Two local woman Marines assaulted in Kailua

Two Air Station woman Marines were kidnapped, robbed and sexually assaulted at knifepoint in Kailua Friday night by a man Honolulu police believe also raped a Lanikai woman the next day.

Police arrested 26-year-old George L. Silva Sunday and charged him Monday night with 12 felony counts. He is being held on \$420,000 bail.

The Marines were in their car leaving Times Supermarket about 8:30 p.m. when, according to the woman on the passenger side, she saw Silva move toward her friend.

"At first, I thought he was one of her friends," she said. "But I knew something was wrong when she crawled into the back seat. Then he sat in the driver's seat, put the knife against me and said, 'Give me all your money, and don't try anything stupid

because I am just as scared as you are.' We just told him he could take the money and run, but he started to drive off."

The woman said that, while on the road, the back seat passenger said something that angered the kidnapper. He then ordered her, at knife-

point, to address. "He said he was going to rape me while my friend watched, and I got real scared," she said. "So when we got by the credit union near the back gate, I jumped out of the car when I saw him shift the gear, because I knew he couldn't do that and

hold the knife, too." The jump cost her a broken right heel and an badly injured left knee, but she managed to flag down a motorist, who was also a Marine.

After the Marine attempted to pursue the car, he drove to the back gate where military police phoned the Honolulu Police Department to report the incident.

"It's amazing," the woman later said. "We were in a

public place, it was well-lighted, there were two of us, and we weren't wearing provocative clothes. But it still happened. I had always said that if it happened when I was alone, I was pretty sure I could get away, but this has opened my eyes. I would tell women now that whenever they're out anywhere, they have to keep their eyes open and their guards up—always."

Higher-tech hits 1st MEB gun line

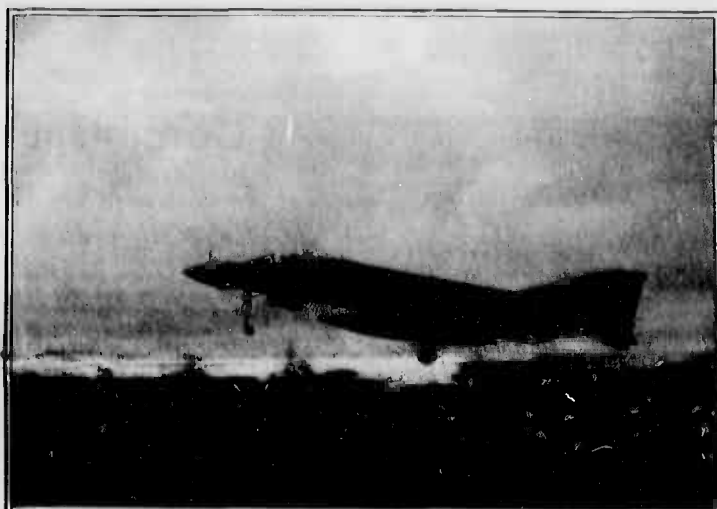

The 1ST Marine Expeditionary Brigade's artillery, 1st Bn., 12th Marines, experienced something new at a recent exercise conducted at the Pohakuloa Training Area.

The Battery Computer System, which has been serving Army artillery units for some time, has been introduced on the Marine gun line. The RCS computes data during a fire mission which is input by fire direction control.

Some of the elements computed are the type of projectile and fuze intended for use, target location, number of rounds to be fired, and weather. The computation of data takes about 30 seconds, as opposed to the

You can still sign up for dental program

AFIS—If you've been gnawing your teeth over your family's dental bills, wishing you'd signed up for the dental insurance available to military families, smile.

"You can still join the Dependent Dental Program, even if you opted out earlier," said Navy Capt. Tom

McDavid, special assistant for dental affairs to the assistant secretary of defense for health affairs.

"All you have to do is get a form from your personnel office and fill it out...in fact, the process is so simple that I suspect that's why people keep putting it off," said McDavid.

Since the program began in August 1987, military dependents in the United States have been receiving dental care from civilian dentists under the Delta Dental Plans of California and Michigan. Similar to the Civilian Health and Medical Program of the Uniformed Services, the dental plan is a

cost-sharing program.

McDavid urged members who haven't opted for the insurance to do so now, during National Children's Dental Health month. "The insurance is a good deal, \$3.93 per month for one dependent, \$7.86 for two or more," said McDavid. "It

Tax tip:

Tax payers claiming a dependent who is at least five years old must include that dependent's taxpayer identification number on their return. For most individuals, this number is their Social Security Number.

If the dependent has a Social Security Number but the taxpayer does not know what it is, or if the dependent does not have a Social Security Number, the taxpayer should contact the local Social Security Administration Office.

If the Social Security Number has been applied for but not received, place the words "Applied for" in the block requiring the Social Security Number.

Taxpayers can use the "Applied for" exception only one time per dependent.

Local Marine, government truck in five-vehicle collision

A Marine stationed at MCAS Kaneohe Bay was involved in a five-vehicle collision on the Likelike Highway Feb. 2 when his government-owned M923 truck skidded out of control.

The driver, a lance corporal from BSSG-1, was enroute to Pearl Harbor from the Air Station when the accident occurred.

