Festival drawing near, Station prepares for visitors

The 1990 Windward Family Festival, co-sponsored by Castle Medical Center and Marine Corps Air Station Kaneohe Bay, will be held here July 27-29.

The three-day Festival will be the largest single event ever held on the Windward Coast, featuring water sports, carnival rides, games, staged entertainment, Marine Corps equipment plus community exhibits and information. Castle Medical Center will provide several activity booths and displays ranging from the Emergency Room "Ask a Nurse" display to its

mobile mammogram van.

"Besides a weekend of fun, the festival offers a unique opportunity for Marine units (down to the company level) to raise some extra money," said Maj. John Buckingham, Assistant Director of MWR.

Volunteers are needed to operate rides, collect admission fees, and work in the food and game booths. "We are prepared to increase a unit's MWR party fund by \$2 per volunteer," said Buckingham. He is currently coordinating the unit volunteers and can be reached at 254-5871.

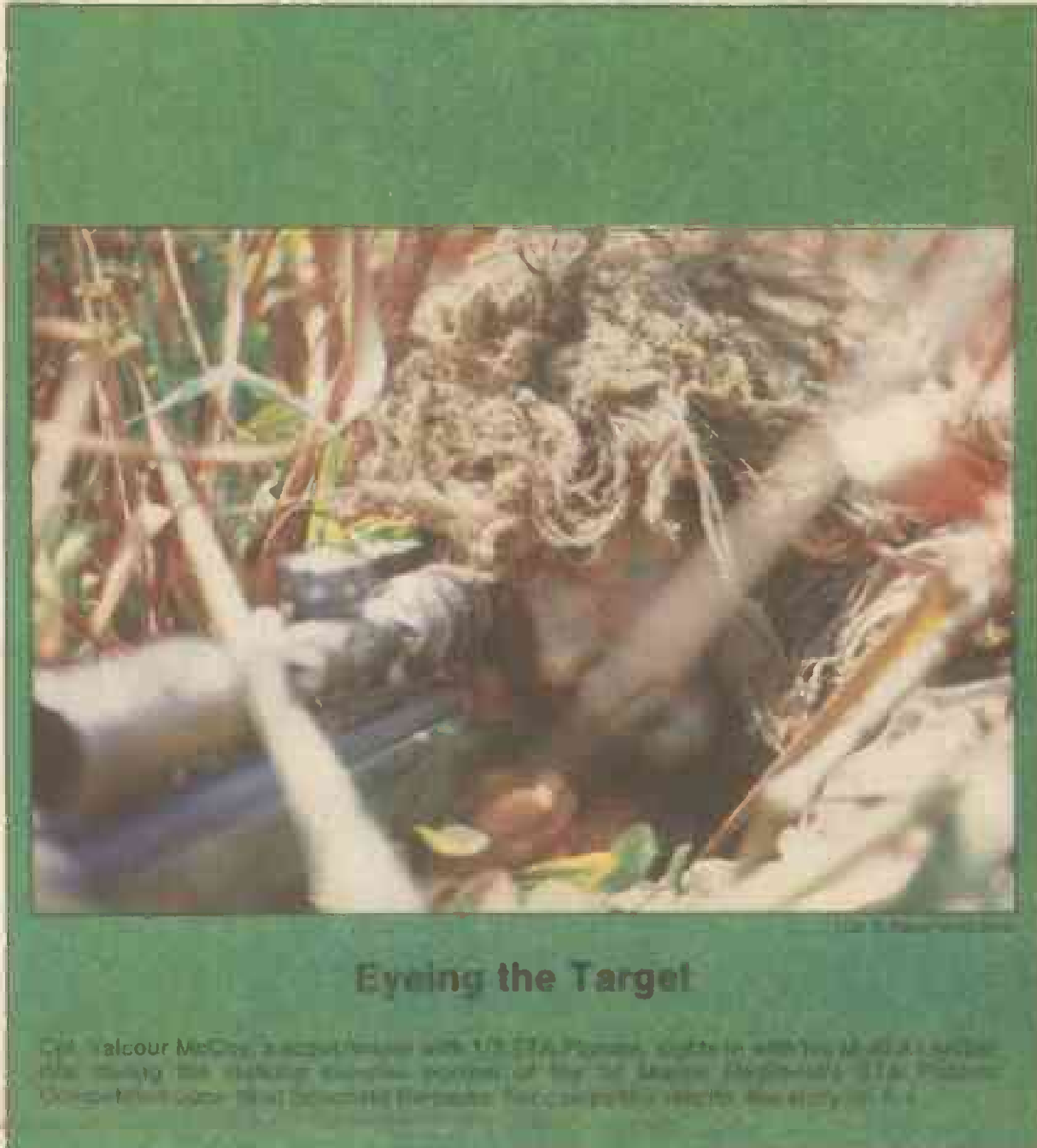

Admire to take command of 3d Marines during Platt Field Ceremony Friday

The 3d Marine Regiment will get a new commander Friday at 10 a.m. during a change of command ceremony on Platt Field. Col. John H. Admire, currently the MEB's assistant chief of staff for Operations and Training (G-3) will take command of the reinforced regiment from Col. James L. McClung, who is transferring to Headquarters Marine Corps.

Admire joined the Corps in November 1965 after graduating Phi Beta Kappa from the University of Oklahoma with a bachelor's degree in advertising and a master's degree in journalism. He has since earned a second MA degree in strategy and policy (1982) and a third in inter-

national relations (1988).

After the Officer Candidate Course and The Basic School, Admire served in Vietnam as an infantry platoon leader with 3d Bn., 3d Marines, from 1966-1967. After two promotions and a tour as an infantry company commander at Camp Pendleton, Admire returned to Vietnam after completion of the Advanced Infantry School to serve as an adviser to the Vietnamese Marine Corps (1969-1970).

After a tour as an officer selection officer in Houston (1970-73), Admire reported to the 2d Marine Division at Camp Lejeune and served as a company commander in Cuba with 2d Bn., 8th Marines, and as the Battalion Landing Team 2/8

