyone under 18.

New policy for family members traveling on space 'A' flights

Camp H.M. Smith — The family member space available restriction on mainland segments of international flights has been removed by a new policy change according to a Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense memorandum.

The change, effective immediately, affects individuals otherwise eligible for space available transportation

under the provisions of DoD regulations. The policy change eliminates a problem for many space available passengers traveling on DoD-owned or controlled aircraft. The new policy provides point-to-point international air transportation when there is no change of aircraft or mission number involved.

Family members will be

allowed to travel on aircraft to and from an overseas location when a mainland enroute stop is involved, such as a flight operating from Hickam AFB, Hawaii, to Offutt AFB, Nebraska, with an enroute stop in California or another mainland location.

Navy Commendation Awarded

According to his commendation, on Sept. 5, 1986, Kiernan, then assigned to Marine Helicopter Squadron 1 in Quantico, saw a van spewing smoke and flames from its gas tank.

Running towards the van and signalling to the woman who was unaware of the danger, Kiernan convinced her to stop the vehicle. Upon reaching the vehicle, which had flames spreading on it, Kiernan opened the back door of the van and shouted a warning to the driver.

He then pulled the woman's two children from the van and carried them to safety. Within moments the van became engulfed in flames, the citation stated.

Kiernan is currently deployed to MCAS Yuma with his squadron.

Facilities Dept. electricians receive award from DoD

High-priced items bought by the military have been the focus to severe criticism by politicians and the media over recent years. Barely sharing the limelight, however, has been the great strides taken by individuals who are identifying and solving instances of waste, fraud and abuse.

The employees from the Facilities Department electric shop here recently shared a \$1,150 award for analyzing and resolving a deficiency within an electric converter.

The converter, a power source for radars, needed a new voltage relay. Vernon Nakasone, Leo Demello and

Mel Horimoto, Facilities Department electricians, realized that it would cost \$2,000 per relay to have it specially-manufactured, and that normally manufactured relays had a poor durability record.

By researching various manuals and catalogs, the three found and adapted a similar relay which cost only \$125, — \$1,875 cheaper than what had been purchased in the past.

"We searched through dozens of manuals," said Leo Demello. "We finally came to the conclusion that we could save a lot of money by modifying a different relay. We

also think the \$125 relay will have a longer life span."

After locating the relays, the electricians decided to submit their idea in writing to the DoD Beneficial Suggestions Program. First, after review, the program administrator here forwarded the idea to the Station's Facilities Department for evaluation. The idea was readily accepted, the new relays were purchased and installed, and the three electricians shared an initial \$900 award for estimated savings generated here.

The suggestion was then forwarded to HQMC for further evaluation. After addi-

tion testing confirmed the value of the new relay, HQMC approved an additional \$250 award based on newly-identified savings. According to Debra Edmond, employee relations specialist at the Civilian Personnel Office here — HQMC has notified all Marine Corps installations of the Kaneohe Bay achievement, and has required that the relay be incorporated Marine Corps-wide.

For their innovation, the three electricians are also now eligible for additional awards based on first-year savings at other Marine Corps installations.

Legally Speaking

U.S. Customs: Know the rules

The purpose of this article is to briefly familiarize the reader with basic customs regulations and prohibited and restricted importations into the United States. Perhaps the most sage advice on customs matters is to check out the applicable rule or limitation before finding yourself subject to a penalty or confiscation of goods upon reentry into the United States.

The U.S. Customs Service is tasked with clearing goods entering the United States from abroad. The status of the person carrying or sponsoring the merchandise is a relevant consideration as different exemptions apply to U.S. residents and nonresidents.

Military and civilian personnel stationed overseas and returning to the United States for temporary duty, voluntary leave, or short visits before completion of their full overseas tour of

duty may claim customs status as either returning U.S. residents or nonresidents.

Different exemptions from payment of customs duties and taxes apply to residents and nonresidents. If an individual elects the "nonresident" exemptions, he or she may not simultaneously reap the benefits of the "resident" exemptions. (Residents of foreign countries married to U.S. service personnel as well as children born abroad are considered nonresidents upon entering the United States for the first time.) To claim these exemptions, the goods or merchandise must accompany the returning person or persons. Examples of the difference in exemptions for a resident and nonresident can be highlighted as follows:

Residents

Four hundred dollars Resident's Exemption exists for articles acquired abroad for one's own use (value of items is based upon the aggregate

fair retail value of the goods in the country of acquisition, except American Samoa, Guam, and the Virgin Islands which are governed by a different limitation).