According to military police, the driver allegedly lost control of the vehicle due to slippery roads caused by rain. The five-ton then collided with a moving van which was one of four vehicles pulled to the shoulder of the highway due to an earlier accident.

The impact with the moving van caused a chain reaction that left everything from minor damage to one flat-bed truck's being totaled.

Drivers and passengers involved suffered head and neck

injuries and were taken to Queens Medical Center for observation.

The accident is under investigation.

The other Marine, meanwhile, was taken to Kaneohe High School, where the man reportedly attempted to rape her and punched her several times, leaving her with a broken jaw. She broke away during the struggle and flagged down a motorist as the man fled in her car.

The two Marines were later taken to Tripler Army Medical Center and treated.

At about 10:45 p.m. Saturday, a 20-year-old Lanikai woman was robbed, kidnapped and raped at knife-point under similar circumstances. The man beat her about the head, put her out of the vehicle, and drove off with her car. She received help at 1:55 a.m. at a nearby home, according to Honolulu police.

Police said Kaneohe residents spotted a man Sunday morning taking items from two cars, putting the items into a van, and driving away. Police found both cars shortly after 9 a.m. By 10 a.m., patrol officers had pulled the van over on Keolu Road and arrested the driver.

Silva was booked Sunday on multiple counts of first-degree sexual assault, kidnapping, second-degree assault, three first-degree robbery counts and auto theft.

Police said the suspect had been paroled recently after serving a prison term for robbery.

Air Station Marine to receive Purple Heart

Award to be presented Wednesday after 20 years

More than 20 years after he was injured during the Vietnam War, GySgt. Howard Halsey, club system supply chief for the Air Station, will finally be awarded a Purple Heart Wednesday morning.

The medal will be presented to GySgt. Halsey by Col. W.E. Daniell, the Air Station commanding officer, at a Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron formation.

While on the final leg of his 13-month tour in Vietnam, LCpl. Halsey was an infantryman assigned to Co. E, 2nd Bn., 5th Marines in the city of Phu Bai. One day, early in February, 1968 (GySgt. Halsey doesn't remember the exact date), he was assigned to accompany a convoy of artillery ammunition into Hue City. He and several others provided security for about 30 vehicles, including jeeps, flatbeds, and five-ton trucks.

The delivery to Hue City had been successful. After off-loading the ammo, the convoy began the return trip

to Phu Bai.

As the convoy exited the outer edge of the city at about 3 p.m., a mine was detonated beneath the rear vehicle of the convoy.

"After being there so long, you hear the difference between a tripped mine and one that is detonated," GySgt. Halsey said.

"Within 15 seconds, another mine was detonated at the front of the convoy. Then everybody got hit—machine-gun fire, grenades, rocket launchers..."

A barrage of fire was delivered by the enemy from a tree line to one side of the convoy bordering a grave site. LCpl. Halsey and two others were aboard a vehicle near the middle of the column; their truck sitting directly over a fork which split into another road.

The driver of the vehicle immediately split from the convoy and took the other road. Machine gun fire tore at the truck; glass was shattered and metal was pierced by the barrage of assault weapons.

"It was amazing the driver even survived," said GySgt. Halsey. Another truck, also with three Marines, had peeled from the column of vehicles and followed the lead. Beyond the truck, LCpl. Halsey could see the NVA overtaking the remainder of the vehicles.

It was during this time that LCpl. Halsey realized he had been injured.

"I don't even remember when I was hit," he said. "All I was worried about was staying alive." LCpl. Halsey's left forearm had, at some point in the ambush, been punctured by a piece of shrapnel, but was not in serious need of first-aid. "The shrapnel was so hot it closed off the wound itself," he said.

The two vehicles moved 300 to 500 yards until it was hidden by a dense area of undergrowth. The six Marines abandoned their vehicles and ran for cover within the perimeter of the cemetery.

Spotting the burial ground were small concrete huts, which were used in memoriam, such as headstones. It was in these that the Marines hid themselves—long after the ambush was over.

At about 9 p.m., a U.S. detachment approached. After hours of hiding, LCpl. Halsey and the other five Marines left the huts. The

unit was in the process of cleaning up the ambush site. LCpl. Halsey immediately saw that he and his comrades were very lucky; everyone else accompanying the convoy, about 120 Marines, had been killed.

LCpl. Halsey and two others received immediate medical care. He was issued

a card to give to his unit upon return. This card, he was told, would merit him a Purple Heart.

"When I returned to my battalion, we went right back to the field. I never got the chance to turn in the card," he said. "It never really

For Petty Officer Second Class Terrance Brown of 21st Dental Company, the new year couldn't have started any better.

Just recently, he was selected as the 1ST Marine Expeditionary Brigade Sailor of the Year for 1989.

For the 23-year-old, becoming Sailor of the Year came as a big surprise.

"When I first heard I going up for brigade-wide board for sailor of the year, naturally, I was honored, but I wasn't confident that I would be selected," he said. "As far as I know, every Sailor of the Year has been an E-6, so being an E-5, I didn't think I had a chance."

What he thought was a "no-win situation" turned to personal accomplishment. When selecting a person for Sailor for the Year, a lot is taken into consideration. The board looks at the duties performed at the applicant's job, community involvement, and off-duty education.

A lot of Marines and sailors probably recognize him as the sailor in a Marine uniform who works behind the appointment desk at the dental clinic.

