## Carlucci assumes SecDef post

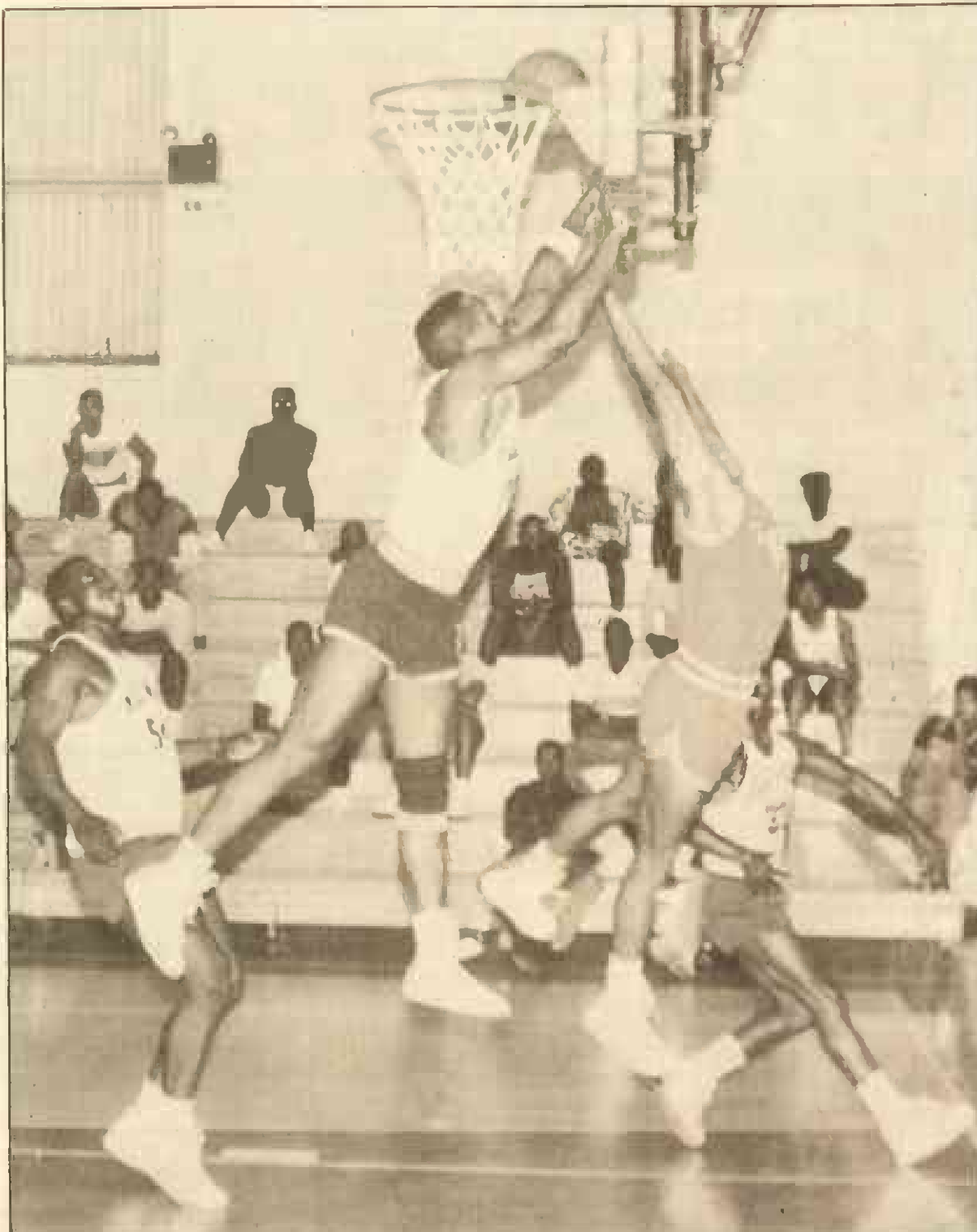
Frank C. Carlucci won confirmation as Secretary of Defense by a full Senate vote Nov. 20. The 57-year-old Scranton, Pa., native succeeds Caspar Weinberger.

A 1952 graduate of Princeton University, Carlucci served as the Deputy Secretary of Defense from Feb. 1981 to Dec. 1982. Carlucci was appointed as the assistant to President Reagan for National Security Affairs in Jan. 1987.

Some of Carlucci's previous titles include Director of the Office of Economic Opportunity from 1971-73 and Under Secretary of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare from 1973-75. Prior to being named Deputy Director of the Central Intelligence Agency in Feb. 1978, Carlucci was the U.S. Ambassador to Portugal for three years.

Some of Carlucci's awards and honors include the Distinguished Intelligence Medal, National Intelligence Distinguished Service Medal, State Department Superior Service Award and several Honorary College Degrees.

On Nov. 17, the President visited the Pentagon to participate in an all-service tribute to Weinberger. Weinberger was honored by each of the Armed Services, which presented him with their highest civilian awards. The hour-long ceremony featured bands, ceremonial guards, the Navy Sea Chanters, and closed with a tri-service flyover.

## Quantico expands warfighting role

During his nomination hearings for the post of Commandant of the Marine Corps, Gen. A.M. Gray stated that as one of his important goals as CMC, he wanted to increase the Corps' efficiency by expanding the role of the Marine Corps Development and Education Center (MCDEC) at Quantico, Va.

Within four months after his confirmation, the new commandant approved a plan to reorganize the Center, which he hopes will standardize doctrine and training throughout the Marine Corps. The Center will ensure that Marines "are the best trained, best led, best disciplined, and best equipped fighting force possible," Gen. Gray said.

On Nov. 10, as the Corps celebrated its 212th birthday, MCDEC was redesignated Marine Corps Combat Development Command (MCCDC).

By combining several elements from Headquarters Marine Corps, the newly reorganized command in Quantico has the mission of developing, assessing and disseminating operational concepts, plans and doctrines, and developing programs for the training of all Marines, units and schools.

The five centers established at MCCDC will be responsible for air, ground, logistics and intelligence, warfighting, training and education, wargaming and assessment, and information technology.

The Information Center will provide threat analysis and intelligence awareness to MCCDC and support.

The Warfighting Center will be the proponent for the Marine Air Ground Task Force (MAGTF). The Center will develop, assess, and teach concepts, plans and doctrines in support of MAGTFs.

The Training and Education Center will develop programs for the Marine Corps Schools Command, and for the training and education of all regular and reserve Marine Corps personnel and units.