Resident's Exemption exists for not more than 200 cigarettes, 100 cigars, and one liter of alcohol per person over 21 years old.

To claim above exemptions, a resident must have remained beyond the territorial limits of the U.S. for not less than 48 hours (except Mexico) and entitlement must not have been used within 30 days immediately preceding latest arrival.

Nonresidents

One hundred dollars Nonresident's Exemption exists for articles intended for use as bona fide gifts for others. Articles must accompany you and exemption must not have been applied within previous six months. This gift exemption may include up to 100 cigars.

Nonresident's Exemption

exists for 50 cigars or 200 cigarettes or 2 kilograms of smoking (pipe) tobacco, or proportionate amounts of each.

Nonresident's Exemption exists for not more than one liter of alcohol for personal consumption.

At the conclusion of your visit to the U.S., whatever remains of the above nonresident articles, except gifts and items consumed during your stay, must be exported upon your departure.

Any articles imported beyond the exemptions will be subject to customs duty and possibly internal revenue taxes unless same are entitled to free entry. Goods purchased in duty-free shops abroad are not immune from import duties in the U.S. but may be included in one's personal exemption.

Finally, liquor is a special entry item in that it is subject to the laws of the state in which entered. Customs officials are bound to apply state

restrictions where applicable.

U.S. Government military and civilian personnel returning from an extended overseas duty assignment (must be at least 140 days' duration), are entitled to enter their personal and household effects without payment of duties and taxes. The extended duty exemption also applies to naval personnel serving aboard a U.S. naval vessel or supporting naval vessel when the vessel departs the U.S. for an intended deployment of 120 days or more, provided such personnel continue to serve onboard the ship until its return to the U.S.

The importation of numerous items and substances into the U.S. is prohibited or restricted to preserve and protect community health and domestic plant and animal life. Among some of the more common items prohibited are narcotics and dangerous drugs, written materi-

als advocating the overthrow of the government, poisonous substances, and switchblade knives.

Prohibited merchandise is subject to seizure. Foreign-produced items bearing an American trademark, e.g., clothing, jewelry, etc., are carefully limited as to the quantity which a person is permitted to enter. Generally such items are only admitted when intended for one's personal use and not for resale.

A special system of importation governs the admission of products from developing nations. This program is referred to as the Generalized System of Preferences (GSP) and is used by many developed countries to help improve the export trade of beneficiary countries. Over 140 countries have been designated as beneficiaries and approximately 2,800 items are eligible for duty-free entry into the U.S. under GSP.

Editor's Note: The following are actual incidents which occurred on the Air Station this week. The Military Police Department here is bringing significant cases to your attention to prevent these types of incidents happening to you or your family. To report a crime, or if you notice suspicious activity on the Air Station, please call the Military Police Department's 24-hour Crime Stopper number — 257-2123.

The failure to register your car with the Military Police Department may result in the

loss of your driving privileges for 90 days. Last week there were six incidents of failure to register a vehicle.

It is more than a common occurrence that people buy cars that are previously owned by military members and use the DoD decal already on the car to gain access to the Air Station. This constitutes fraudulent use of a government decal and results in a 90 day suspension of the new owners driving privileges.

Vehicles may be registered on the Air Station at the Pass and Registration Office, H-3

gate, between 5 a.m. and 11 p.m. on any day of the week.

- Two lance corporals were apprehended at the Enlisted Club after club security reported that they were fighting in the men's room.

- A gunnery sergeant and his wife were reported to be fighting in the parking lot of the Staff NCO Club. The gunnery sergeant and his family have had numerous problems in the past and will be receiving a final warning letter.

- A lance corporal who had been drinking cut another lance corporal and a private with a knife while

they were in a barracks room. The lance corporal who was cut received four stitches to his left wrist. The private was only scratched.

The lance corporal with the knife was apprehended and became very combative while being transported to the Military Police Department. The military police had to restrain the lance corporal, who then fell unconscious due to his intoxication.

He was later transported to Tripler Army Medical Center where he was admitted for an Anabuse reaction and further observations.