and senior White House social aide to President and Mrs. Carter (1976-79). Admire served as an instructor at the Armed Forces Staff College at Norfolk, Va., from 1980-82. He was promoted to lieutenant colonel in January 1981.

Admire served as the G-3 Plans officer for the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing in Okinawa from 1982-83, and served as the deputy chief of staff for the 3d Marine Amphibious Force for the Exercise Bearhunt deployment to South Korea, and as the commanding officer of 3d Reconnaissance Bn.

After attending the Naval War College in Newport, R.I. (1984-85), Admire reported to Headquarters, U.S. European Command in Stuttgart, Ger-

many, to serve as the III MEF tactical exercise controller for Team Spirit 89 in Korea.

Admire was transferred to the 1st MEB in August 1989. His personal decorations include the Bronze Star with combat "V" and a star in lieu of second award, the Purple Heart, the Legion of Merit, the Navy Commendation Medal with combat "V," and the Combat Action Ribbon.

McClung will work in Plans, Policies and Operations when he reports to Headquarters Marine Corps. He joined the 1st MEB in June 1987 after a tour at Headquarters, FMFPac, and served as chief of staff for the MEB until he took command of 3d Marines in June 1988.

News In Brief

Adm. Kelso Posts as Chief of Naval Operations Tomorrow

Adm. Frank N. Kelso becomes the 24th Chief of Naval Operations when he takes over the post from retiring Adm. Carlisle A.H. Trost at a ceremony at the Naval Academy tomorrow.

Adm. Kelso was previously the Supreme Allied Commander Atlantic (NATO) and Commander-in-Chief, Atlantic Fleet, based in Norfolk, Va.

Marine Fighter Pilot Killed

A Marine Corps F/A-18 pilot was killed June 10 when his jet crashed during carrier qualifications aboard USS Enterprise 80 miles east of Norfolk, Va.

1stLt. Michael J. Watters, Strike Fighter Squadron-106, based at Naval Air Station Cecil Field, Fl., crashed into the Atlantic approximately three miles in front of the carrier during night carrier operations. Search and rescue operations were conducted for 18 hours by helicopters based aboard the Enterprise and U.S. Coast Guard aircraft. The cause of the accident is under investigation.

