Families here suddenly facing separation from their Marines and anflors will get a chance Sunday afternoon to find ont how to square away most of the related problems.

All Marine and Navy families of the Kaneohe Ray community, both on and off base, are heing invited by Station Commander Col. R.R. Critser to the "K-Bay Salute to Marine Corps and Navy Families Community Day."

"The entire day will be devoted to the families and to educating them on all the support that is available to them while they are separated from their husbands and wives," said Critser. "It's their day. I would like to see them all attend."

Festivities will take place from 1-5 p.m. at the Station Thenuer, the Lanai Courtward and chastoms, and Ir ay Square, and will be structured around information on benefits and services.

Child care will be available for children agos 4 and up, and will include pony rides, free Disney cartoons, games, and a visit from Ronald McDonald. Pony rides are scheduled for 2-4 p.m., and the Disney cartoons will be screened from 4-5 p.m.

For the rest of the family, service organizations will be on hand at the Lanai Contyard and classrooms. Refreshments, as well as entertainment headlined by the FMFPaa Band, will also be offered. The band will play from 22:30 p.m.

An added feature will be video message taping for deployed family members, offered by the Station Training and Audio-Visual Support Center.

"There will be plenty of food and entertainment," Critser snid. "But what's more important is that we want to make absolutely sure that none of our Marine and Navy families are left in a situation that is unbearable, whether it be hecause of hosaing needs, difficulty with communications with families, children's needs, educational concerns, transportation considerations, or financial problems."

"This is all about giving something hack to the Air Station community and providing something that's needed in these times," said Peter Rudisill, MWR's coordinator for the event. "We're especially concerned about reaching the families who are living off base on the local economy."

Prepositioning tested in Gulf crisis

In the enrly stages of Operation Desert Shield, some analysts were warning that the first components of U.S. forces would be vulnerable to attack. But because of Maritime Prepositioning Force capabilities the Marine Corps may have saved the day.

Using nine prepositioning ships — which combined, carry approximately 13,000 vehicles and another 3.2 million cubic feet of additional cargo — Marines from California and Hawaii

were able to rapidly deploy to Saudi Arabin with enough gear for 30 days of sustained combat.

The 7th MEB from MCAGCC, Twentynine Palms, Calif., was airlifted first and legan off-londing ships in MPS-2 (based off Diego Garcia in the Indian Ocean) Aug. 15. By the end of the second week, Hawaii's 1st MEB began off-loading cargo from MPS-3 (based off Guam in the Pacific Ocean).

As MPS doctrine dictates, equipment aboard the promitted ships was off-

loaded and joined with the MEB personnel who were airlifted along with helicop-ters and other critical equipment not contained

equipment not contained on the ships.

The Maritime Prepositioning Force concept was proposed by the Secretary of Defense in 1979 as a new option for increasing the capable response time of the Marine Corps for contingencies around the world. Marines began training with the prepositioning ships in 1984 to finetune the on- and off-loading procedures as well as

maximize cargo storage capabilities. Desert Shield was the first real contingency test MPS has had, however.

There are 13 commercially-owned, government-leased MPS vessels divided into three squadrons. The squadrons are staged in strategic locations around the globe and each is set up to support a 16,500-Marine brigade. The four ships of MPS-1, which normally operated in the Atlantic, are dedicated to the 6th MEB at Camp Lejeune, N.C. The five ships in MPS-2 and the four ships in MPS-2 and the four ships in MPS-3 are dedicated to the 7th and 1st MEBs respectively.

There are no reports from 10D that MPS-1 has been or is being deployed, but the 4th MEB from Little Creek, Vn., was. Using 13 Navy Amphibious Ships for its cargo, the brigade began leaving from Morehead City, N.C., Aug. 13. Marine Commandunt Gen. A.M. Gray told reporters Aug. 20 that 45,000 Marines were now in the Gulf.

During his Annual Report to Congress in 1988, Gen. Gray said: "With a comtination of amphibious ships, MPS, land pre-positioning, and strategic at 1st 1, you can deploy the Corps where you need it. — Now!"

