## Kaneohe warriors march through city

They gathered before dawn, returned after sundown and had a long, memorable day in between. In that time, these 1,600 Kaneohe-based troops marched before tens of thousands of spectators in downtown Honolulu as part of a parade designed to honor the warriors.

While the Marines were both a large and popular portion of the event, they were only a slice of what city officials are calling "the biggest parade in Hawaii's history." Nearly 30,000 marchers traveled the three-mile route between Aala and Ala Moana parks.

Although Marine F/A-18 Hornets led off the parade with a flyover at 9:30 a.m., the marching Marines had occupied the grassy slopes of Aala Park for several hours before. They came early to beat the traffic and spent several hours waiting for the parade to begin.

When it did, they brought up the rear. Nelson Fujio, a key organizer of the parade, said this was done to save "the best" for last. "We wanted to make the Marine contingent the grand finale to the parade, because they are the big heroes."

But first, a barrage of other units had traveled the course. They represented the Army, Navy, Air Force and Coast Guard, as well as high school marching units and bands, veterans of conflicts dating as far back as World War I, motorcycle clubs and a few other private organizations.

The people who lined the streets along the route clutched flags, held banners and clapped and cheered their approval for all of the more than 100 elements of the parade, but their applause seemed loudest when the Vietnam veterans came strolling into view.

What had been joyous claps became emotional thunder at the sight of the veterans. Several people who had been sitting leisurely along the curb on both sides of the street rose to their

feet as a sign of appreciation. It was something many of them were seeing for the first time. It was, said one spectator, "a much overdue welcome home."

The arrival of the Marines also sparked a loud roar of approval. The first sign of the approaching Marines echoed through the air as portions of the FMFAC Band played the "Marines' Hymn." Again, the crowd deepened its applause.

These were the warriors they'd come to know over the past eight months. These were the warriors that deployed in mass at the onset of the Persian Gulf Crisis. And these were the warriors the people of Hawaii considered to be their heroes.

Several people held signs that made this apparent. One read: "MARINES - YOU'VE MADE US PROUD AND YOU'VE KEPT US FREE!" Another read "THANK GOD FOR THE MARINES."

Leading the Marines in the parade was LtGen. Walter Boomer, commander of all land-based Marines in Southwest Asia during Operations Desert Shield and Storm. He came from his home-base at Camp Pendleton, Calif., where he commands the 1st Marine Expeditionary Force, at the request of Mayor Frank Fasi.

Not far behind LtGen. Boomer's vehicle, Col. John Admire marched at the front of the 3d Marines. To most of Hawaii, and in fact the world, they are better known as Task Force Taro - their name during

the war.

Numerous ranks of Marine units followed. Eventually, representatives of all three infantry battalions of the 3d Marines, then 1st Bn., 12th Marines, then units of Brigade Service Support Group-1, Marine Aircraft Group-24, 1st Radio Battalion and Company B, 7th Communications Battalion, passed before the crowd.

While most of these Marines traveled the parade on foot, some rode aboard HMMWVs, five-ton trucks and other Marine Corps rolling stock. Following the units that deployed to fight in the Gulf was a final Kaneohe-based element - the spouses that galvanized the families on the homefront. Riding a float they'd constructed on a Marine Corps vehicle in a period of only days were approximately 30 ombudsmen and key wives from K-Bay.

When the parade was over, the Marines turned in their weapons and had the choice of either staying downtown or getting home on their own. While several opted to head back home, a great many stayed in Ala Moana Park for a free concert. Others ventured into Waikiki and around Ala Moana in their readily identifiable desert camouflage uniforms.

After the parade, Carol Costa, who organized the event for the City of Honolulu, said it was "absolutely fantastic," and that she was amazed the whole thing came off so well.

## Hawaii Marines help Bangladesh relief effort

More than 200 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade Marines are participating in Joint Emergency Relief Operations in Bangladesh.