Pless Hall Set to Re-open

Pless Hall Dining Facility is scheduled to re-open Monday for breakfast after a four-month re-furbishing project. During the shut-down, the deck was replaced and new equipment was installed.

Marine Diver Rescued off Makaha

A Marine was rescued early Saturday morning after he was separated from his diving partners while doing a night dive off Makaha, north of Barbers Point. The Marine was rescued by a civilian fishing boat at 2 a.m., several hours after he was reported missing.

Building urban warfare skills

Penn Battery resurrected

In 1945, a five-year project to put a 14-inch gun from the sunken battleship *Arizona* on top of Ulupau Crater. The emplacement site was completed just as World War II came to a close. The gun was never used and shortly thereafter was removed and scrapped.

Today, although the 53-foot-long gun is gone, the underground concrete facility that housed it still stands as a hollow reminder of the past. Its 43 rooms were turned into an eerie, but realistic training site last month.

Instructors of the Squad Leader's School brought Pennsylvania Battery back to life, as students from Class 1-90 conducted Military

Operations in Urban Terrain (MOUT).

"MOUT is part of our standard curriculum," said 1st Lt. Scott Fazekas, "but we don't have any facilities here to give (the students) realistic training."

He said that one of his instructors came up with the idea to use Penn Battery. After checking into it further, Fazekas had to agree, the idea was a good one.

There are safety precautions of training within the concrete structure, but they aren't insurmountable. For one thing, there are no lights, and most of the battery remains pitch black regardless of the time of day. This problem is compounded by inconspicuous holes that are

scattered throughout the three levels of the battery. These holes — which come in all shapes and sizes — doubtless had a purpose at some point. Now, however, they serve only as ways to break limbs.

While the class was conducting their MOUT, two generators were brought inside the battery and used to light two of the larger rooms. In addition to this, the fluid from Chem-lights was used to trace any objects or holes in the rooms that the students would be using.

"This isn't as ideal for urban training as the ones that are built especially for MOUT operations, but it's the best thing we've got here," Fazekas said. "I just hope we'll be able to use it more in the future."

VMFA-212 changes command Friday

Command of VMFA-212 will change hands Friday at 2 p.m. during a ceremony on the flightline between Hangars 103 and 104. LtCol. James M. Collins II will take command of the "Lancers" from LtCol. David J. McCarty, who has commanded the Hornet squadron since December 1989.

McCarty, who has logged more than 5,400 flight hours in fighter and attack aircraft during his 22-year career, will be reassigned within MAG-24 until his retirement in August.

Collins began his career as an enlisted Marine, serving with 1st Reconnaissance Bn.

in Vietnam in 1969. After separation from the Corps, he was selected as an aviation officer candidate and was commissioned in August 1970. He was designated a Naval aviator at NAS Meridian, Mississippi, March 3, 1973. He reported to VMFA-201 at MCAS Cherry Point, N.C. for F-4J training and was later assigned to VMFA-451, where he served as a pilot through March 1975.

Assigned to 3d Bn., 2d Marines, he served as Battalion Landing Team air liaison officer and fire support coordinator. He deployed with Special Mission Force 1-75 to Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, in March 1975, and served

there through September. In 1976, he deployed again aboard *USS Iwo Jima* for a six-month Mediterranean cruise.

In December 1976, Collins reported to VT-19 at Meridian, where he served as a gunnery instructor, flight operations officer and squadron operations officer until 1979. After Amphibious Warfare School, he was ordered to VMFA-212 in May 1980, where he served as logistics officer, aviation maintenance officer, operations officer, and executive officer.

His tour with the Lancers ended in 1983 after several Mainland and two WestPac deployments. Selected for the

U.S. Air Force Command and Staff College at Maxwell Air Force Base, Ala., he graduated with distinction in May 1984. His next tour was as the operations officer for MAG-41 at NAS Dallas, Texas, from 1984-1987.

Collins, whose most recent assignment was within the 1st MEB's Operations section (G-3), came to Kaneohe Bay after a two-year tour as executive to the director for operations (J-3) at US-CINCPAC at Camp Smith.

