New commissary opens!

The anxiously awaited moment finally arrived. The biggest Defense Commissary Agency commissary on Oahu opened its doors to eager customers Tuesday at 9:30 a.m.

During the commissary's ribbon cutting ceremony, the Commanding Officer of MCAS Kaneohe, Col. R.R. Crawford presented the commissary's architect, Chester Nakamura and engineer Stan Tamahana with an award for their dedication through out the construction of the commissary.

Brigadier General C.D. Kuhn Jr., 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade commanding general, also commended all the military wives for putting up with the old commissary for many years.

After the ribbon cutting ceremony, the commissary doors opened for business. Customers rapidly flooded the 40,000 square foot building.

While waiting in line, customers talked about how great the commissary was supposed to be. Once they stepped in, it was obvious, by the look on their faces, that it was more than they had imagined.

"This commissary has to be the neatest thing since sliced bread," said Debra Sample, a customer who had been patiently waiting in line for almost two hours before the commissary opened.

But even though Debra arrived exceptionally early to the commissary, she was not the first one to arrive.

"I have been waiting here since 8 a.m.," said Venita Huntington, the first official shopper of the new commissary. "All of us out

here are eager shoppers and are anxious to finally be able to shop at the new commissary."

After having shopped at the older facility, which was built in 1943, it was an amazing difference to walk into this \$15 million facility.

"It is like going from a corner store into a shopping mall," said Martha Smith, another impressed shopper.

More than providing a nicer place to shop, the new commissary will provide customers with a greater selection of line items.

In addition to the 3,500 new line items that will now be provided, the new commissary also has a fresh seafood section, a bakery and an extensive deli section.

"Now we won't have to drive all over the island to find a good bargain on seafood," said Marin Hausley, who arrived at the commissary at 8:35 a.m. to wait for its grand opening.

In the past, many customers had to drive as far as the Hickam Air Force Base commissary in order to take advantage of their bigger selection.

"Not only will the commissary save us money on food but it will also save us money on gas," said Hausley.

Along with the customers saving money, the new commissary is expected to raise sales. The old commissary sales were approximately \$1.2 million per month, it is expected that sales will rise to \$2 million per month.

"You better believe I will not be going anywhere else to do my shopping," said Socorro Heather, another of the many early customers. "Why would I? This commissary provides us with more selection and the added room makes it much more comfortable to shop at."

Marines step in as truckers walk

On June 17, the moving company used by the Oahu Consolidated Family Housing Office walked out on their contract without notice. This company was used to move loaner furniture into government quarters. Marines from the 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade were called in to help continue providing housing residents with this service.

The help received from the Marines not only helped the housing residents but it also saved thousands of dollars of government money.

"Approximately \$24,000 was saved," said MGySgt. David Keen Deers/Temporary Lodging Allowance (TLA), officer-in-charge.

Keen explains that if families do not have loaner furniture, they may be granted TLA.

"We had several families come in last Thursday and they had to stay on TLA for ten days instead of the usual three," he said.

The loaner furniture serves as a means of saving valuable government money. At the same time it accommodates the servicemembers needs.

"These big savings were made possible by the troops being

mobilized so quickly," said Jared St. John, Housing Office director. "Within a matter of hours the Marines had stepped right into the movers' job."

"On Thursday they started working at about 3 p.m. and did not go home until after 8 p.m.," he said.

Although a back-up had been caused, the Marines caught up on Friday. They will continue to help the housing office with the loaner furniture until a new contract begins.

"We expect to have a new contract by Monday, but because this was unexpected, it's hard to have a definite date," St. John said.

Even though an exact reason is not known, St. John says he thinks Oley Services walked out on their contract because of the pressure they were receiving from the Oahu Consolidated Family Housing Office.

"We had been having some problems with them. We had some complaints about them not performing their jobs and not being up to standard. They probably decided to walk off before being defaulted," St. John said.

Although this situation might have caused some short term problems, the contract with the new movers in the long run may prove to be a turn for the better.

