President Clinton visits Marines at Bellows before departing

Marines from Kaneohe were greeted with a unannounced visit from the Commander in Chief, President Bill Clinton Tuesday at Bellows Air Force Station.

The President arrived at approximately 6:15 p.m. to take a look at the training being conducted at Bellows by Marines. The President, who was scheduled to depart Hawaii Wednesday, shortened his vacation in Hawaii because of pressing issues in the Mainland. Shortly after his visit with the Marines, he boarded Air Force One.

Marines from Assault Amphibian Detachment, 3d Marines, were conducting Basic Skills Training and were about to prepare for small infantry and squad movements.

Schoolboy dream comes true, retires

□ "All I've ever wanted to be is a Marine and that I've done."

It started with a dream. A dream that began when he was only eight years old. A dream whose pull was so powerful, it would haunt him all through elementary, high school and college. It was the dream of being a United States Marine.

Recently, that dream ended for BGen. Gary Brown, former deputy commander of Marine Forces Pacific/Fleet Marine Forces Pacific, Camp H. M. Smith, Hawaii, as he took off his uniform for the last time and departed Hawaii to begin his retirement.

The first time young Gary Brown saw his uncle, a Marine Corps corporal, come home, he knew what he wanted to be. His uncle, who was an amtrac driver before and during the Korean War, used to fascinate the young boy with adventurous stories about the Marine Corps. So captivated was young Brown that by the time he

reached high school those adolescent dreams then became the audacious feelings of a young man who really began to think seriously about becoming a Marine.

After graduating high school Brown enrolled in Presbyterian College in Clinton, S.C., in June 1963. While attending college, Brown's feelings and dreams became stronger and more vivid as he decided to set his goal at being a Marine Corps officer.

So, he attended the Platoon Leaders Class, a six-week summer program at the Officers Candidate

School in Quantico, Va., between his freshman and sophomore years, and again during his junior and senior years.

"In those days if you graduated in the top five percent of your PLC class, you were offered a regular commission," BGen. Brown explained.

Little did he know that he was about to begin a journey that would last 31 years and take him to the rank of Brigadier General.

"I went to The Basic School in Quantico for six months intending that when I finished I would continue on to flight school," he said. "But while I was there I decided I liked the infantry very much, particularly working with the Marines. So I decided to stay in the infantry and never went to flight school."

His illustrious career quickly started soaring upon his assignment to 1st Marine Brigade, MCAS Kaneohe Bay in 1965. The brigade deployed to Vietnam where he served as rifle platoon commander in 2d Battalion, 4th Marines until March 1966.

In 1968, he returned to Vietnam, where he initially served as a company commander in the 6th Marines and later as a combined action company commander. After completing his second Vietnam

tour in 1970, BGen. Brown spent his interim years attending different military schools such as the Amphibious Warfare School, the Army Command and General Staff College, and the Naval War College.

He also completed tours at Headquarters, U. S. European Command in Stuttgart, Germany; Camp Hansen, Okinawa, Japan; U.S. Central Command, MacDill Air Force Base, Fla.; 1st Marine Division, Camp Pendleton, Calif.; and as commander of the 1st Marine Regiment, Marine Corps Base, Camp Pendleton, Calif.

In December 1988 after being selected for promotion to brigadier general, he was assigned as the Director of Personnel Procurement Division, Manpower and Reserve Affairs Department, Headquarters Marine Corps, and was promoted to brigadier general in April 1989. He served in this capacity until June 1991, when he was assigned as Commander, Marine Forces Southwest Asia.

In November 1991, BGen. Brown was assigned to what would be his last active duty tour — Deputy Commander, Marine Forces Pacific/Fleet Marine Forces Pacific, Camp H. M. Smith, Hawaii.

Base utilities bill still on the rise

Stop! Take a look around. How many lights are on? Are they necessary at this time? What is the air conditioner thermostat set on? Are the windows and doors properly shut?

These are just a few of the questions that each person should ask themselves everyday. With the utility bill for this installation exceeding the budget, servicemembers and their families are being asked to take the initiative and cut back on their use of electricity and water.

An order, mandated by congress, was issued to reduce consumption by 20 percent starting in 1985 and reaching the goal by the year 2000. For some reason instead of reducing, the consumption has in fact, increased since 1985.

The station is only allotted a certain amount of money for utilities. Each month the station has exceeded the projected budget for those utilities. When the bill is more than what is budgeted, the money is taken from other areas.

"Military families, on the average, consume almost twice as much water and electricity as those living off base," said Bill Nutting, utilities engineer.

Current legislation does not allow the station to charge military housing occupants for utilities. Since the servicemembers don't see an individual bill, they seldom realize the consequences of their actions. The cost may not come directly from their pockets, but they are paying for it in numerous ways.