Collins has logged more than 3,000 flight hours, mostly in fighter/attack aircraft. His personal decorations include the Purple Heart and the Defense Meritorious Service Medal.

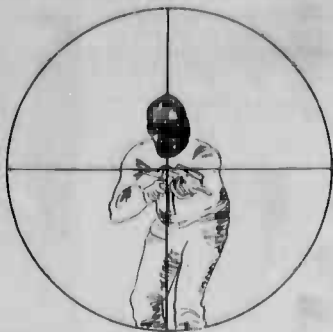

Naming the best sniper in the Brigade

Scout/snipers from Surveillance and Target Acquisition (STA) Platoon, 2d Bn., 3d Marines, claimed top honors in the 3d Marine Regiment's STA Platoon Competition June 18-20.

It was the second STA competition 3d Marines has held. Marines from 2/3 beat STA Platoon from 1st Bn., 3d Marines, 221-191, in making it two out of two, having won the first meet in December.

The meet tested all the basic skills of a scout/aniper, and each battalion's competition team featured their six best snipers plus two alternates. Cpl. George Dabdoub of 2/3 won the top individual scout/aniper award.

The first day's events featured shooting and night skills of the snipers at the rifle range. They fired match rounds from the 200-, 300-, and 500-yard lines at stationary and moving targets. For the night shoot, they used starlight scopes and fired

from the 200- and 300-yard lines at stationary targets.

In addition to live firing, the snipers were paced through two observation exercises, and a range estimation test. Each individual sniper's score for every event was added and divided by six for a team average.

The competition moved to Schofield Barracks on the second day, where the snipers would face the most physical portion of the meet. The snipers went through the first of four land navigation courses (two day, two night) early that morning. Armed with compasses and maps instead of their M-40A1 sniper rifles, the scouts shot azimuths and headed out to find five separate points.

Sandwiched between the two day courses was a grueling "stalk." The snipers had three hours to crawl and slither to a 200-yard line, and pop off two blank shots at the observers, who were scanning the field with high-powered binoculars.

To avoid detection, the snipers were donned in "ghillie" suits. The suits are a combination of utilities, burlap strips, netting and other materials, and when in the ghillie mode, snipers low crawling through the grass are prime examples of the "unseen enemy."

According to Sgt. Patrick Dewey, regimental scout/aniper and a judge for the competition, the longer the snipers are out there stalking, the more careless they get. "They start to get impatient as they get tired," he said.

Stamina Stalking Shooting

An hour into the exercise, only one of 12 snipers had been spotted by Dewey, fellow judge and regimental scout/aniper Sgt. Ferrill Chatman, and Capt. Keith Lawless, the regimental intelligence officer. As the minutes dragged on, and the snipers got closer, the observ-

ers started picking them out one by one.

In the end, only three snipers achieved the maximum amount of points for the stalk. "You can't escape me," said Dewey tauntingly as one of the snipers walked in. "Do you know what got you caught? Your ghillie cover is too dark. Your head is the only thing I saw."

The stalk was followed by the three additional land navigation exercises, and the Marines didn't get back to Kaneohe Bay until almost midnight. "They're some tired puppies," said Lawless.

zation games and a written test. The final event was the second observation exercise.

"Congratulations gentlemen," said Dewey as the snipers packed up their binoculars and scopes. "You have survived STA-Comp-Two."

Lawless gave a short speech to the competitors, applauding their skill and determination. "Every time I see you guys perform, I'm amazed," he said. "I sure as hell couldn't do half the things you do. Once again, kudos to everybody."

Lawless added that for the next competition, all three battalion's STA platoons will be participating, as well as an Army team. "We want everybody to know what STA is all about," he said.

"I think this is the best thing in the world," said LCpl. Douglas Wood. "There's nothing I'd rather do. It's like you against them and I feel like I've got an important job. Yep — no place but STA."

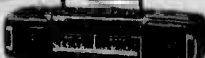

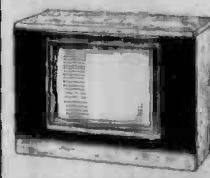

Legally Speaking

Last week's Legally Speaking article covered how vehicle repossessions occur on the Air Station. This week's article spells out the consequences of a repossession.

For the purpose of this article assume that LCpl. Harry G. Benotz went to a car dealership looking for a cheap "Junker" car. As he talked to the car salesman, Benotz started having visions of driving around in a fancy, loaded, \$20,000 car. In his fantasy, because of his new wonder car, all the women who saw him would throw themselves at him, begging for dates.

Moments later, with the contract signed, Benotz drove his new car off the lot. In all his happiness, he forgot that the contract said he would be paying \$425 per month for the next five years.

If he started paying the \$425 each month, however, within a year, he got married and moved into an apartment. Then he had a baby. The bills start to add up to more than he makes each month.

At this point Benotz has three basic choices concerning the car. First, is to continue making the payments. Second, is to sell the car himself. Third, is to have the car repossessed, either voluntarily or at the bank's

request. Choice number three has many lasting consequences.

Once Benotz allows the bank to repossess the car, he will receive an adverse mark on his credit history. The adverse mark will remain on his credit history for the next seven years. Any future creditor who is thinking about loaning him money will look at his credit history and see that he had a repossession. This bad mark occurs even if Benotz voluntarily

gives the car up.

Although Benotz thought he was finished with his car when he turned it in, it will come back to haunt him.

When the car was repossessed, Benotz still owed the bank \$12,000; but the car was only worth \$10,000. At the repossession sale, the highest bidder bought the car for \$7,000. This money was used to pay for the repossession expenses (ie, storage, selling, transferring the title, etc.), the remainder went to the bank

to pay for the amount Benotz still owed. In this case, \$6,100 went to pay on the loan. At this point, the bank is still out \$5,900. Guess who is going to pay the remaining amount—Benotz. He still owes the bank \$5,900 and doesn't even have the car to show for it.

The bank will try to collect the amount from Benotz. If they are unable to do that, they could always turn over the debt to a collection agency. Again, this goes on Benotz's credit history. If the collection agency still cannot collect on the debt, the agency can sue Benotz in court for a judgement in the amount of the deficiency. If the debt is turned in to a

judgement, the creditor or collection agency can try to satisfy the judgement with Benotz's other personal property.

As you can see, repossession of your vehicle is not a pretty picture. If you are experiencing difficulties in meeting your financial obligations get help before it comes down to repossession. The Legal Assistance attorneys can, as your representative, negotiate a new payment schedule with your creditor; some creditors are willing to agree to a delayed payment if they are aware of the situation before it gets too late.

Education

Unlike many people who work in education centers, my background is not in education administration or counseling, but in business and economics. My primary interest lies along the lines of economics, especially in relation to potentialities. And, as I've stated in previous articles, I tend to view everything along these lines. In particular, I tend to review results by analyzing how much potential is lost or wasted.

It amazes me that so many good quality Marines and sailors leave the service with those skills that the military has provided them, and not knowing all that they possess. I like to believe that our military tours are simply

an extension of our education. We are taught our specific jobs and are drilled continually on the various aspects of it. That much is easy to see, but we learn much more. We learn to be leaders, which is a special form of management. We learn to get the best results with the equipment and personnel that we are provided. This develops a search for efficiency, which is a large part of economics, and when we relate this to our income it becomes a hard course in personal finance.

The point is that almost all facets of our career relates in one way or another to practical application of a formal education. This experience teaches us many things that are not attainable in a classroom.

Now to return to potentials. If we do not combine the skills that the military provides, with our personal desires/attributes, we are wasting our best asset, ourselves. In other words, we will never achieve the level of personal satisfaction or level of income and prestige that we have really earned.

There are many ways to enhance or realize our potential, with a formal education being just one. With a formal education you can relate the experiences you've had to the theories and procedures that are contained in the texts. Believe me, it makes them much easier to understand. But, the military provides you with one other important quality that is a definite asset in completing a formal education — tenacity.

This is nothing more than the ability to stick to something when it gets hard; not quitting even though you want to. I do not think that I would have been able to get as far as I have without this drive and I would not have had it if the Marine Corps had not given it to me.

Another way of reaching your potential is to pursue that skill or ability that you are best at. Not everyone is geared to go to college, but that's all right. I may be able to be an excellent educator, administrator or manager, but I don't believe that I would make a good carpenter or automotive mechanic. The leadership skills and dedication you have learned in the military could turn you into an excellent mechanic though.

Every occupation or skill must have leaders. You've already been taught how to be a leader, now all you have to do is develop the skills or abilities that you are best at.

I know I've rambled a little in this column, but I hope that I've gotten across the idea that the time you spend in the military, whether four years or 24 years, is not wasted. You've picked up an education that cannot be taught in any classroom or correspondence course. You've learned to work as part of a team and you've had practical experience.

That experience should not be wasted. You have the opportunity, in one form or another, to channel this expertise into whatever occupation or profession you choose.

The potential you waste can never be regained. However, you must work, and work hard, to achieve your full potential. That's where we at the Education Center can help. We can't do the work for you, but we can help you get started and maybe guide you along the quickest path to your goal.

But we can't do that if you don't let us help. We have programs that can help, some of which I've discussed in these columns in the past. If we don't have the programs you need, let me know and we'll do our best to get them. In the next few weeks we'll be performing our Annual Needs Assessment, that is your opportunity to tell me what you need. I would advise that you use it.

Bending bars Military lifters strain

The Air Station Enlisted Club rocked to a different beat on the afternoon of June 23. The noise wasn't music, but the thump of hundreds of pounds of weights being lifted and dropped during the 1990 Hawaii Armed Forces Powerlifting Championships. Powerlifters from the

Marine Corps, Air Force, and the Army came in force to vie for team honors and individual titles in their respective weight divisions.

The competition consisted of three events: squat, bench press, and dead lift. Judging the competition were Kevin Smith, Buddy Davis, and the Hawaii State Chair-

man of the U.S. Powerlifting Federation, Ray Verdonck. Sanctioned by the United States Powerlifting Federation, this event was only the second official event ever held on the Air Station.

The Marine Corps team, comprised of 13 men and women, ranged in weights from 114-220 pounds. In an afternoon of close competition, the Marine Corps team was beat out by the Army team for top honors. Kaneohe Marine Dane Scott was one of the favorites in the 165 pound division and was out to break the existing Armed Forces record of 441 pounds in the bench press event.

Scott made three close attempts, but failed to get the deciding signal from the judges and was out of the competition.

Other successes in the powerlifting competition were Kaneohe's Crystal Dillard, who took 1st place in the 114.5 pound women's category and Camp Smith's Gina Williams, who captured a 1st place win in the 123 pound women's division. Other Marine first place winners were Ronald Hollabaugh in the 132.25 pound division, Kevin Poynter in the 165.25 pound division, and David

Schleich in the 198.25 pound division.

"Powerlifting is making a comeback in the military," said Verdonck. "This competition was a lot more exciting than last year's. This time the lifters were a little wilder, and that always excites the crowd."

Other highlights during the competition were when Army's Anna Hoffman broke three State records in each of the events for the 181.75 pound division. Army's Sandra Flores-Alamo also broke a state record with a 347 pound squat in her 132.25 pound division.

With 5:39 left in the first half, BSSG was hanging on to a slight lead of 14-8. Fitts, one of BSSG's star players, went into early foul trouble and wasn't playing his normal dominating-under-the-goal style of game.

With 1:15 left in OT, 1/3 gained the lead for the first time, 52-51. At that point, BSSG's offense self-destructed. Fuel was added to the fire when BSSG's head coach Eugene Clark was hit with a technical foul for crossing the halfcourt line during play.

When it was all said and done, 1/3 had captured the Over-30 Championship title, beating BSSG 58-52.

The 1990 Hawaii Marine Athletic Counsel Golf Championships were held at the Klipper Course June 20-24 to pick golfers for the Hawaii Marine Team entry in the Hawaii Armed Services competition next month.

Charlie Allen defended his Open Division championship title for the second year in a row with a four-round total of 302, while Peter Devries took the Seniors competition with a 335.