Included is Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron 265. The squadron and their CH-46 Sea Knight helicopters have joined Marine Aircraft Group-50. HMM-265 was one of only two Kaneohe-based units still deployed to the Arabian Gulf. It was deployed there in early December.

Other Marines from here augmented the 5th Marine Expeditionary Brigade as it departed Hawaii in support of Operation Desert Shield. The

5th MEB departed Southern California Dec. 1, 1990, and passed through Hawaii several days later. It was the largest amphibious task force to leave the West Coast since 1965, with a 7,500-man Marine Air Ground Task Force.

Arriving in the North Arabian Sea Jan. 13, the 5th MEB joined the embarked 4th Marine Expeditionary Brigade from the East Coast to form the largest amphibious force assembled since Inchon, Korea, with 43 navy and civilian ships and more than 16,000 Marines.

During the Desert Storm ground offensive in February, the 5th MEB was the only major Marine unit to conduct an amphibious landing in northern

Saudi Arabia as part of the combat operations.

The 5th MEB was assigned the mission of enemy prisoner of war collection, and clearing bypassed areas and pockets of resistance inside Kuwait.

The Brigade had departed the North Arabian Sea May 7 and was headed home when ordered to conduct relief operations in Bangladesh May 11.

In past weeks, Bangladesh has been plagued by natural disaster. An April cyclone caused an estimated 138,000 deaths and river flooding drove another 150,000 people from their homes, according to an Associated Press report.

## Gulf veterans earn citizenship

Six Marines who served in the Persian Gulf during Operations Desert Shield/Storm received their United States citizenships in a swearing-in ceremony at the Joint Legal Services Center here May 9.

The top federal judge in Hawaii, the Honorable Chief Judge Harold Fong, presided over the ceremony. The ceremony was unusual because most citizenship ceremonies are held at the Federal Courthouse in Honolulu, by whatever judge is on duty. Instead, Judge Fong came to Kaneohe Bay to perform the ceremony himself.

The new Americans are: Cpl. Bayzan Van Ho of Marine Wing Support Squadron-174; Cpl. Kaypheth Inhison, Company A, 3d Reconnaissance Battalion; Sgt. George Sanchez, Company A, 1st Battalion, 3d Marines; Cpl. Heather Robinson, Brigade Service Support Group-1; Cpl. Jaime Lofton, Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron; and Cpl. J.L. Tovar, Company I, 3d Battalion, 3d Marines.

Judge Fong led the group through the citizenship oath,

and then asked the entire courtroom to stand and recite the Pledge of Allegiance. He then made a stirring and dramatic speech addressing the importance of the Marines' new citizenship.

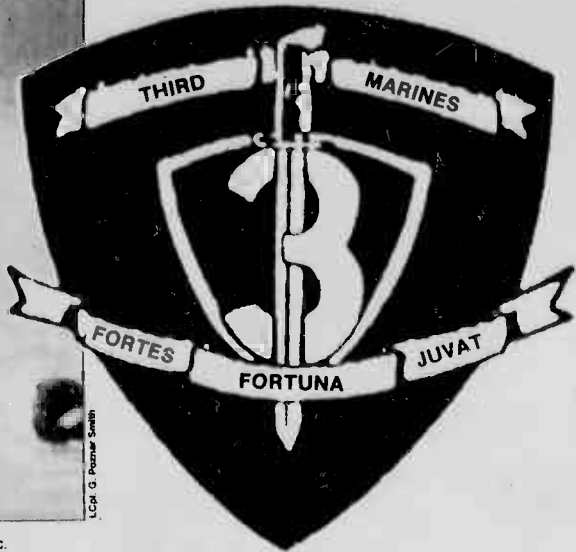
After the ceremony ended, the six new Americans were surrounded by friends, family, co-workers and local media. They were asked what it felt like to be an American. A one-word reply was common among the Marines - freedom.

Robinson, who was born in Jamaica, said "America is freedom...America is happiness." Ho, who came to America in 1978 on a refugee boat from Vietnam, remembers only wanting to come to America. To him, becoming an American citizen was more than a dream come true, "it was as if being re-born."

