Brits invade

MOLOKAI TRAINING AREA, Molokai—With the completion of a force-on-force field exercise here June 14-12, a British Army infantry company and Marines from Co. 1, 3d Battalion, 3d Marines, wrapped up three weeks of cross-training during Union Pacific '91.

Union Pacific '91, which began May 27, was one of the first extensive training evolutions for a Brigade unit since returning from Operation Desert Storm.

Training with the Marines were about 150 British soldiers from Co. B, 1st Bn., The Royal Regiment of Wales, based at Stanley Fort in Hong Kong. The British company is in part responsible for patrolling the Hong Kong-China border, and conducts extensive training to stay ready as a reactionary force for various situations, according to its commander, Maj. Christopher Poyntz.

Union Pacific is just one of several training packages the Brits use to stay sharp, Poyntz explained.

"We have very limited training areas in Hong Kong, especially for live firing," Poyntz said. "That is why we are so glad to be involved in Union Pacific."

He also said that while there are some similarities in U.S. Marine Corps and British army training, there are a great many differences, so this evolution was a refreshing change.

"It not only allows us to experience a bit of what Marines do in training," Poyntz added, "it also sharpens our ability to be flexible when faced with new challenges, from my level of planning and coordination for exercises all the way

down the chain."

The British advance party arrived here May 20, followed a week later by the main body. The Brits are completing their Hawaiian deployment with U.S. soldiers from the 25th Infantry Division (light) at Schofield Barracks.

The focus on the Marine portion of the annual exercise is on small-unit training, including helicopter/waterborne operations, and the force-

on-force exercise, according to Capt. Joseph Molofsky, Co. I commander. Weapons familiarization, rappelling, Zodiac (rubber boat) assaults, assault amphibious vehicle training, and numerous other classes and applications rounded-out the evolution.

Other Brigade units contributed to Union Pacific, included helicopter squadrons from MAG-24 and Marines from Co. A, 3d Reconnaissance Bn.

After Gulf, Bangladesh, HMM-265 heads home

Editor's note: Portions of the following story were excerpted from a news release from Headquarters, Marine Corps.

Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron—265, the only Brigade unit still deployed that participated in Operation Desert Storm, will return home Friday. HMM-265 was most recently deployed to Operation Sea Angel in Bangladesh.

The unit will fly from the deck of the USS Tarawa into the Air Station at 6 a.m. HMM-265 wives have asked the Station community to "break-out the yellow ribbons" today through Sunday as a show of support for the returning Marines.

The 200 Marines and their CH-46 Sea Knight helicopters left here in December as part of the 5th Marine Expeditionary Brigade. After departing the North Arabian Sea May 7, the unit was part of an amphibious task force diverted to Bangladesh.

Made-up of eight ships from Amphibious Group Three and elements of the 5th MEB, the task force spent nearly two weeks assisting the Bangladesh government with relief operations in the wake of a devas-

ating cyclone April 30.

The amphibious task force arrived off the Bangladesh coast May 15, joining other elements of a joint task force already in place to coordinate U.S. military assistance to the relief efforts.

The JTF's primary mission was to provide badly needed air and sea lifts of relief supplies already stored at supply centers in Dhaka to the devastated islands and countryside left inaccessible by the cyclone. From the beginning of U.S. relief operations and through the amphibious task force's departure, U.S. Marine, Army and Air Force aircraft and Navy landing craft delivered more than 4.5 tons of relief supplies. This was done with more than 1,720 helicopter and C-130 sorties, and 46 missions by landing craft.

Initially named Productive Effort, the operation was renamed Sea Angel when Bangladesh people referred to the Marines delivering relief supplies in a Navy hovercraft as "Sea Angels."

During the Desert Storm ground offensive in February, the 5th MEB was the only major Marine unit to conduct an amphibious landing in northern Saudi Arabia as part of combat operations.

BSSG-1 leadership to change hands

Col. Kenneth D. Frantz will take command of Brigade Service Support Group-1 from Col. Ernest G. Belnhart III Wednesday at 4 p.m. on the Air Station's Dewey Square.