The Corps was needed in Saudi Arabia and now as cions speak louder than words as Marines prove once again to be America's force in readiness.

Ombudsman of the year passes on experience

Joyce Miller has been an ombudsman for the past five years. She spent half of those in Beaufort, and the other half here. While she says she's the type of person who likes to keep a low profile, her associates put her in the lime-light when they selected her as Kaneohe's Ombudsman of the Year for 1990.

The award comes at a time when the ornbudsman here are perhaps the husiest they've ever been because of the crisis in the Persian Gulf. Like nearly all of the 48 ombudsmen, Miller has already been kept very busy by the deployment of Marines here.

It also comes on the eve of

the Navy Ombudsman Program's 20th anniversary of service to the Navy-Marine Corps family.

Miller is the wife of Sgt. Mark Miller, Maintenance Company, BSSG-1. Her husband has been deployed, and Miller can relate to the wives she serves — that's why she does it.

Katie Iwanski, president of the Ombudsmen Program here, said Miller was picked for her commitment to the

"She's very active and has gotten many things accom-plished for the program," wanski said.

Among her achievements, Miller has coordinated sev-eral regular deployment

family briefings and has maintained a newsletter for the families of 1,100 Marines in BSG-1. She also coordinated responses for a nationwide child care needs survey and sponsored the Group's first and subsequent family picnics.

She also contributed to the May BSG-1 policy letter which defines various duties of the Ombudsman, commanding officer, executive officer and sergeant major, and is a model for the overall Kaneohe Ombudsman Program.

She originally got into the Ombudsman program because she wanted to help out, and found that she very much enjoyed the feeling.
"It gives you confidence to know that you can handle your own situation while your

husband is away," she said.
She also said that helping young wives gives her a satisfaction because she was there once and knows what they go through.

"A lot of wives are totally new to the area or even to the Marine Corps, and its hard to understand how things work sometimes," added Miller.

Along those lines, Miller would like to have a program started to educate wives about Marine Corps issues, such as history, chain of command, and leave and earning statements.
"I think it would help wives."

and nearth ments.
"I think it would help wives to understand what their husbands do, and why they have to do certain things," Miller said.
"When a lot of the units were preparing to deploy,

some of the wives didn't understand why they're hushands never knew for sure when they'd be leaving," Miller said. "As a result, some wives got frustrated because they didn't understand why their husbands couldn't pin-point the day they'd be leaving."

She explained that it usually just takes someone who's been through it before to explain the system to them.

Ombudsmen exist to support the commanding officer by bridging the gap between families and the command they represent. While husbands are away, they help to keep the families in their unit informed of the latest events, and also act as liaison between unit and family when there's a problem.

Miller said she's already helped arranged for one husband to come home from Saudi Arabia because his pregnant wife was near delivery and there were special medical considerations involved.

"I have built a very good report with the commanding officer, and 1 feel he trusts my judgement in cases like this. That's very important for an ombudsman program to work."

Miller, and her Navy counterpart, will be honored during a dinner ceremony Sept. 11 at the Pearl Harbor. Tickets are \$12.50 each and can be obtained at Family Service Center, Pearl Harbor. For more information call Pamily Service Center at 474-2220/4222.



Red Cross + military = communication

One of the greatest fears a military wife lives with is her husband going away to war. Being left alone without the reassurances she's used to having can put a strain on anyone. Add to that the responsibility of taking care of the kids, paying the bills and a million other duties, and the need for a helping hand can take on a new meaning.

There are local organiza-tions designed to be that helping hand. The best known is probably the American Red Cross. What started out as one man's dream has evolved into one of the largest and most diverse service organizations in the world (see related

when most people think of the Red Cross, images of hardy volunteers feeding dirty faces, or efficient nurses taking pulses come to mind. And while disnater relief and medical care have always been a large part of the Red Cross mission, military men and women see the hold, cherry-red cross symbol as a vital link of communication. The American Red Cross.

vital link of communication.
The American Red Cross
(ARC), as mandated by
Congress, serves as the offitial link for the families
of the U.S. Armed Forces in
cases of emergency. The
ARC has been doing this
since the Spanish-American
War near the end of the 19th
century. It was called home
communication services, and
in times of war, when a
message from home had to
reach an American fighting
man, the Red Cross delivered
the news.