The Wargaming and Assessment Center will act as a focal point for all matters pertaining to manual and automated wargaming. The Center will provide support for simulation, modeling, and assessment for MCCDC, operating forces, reserve and supporting establishment, and Headquarters Marine Corps.

The Information Technology Center will provide information resources management (IRM) support to MCCDC in development of doctrine, training, MAGTF structure, and material involved with MAGTF deployment and employment.

Marine Corps Base, Quantico, will consolidate the function of administration, legal, logistics, civilian personnel management, and facilities for all of MCCDC.

"The time spent on the development of MCCDC is time well-spent and represents an investment in our Corps' future," said the Commandant. "The dividends reaped from this reorganization effort will be beneficial to all Marines, now and in the future. It is yet another step we are undertaking to ensure success on the battlefield."

## Chaplain Corps celebrate 212th anniversary

When the ships of the Continental Navy sailed for battle with the Royal Navy in the American colonies' war against Great Britain, they carried among their crews one man, a chaplain, who was responsible for, among other things, keeping the word of God close to the hearts of his fellow crewmen.

In many cases these Chaplains weren't always ordained ministers. Sometimes they were just ordinary seamen who felt "called upon" by a higher power to assume the duties.

Their duties were outlined in the Navy Regulations and adopted by the Continental Congress on Nov. 28, 1775. That date is now celebrated as the anniversary of the

U.S. Navy Chaplain Corps.

The word chaplain comes from the French word "chape," meaning a short cloak. According to legend, Saint Martin of Tours, entering the city of Amiens, France, on a cold winter day saw a beggar freezing at the gate. Saint Martin then split his cloak down the middle and gave half to the beggar. That night he saw a vision of Christ in a dream wearing the cloak.

That cloak was preserved as a holy relic and later became the sacred banner of French kings. The officer charged with carrying the banner into battle became known as the chaplain, or cloak bearer. As time wore on, the responsibility for the cloak fell to priests rather than field officers.

Chaplains soon became an

integral part of the military forces of most nations.

In the British and American navies, they were charged with the instruction of midshipmen and the moral guidance of the ship's company.

The first chaplain to serve with the Continental Navy was the Reverend Edward Brooks, a Congregational minister, who reported for duty aboard the USS Hancock in the spring of 1777. Brooks was captured by the British in May, 1777, but was later exchanged for a British chaplain.

Chaplains again answered the call to duty when the U.S. Navy was formed. William Austin, a sailor aboard the USS Constitution, performed the duties of a chaplain without a commission, although

there is some doubt as to whether he was ever ordained.

The first man commissioned as a chaplain in the new navy was the Reverend William Batch who received his commission on Oct. 30, 1799.

In addition to performing ministerial functions, which included reading prayers,

performing funeral ceremonies and providing sermons on Sundays, chaplains were also required to serve as teachers.

The modern Chaplain Corps is comprised of members of the clergy of the various faith groups represented in the U.S. Commissioning requirements for

Chaplain Corps candidates include at least three years of graduate study leading to a Masters of Divinity degree, or an equivalent theological degree.

Currently, 12 chaplains serve aboard the Air Station; three serve the Air Station's needs, while the others minister to the 1st MAB.

### Chief of Chaplains visits Air Station

Rear Admiral John McNamara, the Navy's Chief of Chaplains, arrived here Friday, Nov. 20, for a three-day visit which coincided with the 212th anniversary of the Chaplain Corps. During the admiral's visit, he paid a courtesy call on 1st MAB Commanding General, BGen. G.L. Cates on Saturday, and attended an anniversary celebration along with the island's active-duty, reserve and retired Navy chaplains, at the Officers Club. RAdm. McNamara was also the guest speaker for Sunday's Roman Catholic Mass, and Protestant Worship Service at the Air Station Chapel.

# An ancient, international harvest ritual

AFIS - This Thanksgiving, as you sit down to a table laden with turkey and all the trimmings, you'll be sharing in one of the world's oldest traditions - the harvest festival.

Many Americans think of Thanksgiving, the day of thanks first celebrated by the Pilgrims at Plymouth Rock, as a uniquely American holiday. Yet America's Thanksgiving is similar to ancient as well as modern-day festivals celebrated around the world in gratitude for a good

growing season.

The ancient Greeks celebrated a nine-day harvest festival in honor of Demeter, their goddess of agriculture. So important was this observance that armies would stop fighting to share in the celebration.

In similar fashion, the Romans paid tribute to Ceres.

Since biblical days, the Jews have celebrated the week-long Feast of Tabernacles, or Sukkot, in the fall to mark the end of the farming season. This festival, still celebrated today, is a time of

feasting, partying and thanksgiving. Another Hebrew harvest festival, Shavuot, the Feast of Weeks, is celebrated in the spring.

During the Middle Ages, the Anglo-Saxons celebrated the feast of Harvest Home when the last grain was loaded for storage. People from the village went into the fields to decorate the load with ribbons and flowers, dancing around it and singing songs of thanks. The celebration continued long after the last grain was stored away.

In nearby Scotland, the

harvest celebration was known as "kirk" and included special church services and a hearty feast.

The Aztecs of Mexico observed their corn harvest with more ceremony than festivity. Each year, a young girl was beheaded in honor of Xilonen, the goddess of the new corn. The Pawnee Indians had a similar ritual. The Cherokees of the American Southwest, in contrast, observed the corn harvest with the festive green corn dance.

Even with the industrialization of the Western world,

harvest time continues as a cause for celebration and thanksgiving.

Germany's popular celebration of the barley and hops harvest, Oktoberfest, is known worldwide for its abundance of beer, food, singing and dancing. Although literally called the "October festival," the Oktoberfest is usually held in late September when the first new beer of the season comes of age. The celebration, once confined to the city of Munich, has spread throughout Germany.

Many European harvest

festivals take place on Nov. 11 in honor of St. Martin of Tours, Martinmas, patron saint of beggars. During medieval times, the wealthier people of Germany, France, Holland, England and the countries of central Europe offered a share of their harvest to the poor in honor of St. Martin.

Today, St. Martin's Day is a cross between Thanksgiving and Halloween. Roast goose is traditionally served at the day's feasts. In some European towns, children dress as beggars and go door

# Philippines: A U.S. ally in turmoil

The United States has been a long-time ally and friend of the Republic of the Philippines, but the Philippines is a country in turmoil.

Because of the country's troubles, which have been recently marked with terrorist attacks against U.S. military personnel stationed there, it is important that Marines and sailors here understand the current Philippine situation.