- A staff sergeant was reported to have slapped his

wife across the face while they were having a marital dispute, after which the staff sergeant struck a door several times to vent his anger. The wife refused any medical treatment, but the staff sergeant was treated for a swollen hand and received a splint for two of his fingers. A mandatory counseling letter has been sent through his chain of command.

- A corporal and a lance corporal were transported to Pearl Harbor Medical Clinic after they were hit by a chair at the Enlisted Club. The lance corporal had reportedly bitten another lance corporal on the ear earlier that eve-

ning. The bitten lance corporal left the Enlisted Club but returned after about 30 minutes and hit the lance corporal in the head with a chair. The corporal was sitting next to the lance corporal who got struck and was apparently hit by mistake.

The injured lance corporal was transported to Tripler Army Medical Center where they treated his ear. The Criminal Investigation Division is conducting further investigations.

- A gunnery sergeant has lost his daughter to the Child Protective Service Intake Unit after it was reported that he had abused her. An anonymous caller told the military police that the gunnery sergeant was abusing his daughter and the MP's responded.

The gunnery sergeant is suspected of striking his daughter's buttock and head with a wooden rod. As a result of the blows, the daughter suffered a ruptured eardrum and multiple contusions.

- Another gunnery sergeant was suspected of child abuse when an anonymous caller reported that the gunnery sergeant threatened to kill his son. The military police transported the gunnery sergeant and his children to the Branch Medical Clinic where a doctor confirmed that there were no signs of abuse.

The gunnery sergeant was released to his unit representative and his command was notified that he was suspected of child abuse, but there was no evidence of it when his children were medically examined.