Frantz enlisted in the Marine Corps in 1967. His first assignment was as troop leader, 2d Infantry Training Regiment, upon graduation from Marine Corps Recruit Depot San Diego.

He received his commission as a second lieutenant through the Enlisted Commissioning Program. Following the Basic School and Marine Corps Engineer School, he was assigned as a platoon commander with the 8th Engineer Battalion, 2d Force Troops at Camp Lejeune, N.C.

Volunteering for overseas duty, he was transferred to 3d Combat Engineer Battalion in 1971. He first served there as assistant operations officer, then as commanding officer, Headquarters and Service Company; was re-assigned as battalion atomic demolitions munitions officer, and finally as officer-in-charge of the Leadership School.

Returning to Camp Lejeune, Frantz served at the Marine Corps Engineer School, first as a senior instructor and finally as the executive officer, Student Command. He was transferred to Fort Belvoir, Va., in 1974 to attend the U.S. Army Engineer Officers' Advanced Course.

He returned to MCRD San Diego as a captain, and served as the maintenance operations officer. However, he was temporarily assigned to Camp Pendleton, Calif., as the engineer officer for Operation New Arrival. His priority task was to set-up camps to house 13,000 refugees from Southeast Asia in six days. The Camp Pendleton Reception and Processing Center ultimately processed more than 50,000 refugees in less than seven months.

Frantz went back to MCRD San Diego and assumed duties as commanding officer, Service Company, Headquarters and Service Battalion. From 1975-78, he served as facility management officer for the depot.

He returned overseas to the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing at Iwakuni, Japan, and served as the wing utilities officer, and later as executive officer for

Detachment C, Marine Wing Support Group-17.

Frantz was later transferred to the 1st Combat Engineer Battalion at Camp Pendleton, where he served as operations officer, logistics officer and finally commanding officer for Support Company. He also served as battalion executive officer. As a major, Frantz completed the Marine Corps Command and Staff College at Quantico. Following that, he graduated from Central State College, Okla., with a bachelor of science in computer science and management.

In 1985, Frantz was assigned to Fleet Marine Force, Atlantic as a lieutenant colonel to serve as engineer officer. He also served as engineer staff officer for II Marine Amphibious Force and 4th Marine Amphibious Brigade.

He was then transferred to

Okinawa, Japan, where he initially served as the engineer officer for III Marine Expeditionary Force and later as commanding officer, 3d Combat Engineer Battalion.

While serving as battalion commander, he was selected to his present grade. He served his last year on Okinawa as the assistant chief of staff, III MEF.

Frantz's personal decorations include the Meritorious Service Medal, the Navy Commendation Medal and the Navy Achievement Medal with a gold star in lieu of a second award.

Belnhart enlisted in the Marine Corps in 1968 and served his first tour in Vietnam as a rifleman with Company K, 3rd Battalion, 7th Marines after completing the Army's airborne school. He was ordered to Officer Candidate School in 1970.

Belnhart returned to Vietnam as a second lieutenant later that year, after completing The Basic School and High Intensity Language Training (Vietnamese). He served as a rifle platoon leader with Company D, 1st Military Police Battalion.

In 1971, when Marine ground forces redeployed from Vietnam, Belnhart was assigned to the 2d Marine Division. He first served with 1st Battalion, 6th Marines, as logistics officer, and was re-assigned as executive officer and later commanding

1st MEB to demonstrate capabilities for families

News In Brief

Marine killed in weekend accident.

A Kaneohe-based Marine was killed Saturday afternoon by an apparent fall at Makapu'u point in Waimanalo. LCpl. Nathan J. Hollembeck of 1st Battalion, 3d Marines, was reportedly attempting to climb a cliff when he fell to the rocks below. He was pronounced dead on the scene. Memorial services were held for him yesterday. The incident is still under investigation.

Commissaries close July 4

The commissaries here, at Pearl Harbor, and at Barbers Point will be closed July 4 in observance of Independence Day.