The news usually wasn't good; sometimes about a grave illness or death of a

parent or spouse. Yet, the Red Cross also played the stork, bringing news of a birth. However, the ARC isn't the message link for death and casualty reports of deployed servicemembers. Kathleen Yule, the Red Cross service center manager on the Air Station, said news of deaths and casualties are left to the units.

In light of the Middle East situation, with so many American men and women serving thousands of miles away, the need for this vital communication link is two-fold. For Instance, if a 1st MEB lance corporal deploys for Operation Desert Shield and his wife is involved in a serious auto accident, the Red Cross will verify the accident, check on the status of the wife and contact the Marine to get him back to Kaneohe Bay.

Servicemembers are encouraged to let relatives back home know about the ARC's role as a communication link. Relatives should contact their local Red Cross chapter now to let them know they have a relative in the military. This will expedite the channels of communication should an emergency occur.

Yule said Red Cross offices around the world have been handed strict guidelines concerning emergency communications for Operation Desert Shield. "The Joint Chiefs of Staff passed down a 'minimize' communication status," she said. "This means only messages ahout deaths, births and critical illnesses can be communicated." Yule stressed that the limitations apply only to besert Shield, and all other Red Cross functions will go ahead as normal.

The Red Cross provides many different services to

people worldwide. They include classes on first ald, cardiopulminary resuscitation, babysitting and swimmer safety, as well as blood donor programs and massive disaster relief efforts. Hawail Red Cross remains the state's largest health and safety educator, training 60,000 people yearly in standard first aid, CPR and aquatics.

But, as the Red Cross relles almost entirely on a volunteer work force and solely on private donations, it's facing critical shortages of manpower and money. LtCol. Gerald Anderson (retired) of the ARC talked about the Red Cross mission Aug. 19 on CNN. He asked for people to volunteer their time and expertise, and said that nationwide, the ARC is "stepping up" its operations due to the Middle East situation.

After recent massive disaster relief efforts for last year's San Francisco earthquake and Hurricane Hugo that decimated the southeastern coast, it's easy to see that the ARC has been taxed to the limits of personnel and funds.

The Air Station Red Cross chapter is also increasing its support, according to Yule, who has only two other full-time staff members in her office. This past week, Yule sald several briefs were given to various units on pre-deployment preparations.

"We've been stressing to the Marines and sallors that they should keep in contact with their families when they're gone. But it might be a while before they are able to call or send letters, and the families have to



Yule added that it's impor-tant for the Marines and sailors to get their financial and other matters in order before they go, but if there is an emergency at home, the Red Cross can help.

She added that the ombuda-man on Station have been

man on Station have been very helpful, and that the

Red Cross here refers many calls and cases to them. "Sometimes we'll get a call from a wife who just needs to talk to someone," she said.

The ARC also works hand-in-hand with the Navy/ Marine Corps Relief Society.

Society gives assistance beyond battlefield relief

The idea behind what has become today's American Red Cross started with the vision of Henry Dunant of Switzerland. But the credit of founding the diverse social-service organization that has evolved began with a woman named Clarissa Harlowe Barton.

In 1881, Barton organized a society that would go well beyond the giving of battle-

field relief, which was Dun-ant's original intent of an international Red Cross. Barton's society would serve America in times of peace as well as in war, especially when disaster and calamity struck.

struck.

The first war-time participation for the ARC was the Spanish-American War of 1898. This was a major turning point for the ARC, which before had prided itself on quick response to

fire, flood and famine. Although ill-equipped for the War in Cuba and the Philippines, the Red Cross sent doctors, nurses and food; help that the soldiers would not have gotten if the Red Cross hadn't been there.

The effort drew praise from many top officials, including President William McKinley. As successful as the Red Cross was in accomplishing its mission, Barton, already being called the "grand old lady," resigned in 1904 amid charges of mismanagement and financial negligence. But she had accomplished two very significant goals: the official chartering of the ARC by Congress in 1900, and the hringing about of the signing of the Geneva Convention treaty by the U.S. government.