The ceremony was attended by BGen. James E. Livingston, commanding general, 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade, Col. John Admire, commanding officer, 3d Marines, and SgtMaj. Harold Chapman, Brigade sergeant major, and a host of well-wishers.

# Company I plunges into wet training

Marines from Company I, 3d Battalion, 3d Marines, spent a long, hard week in a welcome element — the water. In "Zodiacs" (rubber assault rafts), the Marines performed a full slate of small-boat skills near the Station Marina April 30 through May 3.

Normally, getting wet isn't out of the ordinary for Marines, but for eight months in the Arabian Desert, these grunts mainly weathered the sand of Southwest Asia. Now, little more than two months after returning to a hero's welcome, Co. I is following the new 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade Commanding General's order to resume training and get back to business.

They were given classes on boat handling, crew responsibilities, water safety, breaching (flipping boat to empty water), first aid, surf observation, scout swimming, beach reconnaissance and landing raids. The Marines then

performed practical application of each skill.

The training is not entirely new to Co. I. They trained with all of 3/3 in Marine Expeditionary Unit (Special Operations Capable) operations, according to Cpl. Jonathan Athey, Co. I scout/swimmer instructor.

1st Lt. S.D. Schaefer, Co. I executive officer, said although neither Co. I nor 3/3 is an "official MEU (SOC) unit," both are trained in many specialized missions. Schaefer listed helicopter and night amphibious raids, Tactical Recovery of Aircraft and Personnel (TRAP), mechanized operations and non-combatant evacuation operations (NEO) as some of the missions the battalion is trained in.

But after being in Southwest Asia for so long, many of the Marines needed to polish-up their water skills, Athey added.

"This week we've been training for any type of

amphibious raid by being the leading element for the main body," he said. "A lot of us had to re-qualify in Marine Corps swim qualifications. Then we came out in the ocean for hands-on practice with the Zodiacs and got back into shape."

Due to the long deployment to the Arabian Gulf and the arrival of new Marines to Co. I, re-familiarization training is necessary, according to Capt. Michael J. McCusker, Co. I commanding officer.

"Most of these Marines had learned these skills before," McCusker said. "But skills atrophy, so you have to get back out and jump right into it. Getting back to the basics is good for them, and we'll keep adding to that."

Additional specialized training (culminating in an amphibious raid) is scheduled for sometime in June. The company will be "the tip of the spear" for the raid, and will serve as the initial reconnaissance and beach landing/preparation force for the main raid body, according to Athey.

## Mitchell takes VMFA-232 stick

LtCol. Victor A. Simpson will turn over command of the Marine Corps' oldest and most decorated active squadron -- Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-232 -- to LtCol. Mark R. Mitchell in a change-of-command ceremony today at 1:30 p.m. at Hangar 104.

Simpson, who will become the 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade's Operations officer, assumed command of VMFA-232 in June 1989, where he played an integral part in the transition of F-4S Phantom jets to the F/A-18 Hornet jets. In December 1990, he led the "Red Devils" to the Middle East in support of Operation Desert Shield. Later, during Operation Desert Storm, Simpson flew 41 combat sorties and amassed 71.2 combat flight hours.

Simpson's personal decorations include the Meritorious Service Medal, Air Medal and Navy Commendation Medal. He has flown more than 4,100 hours in fighter/attack aircraft.

"I'm sorry to leave this squadron," said Simpson. "Having commanded this squadron for almost two years now,

I can honestly say it's been a pleasure. It's always sad to leave a unit like this where everything has gone so well."

Simpson is married to the former Jan Palmer of Vista, Calif. They have a son, Craig, 20 and a daughter, Brooke, 16.

Mitchell was commissioned a second lieutenant in 1972 after graduating with a Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering from Texas A & M University. He received his wings in 1974 after F-4 Phantom training, and reported here to VMFA-232.

