1st MAB Marines in Guam for MPF exercise

About 280 1st MAB Marines left here Monday for Guam to conduct an eight-day training exercise that simulates the early stages of a Maritime Prepositioning Force (MPF) deployment. "GuamEx" is designed to exercise four key elements of an MPF deployment: the Offload Preparation Party; the Survey, Liaison, Reconnaissance Party; the Arrival and Assembly Organizations; and the Movement Control Center.

Among other tasks, the Marines will simulate offloading the four ships of Maritime Prepositioning Squadron-3 which are normally "forward-deployed" in the vicinity of Guam. The commercial cargo ships contain enough supplies and heavy equipment to sustain a 16,500-man Marine Amphibious Brigade in combat for 30 days.

In a real deployment, the Offload Preparation Party would be the only element to fly to Guam. There, they would board the ships and prepare the equipment for offload as the ships sail to a contingency area.

Meanwhile, Marines of the Survey, Liaison, Reconnaissance Party would fly to the contingency area where they would evaluate the port facility for suitable off-load sites, and identify airfields for the Brigade's tactical aircraft and for Military Airlift Command flights which later bring the bulk of the Marines in the Fly-In-Echelon.

The SLRP also evaluates areas where the Arrival and Assembly Organizations can get the equipment and supplies from the ships "married-up" with Marines of the FIE. Meanwhile, the SLRP communicates with the Movement Control Cen-

ter in "the rear" at MCAS Kaneohe Bay to keep the entire, complicated process flowing smoothly.

During this week's GuamEx, the Marines will be testing new Automated Data Processing during a simulated "in-stream" off-load where the ships are anchored just off-shore. The only items actually being off-loaded during this exercise, however, will be coded 8x5 cards.

The SLRP will "evaluate" areas in the vicinity of Naval Air Station Agana, Guam, and attempt to communicate with Kaneohe Bay via a new satellite uplink system being flown in from III Marine Amphibious Force on Okinawa. An important goal of the exercise is to validate procedures used during an MPF deployment, and to familiarize new personnel with their responsibilities.

News in Brief

Plug in new phones today

The Air Station will be switching over to the Oahu Telephone System (OTS) Friday, and all military work sections here should plug in their new phones by the close of business today, according to SSgt. S.D. Starling, NCOIC, Telephone Branch of CommElect Div.

Some temporary outages may occur as the new system comes on line. Station and 1st MAB units should report outages to the Station Telephone Branch and Brigade CEO, respectively, and consult their OTS Users Guide for more information.

The OTS is designed to link Oahu military installations together in a single telecommunications network using digital switching and fiber optic technology. The network is specifically designed for military applications, such as precedence calling, and access to the world-wide Defense Switched Network (DSN, which is replacing AUTOVON).

The Air Station, NAS Barbers Point, Ford Island and Pearl Harbor are the first military installations that will switch to OTS. All other military installations are to be switched to OTS by April 1988.

Installed, operated and maintained by the Hawaiian Telephone Company under a \$110 million contract with the Defense Communications Agency, Pacific, OTS will give single-line telephone users access to various features that were previously unavailable.

Some basic features of all Air Station OTS telephones are:

Consultations/Hold All Calls — a feature that will let users place a call on hold, call another user and return to the holding call, or allows for a three-way conference.

Call Transfer — a feature that will let users transfer calls anywhere within the OTS network.

Direct Inward Dialing — a feature that lets users receive calls from outside the OTS network without operator assistance.

Within a month, sections here should receive new phone books, says Starling. Currently, an interim phone book is being used by the 1st MAB, however, distribution is limited.

Ask before you dig

More Air Station personnel and their families are digging up Air Station soil. Not only does this digging endanger lives and property here, but also ancient Hawaiian artifacts.

Personnel here dig up Air Station soil for different reasons: pig roasts, planting various vegetation, or installing swing sets. Digging holes can unearth unmarked electrical lines, making it possible for the digger to become electrocuted.

Throughout the Air Station are numerous burial grounds of ancient Hawaiians. Disturbing these burial sites violates state and Federal laws and Air Station Order 11010.1.

The Air Station order requires individuals who wish to dig to obtain permission from the Facilities Department. For more information on digging on the Air Station, call the Facilities Department at 257-2171.

Marines receive deposit waiver

Camp H.M. Smith — Remember the hassle the last time you moved and a security deposit was required to get your gas and electricity turned on? That security deposit has become a thing of the past for qualified Marines and Marine Corps-based Navy personnel in Hawaii with the Utility Deposit Waiver Program.

The program, which began last May in cooperation with the Hawaiian Electric Company, Inc., and GASCO, Inc., allows the initial utility deposit to be waived for those Marines and Navy personnel who are not known credit risks.

"This program helps incoming personnel cut down on out-of-pocket expenses," said GySgt. Hubert Maier, FMFPac Personnel Resource branch chief and FMFPac Marine Program liaison. "Sometimes, this is crucial for incoming or newly-married Marines."

The no-deposit policy will apply at the time the service is first turned on, but the utility company maintains the right to request a deposit if the Marine later becomes a credit risk.