In 1947, the U.S. and the Philippines signed the Military Bases Agreement that allows the U.S. to maintain Clark Air Base, Subic Naval Complex, Cubi Point Naval Air Station and the Naval Magazine at Camayan Point in that country. While this agreement does not expire until 1991, the Philippine government is scheduled to review the agreement next year.

The fundamental reason that the U.S. maintains its bases in the Philippines is

because of the bases' strategic location. Subic has important natural assets, including a large well-protected harbor. The harbor can dry-dock most major ships, except aircraft carriers. Cubi Point is an important naval aviation support facility in the Western Pacific, and Subic houses a large number of the Seventh Fleet's prepositioned wartime oil reserves.

The presence of U.S. forces in the Philippines may be an important "deterrent" to the Soviet Union, which established a permanent naval position in Cam Ranh Bay, 1,300 kilometers west of Subic Bay. The USSR has more than 15 warships, including submarines, in the bay.

Currently, some 13,000 U.S. personnel are stationed in the Philippines. This number does not include personnel from the U.S. Seventh Fleet offshore. Another 20,000 military dependents also reside in the nation.

There is some resentment by some Philippine nationals against the U.S. presence there. Communist guerrillas have exploited the resentment and, within the past month, Americans have become targets of assassinations. The New Peoples Army (NPA), the military arm of the outlawed Communist Party of the Philippines (CPP), has claimed responsibility for the attacks (see story below).

The most recent attack against U.S. personnel occurred on Oct. 28, when assassins gunned down two U.S. airmen and one retired airman in separate ambushes in Angeles City, outside Clark Air Base. The attacks, according to the *Washington Times*, could have been staged by the NPA in retaliation for the U.S. Air Force's decision to use its helicopters to evacuate Philippine policemen wounded in a firefight with communist guerrillas.

On Nov. 19, police charged 19 people with the murder of those three Americans, according to the *Honolulu Star-Bulletin*.

Within days after the Oct. 28 attack, five gunmen entered a residential area and disarmed private security guards where Americans live near Clark Air Base.

As a result of these incidents and to protect U.S. personnel and their families, joint patrols currently are being conducted by the U.S. military and the local police within a five-mile radius outside Clark Air Base. Philippine Foreign Secretary Raul Manglapus said the new attacks on U.S. personnel, "indicates more weakness than strength" on the part of the Philippine communists. In a news conference, Manglapus said that the decision to "make victims out of the Americans" marked a "new twist" in the offensive strategy of the NPA.



Republic of the Philippines

## Terrorism threatens American lives as communists wage war in Philippines

Behind many recent acts of terrorism against U.S. personnel in the Philippines is the military arm of the Communist Party of Philippines — the New Peoples Army (NPA).

Founded in 1969, the NPA is comprised of insurgents whose goal is to overthrow the Philippine's democratic government and replace it with a "peoples democracy modeled on the works of Mao Tse-Tung," according to William Chapman, former Asian correspondent for the *Washington Post*.

For 18 years, the NPA,

operating underground, has claimed scores of victims, many of them policemen, soldiers and informants. Numerous members of the media have also been targets of the NPA. This year alone, more than 50 policemen have been gunned down by NPA guerrillas.

The insurgents get most of their support, and recruits from students of Manila's urban universities, who are looking for a cause. Nearly 20,000 of these young students are formed in "guerrilla fronts" all over the Philippines, and have gained influence in at least one-fifth of Philippine's villages.

"Hit and run" attacks and assassinations is the NPA style. Normally, the NPA conducts assassinations with "sparrow units" of two or three guerrillas who are trained to strike in urban areas, particularly in Manila. In the July issue of *Asia-Week*, it was reported that the sparrow attacks follow the same pattern: three assassins, which may include one woman, will suddenly appear in a crowd and open fire on their victim. The trio will then confiscate their victim's weapons and speed away by car or pedicab — all the while, the assassins are unmindful of onlookers.

Their victims are those whom the NPA feels have exploited or abused them.

The NPA looks at the U.S. military personnel stationed in the Philippines as "affronts" to the Philippine sovereignty. United Press International reported Nov. 10, that the guerrillas have vowed to "undertake assassination missions, sabotage and other tactical offensives unless U.S. troops stop security operations outside Clark Air Base and other military bases" in their country.

NPA units have been very careful in avoiding getting caught. Groups of NPA guer-

to door carrying lighted lanterns and "begging" for fruit, cake and candy.

The people of Japan celebrate rice harvests at regional festivals held throughout the fall. The Skukaku-sai festivals feature parades, floats, campfires and lanterns.

Like the Japanese Skukaku-sai festivals, many harvest celebrations are observed on a regional, rather than national, basis.

One example is the English Mop Fair, celebrated at the harvest's end in Stratford-on-Avon, home of William Shakespeare. The festival began hundreds of years ago, when servants and farm hands were hired by the year.

Landowners and workers alike went into town, landowners to hire new workers and workers to find new jobs. Shopkeepers in Stratford-on-Avon held a fair for the crowd that poured into town. The name "Mop Fair" was inspired by the mops carried by women servants. Today, the festival features food, music, dancing and amusement rides.

In southern Spain, natives and tourists alike join in the Fiesta de la Uva, or Festival of the Grapes, in town of Jerez de la Frontera. Farmers and winemakers celebrate the mid-September grape harvest with a thanksgiving service in the cathedral, followed by a parade, horse races and bullfights. Lively guitar music, singing and dancing are all part of the festival.

Similar southern celebrations are held throughout southern Spain, but few are as well known as the one in Jerez de la Frontera.

The people of Bern, Switzerland, celebrate the onion harvest every November. The celebration stems back to the early 1400s, when Bern was almost destroyed by fire and the people of nearby Fribourg helped rebuild the city. In appreciation, Bern opened its markets to the farmers of Fribourg to sell their big agricultural product, onions. Today, the onion celebration is still held in the Bern market square. Children dress up as onions, and onions are served in just about every method imaginable.

Borrowing from many of these celebrations, the Pilgrims introduced Thanksgiving to the fledgling American colonies. Since then, Thanksgiving has become one of America's best-loved and most widely celebrated holidays.

Just as the people of America borrowed the concept of Thanksgiving from other countries, they have shared their special way of celebrating it around the world.

Perhaps one of the most memorable examples of this took place in 1942 at Westminster Abbey in London. More than 3,500 American troops stationed in England during World War II jammed into the historic church for Thanksgiving Day services. The service was the first time anything but a Church of

England service had been held at the abbey's altar in nine centuries.

As American GIs sang "The Star-Spangled Banner" and "America the Beautiful" at Westminster Abbey, they demonstrated the one characteristic that has given Thanksgiving Day a special significance for Americans.