Twelve golfers competed in the Open Division for one of six spots on the team. The Seniors Division team was already decided at the start of the competition because only four players entered.

Selecting proper clinics aids in medical treatment

Naval Base Pearl Harbor

There is a big difference between acute care and emergency care, according to Lt.Cdr. Cherie Hellier of the Naval Medical Command, Pearl Harbor.

The three Branch Medical Clinics on Oahu (Makalapa, Barbers Point and Kaneohe Bay) are Acute Care Clinics. They provide coordinated services for examination, diagnosis, care, and treatment for minor acute illnesses and injuries during designated working hours. This encompasses minor cuts, scrapes, colds, sore throats, immunizations, eye glasses and other similar things.

The Naval Clinics on Oahu are not Emergency Clinics for treatment of severe injuries and illness. Emergency Clinics are open 24 hours a day, every day, and have a doctor available at all times.

Emergency rooms are where you go if you have a heart attack, cut yourself with a lawn mower or have a car wreck and have to be brought in by ambulance. For military people on Oahu, this service is provided by Tripler Army Medical Center. However, this doesn't mean Tripler is the only place to go. In a life-threatening

situation go to the nearest hospital or medical facility as fast as possible.

The Naval Clinics on Oahu are for acute care only. Sailors, Marines and their families may use them. Below is a list of clinics and the services available at the Air Station Branch Clinic. Clip it and keep it by the phone.

In these times when much of what is available as Hawaiian island crafts is the overload of cheap, mass-produced imported trinkets, it is refreshing to learn that works truly representative of the Hawaiian Islands and handcrafted by islanders can still be found by travelers and kamaainas who will not be satisfied with less.

Such is the LITTLE HAWAIIAN CRAFT SHOP in the Royal Hawaiian Shopping Center on the third floor. Away from the sounds and hustle of Waikiki streets under the shade of a giant banyan tree, you can wander amongst the displays of this shop and experience a sense of the cultural pride which is still underlying in these beautiful islands.

In 1968, Sallie Jacobsen opened a small shop at the Hilton Hawaiian Village where she sold nut and seed crafts and began to add shells, bone and other natural materials to her jewelry. Charlotte Thielhorn joined her in 1975, adding her interest and talents to

vary the assortment to include scrimshaw, feathers and wood. Charlotte became a full partner in 1978.

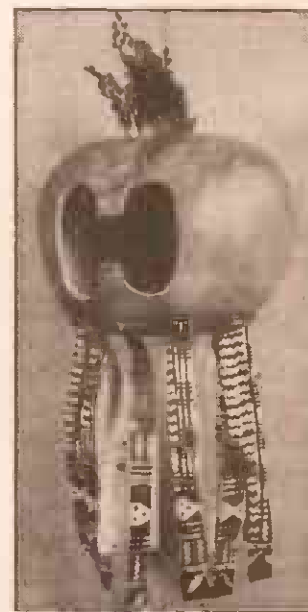
In 1980, they moved to their present location. Their reputation for quality craftsmanship at reasonable prices brought them many referrals and repeat business. With the addition of more artisans, their business grew to four times its original size.

(A small version of this delightful shop has opened at the Dole Cannery Square and will be moving this fall to a larger space nearby.) Usually someone can be seen at the workbench sanding, drilling, polishing or assembling.

The friendly, knowledgeable staff proudly offers the work of about 70 handcrafters of Hawaii and 10-15 from other South Pacific islands. The crafters vary from individuals working at home to small workshops of two to three people.

Bone fishhooks, koa and mīto boxes and bowls, Niihau shells, feather hatbands, wood-

en temple images, hair-picks, scrimshaw, koa rice paddles, hula skirts, Christmas ornaments, ipu, fungus and seaweed painting, quilting, polished shell work, ceramics, tapa and boar tusks are offered along with original pieces of art-gallery quality and fine museum replicas.



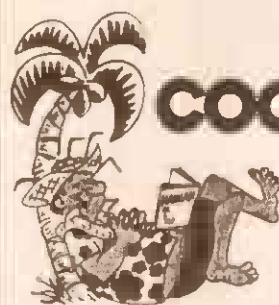