When DT2 Brown isn't helping his co-workers behind the desk, he can be found behind the computer aiding to the mission of getting the brigade dental-ready.

When DT2 Brown graduated from Kenwood Academy (Chicago) High School in 1984, he joined the Navy to further his education. He is currently taking classes at Chaminade University of

Honolulu pursuing his associate's degree in accounting.

There are two reasons why DT2 Brown attends college four nights a week. Their names are Dominique and Derrick, his 2-year-old twin boys.

"I would like to be able to share those older years with them, when playing baseball with dad will be important," he said. "I want to be there for them—that's why I'm pushing hard for my degree."

Between work and school, DT2 Brown still finds time to become involved in his community. The dental technician gives lectures to pre-school children about preventive dental techniques.

"I consider that the best part of my job is when I get out of the clinic and work with the kids," he said. He started working with children when he was in Australia.

"I show them the proper brushing techniques, talk to them about Mr. Yuck Mouth. I really enjoy it," he said.

Although DT2 Brown considers being Sailor of the Year an honor, he feels being selected to represent his unit for the brigade board is an even a bigger one.

"I know it might sound corny," he said. "But to know that the people I work with recognize what I do for the unit, and feel confident in my abilities is the biggest honor."

DT2 Brown's application has been submitted for FMFPac Sailor of the Year, where he will go up against sailors from as far as Yuma, Ariz. and Okinawa, Japan.

Commissary listens to patrons

A new commissary is due to open in 1993.

It will be twice the size of the one now, and will be located near the Marine Corps Exchange gas station. But until it opens, the Commissary Advisory Committee is working to establish better service for its customers.

When first opened in 1942, the commissary's sales were at \$42,000 a month. Sales now top \$1,000,000 a month.

The commissary is here primarily to serve the cus-

tomers aboard the station. One way is by providing a suggestion box in well-marked and obvious areas. The suggestion boxes are now placed near the entrance and exit doorways.

The boxes are emptied daily. The commissary store manager provides immediate responses to all suggestions and questions.

The Commissary Advisory Committee provides a line of communication between the commissary customers and the commissary officer. The committee also provides the commissary officer with

suggestions for improvement to the store.

Customers are encouraged to submit suggestions to the committee advisories.

"This is an excellent way for the patrons to have their concerns voiced, in a positive or negative aspect," said Cmdr. Dom Sanchez, the Air Station's supply officer.

One suggestion received by the committee was the use of flyers to customers telling of specials, events and other discounts that the commissary is having.

A new scanner register will keep the lines down at the check-out counter. Also, the new scanner system will allow price changes by computer rather than by having someone change each item. The first three counters have already been installed with the scanners. The remaining four will be installed in two weeks.

Many patrons have asked why the commissary hasn't instituted the use of double coupon days. The committee raised the question to the commissary officer. The

suggestion was considered, but denied due to the fact that the commissary is a non-profit organization. The items are sold to the patrons at the same price the commissary purchases them. The use of double coupons would force a price raise in the items to prevent a loss to the commissary.

The commissary does encourage patrons to use manufacturer's coupons for a number of reasons. Primarily, they offer savings to the customers, but by using them, the commissary receives a percentage from the coupons. The commissary, in turn, uses the percentage for operational costs.

The commissary here is one of the few Marine Corps commissaries that is open six days a week.

"We're here for the patrons' needs," said Cmdr. Sanchez. "We are here to provide service for the entire (military) community."

one and a half minutes for its predecessor, the Back-Up Computer System—a much smaller, hand-held device.

Although the BCS, which resembles a moderate-sized personal computer, is accurate, the FDC still keeps the HUCS on hand in case of unforeseen trouble.

According to LCpl. Michael K. Reich of Battery A FDC, the BCS was introduced more than 10 years ago in the Army. But the system didn't make its Marine Corps debut until August.

The trip to PTA was the second use of the new computer system by 1/12. Its initial breaking-in took place during Combined Arms Exercises at Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center Twentynine Palms, Calif., in November.

"This is the age of the computer," said LtCol. P.S. Morosoff, 1/12's commanding officer. "If we don't introduce this equipment, we will not be competitive." He said the technology allows the artillery units to strip the enemy of his artillery quickly.

Due to its accuracy, the system will get effect on target with less rounds and allow more rounds to be saved for other missions, according to LtCol. Morosoff.

FDC is not the sole element in arty affected by BCS. The computer system links directly to each gun within a platoon. Section chiefs, who are in charge of the howitzers, operate what has been named the section chief assembly. The assembly allows chiefs to verify information passed during a fire mission.

This eliminates the chance of misunderstood data transmitted over the voice activated headset, which used to be the only source of communication between FDC and the gun line.

"The system helps because each gun can get its own information without confusion over the headset," said Sgt. Cliff R. Mallory, a Battery A section chief.

SSgt. John A. Fletcher, Btry. A, 2nd platoon operations chief, speculated that someday forward observers might operate computer components with a direct link into the BCS. This will amount to steel on target almost instantly.

"In the future, using the digital system, artillery will be able to get rounds on target in under one minute," he said.

will more than pay for itself if your dependents just get the two covered checkups and cleanings per year."

In addition to the two cleanings and check-ups, the insurance covers fluoride treatments, routine dental X-rays, laboratory exams and emergency minor treatments for pain.

Also covered are fillings, stainless steel crowns for baby and repairs to dentures.

The program is designed to cover families of members stationed in the United States, Puerto Rico and U.S. Virgin Islands. Therefore, if you are now overseas and will be posted stateside on your next assignment, McDavid suggested checking with your health benefits adviser for information about the program.

As of October 1988, 1.6 million dependents were covered, meaning a high percentage of eligible members from each service have signed up for the insurance, said McDavid.

"It's a good program, and we're continually looking to make it better," he added.

Construction at MCAS reaches all-time high

Look in almost any direction aboard the Air Station and some form of construction can be seen; whether it is a new building going up, or the roads being torn apart and repaved. These numerous renovations are coordinated by the Facilities Department Office of Public Works.

"We award about 95 percent of the projects aboard the Air Station through the competitive bidding process," said Navy Lt. Richard P. Sauerwein, the Air Station public works officer. "We start off by putting a package together, including design plans and specifications of the project."

The packages are then published in construction magazines, to be read by contractors, who call in a

price for the job. Contracts are awarded to the lowest bidder.

There are currently two contractors improving the station's roads. The roadwork is performed in two phases. First, the outer edge of the pavement is shaved. This creates low areas, allowing water to drain into the gutters. The second phase is the paving. Road construction, which began in October, is scheduled to be completed in April. The total road improvement will cost \$2.6 million.

Another big project is the erection of two four-story barracks near the K Bay Laues. The barracks will be home to more than 400 Marines.

It is still unclear which units will be moved into the sleek "suites." The project is scheduled to be completed

during this fiscal year, and will cost a total of \$9.3 million.

A current renovation of seven existing barracks is also in progress. Five of the seven are already housing Marines with the remaining two to be finished this year. This project will create 486 living spaces at the price of \$8.8 million.

The flight line is currently in the third of a five-phase project to reconstruct the entire airfield. The work is taking place between hangars 104 and 105.

"We are removing and replacing the aircraft parking areas," said Lt. Sauerwein. "This includes tearing out the concrete that has been here since World War II." This phase of the project was awarded for \$8.8 million.

Other projects scheduled for fiscal year 1989 aboard the Air Station include an electronics maintenance shop for Brigade Service Support Group-1, a new motor pool for 3rd Marines—co-located with the existing 1st Bn., 12th Marines gun park; and a training and operations

facility for the Integrated Signal Intelligence System which will be used by the electronics warfare platoon of 1st Radio Bn.

By the end of FY-89, the Air Station will see more than \$33 million in improvements.

"Construction at MCAS Kaneohe Bay is at its all time high," said Lt. Sauerwein. "This year has represented a tenfold increase in our aver-

age military construction, which has been accomplished without an increase in the size of our civilian engineering staff."

Plans for the FY-90 include the construction of work and administration space within all Air Station hangars except 104, and a Special Compartmented Information Facility for 1st Radio Bn.

HALSEY/from A-2 interested me. Plus, I was getting short."

Lt. Col. Halsey departed Vietnam to spend one year on guard duty at MCAS El Toro, Calif. He was honorably discharged in 1969. In 1971, he reenlisted into the active reserve, and served at El Toro in aviation supply.

As a sergeant, he enlisted once again into active duty in September of 1976. GySgt. Halsey arrived at MCAS Kaneohe Bay in September, 1985, and was billeted for service with the club systems.

"When I got into the club system, I met the director, Lou Legare," explained GySgt. Halsey. "He recognized me immediately from Vietnam. He was the battalion aid chief for 5th Marines. I was on duty at the time, wearing Charlies. He asked me where my Purple Heart was. I told him I didn't receive it, because I never turned in the card."

GySgt. Halsey wrote to Headquarters Marine Corps and sent along a recommendation from Legare.

"The only proof I had was my word and his word. My medical records from Vietnam were never found," said GySgt. Halsey. His word was taken, and the award was approved.

"I feel lucky because it has been so long," said GySgt. Halsey. "I knew I rated the award for so many years. Now that the Marine Corps has recognized this, I feel gratified."

Army Captain fits bill at 1ST MEB

When he graduated from West Point and then from Stanford University, it never crossed his mind that during his military career that he would be working with his service rival.

For Army Capt. Andy Bowers, formerly an artillery officer for 25th Division at Schofield Barracks, this became a reality when he was assigned to 1ST Marine Expeditionary Brigade headquarters Aug. 1.

Finds place on the 'other green team'

When he was due to rotate, Capt. Bowers called his personnel manager (equivalent to a Marine Corps monitor) to "see what was over the horizon" for his career.

After several months of

waiting, he finally received a phone call telling him that there was a billet for an artillery officer in Hawaii, but that it was with the Marine Corps at MCAS Kaneohe Bay.

"I really didn't know what I was getting myself into, but I thought it was an interesting idea to work with another service," he said. "It was a matter of luck, my being assigned to operations with the 1ST MEB."

Being attached to the Marine Corps, Capt. Bowers is in a situation that not many Army officers are given. He is able to see first-hand the similarities and differences of the two services in the artillery field.

Since both Marine and Army field artillerymen train at Fort Sill, Okla., an Army post, the transition from Army to Marine artillery officer was smooth.