The Red Cross was also there in Galveston, Texas, after the 1900 Hurricane that

claimed 6,000 lives. In 1906, when the infamous earth-quake shattered San Francisco, Red Cross workers calmly dished out meals and treated injuries to the tens of thousands of affected citizens. The San Francisco Earthquake allowed the Red Cross to show its massive relief capabilities and closed the mouths of many Red Cross detractors and critics. Throughout the 20th century, the ARC continues to serve in times of need, in every war and in every type of disnster. The ARC has seen great faces among its volunteers, including an 18-year-old Red Cross ambulance driver named Ernest Hemingway, who would go on to win the Nobel Prize for Literature. He earned Italy's second highest award, the Silver Medal of Valor for rescuing a fallen comrade in battle during World War I.

Today, the ARC has more than 3,000 chapters in the U.S. with about 78,000 volunteers. There are 300 chapters on U.S. military installations across the world. Hawaii-based military chapters alone processed more than 17,000 emergency communications in 1989 and provided more than \$300,000

in financial assistance

In 1904, Clara Barton said that "It is not in its past that the glories or benefits of the Red Cross lie, but in the possibilities it has created for the future, in the lessons it has taught, in the avenues to humane effort it has opened..."

Red Cross deploys to Middle East

WASHINGTON D.C. — The first of 16 American Red Cross workers expected to be assigned to U.S. military units deployed to the Middle East arrived there Aug. 14

The primary function of workers like George T. Hitchcock, a Red Cross station manager, and other Red Cross volunteers on the Armed Forces staff, will be to facilitate traditional Red Cross emergency communications between service personnel and their families during the military action.

According to Hitchcock, who just returned from the Army's 2nd Infantry Division in South Korea, "getting a

message out to a soldier during a combat situation will mean experiencing the same weather conditions and battle hazards as our service personnel. I know how important it is to the mental attitude of our troops that they be informed about health and welfare news from home in a timely fashion."

In addition to staffing a 24-hour-a day, seven-day-s-week electronic emergency communications system that will link service personnel with more than 2,700 Red Crosa chapters nationwide, Red Crosa workers will provide other support to U.S. troops including emergency financial assistance and social service referrals. The

Red Cross also assists with emergency travel needs.

American Red Cross workers are civilians who volunteered to serve during the conflict, and are participating in the military action at the request of the Department of Defense and individual branches of the Armed Services. Initial assignments are from three to six months. The Red Cross also cooperates with other civilian and military organizations assisting military people during the crisis.

Red Cross workers already named to serve in the Per-sian Gulf come from a vari-ety of disciplines, though

most have social work skills. Each was formerly assigned to a military base in the United States or overseas.

United States or overseas.

"We are prepared to supply additional Red Cross staff as requested," said John Fong, director of Military and Social Services at the American Red Cross National Headquarters. The American Red Cross is the only national Red Cross society that routinely provides services to members of the Armed Porces and families. Typically, we handle one emergency communique every 38 seconds, but with the crisis in the Middle East, Red Cross emergency communications activities have increased."

President praises military during Desert Shield

On Aug. 8, the U.S. mill-tary got the call from its Commander-in-Chief to deploy to Saudi Arabia for Operation Desert Shield. By the end of August, in the face of Saddam Husseln's formidable Iraqi force, American troops stood well-armed and firmly planted on Saudi soil. Desert Shield has seen the deployment of more military power in fewer days than any other operation in the world's bistory. More than 100,000 Marines, sailors, soldlers and airmen, as well as a billion pounds of material, have reportedly been deployed to the Arabian Penninsula and surrounding waters.

"Desert Shield has been a classic case of America's military at its best," Presi-dent Bush told Veterans of Foreign Wars during their National Convention Aug.

National Convention Aug.

The Department of Defense has used a variety of military and commercial aircraft and shipping assets to handle the demanding transportation needs involved.

While there are reports that Saudi airfields are centers of non-stop action as troops and equipment continue to pour into the country, DoD reports 95 percent of the heavy equipment — meaning the bulk of U.S. mechanized and artillery ground forces — is being transported by sea.