Many of the scheduled improvements and services on the station facilities can't be

implemented because the money allotted to them was pulled to cover the increasing consumption of energy.

Just a few minutes and a little common sense could save thousands of dollars that could then be used to fund enjoyable activities and improve the quality of life.

One of the biggest problems for the station commanding officer is the electricity usage, which averages from \$450,000 to \$500,000 a month. From that, lighting and air conditioning are two of the biggest consumers and are the most common energy wasted.


"The conservation of our utilities is no longer just the nice thing to do, it is a must have," said Station Executive Officer, LtCol. Tim J. Sukow.

There are many ways that servicemembers could help cut the cost of this energy. Many of the buildings on the installation have good natural lighting, so artificial light should only be needed for reading and in the evening. Get into the habit of not only shutting lights off when leaving the room, but also turning them on only when absolutely needed. Also make sure outdoor lighting is not on during daylight hours.

Take a look at the air conditioner. Is the setting lower than 78 degrees? If it is, that air conditioner unit is not operating efficiently and adds to the energy waste. Make sure windows and doors are closed and sealed properly. If they're not, that is money flying out the window.

The water bill for the month of May was \$108,000. While this may be considerably smaller than the electricity bill, it is in fact far more important. "Most of the island's water is collected in the See Water, A-8

for civilians. Youngs' next assignment will be with III MEF, Okinawa, Japan. Wilson was assigned to the Headquarters staff, Commander, Marine Forces Pacific/Commanding General, Fleet Marine Forces Pacific.

—Two Marines and a civilian were apprehended for DUI. After failing field sobriety testing, two individuals elected to submit to Intoxilyzer testing which resulted in blood alcohol contents of .106 percent and .135 percent. One Marine elected to submit to a blood test.

Purple foxes return after six months

Six months and 2,200 flight hours later, Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron 364 returned from the Marine Corps Air Station Futenma, Okinawa, Japan.

In mid-January the Purple Foxes deployed to Okinawa for the six-month Unit Deployment Program.

Upon arrival on Okinawa, the squadron immediately began contributing to the workload, while at the same time continuing to concentrate on aircrew training and aircraft readiness.

"The squadron immediately assumed a large portion of the lift FRAG requests for MAG-36 due to the limited number of fragable CH-46 aircraft," said Maj. Lon Yeary, executive officer of HMM-364.

During their stay in Okinawa, HMM-364 participated in operation Team Spirit. Deploying to Pohang, Korea to participate in the operation gave the Marines the opportunity to train in cold weather.

The Marines were able to learn a few different training topics than what they are accustomed to in hot weather.

Aircraft heaters, cold weather flight equipment, aircraft-deicing and exposure were a few of the many training topics, explained Yeary.

While some Marines were participating in Team Spirit, thirty

other personnel, three aircraft and supporting equipment were tasked to support the search for remains of American servicemen in the hot humid, primitive conditions of Cambodia, Yeary said.

But, one day before departing to Korea the squadron's requirement changed. HMM-364 was tasked to bring nine aircraft instead of the detachment of six to Team Spirit.

Not having sufficient aircraft to support Team Spirit and the JTF-FA, forced the support to be transferred to another squadron.

"The short notice change tested the Purple Fox's maintenance department and again they demonstrated their unsurpassed flexibility and capability," Yeary said.

"Despite harsh weather conditions the Purple Foxes performed superlatively during Team Spirit," Yeary said.

The squadron flew 381.7 hours in 18 days while maintaining a 78 percent full mission capable rate. They transported 1,780 passengers and 136,800 pounds of cargo. Not a single fragmentary order request (FRAG) was cancelled except those cancelled by weather.

The squadron's superior performance was acknowledged by the Commanding General, 1st Marine Aircraft Wing, Brigadier General X.X. Forney in a message.

"HMM-364 provided a helicopter assault capability which far transcended that expected of nine

CH-46 helicopters... The squadron's achievements were highlighted by the attainment of 100 percent availability at the end of a difficult and demanding exercise," he said. "The squadron's performance exemplified the best to be found in Marine Aviation."

The Purple Foxes were put through the test in April when they were assigned as the nucleus of the 35th Marine Expeditionary Unit, Aviation Combat Element (ACE). The ACE, which consisted of CH-46Es, CH-53Es, AH-1Ws and UH-1Ns, was tasked to embark aboard the USS Belleau Wood May 7, and participate in Exercise Cobra Gold in Thailand.

Although most MEU ACE's require months to organize, train together and develop their skills, the Purple Foxes wasted no time and attacked the task as assigned and formed the ACE in one month.