Mitchell is a graduate of the Top Gun Navy Fighter Weapons School in 1978, and in 1980, was invited to join the staff at Marine Air Weapons and Tactics Squadron One at Yuma, Ariz. as an F-4 tactics instructor.

During his 18 years of service, Mitchell has accumulated approximately 3,800 hours in more than 30 types of aircraft. He was on combat air patrol during the 1986 air raid on Libya, and was selected as the USMC Astronaut Candidate in 1989. He also earned a Master of Science degree in Aviation Systems from

the University of Tennessee in 1990.

Mitchell has extensive F/A-18 Hornet, weapons and aircraft research and testing experience. Immediately upon reporting to Marine Aircraft Group-24 here in December 1990, he deployed to the Middle East for combat duty in support of Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm. The majority of his missions were flown with VMFA-232 Red Devils.

Mitchell's awards include the Navy Commendation Medal, Navy Unit Commendation, Meritorious Unit Commendation and the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal.

Mitchell is married to the former Dureta Fay Harrison of Benton, Ariz. Their children are Rita Fay, 16, Daniel Wayne, 13, and Ray, 11.

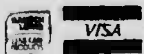

# HURRICANES: Where to go, what to do, how to prepare

In the summer of 1988, the people of Hawaii buckled down and prepared for Hurricane Fabio to uproot their lives. The commanding officer of the Air Station placed the base in Storm Condition Four, and appropriate measures were taken to minimize losses.

By a stroke of luck, the hurricane's course shifted and the islands suffered no damage, unlike 1982, when Hurricane Iwa swept destructively through the islands.

Next month is Disaster Preparedness Month in Hawaii, and the Air Station will conduct a hurricane preparedness drill to determine strengths and weaknesses in its defense system. Printed below is a variety of information that can help you start or improve your own system at home.

## Types of warnings

- Storm Condition FOUR: Destructive winds of force indicated are possible within 72 hours.
- Storm Condition THREE: Destructive winds are anticipated within 48 hours.
- Storm Condition TWO: Destructive winds are anticipated within 24 hours.
- Storm Condition ONE: Destructive winds are anticipated within 12 hours.

## Individual preparations

- Preparations should

include ensuring that you have a three-day supply of non-perishable food, first aid kits, fire extinguishers, a battery-powered radio, flashlights, and extra batteries.

- Keep tuned to a local radio or television station for the latest weather service advisories as well as special instructions from local governments.

- Check battery-powered equipment. A battery-powered radio may be the only operational resource for getting emergency information.

- Keep a car fueled should evacuation become necessary. If the electricity is out, gas pumps will not work.

- Store drinking water in jugs and bottles. Fill up your bathtubs for whatever water needs arise, such as refilling a commode. Water lines may be damaged by the storm.

- Board up windows or protect them with storm shutters or tape.

- Secure outdoor objects that might be blown away.

- Moor boats securely before the storm arrives, or move them to a designated area.

- During the hurricane, remain indoors. Be especially wary of the "eye" of the storm.

## Types of destruction

- Tropical cyclones: Non-frontal, warm-core, low-pressure systems that origi-

nate outside of the tropics or tropical cyclones which have lost all tropical characteristics.

- Subtropical storms: Non-frontal, low-pressure systems developing over subtropical waters and occasionally evolving into hurricanes. They occur mainly during

the period November through April.

- Strong northeast trades: Occur when high pressure north of the Hawaiian Islands builds to form a tight pressure gradient over the local area causing strong northeast winds.

- Frontal winds: Occur during November through April and are often accompanied by strong, gusty surface winds which may last from several hours to several days.

- Low-level wind shear: Conditions under which an

in-flight aircraft could experience a rapid change in wind direction and/or speed. These conditions, usually brief in nature, are commonly associated with thunderstorms, moderate to heavy rain showers, and tight pressure gradients.