Thanksgiving has meant more than just a celebration of the blessings of nature — to the Pilgrims at Plymouth Rock, to World War II GIs at Westminster Abbey and to Americans celebrating it today, whether at home or overseas.

It is a day of reflection on all that America has — freedom as well as bounty — and a time to give thanks as a nation and a people.

# Legally Speaking

## The laws of Okinawa

Marines deploying to Okinawa do not expect to get in trouble. Nevertheless, a few do. This article provides advice on how not to get in trouble and what to expect if you do.

Japanese law is similar to American law. Generally, if you cannot do something in the United States you cannot do it in Japan. For example, assault, larceny, DWI, and possession of illegal drugs are crimes under both countries' law.

One of the most common offenses on Okinawa is DWI. The Japanese are very tough with drivers who have been drinking. Roadblocks are common and Americans are closely examined. Be aware that the Japanese have an offense entitled "driving after drinking." So even if you are not legally drunk you can still be arrested. If you

are picked up for DWI or "driving after drinking" you will be convicted! The best you can hope for is a stiff fine, provided nobody was hurt and no property damaged.

An equally common problem on Okinawa is bad checks. Many Marines are not used to having girls falling all over them. The more you spend the more they fall. It is easy to cash checks on Okinawa, and before you know it you have written \$10,000 in bad checks which you cannot possibly repay. Bad check cases are treated seriously under military law and often result in a bad conduct discharge as well as substantial brig time.

While on Okinawa, Marines are covered by the U.S.-Japan Status of Forces Agreement (SOFA). Basically, the SOFA explains who is going to try you if you do something wrong. If the offense is against a U.S. serviceman or civilian, or against U.S. property, you will be tried under the UCMJ

in a U.S. military court. Also, if you are involved in an accident while driving a government vehicle and are not on official duty, you can be tried in a military court, but will not be tried by the Japanese.

If a Japanese person or his property is involved, or the case involves a DWI, and in almost all drug cases, the Japanese will try you. When a Marine is involved in legal matters with the Japanese (including traffic tickets) he is put on international legal hold. Once on international legal hold you cannot leave Okinawa until the matter is settled or you have served your sentence in a Japanese prison.

Should you be stopped by the Japanese police, identify yourself, be polite, and do what they ask. Do not make a statement, but ask that the Americans be notified. Under the SOFA, the police are required to notify U.S. authorities when an American serviceman is detained.

For many minor offenses a private settlement can be arranged. If so, the Japanese prosecutor will usually drop the case. If the offense is serious, however, he may still go ahead with prosecution.

Even under the worst circumstances, it is still in your best interest to try for a private settlement, since Japanese courts look at this as evidence of repentance. It will drastically reduce jail time, and may even lead to a suspended sentence.

There are also condolence calls. This is a visit by you to the victim or his family, bringing flowers, fruits, candy, or a small amount of money showing remorse, regret, or sympathy for what has happened. Often, a condolence call will satisfy the opposing party, and they will not sue you.

For help in arranging a private settlement or a condolence call, contact the nearest Marine legal office.

If you do go to court, be on time, be polite, and show by your demeanor that you are sorry. The Japanese place great emphasis on a person showing he is sorry for what has happened.

In other than minor traffic cases you are entitled to a Japanese lawyer (paid for by the U.S. government). There will be an American trial observer at your trial. He will ensure you receive a fair trial, but has no other influence.

Should you be sentenced to prison you will serve your sentence at the National Prison at Yokosuka. You will serve at least 60 percent of your sentence. Japanese prisons are not pleasant. You will

be able to work at the laundry, on the hallway detail, and cleaning rugs. Frostbite is a real danger, and there is no smoking, chewing gum, or eating candy. Talking is only allowed when specifically authorized.

In summary, watch out for writing bad checks, be careful if you drive, and watch your drinking. Be courteous to the Japanese. If you can stay out of trouble in the United States there is no reason why you cannot stay out of trouble on Okinawa.

rillas work primarily in the countryside, but are also moving to cities, where they can be sure of local peasant support. The guerrillas maintain high mobility with small self-sufficient units. In most cases, the NPA avoids direct confrontations with government troops.

"All they (NPA) have to do is survive and maintain their credibility as a fighting force with occasional ambushes in order to keep their revolutionary prospects alive, while causing considerable harm to the public image of the (government)," said one observer of the Philippine situation.

# On the Blotter

**Editor's note:** The following are actual incidents which occurred on the Air Station. The military Police Department here is bringing significant cases to your attention to prevent these types of incidents happening to you or your family. To report a crime, or if you notice suspicious activity on the Air Station, please call the Military Police Department's 24-hour Crime Stopper number 257-2123.

Underage drinking has become a prominent issue since October 1986 when the legal drinking age changed from 18 to 21. Marines are being caught on and off Station and are being charged with underage drinking.

This week there were seven incidents of underage drinking. All of them could have been prevented by either the individuals themselves or by the people that the individuals were with. Drinking an alcoholic beverage is a voluntary act which Marines are subjecting themselves to due to several reasons, including peer pressure.

The individuals can "just say no" and the people they are with can and should respect that decision to obey the law. If the individuals are not willing to comply with the law, their peers can see to it that they are not put in the situation that makes them want to drink.

Special Services has activities where Marines can spend their time in a way that does not require or encourage them to drink alcoholic beverages during the activities. Other events are available throughout the islands where underage Marines can find many things

to do without having to drink.

• Two Marines were placed in pre-trial confinement by their commanding officers after they were apprehended for selling drugs on the Air Station.

• A private was attacked by six other unidentified men while he was walking on Third Street, next to Pollock Field. The six men started antagonizing the private with provoking words and the private also retaliated with provoking words. One of the six men hit the private in the head with a walking cane and the others joined in by punching and slapping the private several times in the face.

The private was treated at the Branch Medical Clinic for lacerations and bruises on his face. The incident is being investigated by the Criminal Investigation Division.

If the attackers are known, or if the incident was witnessed, contact the Criminal Investigation Division at 257-3425.

• A lance corporal accused another lance corporal of stealing a shirt. The accused lance corporal hit the other lance corporal.

The military police responded to the dispute and the lance corporal who was hit was treated at the Branch Medical Clinic. The other lance corporal was transported to the Military Police Department and processed as a suspect of assault.

• A lance corporal received a 90 day driving suspension after he was caught attempting to steal a DoD Decal from a car parked next to building 1570. An MP observed the lance corporal trying to scrape the decal. The lance corporal was trans-

ported to the Military Police Department and released to his unit representative.