180-day wait for hiring retired military suspended

The Department of Defense has suspended the 180 day wait for the hiring of retired military personnel through Nov. 5, 1992. This test program, which will run through October 1992, applies to both civil service and nonappropriated fund positions.

Medal guidelines clarified

Much debate has been raised recently concerning the wearing of the Southwest Asia Service Medal and subsequent bronze stars. According to ALMAR 148-91, individuals who served in Southwest

Asia between Aug. 2, 1990, and a date to be determined are authorized to wear the Southwest Asia Service Medal. In addition, individuals who served in Operation Desert Shield (Aug. 2, 1990-Jan. 16, 1991) rate the wearing of one 3/16-inch bronze star device affixed to the medal or ribbon, signifying a campaign. Individuals who served in both operations are eligible to wear the SWA Medal with two bronze star devices. All other guidance from unofficial sources should be disregarded, according to Brigade Adjutant Capt. J.C. Dickman.

Report rotation changes

Servicemembers who live in military housing and whose rotation dates have changed are asked to notify their area housing office of the change.

Society helps Marines, sailors in hard times

It would be nice if money was so plentiful that we didn't have to hold a fund drive for the Navy/Marine Corps Relief Society every year. Coordinators wouldn't have to be chosen, and they, in turn, wouldn't have to bug their fellow servicemembers to dig deep for a donation.

It would be nice, indeed. But the fact is, money for the society comes solely from donations, without which there would be no help for tens of thousands of Marines and sailors every year. Ask Cpl. David Jenkins about the Navy/Marine Corps Relief Society, and he'll tell you a story of sudden hardship and rapid recovery. Jenkins and his wife, Dawn, were hit by a series of disasters in a short period of time that put Dawn in the hospital and left them with serious financial obligations. Everything had been great. Dawn was pregnant and due to deliver July 24. Although

Jenkins was working out some pay problems that resulted in a few "no-pay-due" periods, his wife had a well-paying, steady job and the couple wasn't having too much difficulty maintaining their apartment downtown. Things were looking pretty good, he said.

But April 12 brought a change to all that. Dawn went in for a routine checkup at Tripler Army Medical Center, and found out there were problems with the pregnancy. Her doctor said she'd have to be admitted immediately or run a serious risk of losing their child.

This eliminated half of the family income, while also adding medical bills for her food in the hospital, to say nothing of the worries the possible pregnancy problems caused both of them.

Jenkins tightened his belt and kept going strong. He didn't want to ask for help unless he was sure he'd need it.

"I could live off one small meal a day, and I figured if I budgeted, we'd still make it by," he said.

Their baby daughter, Kimiko, was born more than two months premature May 16, weighing 1.11 ounces. She had to be put into an

incubator. Dawn remained in the hospital for recovery and observation until May 20, but still isn't well enough to go back to work.

Apart from a very low birth weight due to her premature delivery, Jenkins said the baby is fine, but she will have to remain in the incubator until she is developed enough to withstand a regular environment. This could be anywhere from early to late July, and there are medical costs for the baby care as well.

"It's not too bad - only a daily fee for food - but over a couple of months, the bills add up fast," he said.

"That was not the end of the troubles, however. To add to the difficulty, Jenkins' car broke down, requiring nearly \$1,100 in repairs.

After several more no-pay-due periods, and with rent and hospital bills due as well, he realized he was in a hole that he just couldn't handle on his own. Altogether, he was short nearly \$2,000.

That's when he decided to go to the Navy/Marine

Corps Relief Society. He sat down with Chairman of Volunteers Sharon Chessum and told her the complete story. Chessum said there was no doubt in her mind, this Marine needed help - and fast.

"He was dealing with just about every difficulty we are here to help with, and he had done everything he could have to avoid the problems," she said.

By the time he walked out of the society less than an hour later, Jenkins had an interest-free loan to pay his rent, his car repairs and monthly payment, and a grant to pay his wife's hospital bill.

"Just that simply, my troubles were solved. I couldn't believe it," Jenkins recalled.

His situation, while perhaps a bit more drastic than some, is an example of thousands in the annals of the Navy/Marine Corps Relief Society's history.

Ask any of the 91,951 families worldwide who received \$42.9 million in

loans during 1990 what they think of the society and those annual fund drives. Ask 10,000 others who were granted \$3.1 million during the same year. They'll probably say something similar to what Jenkins said.

Aboard the Station alone, more than \$500,000 was loaned to nearly 900 people and approximately \$43,000 was granted to 150 others. Another 875 people were given layettes or helped in a number of other ways.

One grateful recipient of help wrote a "Thank You" card to the Kaneohe office. In part, she wrote: "I didn't realize how important this office was before, because we never used it... (but)... there are so many different kinds of needs that come through your doors, and if everyone has received the same kind and concerned treatment as I have, then I know you're pleasing and helping lots of people. I can't wait for my husband to come home and tell him of the blessing our family has received. Thanks again."

Unfortunately, not everyone who walks into a Navy/Marine Corps Relief Office walks away with a loan or a grant, however. The local office had to turn away more than 100 people last

year, because their situation was not considered a necessity as much as a "nicety," said Chessum.

"Each situation is handled on a case-by-case basis, so it's difficult to explain any hard and fast rules," she added. "Generally speaking, however, most requests are denied because the need does not meet the standards we have set down for a necessity, or because we feel it could be handled better in another way."

This selective process is necessary, she explained, because funds are limited, and the society is entrusted with the responsibility to the entire community of using its funds wisely enough to be able to help people in times of real emergencies.

But have no doubt, Chessum added, the money that they have loaned out has gone to some very grateful people.

Jenkins said he wasn't too enthusiastic about telling his story of hardship at first, but figured it was the least he could do for the Society.

"If telling my story will help other Marines realize what a useful service (the Navy/Marine Corps Relief Society) provides, I'm happy to air my troubles for all to read."

BSSG-1 will have new leader

BSSG-1 from A-1 officer of Headquarters and Service Company. In 1973, he served as aide-de-camp to the commanding general, Fleet Marine Force, Atlantic.

Beinhart was promoted to captain in 1974, after which he served as a non-lawyer trial counsel with the Force Troops Staff Judge Advocate.

From 1975-77, he studied at Pennsylvania State University and earned degrees in economics and English.

He then returned to The Basic School, where he was assigned as a land navigation instructor. He completed the Amphibious Warfare School in 1979 and reported for duty as a captain to 3d Marine Division in Okinawa. There he commanded Company L, 3d Battalion, 9th Marines, through March 1980.

After his promotion to major, Beinhart was reassigned to 4th Marines, where he served as operations officer of 3d Battalion, then as executive officer 2d Battalion. From 1981-84, he served as naval plans officer, then as director of plans and policy on the staff of the Commander, U.S. Naval Forces Japan in Yokosuka. In 1984-85, he attended the Marine Corps

Command and Staff College.

In 1985-86, Beinhart attended the Japan National Defense College in Tokyo as a lieutenant colonel. Upon graduation, he reported to Headquarters, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific, at Camp Smith.

In 1989, Beinhart reported to the 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade and was assigned as executive officer of BSSG-1. He was reassigned as commanding officer in August 1990. During Operations Desert Shield and Storm, BSSG-1 was composited into 1st Force Service Support Group. At that time, he served as an operations officer in the 1st Marine Expeditionary Force command element. BSSG-1 was reconstituted March 28, and Beinhart resumed command. He was frocked to his current rank in May.

Beinhart is a foreign area officer (Japan) and joint specialty officer. His decorations include the Purple Heart, Meritorious Service Medal with a star, the Navy Achievement Medal with a Combat "V," and the Combat Action Ribbon.

He will report in August to Headquarters, U.S. European Command J-5 at Stuttgart, Germany.

DoD waives personnel cuts

An adjusted personnel plan permits 16,000 more servicemembers to remain on active duty through the end of FY91 than were originally authorized under DoD's drawdown plans.

Donald Atwood, deputy secretary of defense, advised the military services in an April 8 memorandum to waive the personnel end strengths set in the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year of 1991. Congress recently authorized the waivers in the Persian Gulf Supplemental Authorization and Personnel Benefits Act of 1991.

The Persian Gulf conflict played a major role in DoD's decision to raise the ceiling, said Christopher Jehn, assistant secretary of defense for force management and personnel.

"The services adjusted their personnel plans significantly to accommodate Operation Desert Storm," Jehn said. "For the active force, this included extensive stop-loss actions, accelerated accession and retiree recalls. With the initiation of the re-deployment, the services have re-adjusted plans to allow them to end FY91 as close to their previously budgeted end strengths as possible."

For example, the Army decided not to involuntarily separate members while stop-loss was in effect. According to Jehn, this affected about 4,000 officers and 3,000 enlisted soldiers in FY91.

Jehn said only a relatively small number of personnel subject to stop-loss may be kept involuntarily on active duty after July 31. Most will be given a chance to get out before then. He added that all services will allow stop-loss members to request up to a 90-day active-duty extension to help ease transition back to civilian life.

All services will meet the FY92 end strengths required by law, Jehn noted.

Marines, Brits 'battle' on Hill of Thermopoli

MOLOKAI TRAINING AREA, Molokai - The British arrived a day before the Marines, into the unfamiliar scrub country of the inner Molokai training area. They would be up against Marines, in the Marines' backyard.

Company L, 3d Battalion, 3d Marines, just-inserted into LZ Falcon, secured the surrounding area, and moved cautiously to its objective about a click away - a small, unnamed hill they would later designate "Thermopoli," after the legendary Spartan battle long ago.

From this hill, the Lima commander figured, his company had a desirable vantage point easy to defend from the Brits, who were sure to be running raids and patrols. The Marine platoon commanders positioned their machine-gun teams and set up listening/observation posts. It was midday, and small, leafless scrub trees provided little shelter from the blazing Pacific sun.

Lima waited. A well-armed Marine security patrol headed out, aware of the exposing light, then returned a couple hours later with no contact to report. Around dusk, the Marines sent out an ambush patrol that moved in a staggered column through the

tall grass. A Brit patrol was spotted below a ridgeline heading toward Thermopoli, and the Marine patrol sprang the ambush, firing with squad-automatic and M-60 machine-gun fire. The Brits made haste, and continued toward their objective.

Minutes later, the British patrol assaulted up Thermopoli. The Marines knew they were coming, however, thanks to forewarning from the patrol and an alert observer team. Up on the hill, Lima Marines fired-up the attackers, who could be heard screaming battle cries in the Queen's English.

Meanwhile, the Marine ambush patrol readied for the return of the Brits, expecting them to backtrack over the same route. The Brits did, and ambush number two was successful.

For the rest of the night, Lima stayed at 75 percent alert, as the Marine commanders expected more Brit activity. More patrols were sent out through the early morning hours.

By first daylight, Lima was tired, but positive of their triumph in the exercise.

Of course, when the bullets are blanks, both sides always claim victory.

After moving back to LZ

Falcon, Capt. Joseph Molofsky - who just recently took command of Lima - told his Marines they did a good job and he's glad he spent the time in the field with them. He also mentioned the improvements that are needed.

Waiting for the CH-53s from Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron-463 to pick up the Marines, LCpl. Charles Gentry, who helped run the Marines' communication during the force-on-force, said this of the exercise during a

moment of retrospection: "Go tell the Americans that we stood obedient to their will."

The Hill of Thermopoli may not join the ranks of hallowed Marine Corps fields of honor, and Gentry's words may never be engraved in bronze, but the Marines of Lima Company, 3/3, Class of '91 can stand proud in the knowledge that they took, held and named this barren hunk of ground for all posterity.

War college to award masters degrees

The United States Naval War College, Newport, R.I., has recently been accredited to award a master of arts degree in national security and strategic studies to many of its graduates.

This determination, made last month by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, completes a process of program certification which began four years ago.

The Newport school is the only war college in the United States authorized and accredited to award a graduate degree for its one-year course of instruction.