In addition to nine pre-po-sitioning ships and 13 am-phibious ships used by Marlnes, eight FAST Sea-lift Cargo Ships, 10 Afloat Pre-positioning Force Ships, and a number of specially char-tered commercial ocean ves-sels have already been put to

sels have already been put to use.
Ground forces in the region include the 45,000-strong lat Marine Expeditionary Force; the 24th Mechanized Infantry Division; the 101st Airborne Division; and the 3d Cavalry Regiment
While U.S. forces are outmanised by the estimated 165,000 Iraqi troops in Kuwait and along the Iraqi Saudi border, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Gen.

Colin Powell said U.S. Nuval gunfire and aircraft assets will more than even the odds. Before Iraq invaded Kuwait, an eight-ship U.S. Navy flotilia was in the Persian Gulf as part of a 40-year-old routine deployment schedule. Additionally, the USS Independence carrier lattle group was in the Indian Ocean and the USS Dwight D. Elsenhower carrier luttle group was in the Mediterranean. group nean.

By Aug. 8, when President Bush called for U.S military deployment to the region, the USS Saratoga carrier battle group, and the battleship USS Wisconsin had already departed from East Coast

ports en route for the Middle East.

The Navy has already established control of the mearly 25,000 square miles of sea lanes in and around the Middle East, according to the Navy News Service.

In addition to sea superiority, the U.S. is expected to have little trouble establishing dominance in the air if hostilities break out.

U.S. fighter and bomber aircraft now in the region include B-52s, F-117A Stealth fighters, F-14s, F-15Es, F-16s, F/A-18s, A-10s, A-6s and AV-8Bs. While Iraq's air force is by no means small, it is said to lack the training or the technology to withstand U.S. firepower in the air.

II. Lawrence Garrett III, Secretary of the Navy, knows of the Importance of U.S. technological advantages, but he sees people as the most important factor.

At the Long Beach Naval Station in California, he told Navy and Marine Corps families that "no matter how much our continuing research and development preserves our technological edge — America's margin of superiority ultimately depends on each and every one of you, and on the sacrifices you and your families so willingly make."

People and advanced technological equipment continue to pour into the Gulf with every day.

Total Quality Leadership

The last six Total Quality Leadership articles discussed the first twelve of Dr. W. Edwards Deming's 14 Management Principles. This article focuses on principles 13 and 14.

Principle 13.

Institute a vigorous program of education and self-improvement.

gram of education and serimprovement.

"What an organization needs is not just good people; it needs people that are improving with education," said Deming.

The type of education and self-improvement is not necessarily important. It need

not be work related. In fact, who is to say what skills or knowledge will be applied at work anyway? Who knows what knowledge will be needed in the future?

Of course, work-related education would be beneficial. Education in the new philosophy might be a start. Education as simple and powerful statistical tools can be used at all levels by all employees. Other topics could include basic math, reading, and writing skills; job related subjects like chemistry or electronics; and even personal improvement classes in stress reduction and weight control. Education and training can

prevent hurnout. People are exposed to new ideas. They discuss these ideas with their fellow employees. They meet new people. The new environment is one of learning, growing and improving. Most people want to work in such an environment.

When an organization improves its quality and improves productivity, fewer people may be needed for specific functions. At the

people may be needed for specific functions. At the same time, however, other functions that are new or expanding will require additional people. Through education and training an organization can fill new jobs and new responsibilities with

members of its family.
Principle 14.
Put everybody in the organization to work to accomplish the transformation. The transformation is everybody's job.
Do whatever you can within your sphere of influence. If your leadership and management is on board, your job will be easier. If not, do what you can. There should be a chain reaction when people become aware of what quality is.
How do we improve processes? Deming recommends the Plan, Do, Check, Act Cycle.
Plan, Assemble expects

Cycle.
Plan Assemble experts

and identify what changes are desirable. Collect data.

plan a change or a test.
Plan a change or a test.
Do. Carry out the change
or test on a small scale if
possible.
Check. Measure the results.
Observe the effects. Study
the results.
Act. Make policy changes.
Implement on a larger scale.
Decide to conduct further
tests.

tests.

