Military joins war on drugs

In legislation passed last year, the Defense Department was given a much larger role in stopping illegal drugs from entering the United States.

It is now the lead agency for detecting and monitoring aerial and maritime drug smuggling threats into the United States. The law directs DoD to integrate command, control, communications and technical intelligence into an effective communications network.

In addition, DoD is to look at new ways to use the National Guard—under direction of state governors—to battle drug smugglers.

The Defense Department established an office to act as

liaison with law enforcement agencies. This office will work on coordinating policy.

Actual operations against drug smugglers have been assigned to four warfighting commanders in chief: the Pacific, Atlantic, North American Aerospace Defense and Southern Commands.

Joint Staff planners said this approach allows flexibility. "Our initial analysis revealed that it was most appropriate to maintain centralized command and planning but to pursue operational execution on a regional basis," said Army Lt. Gen. Thomas W. Kelly, director for operations on the Joint Staff, in testimony before Congress. "This organization enabled us

to account for the regional differences in the drug-smuggling threat, to avoid creating a large, new, national-level organization and to put the most capable individuals and commands in charge of this important mission."

The other unified and specified commands and DoD agencies will provide support as requested by the four commanders in chief, each of whom is building a staff with local links to the various law enforcement agencies involved in fighting illegal drugs.

Kelly said most of the communications network should be in operation by the end of April. He also said that the Defense Intelligence Agency will provide intelligence sup-

port for detection and monitoring.

The use of the National Guard is over and above the normal annual training. Congress appropriated \$40 million for the operations. Plans are in final DoD review process. They include: detection and monitoring through flight-crew surveillance; aerial photography and other imagery; radar surveillance; long range reconnaissance; container search; transportation of law enforcement personnel, equipment and contraband substances; and increased equipment loans.

These missions are in addition to current ones that support the drug-interdiction effort.

Traffic safety stressed during start of school

DoD pushes to keep pilots on active-duty

The Department of Defense is asking Congress to raise the bonuses paid to keep aviators in service.

David J. Armor, principal deputy assistant secretary of defense for force management and personnel, told the House Armed Services Committee that a raise in the retention bonus paid to aviators is necessary to keep experience pilots in the service.

Under the proposal, the bonus paid to aviators would go from \$12,000 a year to \$20,000. In addition, Armor requested authority for DoD to pay bonuses for longer periods of time. Currently, they stop at 14 years. The Aviation Career Incentive program would remain the same.

Not all services are experiencing shortages in pilots. The Army and Marine Corps have enough. The Navy and Air Force are short 1,500 and 1,200 pilots respectively.

DoD officials say that retention bonuses will become more important as competition for pilots increases in the future. "The retention challenge will



both in use being patterns of the airline industry," Armor said. "In the 1960s, public air travel and hiring surged. These pilots are now being recruited by the airlines."

Armor said that the DoD will continue to pay \$20,000 bonuses to pilots who stay in the service. "The program would remain the same."

Both the Air Force and Navy have implemented new specialties that allow non-flying personnel to specialize in air operations. Previously, only rated (flying) officers could hold these jobs.

Other areas influencing retention—such as more support in relocations, including spouse employment, longer tours and greater assignment flexibility—are being dealt with. Pay will continue to be the most important factor in retaining mid-level aviators.

"Given the extraordinary cost of training pilots and the performance consequences of any reduction in the experience level in the cockpit, the department believes that the proposed increase in bonus offers a cost-effective solution to the challenge that we face," Armor said.

News In Brief

Stiffer No-Fault Insurance Penalties

Failure to have a no-fault insurance policy in effect whenever an operator of a motor vehicle is stopped will result in a citation. Such a citation carries a fine of \$1,000 for the first offense and a minimum of \$3,000 for each subsequent offense. The fines will not be suspended.

The driver's license of the driver of the registered owner may be suspended for six months if any person operates a motor vehicle without a valid no-fault policy in effect insuring the driver or registered owner.

Service men and women should personally ensure that transfer of ownership forms are filed at Department of Motor Vehicles immediately following the sale of a POV.

Rates Lowered for Overseas Calls

Thanks to the new International Direct Dialing System installed on Camps Schwab, Hansen, Courtney and McTureous Aug. 1, placing a phone call from the United States to Okinawa is now easier and less expensive.