Marine reservist drowned in scuba accident

A 25-year-old Marine reservist, Cpl. Christopher S. Hardy, drowned Saturday, while diving at Sharks Cove North Shore.

Hardy was diving with several other reserve Marines while on liberty. Apparently he ran low on air and surfaced in a weak state during rough sea conditions.

Observers witnessed a strong wave overpower him.

Hardy was brought to shore in an unconscious condition, by a civilian kayaker.

The Marines who accompanied him attempted cardiovascular pulmonary resuscitation but were

—A Marine, sailor, dependent and civilian were apprehended for DUI. Each elected to submit to an intoxilyzer test which resulted in a blood alcohol contents ranging from .10 to .222.

—Military Police observed a fire at the base of Kansas Tower adjacent to the Officers' Club parking lot. The Federal Fire Department and Crash Fire and Rescue arrived on the scene and extinguished the fire. The fire was reported accidental and its origin unknown.

—A Marine reported persons unknown had assaulted him while in a parking lot aboard the air station. The Marine stated that he

was struck in the back of the head by an unknown object. The Marine was transported to Tripler Army Medical Center where he was treated and released.

—During a command authorized identification check, Military Police detected a strong odor of burning marijuana emitting from a civilian's vehicle. The civilian consented to a search of the vehicle which resulted in the seizure of a green vegetable matter suspected of being a controlled substance. The civilians were transported to MPD for processing and escorted off station where they were released on their own recognizance.

—It was reported several individuals were loud and apparently intoxicated next to the

station pool. Military Police contacted two Marines who became belligerent and argumentative when asked for their AFID cards. The Marines refused to follow instructions and a struggle with Military Police resulted in one Marine being bitten in the left shin by a military working dog. The Marines were apprehended and transported to MPD where they were processed and released to their unit representatives. One Marine was transported to Tripler Army Medical Center where he was treated for the dog bite.

—A Marine reported while surfing at Pyramid Beach he discovered a discharged I.V. bottle in the shallow water. The I.V. bottle was empty and is being

retained at MPD for disposal.

—Two Marines reported they were assaulted by two other Marines at a barracks aboard the air station. One Marine reported that the other threatened to get his gun and shoot someone. Upon arrival of Military Police, a Marine began inciting other occupants of the barracks. Permissive searches of the Marines' barracks did not recover any firearms. One Marine was transported to the Branch Medical Clinic where he was treated for a broken right hand.

openly about AIDS and HIV. Censorship has been a problem at many of the rallies the Florida native has addressed.

"The staff recently viewed a film called "No Second Chance," which was sent by the Chief of Chaplains to all the Navy chaplains," Fitzgerald said. "This ignited a deeper level of concern for education. Education and awareness are

the key points of the three phase program."

The first phase of the program involves the awareness of the dangers of the disease. Marines will view the film "No Second Chance," and

receive education on the medical and sociological impact of the disease.

The second phase will include detailed medical explanation and addresses issues such as risk, methods of transmission and other sexually transmitted diseases. The second phase will also discuss the use of condoms and the myths involved in practicing safe sex.

The third phase will involve a continuing education program to include counseling and other methods of education.

"The first two phases are at the unit level, the third phase will be for the newly joining Marines and will serve as an introduction to the education and awareness program," Fitzgerald said. "We hope that the workshops will educate the Marines because for some there may be no second chance."

After not responding to the resuscitation efforts ashore, Hardy was transported by city ambulance to Wahiawa General Hospital where he was pronounced dead at 2:39 p.m.

Hardy, a Davenport, Iowa reservist, was attached to 4th Maintenance Battalion, 4th Force Service Support Group (FSSG), Rock Island, Illinois, which is conducting training with Brigade Service Support Group-1 here.

The unit arrived June 13 and will remain here for two weeks.

Hardy enlisted in the Marine Corps October 19, 1987, and earned a National Defense Service Medal, a Meritorious Unit Commendation and a Selected Marine Corps Reserve Medal.