- A corporal's wife was the victim of an assault by her

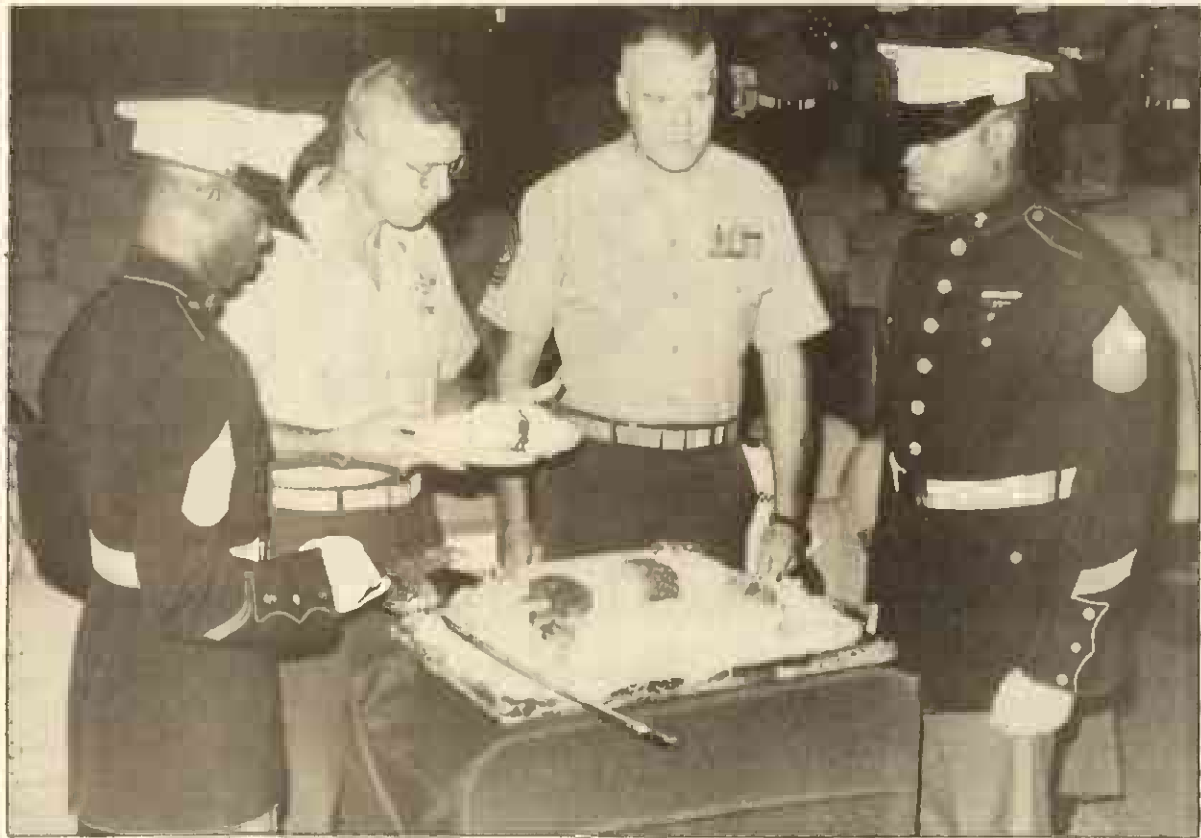
"A great deal of signifi-

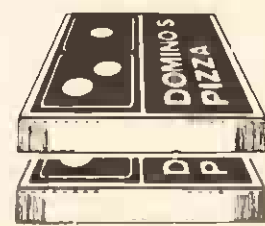

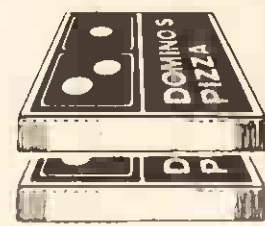

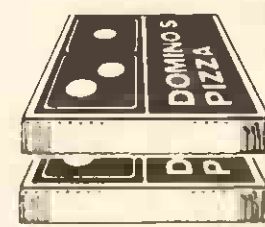

Smoking restrictions benefit everyone

"It's smart to smoke" was a popular advertising slogan that sold a lot of cigarettes in the 1950's. However, in an attempt to show that smoking might not be that "smart," the government banned cigarette advertising on radio and television some years later. Also, print and billboard ads were required to include a health warning from the Surgeon General.

According to a Department of Defense survey on cigarette use in the Armed Forces, 43 percent of Marines smoke. In paygrades E7-E9, 49 percent of these Marines, on average, are smokers.

Throughout the nation today, American Cancer Society's Great American Smokeout is being conducted to help lower those figures by educating people on the hazards of smoking.

The health hazards of smoking, according to the Surgeon General, also extend to non-smokers. Recent findings show that passive, or second-hand, smoke poses a significant health threat to non-smokers. Due to those findings, military personnel and government employees

here and at Camp Smith became subject to recent orders that cutback places where smokers can light up.

Air Station Order 6200.2A and Battalion/Camp Order 5103.1 prohibited smoking in all common workspaces unless adequate ventilation exists to provide workers with fresh air.

The orders also prohibit smoking in theaters, auditoriums, child care and youth activity centers, conference and counseling rooms, libraries, and eating facilities. Corridors, stairwells, restrooms and lobbies are also no smoking areas.

The only areas where smoking is permitted is in private offices, designated smoking areas, and outdoors, unless the area is off-limits due to fire or explosive hazard.

Since the order was published, it has received mixed reaction aboard the Air Station.

"It's a major inconvenience for me," said Sgt. Oscar Simmons, aviation budget chief, 1st MAB Comptroller's office. "I spend more

time away from my desk, and I'm usually in the middle of a project when I need to go outside to have a cigarette."

Most Marines and sailors say, however, that the benefits of the order outweigh the inconveniences.

"I can now smoke without the complaints of non-smokers," said Cpl. Kevin Newman, an accounting clerk, also with the Brigade's Comptroller's office. "It also gave me an opportunity to get away from my desk for a few minutes."

"Going outside to have a cigarette doesn't interfere with my job at all," said Michele Tait, an equal employment office assistant.

"I decided to quit smoking since the order came out," said Cpl. Richard Wadsworth, a pay clerk at Disbursing. "In addition to feeling better and saving money on cigarettes, I get more work done. I no longer have the 'need' to leave my desk to have a cigarette."

With recent orders, the rights of smokers are preserved and the threat that passive smoke poses to non-smokers is reduced.

husband. The corporal banged her head against a wall in their quarters and stabbed her in the hand with a steak knife.