The cycle never ends. After you act, you plan to improve again; continuous improvement, forever.

In addition to leadership talking the talk, it must walk the walk. Deming says:

"Top management must

feel pain and dissatisfaction with past performance and must have the courage to change. They must break out of line, even to the point of exile among their peers. There must be a burning desire to transform their style of management."

Top management must create an environment where those in charge want to know what the problems are and where workers are willing to identify them.

To those who say, "If it ain't broke, don't fix it," Tom Peters says, "If you think it ain't broke, you're not looking hard enough."



MASC-2 detachment supports Giant Warrior

A 19 man Early Warning Control Team (EWCT) from MACS-2 deployed to Salpan to support aircraft participating in Giant Warrior-90 held Aug. 6 - 11. The exercise was sponsored by the 15th Alf Force from Riverside, Calif. Using realistic air-war scenarios, Giant Warrior gave pilots from bases across the United States a chance to drop live ordnance on bombing ranges at Farallon Island,

roughly 70 mlies north of Saipan.
While the "red" force's F-15 pilots defended the Island, the attacking "blue" force maneuvered to drop live ordnance there. The attackers flew their B-62s, F-18s, A-6s, and F-4s out of Anderson Air Force Base on Guam.
Radar support was two-dimensional. Using the AN/TPS-63 radar, the Marines set up inside the Navy Satellite Tracking Station atop the northern tip of Snipan. They

gave close ground control intercept to the "red" force in the northern half of the Marianas Islands.

Nineteen controllers from the 6010th Aerospace Defense Group, Wheeler Air Base, set up a site at Mount Santa Rosa on Guam, to control the southern half. Both units gave broadcast or "big picture" control to the "blue" force and controlled air refuellers, who acted as the "white" force.

"We had two four-hour

missions a day," said 1stLt.
E.H. Minchin, MACS-2
Communications Electronics
Officer. "It was a really good
exercise for the fairly limited
system we had.
"It (the system) would normally be used as a gap filler
behind a mountain range or
something, with just a couple
of Marines to pass information hack to the Tactical Air
Operations Center (TAOC),"
he said. "But we had, at any
one time, up to 50 aircraft
alrburne under our control.

We were performing the mission of a complete TAOC."

Before the "air wars" began Aug. 6, MACS-2 took time to promote one of its Marines, Crl. Dean Guyton, on "Suicide Cliff." The cliff is a historical site which got its name during World War II. According to SSgt. Fred Daubenspeck, EWCT detachment NCOIC, after the United States overran Salpan

during the war, many Japa-ness flung themselves to their deaths there after hearing misguided "horror stories" about American treatment of its prisoners.

IstLt. Minchin said the Air Force plans to make Glant Warrior an annual exercise. If so, with the experience his Marines gained this year, he plans to deploy more personal and equipment in the future.

The Soldiers and Sailora Civil Relief Act has been in an authorise in many different forms since the Civil War. Congress and state legislatures have long recognized that the very nature of military service makes it extremely difficult for service members to meet their ringhts.

During the Civil War, Congress put a temporary halt to all civil court actions brought against federal soldiers. During World War I, Congress passed the Soldiers and Sailors Civil Relief Act of 1918, which provided few

guidelines, but did tell trial courts to take whatever measure justice required to protect servicemembers' rights.

protect servicemembers'
rights.

In 1940, Congress passed
the present version of the
SSCRA.

The Act suspends or postpones certain civil obligations
to allow servicemembers to
devote their full attention to
their assigned duties. It also
permits the delay of civil court
proceedings where military
service prevents the servicemember from asserting or
protecting a legal right.

Finully, the Act also protects the dependents for the
limited purpose of preventing

evictions for non-payment of rent without a court order for a period of up to three months following a service-member's discharge. The eviction protection is very weak, because it applies to rentals of \$150 or less.

Servicemembers most commonly find themselves needing SSCRA when facing debt actions, divorce and support actions or paternity actions.

Once a Marine becomes aware that he is being sued in civil court, he should act quickly. Failure to act in a timely fashion may result in a default judgement. He must tell the party suing him and the court involved he is on active duty and that he wishes to invoke his rights

under the SSCRA.