"Hardy was an outstanding Marine," said Maj. Ralph Emerson, commanding officer, 4th Maintenance Battalion, 4th FSSG.

Maintenance milestone

Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron-265 reached a maintenance milestone May 18 when all 12 squadron aircraft conducted an air station fly-by. LtCol. Farmer, squadron C.O., attributed being able to fly every helicopter to the hard work of the squadron's maintenance personnel. All shops have been putting in

long hours getting the squadron ready for its upcoming MCCRES, and unit deployment to Okinawa.

The 12-helicopter formation launched out of MCAS at 12:15 p.m., and began its flight around the island. The only problem encountered during the flight was a generator failure in one aircraft which landed at Dillingham Airfield on the west shore of Oahu. The generator was changed in the

field and the aircraft was up and flying with minimal delay. The flight was completed with a formation fly-by of the air station, and two division landings at West Field.

The CH-46 "Sea Knight" was first brought into service during the Vietnam War, and has continued to serve in virtually every conflict to the present. Many of the helicopters were delivered

to the Marine Corps before some of the dedicated Marines who work on them were born. It's a tribute to the professionalism of all maintenance personnel and aircrews to have the squadron at such a high state of readiness. 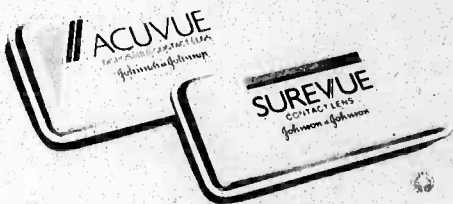

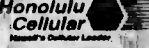

Housing office offers many tips

Housing Policy Explained
In the summer months ahead, thousands of military families located all over the world will receive orders which will direct them to new locations. Some of them will make their new homes in Hawaii. If you will be sponsoring one of the incoming families, you may find the following information helpful.

Incoming servicemembers assigned to MCAS Kaneohe Bay, who have families must report to the Area Family Housing Office, Building 455. If an advanced application has already been received, the housing counselor will activate the application. If an application has not been received, one will be completed when the servicemember reports to the Area Family Housing Office.

Eligibility Date
The housing office counselor will confirm or determine the servicemember's eligibility date. This is based on the date the servicemember departed the last permanent duty station or, in case of personnel serving unaccompanied tours, the date the servicemember departed the last duty station prior to the unaccompanied tour. The eligibility date determines where you are placed on the waiting list.

Bedroom Needs
Bedroom requirements are evaluated for each applicant. Upon initial assignment to family housing and if existing family housing permits (as determined by the Installation Commander) each dependent may be assigned a bedroom. Sponsor or sponsor and spouse will be assigned to one bedroom. When sponsors or

spouses are pregnant (as certified by the station's medical authority) and are not already occupying family quarters, application may be made for a separate bedroom for the expected child. Physically or mentally disabled dependents may be authorized a separate bedroom when necessary as certified by the Exceptional Family Member medical review board at Tripler Army Medical Center.

Waiting List
If housing is not immediately available, the servicemember will be placed on a waiting list and, as housing becomes available, will be offered assignment based on eligibility date, grade category, and bedroom requirements. The relative position on a waiting list will be determined by rank, date of rank, and eligibility date. If an applicant who is already on a waiting list due to an increase in dependents, the individual will be moved to the appropriate list using the original eligibility date. Upon initial arrival promotable applicants having a promotion sequence number will be placed on the waiting list of their promotable grade. When an individual who is already on a waiting list becomes eligible for a different list due to promotion that individual may be moved to the appropriate list using the original eligibility date. A member occupying housing whose bedroom requirement will change following the birth of a child may request placement on the waiting list when the pregnancy is confirmed by military authorities. Eligibility date will be date of application. When a servicemember is on a waiting list and is authorized TLA and declines adequate housing, TLA will terminate effective the date before the quarters would have been assigned. Unless otherwise stated above the eligibility date for application for housing is the date of application. When the sponsor presents PCS orders, the eligibility date will be the date departed last permanent duty

station provided the application is made within 30 days of the reporting date to the new duty station. Personnel from dependent restricted tours are allowed a maximum of 14 months credit on waiting lists; eligibility date for members who obtained non-accompanying dependents during the tour is the date the dependents were acquired.