"Since we train together, things such as the routine of delivering and directing artillery is the same," he said, "so making the transition wasn't a dramatic one."

But the transition from one service to another was not as simple.

"I had to learn a totally new language," he explained. "Words like 'battalion' mean two different things to me. In the Army, a battalion is a small unit, where as in the Marine Corps, a battalion consists of five companies."

Working with Marines, Capt. Bowers has probably heard every Army joke from "Did you hear about..." to "How many soldiers does it take..." but he takes them in stride.

"The jokes don't bother me. The Marine Corps and Army are different," he said. "Our missions are different and we can never replace each other. The jokes between us show that we're proud of our services."

Amidst concertina wire at the Pohukuloa Training Area, the jokes and service rivalry took the back seat when it came to performing as a team during the 1ST MEB Command Post Exercise. At the Combat Operations Center, Capt. Bowers served as a watch officer is responsible for disseminating messages to the correct units.

According to Lt. Col. Bob Blase, 1ST MEB operations officer, Capt. Bowers did a "superior job."

"He puts in a lot of hours and has done more than his share," he said. "He is a valuable member of the team."

BSSG steps up training with 14-mile 'stroll'

Under a dark, early morning sky speckled with stars, 101 Marines from Brigade Service Support Group-1 Maintenance Co. left their comfortable offices behind and embarked on a 14-mile force march Feb. 1.

At 6:30, Marines armed with M-16s and load-bearing packs on their backs stepped off for a conditioning march which turned out to be a test of strength, endurance and company camaraderie.

"It's also a confidence booster, which bleeds over to morale," said SSgt. Thomas Williamson, operations chief. But according to him, "humping" (force marching) is all mental.

"I think of it as going for a walk and eating lunch in the park," he said.

According to Maj. Charlie Smith, Maintenance Co. commanding officer, the "stroll" was a stepping stone to the company's ultimate goal.

"Our goal is 25 miles; we still have far to go, but we can do it," he said. "We're working the company up gradually. We started off with five miles, then went

seven. Every march we have not only increased the distance, but the weight as well. This builds endurance."

The Marines were allowed three breaks during the march.

1stLt. John Carter, motor transport maintenance officer, felt the force-march tested the Marines' physical endurance.

"A PET (physical fitness test) is not the real test," he said. "You can practice and train for that, but not for a hump—it is a true test of one's physical endurance."

The conditioning march is one of several different exercises which comprise the support group's on-going "warrior training" program. Others include the Physical Readiness Test, obstacle course, boot and utilities formation runs, and a circuit course.

After four-and-a-half hours and 14 miles, the Marines reached their destination—Bellows Air Force Station.

"Getting back to basics is something we don't take lightly," said SSgt. Wayne Harkley, company gunnery sergeant.

Over the horizon

You name it, the Osprey promises to deliver

The MV-22 "Tilt-Rotor" Osprey can take off, hover, and land like a helicopter. But it also flies like an airplane.

The Marine Corps' newest piece of aviation machinery is due to arrive in the Fleet Marine Force in April of 1992.

The "vertical take-off and landing helicopter" will be capable of cruising at a speed of 287 mph and a sea level dash speed of 316 mph. That's more than twice the speed of the present-day CH-46 and CH-53 helicopters.

The MV-22 is the world's first aircraft constructed from solid laminate graphite-epoxy composite materials. The Osprey can carry up to 20,000 pounds of cargo internally for short-range combat missions. Externally, it can carry up to 15,000 pounds of cargo suspended from its two external cargo hooks.

General Electric and Boeing Helicopters are developing the flight control system for the MV-22.

"The MV-22 cockpit is much different from the cockpit of the CH-46 and CH-53," said Col. W.S. Lawrence, the Marine Corps' MV-22 program director. "There are no gauges in the cockpit. There are four multi-functioning display screens that store all information. Around the edges of the display screens are push buttons that allow the pilot to call up different information."

A pilot may decide to look at one display while taking

off and push to an entirely different display while on route. Warnings and cautions and all other readings that a pilot would normally see in the cockpit will be displayed in a reserved area on one of the screens.

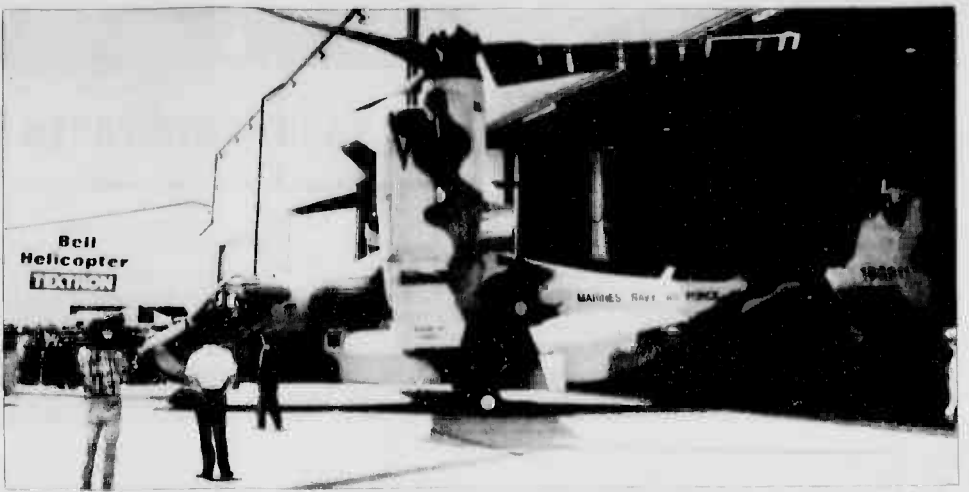
"The kid coming straight out of a training command, that has never flown before, going up on computers. He's going to be able to fly this machine better than I ever could," Col. Lawrence said.