Depending on the state ipvolved, the effect of providing such notice could stay the action for a maximum of three months beyond his discharge. However, many states have drastically reduced the length of time a stay will be granted. In some cases, it is only good for a couple of weeks, requiring the servicemember to request a new stay every time the old one expires.

The best way to invoke the Act is to send an affidavit to the court which indicates that the servicemember is on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces, and that he did not enter the service to avoid the action.

It is also very important that the servicemember tell the court that he is not represented by an attorney. Courts have been known to construe almost any communication from an attorney on behalf of a servicemember to mean he has been retained by the servicemember. This may terminate the servicemember's protection from default judgement, leaving him with no rights to petition the court to re-open the case.

If a servicemember successfully invokes the SSCRA, the state court involved must appoint a lawyer to assist him. The primary responsibility of the court appointed attorney is to ascertain

whether the defendant is in the military and, if so, re-quest a stay of the civil proceeding in the defendant's behalf. Be warned, however, that if you leave the Armed Porces, that same court-appointed attorney will report to the court and force you to appear or lose by default.

If you are in the process of being sued and need to invoke your rights under SSCRA, you should go to the Legal Services Center and speak to an attorney. He will assist you with the preparation of documents necessary to stay the action. Further, he can advise you on the hest course action to remedy the situation.







Alcohol-related Incidents

alcohol content of .14 percent. The driver was arrested for DWI and having an open container in the vehicle. He is being held on \$200 bail. The other Marines were arrested for open container and released on \$50 bail. They are all scheduled to appear in court.

Honolulu Police stopped a Marine for loud music in Kailua. Upon contact with the Marine, an odor of slechol was detected. He falled a field sobriety test, was

arrested for DWI and was transported to the Kailua Sub-station where he refused to submit to a BAC test. The Marine was released on \$150 bail and is acheduled to appear in court. His decal has been removed and his Station driving privileges were suspended.





Marine punches his way to Goodwill gold

LCpl. Sergio Reyes heat ulgarian Serafim Todorov ug. 4 to win the gold medal the bantamweight class at the 1990 Goodwill Games in

in the bantamweight class at the 1990 Goodwill Games in Seattle.

The spunky pugilist won three bouts, going unbeaten during the Games, all on 3-2 split decisions. In doing so, he knocked off the world's top two boxers in the 119-pound class.

Reyes pounded the Buigar-ian, who was considered second in the world in that class, during the finals. But the fight he considers his

crowning accomplishment was a surprise split decision in the quarterfinals over the reigning world champion.

The All-Marine, Interservice and U.S. Amateur champ, won a 3-2 decision over two-time world champion Enrique Carrion of Cuba. The win has been called the biggest upset in boxing dufine the Games.

The 20-year-old Marine cited his aggressiveness and constant pressure as the two major factors that swung the decision over Carrion his way, according to reports in several national newspapers. However, those reports in-

cluded comments from the Cuhan, who said the deci-sion was unjust but agreed that Reyes did pressure him during the bout.

The win was expensive for Reyes as he injured his right hand and was a question mark on the semifinal card until weigh-ins Aug. 1. Newspaper reports went so far as to say Reyes might be medically disqualified from fighting the semis. But the decision was left up to Reyes.

Reyes shook off the injury and relied exclusively on his

left to take another 3-2 decision and beat his Soviet opponent.

Going Into the champion-ship bout, the agile Marine had no doubt about his abilities and chances to win the gold. "I've beat the hest in the world and I know I can beat the second hest, too," Reyes said in a tele-phone interview from Seattle. "Nothing can stop me now because I'm hungry...I want to fight him right now."

In the championship, the 5-foot-3-inch Reyes penetrated

his taller opponent's defense and delivered a series of op-portunistic head combos to the Bulgarian.

In a post fight interview with the cable network showing the Games, Reyes, who is unbeaten this year, credited his Marine Corps training and All-Marine Boxing Coach Roosevelt Sanders with giving him the abilities to win on an international level.

Reyes has been hoping to use the Goodwill Games as a springboard to the 1992 Olympics.