To use the system, callers in the United States should dial 011 to get the international operator. Then dial 81 to get Japan, 6-117 to connect to Okinawa, and finally the last six digits of the number here. For example, 635-7421 would be dialed 011-81-6-117-35-7421 from the United States.

For incoming person-to-person calls, the rate for the first three minutes is \$11.38. Each additional minute from 2-8 p.m., is \$1.83. From 8 p.m.-3 a.m., each additional minute is \$1.03. The economy rate for each additional minute from 3 a.m.-2 p.m., is 81 cents. These new rates could save up to \$10 for the first three minutes and \$2 for each additional minute, compared to calls from Okinawa to the United States. The system has been operational on the southern camps since March of this year.

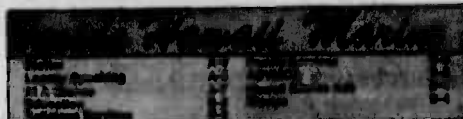
Service Limitations for NCOs Eased

According to ALMAR 137-89, the High Year Tenure (HYT) point for corporals and sergeants, who have consistently displayed high quality performance and are victims of promotion stagnation, is being routinely waived for quality Marines.

Promotion stagnation in some Military Occupational Specialties has created a situation where quality Marines may reach their (HYT) point essentially no fault of their own.

The promotion from corporal to sergeant should have occurred by the eighth year of service. Sergeants should have been promoted to staff sergeant by the 13th year of service.

This means if neither bad conduct nor poor performance has occurred on or near their HYT point, Marines will receive favorable consideration for further service.



Sgt. Maj: Marines determine the Corps' reputation

Recent reports indicate that Hawaii Marines are involved in a disproportionately high number of offenses when compared to members of the other armed services.

Accordingly, our Commanding General has expressed his concerns regarding Marines' conduct on liberty. He stressed his beliefs that: (1) each Marine on liberty bears responsibility for protecting the reputation of our Corps, (2) Marines must maintain our high standards of discipline, both on and off duty; and (3) Marines must conduct themselves in a courteous manner and respect the rights and cultures of others at all times.

Paragraph 1303.2c of the Marine Corps Manual provides officers, petty officers, and noncommissioned officers



of the Armed Forces are authorized to take preventive or corrective measures, including apprehension, if necessary, in the case of any member of the Armed Forces who is guilty of committing a breach of peace, disorderly conduct, or any other offense which reflects discredit upon the Armed Forces. Personnel on leave or liberty are subject to this authority."

In late June, several of our Marines were at a fireworks display and ceremony in Kailua. They swore aloud during the opening prayer and blessing, yelled and belched during the national anthem, and one was even caught relieving himself in a cup where he was sitting. These Marines' actions were in full view of other spectators who included ladies and small children and other Marines. This should never be tolerated at any time.

How many times have you been present at recreational events on base or at the exchange, etc. and overheard some Marine using street-talk and poor language. Lets face it, if a person needs to express him/herself in this

manner, then they are not very intelligent. We need to change our ways by actively participating in preventing this kind of behavior from ever going unchecked. We police our own. "SILENCE GIVES CONSENT." Do not allow your fellow Marines to embarrass our Corps nor tarnish the image of the Marines who have gone before us.

Integrity and principle compel us to take corrective action under these circumstances. Review of Article 134.95 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice suggests that failure to report a serious offense to civilian or military authorities as soon as possible after you have determined an offense has been committed, may be punishable to include a dishonorable discharge, forfeiture of all pay and allowances, and confinement for up to three years. Certainly the reference discusses the extremes, but it does suggest the requisite action you should take any time you witness Marines conducting themselves in a manner which brings discredit on our Corps.

We have traditionally "taken care of our own." As this phrase includes assisting our fellow Marines and sailors in their personal and professional difficulties, this also includes policing our fellow Marines and sailors. We must never allow a few disrespectful or disruptive individuals to tarnish a reputation that the rest of us so fervently strive to keep lustrous.

given by Honolulu Fire Department firemen, they carry the victim out of the building and begin the lifesaving steps.

Working with the local fire department, the men have been cross-training in many aspects of the life of a fireman. They have a dangerous job. The knowledge and skills they gain from their training may mean the difference between life and death when they are called upon in a real-life emergency.

"It builds the bond between us (civilian and military firefighters) to have the Marines come in," said Capt. Richard Frost, a civilian fireman who helps coordinate the inter-training. "We have facilities that aren't available on base. The more they can practice the better they will be in action."

Working with the local firemen is a fairly new concept in the Crash Crew's training syllabus. It has been

fostered through Camp Smith's "Know Your Neighbor" program, a program designed to familiarize military people on Oahu with civilian businesses and organizations. While Marine fire fighters' primary mission

is responding to crashes on the flightline, any training they can get broadens their capabilities for dealing with disaster.

"We're out here working on a simulated fire inside a building," said SSgt. Archie

Achuara, a section chief with the MCAS Kaneohe Bay Crash Crew, as he directed his men around the Honolulu Fire Department training facility. "While we don't normally handle building fires, the men are gaining confidence in the equipment."

Achuara went on to draw a parallel between a smoke filled room and a cargo plane on the runway at the Air Station.

"If a C-5 was on fire we would have to know how to go in and get the people out."

By 10:17 they have combed every inch of the 50-square-foot room and located a Marine acting as a victim. Using techniques learned from their years as Marine Corps crash-crewmen, along with classes

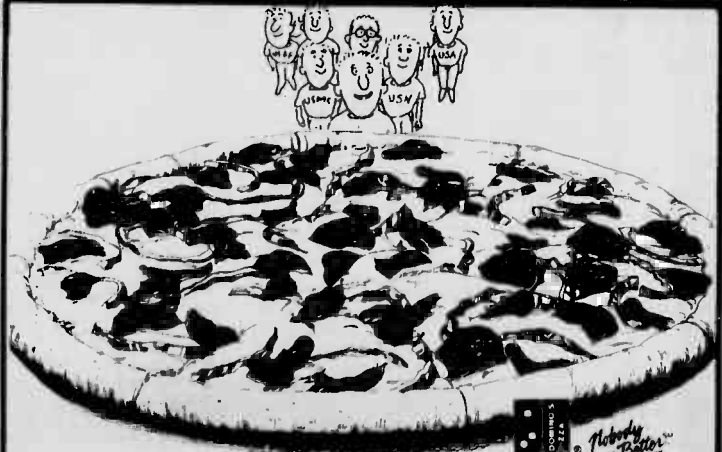

Mail-call, 18 years late

"Neither snow, nor rain, nor heat, nor gloom of night, stays these couriers from the swift completion of their appointed rounds."

The mailman has upheld this creed throughout history. On August 15, 1989, a postal Marine here returned a letter

to "Pvt." Douglas Goodrich. Goodrich had mailed the letter to his grandmother while he was in boot camp. The envelope read, "Return to Sender."

This may seem like an ordinary attempt to deliver the U.S. Mail but what makes this story a little different is Pvt. Goodrich is

no longer a private. In fact, by the time this letter was returned to him, 18 years had past and Pvt. Goodrich had earned six promotions.

GySgt. Douglas Goodrich, the classified material control center chief of Marine Aircraft Group-24 was that 18-year-old private who wrote the letter to his grandmother in 1971.

"I thought the postal Marine was trying to be a wise guy when he said he had a letter for a Pvt. Goodrich," said Goodrich. "That's when I saw that it had my name, my grandmother's name, and a six-cent stamp on it."

According to Goodrich, the letter probably fell behind a shelf and wasn't discovered until 18 years later.

"My grandmother never had a chance to read the letter because she had died eight months earlier," said Goodrich.

On the Blotter

Alcohol Related Incidents

Two Marines had dinner and drinks at a local establishment in Kailua, and after breaking a glass left the restaurant without paying. The Marines fled the area in a vehicle, nearly running over the owner of the restaurant. The vehicle later ran the H-3 gate. Contact was made with the owner of the vehicle, who stated that she had loaned the vehicle to another Marine. Contact was made with that Marine and the odor of alcohol was detected on his breath. He was transported to MP Headquarters, where a breath test resulted in a reading of .14 percent blood alcohol content. The Marine was apprehended for DWI, failure to pay a just debt, and damage to private property. The owner of the restaurant later identified the Marine as one of the individuals who left the restaurant, but that Marine refused to identify the other Marine involved.

A Marine operating a vehicle with part of the DoD decal missing was observed approaching the H-3 Gate.

The Marine was instructed to proceed to the Pass and Registration Office to get a replacement decal. When the Marine exited his vehicle, he was observed swaying as he walked. Upon making contact, the MP detected the odor of alcohol on his breath, and he failed to pass a field sobriety test. A records check revealed the Marine is currently on the base revocation list and that the DoD decal on his vehicle was registered to another Marine's vehicle. The Marine was taken to MP Headquarters, where a breath test revealed a .10 percent blood alcohol. The Marine was apprehended for DWI, driving on revocation, fraudulent use of a DoD decal, and larceny of government property. During processing, it was discovered the Marine had two wallets and two Armed Forces Identification Cards. The Marine was later released to his unit.

Other Events on the Blotter

A Marine was apprehended by Fort DeRussy Military Police for an expired safety decal, fraudulent use of a registration decal, and

no insurance. The Marine was stopped in the Fort DeRussy parking lot for the expired safety decal when it was discovered the license plate had been altered and the Marine had no insurance. The Marine was later released.

The dependent daughter of a Marine was treated at the Branch Medical Clinic for puncture wounds on her face, received when a dog jumped on her. The owner of the dog stated that the girl approached the dog while it was eating in the rear of the owner's quarters. The owner said the dog jumped, striking the girl in the face with its paws. The girl was treated and released.

A dependent wife reported that her seven-year-old son wandered away from her while at a local restaurant in Kailua. A search of the area by HPD and the Fire Department failed to locate the boy. He was later found by the MPs, walking down Moffett Road on the Air Station.

Check Your Speed

Recently there has been an

increase in the number of people from the Air Station receiving tickets from HPD for speeding on the H-3 Highway. At the Kamehameha end of the H-3, the posted speed limit drops quickly from 55 to 25 miles-per-hour, and at the Air Station end it drops from 55 to 35. These two areas are where most of the citations have occurred. The reason for the dramatic drop in the speed limit is the winding curves at either end of the H-3, where the requirement for a rapid stop could occur.

The Air Station MPs warn you to be safe not sorry, and if you have any questions about speed limits call the Traffic Section at 257-2130.

Essay: "Why I'm Proud to be Part of a Military Family."

Editor's note: The following is the essay written by Charles Buckingham II for the Hawaii Military Week scholarship competition. Charles is a 13-year old 9th grader at Iolani School.

There are many reasons why I am proud to be in a military family. I could simply list them, but that doesn't really tell how I feel. People often do not think of military families being close, the man is "super macho" and the woman just stays at home taking care of the kids and talking about

other people's business. This is a stereotype and could not be more wrong. Military families often face the loss of one parent for six months or a year as they go on deployment. The children are forced to rely on the other parent and vice versa. This requires a closeness between us that is often not found in other families that I have seen. We are forced to support each other and families who are in the same situation.

Another reason I am proud to say that I am in a military family is that when I refer to this "family" I am also

thinking of all the families I know in the military community. This community of military families seems to have a higher rate of volunteerism than any other corporate group. Our family is a good example. My mother has been a regular volunteer at Aikahi Elementary School and our church. My dad and I have both been active with Windward Special People (WISP), a group of retarded citizens.

As I look back, many of my soccer and baseball coaches were servicemen, fathers of military families. This spirit

of volunteerism puts the military and their families in a good light with the non-military community.

While the pride is never lessened, there are times when being in a military family is hard because you meet people in a high risk business. I had a friend named John Nisbet, a helicopter pilot with my dad, who was young and single and sort of took us as his family. Every so often he would come over unexpectedly with a pizza, and often he would come when I was in trouble with my parents. He would

make some jokes and usually when he left, my mom and dad would be in a better mood. But then, just over a year ago, he was killed when his helicopter crashed off Kailua beach. These events

bring the entire military "family" together and make them tighter. This is another reason for my pride. Finally, I take pride in the fact that I have found mili-

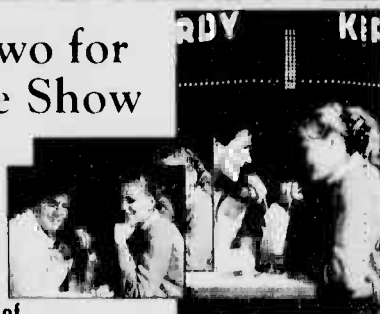

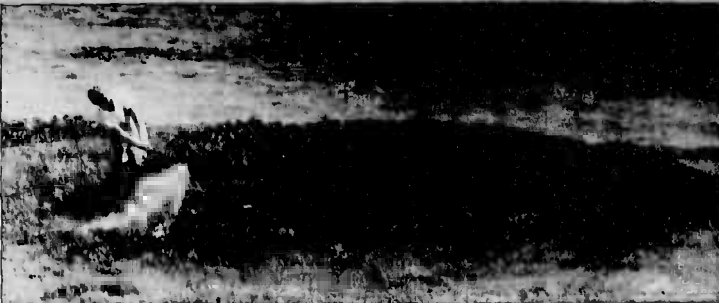

Education

In the past couple of weeks we have discussed the Veterans Administration funds that are available for education. This week I would like to talk about the current rules concerning the Marine Corps Tuition Assistance (TA) Program.