Determination of a credit risk will not be based on rank, but may be determined through normal credit-bureau records, other utility

companies' records or evidence that the Marine has filed for bankruptcy.

"The waiver applies only to the initial turn-on cost," said Mayer, "and not towards advance payments, which include having a company representative come out to install and turn on the service."

Eligible Marines or sailors who wish to apply for the program should complete a Waiver of Deposit/Privacy Act form. This form will allow the command to verify an applicant's name and social security number, and release present and future residence addresses. The

forms and more information, administration offices.

After the commanding officer approves the form it is the Marine's responsibility to forward it to his utility of fice.

If a problem arises concerning non-payment of a bill, the respective utility company will notify the Marine's commanding officer of the problem.

If an applicant has a previous deposit that was paid to Hawaiian Electric or GASCO, it will be refunded when the Utility Deposit Waiver has been approved and the person has not been determined a credit risk.





Legally Speaking

Deciding on a power of attorney

If you are going on leave, deployment, temporary additional duty, or making a permanent change of station, you should consider whether or not you should give another person a power of attorney.

A power of attorney is a legal document by which you, the principal, give another person, your agent, the ability and authority to take certain legally binding actions on your behalf. The document itself must be in writing, signed by you and notarized.

Selecting an agent

It is critical to select a trustworthy and reliable individual as your agent

since actions taken by your agent pursuant to this grant of authority will make you legally responsible or liable. By example, if you give a friend a power of attorney to buy a stereo system for you from the exchange, you alone will be liable for the purchase price. Your friend will not be liable for the cost of the stereo.

An agent who acts on your behalf does, however, have special responsibilities when acting for you. He or she must act reasonably, inform you about all important matters undertaken for you, and render to you a full accounting upon termination of the power of attorney.

Types of powers

There are two types of powers of attorney — a spe-

cial (limited) power of attorney and a general (unlimited) power of attorney. As the name implies, a special power of attorney is used for specific purposes only. The agent's authority is limited to the specific grant of authority specified in the instrument.

Special powers of attorney are commonly used to enable another person to:

- Ship or receive a household goods or POV shipment;
- Operate, maintain, register, insure or sell a vehicle;
- Buy, sell, or lease real or personal property;
- Withdraw or deposit funds or close a bank account;
- Take care of minor children during a prolonged absence;

- Receive or relinquish base housing; and
- Sign and file income tax returns.

A general (unlimited) power of attorney is different from a special power of attorney in that the agent acts "generally" and the scope of his/her authority is unlimited. General powers of attorney are commonly given to a spouse or close family member while the principal is away on deployment or on temporary additional duty. The purpose is to allow the agent to manage any number of personal, business or legal matters as circumstances require during the principal's absence.

Agent termination

The authority vested in an agent is automatically termi-

nated on the occurrence of the expiration date specified in the document. A power of attorney may be terminated before the stated expiration date by either giving written notice of revocation to the agent or by the intentional destruction of the document by the principal.

In addition, a power of attorney normally is automatically terminated by the death of either party or by the mental disability or incapacity of the principal.

If the agent and others no longer know the whereabouts of the principal, the power of attorney may be automatically terminated. For example, if the principal is "missing," "missing in action," a "prisoner of war," or a "hostage" as those terms are commonly used, the agent's

authority may be automatically revoked, suspended or terminated. To prevent such a result, you may wish to request that your Legal Assistance Attorney make your power of attorney "durable."

You may also request a special provision in your power of attorney to prevent automatic termination in the event of your mental disability or incapacity, or you may request that your power of attorney become effective upon your mental disability or incapacity.

These provisions are said to make your power of attorney "durable" because they allow your agent to act on your behalf during circumstances when he or she ordinarily would not be able to do so.

MCAS Housing circulation policy

The Hawaii Marine is a free publication delivered each week to all family housing units aboard the air station. Carriers are paid only by voluntary contributions from customers who are satisfied with the youngsters' delivery service.

Holiday safety tips

With the holiday season just around the corner, here are a few tips to keep in mind to help ensure a safe holiday season.

- Unattended cooking is the leading cause of home fires, so remain closely whenever the stove is in use.

- Keep hot foods hot and cold foods cold to prevent possible food poisoning.

- If you plan on buying a live tree, keep it in a cool place for as long as possible. Cut about one inch off the base of the tree, then place the tree into a large container of water. Check and refill the water reservoir on a daily basis.

- Prevent possible burns to younger children by turning pot handles inward where they won't be able to reach them.

- Keep the tree away from open flames and heat sources.

- If lights are used, check for broken bulbs, loose connections and frayed cords. Never leave a lighted tree unattended, even for a short period of time. Heat from the lights will tend to dry the tree, so use them sparingly.

- Never use electrical lights on a metal tree. Use a colorful spotlight for illumination.

- Make sure electrical air vents are not overloaded.

- Extension cords increase the chance of fire when they are misused or overloaded. Purchase only those that carry the Underwriters Laboratory (UL) label.