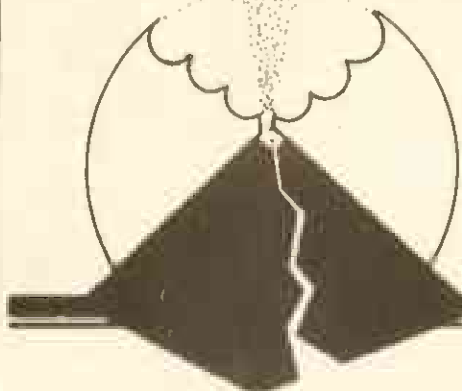

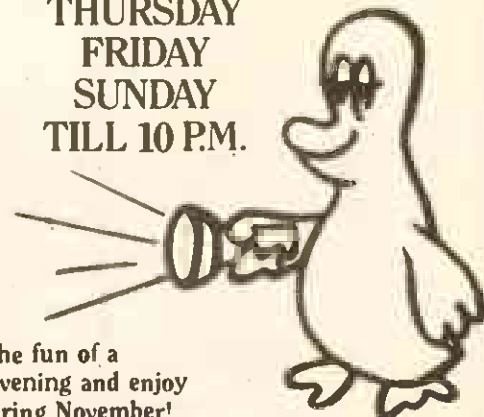

Dec. 7 observance activities scheduled at Arizona Memorial

December 7, 1987, marks the 46th anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor. In remembrance of that "Day of Infamy," and in addition to the normally scheduled movies and trips to the Memorial, the National Park Service is planning special visitor activities for Dec. 5, 6 and 7. Activities will take place at the USS Arizona Memorial Visitor Center.

The Visitor Center is located off Kamehameha Highway on the Pearl Harbor Naval Base just south of Aloha Stadium. These special activities will provide visitors to the Memorial an expanded historical perspective of the events surrounding the attack on Pearl Harbor.

A remembrance ceremony on Dec. 7 will begin at 7:40 a.m. Senator Daniel Inouye, a former member of the highly decorated Japanese-American 442nd Battalion who fought during World War II will present the Keynote address. Walter Lord, a noted author, will also be speaking at the ceremony about "the last minute of peace." The ceremony is by invitation only due to the memorial's capacity.

Activities will begin at 1 p.m. on Dec. 5, the Royal Hawaiian Band will set the mood by presenting a concert performance featuring music from the 40's.

On Dec. 6 and 7 visitors will be able to attend a variety of activities including:

- A historian panel will discuss various aspects of the attack. Participants include: Stan Cohen, Author (East Wind Rain); James Dator, Professor, University of Hawaii; Yasumasa Kuroda, Professor, University of Hawaii; Walter Lord, Author (Day of Infamy, Night to Remember, Titanic); Michael Slackman, Author (Remembering Pearl Harbor); Ronald

Spector, Author (Eagle Against the Sun).

- Showing of the film TORA! TORA! TORA! Film begins at 7 p.m. and is free of charge. (150 seats per night distributed on a first-come, first-served basis.)

- Presentations by Park Rangers and Pearl Harbor Survivors which describe the events that occurred before, during, and after the Dec. 7 attack.

- Special exhibits, displays, and artifacts from other museums and organizations on Oahu to help explain the events surrounding Dec. 7, 1941.

- "Living History" programs, using period uniforms and equipment, on what life was like for enlisted men during that period.

- Videotape programs which include the 1985 underwater survey of the USS Arizona, interviews with survivors of the attack, historical footage of the attack, and Return to Iwo Jima which covers the 1985 reunion of Japanese and American veterans of that attack.

- A presentation by Alfred Preis, the Memorial's architect, on the design and meaning of the Memorial as he envisioned it over 25 years ago.

- A Honolulu Department fire truck which was called to fight fires at Hickam Air Field the morning of Dec. 7, 1941.

- A concert performed by the U.S. Navy Pacific Fleet Band which includes selections from the "Big Band" era.

Chess player puts goal in 'check'

Sergeant Abraham Mina, a squad leader with Weapons Co., 1/3, likes to think of himself as something of a perfectionist. He constantly strives to better himself and the things he does. Because of this strict attitude toward himself, he has become the top chess player in the Marine Corps after competing in the Armed Forces Chess Tournament in Washington, D.C. in September.

The soft-spoken, 23-year-old has been playing chess for about 10 years now. He became interested in chess when a junior high school teacher, who was also the school's chess coach, challenged him to a game. The young Filipino lost but refused to give up, and later challenged his teacher to a rematch. His determination and patience paid off when he defeated his teacher a month later.

"I just play one move at a time . . . the best move."

A Marine for five years, Mina continued to play chess throughout high school and became proficient enough to coach two elementary school teams on chess. Mina believes that chess helps kids improve personal characteristics and challenges their minds.

"The game can improve personal characteristics such as discipline, attention span, self-control, and patience," said Mina. "Kids attention spans can be very short, especially when their minds aren't being challenged. Chess challenges them and helps them focus their energy to the task they are performing."

Mina started competing in military chess tournaments in 1983 when he joined a military chess team while stationed with Weapons Co., 1/5, at Camp Pendleton. Since then, he has played at various military installations in southern California. Here on the Air Station, he continues to compete against other military personnel.

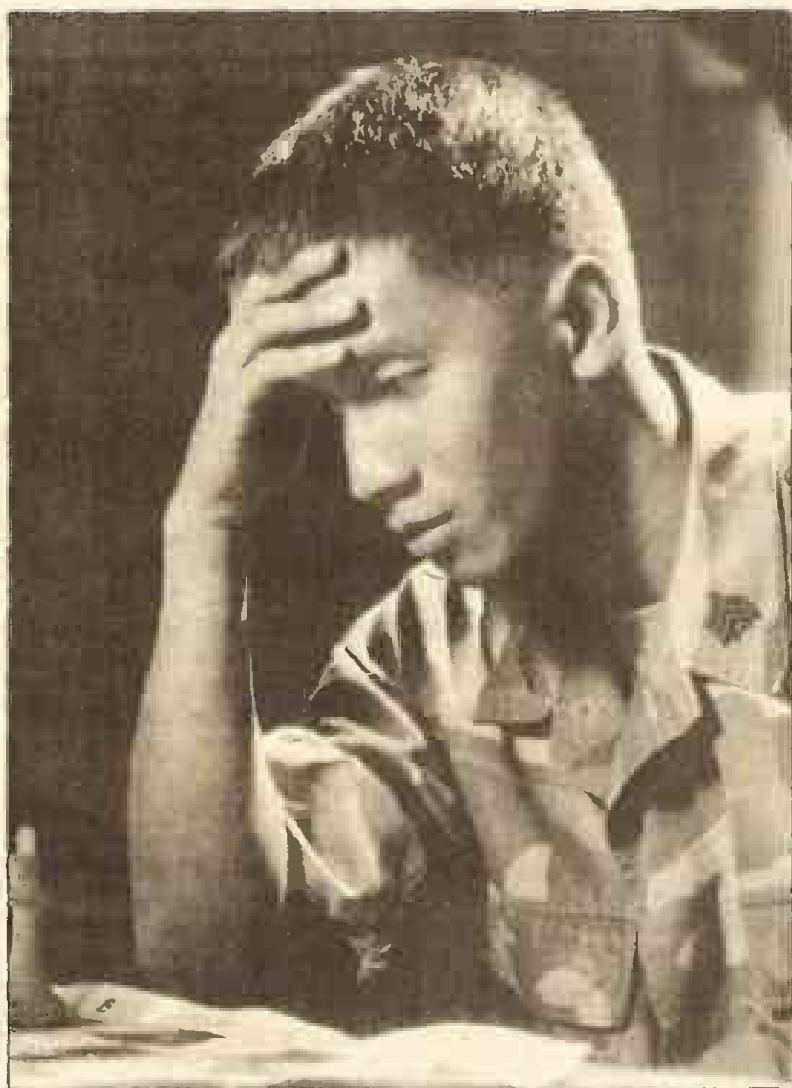
Because of his playing ability, Mina was selected to participate in the annual Sea Services Chess Program in Little Creek, Va. The Sea Services program combines the six best Marine Corps and Navy chess players to play as a team in the Armed Forces Chess Championship. The top two competitors from each of the military teams go on to the U.S. Armed Forces Chess Team for world competition.

When he arrived in Little Creek, Mina had to compete against three Marines and eight sailors to fill one of the six openings on the Sea Services team. "When I went to compete in Little Creek, I had no idea how strong the other players would be. I was surprised I made the team on the first try. Three of the people I competed against were on last year's team and it felt good when I beat them."

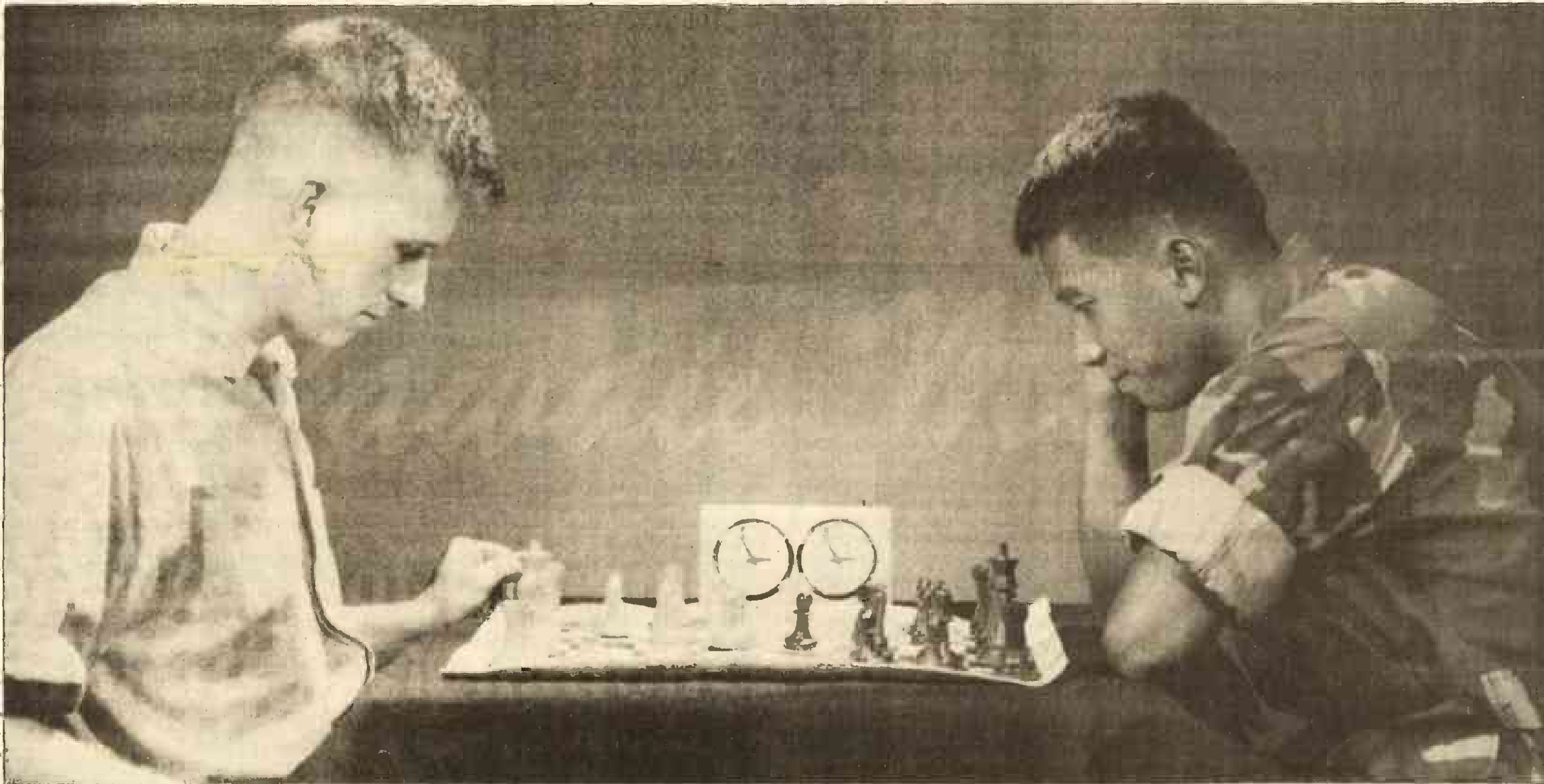
Mina made the Sea Services team, and went on to the Armed Forces competition at Bolling Air Force Base, Washington, D.C. After stiff competition, he became the number one chess player in the Marine Corps, and tied for second place in the Navy. In a playoff match against Petty Officer Joseph F. Longen, Mina missed his chance to become part of the U.S. Armed Forces team. "I was disappointed when I didn't make it to the U.S. Armed Forces team, but with some more work I'll make it next time," said the Salinas, Calif. resident.

Mina's next goal is to make the "Masters" or professional rating in chess, which he says may require one more year of intense playing and studying for him. Part of that training includes playing chess with interested players for six hours on Saturdays at Waikiki Beach and spending at least one hour a night studying books on chess moves.

His philosophy for winning is simple. "When playing, your ideas need to be clearer and better than your opponents. Some players try to think two or three moves ahead. I don't, I just play one move at a time . . . the best move. I try not to make too many mistakes and try to make even fewer than my opponent."