These funds are available to anyone of any service, on active duty. To obtain TA funds at the Joint Education Center, you must be assigned to MCAS, Kaneohe Bay for permanent duty. This would include, in addition to the Marines here, all the Navy personnel and those few Army personnel assigned to this Station.

The TA policies are as follows:

A. Rates payable - TA will pay 75 percent of actual college tuition charges. TA will not pay fees or any part of book costs. TA will also pay 100 percent of tuition for high school classes, however the student is still responsible for all fees and books.

B. Amounts payable - Here is where TA gets tough:

(1) For lower division (100 and 200 level) undergraduate courses, TA will pay up to 20 semester hours or \$1650 (\$1750 if you are on your second enlistment) per fiscal year (Oct to Sep). However, TA will only cover 65 semester hours of lower division courses throughout your career. Sixty of these hours are normally required in most associate and bachelor programs.

(2) For upper division (300 and 400 level) undergraduate courses TA will cover up to 18 semester hours or \$1650

(\$1750 if you are on your second enlistment) per fiscal year. Again, as with the lower division courses, there is a career limit of 85 semester hours. Normally, 60 of these hours are required for a bachelor program.

(3) The reason for limiting the number of hours during your career is that we want you to achieve a degree. We understand that as you change colleges certain classes don't transfer, that's why the additional five semester hours are there. Basically, TA is to help you get an education and a degree, not a form of entertainment for those people who just enjoy going to college.

(4) You can combine upper and lower division courses within a fiscal year as long as you do not exceed the \$1650 (\$1750 if you are on your second enlistment) limit during any one fiscal year.

(5) TA will fund 20 semester hours of graduate work up to a fiscal year limit of \$1000 and a career total of 40 semester hours. There is no dollar maximum for sergeants and below on graduate courses.

(6) Graduate and undergraduate courses can be combined during the same fiscal year as long as they do not exceed \$3000.

(7) Vocational courses are a little different. TA will pay for vocational courses as long as the program leads to a cer-

tificate and as long as the program is related to your MOS or any MOS that the program qualifies you for a lateral move into.

(8) TA will also pay 75 percent of the tuition for correspondence courses listed in the DANTES Independent Study Catalog or its supplements.

C. Acceptable programs - Any program that leads to a diploma, certificate or degree at an academic level above what you presently hold is acceptable. However, the institution must be accredited by the Council of Postsecondary Accreditation (COPA) and recognized by the Department of Education.

TA will also pay 75 percent of the tuition for correspondence courses listed in the DANTES Independent Study Catalog or its supplements.

D. Failure/withdrawals - If you fail the course or voluntarily withdraw from the course, you are required to reimburse the Marine Corps for that amount of tuition assistance funds provided. All future entitlement to tuition assistance is suspended until repayment is made. On an involuntary withdrawal due to work commitments, this reimbursement may be

waved upon recommendation of your commanding officer.

E. Obligation - By accepting TA, a commissioned officer obligates him/herself for two years upon completion of the course.

F. Availability - Tuition assistance funds are available at the Joint Education Center (JEC). The counselors on

the Air Station have the appropriate forms and will help you complete them when you register. If you want to attend a college that is not represented on Station, stop by the JEC and we'll help you get your forms completed.

The information above is extracted from ALMAR 153/89 and is the policy for Fiscal Year 1990 funds. Future articles will address changes that may occur.

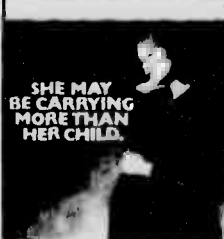

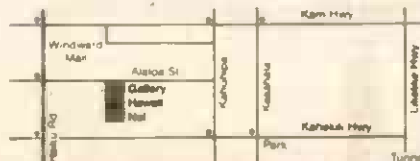