Exercise Cobra Gold was a two-phased exercise. The first phase was a large Combined Arms Live Fire Exercise (CALFEX) and the second phase was a joint U.S./Thailand amphibious landing.

Four actual medevacs were flown by the ACE, including one which the doctors acknowledged as "life saving."

Upon returning to Okinawa, the MEU ACE was dissolved and the Purple Foxes began preparation for their return to Hawaii.

Prior to returning, explains Yeary, the maintenance department was informed of a 100 percent Material Condition

inspection. HMM-364 not only passed the inspection, but they passed it with flying colors.

Besides achieving maximum training, Yeary said there was one thing that he appreciates the most about the Unit Deployment Program.

"Being away together as a squadron, helps bring all the Marines closer to each other. It seems that while we are deployed, we become a real family," he said.



Hearing Safety: Know your limits

Want Better Hearing? Shhhh!

For those who have already suffered damage, hearing aids can help, but they cannot restore normal hearing.

People are rarely as satisfied with their hearing aids as with

their eyeglasses because the older hearing aids can't clarify sounds. Newer hearing aids are better at picking up certain sound frequencies, screening out much unwanted background noise.

"Basically, a hearing aid is an audio amplifier that provides amplification in the frequency range where the patient has the greatest hearing loss," says Harry Sauberman, chief of the ear, nose and throat division at FDA's Office of Device Evaluation.

"One of the concerns about hearing aids is that many of them amplify ambient

(background) noise. That may be the reason people leave them on the dresser. They just don't find them desirable."

Sound Advice
Rock musician Kathy Peck cherishes what's left of her hearing. To educate others about noise-induced hearing loss, she helped establish a nonprofit organization called HEAR, for Hearing Education and Awareness for Rockers, with the Haight-Ashbury Free Medical Clinic in San Francisco.

HEAR has garnered a lot of publicity and support in the music industry, including a \$10,000 donation from musician

Pete Townsend of The Who, who also has hearing loss.

While Peck doesn't play in a band anymore, she is still a rock music fan. However, now when she goes to concerts, she wears custom-made earplugs. Some are decorated with dangling jarring-like ornaments.

She encourages other music fans to take precautions as well. "We're not against music, we're not anti-rock 'n' roll," says Peck. "I just want them to protect their hearing."

Tripler's Pre-Admission Unit/Ambulatory Surgery Center is one way of cutting back budget costs

Editor's note: This is a continuation of a series of Tripler articles that will discuss budget cuts and their impact on health care.

The Pre-Admission Unit/Ambulatory Surgery Center (PAU/ASC) saves Tripler Army Medical Center approximately \$3 million per year by shifting inpatient to outpatient care while continuing to provide quality health care.

As Tripler continues to plan for the expected \$9.5 million budget cut for FY94, more patients will be sent through outpatient care in PAU/ASC that previously would have been admitted to the hospital. "It is a tremendous savings when you start talking about linens,

housekeeping, nutrition, nursing care..." explained Army Lt. Col. Eileen K. Berlin, chief, Surgical Nursing Section, Tripler.

In May 1992, Tripler began progressively increasing ambulatory surgery, also called same-day surgery, and started a pre-admission unit. They arrive the morning of surgery and depart for home the same day.

Due to the success in the shift to outpatient care, in May, PAU/ASC doubled its capacity in its new location on 5C2, according to Army Capt. Barbara S. Stakk, head nurse, PAU/ASC, Tripler. Also, the expanded hours of operation from 5:30 a.m.-10 p.m. have allowed more inpatient care to be switched to outpatient.

Key to the continued success in PAU/ASC is "communicating both to our resident doctors, who are in training programs, and our military community that is

standard of care going on in the civilian community," said Berlin. "We can go forward in a very safe and efficient manner," continued Berlin.

"These changes provide many benefits to the patients as well (as to Tripler)," said Stakk. "Once the concept is adequately explained most patients are pleased with spending less time in the hospital. The majority of patients recuperate better and are more comfortable at home," said Stakk who has 10 years experience in a civilian recovery and ambulatory unit.

PAU/ASC missions include the pre-admission process; ambulatory surgery; and handling nonsurgical patients, such as monitoring a patient undergoing a procedure.

The pre-admission process, completed in approximately 80 minutes of individual counseling, prepares an outpatient or inpatient for surgery from 1 to 30 days prior

to the actual surgery, explained Stakk.

The patient, referred to PAU/ASC by his doctor, receives information and instruction from a pre-operative video, anesthesiologist or nurse anesthetist, operating room nurse, and ambulatory surgery center nurse.