"It's driven by the requirement for low level night flight," he added. "Those pilots who have been to Yuma, Arizona, for the low-level turf route and gotten horrible lost trying to find their way along the map won't anymore."

The map will be programmed on one of the screens. A "chip" on the map will indicate exactly where the pilot is."

There will be a route on the map inputted into the computer that will direct the pilots from starting point to destination.

The MV-22 has an automatic maintenance device that stores all faults and all indicators of faults while the aircraft is in operation. Immediately following operations, the device can be down-

loaded to be repaired at a later time.

Company commanders and platoon commanders found it nearly impossible in the CH-46 and CH-53s to communicate with troops on the ground.

On the MV-22, the commander will be able to plug his radio into the antenna base that is reserved for him. He will then be able to communicate with ground troops without interfering with the plane's communication signals.

The Marine Corps' amphibious assault doctrine of landing two thirds of the amphibious assault force by vertical envelopment will be enhanced by the introduction of the MV-22 Osprey.

Legally Speaking

The federal government imposes a tax on the income of all United States citizens, wherever they live, on the income of all other persons residing in the U.S. This is the federal income tax.

In addition, a number of states and some local governments impose taxes on persons subject to their jurisdiction.

Members of the armed forces are not exempted from

the state or local taxes unless the Soldiers' and Sailors' Civil Relief Act or the state and local laws so provide.

As a general rule, the states that impose taxes do so on two classes of people:

A. Those "residing" or "domiciled" in the state during parts of the tax year.

B. Those not in the state but deriving income from sources within the state.

If these general rules are applied, a person in the armed

PAY YOUR STATE TAXES

forces could be liable to two or more states. This happens where a member pays taxes to the state of permanent residency (usually the home of record) and to the state where he is stationed and thus "deriving" income. Many persons maintaining a

residence in one state but working in another are subject to this double taxation.

The Soldiers and Sailors Civil Relief Act allows a certain amount of relief for members of the military. The Act provides, substantially,

that a member of the armed forces who is a legal resident of one state but not living in another, solely by reason of military orders, is not liable to the second state for income taxes on his/her service pay.

The law does not exempt military retired pay, separate income of a spouse or other members of the service member's family, nor the income of service personnel from off-duty employment, in-

vestments, businesses, rents, bank deposits and other sources.

Example 1: Domiciled in one state, stationed in another, no outside income.

1. Cpl. Bel Gangho is a legal resident (home of record) in Virginia. He is ordered to duty and move his family to Hawaii. He has no income other than his active duty pay. As a resident of Virginia, he is required to pay income tax to the State of Virginia. However,

• A Marine was apprehended by MPs for DWI and

underage drinking. The Marine was stopped for lane-weaving at the H-3 gate when the MPs noticed an odor of alcohol on the Marine's breath. The Marine was advised of the Implied Consent Law, but refused to submit any tests. During processing, it was learned that the Marine was underage. The Marine was later released to his unit.

• In an eight-day period, there were two DWI apprehensions aboard the Air Station. HPD and the CHP each arrested one Marine from the Air Station for DWI.

Other events

• Two Marines were apprehended by MPs for wrongful use and possession of mari-

juana and for possession of an illegal weapon. Another Marine reported that he suspected the two Marines were smoking marijuana inside their room. Upon contact with the two Marines, the MPs smelled alcohol and marijuana smoke in the room. A search of one of the Marines' wall locker resulted in the seizure of a homemade smoking device containing suspected marijuana and a double-edged knife. The Marines were later released to their unit.

• A Marine was apprehended by MPs for aggravated assault. The Marine's wife reported that while at their assigned quarters, the Marine pointed a shotgun at

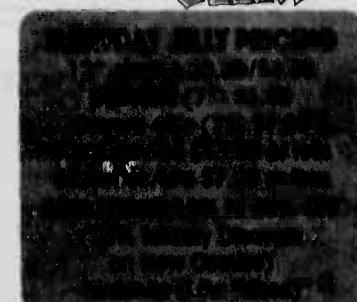

Fourteen hours around the perimeter

Seven Marine teams participated in a recent Perimeter of the Island run around the 133 mile Oahu coast, with the Special Services sponsored "Team Marine" finishing third out of 79 military and civilian teams.

This was the 18th time teams took to the pavement in the annual event which began late in the evening on Jan. 28 and finished over 14 hours later as the teams relayed around the island. Team Marine was led off by Bob Morales who conquered the first 5.7 miles in an impressive 33 minutes, 56 seconds. Coming up to the finish Card suffered severe muscle cramps, forcing Morales to come out of the van (with 21 miles already under his belt) to finish the last mile and take Team Marine across the finish line for their third place overall finish and second place among all the military teams participating.