Community Homefinding Relocation and Referral Services
Service members who can not immediately obtain government quarters will be processed through the Community Homefinding Relocation and Referral Services (CHRRS) of the Family Housing Office. The CHRRS counselor

will provide the service member a complete listing of rental or sales units meeting their specific requirements, and general information on the geographic area such as schools, transportation, recreational facilities, and community services available. All service members renting in the civilian community must provide the housing office with a copy of the lease and indicate, in writing, whether they wish to be offered housing during the lease period.

Options
Each service member is authorized a turn-down option. If an adequate unit is offered and a turn-down is made, the service member remains on the list in the same position. If the service

member is on TLA, however, the TLA will stop on the day before the quarters are available. If a second turn-down is made, the service member is removed from the list. The Housing Office does offer a preference option for personnel not on TLA. If they express a preference for a particular type of housing, the preference will be recorded and they will only be offered that type of housing. Personnel expressing no preference for housing are offered any quarters that become available for assignment consistent with their grade and family size requirements.

Check-In
Once quarters are accepted, the housing counselor will schedule a

check-in inspection and will furnish the new resident with a housing manual, which includes pertinent information on housing rules, self-help, water and energy conservation, station policies, and pertinent telephone numbers. The counselor will also initiate paperwork to stop the Basic Allowance for Quarters (BAQ). During the check-in inspection, the housing inspector will provide operational instruction for appliances, and installed equipment. Additionally, they will explain house rules, yard boundaries and responsibilities. A joint occupant/inspector condition report will be conducted. Additional work required on the quarters will be ordered at this time.



The tour included several performances with a marching unit, ceremonial unit, concert band, small combos and an electrifying showband.

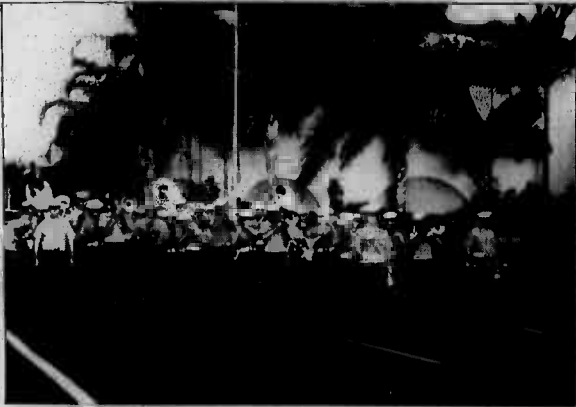
The last time the Marine Band from Hawaii was on Australian

The Marines were able to work in some liberty time and many took the time to visit shops, museums and enjoy the festivities of the Easter Show (much like a state fair in the mainland). Some Marines took advantage of the rare opportunity to scuba-dive or

snorkel at the Great Barrier Reef.

"I was able to get some really great stuff (souvenirs). We had a blast," said Sgt. Adrian Shields. "Hopes are that the band will be able to return to the land down under soon. Based on the reactions of the Australian people to the Marines "Operations Down Under" was a major success."

