## Camp Smith closes mess hall; opens restaurant

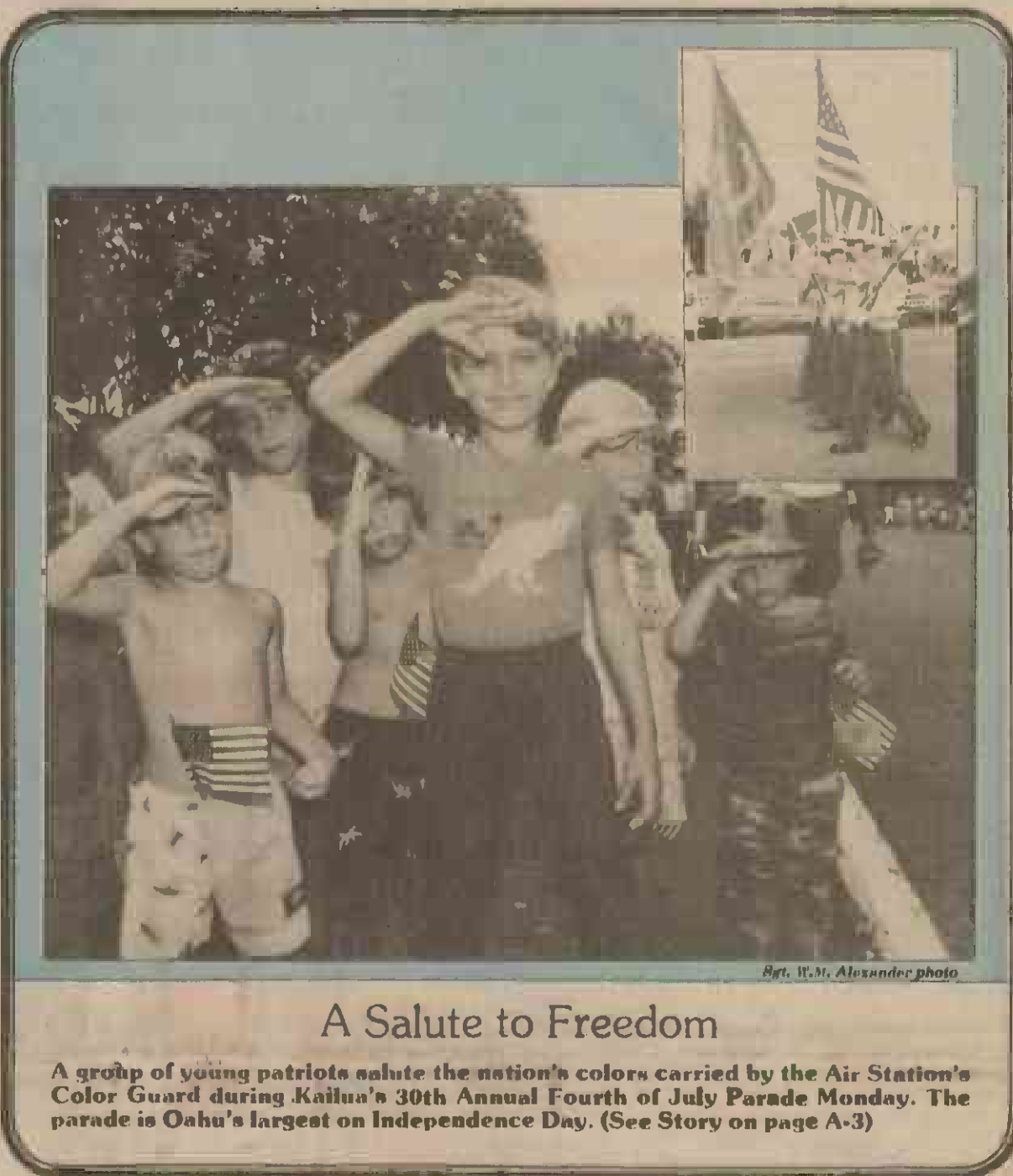

CAMP H.M. SMITH, Hawaii—Marines are known to detest waste, fraud and abuse. For that reason, the mess hall will close following the last meal today. An "all-hands" restaurant will open Friday, at the Officers' Club to serve as the essential eating place for camp personnel.

The restaurant will be open to all military ranks and civilian employees. It will have a snack bar that will be open from 6 a.m.-6 p.m. for breakfast, lunch, and dinner. It will be open from 9 a.m.-5 p.m., Saturday and Sunday and holidays, and will serve fast food items and regular hot meals. The main dining room will be open for lunch Monday-Friday from 11 a.m.-1 p.m., and Sunday from brunch from 9:30 a.m. to noon.

Meals will not be served without charge, and meal cards will not be accepted. Marines entitled to a meal card will receive basic allowance for subsistence (BAS) at the higher rate, along with a cost of living allowance (COLA) own right.

## 'Revenge' threats from Iran spur greater vigilance

Although the threat condition (THREATCON) level in Hawaii has not been raised as of press time, Iranian leaders have threatened "revenge" following the destruction of an Iranian jetliner by a U.S. Navy vessel last week.

- Cover American or service-related tattoos with a bandage or item of clothing.

- Avoid loitering in public areas of airports, or discussing military status or association.

On the Air Station, everyone is being urged to be suspicious and inquisitive about strangers, particularly those carrying suitcases or other containers. Everyone should be alert for unidentified vehicles on or in the vicinity of U.S. installations and for abandoned parcels or suitcases, or any unusual activities. The use of the "Neighborhood Watch" concept in military housing areas, on school grounds and around social and recreation centers is encouraged.

Anyone wishing to report suspicious activities or items should call the military police; at MCAS Kaneohe Bay, 257-4114; Camp Smith, 477-7114; and Pearl Harbor, 471-7114.

While it is important to increase an awareness of terrorism, it should be emphasized that Marines' chances of becoming victims of terrorism are slim, according to Maj. Peterson.

This "revenge" could take the form of terrorism directed at Americans and American interests around the world, according to the 1st MEB G-2 (Intelligence) Officer, Maj. H. Peterson.

American service personnel are particularly vulnerable to terrorist attacks since they are so easily recognized. Some personal security steps military personnel should take while traveling and "at home" include the following:

- Use a tourist passport while traveling, instead of military identification.

- Avoid wearing distinctive military items, including dog tags, high gloss military shoes, military glasses, and jewelry.

- Wear nondescript clothing. Avoid such distinctively American items as cowboy hats and boots, etc.

## News In Brief

### Airfield Hours Extended

Airfield operating hours here will be extended on several days through the end of July, as MAG-24 provides fixed-wing aviation support for RIMPAC 88.

The operating hours for the airfield are as follows: 9 July, 1-7 p.m.; 16 July, 7:30 a.m.-7 p.m. and 18 July, 5 a.m.-6 p.m.

Flight operations at the Air Station are normally conducted from 6:30 a.m.-9:30 p.m. Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday; and 6:30 to sunset Thursday and Friday. The airfield is normally closed for flight operations on weekends.

### COLA Change Fizzles

The projected loss of 25 percent of COLA for servicemembers did not take effect July 1, according to CWO Cecil DeLarosa, Quality Assurance Officer for Disbursing.

The stable or declining food prices here from 1987 to 1988, compared to the increased prices in CONUS during the same period, had DoD considering a 25 percent cut in COLA.

While COLA is remaining at its present level, per diem rates have gone up as of June 1, which will increase the amount of Temporary Lodging Allowance (TLA) for those reporting here.

### Allotments Change

The Marine Corps Finance Center (MCFC) will soon terminate all savings ("S") or dependent ("D") allotments not made out to savings or checking accounts.

The move, to be enforced November 1, is spawned by U.S. Treasury regulations that require MCFC to make credit payments due to financial institutions (FIs) via Direct Deposit/Electronic Funds Transfer (DD/EFT). Allotments paid as "S" and "D" allotments to other than a savings or checking account, or "S" allotments to other than a financial institution (which is unauthorized), will not be eligible for conversion to the DD/EFT payment method, and will be terminated.

This means that if a Marine is using an "S" allotment to repay a loan, and during an audit the bank verifies the payment is not to a savings or checking account, the allotment will be stopped. The Marine will be urged to arrange another method of payment.

When requesting new allotments in the future, Marines should make sure that all "S" or "D" allotments to FIs are paid to a savings or checking account.

## HQMC plans MWR survey here

HQMC, Washington, D.C.—Marketing Specialists from the Morale Support Division, HQMC, will visit the Air Station, July 14, as part of a Corps-wide survey to gather information on how Special Services and Club System Managers can best serve the needs of local patrons.

The "MWR Patron Need Assessment" is in the form of a written survey that will be given to more than 12,000 randomly selected Marines, dependents, and retired military personnel of any service who live near each facility.

"The survey results will help not only Headquarters, Morale Support Division, but

will also assist morale, welfare, and recreational leaders and the individual activity managers in planning, forecasting, and ensuring that future programs meet the patron's needs," said Michael Dalton, head of the Morale Support Division's Marketing Branch and one of the two marketing specialists who prepared and will administer the survey.

"By assessing the patron's needs, the morale, welfare and recreation activities can become more patron-oriented, or market driven, which is now both critical and necessary because of increasing civilian competition for the military patron's dollar and the reduction in MWR appro-

riated fund support," he added.

The survey will be personally administered to a predetermined number of Marines randomly selected at each installation. When they have completed the 30-minute survey, married Marines will be given an additional survey form for their spouses to complete and return to the local MWR facility. Retired military personnel living near the installation will be mailed survey forms.

In this way, Dalton plans to survey 6,400 active duty Marines, 3,000 family members and 3,000 retired families, and provide commanders with both localized and Marine Corps-wide initial

results data within two months of local survey completion.

"Only a small portion of the Marine Corps population will be asked to participate in the survey," said Dalton. "This makes it even more important that each participant understand that he or she represents a large peer population."

The 1988 patron needs assessment is the first in a series of market research efforts planned by the marketing branch, which was established as a separate office last year to provide marketing and communications programs for the Morale Support Division.

## '262 gets 'thumbs up' after grueling MCCRES

The Flying Tigers of HMM-262 received a "thumbs up" Friday after completing a week-long Marine Corps Combat Readiness Evaluation System (MCCRES) test.

The MCCRES began on June 27 and was designed to do just what the name implies. It put the squadron through the paces with a series of written tests, and actual flying scenarios to determine if the Marines are combat ready — and they are, according to the senior evaluator, LtCol. Michael J. Cross.

"HMM-262 passed with a pretty good MCCRES," said LtCol. Cross. "Things didn't start really getting hot until the second day when the actual flying began."

For almost three straight days, the Marines were

conducting business in an environment that would be common to pre-invasion operations. They were receiving missions, one right after another, which put their

# 1st Radio Bn. to get new commander

Lieutenant Colonel Thomas A. Flaherty will assume command of 1st Radio Battalion from LtCol. James W. Hust at 10 a.m., Friday, during a change of command ceremony at Dewey Square here.

LtCol. Flaherty was commissioned a second lieutenant in October 1969, after attending the Basic School in Quantico, Va., he reported for duty with 2nd Tank Bn., Camp LeJeune, N.C. The Erie, Pa. native also served with Co. D, Marine Support Battalion, Hanza, Japan, 3rd Tank Battalion, and as a representative of the National Security Agency, Fellowship Program.

A graduate of Gannon University in 1966, LtCol. Flaherty received a Master of Arts Degree from the University of Southern California. He has also attended the Chinese Mandarin Language

Course at the Defense Language Institute, Monterey, Calif. As a recipient of the Olmsted Scholar Program, he attended the University of Salamanca, Salamanca, Spain.

## School Physicals

The Branch Medical Clinic conducts school and athletic physicals on a monthly basis, except December, through its Immunization Clinic.

All patients needing a physical must be prescreened through the Immunization Clinic to update immunizations and receive a visual acuity test. The child must have his medical and immunization records; eyeglasses, if worn; and a valid military dependent identification card if 10-years-old or above, for the prescreening.

Prescreenings are done on a walk-in basis, from 8-11 a.m., Monday through Friday.

"These Marines will probably see an increase of almost \$125 per payday, which will be a considerable pay raise for them," said SSgt. Ricky W. Coffey, mess hall manager. A private first class to a lance corporal under two years in the Marine Corps will receive a BAS allotment of \$185.70 monthly, and COLA of \$46.80 for a 30-day month.

"My guess is the cost for a meal will be between \$3.50 and \$4, and there will be no going back for seconds without a charge," he added. At a regular Marine Corps mess hall, an all-you-can-eat, breakfast, costs 75 cents and lunch and dinner costs \$1.50.

Coffey understands the economic reasons for closing the mess hall, but is concerned about the troops nutrition. "There will probably be a lot of new stereos and CD plays around, but they should learn to budget their money, or they will go hungry those few days before payday."

Overhead costs and excess space were two of the deter-

mining factors in closing the mess hall, according to Coffey. "We did an analysis study about a year and a half ago. For everyone who walked in the door, it cost us \$5.80 per plate," he said. This did not include electrical costs, civilian help or depreciation.

Also, the facilities rested within 25,000 square feet of space. "This mess hall was designed for 3,000 people back when it was a hospital. We rate less than 6,000 square feet for the less than 200 people we feed daily," he said. Necessary renovations would take a big chunk out of the Marine Corps' budget. Other decisions included a lack of patronage of meal card holders, and manpower reductions by Headquarters Marine Corps.

According to Coffey, equipment within the mess hall will possibly be transferred to other Marine Corps commands. The mess hall will be converted into office space.

Coffey stated the the cooks assigned to Camp Smith will either be transferred to mess halls on-island or to the mainland.

planning and organizational skills to the test.

"We turned a lot of the planning over to the junior officers so they could see just what is required of them to ensure a mission works," explained Capt. Doss Comer, assistant operations officer. "A mission is not a simple thing. You can't just walk in and say we are taking off here and we are going there. There are all sorts of considerations to be aware of such as emergency procedures, alternate routes, frequencies etc."

One of those complex missions, assigned less than 24 hours in advance, was to insert a rifle company of Marines into Bellows Air Force Station and then return for a quick extraction all within a couple of hours.

Co. L, 3/3 got the assignment and decided to turn the mission into a full blown raid on a simulated communications site to take advantage of their assets. "Whenever we have the training areas and helicopters available, we use our time to obtain the most meaningful training possible," commented Capt. Michael O'Hara, Co. L's Commanding Officer.

During this one portion of the MCCRES, the HMM-262 Marines were confronted with a variety of problems that tested their aeronautical abilities and prior planning coordination. On the way into the LZ, the lead helicopter was fired on with a simu-

lated ground-to-air missile and had to execute the evasive action plan that had been discussed in their pre-flight brief. Once the two waves of helicopters had unloaded their Marines in the landing zone, they immediately received a call for help from the ground. The 3/3 Marines had received five simulated casualties on the attack and needed an immediate medevac.

And if that wasn't enough, the pilots and crew were faced with another problem when they came in for the extraction. A number of the Marines from the raid had been contaminated with an unknown simulated chemical. Special provisions and quick decisions had to be made on the scene within seconds to handle the scenario, which the HMM-262 Marines took in stride.

Now that the MCCRES is over for HMM-262, the findings are forwarded to the Commanding General of FMFPac. This lets the general know that this individual unit under his command is ready for combat. The report then continues on to Headquarters Marine Corps where it is compiled with other MCCRES findings to evaluate areas where there are training and where more training needs to be emphasized Corps-wide, according to the 1st MEB's operations officer.

## 8th Annual Marine Expo to be held in Washington

ALEXANDRIA, VA. — The eighth annual Modern Day Marine Military Exposition will be held at the Sheraton Washington Hotel, Washington, D.C., Aug. 23-25. It represents the largest display of amphibious warfare equipment in the world with more than 125 companies scheduled to participate.

The three-day exposition will include technical seminars, an enlisted awards luncheon and a formal grand banquet.

The Marine Corps Research, Development and Acquisition Command at Quantico, including its officer and staff level schools, will reflect the Modern Day Marine Exposition on its training schedules because of the education value of the exhibitions the comprehensive seminar program, first introduced to the exposition in 1986.

A USMC Enlisted Awards Luncheon will be held Tuesday during the exposition

and will honor four enlisted Marines and a Fleet Marine Force Navy corpsman for distinguished contributions to combat readiness in the Fleet Marine Force. This invitation-only event is one of the most prestigious events associated with the exposition.

Also on the agenda is the invitation-only formal reception and Grand Banquet which will be held August 24. The Marine Corps League will present its highest civilian award, the Military Order of the Iron Mike. Previous recipients include James H. Webb, Jr., Donald T. Regan, Gen. Lewis W. Walt, Sen. Dewey Bartlett, Howard K. Smith, Gen. Louis B. Wilson and John Wayne.

The exposition and the seminars are open to all military and DoD civilian employees, media representatives, allied foreign embassy, and defense contractor personnel.

## Gunner rank 'born' in 1916; makes comeback after 14 years

HQMC, WASHINGTON, D.C.—"Marine Gunners," until recently, considered a vanishing breed, are making a comeback within the ranks of the Marine Corps after a 14-year absence.

ALMAR 09/88 announced the re-establishment of military occupational specialty 0306, infantry weapons officer, to be designated Marine Gunner, and authorized to wear the "bursting bomb" insignia.

A selection board will convene at HQMC Sept. 13 to select the first 16 Marines to be appointed Marine Gunners since the designation was discontinued in 1974. Those Marine selected will be appointed in January 1989 and will join the three Marine Gunners currently on active duty, according to HQMC officials.

HQMC is planning to add 12 additional gunners during each of the next three years, to bring the total strength to 52 by FY92.

Those chosen will be opening up a new chapter in the history of the Marine Gunner Program—a history which began with the passage of the 1916 Act of Congress which first authorized the warrant grades of

Marine gunner and quartermaster clerk.

Subsequently, in 1917, 41 quartermaster clerks and 43 Marine gunners were appointed.

The shortage of officers during World War I resulted in all but three of the new warrants being commissioned as second lieutenants.

Congress established the commissioned warrant grades of chief Marine gunner, chief quartermaster clerk and chief pay clerk June 10, 1926, and required six years of service, in addition to an examination, for promotion from warrant to chief.

Just a few months before Pearl Harbor, congress provided that under temporary appointment "in time of war or national emergency," warrant officers, like senior NCOs, could be jumped to captain, keeping such temporary status until six months after the end of the war or national emergency. However, Oct. 21, 1943, in the middle of World War II, congress abolished the grades of chief Marine gunner, quartermaster clerk and pay clerk. In their place, congress established the grades of chief warrant officer and warrant officer.

It was not until 1956 that the bursting bomb insignia of the Marine gunner was restored for qualified personnel appointed as nontechnical warrant officers.

The resurrection was to be short-lived, lasting only three years as the Marine gunner program was eliminated with the inception of the "Young" Warrant Officer Program in 1959.

As the Vietnam hostilities developed, the Marine gunner designation was reinstated. That was in October 1964, and it was only for those specialized in the infantry, artillery, tank, amphibian tractor, or operational communications fields.

A decade later in 1974, the Marine gunner designation was again discontinued for the third time since its inception in 1916. However, personnel previously designated gunners were allowed to retain the title and insignia.

After 14 years, the Commandant has reintroduced the rank of Marine gunner and has directed that they come from the ranks of the infantry's senior staff NCOs.

# Legally Speaking

## Landlord-tenant code

How many times have you had to ask your landlord to fix something in your rental unit? Of those times, how often was the repair as prompt and complete as you expected? The Hawaii Residential Landlord-Tenant Code obligates landlords to perform various types of maintenance within certain periods of time and entitles tenants to safe, healthy premises with facilities and appliances in good working order. Before you move in, the landlord must inventory the premises, record their condition in writing, and give you a copy.

Your landlord must then keep the premises in a habitable condition, and maintain all electrical, plumbing, and other facilities and appliances that he has supplied, in good working order and condition, subject to reasonable wear and tear. If you want to agree to perform some of the maintenance, you should first consult a Legal Assistance Attorney for advice. You, as tenant, are not obligated to repair the premises, but, basically, to keep them as clean and safe as possible.

### Tenant's Repair Remedies

There are three types of situations covered by the Hawaii Residential Landlord-Tenant Code's repair remedies. All require the landlord to begin repairs and complete them as soon as possible, but vary in the type of notice you must give. Also, the time to then begin repairs varies from three to twelve days. However, in all situations, if the landlord is unable to begin the repairs within the set time for reasons beyond his control, he must inform the tenant of the reason for delay, and set a reasonable tentative date to begin repairs.

The first situation involves electrical, plumbing, or other

facilities, including major appliances provided by the landlord as shown on your rental agreement, which are necessary to provide sanitary and habitable living conditions. This appears to be the most serious situation. Therefore, the landlord must begin repairs within three business days of receiving oral or written notice. If the landlord fails to perform on these sanitary, and habitable living conditions, you may immediately do or have done the necessary work, submit receipts to the landlord and deduct from your rent a maximum of \$300 per month/per instance for actual expenses.

The second situation involves written notification to your landlord by the Department of Health or other state or county agencies that a condition of the premises constitutes a health or safety violation. Here, the landlord must begin repairs within five business days of written notice. If the landlord fails to perform, once again you may deduct a maximum of \$300 from the rent per month/per instance for actual expenses in repair. In the alternative, you can give the landlord written, signed estimates from two qualified workmen at least five business days before having the work done, then proceed to have the work done. You must use the workmen who gives you the lower estimate. If you choose this alternative, you may provide the landlord receipts for actual expenses, and deduct \$300 or one month's rent, whichever is greater. In this case, the landlord may require, in writing, a reasonable substitute workman or substitute materials.

The third situation involves other defective conditions on your premises that violate your rental agreement or the landlord's previously mentioned obligations to supply and maintain fit premises. In these situations, the landlord must

**On the Blotter**

**Alcohol incidents**

A private first class was the victim of an assault near the back gate. A dependent son reported to the Mokapu gate sentry that two Marines were fighting on the Antrac trail. The private first class, who was on his way to Kailua, told the MP that a lance corporal had assaulted him at the barracks, and then followed him and assaulted him again. The lance corporal had the odor of alcohol on his breath. He was taken to the Military Police Department, and later released to his unit.

A lance corporal was apprehended for DWI, reckless driving, assault, underage drinking, and numerous other offenses. MPs saw a van speeding on Mokapu Rd., going toward Pyramid Rock Beach. The van made a sharp turn and went off the embankment, and on to the bench. The lance corporal had the odor of alcohol on his breath. When the Marine was told to lock up his van, he used provoking speech, pushed the MP, and tried to take the MP's pistol. The lance corporal threatened to kill the MP. After being restrained, the Marine damaged the MP sedan by kicking the door. His breath resulted in a .10 percent blood alcohol content.

A corporal was arrested in Kaneohe for DWI after he was found sleeping in his car on the Kahekili Hwy. A test of his breath resulted in a .14 percent blood alcohol content. He was released on \$150 bail, and is scheduled to appear in court.

**Other events on the blotter**

Two civilians from Kaneohe were detained for netting inside the boundary area on Kaneohe Bay. MPs were transported by Waterfront Ops to the boat, and both men were advised that they were in a restricted area. The two individuals were later released on their own recognizance.

**LEGAL /from A-4**

Begin repairs within twelve business days of written notice. If the landlord fails to perform these minor defects, you may once again immediately do or have done the necessary work, submit receipts to the landlord, and deduct from you rent a maximum of \$300 per month/per instance for actual expenses. In all of these situations, the total amounts chargeable to the landlord during each six-month period cannot exceed the equivalent of three months' rent. You don't qualify for remedies at the landlord's expense if you misuse the premises or fail to act with due care toward the premises.

You may have a habit of informally discussing your landlord's maintenance obligations, and your repair remedies with him, but the safer practice is to communicate in writing. Keep detailed records of signed and dated receipts and all letters to and from your landlord.

In any case potentially or actually involving a landlord-tenant dispute, you are advised to consult a Legal Assistance Attorney at the Legal Services Center, building 256, or call 257-2160.

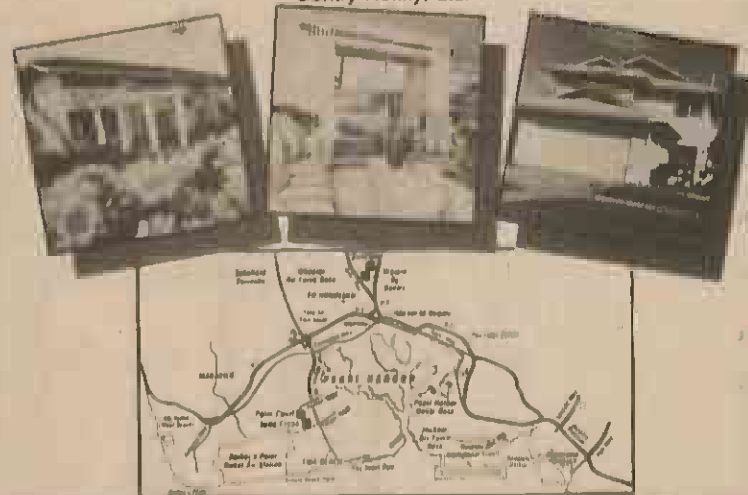

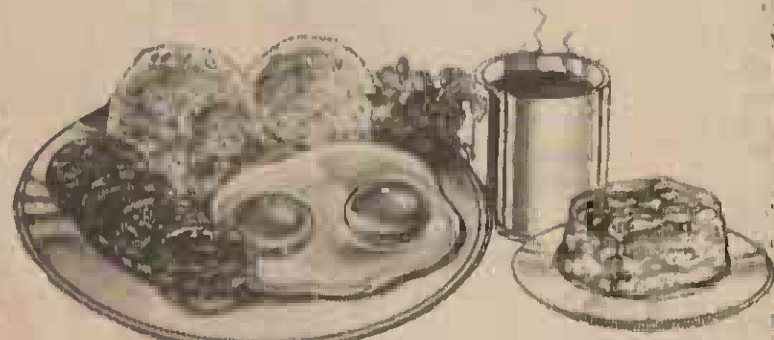



# 1/3 holds field meet in Japan

**CAMP HANSEN, Japan** — More than 700 Marines of 1st Bn., 3rd Marines participated in a field meet June 1. The meet marked the unit's 90th day of island training. # Marshal of the Soviet Union views operation at Lejeune

**MCB CAMP LEJEUNE, N.C.** — The Marshal of the Soviet Union (MSU) and the Chairman of the U.S. Joint Chiefs of Staff (JCS) will visit Camp Lejeune to watch a Marine air-ground/logistics task force operation today. Marshal Sergei Fedorovich Akhromeyev will be at Camp Lejeune as part of a JCS-sponsored visit of military installations designed to promote better understanding between the Soviet and U.S. military. He will be escorted by Admiral William J. Crowe Jr., CJCS. Marshal Akhromeyev, First Deputy Defense Minister and Chief of the Soviet General

Staff, was born in 1923, and has served in the Soviet Army since age 17. He distinguished himself in World War II as a tank commander. Following the war, he commanded a battalion, regiment, division, and army. His duties currently include restructuring and modernization of Soviet armed forces and appointment of senior officers to top positions. Admiral Crowe was appointed the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff by President Reagan Oct. 1, 1985. He was reappointed to a second two-year term in 1987. He serves as the principal advisor to the President, Secretary of Defense and National Security Council. Admiral Crowe graduated from the U.S. Naval Acad-

emy in 1947. He has served as Commander in Chief of U.S. Naval Forces Europe, as well as Commander in Chief, U.S. Pacific Command. Marshal Akhromeyev will visit the U.S. July 5-11. He will participate in a wreath-laying ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknowns at Arlington National Cemetery. During his trip, he will also visit units from the other three military services and will travel to Virginia, North Carolina, Texas, Oklahoma, South Dakota and New York. The Marshal will be accompanied by his wife and other senior military leaders. While he attended the December Summit in Washington, this will be his first visit outside the nation's capital.

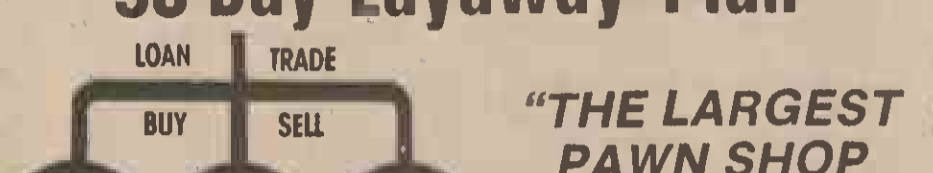

## TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES

Traffic Schedule No. 88-8

IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF ORDINANCE NO. 79-44 AMENDING ARTICLE II, THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SERVICES, CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU, HEREBY ESTABLISHES TRAFFIC SCHEDULE NO. 88-8 TO AMEND SCHEDULE XIV OF SECTION 15-11.3 ESTABLISHING 8-STOP INTERSECTIONS; SCHEDULE XVIII OF SECTION 15-13.10(1)(a) ESTABLISHING "TOW ZONES"—AFTERNOON PEAK PERIOD; SCHEDULE XX OF SECTION 15-13.10(1)(b) ESTABLISHING TOW ZONES—24 HOURS; SCHEDULE XXII OF SECTION 15-14.5(1) ESTABLISHING PROHIBITED PARKING IN CERTAIN AREAS; SCHEDULE XXIV OF SECTION 15-15.1(4) ESTABLISHING CURB LOADING ZONES.

SECTION 1, Chapter 15 (1978 Traffic Code), City and County of Honolulu, as amended, is hereby further amended in the following particulars:

a. By amending Schedule XIV of Sec. 15-11.3 establishing tow zones—afternoon peak period by adding thereto the following item: "Park St. Traffic on Park St. shall stop before entering Laimai Rd."

b. By amending Schedule XVIII of Sec. 15-13.10(1)(a) establishing tow zones—afternoon peak period by deleting therefrom the following item: "Hotel St., makai side, for distance 294' Ewa direction from Ewa curbline prolongation of Ward Ave."

c. By amending Schedule XX of Sec. 15-13.10(1)(b) establishing tow zones—24 hours by adding thereto the following items: "Atkinson Dr., Koko Head side, mauka direction from a point 158' makai of mauka curbline prolongation of Kahaiki Dr. to Kapiolani Blvd." "Hotel St., makai side, for distance 294' Ewa direction from Ewa curbline prolongation of Ward Ave."

d. By amending Schedule XXII of Sec. 15-14.5(1) establishing prohibited parking certain areas in the following particulars:

1. By adding thereto the following items: "Hilani St., mauka side, from a point 400' Ewa direction from mauka curbline prolongation of Tantalus Dr. extending Ewa to its dead end." "Hilani St., makai side, from a point 420' Ewa direction from mauka curbline prolongation of Tantalus Dr. extending Ewa to its dead end." "Kahaiki Dr., Ewa side, for distance 41' makai direction from mauka curbline prolongation of Kahaiki Dr. (next to 'TMK: 2-4-16: 33)." "Kulihi St., Koko Head side, for distance 60' makai direction commencing from the mauka curbline prolongation of Nobrega St. during hours 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., school days only." "Kalihi St., Ewa side, for distance 60' makai direction from a point 190' makai of mauka curbline prolongation of Lehua St. during hours 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., school days only." "Kapiolani Pl., both sides, for its entire length." "Kapiolani Blvd., both sides of dead-end roadway, between 2812 and 2824 Kapiolani Blvd."

"Lauhala St., Koko Head side, for distance 90' makai direction from mauka curbline prolongation of Luaniua St." "Lauhala St., Koko Head side, for distance 360' mauka direction from mauka curbline prolongation of Beretania St." "Lehua St., mauka side, from Nihii St. to Kalihi St. during hours 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m., school days only." "Pacific Heights Rd., Ewa side, for distance 120' mauka direction from Ewa-mauka curbline prolongation of Lanole Pl."

"Hikoi St., Koko Head side, for distance 100' mauka direction from a point 224' mauka of mauka curbline prolongation of Lanualo St." "Waiolu St., mauka side, Ewa direction from a point 124' Ewa of Ewa curbline prolongation of Lokahi St. to its terminus."

2. By amending the following items: a) Oahu Ave., Koko Head side, between makai boundary 3233 Oahu Ave. in the mauka/Koko Head direction and a point makai side Loulu St., 183' from Koko Head intersection of Loulu St., to read: "Oahu Ave., Koko Head side, between makai boundary 3229 Oahu Ave. mauka-Koko Head direction and a point makai side Loulu St., 245' from Koko Head curbline prolongation of Loulu St."

b) Philip St., mauka side, between point opposite driveway 1629 Philip St. and a point approximately 30' Koko Head opposite driveway 1633 Philip St. to read: "Philip St., mauka side, Koko Head direction from a point 69' Koko Head of Koko Head curbline prolongation of Kahaiki St. to its terminus."

c. By amending Schedule XXIV of Sec. 15-15.1(4) of Subsection (2) establishing freight curb loading zones by adding thereto the following item: "Makalao St., makai side, for distance 30' Ewa direction from a point 130' Ewa of Ewa curbline prolongation of Amama St."

SECTION 2. This Schedule is hereby attached to and made a part of Article VI hereof and shall take effect ten (10) working days after its publication.

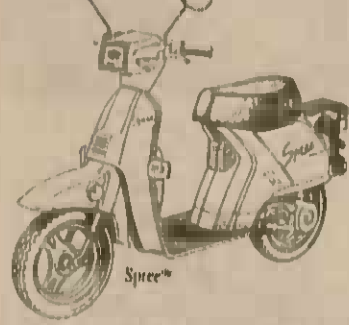