The first students from the Naval War College to receive the master of arts degree will be U.S. military officers and civilians from agencies of the federal government who graduate tomorrow from the College of Naval Warfare and College of Naval Command and Staff.

The Secretary of the Navy has concurred with the recommendation of the college's president, Navy RAdm. Joseph C. Strasser, that degrees be conferred retroactively to qualified graduates from the college of Naval Warfare and the College of Naval Command and Staff who, during their enrollment, met the same academic requirements as those enrolled

in the program at the time of its accreditation.

"In the late 1980s," said RAdm. Strasser, "college administrators concluded that our two resident colleges for students from the United States had more than sufficient academic rigor, focus and scope to warrant the awarding of a master's degree to their graduates."

This conclusion also took into account that most Naval officers have insufficient time ashore during their careers to complete master's programs.

The Dean of Students at the Naval War College, Navy Capt. Ray Alcorn, and his staff are seeing that degrees find their way to those alumni who are "grandfathered" by the Secre-

tary of the Navy's decision.

Qualified graduates still on active duty will be contacted through their respective branches of service. Alcorn said it will be a challenge to locate graduates who have departed from the military or federal service, or those who have transferred to other agencies.

Military students who graduated on or after the respective June and March 1985 graduation dates and who are still on active duty will be contacted. All other graduates are asked to contact the Naval War College by calling commercially (401) 841-2418 or Autovon 948-2418 between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. Eastern Daylight Time, Monday through Friday.

Defense department takes hard look at deployment policy for parents

The Persian Gulf operations and the resulting furor over deploying parents leaving children behind have forced DoD to take a hard look at its assignment policies.

Christopher Jehn, assistant secretary of defense for force management and personnel, said the military deployment policy requires that all servicemembers "have a viable, workable family care plan. Military members are required to be able to deploy on short notice without regard to personal circumstances or their personal situation. Readiness - it's that simple," he said.

According to Jehn, the current personnel policy requires military members to be deployable, all taking their turns for assignments, including those in imminent-danger areas. He said unit readiness, assignments and job requirements may require a single parent or both parents of a service couple to be assigned to an im-

minent danger area.

"Expecting the same sacrifices for all military members, married or single, with children or without, is the only understandable and fair policy and one that is consistent with the American tradition of equality," Jehn said.

He added that if separate assignment rules covered marital or family status, the services would have to maintain combat readiness and deployability by closing certain careers, such as combat and direct combat support skills. He also believes exempted individuals' careers would be hurt.

"It would make or create a new class of military servicemembers - those who can't deploy," he said. "They would still be eligible to share in all the benefits and privileges of military service, but wouldn't be required to share the burdens and responsibilities of that service. Those people won't get, and I don't think they should get, the assignments, promotions, training and so on that their comrades who

deploy get."

A policy change favoring parents could also lead to the feeling among childless servicemembers that their lives are less valuable than those of military parents, he added.

Operations Desert Shield/Storm deployments were the first major tests of active, Guard and Reserve members' family care plans, officials noted. News media showed children being left as their parents deployed.

"People are concerned about the welfare of the children left behind and want to know what DoD is doing to care for these children," said Jehn. This is where a good family care plan comes in, he observed, and why the services are so aggressive about making sure members' plans will work - because they didn't in some cases. News stories told of the intended guardian becoming ill or reneging, children developing emotional or

physical problems or other difficulties.

When a family care plan collapsed, the servicemember was given up to 30 days to make alternate arrangements for child care, said Jehn. But DoD did more to take care of children than depend on family care plans, he continued. The DoD safety net included additional day care hours, family assistance centers and volunteer staffs on military bases, and counseling staffs and programs for children at DoD's statewide and overseas schools.

Family support to the children and their guardians is available through the military's extensive family assistance program. Jehn said children remain eligible for all programs and benefits, and guardians can receive financial, logistical and counseling support. Several options are available if family problems arise, including temporary deferment or re-assignment, ordinary or emergency leave, or a hardship discharge.

Legally Speaking

The Sixth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution states "In all criminal prosecutions, the accused shall enjoy the right...to have the Assistance of Counsel for his defense."

This article describes the rights a Marine has in the various proceedings common to the military.

General/Special Court-Martials

Detailed Military Counsel: Whenever a Marine is the subject of a General/Special Court-Martial, a defense counsel is assigned to represent him free-of-charge. This detailed military counsel is assigned to represent him free of charge. This detailed military counsel is always a law school graduate, a member of a state bar and certified by the Judge Advocate General of the Navy.

Individual Military Counsel: In addition to a detailed military counsel, an accused may request the services of an individual military counsel. This is a judge advocate chosen by the accused from any branch of the armed forces, who serves at no cost to the accused. However, if an accused receives individual military counsel, the commanding officer of the detailed military counsel may remove the detailed counsel from the case.

A request for an individual military counsel will be approved only if that counsel is reasonably available. Counsel serving in the following billets are normally not reasonably available: a military judge; a trial counsel; an appellate counsel; a Staff/Deputy Judge Advocate; or an instructor or student at a service school or academy. Otherwise, a judge advocate on active duty with any branch of the armed forces is usually reasonably available if located within the immediate geographical vicinity of the proceedings.

Civilian Counsel: In addition to a detailed or individual military counsel, an accused may also retain the services of a civilian counsel at his own expense. In this case, the detailed or individual military counsel, at the discretion of the accused, remains on the case.

A civilian counsel must be a member of the bar of a federal court or of a bar of the highest court of the state. If not a member of such a bar, the civilian counsel must be a lawyer who is authorized by a recognized licensing authority to practice law and is found by the military judge to have appropriate training and familiarity with the general principles of criminal law which apply in a court-martial.

Self Representation: An accused may represent himself. However, an accused cannot waive all counsel and stand mute. Self representation is highly inadvisable.

Court martial

Martial/Nonjudicial Punishment

An accused has no right to a detailed or individual military counsel at a summary court-martial or at nonjudicial punishment proceedings. However, the accused may retain the services of a civilian counsel at his own expense. Civilian counsel will be permitted to represent the accused if such an appearance will not unreasonably delay the proceedings and if military exigencies do not preclude it.

Interrogation of Suspect to a Crime

A suspect or an accused has the right to consult with a

military lawyer and to seek his advice before answering any questions. They also have the right to stop answering questions at any time in order to speak with a military lawyer. A Marine may obtain a civilian lawyer at his own expense, for advice prior to answering questions.

Other Legal Proceedings

Marines also have the right to be represented by military or civilian lawyers in: pretrial confinement hearing; vacation proceedings; and administrative discharge boards.

For pretrial confinement hearings, military counsel are

assigned to represent the accused only. A prisoner does not have the right to have an individual military counsel in this circumstance.

Marines convicted at general/special courts martials have portions of their punishment suspended. If these Marines and sailors violate conditions of the suspension of punishment, they may be the subject of a vacation proceeding.

An accused has the right to be represented at this hearing by a civilian counsel provided by the accused, or upon request, by military counsel detailed for this purpose. Again, the accused does not have the right to have an individual military counsel in this circumstance.

Finally, any Marine facing an administrative discharge has the right to consult with a military lawyer regarding his rights. This is not considered representation by a military lawyer.

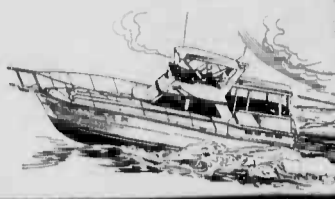

STEROIDS

A path to destruction of your body, military career

Editor's note: Some of the information in this article was obtained from recent medical journals from the University School of Medicine, New Haven, Conn.

In the quest for the ultimate physique, athletes striving for that top rung willingly endure the rigors of grueling workouts.

Some are also willing to do almost anything to get a

competitive edge. And some do.

It starts out simple. Taking steroids may make you become larger and stronger very quickly, but the long-term effects may be too far down the road for the person bent on winning the next meet or competition to be concerned with.