Water you Waiting for?

Marina offers the ocean

Nothing could be worse than leaving one of the water sports capitals of the world and having to tell your state-side friends, "Well, I never got around to surfing, or skiing or boating." But I did plan on taking SCUBA lessons, but never got around to it.

Imagine yourself now, floating up to your neck, throwing a thumb up to the driver, listening to the whine of 70 horses dragging the ski to the top of the water. Lean back, you check out the view, and appreciate the fact that you're in Hawaii.

you're sitting in one of the best water-recreation spots available.

Water skiing is only the beginning of a myriad of "fun in the sun" activities offered by the Station Marina. They have everything from sailboards to overnight sailboats up and ready to go at prices that make a day on the water affordable to everyone. All it takes is a trip to the waterfront to get started.

"We almost always (even on weekends) have a boat or two waiting to be checked out," said Tom Marlow, a Special Services Marine who helps run the Marina. "I guess there's people out there who don't know what we have or where to get started."

To facilitate everyone interested in boating, the Marina has programs set up to test experienced boaters and brief them on dangers in Kaneohe Bay, and classes to teach novices how to master small craft operation. It all begins by going to the Marina and picking up a study guide a day prior to the weekly tests.

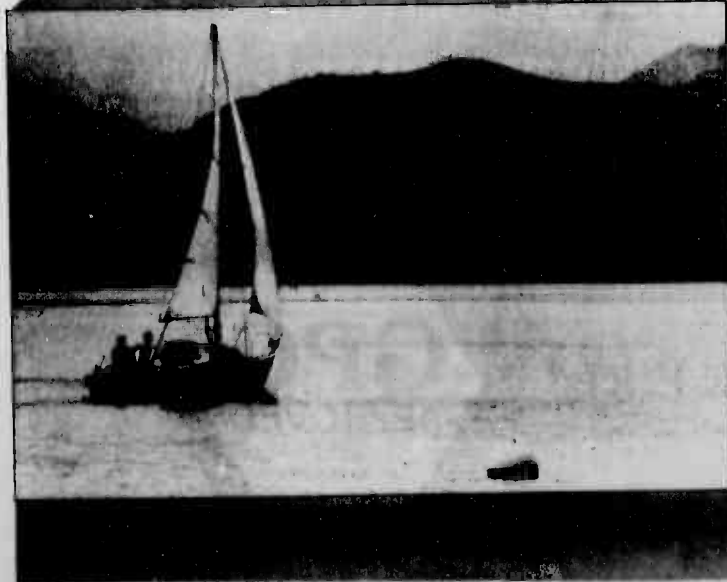
This is where experienced boaters can get their boats checked out.

are available to suit your needs, and are available in the same manner as the sailing craft.

"All you have to do is take the test and we'll run out into the Bay to show you where and where not to go," said Windhurst. "Cruising in a boat is a great way to spend an afternoon or evening."

But, boats are only the beginning.

Stacked against one wall of the boat house are half-a-dozen wind surfers ready to hit the water. All you need to check these out is a little breeze, a little balance and no fear of getting wet.

"We have people who give lessons in wind surfing," said Windhurst. "And the boards really get very little use. It takes some time to master, but

it's good exercise and a blast when you get the hang of it."

Adjacent to the boat house is the SCUBA locker. They have diving gear for certified divers to rent, and programs to certify interested people. They also coordinate boat divers and have a boat to rent.

Classes in SCUBA are coordinated through a local dive shop, who gives a price break to military people which can save hundreds of dollars. Classes start on a regular basis (about every other week) and last for three weeks. At the end of the class students are certified open water divers and can take full advantage of Station's facilities.

If you're looking for either a pleasure trip on the water or a little sport fishing, but want to leave the driving to

someone else, the Marina can still hook you up. The Miller Time III is a private owned, 31-foot sport cruiser that can be chartered for a day cruise or overnight camping trip. The Megan is a charter fishing boat offering a day on the ocean chasing down marlin, tuna or any other fish that will take a bait. Both charters are available through Station IPT.

Even if you have no desire to venture out on or under the water, the Marina still has something to offer you. Everything you need for a camping trip from tents to sleeping bags can be rented for a nominal fee.

Now is the time to get into it, not when your rotation date comes around and, leaving you saying to yourself, "I should have gone sailing, or surfing or..."

er, because of the Soldiers' and Sailors' Civil Relief Act, he is not liable for Hawaii state income tax.

Example 2: Domiciled in one state, stationed in another, with outside income.

Sgt. P.T. Animal is a resident of New Mexico and is stationed in Hawaii. She is required to pay income tax to the state of New Mexico. While stationed in Hawaii, she takes a part-time job during her off-duty hours. The income from the off-duty employment is not covered by the Soldiers' and Sailors' Civil Relief Act. With respect to the off-duty income, she is required to file a Hawaii state income tax return and also report that income on her New Mexico income state tax return.

Although this income would be reported to two states, it would probably be taxed once. The income would be taxed in Hawaii and the tax paid would be credited against her New Mexico tax liability on the off-duty income.

Example 3: Domiciled in

one state, stationed in another, with outside income in yet another state.