**Evacuation Plan**

# On the Blotter

Military Police Department

## Alcohol-related incidents

- A Marine was arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol by Military Police after he tried to enter the Station. While the Marine was taking a field sobriety test, his passenger got angry and threatened MPs. The Marine chose to take a blood test, with the results pending. The passenger was arrested for drunk and disorderly conduct and communicating a threat.

The dependent parked her vehicle near the intersection of Mokapu Blvd. and Moffett Rd. and left her daughter inside. The daughter released the emergency brake and the vehicle rolled into another vehicle, causing minor damage.

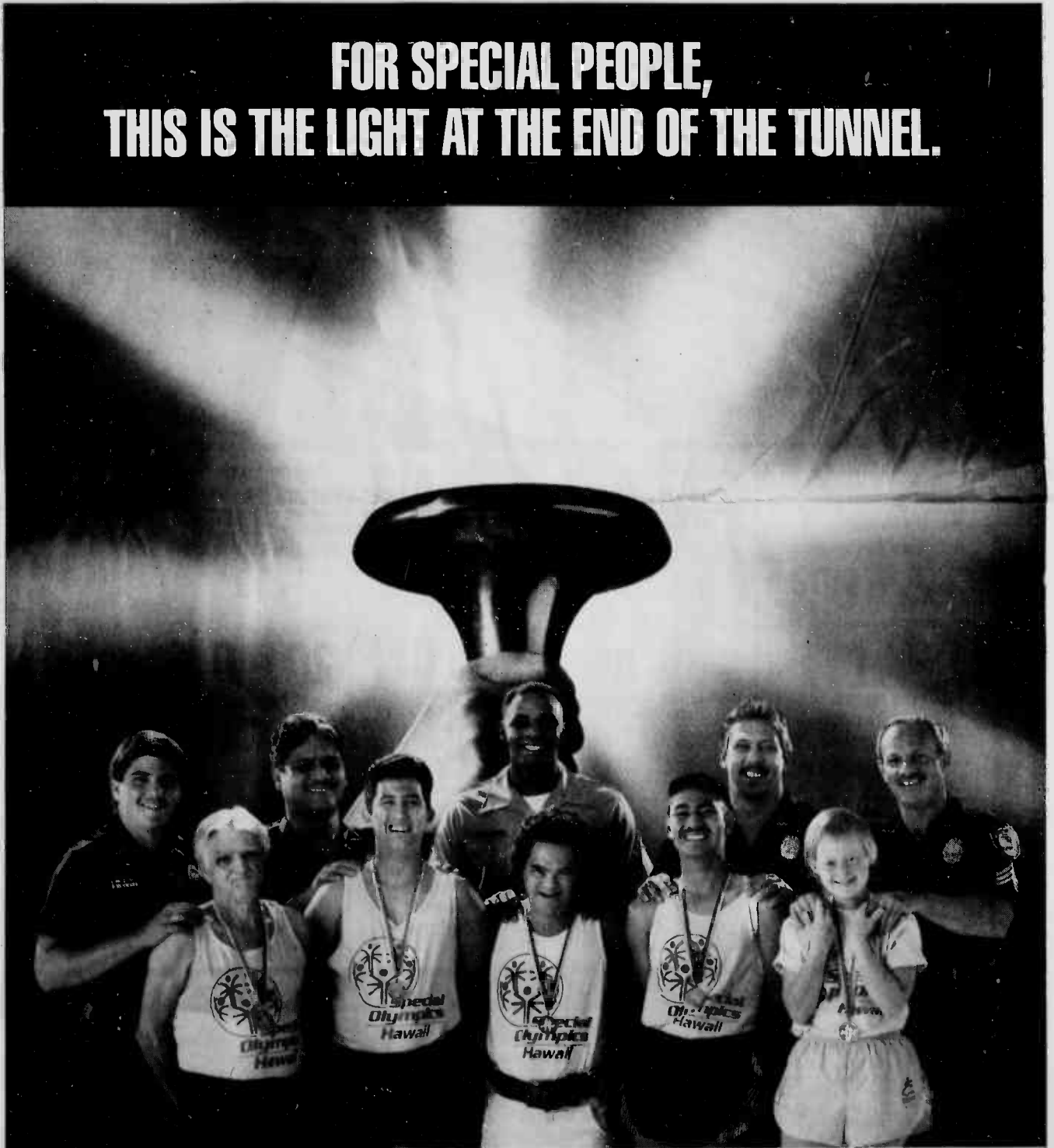

# Ombudsmen float through parade

The final touches were still being made on the ombudsman float as Friday night became parade morning with the sweep of the second hand. By 6 a.m., it was on its way downtown to join in the massive celebration.

"Because We Care," was written on one scroll and "Till The Troops Come Home," on another. These, said Ombudsman Council President Katie Iwanaki, are the principles that kept the ombudsmen here going during the war, and they wanted everyone else to know.

The float, upon which approximately 30 ombudsmen and key wives rode during the "Ho'ohonohono Na Koa" parade, was an accurate representation of the fibers that bound the families during the deployment. The floatbed was a loaned military vehicle.

The materials used to decorate it were donated from various Station activities including the commissary. And the manpower that went into its creation came from the wives who have donated so much of their time over the past nine months.

Rosie Hayles, ombudsman for HMH-463, played a key role in putting the float together. She said about 20 wives spent a great deal of time on it and did a great job.

As they did during Operations Desert Shield and Storm, the ombudsmen lined up in the parade directly behind their Marines and sailors. Iwanaki and Hayles agreed that they were very well received along the route, "even if the crowd didn't know what an ombudsman is," as Iwanaki put it. "They were still very enthusiastic and supportive as we passed."

Hayles said it was nice to get that kind of recognition and that "everyone had a great time."

The decision to make the float and participate in the parade wasn't made until the council's last meeting, and work on it didn't begin until two days before the big day. This resulted in long hours the night before.

Hayles said they couldn't have pulled it off without the tremendous support of the command, which provided Hangar 101 as a work site and the vehicle with two military drivers.

"I'd also like to thank the commissary staff for donating the 12,000 napkins we used to make flowers," Hayles said. "They were very helpful, especially considering we gave them such short notice."

Despite the long hours these ladies spent getting the float set-up, then participating in the parade, Hayles and Iwanaki agreed it was well worth the effort.

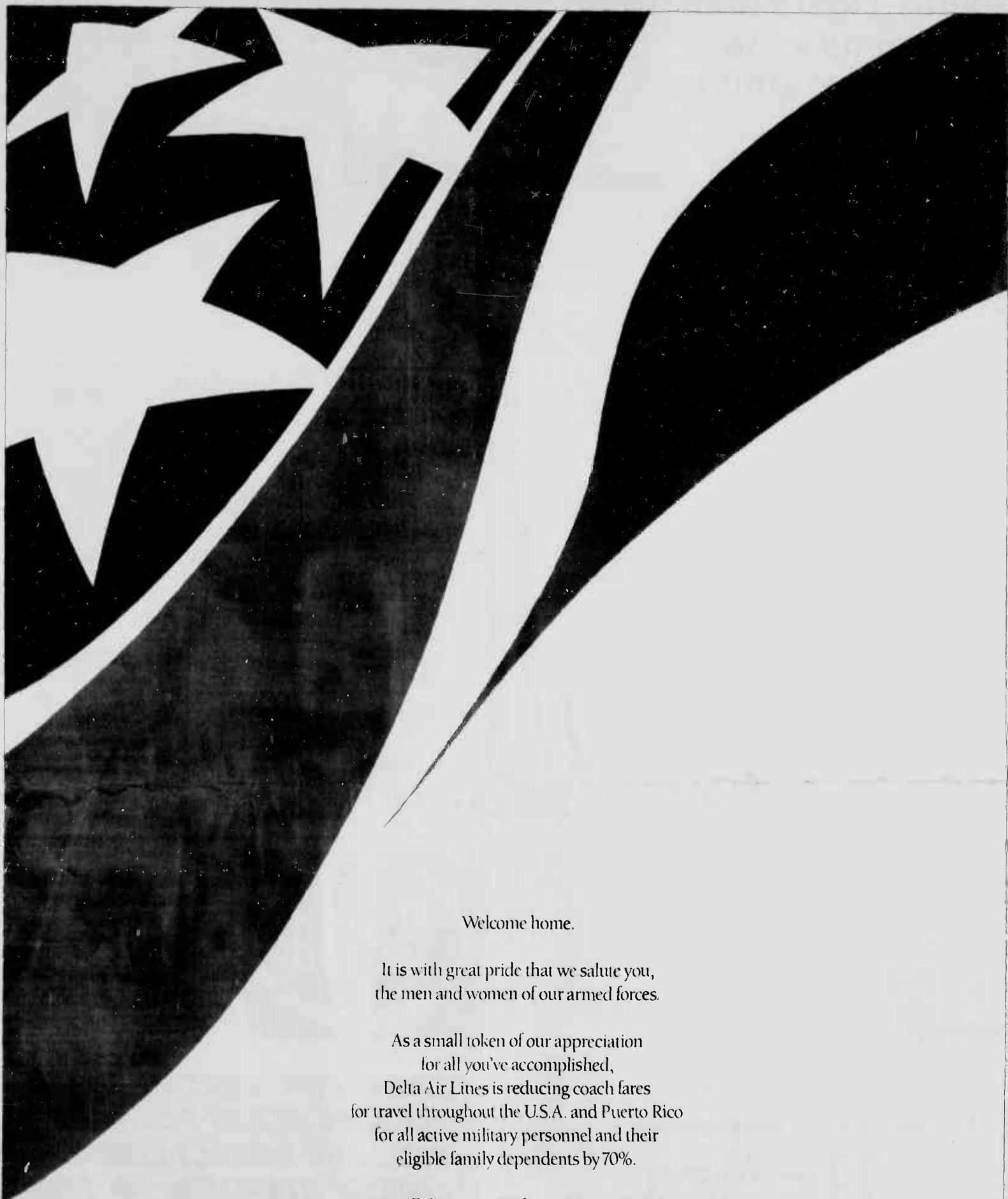

## Community program can prevent crimes

Throughout Air Station neighborhoods, residents are learning to help stop crimes by keeping their eyes and ears wide open.

It's all part of the Neighborhood Watch Program currently being established here. Through the program, residents in a given neighborhood organize themselves to watch for suspicious activities and report such activities to the Military Police.

Participants are encouraged to improve security precautions in their homes and their daily lives. At first, the program will probably not actually prevent crimes but is expected to help police do a better job of detecting and apprehending criminals.

As time goes on, though, the fact that neighbors are

watching out for neighbors is expected to have an effect on the local criminal population. If a would-be criminal feels his activities are likely to be seen, reported and produce a police response, he may decide "working" that neighborhood isn't worth the risk.

Neighborhood Watch is not a group of vigilantes. It is an organized group of neighbors, acting as a community to watch-out for each other.

The Military Police Department's Crime Prevention Section will help establish Neighborhood Watch programs by serving in an advisory capacity. They will provide resource information and helpful tips to improve the program. However, the program is actually run by the community.

## Legally Speaking

The first 10 amendments to the Constitution constitute the Bill of Rights, which guarantees protection of individual liberties from government interference. The most encompassing and controversial is the First Amendment, which states:

"Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances."

The First Amendment guarantees five freedoms: religion, speech, press, assembly and petition for redress of grievances. Deceptively simple in language, the interpretation of the First Amendment has proved difficult in determining the degree of constitutional protection of these freedoms.

Despite the wording that "Congress shall make no law respecting..." these freedoms, limitations regarding the exercise of these rights exist, both for civilians and military.

### Freedom of Religion

The First Amendment limits the government from enacting laws which promote the "establishment" or prohibit the free exercise of religion. These two clauses can present conflicts as the government attempts to treat religious concerns in a neutral manner.

For instance, the establishment clause prohibits the government from promoting religious activities, such as the display of nativity scenes on government property, or the funding of private schools through subsidies of student's tuition. However, religious institutions are entitled to the same

benefits as other institutions, including police and fire protection, student transportation, and reimbursement for educational materials of a secular nature.

The free exercise clause requires that the government allow an individual to freely practice his or her religious beliefs. However, the government can impose some limitations if a legitimate health or safety interest is involved.

Children can be required to attend the schools or receive medical treatment, such as blood transfusions or cancer resistant drugs, despite the religious objections of their parents.

Military practice allows reasonable accommodation of members' religious beliefs. Federal law provides for the Navy Chaplain's Corps, and the practice of religious services on Sundays or other days of obligation. However, limitations regarding an individual's religious practice can be imposed dependent upon military requirements.

For instance, the Supreme Court has ruled that an individual could be required to obey an order prohibiting the wearing of religious apparel with his uniform. The court determined the 1st Amendment didn't require the military to accommodate an individual's religious beliefs if it would detract from service dress regulations.

### Freedom of Expression

The guarantee of freedom of speech has been extended to different forms of expression, including symbolic speech, such as wearing armbands or other articles of clothing, picketing or marching. Though this freedom is one of our most cherished, it is not absolute.

Certain types of speech are not constitutionally protected because of the public harm that may be incurred. For instance,

an individual who falsely shouts "fire" in a crowded theater may be subject to prosecution for his actions, because he causes a "clear and present danger" to the public welfare.

Other types of speech may be prohibited if the community interest to be protected outweighs the infringement of the individual's right, such as the publication of obscene or libelous materials.

Certain types of speech are specifically subject to criminal penalties under the Uniform Code of Military Justice. Such offenses include:

- Article 81, conspiracy
- Article 82, soliciting desertion, mutiny, sedition, etc.
- Article 88, contempt towards officials
- Article 89, disrespect toward an officer
- Article 91, disrespect toward a warrant officer or noncommissioned officer
- Article 104, communicating with the enemy
- Article 116, causing a riot or breach of peace
- Article 117, provoking speeches or gestures
- Article 134, disloyal statement, false swearing, indecent language, perjury, soliciting another to commit an offense, and communicating a threat.

Also, operational security concerns impose limitations. While service personnel are entitled to 1st Amendment protections, a balancing of the nation's interest in maintaining an effective fighting force with the right of free expression results in greater restrictions than those imposed on civilians.

the disciplinary and security restrictions previously discussed.

### Freedom of Assembly

Freedom of expression included the right to assemble with others to picket, march or demonstrate in support of a particular position. Limitations may be placed upon the time and location of such gatherings in the interest of public safety.

Installation commanders can also limit access to a base and prohibit demonstrations which may interfere with the mission and security of the installation. Additionally, military members are prohibited from participating in demonstrations while wearing the uniform, while in foreign countries or where violence may result. A commander can also place certain establishments off-limits where conditions exist which are detrimental to the morale, welfare and safety of armed forces personnel.

### Right to Petition for Redress of Grievances

Individual citizens can request a redress of any grievance they may have against the govern-

ment by petitioning their elected officials or by filing suit in a court. The military provides a variety of means for an individual to redress a grievance.

Under U.S. Navy Regulations, an individual may request mast to his or her commanding officer. Article 138 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice provides a proceeding for forwarding complaints of wrongs by the commanding officer.

Additionally, an individual can bring a grievance to the attention of the Inspector General. And, as in the case of any other citizen, an individual can petition congressional representatives or seek relief in federal court.

The First Amendment guarantees individuals the freedoms from government interference with the exercise of religious beliefs, expression of speech, freedom of the press, the right to assemble and the right to petition for redress of grievances. The language of the amendment is simple, but the concepts involved are complex, and are constantly subject to refinement. It is the responsibility of all citizens to be aware of these rights and to insure their continued viability.