- Holiday plants and greenery, such as poinsettia, holly, mistletoe berries and

Jerusalem cherry plants can be poisonous if ingested. Be sure to keep them out of the reach of children and pets.

- Select toys to suit the age, abilities and interest of the child.

- Beware of sharp edges, points, pins, wire and lead based paint, especially in toys that have been imported. Toys that shoot projectiles should be reserved only for older children with adult supervision.

- If you're planning on hiring a babysitter, be sure the sitter knows how to get in touch with you in case of an emergency. Leave telephone numbers of a reliable neighbor, family doctor, police and fire department next to the phone. Inform the sitter of household rules children should follow pertaining to meals, bedtimes, television shows and restricted activities. Also give any instructions concerning medication, special dietary needs, habits or problems that may arise.

Following these guidelines will help to keep your holidays safe and happy. Aloha.





Building on their basic infantry skills

Simulated anti-personnel mines were concealed in dense foliage and camouflaged troops, masked by the same vegetation, were waiting for the enemy to attack. Suddenly, a trip wire was set off and an empty coffee can was sent clanking across a dirt road.

A fire fight had begun, and a superior opposing force quickly seized its objective. Soon after, the victor emerged from the tangled growth that had hidden their advance so well, and with their opponents, began cri-

iquing the fire fight scenario. The players here were 70 Marines from 3d Combat Engineer Battalion who used the jungle-like terrain of Bel- lows AFB during a recent four-day exercise to hone their combat skills.

"Usually when we go out to the field, it's to provide support for another unit," said 1st Lt. Michael Gerhardt, executive officer for 3d Cbn Engr Bn. "We spend

most of our time setting up concertina and barbed wire, and mine demolitions. This time, we were able to act as aggressors, and to set up and defend our own position."

During the exercise, the engineers split into opposing teams to organize ambushes and night patrols.

"Since our mission is to be out there working with the infantry, we should train the infantry," said Gerhardt. "By occasionally going out to the field by ourselves, we can devote the time to refining our basic infantry skills."

On the Blotter

Editor's Note: The following are actual incidents which occurred on the Air Station. The military Police Department here is bringing significant cases to your attention to prevent these types of incidents happening to you or your family. To report a crime, or if you notice suspicious activity on the Air Station, please call the Military Police Department's 24-hour Crime Stopper number — 257-2123.

Family violence has become an increasing and disturbing problem on the Air Station lately.

Escalating breaches of peace between husband and wife are being reported by the couples themselves, medical personnel, neighbors, and

the civilian police department.

Continuing reports of family violence can hinder one's military career, cause removal from family housing, and disrupt the lives of all of the family members, especially children.

Mediation groups in the civilian community, as well as the Air Station and 1st MAB chaplains, the Navy Relief Society, and the Family Services Center, are available to Marine Corps and Navy families who need marital counseling.

• A corporal was arrested in Honolulu for an assault after he struck a man following an argument. The corporal was released on \$50 bail, and is scheduled to appear in court.

• A lance corporal was treated for an assault at the Branch Medical Clinic. The lance corporal stated that while he was walking in Honolulu, he observed four men trying to break into a car. The lance corporal approached the men. Two of them fled, but the remaining two, and an unknown number of individuals from a pick-up truck, began to kick and punch the lance corporal. All of the assailants fled before the Honolulu Police Department arrived.

• A staff sergeant reported that someone had stolen his maroon, Huffy 12-speed bicycle, which was left near his quarters. The bike had not been locked up.

• A private first class reported that someone had stolen a Black and Decker

power drill, two car batteries, and two extension cords from his 1970 VW. The car had been locked. The theft is still under investigation.

• A set of 782 gear was stolen from a lance corporal's 1979 Ford, which was parked near his barracks. The car had been towed to the impound lot. An inventory of the vehicle later revealed that the gear was not in the car at the time it was towed.

• A corporal reported that his gold ring and three shirts had been stolen by a lance corporal. When approached about the thefts, the lance corporal returned one of the shirts, but denied that he had stolen the other items.

• A lance corporal was arrested in Honolulu for DWI and erratic driving. The lance corporal elected to have

his breath tested, which resulted in a .17% blood alcohol content. The Marine was released on \$150 bail and is scheduled to appear in court.

• Two Army privates first class, were apprehended for being in a restricted area. One of them also apprehended for underaged drinking. Both were apprehended and released to their unit.

• A staff sergeant was arrested for DWI in Kaneohe after being initially stopped for speeding. The staff sergeant refused all tests. He was released on \$150 bail, and is scheduled to appear in court.

• A lance corporal was apprehended for a fraud against the government after he submitted a false travel claim. The travel claim was

submitted after his reporting to the Air Station.

• A lance corporal was apprehended for fraudulent use of a state inspection sticker. The Marine tried to gain access through the main gate with an expired inspection sticker. When questioned about the sticker, the lance corporal stated that he had bought it from an unknown Polynesian male in Kaneohe. The Marine stated he could not get a valid inspection sticker because his vehicle had no insurance.

• A bartender at the Enlisted Club reported that she had witnessed a lance corporal break a glass. The lance corporal was apprehended for damage to government property, and released to his unit.