Sgt. I.M. Grunt is a resident of Ohio and is liable for income taxes to that state. He is on active duty in Hawaii. He bought a house in North Carolina while stationed at Camp Lejeune. When he bought the house, he did not intend to change his state of residence from Ohio.

The purpose was to provide a place of shelter for himself and his family on duty in North Carolina. He must file an Ohio tax return for his income from military service. In Hawaii, he is exempt from taxes on all military pay and any income from outside the state of Hawaii.

However, Sgt. Grunt rented out his house in North Carolina. This is income, commonly called unearned income. Under normal circumstances, he would be required to file a tax return in North Carolina on the unearned income on the rented property. He would also need to identify and report the rental income on his Ohio tax return, but would

probably receive a credit on his Ohio tax return for any taxes he paid on his rental income.

Treatment of spouse for state tax purposes

Many spouses of military members in today's armed forces hold jobs in the community in which they reside. These spouses in most states, including Hawaii, will become taxpayers in the state in which they live. The service member will not become a taxpayer based on his military pay or just because his spouse works and file a tax return in that state.

The spouse will file the tax return as either a resident or nonresident, based upon that state's tax laws.

A state can treat a spouse taxpayer as a resident based on the period of time that person has lived in that state. Other states will treat the spouse as a nonresident who derives income from within the state.

Each state will determine whether the spouse and the member will file a joint return or that they must file individually.

In Hawaii, residents are defined as those domiciled in the state or maintaining a domicile in the state while outside of the state. Domicile does not include living here for a "mere special or temporary purpose." This allows military families who are in Hawaii at the order of the military for a tour of duty to remain nonresidents for tax purposes.

However, in the event you are in the state for more than 200 days during the year, there is a presumption that you are a resident.

Maintaining contact with your home of record can overcome this presumption.

Examples of that contact include voting and registering your vehicles at your home of record. Residency is basically an "intent" test to determine your intent to either make or not make a place your permanent home and principle residence.

States can require you to show some physical evidence of your intentions. Your military permanent change of station orders, ordering you to duty in Hawaii, are evi-

dence of your temporary status in Hawaii. In Hawaii, most military members would want to file a nonresident tax return. This would require both spouses to declare all income. Then, only the income earned in the state of Hawaii will be taxed.

Remember, just because a spouse files a tax return with the military member in the member's state of residence, it doesn't mean that the spouse's income will be taxed twice. Most states will allow a tax credit for any taxes paid on that income.

Secondly, if a military member is required to file a joint return with the spouse in a state like Hawaii, it does not mean that Hawaii is going to tax the member's pay. It won't be taxed, but it must be reported.

More and more states are becoming very sophisticated in catching those who fail to file their income tax returns. Additionally, a copy of the military member's earnings are furnished to the state the member has declared as his residence. Late penalties and interest on any back taxes can add up quickly.

File your tax returns, and do it early to get your refund back faster. If you have any difficulties, see your Volunteer Income Tax Assister (VITA) representative at your unit. If the VITA-rep. cannot give you the answer, then Legal Assistance Center has a retired Marine officer who will provide free tax assistance on state and federal tax problems. He is available on Tuesdays and Fridays in the Legal Assistance office from 8-10 a.m. He is an expert, and has been trained by the Internal Revenue Service to provide assistance to military members.

Your VITA-rep. can also refer you or your question to legal assistance for advice on difficult tax law questions during walk-in hours from 8-9:30 a.m., Monday through Friday.

Some state and federal tax forms are available at Legal Assistance during the walk-in hours. Hawaii state and county offices, federal offices, banks, and most post offices will provide the more common forms that most individuals will need.

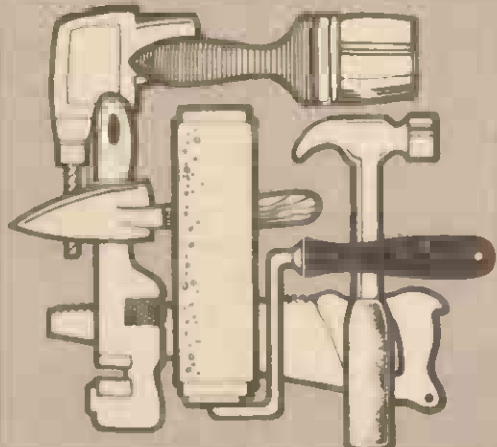

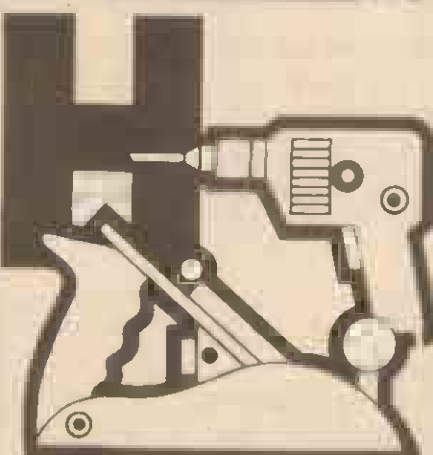

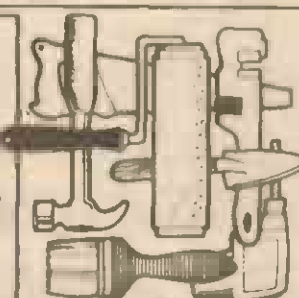