"During pre-admission process the patient will be categorized as either a same-day admission patient or an ambulatory surgery patient. The same-day admission patient will be admitted to the ward after surgery. The ambulatory surgery patient will go home the same day as surgery provided the patient has an escort and is doing well, as determined by the medical staff.

"Patients are screened very carefully for those who go home the day of surgery. It is used only for minor surgery, where the incidence of complications and

bleeding is very low. That's what ambulatory surgery is all about," said Stakk.

PAU/ASC medical staff also receive and prepare patients the morning of their surgery. After the surgery the ambulatory surgery patients recover in PAU/ASC.

Once the ambulatory surgery patient meets discharge criteria, he and his escort are given post-operative training and instruction in preparation for release the same day as the surgery.

The escort plays an essential role in ambulatory surgery, accompanying the patient during the entire day of surgery.

"The biggest reason why the patient has to have an escort is to pick up any prescriptions from the pharmacy, to drive the patient home and to assist the patient at home after discharge from the hospital," said Stakk.

"What that means is we will

have the resources and staff to ensure that those patients who really need to be inpatient are appropriately taken care of. So it is being more efficient. We want to continue taking care of as many patients as possible in light of all our budget and personnel constraints," said Berlin.

The final PAU/ASC mission is providing beds for nonsurgical patients. This capability has been expanded recently by PAU/ASCs lengthened hours of operation.

In June, patients referred by their doctors for heart catheterization procedures began going through PAU/ASC as outpatients, and in July PAU/ASC began accepting intravenous sedations and recovery for children according to Berlin.

"These changes save a lot of money, but also streamline a lot of our modes of operation making Tripler more efficient," said Stakk.

Koolau aquifers" Nutting explained. "While the demand for water is constantly rising, the supply is not increasing."
Oahu has received 30 percent less rainfall than normal since

Brigadier Gen. Brown, however, doesn't see his retirement as a retirement, but a transition to another job.

Although BGen. Brown is leaving the Corps, he's not leaving the Marines. He explained the Marines will always be with him

in his heart and in the friends he's made throughout the years, and in the job prospects he's researching in Florida.

He further explained that the one thing they will miss the most is the Marines.
"Nowadays, every time I talk to Marines on the street or my wife and I are in the Exchange and one of them recognize me, they come to attention and salute, she (his wife) says, 'I'm going to miss these Marines.'"
"And we're going to miss our friends. The friends that you make along the way and the professional acquaintances, all the great staff NCOs, NCOs and officers that I've met over the years. They're

really the most important," he said.

Brigadier Gen. Brown had some parting advice for Marines who are still in the midst of their careers. He said setting goals and working on your education was very important; but he also said not to get too focused on what comes next.

"I would tell people in the Corps, enjoy the Corps; enjoy your fellow Marines and friends that you make," BGen. Brown explained. "Don't get too [concerned] with your next promotion or your next set of PCS orders or what your next job is going to be... enjoy the friends you make; enjoy your present duty station."



 Secret Service agents pulled up and informed the Marines the President would like to shake hands with the Marines. After quickly forming the platoon, the Secret Service agents gave the thumbs up and the President's vehicle pulled up. The President introduced himself and his staff as the Marines stood smartly at attention. Then the President asked the commanding officer to put the Marines at ease.

The President then proceeded to go down the line and speak with each Marine individually and shook their hands. Each Marine's photograph was taken with the President, courtesy of the White House staff. According to Lt. Brian Seiffert, detachment executive officer, after personally greeting all

45 Marines, "the President went on to address everyone: "Each of you should be proud and happy to serve in the military and you are doing your country a great service." Marines had become accustomed to seeing the Secret Service agents the past few days. Mrs. Clinton and daughter Chelsea had been swimming in the beach area a short distance from where the Marines had been training Monday. But, the visit Tuesday evening was a total surprise.

"The Marines were surprised and pleased to meet the commander in chief," said Seiffert. "The younger Marines were especially excited to have the rare opportunity to meet the President and shake his hand. This was truly motivating for all of us."

The President seemed to be interested in the training of the Marines and spoke

cordially to everyone concerning the type of training the Marines were conducting. "The Secret Service agents came up and said that the President wanted to shake our hands and talk to us," said PFC Alfredo Franco. "I thought it was real cool of the President to do that. It gave me a good feeling."

The Marines were pleased the President had taken the time to speak with them on a personal level rather than as a group only.

"This was really a surprise. We had seen Mrs. Clinton and their daughter the day before, so we were used to seeing the Secret Service agents around, but when we looked up and saw that the President was there, I was shocked," said LCpl. Brian Hudson. "This certainly wasn't something you expect to see when you're out in the field. It was a really different experience that I will always remember."

My question is, why are there so many women with Canon EOS Rebel cameras? No, they could never fall victim to such ploys.