• A dependent wife reported the theft of her wallet that she had left in the ladies room at the Temporary Lodging Facility. The thief stole \$85 to \$90 that was left in the purse, along with 15 blank checks. The military police are following up on the incident.

• A private first class attempted to steal a dependent wife's purse while she and her husband were at the Enlisted Club. The sergeant and his wife were dancing when his wife noticed the private first class leaving the club with her purse.

The sergeant confronted the alleged thief and they struggled. The sergeant and the private first class were separated and the private first class left without the purse. Other club patrons identified the private first class and where he worked.

The military police apprehended him at his barracks and transported him to the Military Police Department where he was positively identified by the sergeant and his wife.

• A corporal was suspected of larceny after it was reported that he stole a total of \$83 from two other NCO's and a private first class while at Brigade Schools. The corporal was transported to the Military Police Department where he was processed and released to a unit representative.

• A corporal and a lance corporal have lost their driving privileges for 90 days because they failed to deregister and register a car. The corporal sold his car to the lance corporal and the corporal did not deregister the car on the Air Station.

The lance corporal continued to use the decal issued to the corporal which was on the car, to gain access into the Air Station. The incident came to the attention of the military police through a command authorized vehicle inspection at the Mokapu Gate.

• A 13-year-old girl is in custody of the Child Protective Services after officials at her school reported that she may have been subjected to child abuse while staying with her family here.

The girl was transported to Tripler Army Medical Center where it was confirmed that she was possibly abused by her father, who is suspected of using a leather belt to hit her. The belt left several bruises on her buttocks which she was treated for while at the hospital.

• A 7-year-old boy and a 5-year-old girl have been taken into custody by the Child Protective Services. The children's father is suspected of hitting the boy in the face, and spanking him and his sister on several occasions with his belt.

The Criminal Investigation Division and the Child Protective Services are working together to solve these cases.

• A private first class left her 11-month-old baby in the car while she went to formation. The child was unattended for over fifteen minutes in an unlocked car.

The mother was found and the military police advised her of the Station Regulations pertaining to proper child supervision.

• A civilian man will receive a bar letter as a result of his actions at the H-3 Gate. The letter will bar him from the Air Station for one year after he was suspected of

reckless driving, disorderly conduct and provoking speeches and gestures.

The man ran over a military policeman's foot and narrowly missed another military policeman after the man was told to park his car properly while he was at the Pass and Registration Office. The man then started using profanities toward the military police and refused to identify himself.

He and his passenger were transported to the Military Police Department where they were properly identified and released.

• A lance corporal and a private first class are suspected of stealing mail. The two suspects' commanding officer requested an investigation after it was brought to the commanding officers attention by the victim.

The two suspects are being investigated for stealing two credit cards and possibly using them before giving them to their proper owner. The investigation is being

conducted by the Criminal Investigation Division.


• A lance corporal had his car repossessed after he wrote a worthless check to cover \$4600 in overdue payments.

• A traffic accident occurred when a staff sergeant signaled to a lance corporal that it was all right to cross Harris Avenue. The lance corporal crossed the first lane without incident, but as he walked into the second lane of traffic he was hit by a two door white car.

The driver of the car stopped to assist the lance corporal, but when the lance corporal said that he was fine, the driver left the scene. The lance corporal was then transported to the Branch Medical Clinic where he was treated for abrasions to the back of the head and elbow.

• A hit and run accident occurred when a staff sergeant was riding his bicycle on South Lawrence Road and was hit by an unknown vehicle.

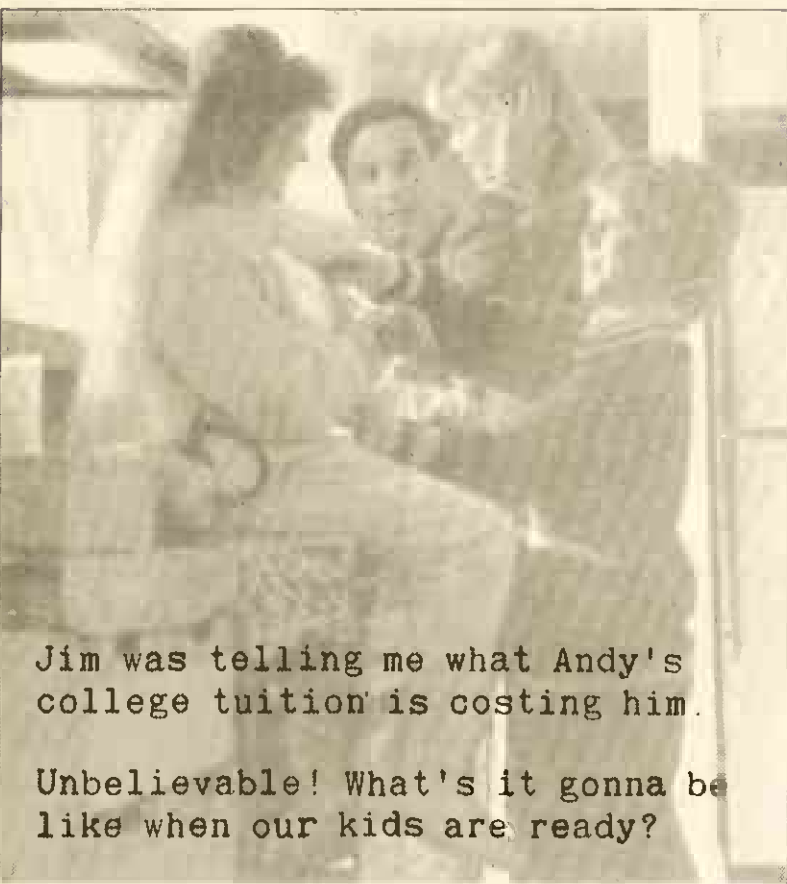

**Thanksgiving food tips**

AFIS — Benjamin Franklin thought the turkey should be our national bird. And although the eagle's strong and vigilant image earned it "top bird" status, on Thanksgiving, it's the turkey who reigns on dinner tables wherever Americans gather.

Turkey, like other poultry, is tasty and nutritious. But like all high-protein food, it is especially vulnerable to microorganisms that can cause food poisoning. Every year, some 2 million Americans suffer from food poisoning. Here are some hints from food safety experts to ensure that you and your loved ones are not included in that number.

• **Preparing** — If you mix your stuffing a day ahead, premix only the dry ingredients and refrigerate them separately from the uncooked bird. That will keep any bacteria from entering the starchy dressing. Bacteria thrive in high-protein, high-carbohydrate food combinations.

• If you're going to use the same knife to cut the vegetables that you used for meat, first wash it thoroughly. The same goes for cutting boards and all utensils.

• **Serving** — Serve the stuffing in a separate dish from the turkey. Don't leave the turkey and stuffing at room temperature longer than two hours. Even if you can't face clearing off the whole table right after eating, at least get the turkey, stuffing and any foods containing eggs or dairy products in the refrigerator promptly.

• **Refrigerating** — If you don't want to debone the turkey right away, refrigerate the carcass. It is best to separate turkey into pieces, such as drumsticks, before refrigeration. But it will stay fresher if you don't slice it into very small pieces. The reason: You want it small enough to cool quickly but

not so small that it is exposed to air at room temperature for long.

If you have large amounts of stuffing, divide them into smaller dishes. This speeds cooling. The key to food safety is to try to keep foods either hot (above 140 degrees) or cold (below 45 degrees). Minimizing the time food stays at room temperature increases safety.

• **Freezing** — If you can't eat leftover turkey quickly, freeze it. Cooked dry turkey keeps a month in the freezer. Turkey in gravy keeps up to 6 months. Freezing dries foods out, but the gravy helps prevent this.

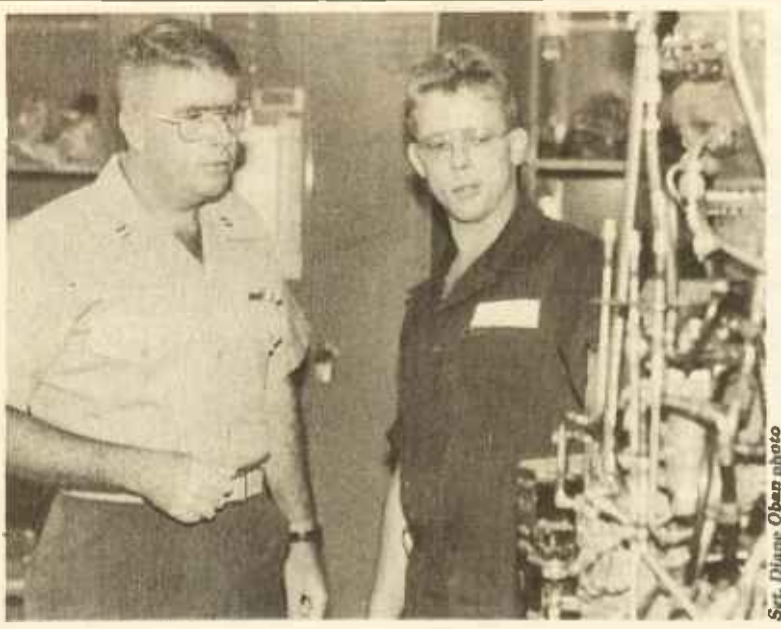

## Packing, Mailing suggestions

Bulky brown paper and loose string are out when it comes to wrapping holiday parcels; proper addressing is in, says Honolulu General Manager/Postmaster Michio Harada.

"The name of the game is for customers to address cards and packages properly, with the name, house number and street, or the apartment number," Harada says. "The city, state and ZIP Code should all be on the last line — be sure to use the ZIP Code! And put your return address and ZIP Code in the upper left corner."

Harada also suggests writing the recipient's name and address on a slip of paper and putting that inside when mailing a parcel.

"Remember, too, that Postal Service standards require a surcharge for oversized envelopes," Harada says.

The Postal Service offers these additional suggestions for mailing correctly:

- Cushion the contents of packages carefully with crumpled paper, commercially available foam shells or air-pocket padding, and leave no empty space in the

box. If the gift item is small, use a padded mailing bag.

- Seal your parcel with one of these kinds of tapes: pressure sensitive, nylon-reinforced craft paper or glass-reinforced pressure sensitive. Don't use cellophane or masking tapes — they're not sturdy enough.

- Avoid wrapping a carton in brown paper or tying it with twine; paper can tear and twine can get tangled in mailing processing equipment.

- Address not just packages, but cards and letters too, with smudge-proof ink.

- Put the recipient's name and address in the lower right part of the top of the package, and your name and address in the upper left, and remove all other labels and addresses.

- Try to avoid sending cash, but if you must, use Registered Mail. Use it for irreplaceable valuables, too.

Ending the regular season with a 6-2 record, H&MS was quick to put points on the board during the game. In the first six minutes of the game, H&MS-24 quarterback

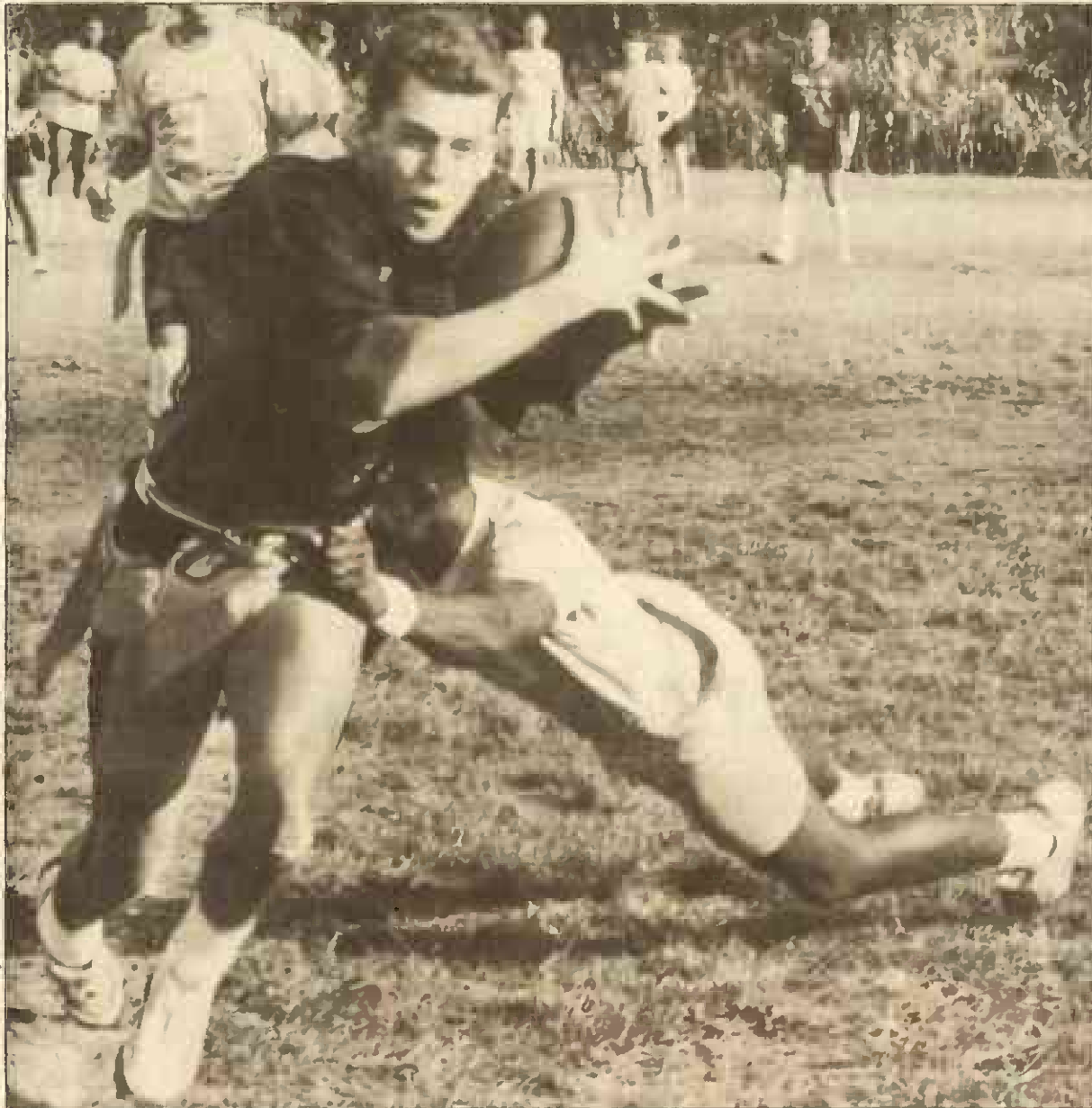
Brian Lohman threw a 30 yard pass to receiver Frank Donohue for a TD. Kevin Dillon then kicked for the extra point.

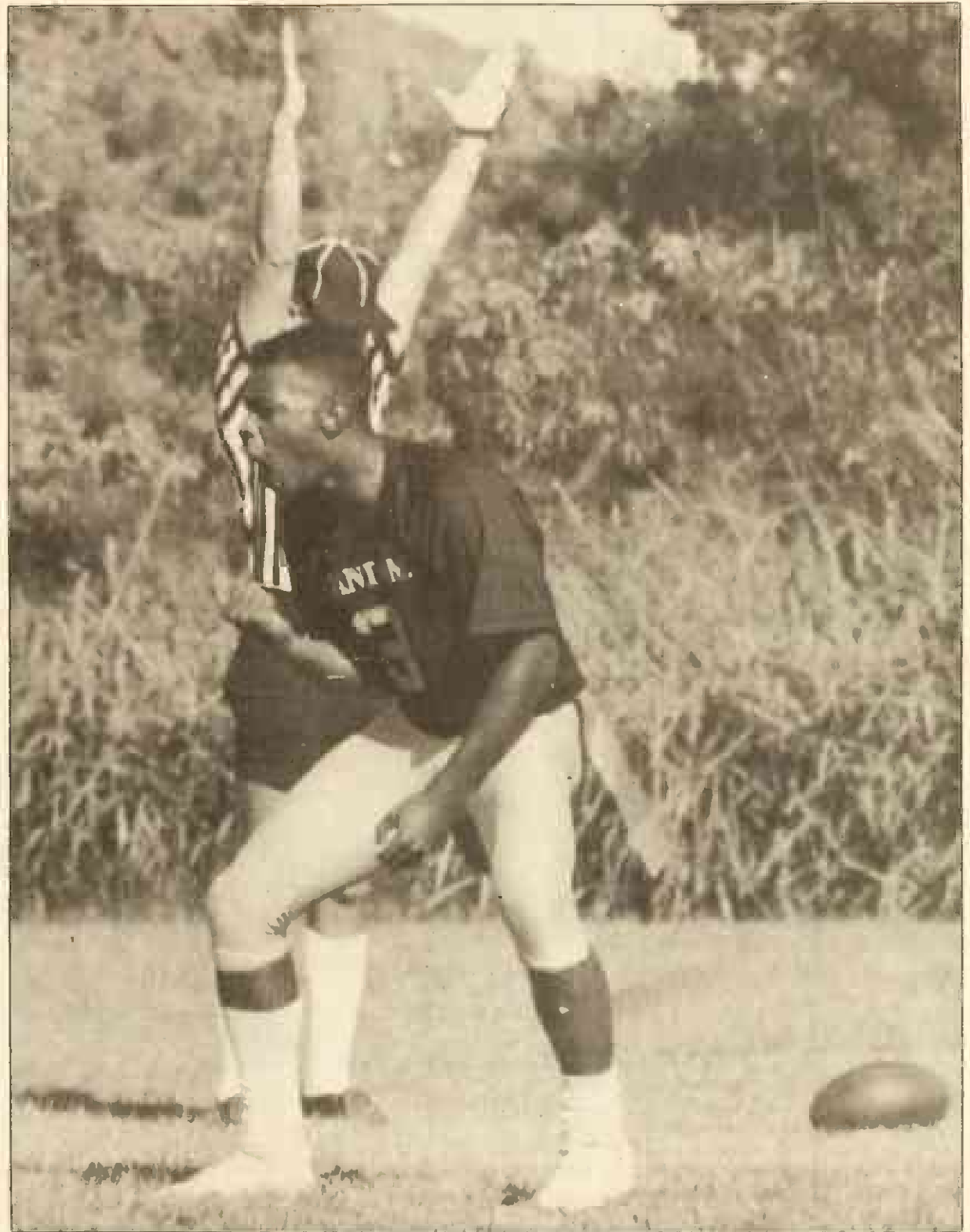

# Disabled Marine runs for those who can't

MCDEC, Quantico, Va. — As the more than 12,000 runners took that first step at the start of the Marine Corps Marathon Nov. 8, there were probably more than 12,000 motivations behind them. Not one could be more inspiring than that of Marine Major John Bates.

Bates, a life member of the Disabled American Veterans who is attending the ten-month Command and Staff College here, says he ran his fifth Marine Corps Marathon for those who "would if they could."

He's referred to the thousands of disabled veterans who, because of their disabilities, were unable to participate. He was inspired by a group who enabled him to enter the 1982 Ironman Triathlon in Kona, Hawaii.

"I needed financial assistance to compete," 42-year-old Bates recalled. "I was invited to address San Francisco's William Randolph Hearst DAV Chapter 144, to solicit funds for my rather ambitious feat. It was the first chapter meeting I'd attended and when I saw the extent of some of my fellow member's disabilities, I simply couldn't ask for a penny ... but I didn't have to. When they heard what I planned to do, the members offered to help sponsor me."

"That's when I learned something that's very important to me. When I run, I'm not only running for myself — I'm running for every one of those brave veterans who would if they could."

Without his perseverance and determination he might be considered in the same group that he represents

when he runs.

His muscular, 5'10" frame and rugged appearance personifies the stereotypical image many have of a United States Marine. But the lines etched in his face hint of the story behind a man who has faced, met, and championed defeat against ominous and sometimes self-imposed odds.

As a young private first class, abruptly introduced to the harrowing experiences of an infantryman on the front lines during the Vietnam Conflict, Bates earned three Purple Hearts before completing the first hitch of what he hoped would be a Marine Corps career.

After only six weeks in Vietnam, he took a Viet Cong machinegun bullet through the chest and subsequently lost most of his right lung. After returning to his unit he was wounded again when shrapnel from an exploding grenade penetrated his knee. One month later he stepped on a punji stake, serving the nerves in two of his toes. He returned to Camp Pendleton and was then medically discharged ... his military career seemingly over.

He returned home to Arkansas and used the G.I. Bill to earn both a bachelor's and master's degree. He then began exploring the possibilities of reentering the Corps as an officer.

"After several packages were bounced back," Bates said, "the officer selection officer told me that if I could beat him on the Marine physical fitness test he would personally try to get it approved. I never did beat

him, but he helped me anyway. If it hadn't been for him I probably wouldn't be in the Corps today."

While he was training to prove to the Marine Corps that he was physically capable of being a Marine, Bates discovered that he had an aptitude for long-distance running.

Since his acceptance into Officer Candidates School in 1975, Bates is a veteran of more than 28 marathons, has completed scores of 10 and 15 kilometer races, twice competed in the Western States 100-Mile Endurance Run and successfully completed the Ironman Triathlon.

The Ironman Triathlon combines a 2.4-mile swim, with a 112-mile bicycle race and a full 26.2-mile marathon. Bates was successful in securing finances and he did compete in the 1982 Ironman competition in Kona, Hawaii. He finished in 12 hours, 28 minutes and 40 seconds, a half hour ahead of his pre-race projections.

The actual event was preceded by a full year of three to five-hour training days. He would run 75 miles, swim seven to 12 miles and bike over 200 miles each week during his peak training period.

As an official "Ironman" Bates had to find a way to further challenge his physical ability. On Saturday, June 28, 1986, he entered the Interstate Western States 200-Mile Endurance Run. It took him 23 hours and 46 minutes to navigate the rugged terrain of the high

Sierra country between Squaw Valley and Auburn, Calif. His time was fast enough to earn him a silver belt buckle awarded to those finishing under 24 hours.

Running the Marine Corps marathon may seem a meager task for such an accomplished runner, but Bates looks at it differently.

"The Marine Corps Marathon is the only marathon I make an effort to get back to ... no matter where I'm assigned," he said. "Not only because it's the best organized and best produced marathon around, but also because I always meet a number of old running buddies who travel from around the world to run here."

"That run is particularly taxing," he said. "But even during the worst stretch — when my feet are so swollen that I have to cut the toes out of my shoes, and the blisters are so deep they turn bloody — I'm thankful that at least I'm able to run. It's during this time that my mind returns to Vietnam. The ghosts of those who died there and the living souls of those who came home disabled, push me to keep putting one foot in front of the other. They would run if they could ... I can, so I must."

Shawn Dye did a super job by stopping his Army opponent in the heavy-weight class.

Marines came to do battle. The Army wrestlers who workout year round, were not that far ahead of the Marines who have only been practicing for six weeks. Marine coach Ken Berger was pleased with the effort put forth by the Marine wrestlers.

# Native American Week Nov. 22-28

AFIS — Through a fluke in history, thousands of American Indians are not recognized as Indians by the federal government.

"Many of the groups are not recognized primarily because of accidents of history," said Pat Simmons of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Division of Tribal Government Services.

"For instance, groups that never made war on the United States seldom had occasions to enter into treaties," said Simmons. "Other groups were so isolated that no one ever noticed them. Many groups kept to them-

selves and avoided contact with the United States, and some made treaties with the colonial or state government. There may be other reasons, but these are the primary ones."

## Who is an Indian?

There is no one federal tribal definition that establishes a person's identity as Indian. Government agencies use different criteria for determining eligibility for programs and services. Tribal groups have varying requirements for determining tribal membership.

But for Bureau of Census purposes, people who declare themselves to be Indians are

considered Indians.

The eligibility for programs and services of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, according to the Snyder Act, is limited to enrolled members of federally recognized tribes who live on or near trust land. To receive education benefits, a person must be one-fourth Indian.

"Each tribe determines their own eligibility and criteria for tribal membership," said Tom Oxendine, a spokesman for the Bureau of Indian Affairs. "Some tribes are very restrictive, and some are very lenient. Some tribes require that to be a member, one must be born on the reservation to an enrolled member. And some tribes use decedency."

There are 309 federally recognized Indian tribes in the continental United States. The United States holds more than 53 million acres of trust land under statute — treaties, executive orders and legislative acts of Congress, according to the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

Some 250 tribal groups also are not recognized by the federal government, such as the 40,000-strong Lumbees, who are recognized by the state of North Carolina. The average population of these groups is about 700.

More than 755,000 federally recognized Indians live on or near Indian reservations. The 1980 U.S. Census showed that some 1.5 million Native Americans, from both federally and state-recognized tribes, live in the United States. This includes more than 65,000 Alaska natives — Indians, Aleuts and Eskimos — who live in 197 native Alaskan villages.

More than 13,700 American Indians are currently on active duty in the military services. Another 6,000 serve in the National Guard and Reserve.

## What is a tribe?

"Tribe" originally meant a body of people bound together by blood ties who were socially, politically and reli-

giously organized. They lived together, occupied a definite territory and spoke a common language or dialect.

But after Indians were relegated to reservations, the word "tribe" developed a number of different meanings.

"The establishment of the reservation system created some new tribal groupings when members of two or more tribes were placed together on one reservation or members of one tribal

group were spread over two or more reservations," said a spokeswoman for the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

Today, "tribe" refers to any Indian tribe, band, nation or other recognized group or community, including any Alaskan native village, she said. "But they must be recognized by the Secretary of the Interior as having special rights and responsibilities because of their status as Indians."