Anabolic steroids are synthetic drugs that act like the male hormone, testosterone. Unlike testosterone, which regulates, promotes and maintains physical and sexual development in normal males, the use of anabolic steroids has more than 70 known side effects.

Any Marine who unlawfully possesses, uses or distributes steroids is punished under Article 112a of the Uniform Code of Military Justice. Anabolic steroids are only legal for military personnel if they are medically prescribed by a physician. Even then, the risk of harmful side effects is still present.

Cdr. Frederick Bauer, a flight surgeon with Marine Aircraft Group 24, spoke of a particular Marine he examined.

"About a year and a half ago during a routine physical, a gunnery sergeant came to me and asked about liver tests," said Bauer. "After further questioning, I found out that he had been taking anabolic steroids. Although he was being cured for by a civilian doctor, he developed full-blown liver failure."

According to Bauer, the Marine was admitted to Tripler Army Medical Center soon after. Within weeks, he was told that a liver transplant was necessary. At the time, there was a Navy man there with the same condition - liver failure, as a

result of anabolic steroid use.

"Just by chance, the gunny's physician had done some research on liver treatment involving children," Bauer added. With this treatment, the gunny's liver began to regenerate and repair itself.

The sailor wasn't so lucky. He died.

"Anabolic steroids are not developed to make people large or strong," Bauer stressed. "That's viewed by some as a 'positive' side effect."

According to reports from the Journal of the American Medical Association, when prescribed by a physician, anabolic steroids promote protein synthesis necessary for developing muscle tissue. The journal also noted that the drug has been used for treatment of certain cases of breast cancer or treatment of a rare condition known as hereditary angioedema.

According to Bauer, the side effects of using anabolic steroids will vary from person to person, but some of the most common are: skin acne, jaundice, testicle shrinkage, infertility, bodily hair growth, arteriosclerosis, kidney disease, liver failure and temper tantrums, which are sometimes referred to as "roid rages."

According to Terrence Zline, head of the Detection and Deterrence Branch of the

Navy's drug and alcohol division, military commanders can conduct steroid testing on suspected steroid users.

"Anyone, bodybuilder or not, who is willing to use steroids isn't looking at what will happen to his body five or 10 years down the road," said SSgt. Mike Babcock, a well-known bodybuilder and runner stationed here.

Babcock, who has won several state-wide military bodybuilding championships such as Mr. Kanaohe Bay (1989-1990) and second runner-up at the Armed Forces Bodybuilding Championship (1990), attributes his success to hard work and dedication.

"Someone using steroids, especially in the Marine Corps, is only hurting himself," said Babcock. "It may not happen now, but steroids will definitely be their downfall."

Three Marine boxers took gold medals and another a silver in the Aloha State Games boxing event Saturday night at Pearl Harbor's Bloch Arena.

Jesua Perez (139 lbs.), Creanahew Jones (178 lbs.), and Jermain Thedford (heavyweight) all won their respective finals to take first place. Michael Cerda (147 lbs.) lost a close decision to grab second.

The next fight, and last for the Marines, featured Thedford, who took control of the bout from the opening

bell. A newcomer to Kaneohe Bay, Thedford used his quickness to surprise his opponent, Michael Carter of Ohana Boxing Club. The second narrowly went to Carter, who walked through many Thedford jabs to connect. Playing it smart, Thedford kept his distance and scored when he could.

Going into the third the fight was even. But Thedford had it when it counted, and scored with ruthless combinations that had even the local crowd cheering on their feet. Shaken but fighting to the bell, Carter lost by unanimous decision.

Other Marine results from the games included Calvin Carter (a corpsman with 3d Battalion, 3d Marines), who struck gold in the 200-meter

dash (ages 30-39) with a time of 23.8. He was also a member of the 4x100 and 4x400 relay teams that took first place.

Anthony Pollard jumped six-feet four-inches to take second in the high jump (ages 20-29). Three Marine wrestlers placed: Ray Elger, third, 220 lbs.; Allen Smith, fourth, 163 lbs.; and William Wright, fourth, 149.5 lbs.