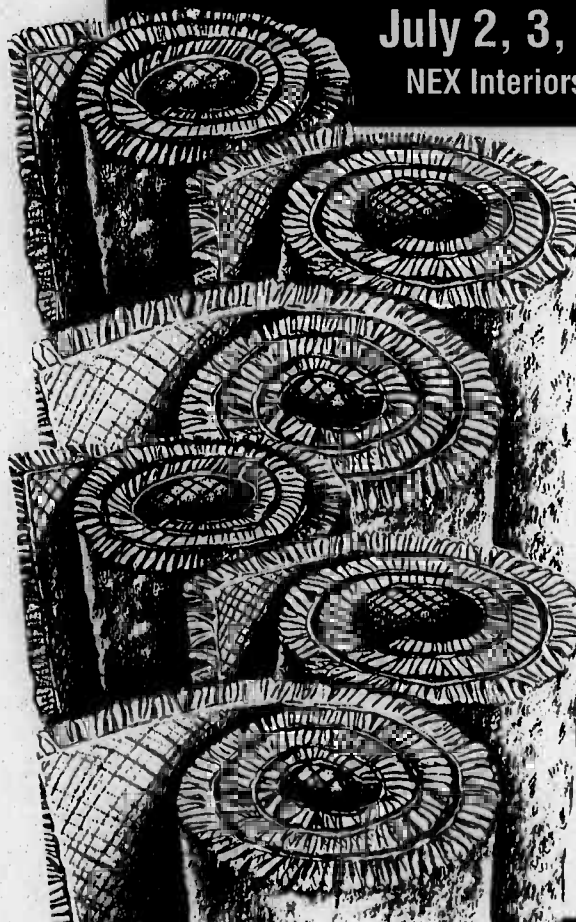

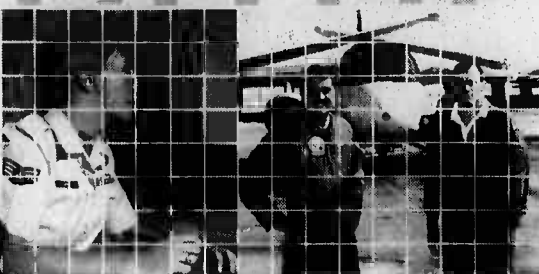

Traffic Schedule No. 93-6

IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF ORDINANCE NO. 91-87 AMENDING ARTICLE III, THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SERVICES, CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU, HEREBY ESTABLISHES TRAFFIC SCHEDULE NO. 93-6 TO AMEND SCHEDULE III OF SECTION 15-8.3 ESTABLISHING PROHIBITED RIGHT/LEFT TURN ON RED; SCHEDULE V OF SECTION 15-7.2(b)(3) ESTABLISHING SPEED LIMIT - 25 MPH; SCHEDULE XI OF SECTION 15-8.3(b) ESTABLISHING NO TURN; SCHEDULE XIV OF SECTION 15-11.3 ESTABLISHING STOP INTERSECTIONS; SCHEDULE XXII OF SECTION 15-14.5(a) ESTABLISHING PROHIBITED PARKING CERTAIN AREAS; SCHEDULE XXIV OF SECTION 15-16.1 ESTABLISHING CURB LOADING ZONES; SCHEDULE XXV OF SECTION 15-16.3(d) ESTABLISHING OFFICIAL BUS STOPS; SCHEDULE XXVIII OF SECTION 15-24.17 ESTABLISHING MISCELLANEOUS TRAFFIC CONTROLS.

SECTION 1. Chapter 15 (1990 Traffic Code), City and County of Honolulu, is hereby further amended in the following particulars:

- By amending Schedule III of Sec. 15-8.3 establishing prohibited right/left turn on red by adding thereto the following item:
"Smith-Beretan St. No left turn from the lane next to the Ewa curb lane on Smith St. into Beretan St. in the Ewa direction."
- By amending Schedule V of Sec. 15-7.2(b)(3) establishing speed limit - 25 mph by adding thereto the following items:
"Kalihi Pl., for its entire length."
"Kalihi St., from Likelike Hwy. to the makai property line of 3390 Kalihi St."
"Old Moku Rd., for its entire length."
- By amending Schedule XI of Sec. 15-8.3(b) establishing no turn by adding thereto the following items:
"Moanalua Rd. No left turn from Moanalua Rd. into the Pali Momi Hospital emergency unit driveway."
"Moanalua Rd. No left turn into Moanalua Rd. from the Pali Momi Hospital emergency unit driveway."
- By amending Schedule XIV of Sec. 15-11.3 establishing stop intersections by adding thereto the following items:
